



YET MORE RECORDS FALL AT TATTERSALLS

After records tumbled on consecutive days at Tattersalls, a day without a millionaire yearling could be seen as disappointing, but there was still plenty of strength in depth to the trade at Park Paddocks. This was evident by the fact that the three sessions

combined to produce the highest turnover for any Thoroughbred auction ever staged in Europe.

The Oasis Dream (GB) colt out of Watership Down Stud's multiple Group 1 winner Dar Re Mi (GB) (Singspiel {Ire}) led the way, his 850,000gns price tag making him the fourth most expensive yearling sold throughout Book 1 and contributing to an overall aggregate of 70,343,000 gns, an increase of 3%. The Book 1 average of 207,501gns represented a

substantial improvement of 27%, with the median shooting up by 30% to 130,000gns. The only decline came in the clearance rate, with some expensive buy-backs--especially during the final day--being partly responsible for a fall of 7% to 75% overall, with 339 of the 450 yearlings to be brought under the hammer finding a buyer. Yesterday's average was up 26% 181,981gns compared to the corresponding session last year, while the median soared by 41% to 120,000gns. The aggregate was down slightly to 19,108,000gns, but it was worth noting that last year's session three topper was worth 2.5-million gns.

The collection of yearlings on offer throughout the three days came in for much praise from the assembled buyers and this was reflected in Chairman Edmond Mahony's post-sale verdict. He said: "To have broken the European record price for a yearling twice in two days and to have established a new world record for a yearling filly is a measure of the outstanding quality of the yearlings assembled for Book 1 of the 2013 Tattersalls October Yearling Sale. Our consignors yet again have brought yearlings of the highest caliber to Park Paddocks and for the third consecutive year, the average and median prices have reached new highs and the turnover has also bettered last year's record despite a significantly smaller catalogue." **Cont. p3**

HONOR CODE TO SKIP BREEDERS' CUP

Lane's End Racing and Dell Ridge Farm's **"TDN Rising Star"** **Honor Code** (A.P. Indy), a narrow runner-up to **Havana** (Dunkirk) in last Saturday's GI Champagne S. at Belmont Park, will bypass the Nov. 2 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile in favor of the GI Remsen S. at Aqueduct Nov. 30. Trained by Shug McGaughey, the son of Serena's Cat (Storm Cat) trailed by as many as 22 lengths in his seven-furlong debut over a sloppy Saratoga main track Aug. 31, but came with a stunning late rally to graduate by a widening 4 1/2-length margin. The dark bay was the narrow \$1.85-1 favorite in the Champagne and lingered well behind early, was forced into about the eight path when **Ride On Curlin** (Curlin) came wide and finished strongly to just miss. "We think he just needs more schooling and we thought we'd run him one more time after the race the other day and go from there," Lane's End's Will Farish explained. "The long-range picture is the Classics, and with that in mind, we thought it was better to keep him at home and go a mile and an eighth with him and bring him along in the spring. We think we have an exceptional colt and we look forward to the future."

On Song...

Dar Re Mi dominated the track in her racing days and on Thursday her first foal took center stage at Tattersalls as the top lot of the final session of a lively October Sale. Offered by his breeders, Lord and Lady

Lloyd-Webber of Watership Down Stud, the Oasis Dream colt ([lot 354](#)) was knocked down to Charlie Gordon-Watson on behalf of an unnamed "relatively new client". Shadwell's Angus Gold was the under-bidder. Gordon-Watson said: "He has the best stallion's pedigree in the book and it's great to be

able to buy him. I also bought his grandam Darara (Ire) and she's the one who started it all. He's a special horse."

Darara (GB) (Top Ville {GB}), a half-sister to Darshaan (GB) who died last year at the age of 29, was the cornerstone of Watership Down Stud, producing not just Dar Re Mi but fellow Group 1 winners Rewilding (GB), Darazari (Ire) and Diaghilev (Ire), a son of Sadler's Wells, who, until Tuesday, held the European record as the highest-priced yearling sold at public auction after fetching 3.4-million guineas in 2000.

Dar Re Mi was trained by John Gosden to win the G1 Pretty Polly S., G1 Yorkshire Oaks and G1 Dubai Sheema Classic. She retired in 2010 with almost £2.7-million in earnings and now has a Dubawi (Ire) filly on the ground at Watership Down. The 8-year-old mare is currently in foal to Frankel (GB).

Gordon-Watson also went to 450,000gns for a yearling by Invincible Spirit (Ire) out of the stakes-placed Street Cry (Ire) mare Gold Bubbles ([lot 424](#)). The colt was a successful pinhook for Denis Brosnan's Croom House Stud, who bought him last November at Goffs for €175,000 from Jacqueline Norris' Jockey Hall Stud.

Power Play...

Coolmore raced and now stands at stud the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas winner Power (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}), so when his half-sister by Galileo ([lot 405](#)) appeared, it was no surprise that she would leave the ring as the property of the Irish team. M. V. Magnier signed the buyer's sheet at 775,000gns for the daughter of the Inchinor (GB) mare Frappe (Ire), who was bred by her consignor, Lofts Hall Stud.

Having also bought Tuesday's top lot--the 3.6-million guinea Galileo colt--Magnier signed for a total of seven youngsters over the three days (not including those bought with the China Horse Club), while Demi O'Byrne's name went on the sheet as buyer of Newsells Park Stud's Medicean (GB) filly out of Nathaniel (GB)'s Danehill half-sister Distinctive Look (Ire) at 260,000gns.

Year of the Horse Beckons...

The only War Front yearling offered for sale at Tattersalls this week was [lot 358](#), a filly out of the winning Unbridled's Song mare Dawn Chorus, offered by Watership Down Stud. She proved to be the first purchase at the auction for China Horse Club, whose representatives had been in town all week and made the successful bid of 240,000gns.

"I've been to this sale for the last three years and the reason I keep coming back here is because I believe Tattersalls is a center of excellence," said China Horse Club Chairman Teo Ah King, who confirmed that the War Front filly will be trained in Ireland by David Wachman. "All the quality is here and I'd like to see more Asian participation. The Chinese people have a great interest in racing and are very excited about its expansion in China. We hope to race at three venues eventually, possibly one in Shanghai, and Tianjin

racecourse opens next year in the Year of the Horse."

The club, which is made up of 40 syndicates of around 50 members spread around China, has enjoyed eight winners in its inaugural year, in Singapore, America, France and Australia. Teo Ah King is also part owner of leading juvenile Australia (GB)--the Galileo colt out of Ouija Board (GB)--with Derrick Smith and Sue Magnier. He added: "We're working with Coolmore to expand the breeding side--we currently have 40 mares, 20 in Ireland and 20 in Australia--and John Warren is my advisor. I'm hoping we can team up with Tattersalls. In a couple of years I can see a sale like this happening in a big city like Shanghai."

It didn't take too long for the alliance of China Horse Club, John Warren and John Magnier to swing into action, with the triumvirate signing for four more yearlings later in the session. [Lot 373](#), Norelands Stud's full-brother to Newmarket listed winner Enticement (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}) was captured for 375,000gns, while [lot 394](#) proved to be harder to pin down, with the bidding eventually reaching 650,000gns.

That pricey colt was consigned by Flash Conroy's Glenvale Stud and is also by the late Montjeu. His grandam is Grenzen, whose excellent son Twilight Agenda accrued 13 victories in Ireland and America, including the GI Meadowlands Cup H., while his half-sister Market Slide (Gulch) was the stakes-placed dam of Group 1 winners Refuse To Bend (Ire) and Media Puzzle.

On behalf of the partnership, Magnier also went to 420,000gns for [lot 482](#), a Montjeu (Ire) colt out of Oasis Dream's daughter La Sylvia, whose first foal, the unraced 2-year-old Gift Of Rain (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), cost 570,000gns at this sale last year.

Hope Springs...

"I've been to quite a few sales in my time and I think this is possibly the strongest I've been to, certainly in Europe," was the opinion of Blandford Bloodstock's Tom Goff, who went all the way to 650,000gns to secure [lot 390](#), the Galileo colt out of the Selkirk mare Field Of Hope (Ire). A Group 1 winner herself when trained by Pascal Bary for her breeder Grundy Bloodstock, Field Of Hope has proven to be a terrific matron, her offspring including a trio of listed winners--Ransom Of Hope (GB), Field Of Dream (GB) and Dormello (Ire).

"He was nearly the best Galileo colt here--obviously Newsells Park Stud's Galileo [Tuesday's top lot] was an absolute king. But the mare's done it so many times," Goff continued.

"There's been extraordinary trade at the top end but they've been a very good group of yearlings here and all around it's been a very good crop. The consignors should be congratulated for bringing such a good bunch of horses to the sale, especially Newsells Park and Highclere Stud."

Sheikh Mohammed Out In Front...

Sheikh Mohammed's Darley operation was the sale's most prolific purchaser, with John Ferguson signing for 42 horses at a total of 10,450,000gns. His average outlay was 248,810gns, with a top price of 650,000gns.

He paid that for two colts, one ([lot 302](#)) by Oasis Dream (GB) out of Briquette (Ire) from the family of Pilsudski (Ire). The other, [lot 359](#), a final-day purchase, was by Dalham Hall Stud resident Dubawi (Ire) out of Demisemiquaver (GB) (Singspiel {Ire}). The majority of Ferguson's buys were by Darley stallions--four by Dubawi (Ire), four by Exceed And Excel (Aus), five by New Approach (Ire), and nine by Shamardal--but he also purchased offspring of Arcano (Ire), Dark Angel (Ire), Lope De Vega (Ire), Monsun (Ger), Oasis Dream (GB), Pivotal (GB), Sea The Stars (Ire) and Lawman (Fr). Four Darley stallions appeared in the sires' top 10: New Approach, Exceed And Excel, Shamardal and Dubawi, with their combined offspring bringing a total of 9,577,000gns.

Sam Bullard, Darley's Director of Stallions, said: "We're delighted to see that the breeders who support our stallions have reaped such wonderful rewards here. It's been a really healthy market."

Wind of Change for Final Session...

Lady Carolyn Warren summed up the sale succinctly, saying: "It was very strong for the first couple of days, but today was quite different. The weather changed and so did the temperature in the ring. It proves how fantastic this place is when the principals are here." Highclere, the second-top consignor in Book 1 behind Newsells Park Stud, sold 27 horses for a total of 6,737,000gns, with an average of 249,519gns. Two horses shared top billing, making 650,000gns. The first was a Dubawi (Ire) colt out of the Singspiel (Ire) mare Demisemiquaver (GB) sold to John Ferguson, while Tom Goff of Blandford Bloodstock bought a son of Galileo (Ire) out of Prix de la Foret heroine Field Of Hope, dam of seven winners from seven runners.

"The Dubawi and the Galileo were both outstanding and they realized the money," said Lady Carolyn. "Everybody's had some ups and some downs this week. You bring horses here to sell, but on balance we're pretty happy."

A further two of the Highclere draft made 525,000gns apiece. MV Magnier bought a Galileo son of Beverley D S. winner Muralakana (Fr) ([lot 11](#)), while the Niarchos Family's Flaxman Stables Ireland purchased Cabaret (Ire)'s filly by Danehill Dancer (Ire).

Acclaim for Clairemont...

Second-season consignor Clairemont Stud made profits on all four of the pinhooked foals they bought last December. The Hampshire stud is owned by Liam and Jenny Norris and brothers Martin and Lee Taylor, for whom Norris bought their Epsom Oaks winner Dancing Rain (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) as a yearling. "We brought five yearlings here [a homebred Montjeu filly as well as the pinhooks] and all made a profit," said Norris. "We put a lot of work into them at home, especially my wife Jenny and Rachel Andre, who assists her, so we were hopeful."

Of the four pinhooks, the greatest profit came on [lot 399](#), a colt by Lawman (Fr) out of the Quiet American mare Fonda. Bought for 110,000gns, he was sold to Tony Nereses for 280,000gns. "He's a really lovely-moving horse," commented Norris.

[Lot 214](#), an Exceed And Excel (Aus) filly out of Welsh Diva (GB) (Selkirk {GB}) sold to Katsumi Yoshida for 160,000gns, having cost Norris and his buying partner William Huntingdon 75,000gns at Tattersalls last year. The pair paid €90,000 at Goffs for a colt by Equiano (Fr) out of Moyglare Stud S. winner Mail The Desert (Ire), and Peter and Ross Doyle bought him for 140,000gns on Tuesday ([lot 5](#)). Finally, a 55,000gns Invincible Spirit (Ire) colt out of In The Light (GB) ([lot 455](#)), realised 120,000gns when sold to The Channel Consignment.

The Montjeu (Ire) yearling ([lot 247](#)), out of the Aga Khan-bred Alaia (Ire), sold to BBA Ireland for 100,000gns. "I was very keen for her to go to a good home. She's her dam's first foal and I put a fairly high reserve on her," said Norris.

After renting from Lady Rothschild at Stowell last year, Norris and the Taylors bought Clairemont last August. "We're doing a lot of fencing and painting and trying to build a commercial stud," Norris explained. They have six mares on the farm at the moment, and may invest in a couple more at Tattersalls in December, when Dancing Rain, who is in foal to Frankel (GB), is due to sell on the first day.

"It'll be sad to see her go, but we've been lucky to have her and it'll be an exciting day--she's a beauty," he said.

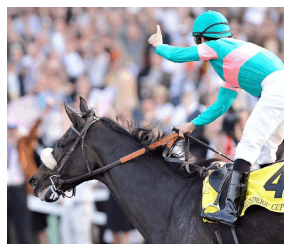
He continued, "The bloodstock industry, like all others, has endured challenging times in recent years, but it has also shown remarkable resilience and the intense competition at the top of the market has demonstrated the enduring global demand for quality bloodstock."

Mahony pointed to an international buying bench, including visitors from America, Australia, Hong Kong, Kuwait, Japan, South Africa, Turkey and the UAE. He added: "We have also been encouraged by the level of participation from emerging markets. Chinese and Russian interests have made a significant contribution to the success of the sale and the already considerable Qatari influence has been remarkable. It is wonderful to see relatively new participants embracing the sport with such enthusiasm and it has been a pleasure to see them, and so many of the world's leading racehorse owners, here at Tattersalls throughout the sale.

"We now turn our attention to Books 2 and 3 of the Tattersalls October Yearling Sale starting on Monday and we look forward to sustaining the momentum from this week's successful sale," Mahony concluded.

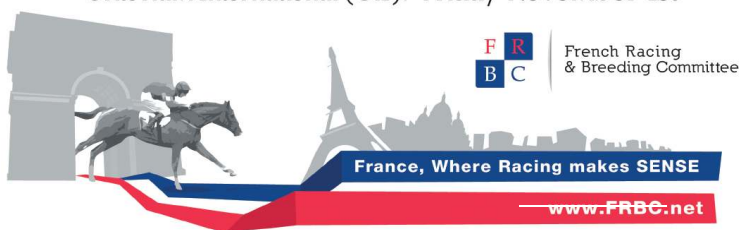

GOOD AND 'SEXY' *by Christina Bossinakis*

Not many in attendance at the 2011 Fasig-Tipton October sale could have foreseen that a yearling filly by first-season sire Ready's Image out of the Trempolino mare Klohho would be competing at the highest level of racing. Looking for a sound investment but at a modest price, the husband-and-wife team of Anna Seitz and Evan Ciannello--with the assistance of bloodstock agent Bob Feld--stepped in to secure the dark bay for \$20,000 on behalf of their new racing syndicate, Hit the Board Stables. Fast forward two years, and *I'm Already Sexy* is among the leading candidates for

Saturday's GI Queen Elizabeth II Invitational S. at Keeneland.

"It's a dream come true," said one of the filly's 18 investors, Trey Hart. "It was just last year that she broke her maiden at Keeneland [Oct. 5, 2012]. A lot has happened in a year, and we have been very, very lucky to have one like her."

The winner of half of her six starts this season, the filly has registered victories at Arlington in her two latest trips to the post--the 8 1/2-furlong Hatoof S. Aug. 17 and Sept. 14 GIII Pucker Up S. over nine panels. All nine of her career starts have come without Lasix.

"She won the Pucker Up very easily and [trainer] Wayne [Catalano] was very impressed with her," explained Seitz. "We were invited to Keeneland, so we just said 'let's go for it.' It's a tough race, but he feels she belongs in it, so it'll be fun to be part of it. It is just a natural progression for the filly."

In preparation for Saturday's test, the filly worked five furlongs in :59 1/5 over Keeneland's Polytrack Oct. 6. It was the fourth-fastest of 27 at the distance that day.

"She always breezes very fast," affirmed Seitz. "[Jockey] Joe Rocco Jr. was on her and he said that she did it so easy. He didn't have to ask her to switch leads and she just did it all on her own. She was very focused and felt very comfortable. He was very impressed with her."

The first and only runner thus far for her owner Hit the Board Stable, *I'm Already Sexy* has already afforded the syndicate of predominantly young professionals plenty of thrills along the way. While the filly will be trying top company for the very first time in her career in the QE II, the festivities surrounding the race will play out just as it has in all of her previous nine starts.

"When we go to the races, we have a champagne brunch at the barn before the race," said Seitz, explaining the team's customary race day habits. "We have some champagne, breakfast sandwiches and just hang out before we head over for the races. We like to have a good time for the entire experience. It's not just about those couple of minutes when they are on the track, it's about the whole comradery involved in seeing her in the morning as well as seeing her on race day. It's about the whole experience and we will do that again for the QE II."

Diamond in the Rough...

Inspired by Seitz and Ciannello, the original concept behind Hit the Board Stables was to give young people the opportunity--for a reasonable investment--to get involved in racing

"Racing kind of got away from the fun of it, because it became a business," said Seitz. "We've tried to make it more about entertainment than just trying to make money. We try to get back to bringing back the fun to the game."

Primarily comprised of young professionals in their 30s, Hit the Board is made up of everything from a school teacher to a seminary student, all with the hankering for a bit of fun and entertainment, while not breaking the bank.

"We have a lot of young people in this group, and so everyone couldn't really afford the same amount," explained Seitz. "Three of my friends brought in three more people and that's how we built it. When you have that many partners, it does become more work, but it's not really about making money, it's more about making racing accessible and fun." **Cont. p10**

Hart, who was among the original investors, offered his thoughts on the syndicate's accessibility.

"Obviously, financially we were in a position to do it, that's first and foremost," he said. "Even with a horse like 'Sexy' that only cost \$20,000, that's still a pretty big investment for a lot of people to do it by themselves. So, when the syndicate was put together, it definitely made it more advantageous for beginners like myself."

Seitz, who hails from a highly regarded family in the racing industry, drew not only on her own resources to select I'm Already Sexy from the October sale, but also called in well-known bloodstock agent Bob Feld to help out the fledgling operation.

"Bob narrowed it down to about 10 horses, and Evan and I looked at all of them," recalled Seitz. "We also invited all the partners to come out and have a look too, and about four or five came out."

Explaining the decision to open up the sales process to the investors, Seitz said, "Our whole goal was to make it very educational and we wanted it to be a group effort the entire time. I didn't want it to be me telling everyone what we're going to do. We wanted it to be everyone together. I also really like to do things with my friends. A lot of them didn't really start off knowing anything about the sport, so it's not like they would tell us what we need to do. They just enjoyed coming out and looking at the horses, listening to Bob talk about pedigrees and explain what a nice physical is."

Also coming into play in the selection of I'm Already Sexy was Seitz's prior experience with the 3-year-old's young sire, GII Sanford S. winner Ready's Image.

"We liked her because for one thing, I was familiar with Ready's Image, because I worked for Todd Pletcher [who trained the son of More Than Ready]," said Seitz. "I thought he was just a really fast 2-year-old and I loved being around him and I thought, if maybe we got any of that, we'd be lucky. And fortunately for us, she got a lot of that. She's also out of a Trempolino mare [winner of the 1987 Arc], so that's where going longer on the grass comes in to play. We got the best of both worlds."

As for the modest purchase price, she added, "We didn't have a big budget, but she was by a first-season sire, and although she didn't have a

huge pedigree, she was a very nice physical, so we instantly fell in love with her."

Sexy Start...

I'm Already Sexy kicked off her career with a fourth over the Arlington Polytrack in August of her juvenile year, but didn't reappear until Keeneland's fall meeting, where she came home a professional 2 1/4-length winner. Back in the winner's circle after taking her route and turf bow at Churchill Downs in November, she was packed away for the winter before resurfacing at Gulfstream Park Jan. 1 for the 8 1/2-furlong Ginger Brew S. Fifth that day, she was walked off following the June 1 Meafara S. on the Polytrack at Arlington but rebounded to win in a five-furlong Arlington turf allowance July 5. A trouble fifth in the Northbound Pride Oaks at Canterbury Aug. 3, she came back to annex her two latest, including the Pucker Up on her most recent visit to the races.

Guiding I'm Already Sexy--as well as the young, developing syndicate--every step of the way has been Wayne Catalano.

"Wayne Catalano is great," said Seitz. "He actually came up to me at the October sale and asked if he could train her. I was so flattered and honored that a trainer of his caliber wanted to train our little filly. Not only is he a very good horse trainer, but he is a great guy to deal with and very entertaining. He really knows his stuff and he lets anybody come by any time. He is flexible and will try to arrange works at a time that is convenient for the partners to attend. He's made the process very fun."

Underscoring the importance of a trainer granting that degree of hands-on attention and guidance to newcomers in the sport, Hart added, "I try to remain a silent partner, so Anna speaks to Wayne most of the time. But when I do get to see him, he's a hoot. The dude cracks me up. He's a really great guy. In terms of horse knowledge, he's a super sharp guy. Ever since 'Sexy' has been under his tutelage, I've watched many of his horses train and race. He always seems to put his horses in the right spot. He's always live on race day and he always cares about their condition before racing. I have nothing but respect and admiration for the guy. And he's hilarious to boot."

And while Seitz and Ciannello might be among the most visible representatives of Hit the Board, she is quick to point out that I'm Already Sexy's success has been a team effort.

"Wayne [Catalano] and Bob [Feld] have been so great to work with," she said. "She was broken by Raul Reyes and he did an absolutely fantastic job with her. Jonathan Thomas at Bridlewood freshened her for us when she took a couple of months off in the spring. He took his time with her and she really blossomed during her time there. She came back bigger and stronger. It's been a real team effort. It's a really fun team, we all work very well together." **Cont. p11**

From an investor's perspective, Hart offered, "Anna has been the most amazing syndicate manager. She loves the horses, first and foremost. She wants to please the partners, but will always do what is best for the horse and she has done that every day for the last two years and that's what has led 'Sexy' to where she is now. I believe in my heart, if we didn't have a trainer like Wayne Catalano or a great managers like Evan and Anna, we probably wouldn't be pointing toward the QE II like we are."

Sex Sells?

Finding themselves in the exhilarating position given I'm Already Sexy's racetrack success, the Hit the Board team decided to enter her into next month's Fasig-Tipton November sale in Lexington. According to Seitz, however, along with the success comes the need for some hard decisions.

"We haven't decided on that yet," she said when asked whether the filly will appear in the sale. "We have already received some private offers on her and we passed on those, because we are having so much fun. We just decided, let's run her in the QE II and we can decide after that. We figured the catalog would have already been out, so we decided to put her in there, just in case. We'll decide next week what we want to do."

Win or lose Saturday, could there be another 'Sexy' in the offing for Hit the Board?

"We'll talk to the partners after this Saturday and we can decide if we will go and buy another one," said Seitz. "For most of the partners, this is their very first horse ever, so they've probably become a little bit spoiled, but we'll see how everyone is feeling and maybe we'll put the money back into buying another horse."

And at least one partner feels confident he will be back to reinvest in the industry that has afforded him so much enjoyment until now.

"There have been conversations about starting from a weanling or a yearling, and whether we try to pinhook or get them to the track, it's definitely something I'd like to do," said Hart.

And while many partnerships would try to retain investors as their own resource, Seitz admits this is part of the process she wholeheartedly encourages.

"I've been introducing them to 2-year-old guys and vets and they seem interested in taking the next step, in some cases on their own," she said. "They want to get very involved because they are having the time of their lives. My goal was to get them to want to go on to do more and they are doing it. That's a very good thing."

Build It and They Will Come...

Seitz acknowledges that while the finances of the sport can sometimes be challenging, the overall concept behind the syndicate was a simple one.

"This is exactly the point of this whole endeavor, to get new owners in," said Seitz. "Even if they don't go on to buy another horse, now they now know how to read the *Daily Racing Form*, they know the difference between breezing and galloping, they know the difference between a mare and a filly. Even if they never buy another horse, hopefully, they'll have more of an education in the game which makes them want to go to the races and enjoy it and gamble and remain involved somehow."

Looking back to when he first became involved with the Hit the Board syndicate, Hart admits that he, like so many who want to get involved in the game, had the passion for horses, but was lacking the raw material to make Thoroughbred ownership a reality.

"I didn't know where to start," he recalled. "Much like any dream that you have that you haven't actually exercised any labor on, I didn't know where I was supposed to begin. This syndicate has provided me with the knowledge, tools, experiences and interaction to make it something that I feel comfortable moving ahead with."

Where it comes to the partnership, Seitz believes full immersion is the best policy.

"I think it's very important to have the partners involved in every aspect from the sales to the racetrack," she offered. "We can now all look back on the day we bought her, look at the pictures and see how's she's changed from then until now. They have an idea now what a yearling looks like, later a 2-year-old and they can see her now and see how she's changed just by looking at their own pictures."

As for some of the practical tools that the syndicate has given him over the last two years, Hart said, "What I've learned over the past two years is not looking at a horse from a program perspective, but rather looking at a horse from a physical standpoint. Watching their walk, watching them gallop and breeze and even cool out after the breeze. It's really all the behind-the-scenes stuff that takes place behind 6-8 a.m. every day. I was never involved in that aspect until now, so that's the knowledge I've taken away from the whole experience. I've always been able to handicap, but it's been about learning about their physical characteristic associated with when their having a good or bad day."

Friends Forever...

A partnership that was built on friendship and education and the sharing of information has now taken on a greater meaning for the team of 18 who are represented by the Hit the Board banner.

"It was originally made up of my friends and they brought in friends of their own, so I've made a lot of new friends because of 'Sexy,'" offered Seitz.

Echoing the sentiment, Hart added, "The interaction with the group, Anna and Evan and all the friends we've made throughout is special. I really enjoy the comradery with the new friends I've made through the syndicate."

Hart has admittedly enjoying the fun and festivities that go hand-in-hand with a day at the races, and acknowledges that, at the very basis, lies the love of the horse.

"I've been a horse racing fan my entire life. Before 'Sexy,' it just as a casual observer, but through Anna, who has been involved in racing her whole life, I was able to get involved. I always loved racing, initially it was for the gambling, hitting it big and potentially returning with more money than you left with. But now that I am truly involved, I love being around the action with the horses."

He added, "Personally, I love being involved with the horse, behind the scenes, and not just on race day. Whenever 'Sexy' is in the state of Kentucky, we'll go and see her a couple of times a week. It's about being out there at 7:30 in the morning to watch her work and feeding her peppermints. That's my favorite part. The fact that she is winning races is truly great, but I love that I own part of a race horse and I know her personally is what I really look forward to the most."

And what started out as a small investment with the hopes of having some fun with friends along the way, has taken on greater meaning.

"It had always been on my bucket list to own a Thoroughbred, and that came through two years ago, and now we're talking about running in a Grade I," Hart said. "It just keeps getting sweeter each day."

JEWEL LOOKS TO GET BACK ON TRACK

While Saturday's G1 Caulfield S. has drawn a short field, it does not lack talent, and is headlined by **Atlantic Jewel (Aus)** (Fastnet Rock {Aus}), who will attempt to atone for her first defeat in 10 outings last out in the G1 Underwood S. here Sept. 21. The Mark Kavanagh-trained 5-year-old took her first top-level event two years ago almost to the day in Caulfield's G1 1000 Guineas, and added a pair of Group 2 tests and the G1 All Aged S. against older rivals en route to champion 3-year-old Filly honors. Sideline for 16 months due to injury thereafter, Atlantic Jewel has perhaps returned better than ever this season, sweeping the G1 Memsie S. and G2 Stocks S. before going down by a valiant head to It's a Dundeel (NZ) (High Chaparral {Ire}) in the Underwood. The star mare's biggest threat here could be **Foreteller (GB)** (Dansili {GB}), who upended early G1 Melbourne Cup favorite Puissance de Lune (Shamardal) in the G1 Makybe Diva S. at Flemington Sept. 7. The Chris Waller-trained import finished a flat 12th after dropping out of affairs early in the Underwood, and looks to get back on track after 21 days on the sidelines.

Last year's Melbourne Cup winner **Green Moon (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}) takes in this race en route to a title defense Nov. 5. The 7-year-old Robert Hickmott charge has not won since claiming Australia's famed race last year, but as is the norm in that country, he has been gradually building up in distance throughout his latest prep, most recently finishing ninth, beaten four lengths, in the Underwood.

AUSSIES GALLOP FOR THE GUINEAS

Three-year-olds take center stage at Caulfield Saturday for the G1 Caulfield Guineas, with a field of 14 drawn for Victoria's first major spring sophomore event. Darley homebred **Long John (Aus)** (Street Cry {Ire}) heads the early betting, and will look to give the stable it's second renewal in three years after **Helmet (Aus)** (Exceed and Excel {Aus}) took this event two years ago. The gelding didn't hit the racetrack until April, but he quickly made up for lost time, taking his first two outings, including the Listed Anzac Day S. at Flemington Apr. 25. Spelled thereafter, Long John returned to finish third in the Listed McKenzie S. at Moonee Valley Aug. 24, and won the Listed Henry Bucks S. at Flemington Sept. 7 before finishing third in the G3 Guineas Prelude here Sept. 29. The winner that day was **Eclair Big Bang (NZ)** (Savabeel {Aus}), who took his first two outings at Morphettville. The Phillip Stokes-charge was not disgraced when third after running slightly greenly in the G2 Danehill S. Sept. 7, and made amends for that defeat last out. **Prince Harada (Aus)** (Haradasun {Aus}) strung together a pair of victories earlier this year before hitting the sidelines. He returned to finish second in a messy G3 McNeil S. here Aug. 31, and was most recently fifth after finding traffic trouble early in the G1 Golden Rose S. at Rosehill Sept. 14. The Peter Moody-trained **Dissident (Aus)** (Sebring {Aus}) looks to follow the same path to victory as All Too Hard (Aus) (Casino Prince {Aus}) last year, parlaying defeat in the G1 George Main S. against older horses into a win here. Dissident, who has not won in six starts since his debut here Jan. 26, was not disgraced in Randwick's George Main Sept. 21, fighting traffic troubles along the rail to finish sixth.

Hughes saddled Ramsey Farm colorbearer We Miss Artie (Artie Schiller) to a win in the GI Dixiana Breeders' Futurity last Saturday while Pletcher oversaw his Belmont runners. "That was the first time I've saddled for a Grade I and we won," Hughes said. "It was amazing. There were a lot of nerves. I wanted everything to go just right and it worked out well and we got the win. It was a good feeling. It was good to come back here and win some races."

While a student at the University of Pennsylvania, Weisbord worked as a hotwalker for trainers Walter Kelley and Allen Jerkens, then acquired a trainer's license and maintained a small stable before founding Executive Bloodstock Management, a bloodstock portfolio management company, in 1979.

In 1983, Weisbord and partners launched the Matchmakers Breeders' Exchange, a stock exchange for the trade of stallion seasons meshed with a high-end social experience. Weisbord is also credited with conceiving of and directing the American Championship Racing Series, a series of major races for older horses for which he attracted national television coverage and created industry 'buzz' in the pre- full-card simulcast era.

In 1993, Weisbord purchased a controlling interest in the *Thoroughbred Daily News* and relocated it from Kentucky to New Jersey. He has built it into the industry's leading trade daily, with over 10,000 individual readers worldwide.

More recently, Weisbord became aware of horse-tracking technology called Trakus, which simplifies watching athletic competitions through graphic displays. Trakus was originally used for hockey, but Weisbord was instrumental in adapting the technology to horse racing and now serves as Trakus chairman. The Trakus system, which follows every individual horse throughout a race, displaying its position along with distances traveled during the race, is now in use at such major North American tracks as Woodbine, Churchill Downs, Keeneland, Gulfstream Park, Santa Anita and Belmont Park, as well as in several foreign locations, such as Dubai, Singapore, and Turkey.

Weisbord's crowning achievement as an owner came courtesy of Hall of Famer and Eclipse Award winner *Safely Kept*, who he campaigned to a victory in the 1990 GI Breeders' Cup Sprint. He currently serves on the Breeders' Cup Board of Directors and is co-chair of its Enhanced Experience Committee.

"Barry Weisbord exemplifies the concept of entrepreneur in the horse industry," said Tim Capps, director of the Equine Industry Program at UofL. 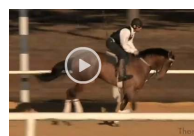

Overall, 10 former winners of Maryland Million races have been pre-entered, including defending Sprint champion **Action Andy** (Gators N Bears), **Roadhog** (Bowman's Band) in the Turf and Maryland Million Ladies' defending champion **Pagan Priestess** (Oratory). Entries for the Maryland Million will be taken next Wednesday, Oct. 16.

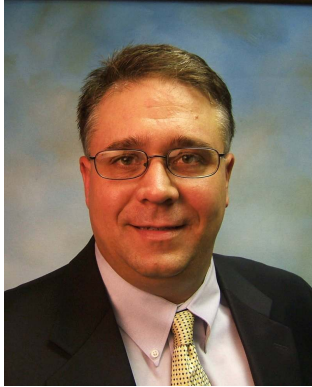

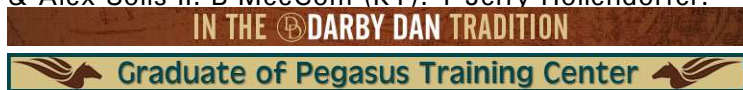
