



TO WAR

Newmarket's G1 Dubai Dewhurst S. has crowned countless juvenile champions, and while today's renewal boasts little of its usual strength in depth, it plays host to one who is almost there already in **War Command** (War Front). Joseph Allen's homebred must rate as one of the most impressive winners of the G2 Coventry S. in that race's history when storming to a six-length success at Royal Ascot June 18, and his subsequent success in The Curragh's G2 Futurity S. Aug. 24

amounted to another display of his considerable prowess. His sole blip came when third over six furlongs in the latter venue's G1 Phoenix S. 13 days earlier, which Aidan O'Brien put down to lack of peak fitness. "He ran in the Futurity and he worked after racing at the Curragh a few weeks ago," O'Brien commented. "He is in good form and we are looking forward to the Dewhurst." Godolphin enjoyed a first success in this race 12 months ago with Dawn Approach (Ire) (New Approach {Ire}), and rely solely on their supplemented homebred **Outstrip (GB)** (Exceed and Excel {Aus}). He had **Cable Bay (Ire)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) three lengths back in third when taking the G2 Champagne S. at Doncaster last time Sept. 14, and Racing Manager Simon Crisford is hoping for a bold show. "We won the Dewhurst last year with Dawn Approach and whichever horse wins the race on Saturday, it tells you that you have a live Classic horse for the following season, which is always a nice position to be in. We gave Sunday's [G1] Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere at Longchamp a miss with Outstrip, hoping for better ground in the Dewhurst. That is a decision that might backfire--we will have to wait and see. His Champagne victory was a top-notch effort and we are very pleased with him." **Cont. p5**

Second behind Toormore (Ire) (Arakan) in the G1 Goffs Vincent O'Brien National S. when trying seven furlongs at The Curragh last time Sept. 15, the high-class performer, who also took the June 29 G2 Railway S. as well as the Aug. 11 Phoenix at The Curragh, has only No Nay Never (Scat Daddy) above him in the ratings over this trip. **Cont. p5**

ALTERITE SEEKS GRADE I DOUBLE IN QEII

A strong and well-matched group of nine 3-year-old fillies lines up for today's G1 Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup S. at Keeneland. Marty Schwartz's **Alterite (Fr)** (Literato {Fr}) seeks her second-consecutive Grade I from as many Stateside tries while looking to provide conditioner Chad Brown with back-to-back renewals of this prestigious event. Purchased privately after finishing third by a neck in last October's G1 Prix Marcel Boussac, the

former Jean-Claude Rouget trainee came up a nose short of Boussac winner Silasol (Ire) (Monsun {Ger}) in this May's G1 Prix Saint-Alary at Longchamp. She was sixth behind eventual G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe heroine Treve (Fr) (Motivator {GB}) in the June 16 G1 Prix de Diane at Chantilly before joining the Brown barn. Given a 3-1 chance for connections who have done so well in the past with European imports, the bay stalked and pounced to a 1 1/2-length success in Belmont's G1 Garden City S. Sept. 14. "She's a special filly," offered Baldo Hernandez, assistant to Brown. "She's really nice. I think she's going to run big on Saturday." Fellow foreign transplant **Concise (GB)** (Lemon Drop Kid) was third in the Garden City, while GII Lake Placid S. winner (via DQ) **Caroline Thomas** (Giant's Causeway) could only manage a seventh-place run. **Cont. p3**

Concise, just one-for-six for Ed Dunlop in Britain, has improved with every start in this country for Graham Motion. The Andrew Stone colorbearer finished a fast-closing second in a Saratoga optional claimer July 25, and again arrived too late on the scene in the Lake Placid, still checking in fourth beaten less than a length. Showing much-improved speed under new rider Edgar Prado last time in the Garden City, the bay was bottled up on the rail in upper stretch, likely costing her second to GI Del Mar Oaks heroine Discreet Marq (Discreet Cat). "She's an improving filly," offered Motion's racing manager Jane Buchanan. "She breezed Saturday at Fair Hill (five furlongs on the all-weather in 1:04.60) and shipped here after the work."

The connections of **Say (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) will hope that lightning strikes twice, but that rain stays away. Aidan O'Brien and the Coolmore contingent annexed the 2011 QE II with another daughter of Galileo, Together (Ire), who was coming off a runner-up finish in the GI First Lady S. against her elders a week earlier. While Saw was a disappointing sixth last

week in the First Lady, that race was contested in a torrential downpour that forced the GI Shadwell Turf Mile off the grass two races later. Say adds blinkers this time, switches pilots from Joe Bravo to James Graham, and could prove a major factor if she returns to her Irish form. The bay annexed the G3 Dance Design S. at The Curragh Sept. 1, and was a close third in Leopardstown's G1 Matron S. just six days after that.

Hit The Board Stables's **I'm Already Sexy** (Ready's Image) figures to have a say from start to finish. The Wayne Catalano pupil cruised to a 4 3/4-length victory in a division of the Hatoof S. at Arlington two back Aug. 17, and she enters off a similarly convincing box-to-wire score in that venue's GIII Pucker Up S. ★ **"TDN Rising Star"** ★ **Great White Eagle** represents Ballydoyle and Michael Tabor, Derrick Smith and Susan Magnier's unbeaten performer remains unexposed following his comfortable success in the G3 Round Tower S. over this distance at The Curragh at the start of last month. "We are happy with him, he's in good order," Aidan O'Brien said. "He's only had the two runs, but I have been happy with his work since the Round Tower." Kevin Ryan delivered Amadeus Wolf (GB) to win this in 2005 after he had taken the G2 Gimcrack S., and he bids to repeat the feat with Angie Bailey's **Astaire (Ire)** (Intense Focus), who came to prominence when winning that six-furlong York contest on his latest start Aug. 24.

"I don't think he has any preference as far as the ground is concerned," his trainer told *PA Sport*. "You wouldn't have thought he would have gone through the soft ground at York, but he did, and I don't believe there is any such thing as fast ground at this time of year. He never leads in his work at home but I will leave the tactics to Neil Callan--he knows the horse very well. Astaire is, like all Gimcrack winners, a very good horse. He has shown us loads since day one and has since proved himself on the racecourse."

FACING THE CHALLENGE

Today's G2 Dubai Challenge S. at Newmarket offers a mixed bag of improving handicappers and steady pattern-race performers, but one who has the potential to quicken the pulse is Derrick Smith's **Darwin** (Big Brown). Despite coming into this on the back of a disappointing defeat when third in the G3 Solonaway S. over a mile at The Curragh Sept. 15, the previously exciting Ballydoyle recruit sports cheekpieces, but would not want any more rain. Ease in the ground will not inconvenience Godolphin's **Lockwood (GB)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}), who was runner-up to Victoria (Ire) (Oratorio {Ire}) in the G2 Park S. over this trip at Doncaster last time Sept. 14. Previously, he had won the G3 Supreme S. also at this distance at Goodwood Aug. 25, and Racing Manager Simon Crisford is hoping the adverse weather continues. "Lockwood is progressing along the right lines and has had a good campaign," he said. "He stepped up to a different level with his second place in the Park S. last time, which was a very good run. He would prefer some rain--the softer the better for him." The impressive Sept. 21 Ayr Gold Cup hero **Highland Colori (Ire)** (Le Vie dei Colori {GB}) steps up a panel for this first try at black-type, and trainer Andrew Balding believes that conditions have come right for the 5-year-old. **Cont. p6**

Richard Hannon saddles Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's **Anjaal (GB)**, who makes his first start since winning the G2 July S. on the July Course in this town July 11. "Anjaal would not want any more rain, as we took him out of the Champagne at Doncaster when the ground turned soft," his conditioner said. "He has been off since he won the July S. on the summer course, but he only got going at the end of that six furlongs, so he should be well suited by this longer distance. He has always worked like a top horse at home, and we think he warrants a crack at a big one."

THUNDER ON THE HORIZON

It may be that **Lightning Thunder (GB)** (Dutch Art {GB}) came up against a brilliant rival in Miss France (Ire) (Dansili {GB}) last time in the G3 Oh So Sharp S., and she will not meet anything of that caliber again in today's G2 Rockfel S. at Newmarket. Beaten just a head by the Fabre trainee in that course-and-distance contest Sept. 27, Mohammed Al Kubasi and Pearl Bloodstock's bay was five lengths clear of the remainder, and the form received an indirect boost on Sunday. That came when Indonesienne (Ire) (Muhtathir {GB}), who had also been runner-up to Miss France, took the G1 Prix Marcel Boussac on Arc day. One of the unexposed types who has real potential is Sheikh Joaan bin Hamad Al Thani's **Al Thakhira (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}), who beat the subsequent winner Expect (GB) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) in a six-furlong maiden on debut at Yarmouth Sept. 17 and is held in high regard. This race also contains the second, third and fourth, respectively, in the G3 Firth of Clyde S. over six furlongs at Ayr Sept. 21. Very little separates **Hoku (Ire)** (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}), **Ventura Mist (GB)** (Pastoral Pursuits {GB}) and **Valonia (GB)** (Three Valleys) on that form.

Phipps Stable's **Boisterous** (Distorted Humor) will break from the outermost post as he seeks his third-straight GIII Knickerbocker S. win today at Belmont Park. The 6-year-old seemed to be coming into his own in the first half of this season, annexing the GII Monmouth S. over subsequent MGISW Big Blue Kitten (Kitten's Joy) before becoming a Grade I winner himself in this venue's July 13 Man o' War S. July 13. But little has gone right for Boisterous since then. He finished a wide-trip eighth behind Big Blue Kitten in the Aug. 17 GI Sword Dancer S. at Saratoga, and could do no better than third with traffic trouble as the odds-on choice in Belmont's GII Bowling Green H. Sept. 7. He was subsequently scratched from the GI Joe Hirsch Turf Classic when trainer Shug McGaughey was unhappy with how he was doing, and could be making the final start of his career here, as he is entered in next month's Keeneland November sale as a racing or stallion prospect. "When [jockey John Velazquez] checked him [in the Bowling Green] that jarred him up a little, which is why he wasn't exactly right for the Joe Hirsch," McGaughey explained. "I was worried about running him a mile and a half, and if he wasn't 105% I didn't think it'd be worth taking the chance." Live Oak Plantation's **Za Approval** (Ghostzapper) appears the horse to beat, should he remain in the field. The grey, second to Obviously (Ire) (Choisir {Aus}) in the June 29 GI Shoemaker Mile S. and to Wise Dan (Wiseman's Ferry) in the GI Woodbine Mile Sept. 15, has scratched twice this year already due to wet conditions, and could be faced with similar conditions again here. It's no secret where Jesse Iglesias and Michael Imperio's **Plainview** (Street Cry {Ire}) will find himself early. The former claimer has proven very dangerous when allowed any sort of breather on the front end at middle distances. He paired up Saratoga optional claimer wins over the summer, and ran well to finish a close fourth in the one-mile Who's To Pay S. here Sept. 21. One for one at this nine-furlong trip, the bay has done some of his best work in Elmont and could prove an elusive longshot in the lane under Midlantic-based pilot Travis Dunkelberger. **Field p7**

Fresh off a sweep of the two graded stakes contested over the Belmont lawn last Sunday, trainer Chad Brown again holds a strong pair in the GIII Athenia S. today. Barry Schwartz's **Samitar (GB)** (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}) has failed to earn another graded stakes victory since she annexed the GI Garden City S. here some 13 months ago, but last term's G1 Irish 1000 Guineas heroine has run well in three starts since finishing fourth as the chalk behind stablemate **Pianist** (More Than Ready) in Pimlico's GIII Galorette H. May 18. A winner of the Fairy Garden S. here July 4, the bay was a creditable fourth behind recent GI Flower Bowl Invitational victoress Laughing (Ire) (Dansili {GB}) in the Spa's GI Diana S. July 27. The bay enters off another confidence-building win upstate in the Sept. 1 Speed Boat S., and is bidding to remain perfect from three tries in Elmont. Hidden Brook Farm and Dan Zucker's Pianist finally made good on the promise she showed early in her career when annexing the Galorette three back, but subsequently finished third as the chalk in the July 2 Dr. James Penny Memorial S. over yielding Parx sod Aug. July 2. She hasn't been seen since coming up a neck short of Laughing in a merry-go-round renewal of the GII Ballston Spa H. Aug. 24. Phipps homebred **Abaco** (Giant's Causeway) could be cycling up to a top effort third off the bench. Fourth off a 4 1/4-month break in the Speed Boat, the 5-year-old flew from out of the clouds to be a tough-luck second in Laurel's Lady Baltimore S. Sept. 21, good for a career-best 92 Beyer Speed Figure. "I thought she was much the best in the Lady Baltimore, but she had all kinds of trouble in the race," said conditioner Shug McGaughy. "I'm sure trying to win a graded stakes with her--I think she's deserving of it. Whether it's Saturday or not, I don't know, but she's doing awfully well." **Field p8**

AUTUMN PROMISE

Moved to Newmarket in 2011, the latest renewal of the G3 Autumn S. was won by subsequent G1 Irish Derby hero Trading Leather (Ire) (Teofilo {Ire}) and now forms an important part of this "Future Champions' Day". Whether there is anything lurking in this year's field that has the same Classic-winning credentials remains to be seen, but there are some solid performers including Ballydoyle's **Oklahoma City (Ire)** (Oasis Dream {GB}), who returns to the scene of his success in the £500,000 Tattersalls Millions 2YO Trophy over seven furlongs just a week ago. Derrick Smith, Susan Magnier and Michael Tabor's bay was second just six days earlier behind stable companion Geoffrey Chaucer (Montjeu {Ire}) in the G2 Beresford S. over this trip at The Curragh, but has obviously given the right signals to the stable to justify this third quick outing. Representing the form of the course-and-distance G2 Royal Lodge S. is **Sir Jack Layden (GB)** (Sir Percy {GB}), who was just a half-length off Berkshire (Ire) (Mount Nelson {GB}) in that Sept. 28 contest, while Roger Varian pitches the Newbury maiden winner **Kingston Hill (GB)** (Mastercraftsman {Ire}) in deep. Green when scoring over seven furlongs there Sept. 21, his trainer expects improvement. "Kingston Hill has come on for his debut," he commented. "This is a big rise in class for an inexperienced horse, but we like him and I don't think he'll disgrace himself."

Ever Blossom (Jpn), another daughter of Deep Impact, was well-beaten in 14th in that signature Shuko Sho prep, but aside from that hiccup off the layoff has had a remarkably consistent campaign, finishing first or second in her four previous outings, including G2 Sho Flora S. at the Japanese Oaks. **Cont. p10**

Assistant trainer Atsunori Hashimoto indicated Ever Blossom is in better shape this time, stating: "In the Rose S. we tried to push her forward but she wouldn't go, and she was bothered by the going, too. We didn't get what we had expected. After coming back to the yard she was back in shape right away and weighed in at [1060 pounds] on Sept. 24. On [Oct.] 1, she was at [1074 pounds]. Her last race should have done her good and I think she'll be back up to where she was in the spring." Meisho Mambo sprung a 28-1 upset in the Japanese Oaks on the heels of a 10th-place finish in the G1 Japanese 1000 Guineas Apr. 7, and proved that effort was no fluke with an encouraging fourth place finish in the Sho Rose. She defied a four-month layoff and an outside draw to finish strongly after racing wide without cover early. **Ti Amo (Jpn)** (King Kamehameha {Jpn}) could prove herself a rising force here. The lightly-raced bay, who carries the same Lord Horse Club colors as star sprinter Lord Kanaloa (Jpn) (King Kamehameha {Jpn}), has been off the board just once in four starts, and that loss was a sixth place finish in the Japanese Oaks. She rebounded from a three month layoff to beat older mares in an 1800 meter Kokura allowance last out Aug. 24.

"If everything is 100%, we're happy to go," O'Rourke stated. "We obviously have two workouts before now and entry time, and if she is anything short of 100%, we reserve the right to back out. We won't make a final decision until entry time and after we evaluate exactly where we are." O'Rourke also said that Emollient, last-out winner of the GI Juddmonte Spinster S. over the Keeneland Poly Oct. 6, also remains under consideration for the Breeders' Cup. "We'll sit and wait and see how she comes out of Sunday's race, but if she is good, we'd consider her for the Filly & Mare Turf," he commented. "We'll make a decision closer to entry time, but we'd be leaning towards taking a chance if she's bucking and kicking and doing well."

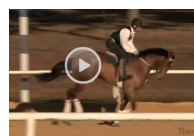

SHADWELL TURF & BOURBON WINNERS TO RECEIVE BC ENTRY FEES

Breeders' Cup entry fee benefits will be reinstated for GI Shadwell Turf Mile winner **Silver Max** (Badge of Silver) and GIII Bourbon Stakes victor **Poker Player** (Harlan's Holiday), the Breeders' Cup announced yesterday.

Both races were "Win and You're In" events that lost their designations when they were removed from the turf due to weather conditions. The Shadwell granted automatic entry to the GI Breeders' Cup Mile, while the Bourbon winner would earn a full ride to the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf.

Each horse will be required to qualify on the basis of Breeders' Cup qualifying points or through the Racing Directors/Secretaries Panel selection, as the automatic Challenge starting position was not reinstated.

According to Breeders' Cup Challenge rules, automatic entry cannot be given to the winner of a race taken off the turf. They did, however, reinstate the entry fee awards after the American Graded Stakes Committee reinstated the races to their original grades since no horses were scratched from either even. The foal nominators will also still receive their \$10,000 nominator awards.

"Since the fields of both the Shadwell Turf Mile and the Bourbon Stakes remained completely intact following the decision to run them on the main track, we've determined that while an automatic starting position into the turf races is not possible, representatives of both Silver Max and Poker Player should still receive the financial benefits of the Challenge series," said Craig Fravel, Breeders' Cup President and CEO. "We hope to see them both at Santa Anita next month."

HKJC BACKS IFHA STEROIDS STANCE

Edited Press Release

The Hong Kong Jockey Club yesterday released a statement from its Chief Executive Officer Winfried Engelbrecht-Bresges in support of the International Federation of Horseracing Authorities' stance on anabolic steroids, as discussed at an Oct. 8 meeting. The IFHA, of which Engelbrecht-Bresges is also vice chairman, noted that steroids have no place in horse racing; that the use of anabolic steroids should not be permitted in or out of competition, and that the IFHA will work with jurisdictions that may permit exceptional use for therapeutic purposes only, subject to stringent controls and a minimum stand down period to eliminate performance enhancing effects. Engelbrecht-Bresges' statement read: "The removal of anabolic steroids in horse racing across the world is key to the continued international growth of the sport at the highest level. Ultimately, it is vital for the global credibility of horse racing and the identification of the greatest horses through competition that horsemen, racing fans and the wider public understand that our sport operates a zero tolerance policy when it comes to the use of anabolic steroids. I hope that this confirmation of the IFHA's position is a further step on the road towards full harmonization on this issue across the world. The stellar quality of the fields that contest the Hong Kong International Races in December demonstrates what can happen when horsemen around the world know that they are competing on a level playing field."

ONTARIO ANNOUNCES FIVE-YEAR PLAN

The Canadian province of Ontario announced yesterday a five-year plan to sustain the horse racing industry there. The plan will provide C\$400 million over those five years to support racing-related opportunities, integrate horse racing with the Ontario Lottery and Gaming Corporation modernization plan, and restructure the Ontario Racing Commission into two divisions, one for its existing regulatory function and one for funding. A newly formed organization called Ontario Racing Live will manage the allotted funds, dividing them up between Thoroughbred, Standardbred and Quarter Horse entities. Funding for tracks will be directly tied to accountability and transparency, as well as on positive return for the public funds.

"We know how important the horse racing industry is to communities all across Ontario," said Kathleen Wynne, Premier and Minister of Agriculture & Food. "That's why our government has worked with industry and community representatives to develop a five-year plan that will build on the great traditions of horse racing in this province and attract a new generation of fans to the sport."

Minister of Finance Charles Sousa added, "Integrating horse racing with OLG's modernization will help create a more sustainable industry going forward. OLG's experience in business, marketing and responsible gaming will provide additional benefits to the racing industry."

The racing industry in the province was dealt a blow in March when the slots-at-racetracks program, which earmarked 20% of all VLT revenue from Ontario tracks to be paid back to tracks and horsemen, was ended.
