THE WAR IS WON

Dazzling at Royal Ascot in the height of summer, Joseph Allen and Coolmore's **War Command** (War Front) offered less in the way of pizzazz at a typically autumnal scene at Newmarket yesterday, but still managed to stamp his authority on the G1 Dubai Dewhurst S. Sent off the 10-11 favorite despite the preceding rain turning the ground to the slow side, the handsome and imposing bay ground his way past the

20-1 shot **Cable Bay (Ire)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) with a furlong remaining and stayed on to score by 1 1/4 lengths. "We were worried about the ground, as he's a beautiful-moving horse but he got away with it," trainer Aidan O'Brien said. "He's an unbelievable specimen to look at physically, with his movement and power and strength. He is relaxing now and has maybe gone a bit lazy when he gets to the front, but the season has been long." **Cont. p3-4**

AT THE DOUBLE

Like the former Kevin Ryan trainee Amadeus Wolf (GB) in 2005, Angie Bailey's **Astaire (Ire)** (Intense Focus) completed the G2 Gimcrack S./G1 Middle Park S. double at the expense of **Hot Streak (Ire)** (Ifraaj {GB}) at Newmarket yesterday, in the process leading home a one-two for the stable. Freshened up since winning that Aug. 24 York contest, the 8-1 shot held a narrow lead against the fence under Neil Callan and, when asked to extend

approaching the quarter pole, had all in trouble bar his barnmate, but proved just the stronger to score by a half length. "He is very tough and genuine and has filled out and strengthened since the Gimcrack," his rider said. "With each run, he is becoming more relaxed and the result is a credit to Kevin." **Cont. p5**

QUEEN OF THE KITTENS

Ken and Sarah Ramsey's homebred **Kitten's Dumplings** (Kitten's Joy) continued the unbelievable run for her red-hot sire and connections with a come-from-behind neck victory over favored G1 Garden City S. victress **Alterite (Fr)** (Literato {Fr}) in Keeneland's G1 Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup S. Saturday. "Good ones are easy to [train]," conditioner Mike Maker said. "She's a little tough to deal with. She needs more schooling in the winner's circle. She looked a little nervous in there." Winning jockey Julien Leparoux added, "She always comes from behind. We had the pace today; they went very fast up front. I tried to settle her behind, and she made a big run at the end. I tried to get a jump on Johnny [Velazquez, riding Alterite] before I actually asked this filly. We got to the lead and he never could catch us." **Cont. p6**

War Command was sent off the outsider of the Ballydoyle trio that contested the G2 Coventry S. at Royal Ascot June 18, but his odds of 20-1 were strangely long considering he had advertised his inherent class when breaking his maiden at the first time of asking over seven furlongs at Leopardstown 11 days earlier. That market scepticism centered around his ability to handle such a speed test as the Coventry, but he demonstrated such raw power in his subsequent six-length success over more precociously bred rivals that he suggested he could be a rare commodity. **Cont. p4**

After a break, that inner drive seemed to be missing as he floundered in the G1 Phoenix S. at The Curragh Aug. 11, but within 13 days he was back there to display some of his prowess once again in the G2 Futurity S. With no Kingman (GB) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) in the line-up and his own stable's more-vaunted Australia (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) put away for the season, this renewal looked below the customary standard and, with the rain turning the ground from the quick side to dead, there was a feeling that the Suffolk faithful would not be witnessing any fireworks.

Switched off early by Joseph O'Brien in fourth as stable companion **Friendship (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) shared pace-setting duties with **Stormadal (Ire)** (Shamardal), War Command was busied after halfway and joined Cable Bay lugging left running down into the "dip." Given a smack to awaken his fighting spirit, the homebred steadily dragged the stamina from that rival inside the final furlong. "The ground was plenty slow enough for him and I got to the front a mile too soon," his jockey said at the end of a momentous week which saw him break the record of winners in an Irish flat season. "He was idling like mad and waiting for the horses to come to him, so he's done well. The more he races, the more professional he gets and he'll have no problem getting a mile. The faster the ground, the better he'll be, too."

Aidan O'Brien was fulsome in his praise afterwards. "I gave him too good a break after Ascot and it just took a while to get him back," he said. "At The Curragh, he was very ring-rusty and still asleep, so he came back fairly quick for the Futurity, as I was worried he was doing too well. He's a very big, solid horse and the War Fronts we have had are very strong with great minds who travel very strongly through their races and have a lot of class. When horses have movement like that and that strong constitution, it's very hard to beat that kind of pace. When they have all that, it's magic." War Command is almost certainly done for the year now, with O'Brien looking at finishing up his other stable star juveniles. "The lads will all decide, but I'd imagine he will be put away now as he's probably done enough, education-wise, for the year. We are lucky to have some nice 2-year-olds--we have Australia (GB) (Galileo {Ire}), we have Geoffrey Chaucer (Montjeu {GB}) and Giovanni Boldini (War Front)--but they all probably won't be out again this year, so we have some to look forward to." Cable Bay's trainer Charlie Hills told *PA Sport*, "He ran another great race and he's been very consistent. We've been beaten just over a length by a good horse and hopefully he can keep progressing next year."

Astaire was introduced over this trip at York May 25 and made virtually all to open his account at 14-1 before fading to sixth in the G2 July S. at this town's other venue July 11. Back on the July Course 16 days later, the bay blitzed his rivals in a confidence-restoring conditions event before battling to a game success from the front in the Gimcrack. Soon at the head of affairs again, he had Jallota (GB) (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}) for company with Hot Streak and Jamie Spencer traveling with zest in behind. With the screw turned passing halfway, the closers were struggling--including the disappointing 2-1 favorite and ☆ **"TDN Rising Star" ☆ Great White Eagle** (Elusive Quality)--and only his barnmate was able to track him down. Veering left running downhill and allowing the eventual runner-up a dream run up the rail, he gritted his teeth when joined and began to assert again from 100 yards out.

"Amadeus Wolf set me up, so its nice to do it again, especially for Kevin [Ryan]," Neil Callan said. "I know Hot Streak had run keen over six in the Mill Reef, so I jumped to let him do his own thing and not take the other horse on."

Callan continued, "Jamie [Spencer] took a sit and I was amazed at how easy a lead I was getting down to two-and-a-half out and when I let him down he found a length and then waited for them. In the Gimcrack, he did the same thing on more testing ground and he's strengthened up and got more relaxed, so it indicates he has improved. All he was doing was looking at the jeep with the camera on the left side, so that's why he went right, but then quickened up from the other horse and found another gear. I'd be quite confident he'd get seven furlongs, but I don't know about a mile as he possesses a lot of natural speed. They say you need a sprinter to win the Guineas, and when you have a 2-year-old who wins this race you have to think about that race." His trainer added, "He was half-backing off the bridle, so I'm sure he'll get seven. Even though he made the running, he could have got a lead and at home he sits in behind in all his work and is very relaxed. Hot Streak got warm before and has done a lot in a short space of time, so that might be him telling us he's had enough for the year." Joseph O'Brien said of the unplaced favorite, "He was a bit disappointing for whatever reason and possibly the ground was a bit slow for him."

Kitten's Dumplings, a well-beaten fifth in Keeneland's GI Ashland S. Apr. 6, has done very little wrong since returning to grass. The bay put together a three-race winning streak, including Churchill's Edgewood S. May 3 and Gill Regret S. June 15, and Saratoga's Gill Lake George S. July 24. She came in a little under the radar following a disappointing fourth as the 8-5 chalk in the GI Del Mar Oaks last time Aug. 17. Seventh through a half mile in :46.56 here, Kitten's Dumplings began to improve her position down the backstretch. Still with plenty to do as Leigh Court (Grand Slam) led through six furlongs in a snappy 1:10.55, Kitten's Dumplings came rolling four wide into the stretch, reeled in the pacesetter down the lane, and was always traveling better than the runner-up for a narrow score.

Three-time winning dam Granny Franny (Grand Slam), claimed by Ken Ramsey for \$40,000 out of a maiden claimer at Belmont in 2007, produced a colt by Kitten's Joy in 2012. Kitten's Dumplings' juvenile full sister Granny Mc's Kitten graduated at second asking in Saratoga's P. G. Johnson S. Aug. 28

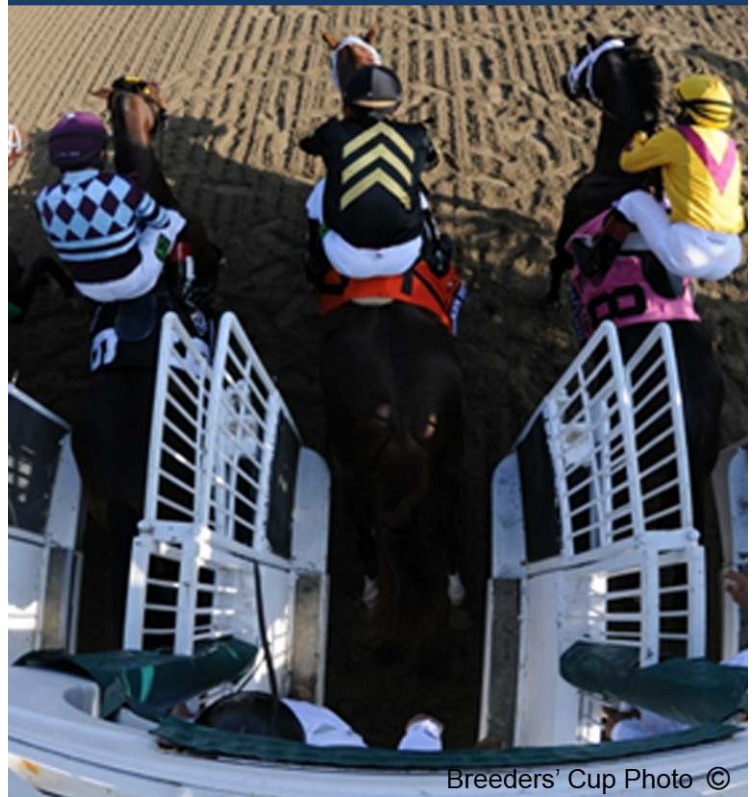

Fairyhouse July 3 and the Aug. 22 G3 Fairy Bridge S. over 100 yards further at Tipperary. When tried at further, the bay had come up slightly short, but was far from disgraced in fifth over nine furlongs in the G2 Kilboy Estate S. at The Curragh July 21 and fifth last time in the G1 Matron S. over a mile at Leopardstown Sept. 7. Restrained in mid-division early by Billy Lee, she traveled best of all and, after being given the go-ahead, cut down German raider Amarillo with 150 yards remaining before asserting her superiority in this weak-looking renewal. "They went a good gallop and she settled well and was going easily, but she doesn't do a lot when she gets to the front, so I bided my time," her jockey said of the winner, who is bound for the Tattersalls December Sales. "If they come to her, she'll give you everything."

Staying on between one-paced rivals as Oklahoma City kept up the gallop in front against the rail, he was able to mow down that rival passing the furlong pole en route to an ultimately comfortable success. "He was going from a maiden to a group race trainer," Roger Varian said. "He had to step up, but I thought he did it really well. It's nice to go into winter with a horse of potential."

Just hours after Complacent (Aus) (Authorized {Ire}) lifted Randwick's G1 Spring Champion S., Darley homebred Long John completed a cross-country Group 1 double for Sheikh Mohammed's operation. Making the most of his rail draw, the bay gelding jumped swiftly and challenged the frontrunners through the first few hundred meters before

losing a few positions on the run into the turn. Switching off the fence rounding the bend, the favorite set his sights on the pacemaking Eclair Big Bang (NZ) (Savabeel {Aus}) turning into the straight. Charging to the lead at the 300-meter mark, Long John had only to contend with a stubborn Divine Calling down the lane, but he comfortably held that rival at bay to give his connections their second victory in this race in three years, following Helmet (Aus) (Exceed and Excel {Aus}) in 2011. He becomes the second son of shuttle sire Street Cry to take this event, in addition to Whobegotyou (Aus) in 2008.

Long John had a rather undescript beginning to his career, debuting Mar. 28 in the country at Bendigo, but he quickly showed he was anything but ordinary, winning that day before adding victories in a Sandown handicap Apr. 10 and the Listed Anzac Day S. at Flemington Apr. 25. Put away for the winter thereafter, Long John suffered his first defeat on return, finishing third in Moonee Valley's Listed McKenzie S. Aug. 24. He atoned for that hiccup two weeks later when returning to Flemington for Listed Best Dressed S. Third in the G3 Caulfield Guineas Prelude won by Eclair Big Bang Sept. 29, Long John justified favoritism here, but despite his flashy-looking victory, trainer Peter Snowden was wary to commit the gelding to the same Cox Plate path that Helmet followed. "I thought Helmet could do it and it brought him undone, so we'll have to think long and hard about that," Snowden told *Racenet.com.au*. "A horse like this, if he ran at Moonee Valley [in the G2 Moonee Valley Vase Oct. 26] and backed up in the [G1 Victoria] Derby [at Flemington Nov. 2], that would be the perfect preparation for him. We'll see."

Atlantic Jewel, Australia's Champion 3-year-old Filly of 2011-12, had nearly exhausted all the superlatives in the book in stacking up nine straight victories to begin her career, including Group 1 victories in the 2011 Schweppes 1000 Guineas--against sophomore fillies--and the last April's All Aged S. and Aug. 31 Memsie S. against older rivals. Off for 16 months on account of injury after her All Aged victory, the Coolmore colorbearer showed no rust upon return in the Memsie, but suffered her first defeat thereafter at the hands of four-time Group 1 winner and 3-year-old Australian Triple Crown winner It's A Dundeel (NZ) (High Chaparral {Ire}) in the G1 Underwood S. last out here Sept. 21. Atlantic Jewel likely jumped too quickly for her own good that day, and was forced out of her element to set the pace before going down by a valiant head to the 4-year-old colt. This already short field lost some

of its luster with the withdrawal of last year's G1 Melbourne Cup hero Green Moon (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}), but Atlantic Jewel would still have to contend with the likes of G1 Makybe Diva S. winner Foreteller and her G1 Australian Cup-winning stablemate Super Cool. More relaxed at the break this time, Atlantic Jewel allowed regular pilot Michael Rodd to settle her near the rear of the pack, one position ahead of Foreteller. Little changed through the early stages, with Spacecraft setting a steady tempo and the rest of the field trailing him in single file. The real racing began past the 600-meter mark, when Atlantic Jewel kicked into gear, passing Super Cool with her sights set on the leaders and Foreteller hot on her heels. None of those rivals proved a serious threat, however, as Atlantic Jewel cantered to the lead and sauntered away with her fourth Group 1 victory, firmly establishing herself as the favorite for the G1 Cox Plate Oct. 26. "I thought it would be a tactical nightmare, but it went to script," Kavanagh told *Racenet.com.au*. "She just left them behind like we know she can. That should tune her right up now [for the Cox Plate]. I left a little bit but she'll be spot on now." Of Super Cool's Cox Plate prospects, Kavanagh added: "I'll wait and see. There's an issue there and the reason I've kept my cards close to my chest is because if the weights raise too much it's going to put him out of the race. I'll sit down and work it out from where we sit."

Veteran New Zealand galloper Solzhenitsyn took until the end of his 5-year-old campaign to try group company, but he made the wait worthwhile when scooping Doomben's G3 Lord Mayor's Cup last May. He broke through at the highest level when taking this event a year ago, with his only win in the interim being a repeat in the Lord Mayor's Cup May 18. Solzhenitsyn signaled he was as strong as ever with a second in the G2 Theo Marks S. at Rosehill Sept. 14 and a third in the G1 Sir Rupert Clarke S. here Sept. 29 to kick off his prep. Traveling on the fence in fifth early while chasing a quick early tempo, Solzhenitsyn swung wide coming off the turn at the 300-meter mark and was full of run, charging down the middle of the lane. He gained the advantage inside the final furlong and won comfortably under top weight from a slowly gaining Trevieres, cracking the A\$1-million mark in earnings in the process. Trainer Robert Heathcote told *Racenet.com.au* that Solzhenitsyn would bypass the G1 Cox Plate Oct. 26 in favor of the G2 Crystal Mile at Moonee Valley in two weeks. "Originally we paid up for the Cox Plate but [co-owner] Paul [Willetts] and the owners are very patient," Heathcote said. "We said let's get the job done this year then next year we'll set him specifically for the Cox Plate." Solzhenitsyn, a \$10,000 weanling purchase by Paul Willetts from the 2007 New Zealand Bloodstock National Weanling Sale, was nearly sold to Hong Kong earlier in his career, but failed a vet test.

A latecomer for the loaded Peter Snowden/Darley stable, Complacent played the bridesmaid's role in his first two public appearances, finishing second in a Hawkesbury maiden July 21 and filling the same spot 10 days later in a Warwick Farm handicap. Complacent kicked off a significant cross-country Group 1 double for his connections, which was completed by Long John (Aus) (Street Cry {Ire}) in the G1 Caulfield Guineas hours later, and trainer Peter Snowden noted that, like Long John, Complacent could target the G1 Victoria Derby at Flemington Nov. 2. "It's been a tremendous effort, he is a talented horse and it's been a very pleasing effort," Snowden told *Breednet.com.au*. "He will make a lovely autumn 3-year-old, but Group 1's are great to win and the Derby is just around the corner, so we will be giving it a lot of thought."

A solid third to Hogy (Offlee Wild) in the Aug. 14 Troy S. over yielding Saratoga turf, the dark bay made a mess of the start and split the field in the Gill Turf Monster H. at Parx Sept. 2. **Bear Tough Tiger** (Roar of the Tiger) attended the pace in last year's Nearctic and held well to be third behind Next Question (Stormy Atlantic) and looks to build on a course-and-distance allowance victory Aug. 11. **Escaper** (Exchange Rate) is the mild 3-1 favorite on the morning line and has shown solid form over seven furlongs this term, with an allowance success July 19 followed by a runner-up effort--with **Riding the River** (Wiseman's Ferry) third--in the GII Play the King S. Aug. 25. The 2011 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf runner-up exits a decent fourth behind Wise Dan (Wiseman's Ferry) in the GI Woodbine Mile Sept. 15, but today's trip could be on the sharp side for him.

Today's G1 Gran Criterium at the San Siro is a select affair, with the usual overseas raiders conspicuous by their absence and the all-conquering Stefano Botti stable again in pole position with the unbeaten **Arpinati (GB)** (Lucky Story). In the G3 Premio Primi Passi over six furlongs here June 30, the dark bay lorded it over some serious rivals, which included the runner-up Omaticaya (Ire) (Bernstein), who went on to chase home the eventual G1 Cheveley Park S. heroine Vorda (Fr) (Orpen) in the G2 Prix Robert Papin and two subsequent black-type scorers in **Quiz Evolution (Ity)** (Mujahid) and **Grey Greezly (Fr)** (Red Rocks {Ire}). The latter re-opposes on the back of his win in the Listed Premio Vittorio Riva over 7 1/2 furlongs here Sept. 22, and is one of a quartet of Bruno Grizzetti-trained contenders, but judging by the way Arpinati went through his return in a conditions event at the Capannelle Sept. 10, they all face a stiff task. Also from the Botti yard is the Sept. 21 Listed Premio Rumon scorer **Priore Philip (Ity)** (Dane Friendly {GB}) in what is largely a two-stable war.

MUKHADRAM GEARS UP FOR CHAMPION BID

Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's **Mukhadram (GB)** (Shamardal) was put through his paces on Newmarket's Rowley Mile yesterday as he is prepared for Saturday's G1 QIPCO Champion S. at Ascot. Partnered by Paul Hanagan in a six-furlong workout before racing, the William Haggas-trained 4-year-old, who placed in the G1 Prince of Wales's S. and G1 Eclipse before winning the G2 York S. July 27, drew away from his group-winning sprinting stable companion Heeraat (Ire) (Dark Angel {Ire}). "William had left him alone after York and he's been keen to get him back on the racecourse and get the fizz out of him," the owner's Racing Manager Angus Gold told *PA Sport*. "He had an abscess after York, which is why he probably hung so badly there, but he's been doing well since. This gallop would have put him spot on for next weekend. We just have to get him through another week. What we don't want is too much rain and the forecast, unfortunately, doesn't look too clever."

BREEDERS' CUP OR BUST

A TALE OF TWO SALES

The honors are pretty much divided, so far, after North America's most important yearling sale, Keeneland September, last month, and Europe's most important yearling sale, Tattersalls October Book 1, last week. Qatari Sheikh Joaan al Thani has had a pretty

busy week: last Sunday he won the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe with the unbeaten Motivator filly Treve; then, on Tuesday and Wednesday he announced his arrival on the sales scene, buying 16 yearlings at Tattersalls, including the new world record \$8.4-million (5 million guineas) yearling Galileo filly from the Burns family's Lodge Park Stud, for which he trumped even Coolmore. Considering the record price for a European

yearling (and still the record for a colt) had been set less than 24 hours before, when Coolmore paid 3.6 million guineas (about \$6 million) for Newsells Park's full brother to G1 Epsom Oaks runner-up Secret Gesture, also by Galileo, it's no wonder the sale lived up to its advance billing--more or less.

Sheikh Joaan left on Thursday, the third and final day of the sale, and perhaps not coincidentally, the sale did tail off; in fact, with an identical 171 horses catalogued each day, the number actually sold declined every day--124 the first day, then 110, 105. Yes, Sheikh Joaan announced his presence at the top of the market, thus increasing that number in Europe by 50%, from two to three. The way the sale worked out, it was therefore strongest at the top, and not really all that strong below the top: with 11% fewer yearlings catalogued, a 6% fall in the clearance rate from the catalogue (from 72% to 66%) meant the gross advanced by just 2.2 million guineas, or 3%. Mind you, the gross had been up nearly a third last year from 2011 (from 51 million to 68 million guineas). The 207,501-guinea average for the 339 sold this year was up 25% from last year, and is up by 46% from two years ago. **Cont. p16**

It's very striking when you break down the figures a little bit, though, and we've done that in two different ways, by buyers and by sires (see tables). There is an elite corps of sires in Europe, but there have not been as many middle-range sires as there need to be. Similarly, there is an elite corps of buyers, but not as many middle-range buyers as there need to be. There were six sires in October

Book 1 which had five or more sold and averaged over 245,000 gns (about \$413,560). In order of their October 1 averages, these were: Galileo, Oasis Dream, Dubawi, Montjeu, Sea The Stars and Dansili. Galileo, incidentally, had 30 yearlings sell for an average of 604,000gns; 28 of them averaged 340,000 gns. and the other two sold for 8.6 million.

As you can see from the table, there were 77 yearlings (22.7% of the 339 sales) which sold by these six sires. They averaged 433,441gns. The other 262 yearlings (77.3% of those sold) averaged 141,099 gns. The 77 yearlings by the six sires accounted for 47.4% of the sale's gross; all other yearlings accounted for 52.6%.

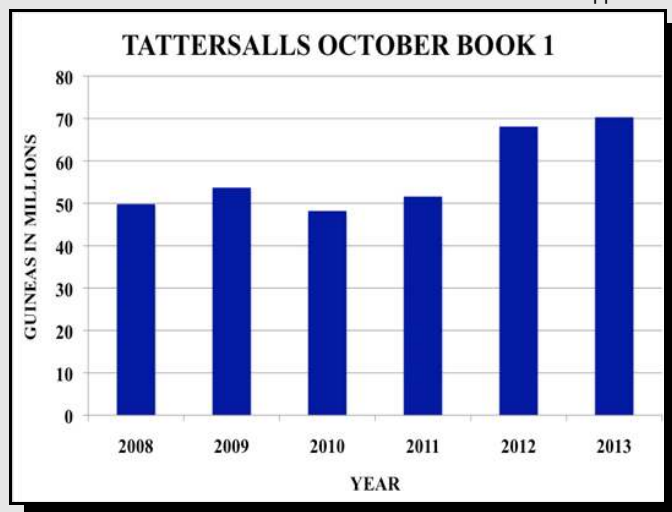

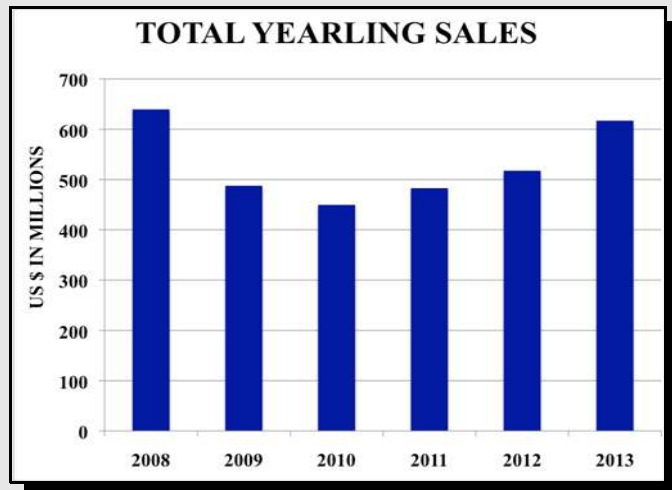

It was a similar story with the buyers. If we combine the two big UAE buyers, Sheikh Mohammed (John Ferguson) and his brother, Sheikh Hamdan (Shadwell); the two big Qatari buyers, Sheikh Joaan and his cousin, Sheikh Fahad (David Redvers); plus the Coolmore buyers (MV Magnier, Demi O'Byrne, and four horses signed for by John Warren for the partnership of Coolmore and the China Horse Club), these five buyers or buying groups bought a total of 99 yearlings (29.2% of those sold), for a total of 36,580,000 gns (52% of the sale's gross). All other buyers signed for a total of 240 yearlings, grossing 33,763,000 (48%), and averaging 140,679 gns.

We can't really make direct comparisons between Keeneland's entire two-week sale and Tattersalls' corresponding sale until the end of next week, after October Book 2, which has a four-day run starting tomorrow through Thursday, and which correlates to some degree to Keeneland Week 2 (this year, Books 2-5). Last year, October 2 had 1,043 yearlings catalogued, of which 788 sold, for an average of 39,390 gns (about \$66,490 at current rates); Keeneland September Week 2 this year averaged \$57,928. Of course, there were nearly three times as many yearlings catalogued at Keeneland as there are in Tattersalls' October 1 and 2 combined. But here's a really impressive statistic: this year, in Keeneland September, 343 yearlings sold for between \$200,000 - \$499,000. That's more horses than actually sold last week in all of October 1. This is the difference: the American market is bigger and has far more depth to it. What's missing there, for the most part, are the long ball hitters. The highest yearling sold in North America this year has been \$2.5 million. Last week a Galileo colt sold for the equivalent of \$6 million, and a Galileo filly sold for the equivalent of \$8.4 million. **Cont. p18**

This is reflected in the list of leading North American and European sires by Yearling Average (5+ sold). The accompanying table shows the 15 sires which have averaged over \$300,000 so far this year: eight are European, seven North American. Two of the Europeans (Montjeu and Monsun) have died; one of the Americans (Dynaformer) has died, meaning of now, six of the top 12 active sires by 2013 yearling average will be standing on one side of the Pond, six on the other. It has to be telling us something that the top five of the 15 all stand or stood in Europe, and the second five all stand or stood in Kentucky.

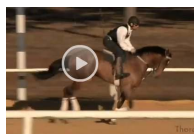
