## TIME CALLED ON CAMELOT CAREER

Coolmore yesterday announced the retirement of **Camelot (GB)** (Montjeu {Ire}--Tarfah, by Kingmambo). The 4-year-old, who was preparing for a potential tilt at the GI Breeders' Cup Turf, pulled out lame yesterday morning, and while the injury is not considered serious, it would cause him to miss at least a week's exercise and preclude a start at Santa Anita. Last year's G1 2000 Guineas and English and Irish Derby hero was likely to skip Saturday's G1 QIPCO Champion S. due to soft ground conditions. "From the

very first time we saw him at the sales, we just loved him," trainer Aidan O'Brien commented. "He was the perfect racehorse, a beautiful horse with a terrific action. Speed, class and a super-intelligent horse to go with it--he had it all. Unfortunately, we never saw the same brilliance on the racecourse as we had done before his colic operation, but he was showing signs of it at home in recent weeks, so it's obviously disappointing that he won't get the opportunity to run again." **Cont. p3**

## TATTS BOOK TWO BEGINS ON A HIGH

High Chaparral (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) so often has to play second fiddle to his illustrious stablemate and paternal half-brother Galileo (Ire), but on Monday it was his chance to shine at Tattersalls as his son out of the Dalakhani (Ire) mare Middle Persia (GB) ([lot 543](#)) led the way at Tattersalls, selling for 275,000gns to M V Magnier. He was one of 13 six-figure lots on the opening day of Book 2 of the October Sale--three more than for the corresponding day in 2012--which helped the aggregate climb by 29% to 8,980,500gns. The average and median increased accordingly, by 22% (to 46,291gns) and 27% (to 38,000gns), respectively. There was also an increase in the clearance rate to 84%, from 78%. The Castlemartin Stud-consigned session-topper was early into the ring Monday morning and caught the attention of agents Peter Doyle, Anthony Stroud and Paul Moroney, all of whom had to make way for a determined challenge by the Coolmore team, which owns the colt's granddam Massarra (GB) (Danehill), a full-sister to Tally-Ho Stud's promising young sire Kodiak (GB) and half-sister to the more established Irish National Stud resident Invincible Spirit (Ire) (Green Desert).

"He is a very good-looking horse and we've been lucky with the family," said Magnier. **Cont. p8**

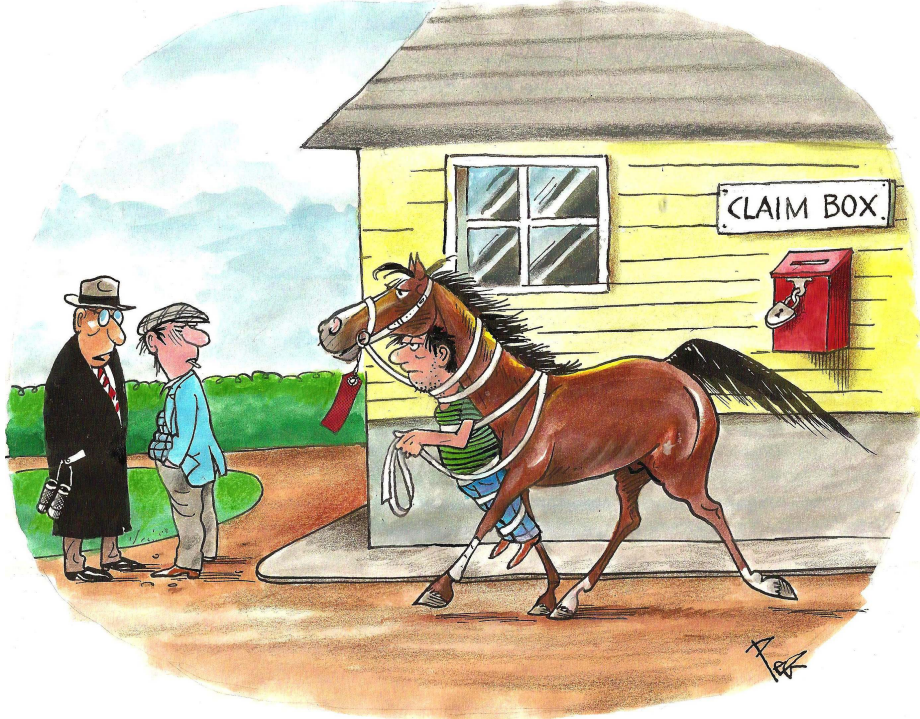

## RECKLESS ABANDON RETIRED

**Reckless Abandon (GB)** (Exchange Rate--Sant Elena {GB}, by Efisio {GB}) has been retired to stand at Darley's Kildangan Stud for the 2014 breeding season, it was announced yesterday. Prolific and unbeaten at

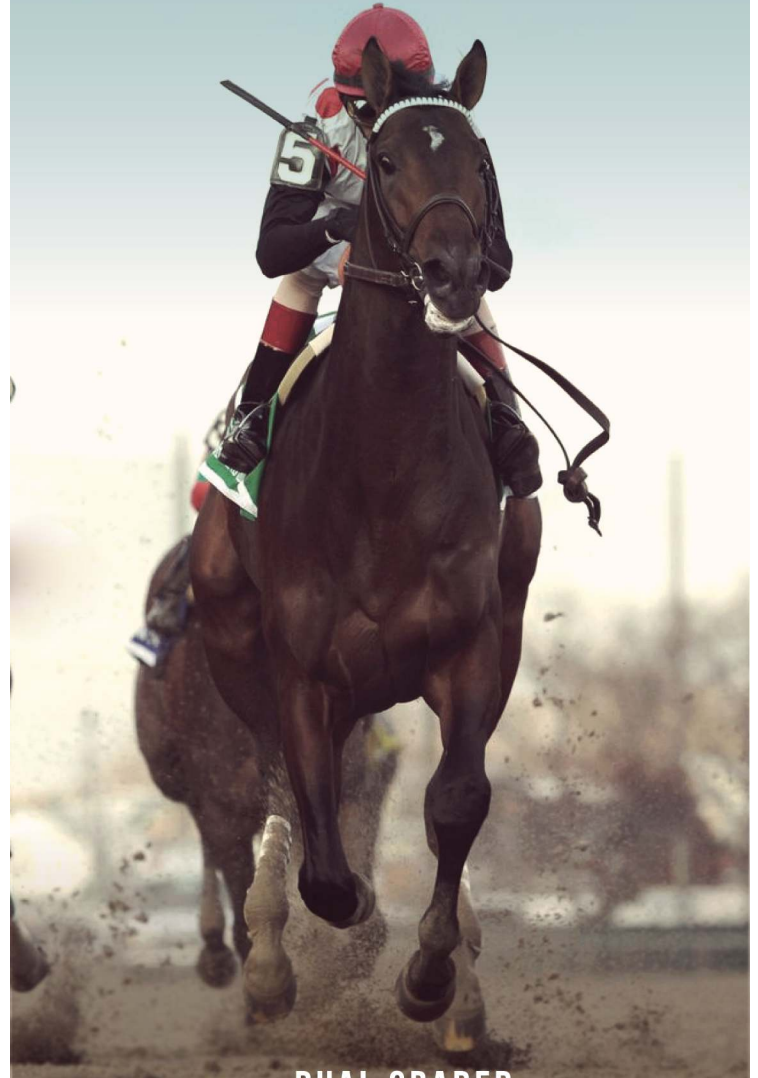
two, the Clive Cox trainee captured the G2 Norfolk S. at Royal Ascot and G2 Robert Papin at Maisons-Laffitte before adding the G1 Prix Morny at Deauville and G1 Middle Park S. at Newmarket to his tally. Despite being winless in just three starts in

2013, he remained unbeaten by his own generation at the time of his retirement and currently stands as the highest-rated 3-year-old sprinter in Europe. From the immediate family of Ticker Tape (GB) (Royal Applause {GB}), he had been purchased by Darley last September before being leased back to his owners, Julie Deadman and Stephen Barrow, and signed off with a fifth placing in last Sunday's G1 Prix de l'Abbaye de Longchamp. Sam Bullard, Darley's Director of Stallions, said "Reckless Abandon was an unbeaten champion 2-year-old, a brilliant sprinter and he has the physique to match. He's an attractive, strong young stallion and is very likely to sire precocity. We are thrilled to have him join the Darley roster for 2014 and have no doubt that he will be very popular with breeders."

Also successful in the 2011 G1 Racing Post Trophy, Derrick Smith's colorbearer took the 2000 Guineas by a neck in May before annexing the Epsom Classic by five lengths four weeks later, becoming just the third horse since Nijinsky--in addition to Nashwan and Sea the Stars (Ire)--to complete that Classic double. Following up on extremely testing ground in the Curragh equivalent at the end of June, he lost his unbeaten record when second while attempting to complete the English Triple Crown in the G1 St Leger at Doncaster last September. Unplaced in the Arc before suffering a potentially life-threatening bout of colic, he had returned to win the G3 Mooresbridge S. at The Curragh this May before meeting with defeats in his two subsequent starts in that track's G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup and Royal Ascot's G1 Prince of Wales's S. In total, he won six of his 10 starts and just short of £2-million in prize money. A 525,000gns Tattersalls October Book 1 purchase and the most expensive horse of his generation to enter training at Ballydoyle, Camelot remains the only 2000 Guineas winner by Montjeu. No fee has been announced at this time.

“Not many horses win three Grade Is for their owners, but that is what Dullahan did,” continued Jerry Crawford. “Those wins included beating Game on Dude and other older horses in the Pacific Classic in August of his 3-year-old season. In my eyes, he is from a similar mode of stallions like Tiznow, Candy Ride, Indian Charlie, or Harlan’s Holiday, as all of them were great racehorses whose sires weren’t perceived to be commercial at the time of their retirement. We believe that Dullahan has many attributes equipped to make him an excellent sire.”

In addition to the 2012 GI TVG Pacific Classic, Dullahan also won the 2011 GI Dixiana Breeders’ Futurity and 2012 GI Toyota Blue Grass. He was third in last year’s GI Kentucky Derby. On the board in nine of 18 starts, he won three times and earned \$1,735,901.

Trainer Dale Romans said the chestnut “tried really hard all the time. I don’t even think we ever got to see him at his very best, he might have been the most talented colt I ever trained.”

Stud plans for Dullahan, a half-brother to GI Kentucky Derby winner Mine That Bird, are under consideration. The 4-year-old will be shipped to WinStar Farm in Lexington for rehab and he will be available for inspection.

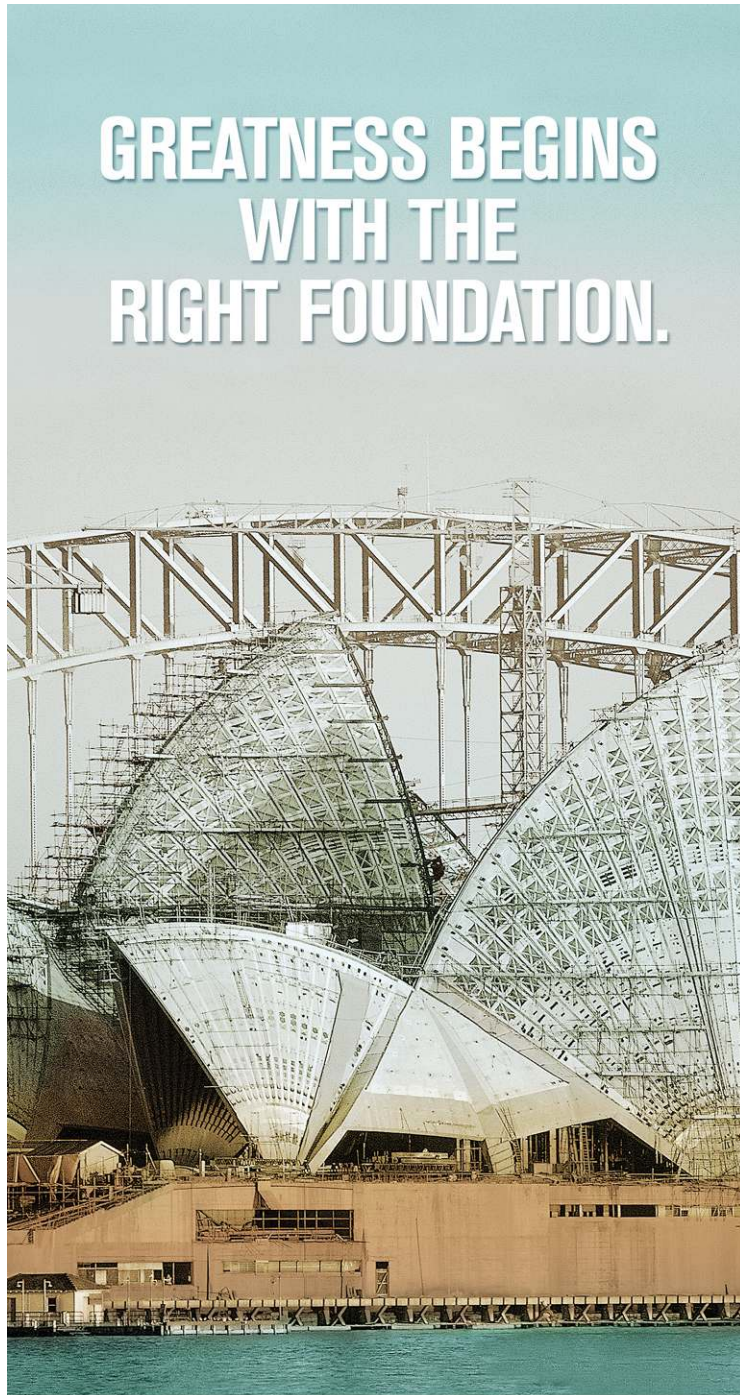
**\$500 BREEDERS’ CUP NOMS CLOSES TUESDAY**

The last opportunity for breeders to nominate weanlings of 2013 to the Breeders’ Cup program for a one-time \$500 fee closes Tuesday night at 11:59 ET. The \$500 fee entitles all those foals with lifetime eligibility to the Breeders’ Cup World Championships and the Breeders’ Cup Racing Programs. All foals sired by a fully nominated North American Breeders’ Cup stallion are eligible for nomination to the Breeders’ Cup program in their year of birth.

**RACETRACK ROUND-UP**

**SETSUKO ON COMEBACK TRAIL**

**Setsuko** (Pleasantly Perfect), last seen running second in the 2012 GI Santa Anita H., is working towards a comeback. The 6-year-old gelding breezed four furlongs at Santa Anita Monday in :52.20. “He’s about six weeks from running,” reported trainer Richard Mandella. “He had a long time off with a suspensory problem, but it looks great now. We’re doing a Seabiscuit.” Seabiscuit was second in the 1937 and 1938 Santa Anita H., missed 1939 due to injury and returned to win the race in 1940. In addition to his runner-up effort in 2012, Setsuko was also second in the 2011 race. On the board in 12 of 18 starts to date, he has won twice and earned \$656,486.

**CIRRUS HEADS CHAMPION FIFTEEN**

**Cirrus des Aigles (Fr)** (Even Top {Ire}) yesterday headed 15 entries for Saturday's G1 QIPCO Champion S. at Ascot, with the only notable withdrawal at the six-day stage being the Breeders' Cup-bound **The Fugue**

**(GB)** (Dansili {GB}). The 2011 winner, who was also runner-up to Frankel (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) 12 months ago, warmed up for his return in Longchamp's G2 Prix Dollar last Saturday. "He seems to have come out of the race in cracking form," said trainer Corine Barande-Barbe. "I think,

at the moment, he is better than ever. I think he is still getting better and will be at his top level at Ascot, so we will see what happens." Aidan O'Brien has left in Susan Magnier, Michael Tabor, Derrick Smith and Joseph Allen's **Declaration of War** (War Front), but in his likely absence could be represented by last year's G1 Racing Post Trophy scorer **Kingsbarns (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) and the G1 Epsom Derby hero **Ruler of the World (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}). The G1 Irish 2000 Guineas winner **Magician (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) also remains, but like Declaration of War is set to sidestep the contest if the ground does not dry out. "I don't know if Magician would want cut in the ground," O'Brien said. "If it came up soft, we might run the others." Like all the Ballydoyle protagonists bar Ruler of the World, Godolphin's **Farhh (GB)** (Pivotal {GB}) also holds an entry in the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S.

That race has 17 entries remaining, headed by fellow Godolphin representative and ☆ **"TDN Rising Star" Dawn Approach (Ire)** (New Approach {Ire}).

The operation's Racing Manager Simon Crisford commented, "He is doing well and Jim [Bolger] is very happy with him. He is heading towards the Queen Elizabeth II S. He had a break, having not scoped well after coming back from Deauville, but Jim has been pleased with his progress." Supplemented to the mile contest yesterday was Keith Brown's G3 Superior Mile winner **Top Notch Tonto (Ire)** (Thousand Words {GB}), with trainer Brian Ellison gambling on the weather worsening when paying the £70,000 fee. "I left it to the owner. I said 'It's your money, so you had better make the decision'," Ellison told *PA Sport*. "The ground is right for him and I just hope it keeps raining, really. We thought about waiting and trying him in a group race next year, but when would he get his ground? We'll take our chance and there might be a few to drop out yet." Likely high-profile defectors could include Sheikh Joaan bin Hamad Al Thani's G1 Sussex S. winner **Toronado (Ire)** (High Chaparral {Ire}), with Richard Hannon set to rely on the same owner's G1 Prix Jacques le Marois runner-up **Olympic Glory (Ire)** (Choisir {Aus}). Another from that stable who is almost certain to miss the gig is Ben Keswick's Hong Kong-bound **Sky Lantern (Ire)** (Red Clubs {Ire}). Mike de Kock is also wary of soft ground for Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's G2 Joel S. scorer **Soft Falling Rain (SAf)** (National Assembly). "If it gets bottomless, I'd probably have to discuss with Sheikh Hamdan about what we'd do," de Kock said. "My gut feeling is that he wouldn't want it too soft."

Patricia Generazio's homebred Discreet Marq, heroine of the Aug. 17 GI Del Mar Oaks, saw a three-race winning skein snapped in a runner-up performance to Alterite (Fr) (Literato {Fr}) in the nine-furlong GI Garden City S. at Belmont Sept. 14 last time out, but got back to winning ways against a solid group here. Sent off the 3-2 choice, the former frontrunner was taken back in fourth by Irad Ortiz, Jr., and while she resisted the rating tactics initially, settled into a smooth stride as longshot Mariel N Kathy (Corinthian) led through :23.82 and :47.17 fractions. Discreet Marq followed in the slipstream of the tracking Tapicat around the turn, bid three wide approaching the quarter pole and, after putting a nose in front a furlong from home, outfinished a game Tapicat.

Discreet Marq, previously trained by Jane Cibelli, won the May 27 GII Sands Point S. in her first start for Christophe Clement. She added a front-running 6 1/4-length victory against state-breds in the July 4 Eventail S. before heading west for her victory in the Del Mar Oaks.

"She's a very nice filly who belongs to great people," Clement said. "I'm delighted for them. I've always thought she was a top-class miler. We've been stretching her all year long, but she's good, and she overcame me, which is wonderful. Irad rode her great. He's a very good, talented young jockey."

Ortiz added, "I raised my hands a little bit because she [fought] a little with the mouth [at first]. She relaxed very good for me today. I got a lot of filly, I got a lot of horse, so I went little by little. I asked her a little bit, and she gave me what she had."

Discreet Marq's dam To Marquet was also a Generazio homebred. She was second in the 1999 GIII Tempted S. The 16-year-old mare produced a full-brother to the Pebbles winner this spring. The mare also has a 2-year-old colt by Bluegrass Cat named Bluegrass Flash.

Bumble Mitchell's decision to buy Naizak (GB) back from Shadwell as a 3-year-old for 11,000gns, having sold the daughter of Medicean to Sheikh Hamdan as a yearling for 110,000gns, proved to be a sound one, as on Monday she sold the mare's second foal for 180,000gns--to Shadwell.

The chestnut Kyllachy (GB) colt (lot 599) impressed Shadwell's Angus Gold. "Of those that I've seen so far in the sale he's the best of them," Gold said. "He's a lovely horse who showed himself off beautifully. Bumble's done a wonderful job with him, but then she always does a good job. He made a bit more than I hoped he would."

The colt, whose juvenile half-brother Smart Salute (GB) (Royal Applause) won over six furlongs at Redcar in July, was bred in partnership by Mitchell, Sally Nicholls and David Powell of Catridge Farm Stud. Margarson, who also trained the Classic-placed Barathea Guest (Ire) for John Guest, is a popular

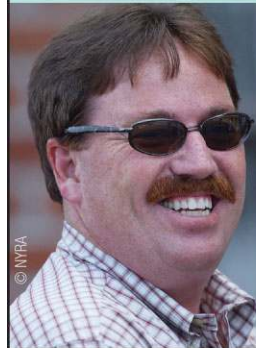

Two fillies will be heading to the paddocks at Prince Faisal Salman's Denford Stud on conclusion of their racing careers, but first they will go into training with John Gosden at Clarehaven Stables in Newmarket. Hillwood Stud consigned [lot 654](#), a daughter of Australia's former champion sire Fastnet Rock (Aus), who was acquired for 130,000gns by Prince Faisal's advisor Paul Webber. "It's a family that Prince Faisal has been trying to get into for ages," Webber said.

That family includes G1 2000 Guineas winner Foostepsinthesand (GB) (Giant's Causeway), a brother to the filly's dam Pellinore who raced for her breeder Anthony Oppenheimer. The second filly ([lot 533](#)) is an Azamour (Ire) half-sister to the Group 1-placed Drumbeat (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}), who was bought for 75,000gns. Charlie and Tracy Vigors' Hillwood Stud was in second place on the consignors' list at the end of day one after parting with five yearlings for a total of 355,000gns.

Darley homebred **Guelph (Aus)** (Exceed and Excel {Aus}) looks to have a stranglehold on Wednesday's G1 Schweppes Thousand Guineas, and if the three-time Group 1 winner can add the 1600-meter feature to her already illustrious record, she will provide her connections with a rare Guineas double after they took the colt's equivalent with Long John (Aus) (Street Cry {Ire}) on Saturday. A second-out winner at Warwick Farm in January, Guelph was fourth in the G1 Golden Slipper at Rosehill Apr. 6. She returned a week later to upend Slipper winner Overreach (Aus) (Exceed and Excel {Aus}) in the G1 Sires' Produce S., and doubled up two weeks later in the G1 Champagne S., giving her two of three legs of the Australian 2-year-old Triple Crown. Running on late to finish second to **Bound For Earth (Aus)** (Northern Meteor {Aus}) in the G2 Furious S. in her sophomore debut Sept. 7, Guelph turned the tables on that rival in the G2 Tea Rose S. at Randwick Sept. 21 before trouncing her rivals in the G1 Flight S. over this distance Oct. 5. Guelph owns a victory over this course, in last season's G3 Blue Diamond Prelude. **May's Dream (Aus)** (New Approach {Ire}) is one of the most lightly raced of the bunch, and is entitled to improve off a handicap victory here Sept. 29. Her pedigree suggests she should enjoy the added distance. **Gregers (Aus)** (Commands {Aus}) has displayed consistency throughout her short career, her only losses in six starts coming in last season's G1 Blue Diamond S., where she finished fourth, and the Sept. 7 G2 Danehill S., where she finished strongly to be fifth. She comes into this off a win over the track in the G2 Thousand Guineas Prelude.

## HORSE RACING THE ISLAND WAY

Simon Scupham didn't have the most natural foray into racing. The Bermudian businessman stumbled across the racing world by accident while studying mathematics at Sheffield University in England, when his Irish professors assigned him the task of running their bets to the local bookies over lunch. After a few visits, Scupham's interest was piqued, and the rest, as they say, is history.

"Fortunately, running bets for my Irish professors didn't hinder me academically," Scupham laughed. "I got my degree and eventually became an Associate Fellow of the Institute of Mathematics and its Applications, and also a Canadian Chartered Accountant."



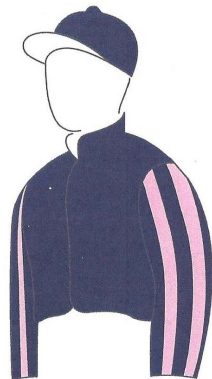

Today, Scupham, who resides in Bermuda, is the Chairman of Shoreline Insurance Managers. However, his greatest venture yet could still be up his sleeve, as he prepares to introduce

Bermuda Thoroughbred Racing to the world.

Scupham describes Bermuda Thoroughbred Racing as an "elite partnership," one that aims to gather like-minded individuals living in or connected with Bermuda who have an interest in owning and campaigning racehorses at the highest level. Scupham has joined forces with Highclere Thoroughbred Racing, one of the world's leading racehorse ownership companies, with which he has owned horses for almost 15 years. Bermuda Thoroughbred Racing will own the horses and employ Highclere as its racing manager, utilizing the expertise of Harry Herbert, Highclere's managing director, and John Warren, one of the world's most respected horsemen and bloodstock agents. The partnership will have an overriding Bermudian feel, with silks of Bermuda pink and navy blue, and the horses will have Bermudian-themed names.

Scupham stressed his desire to compete at the highest levels of racing globally—a level he has already reached as part of Highclere partnerships. The first horse he was involved in was 2000 European Champion 3-Year-Old Filly and three-time Group 1 winner Petrushka (Ire) (Unfuwain), a £110,000 yearling who went on to fetch \$5.25-million from Sheikh Mohammed as a broodmare prospect.

Five years later Motivator (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}) put Scupham in the winner's circle for the G1 Epsom Derby, and in 2010 along came Harbinger (GB) (Dansili {GB}), the highest rated horse in the world that year. Scupham's current interests include the highly promising G2 Great Voltigeur winner Telescope (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), and Opinion (Ire) (Oasis Dream {GB}), winner of the Duke of Edinburgh H. this year at Royal Ascot, who is now in training in Australia with Chris Waller with an eye toward the 2014 G1 Melbourne Cup.

"I've been involved with Harry [Herbert] for 14 years, and over those years we've had some pretty special horses," Scupham said. "It just got to the point where I thought, although they buy very good horses at the top end as far as they can go with their budget, I thought maybe we could push it a bit more and buy horses that were a bit more expensive than what they'd normally be looking at for their own syndicates, and have fewer people involved. I suppose the big kicker for me was just to find people in Bermuda or connected to Bermuda that I wanted to go racing with, rather than joining a syndicate where you don't necessarily know who the other members are, and it's not quite the same feel to it."

After spending the summer creating the company and getting licensed with the British Horseracing Authority, Scupham held his first public presentation to introduce BTR in Bermuda last month. Harry Herbert also spoke at the event.

"It's amazed me in a small community like Bermuda how when word gets out, you find all sorts of people that come to you that you didn't know were passionate about horses, or were involved in horses in the States or elsewhere, that I wouldn't have known if I hadn't started this," Scupham noted. "We did a presentation to about 35 people, sort of the who's who in Bermuda, and told the whole Highclere story and what BTR is going to be all about."

"We've gone about it sort of aggressively, and we built it like the field of dreams—if we build it, he will come, sort of thing—and it's turning out to be like that. We're probably only about two people short of what I would like to be in there, but we've also had enough interest to go ahead and buy the horses."

It was Scupham's plan to start out with two yearlings, to be purchased at this autumn's sales, and that is how it turned out, with John Warren picking out a colt by Acclamation (GB) for €310,000 at Goffs Orby ([pedigree](#)), and another colt by Arch ([pedigree](#)) for 250,000gns at Tattersalls Book 1 the following week.

“The Acclamation colt we bought, Harry thinks he’ll be precocious enough to probably be a summer 2-year-old next year, maybe one for Royal Ascot,” Scupham said. “The Arch colt we bought is more likely to be a slow fuse, more of a 3-year-old with Derby-type potential. The first horse is going to John Gosden, and the second one will go to Sir Michael Stoute, who has trained all the Group 1 winners I’ve had aside from Motivator, who was trained by Michael Bell.”

These two yearlings will eventually race for what Scupham has coined the ‘Longtail Account’—named for an iconic Bermudian bird. Bermuda Thoroughbred Racing has been established under the Segregate Account Company legislation in Bermuda, and will be comprised of accounts, with typically two horses and 10 owners in an account. This legislation will allow the horses to race under the company name, but legally for and on behalf of the account. As a way to offer owners greater involvement in racing, Scupham has also set up the Longtail 2 Account, which has purchased shares in five of Highclere’s other 2014 syndicates—10 horses in total. Those who buy into the Longtail Account will have the option to buy into the Longtail 2 Account should they wish to expand their bloodstock interests. The Longtail Account offers 10 shares at a cost of £69,950 per share, with a second year cost of £13,950 for the horses’ 3-year-old careers.

Herbert noted that, while Highclere doesn’t typically manage other partnerships, this venture made sense because the two businesses complement one another without competing.

“We haven’t really done anything like this outside of the Highclere Thoroughbred Racing brand, although we do manage the Royal Ascot Racing Club whose horses run in separate silks,” Herbert noted.

“I was happy to get involved with Simon because first and foremost I know him very well, and regard him and his wife Moira as friends. Also, this is at a different level price-wise to where we pitch the Highclere syndicates, so there isn’t any

competition between the entities. To have new owners coming into Highclere shares from Bermuda and encouraged to do so by Simon was also a tremendous incentive for us to work together on this project.”

Scupham says that while he hopes to offer more accounts in future years, 2014 will be all about getting off the ground.

“It’s all about getting people exposure to this, and about getting people in Bermuda to learn about horse racing,” he said. “We’ll do another offering next year, and if we have enough subscriptions we may do two lots of these syndicates, or even three, so we’ll have four or even six horses.”

Scupham noted that while all the partnership’s horses will begin their careers in the UK, he would like to see the BTR silks grace international racecourses as well.

Although the company’s first two purchases were colts, he said he is not biased to any particular type of horse, and would leave purchasing decisions entirely up to Warren.

For Scupham, the thrill of owning a racehorse is inherent in trips to the races and visiting the gallops and stables, and he is eager to find like-minded individuals who also share a love for and connection to Bermuda.

“It’s not a financial thing as much as it is a passion,” he said. “If you don’t get the passion, get the enjoyment out of going racing or going on the gallops to see the horses, if that doesn’t push your buttons, I think it’s something you probably shouldn’t be getting into.”

### FOR BUTTIGIEG, A 'DREAM' HORSE

On paper, Phil's Dream may be one of the unlikeliest Grade I winners this year. To begin with, the hero of Sunday's GI Nearctic S. at Woodbine has a pedigree that's way more blue collar than blue blooded. He is by a solid regional sire who, now expatriated, had nonetheless never before sired a graded winner, and was produced by a mare who won once in 27 starts, her last facing \$2,500 claimers at Charles Town. The 5-year-old gelding, making just his 12th start in the Nearctic, has had some physical issues, too, missing 21 months from July of 2011 through April of 2013 with a tendon injury. Bettors also had a hard time gauging the strength of his races leading up to the Nearctic. While he'd been very good this year, prior to a first black-type win in the restricted Overskate S. Sept. 22, Phil's Dream's biggest victory had come in open optional claiming company. Last but not least, the homebred is owned and trained by a conditioner few outside the confines of Woodbine are familiar with, Paul Buttigieg.

But then there was Phil's Dream, driving between rivals at the furlong grounds of the Nearctic and powering away from a nice field to prevail by two lengths at odds of 9-1 ([video](#)).

"I was out of breath at the eighth pole, screaming," laughed Buttigieg yesterday morning from the backstretch at Woodbine. "This horse just keeps on improving. He's good and sound now, and he keeps getting better. I really don't know what he's capable of."

The Nearctic was a Win and You're In event for the GI Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint, but Phil's Dream is not Breeders' Cup nominated and Buttigieg said he would not supplement him.

Phil's Dream has become another chapter in a book of rags-to-riches stories being stitched together by Buttigieg, who has quietly excelled in his 35-year training career with horses not born with silver spoons.

Sunday's Nearctic win was the second for Buttigieg, who turns 66 this year.

In 1998, he sent out Rushiscomingup (Bold Executive), whom he bought for \$5,500 as a yearling, to an 18-1 upset win in the six-furlong centerpiece. Since then, his homebreds have included Gypsy Ring (Where's The Ring), a MSW & GISP runner who finished a close-up third in the 2011 Nearctic and who has won \$685,000, as well as SW Royal Egbert (Old Forester) and SW Officeinthevalley (Peaks and Valleys).

Buttigieg's blue-collar horses reflect their trainer's work ethic. Buttigieg has operated Buttigieg Training Centre in Egbert, a 50-minute drive due north of Woodbine, for over three decades. The center is currently home to about 60 horses in training, roughly half of them for outside clients, including longtime patron Bob Tiller, another Canadian-based conditioner. Each morning, seven days a week, Buttigieg makes the trip down to Woodbine and, beginning at 4:15 a.m., puts his 40-strong stable through their paces. By mid-morning, he returns to his farm, leaving any saddling duties later in the day to his longtime assistant Ricky Hayashi.

"I haven't been to the races in a couple of years," admitted Buttigieg. "Ricky's been with me for 30 years, and he does a terrific job."

Buttigieg Training Centre is also home to about 40 broodmares, whose progeny account for the majority of the horses Buttigieg trains. One mare now notably absent from the center is Phil's Dream's dam Dream a Dream (GB) (Emperor Jones), who Buttigieg acquired privately when her racing days were through.

"I bought her for a hotdog," said Buttigieg. "I got this foal out of her, but then she didn't get in foal for two straight years, and so I gave her away. The folks I gave her to were using her as a riding horse, but now they're going to breed her."

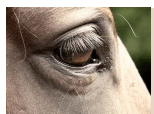
Asking about choosing Philanthropist as a mate for Dream a Dream, Buttigieg chuckled, "Well, I had bought a share in Philanthropist, and just sent this mare to him. I didn't look up the cross at all."

Phil's Dream wasn't a star from the start, needing four trips to the post to break his maiden, but Buttigieg felt his big gelding--who stands nearly 17 hands--had potential. Unfortunately, Phil Dream's maiden breaker, which came in July of 2011, would be his last start for a while. "He tried to pull a tendon on me, so I gave him some time off," Buttigieg explained. "It was small, but I didn't want to go on with him. I knew he was a good horse, but I didn't know how good."

Phil's Dream, despite the long layoff, began to answer that question this spring, when he won four of his first six races back. "Every time I worked him, he worked better; every time he raced, he raced better," said Buttigieg. "He kept filling out and improving."

Phil's Dream's victory in the seven-furlong Overskate came in a crisp 1:21 1/5, and his emphatic Nearctic win stamped him as a major player in Canada's handicap division. But before that, Phil's Dream has one more 2013 target--the GII Kennedy Road S. going six furlongs over Woodbine's main track Nov. 30.

"Then he'll get a rest," said Buttigieg. "Next year, we'll bring him back at Woodbine, and see where he takes us."

Some of last Saturday's important races surely gave us a sign of things to come.

At Keeneland, the GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup provided Kitten's Dumplings with the opportunity to become the first American Grade I winner with 3x3 inbreeding to the 14-time champion sire Sadler's Wells (Vagabond Shoes, winner this year of the GII Del Mar H. is inbred 2x4).

Significantly, the inbreeding comes through El Prado and the non-winning Franziska, two animals sired by Sadler's Wells from granddaughters of Sir Gaylord.

Earlier in the day, the historic G1 Middle Park S. at Newmarket had highlighted another example of close inbreeding to one of Coolmore's former outstanding champion sires. The winner, Astaire, is inbred 3x3 to Danehill, and this tough colt's pedigree is made all the more interesting by the fact that he is also inbred 4x4 to the Derby and Irish Derby winner Kahyasi.

This inbreeding comes about because Astaire's first-crop sire Intense Focus is out of Daneleta (by Danehill, out of Kahyasi's daughter Zavaleta), whereas his dam Runway Dancer is by Dansili (by Danehill out of Kahyasi's blue hen Hasili). The motivation behind this dual inbreeding no doubt came from the fact that Danehill's record with daughters of Kahyasi stood at 14 foals, of which 12 ran and all 12 won. With considerable help from Hasili and able support from Zavaleta, seven of the 14 became group winners, with five scoring at the highest level. Another three were group placed, so this was definitely a nick capable of laying a golden egg.

With such examples of close inbreeding, it isn't always easy to know how much the inbreeding is responsible for its bearer's talent. Kitten's Dumplings is out of a Grand Slam mare and her success came just three days after the GIII Jessamine S. had fallen to Kitten Kaboodle, another filly sired by Kitten's Joy from a Grand Slam mare. This one, though, doesn't have any inbreeding to Sadler's Wells (though she does have three lines to his sire Northern Dancer).

The way Kitten Kaboodle galloped home nearly five lengths clear suggests that she has every chance of developing into as good a 3-year-old as Kitten's Dumplings. Perhaps the credit should go to Grand Slam, whose daughters now have the eye-catching total of four black-type winners among their first nine starters by Kitten's Joy, another being the GI Secretariat S. winner Admiral Kitten.

I suspect the dual inbreeding is more significant when it comes to Astaire. His dam Runway Dancer was sold for 17,000gns as a 2-year-old and never made it to the races. Only one of her three previous foals managed to win, and that win came in a small race in Germany. There is plenty of talent further back in Astaire's female line--his second dam was a half-sister to Dead Certain, winner of the fillies' equivalent to the Middle Park S.-- and I think it is fair to accept that the inbreeding to Danehill and Kahyasi has played its part in reviving this talent.

No inbreeding in the first four generations was required to produce War Command, winner of

Saturday's other Group 1 race, the Dewhurst S. The son of War Front was following in some very illustrious footsteps in taking this seven-furlong test. The Dewhurst's roll of honor in the last 50 years reads almost like an equine Who's Who, featuring such standouts as Nijinsky, Mill Reef, Grundy, Wollow, The

Minstrel, Storm Bird, Diesis, El Gran Senor, Generous and Zafonic.

The race underwent something of a downturn, with several less-than-inspiring winners in the late 1990s and early noughties. Fortunately it has bounced back well, thanks to Shamardal, Sir Percy, Teofilo, New Approach, Frankel and Dawn Approach. Even Intense Focus, the 20-1 winner in 2008, has sired Astaire in his first crop.

The bookmakers weren't carried away with War Command's workmanlike performance, generally making him only third or fourth favorite for next year's G1 2000 Guineas, behind the sidelined Kingman and War Command's stablemate Australia. I took a more favorable view of the winner, who was so impressive in landing the G2 Coventry S. earlier in the year, and I look forward to seeing him tackle a mile.

I also consider him a very exciting stallion prospect. After his six-length triumph at Royal Ascot, my worry was that he might be asked too much too soon, in the summer's major juvenile races. My fears were based on the fact that his grandsires are Danzig and Red Ransom, two American colts whose soundness ultimately failed to match their sky-high reputations. I'm sure no one needs me to detail how these two potential superstars didn't even make it into stakes company before being forced into retirement after only three races apiece.

Of course War Command's Grade II-winning parents, War Front and Wandering Star, both proved much more durable than their sires. War Front raced 13 times over three seasons, while Wandering Star, a winner of the GII E.P. Taylor S. over a mile and a quarter, raced nine times. Fortunately War Command hasn't been asked too much, the Dewhurst being his fifth start and only his second at Group 1 level.

From the viewpoint of War Command's future stallion career, it can only be good news that his dam Wandering Star is bred along similar lines to that excellent sire Silver Hawk. In fact, her sire is a son of Silver Hawk's sire Roberto and her dam was a daughter of Silver Hawk's dam, the G1 Prix Jacques le Marois winner Gris Vitesse.

Nowadays, books of 200-plus mares are not unheard of, but Silver Hawk's stallion career took place in a less excessive time. Despite being active until he was 24, Silver Hawk's total output stood at 655 foals.

No fewer than 15 of them became Grade I winners between 1988 and 2007 and among them were the European Classic winners Benny The Dip, Lady In Silver and Mutafaweq, plus three other Europeans in Germance, Devil River Peak and Magnificent Star. His Grade I-winning American performers comprised Hawkster, Memories of Silver, Red Bishop, Silver Ending, Zoonaqu, Hawk Attack, Wonder Again and Nashoba's Key, while the Japanese have a champion son in Grass Wonder.

Altogether Silver Hawk sired 35 group or graded winners, which puts him in the elite group of stallions which manage to sire 5% group/graded winners. These days breeders are happy to use stallions with 5% stakes winners.

None of Silver Hawk's first six crops contained more than 35 named foals, and his fifth crop, born in 1988, numbered only 16, even though his fee had fallen as low as \$2,500 in 1987. This early struggle for support was probably a reflection of his failure to win anything more important than a Group 3 event during an eight-race career. However, he was good enough to finish fifth as favorite for the 2000 Guineas before going on to finish third in the Derby and second in the Irish Derby. **Cont. p18**

War Command's broodmare sire Red Ransom provides an example of how much times have changed, especially since the dawn of the shuttle stallion. He is credited with 2,057 foals, of which 107 (5%) have become stakes winners. He has justified his chance as a stallion and his stallion sons include Intikhab, sire of the outstanding international performer Snow Fairy, and Red Clubs, sire of that excellent 3-year-old filly Sky Lantern.

The other exciting aspect of Silver Hawk's career is that his broodmare daughters have shone with Galileo, as well as producing Group 1 winners to Sadler's Wells and El Prado. This suggests that War Command will eventually prove extremely useful to Coolmore.

Before then, though, let's hope that he can add substantially to the impressive first chapter to his story. With War Front as his sire, it would be a surprise if War Command were to stay much more than a mile at three, though the G1 Juddmonte International success of Declaration of War means that a mile and a quarter can't be ruled out.

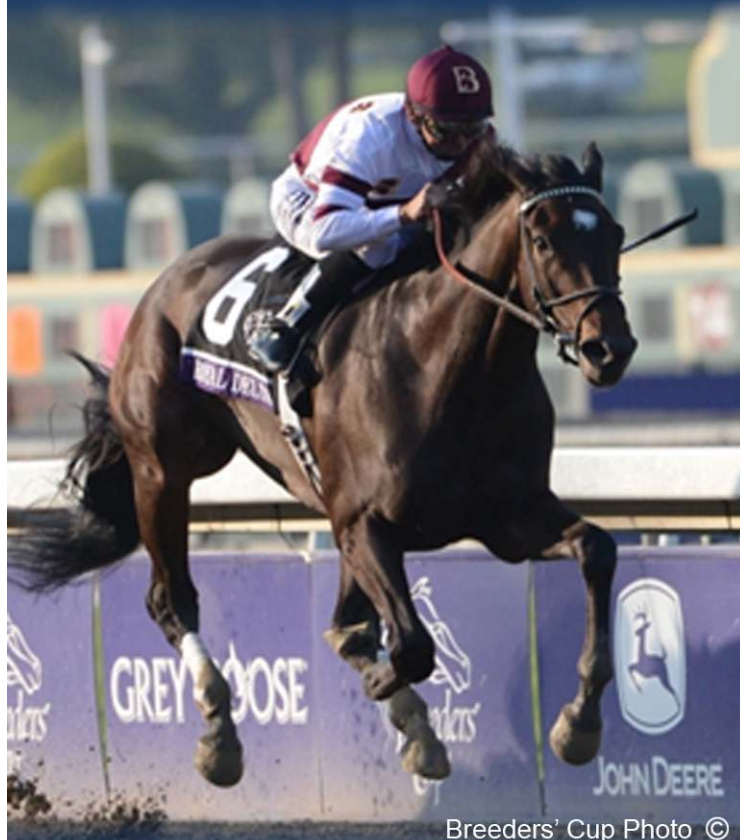

Can the Man struck the front as they hit the half in :44.50 and edged away from a game Hi Fashioned late. "He was disappointing in the two-turn race, so I thought this was time to take the blinkers off, and he drew perfectly on the outside," explained trainer Bob Baffert. Asked about the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, Baffert replied, "I don't know. It's two turns, it's sort of tough. Right now I think one turn is his race. I've got to be careful. He's still a young horse. He's a nice horse, and I think in time he'll get it." Can the Man was giving Baffert his third straight race on the card.
