## TEN LINE UP FOR CHAMPION

Jean-Claude-Alain Dupouy's **Cirrus des Aigles (Fr)** (Even Top {Ire}) will face nine rivals in tomorrow's G1 QIPCO Champion S. at Ascot, which has been affected by significant rainfall during the week. The wet weather has led to some high-profile withdrawals, including Susan Magnier, Michael Tabor, Derrick Smith and Joseph Allen's **Declaration of War (War Front)**, his G1 Irish 2000 Guineas-winning stable companion **Magician (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) and multiple Group 1 heroine **Sky Lantern (Ire)** (Red Clubs {Ire}). Last year's G1 Racing Post Trophy hero **Kingsbarns (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) is a surprising runner in the same card's G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. His re-routing leaves Ballydoyle

with a sole Champion S. representative in the form of G1 Epsom Derby hero **Ruler of the World (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), who will be partnered by Ryan Moore after it was announced that Sir Michael Stoute's number one had passed over that stable's **Hillstar (GB)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}). With Joseph O'Brien unable to make the weight on Ruler of the World, Moore made the decision to jump ship, and Richard Hughes has subsequently stepped in for the ride on Sir Evelyn de Rothschild's homebred from Freemason Lodge. **Cont. p3**

## DANDINO DRAWS WIDE FOR CAULFIELD CUP

Jockey Craig Williams will go for a third consecutive victory in Saturday's G1 Caulfield Cup in Melbourne, but to do so, he will need to work out a trip from barrier 19 astride last-out American St. Leger hero **Dandino (GB)** (Dansili {GB}). Williams, who guided Southern Speed (Aus) to the victory in 2011 and Dunaden (Fr) last year, admits to cringing when stalls were drawn Wednesday. "I did flinch when draw 19 came up, so it just means he is going to need a lot more luck in the early part of the race," Williams told *AAP*. "But he gives me great confidence going into the race, even from the wide draw." Should the three emergencies fail to draw in to the race, Dandino will have the 16 hole to overcome. **Cont. p10**

## NOVELLIST SOLD TO SHADAI, RETIRED

The Yoshida family's Shadai Corporation, based in Hokkaido, has purchased Germany's international star **Novellist (Ire)** (Monsun {Ger}--Night Lagoon {Ger}, by Lagunas {GB}) for an undisclosed sum. Dr. Christoph Berglar's homebred, who smashed Ascot's 12-furlong track record by two seconds when annexing the July 27 G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth S., has been retired from racing and will leave trainer Andreas Wohler's Gutersloh base for Japan at the end of this week. From 2014 onwards, he will be stationed at Shadai and Berglar has indicated he will support the 4-year-old with his own mares by retaining breeding rights in the future

stallion. "Since 2011, the center of my breeding activities has been in Kentucky, where our family is running Stonereath Stud, and we contemplated standing him ourselves in the United States," explained Berglar. "However, as a stayer and turf horse, and with 75% of all races in the U.S. run over shorter distances and on dirt, Novellist would have had limited opportunities to succeed in that environment. A few established European farms were interested, but it became obvious that European valuations of the horse as a breeding prospect were certainly far removed from the Japanese offer we received. Novellist will be an interesting addition to the Japanese Thoroughbred gene pool and should have a fair chance that he will be as successful a stallion as he was a racehorse." **Cont. p3**

Berglar continued, "We still have his dam Night Lagoon as an active broodmare and two half-sisters to Novellist as upcoming broodmare prospects, and therefore the family should be standing on a sound foundation for the near future." Runner-up in last year's G1 Deutsches Derby, Novellist was unbeaten in his last five starts and, in addition to his Ascot romp, garnered top-level victories in the G1 Gran Premio Del Jockey Club Italiano, G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud and G1 Grosser Preis von Baden. He was scratched from this month's G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe after found to be running a high temperature and retires with a career record of 11-9-1-0, and earnings of €1,443,632.



# TATTERSALLS OCTOBER BOOK 2

## BOOK 2 CLOSES WITH RECORD HIGHS

When sales formats are constantly changing, it's hard to draw direct comparisons, and new records are easily set. But there's little doubt that the frenetic level of trade witnessed during the four-day Book 2 of the Tattersalls October Sale, which concluded on Thursday, was a return to the pre-recessionary highs of 2007, and in most sectors surpassed those levels.

The aggregate of 36,359,500gns, achieved from 23 fewer horses than last year, made this a record-breaking Book 2, with turnover improving by a whopping 17%. The indicators of median and average each improved, by 16% and 21%, respectively, from 2012, while the previous record median for Book 2--of 35,000gns in 2007--was surpassed this year and reached 37,000gns. The 2007 average is still the highest on record at 50,544gns, but the 47,529gns figure set this year is an improvement on any year in between, when the bloodstock industry faced darker days. Encouraging, too, was the clearance rate of 87%, a record since Book 2 began in 2004. The same was true for the number of six-figure lots sold, which was 62 compared to a previous high of 55.



Another 7,808,500gns was traded during the final day of the sale, accounting for a 9% increase on last year's fourth session. The session average of 44,620gns was up by 29% (from 34,529gns) and the median rose to 35,000gns, up by 17% (from 30,000gns). The last-day clearance rate dropped slightly to 85%.

"Record turnover at Book 2 for the third consecutive year is a pretty remarkable achievement and a clear indication of the sale's standing in the European yearling sales calendar," said Chairman Edmond Mahony. "The extraordinary events of last week will sit proudly in the record books for many years to come, but the depth to the Book 2 trade has been equally gratifying. Buyers from more than 20 countries, including Australia, Hong Kong, India, Japan, New Zealand and Ukraine have all made a significant contribution and, similar to Book 1, the influence of our wide cross section of buyers from the Gulf region has been immense."

**Winning Combination...**

Bumble Mitchell, The Kathryn Stud and Ross Doyle combined in the top lot for the whole sale--the 320,000gns daughter of Motivator who sold on Wednesday--and the next day it was the turn of Peter Doyle to sign for a Rip Van Winkle (Ire) colt (lot [1346](#)) at 170,000gns. He was consigned by Mitchell for The Kathryn Stud's owners' Fergus and Kathryn Anstock. Out of the Machiavellian mare Have Faith (Ire), a half-sister to G1 Nassau S. winner Favourable Terms (GB) (Selkirk), the colt is the second most expensive by his sire to sell this week. Eighteen of his first crop changed hands during Book 2 for a highly respectable average of 75,222gns (approximately €93,400) from a 2011 covering fee of €20,000. Mitchell sold all five of her Book 2 yearlings for an average of 152,600gns, making her the leading consignor among those vendors with more than one yearling sold.

**The Right Approach...**

Norfolk-based breeder Paddy Barrett enjoyed a decent result during the final session when his New Approach (Ire) colt (lot [1272](#)) was one of two purchases for John Ferguson. Sheikh Mohammed's buyer purchased the son of the Darley stallion from the family of Classic winner Sleepytime (Ire) for 160,000gns. He was offered by Peter and Frances Stanley's New England Stud, where Barrett boards his mares.

"It's all down to New England's advice," said Barrett. "Peter was sure he'd sell well, but you never know what is going to happen until you are in the ring. Luke Lillingston bought the mare for me and he is sure something good is going to come out of her."

The colt's dam Faslen (Fasliyev) was a dual winner in France and her first foal, Don't Be (GB) (Cape Cross {Ire}) is also now a winner.

Barrett, whose interest in racing was piqued when working part-time in a bookmaker's shop before setting up his own business, owns several mares in partnership with Stanley and Lillingston, and together the trio bred Highclere Thoroughbred Racing's four-time listed winner Gusto (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}). **Cont. p7**

Ferguson's only other purchase during Book 2 was Street Cry (Ire)'s sole representative in the catalogue (lot [1323](#)), who was bought for 145,000gns from the Voute Sales draft. The January-born colt is the first produce of the Dansili (GB) mare Glowing (Ire), who won the G3 Brownstown S. at Fairyhouse when trained by Charles O'Brien for his sister Sue Magnier.

**Brummerhof Strikes...**

A 3/4-sister to GIII Robert G Dick Memorial S. winner Cheetah (GB) (Tiger Hill {Ire}) is on her way to Germany to race for Gregor and Julia Baum, the breeders of German wonder filly Danedream (Ger). The daughter of Duke of Marmalade (Ire) from the Aga Khan-bred mare Kassiyra (lot [1409](#)), is a graduate of Luca and Sara Cumanis's Fittocks Stud, and hails from a family which has a special association for the couple, as it also includes their 1988 Derby winner Kahyasi (GB). The Cumanis sold Cheetah at the December Sale in 2010, where she fetched 180,000gns to continue her racing career in America. Her 3-year-old half-brother Diamond Mine (GB) (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}), a winner at Kempton Oct. 1, is catalogued to sell in a fortnight's time during Tattersalls' Horses In Training Sale.

After Sara Cumanis thanked Gregor Baum for buying the filly, who was consigned through Highclere Stud, the owner of Gestut Brummerhof said: "She'll be coming to Germany to be trained by Paul Harley in Hanover."

Baum is President of Hanover Racecourse and has around 25 horses in training, with Harley as his retained trainer.

He added, "We've managed to buy three this week. This filly was one of my two favourites--the other was the Motivator filly who made 320,000gns last night."

**Jumping Ship...**

Flat trainer Jamie Osborne is a man with his roots firmly in the jumps racing--he retired as a National Hunt jockey in 1999 after a highly successful career--and he has managed to persuade a major jumping owner to have a 2-year-old in training with him next season. The youngster in question is a Mastercraftsman filly out of the Alhaarth mare Khibraat (lot [1418](#)), who was bought for Richard Kelvin-Hughes for 135,000gns and knocked down to Anthony Stroud.

"This is the first horse Richard will have with me but he's had the odd flat horse in the past," said Osborne of the owner of such jumping stars as My Petra (GB) and Chomba Womba (Ire). "She's a really smart filly by a sire's who's made a good start--he's looking like he could be the real thing," he added. "I've had a little bit more money to spend this year. The market has been strong but fortunately I've been able to buy a few nice ones and fingers crossed they'll do us proud."

The filly, a half-sister to the Group 3-placed Cavaleiro (Ire) (Sir Percy {GB}), was offered by Peter and Antoinette Kavanagh of Kildaragh Stud, who bred her in partnership with Michael Downey.

### The Next Big Sprinter?...

Emma Armstrong, who, with husband David, raced homebred G1 July Cup winner Mayson (GB) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}), selected another speedy sort to carry the family's red-and-white silks next season. The Highfield Farm owner went to 150,000gns for lot [1337](#), a colt by Acclamation (GB) from the winning sprinter Green Poppy (GB) (Green Desert).

He was one of a trio of colts to sell for that amount during the final session, including Egmont Stud's son of High Chaparral (lot [1311](#)), a good pinhook by Paula Flannery, who bought him for 28,000gns at the December Sale. The last of the three was a Carmel Stud-consigned son of Bahamian Bounty (GB) (lot [1309](#)) out of the winning Miswaki mare Galapagar, who was one of Shadwell's 27 Book 2 purchases. Sheikh Hamdan enjoyed success in the G2 July S. at Newmarket earlier this year with another colt by The National Stud resident, the Richard Hannon-trained Anjaal (GB). He too was bred and consigned by Carmel Stud, fetching 105,000gns in the same ring last year.

### Tallying Up...

Following a week when Sheikh Mohammed Al Maktoum of Dubai and Qatar's Sheikh Joaan Al Thani each spent more than 10 million guineas on yearlings in Book 1, the Middle Eastern dominance has continued to be a significant factor in Book 2.

Peter and Ross Doyle topped the buyers' list with 41 bought for 3,587,000gns. It's unclear whether any of those horses are for Sheikh Joann--the Doyles, along with Nicoals de Watrigant were his agents in Book 1--but second and third on the list are Sheikh Hamdan's Shadwell Estate Company and Rabbah Bloodstock, a team of associates of Sheikh Mohammed. Those two outfits bought a total of 93 yearlings for 5,094,000gns, in Book 2, or 12% of the total number sold.

In contrast, David Redvers' spending on behalf of Sheikh Fahad Al Thani, who was present during the first few days of Book 2, was more measured. Redvers signed for 10 yearlings, including one colt by the sheikh's freshman sire Makfi (GB), for an outlay of 721,000gns.

As in 2012, The Castlebridge Consignment topped the vendors' list at Book 2, selling 29 yearlings for a total of 1,141,000gns. Hillwood Stud also exceeded the million-guineas mark, its 20 sold fetching 1,032,000gns. Rathbarry Stud's Acclamation (GB) was best represented numerically and duly topped the sires' list by aggregate with 38 sold for 2,266,000gns. Among the stallions with more than two yearlings sold, the Irish National Stud's Big Bad Bob (Ire) returned the best average, of 91,500gns for four sold.

The October Sale's one-day Book 3 starts today at 10 a.m. local time.

## BLACK-TYPE PREVIEWS

### OVERFLOW FIELD FOR VALLEY VIEW

Keeneland will play host to a full field of 3-year-old fillies in today's GIII Pin Oak Valley View S. Bona Venture Stables's **Summer of Fun** (Include) gets the morning-line nod at 2-1 as she seeks the first graded stakes tally of her career. Third, beaten just a head in the course-and-distance GIII Jessamine S. here 12 months ago, the dark bay finished off her juvenile campaign with a third-place run at 43-1 in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf. She resurfaced to annex a Gulfstream optional claimer in March, and fell a nose short to subsequent GI American Oaks runner-up Emotional Kitten (Kitten's Joy) in Pimlico's Hilltop S. in May. The George Weaver trainee returned to winnings ways two back in Saratoga's Auntie Mame S. Aug. 10, and checked in a close-up fifth behind last Saturday's GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup runner-up Alterite (Fr) (Literato {Fr}) in Belmont's GI Garden City S.

Sycamore Racing's **Nellie Cashman** (Mineshaft) appears for the first time since she was disqualified from first to third in the Spa's GII Lake Placid S. Aug. 18. She had previously upended Colonial's GIII Virginia Oaks at 19-1 July 13 after breaking her maiden in her seventh attempt a month earlier. Nellie Cashman had been invited to the QE II, but was forced to run here after missing some training. "She came down with a little fever and we missed a day of training, but she was fine by Saturday," said trainer Francis Abbott III. "If it had been a morning ship, she could have run instead of shipping here and missing another day or two. I blew her out three-eighths [Wednesday] morning and she got here last night about 10."

New York-bred **Unbelievable Dream** (Kitalpha) flew from out of the clouds to nip **Overheard** (Macho Uno) in the GIII Appalachian S. here in April, but has endured a four-race winless drought since then. The Sure Thing Stables homebred did show some life last time to be third in a pacesetter running of Saratoga's Aug. 30 Riskaverse S., and could have a say late if she's cycling back up to her best.

## JOCKEY CLUB RELEASES RMB STATISTICS

The Jockey Club released its Report of Mares Bred statistics for the 2013 breeding season yesterday. They reported that 1,698 stallions covered 34,174 mares in North America, which represents about 90% of mares that will eventually be reported as bred this year.

Among the noteworthy changes was that Ontario, Canada, where the state of racing had been in flux following the cancellation of the Slots at Racetracks program, saw a 44% decrease in the number of mares bred.

The number of stallions overall declined 8.8% from last year and the number of mares dropped 3.4%. The number of stallions covering 100 mares or more increased from 87 last year to 88 this year.

Analysis also shows a 2.9% increase in the number of mares bred to stallions with a book size of 100 or more in 2013; an 11.6% decrease in mares bred to stallions with a book size between 75 and 99; an 11.3% increase in mares bred to stallions with a book size between 50 and 74; a 15.9% decrease in mares bred to stallions with a book size between 25 and 49; and a 5.3% decrease in mares bred to stallions with a book size fewer than 25.

The leading stallion by mares bred this year was Into Mischief with 210, followed by Archarcharch and Harlan's Holiday, both with 187; Kitten's Joy with 184; and Majestic Warrior with 176.

During 2013, Kentucky's 235 reported stallions covered 15,695 mares, or 45.9% of all of the mares reported bred in North America. The number of mares bred to Kentucky stallions increased 2.2% percent compared with the 15,361 reported at this time last year.

Of the top 10 states and provinces by number of mares reported bred last year, only Kentucky, Oklahoma, and Texas stallions covered more mares than in 2012. The following table shows the top 10 states and provinces, ranked by number of mares reported bred in 2013 through October 10:

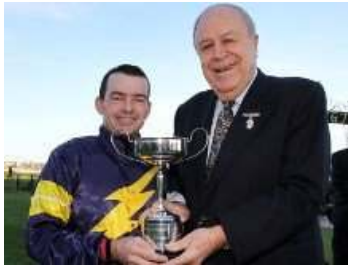

### ANDREW RAMSDEN DIES SUDDENLY

Andrew Ramsden, a prolific owner and former chairman of the Victoria Racing Club, suffered a stroke and died suddenly in the Committee Room at the Caulfield races Wednesday afternoon. He was 79 years old. Born on Victoria Derby day 1934, Ramsden was a

two-time winner of the G1 Melbourne Cup (Gurners Lane and Brew) and raced the winners of four G1 Caulfield Cups (Gurners Lane, Paris Lane, Sky Heights and Descarado). He is a co-owner of Manighar (Fr) (Linamix {Fr}), who races in Saturday's Caulfield Cup at the Sydney oval. Ramsden, who served the VRC as its chairman from

1998 to 2003, had reportedly not missed a Caulfield Cup since 1946. The Duke of Norfolk S., run at Melbourne's Flemington Racecourse, was renamed the Andrew Ramsden S. in 2005. Niwot (Aus), a horse co-owned by Ramsden, won the event in 2011. Tributes poured in from across the racing industry following the news of Ramsden's passing. "The Victorian racing industry is saddened at the loss of Andrew Ramsden who has left an indelible mark on the sport in this state and abroad as a legendary administrator and a highly successful owner," said Rob Roulston, chairman of Racing Victoria. "As then VRC Chairman, Andrew was instrumental in the establishment of Racing Victoria in 2001 to allow the industry to prosper and his efforts in doing so will be long remembered. The Board and staff of Racing Victoria extend their sympathies to Anne, Michael and the Ramsden family on the passing of a visionary and true icon of the Victorian racing industry." Added Victorian Premier Dennis Napthine, "Today, Victoria's racing industry lost one of its illustrious contributors with the passing of Mr. Andrew Ramsden. On behalf of the Victorian government and the Victorian racing industry, I pay tribute to Andrew's many years of dedicated service to racing and the passion he held for this great industry."

Grimthorpe. "Winsili was prepared for the the Prix l'Opera at Longchamp, but didn't go because of unsuitable ground," he told *PA Sport*. "The Filly and Mare was the other race we had in mind and it's all systems go for the States, because she will like the track and the faster ground."

### Private Zone Fires Bullet...

Good Friends Stable's **Private Zone** (Macho Uno) fired a four-furlong bullet in :45.80 (1/21) at Santa Anita yesterday morning as he prepares for the G1 Breeders' Cup Sprint Nov. 2. Regular pilot Martin Pedroza was aboard for the drill. "He worked fantastic," trainer Doug O'Neill said of the Sept. 28 G1 Vosburgh Invitational winner. "He was visually super-impressive. He just flew around there. He's spot-on ready to go." The 4-year-old enters the Breeders' Cup a relatively fresh horse. After a ninth-place run in the G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen in March, he did not race again until Del Mar's Pirate's Bounty S. Sept. 4. "It was Rene's idea to freshen him up," O'Neill said, referring to former jockey Rene Douglas, who was paralyzed in an accident at Arlington in 2009 and now serves as racing manager of Good Friends. "I think that did a world of good. He's come back gangbusters and he continues to look great. I love how we're doing coming into the biggest race of his life."

### Alpha Confirmed for Mile...

Godolphin's two-time Grade I winner **Alpha** (Bernardini) has been confirmed for a tilt in the G1 Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile Nov. 1. A dead-heat winner of last year's G1 Travers S., the homebred returned to the winner's circle two back in that venue's G1 Woodward S. Aug. 31 before most recently finishing sixth in the G1 Jockey Club Gold Cup over 10 furlongs at Belmont Sept. 28. "We're going there with three others," trainer Kiaran McLaughlin explained to *Daily Racing Form* of what went into the decision to go to Santa Anita. "We thought we had everything to gain and not much to lose. He's doing great. We thought we'd give it a try." Alpha, who worked four furlongs in :49.22 (4/23) over Saratoga's Oklahoma Training Track Thursday, will be piloted for the second straight time by Joe Bravo in the Breeders' Cup. McLaughlin's other Breeders' Cup hopefuls are **Dance Card** (Tapit) (G1 Filly & Mare Sprint), **Dancing House** (Tapit) (G1 Juvenile Fillies or G1 Juvenile Fillies Turf) and **Sky Painter** (Street Cry {Ire}) (Juvenile Fillies Turf).

### Guelph To Get a Break...

Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid al Maktoum's treble Group 1 winner **Guelph (Aus)** (Exceed and Excel {Aus}), who took out Wednesday's G1 Schweppes Thousand Guineas in front-running fashion, will head to the paddocks for a spell and has therefore been ruled out of a tilt at the G1 Cox Plate Oct. 26. "We sat down, just laid the cards on the table. There's no dramas with her but everyone just felt she has done the job this time through and there's nothing else to prove," Darley's Melbourne stable foreman Paul Snowden told *AAP*. "So we look forward to next preparation." Snowden indicated that Sheikh Mohammed would make the call as to whether the homebred daughter of Camarilla (Aus) (Elusive Quality) continues her career in Australia or elsewhere. Winner of the G1 Champagne S. last April, Guelph won the G2 Tea Rose S. Sept. 21 and the G1 Flight S. Oct. 5 prior to her Guineas success.

### Trading to Return Next Year...

Trainer Jim Bolger revealed that **Trading Leather (Ire)** (Teofilo {Ire}) will be back in 2014 after ruling him out of tomorrow's G1 QIPCO Champion S. at Ascot. With ground conditions against the G1 Irish Derby hero, the homebred who was also runner-up in the G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth S. has been put away for the year. "There's nothing else for him this season, he's finished for the year," Bolger told *PA Sport*. "He was very impressive in the Irish Derby and ran well in the King George. When he gets his ground he's a very good horse, but I expect him to be much better next season. I don't think he was mature enough to do himself justice really this season and as a 4-year-old, I expect him to be one of the best."

### THE FIRST TEE...THE TRUE MEASURE OF A MAN

As the crow flies, David Greathouse grew up a mile or two from me, on the Elkhorn Creek downstream. Though we both were similar in age and both sons of small breeders and both raised on our dad's horse farms, both of which were in Midway, David and I didn't bond until we reached our 30s. That friendship I speak of wasn't born in the track kitchen at Keeneland, or the "round room" in the sale pavilion, or even in Naples and Everglades City where we would bump into each other snook fishing from time to time... but on the golf course. I picked up golf in my late 20s and, like many people do, I fell head-over-heels for the game. Upon realizing that golf courses were as much hotbeds for gambling endeavors in all shapes and sizes as they were beautiful sites for incredible athleticism, I remember thinking, "Wow...this is the greatest thing under the sun." David and I soon began our journey together, sometimes two and three days a week in the summers. As you can imagine, I was welcomed with arms wide open by the seasoned golfers in town, most of whom had been playing with David for decades and all of whom loved David very much. As you can also imagine, I paid my dues becoming part of the gang. It didn't take me as long, however, to know, whether it be at Idle Hour or Lexington Country Club or Spring Valley or Champions...that David was unique. You see, sometimes the stakes were substantial and the characters were colorful, and we all learned pretty well where our handicaps were, or should have been. Having performed our stretching, and hitting some practice balls and stroking a few practice putts, one could see the tension building as we walked up to the first tee, ready to establish our team games and assign strokes. This part of the day wasn't always fun, as it generally brought forth conflict. Let's face it...it was rarely a two-dollar Nassau we are talking about here. Looking back on those former days, there was one man in our midst that you could always count on to be fair when we reached this point of the day--no matter the stakes, big or little, or whether he had been recently winning or losing, and that was David. Though he was intensely competitive, he always wanted to be fair--he always wanted everyone to have a fair shot. It was second nature for him to do the right thing. I know David was a gifted horseman and that he was successful for many decades in a very tough business, but where I will remember him most, and where I grew to love him, was on the first tee.

**FALL SALE ENDS STELLAR YEAR FOR OBS**

The Ocala Breeders Sales Company concluded a stellar 2013 sales season with a strong renewal of the Fall Mixed Sale. The sale, which concluded its two-day run in Ocala Wednesday, registered dramatic increases across the board.

During Tuesday’s consignor preferred session, 118 horses sold for \$2,666,000, compared with 123 horses grossing \$1,740,900 in 2012. The average was up 59.6% to \$22,593, while the median rose a staggering 68.1% to \$18,500. A weanling daughter of Kitten’s Joy ([hip 73](#)), consigned by Top Line Sales, brought the sale’s top price of \$110,000 from Machmer Hall. The top price at the 2012 sale was \$55,000.

During Wednesday’s open session, 153 horses grossed \$1,482,100. The average rose 31% to \$9,687. OBS Director of Sales Tod Wojciechowski admitted Thursday he was “pleasantly surprised” by the Fall Sale results.

“Going in, we hoped that the results of our sales throughout the year would carry through and the momentum would carry through to the Fall sale,” Wojciechowski said. “Certainly, with the economy and with supply and demand--knowing that there would be fewer horses out there and people needed horses--we felt that would help us. With the strength of all of our sales throughout the year, it was nice to finish on such a high note.”

Wojciechowski said he was particularly pleased with the strength of the broodmare market at the mixed sale. The auction’s top-priced broodmare was **Ribbon Taffy** (Hard Spun), a half-sister to multiple stakes winner and graded stakes placed Barrier Reef (Mizzen Mast). The 4-year-old mare, in foal to Into Mischief, was also consigned by Top Line Sales and was purchased by Hunter Valley Farm for \$72,000.

“We were very happy to see the broodmares bounce back the way they did,” Wojciechowski commented. “I think that is a good thing for the industry.”

Overall, Wojciechowski said the sales grounds were buzzing with activity from start to finish.

“I think it was a more enthusiastic buying bench than I’ve seen in recent years,” he said. “There were certainly some new players that were here for this sale and there was a lot of optimism and enthusiasm on the sales grounds.”

The Fall sale put an exclamation point on a powerful year of selling for OBS. The company’s juvenile sales started strongly and only got stronger. The record-setting March sale was topped by a \$1.8-million son of Smart Strike and recorded double-digit increases in average and median.

Both the April and June sales produced records for gross, average and median and a son of Pioneerof the Nile brought a record \$525,000 to top the June sale.

“I don’t think we had a sale that wasn’t up significantly over last year,” Wojciechowski said. “A lot of our numbers are harkening back to the 2008 or 2007 levels, before things dropped off. It was nice to see that the consignors and the sellers brought good horses and they obviously brought good prices.”

The graduates of those record-setting juvenile sales have made an immediate impact on the racetrack, with My Conquestadory (Artie Schiller), In Trouble (Tiz Wonderful), Secret Compass (Discreet Cat) and Bond Holder (Mineshaft) all scoring graded stakes victories this summer and fall.

Not content to rest on their 2013 laurels, OBS officials are already looking ahead to the 2014 season, which will begin with the Winter Mixed Sale scheduled for Jan. 22-23. That sale features an extended deadline for the horses of racing age section.

“We’re rolling right into our January sale coming up, we’re taking entries for that, and the horses of racing age sale is really starting to take hold and have an impact on the marketplace,” Wojciechowski said. “Then we move right into the 2-year-old season.”

Wojciechowski hopes the results of 2013 provide momentum for 2014.

“We’re going to continue to work hard and hopefully the results of this past year will give the sellers of horses even more confidence to bring their horses here,” he commented. “And the performance of horses on the racetrack this year that have been bought out of OBS will continue to give buyers strong confidence in us as well.”

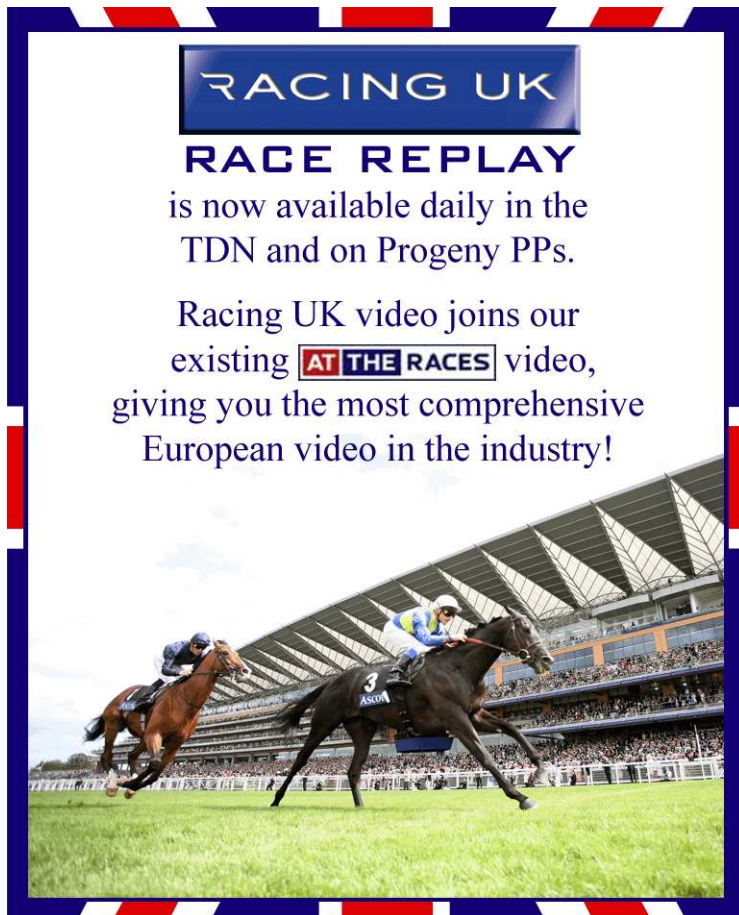
