While the 11th hour withdrawal and retirement of G1 Cox Plate favorite Atlantic Jewel (Aus) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}) has no doubt cast a shadow over Australia's weight-for-age showpiece, the Moonee

Valley faithful could still be given a real treat if new favorite **It's A Dundeeel (Aus)** (High Chaparral {Ire}) lives up to his billing. Winner of the G1 Spring Champion S. in his fifth outing last October, It's A Dundeeel went on to sweep the Australian 3-Year-Old Triple Crown--the Group 1 Randwick Guineas, Rosehill Guineas and Australian Derby--last season. Fourth in his 4-year-old debut behind Atlantic Jewel in the G1 Memsie S.

Aug. 31, he turned the tables on that rival with a tactical victory in the G1 Underwood S. last out Sept. 21. If he is to emerge victorious, It's A Dundeeel will have to overcome a longer than expected layoff after a minor foot ailment kept him out of last weekend's G1 Caulfield Cup, as well as a wide post in 13. Young jockey James McDonald, who describes It's A Dundeeel as the best he's ever ridden, is confident the colt can prove himself the best in Australia. "I have won five Group 1s on him and that really gives you confidence in what he can do," McDonald told the *Sydney Morning Herald*. "It is the most confident I have been going into a big race. When you're in a team with Murray Baker, you get a lot of confidence, and he is happy with him at the moment." **Cont. p3**

NEW FUND ANNOUNCED

British racing was thrown a lifeline yesterday after an arrangement was signed between the country's leading bookmakers and industry officials that will amount to £4.5-million per year. Unveiling a new Incentive Fund, the British Horseracing Authority outlined the deal between the betting firms William Hill, Ladbrokes, Coral and Betfred and representatives of the Levy Board, BHA, Racecourse Association and the Horsemen's Group. Total contributions are expected to reach just over £80-million, including Betfair's £7.8-million contribution. A statement on behalf of William Hill, Ladbrokes, Coral and Betfred read, "We are delighted to have reached an arrangement with racing, which will see the biggest four bookmakers in Britain inject an additional £18-million into British racing over the next four years. This addition to our normal statutory Levy payments will ensure that the four companies underwrite a minimum £52-million per year to the Levy Board. British racing is a core product in our betting offices and we want to see it grow and thrive. The £18-million will be used to improve the competitiveness of the racing product, making it more appealing to both racegoers and betting office customers alike. We look forward to working closely with our colleagues from racing over the next four years and maintaining, and enhancing, Britain's status as the number one horseracing nation in the world." BHA Chief Executive Paul Bittar said, "This arrangement has the support of the principal organizations in the sport, including the Racecourse Association and Horsemen's Group, and represents a positive step forwards in the prevailing circumstances. **Cont. p4**

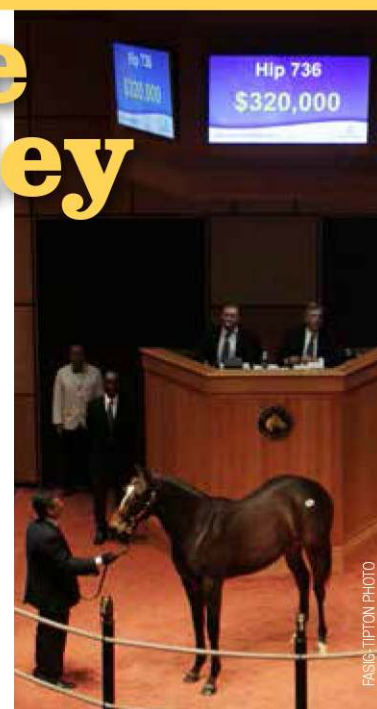

Hot on the heels of It's A Dundeel in the betting is **Puissance De Lune (Ire)** (Shamardal), who justified antepost G1 Melbourne Cup favoritism with victories in the G2 Blamey S. and G2 P.B. Lawrence S. earlier this term. He has since suffered three straight defeats, losing the G1 Makybe Diva S. Sept. 7 by the narrowest of margins before finishing seventh in the G1 Underwood S. Sept. 21. He was most recently nailed on the wire by **Happy Trails (Aus)** (Good Journey) in the G1 Turnbull S. at Flemington Oct. 5. The Gai Waterhouse-trained import **Fiorente (Ire)** (Monsun {Ger}) flashed his talent when second to **Green Moon (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}) in last year's Melbourne Cup in his Australian debut, and the 6-year-old is the current favorite to go one better Nov. 5. In the meantime, he has this contest to tackle, and he holds the advantage of a victory over this quirky course in the G2 Dato'tan Chin Nam S. Sept. 14. He checked in fourth behind Happy Trails after encountering traffic trouble in the Turnbull. Jockey Blake Shinn, who picks up the mount after intended rider Damien Oliver was suspended for careless riding last week, partnered Fiorente in a work at Moonee Valley Tuesday. "He felt beautiful, we just cruised around," Shinn told *Racenet.com.au*. "It was good to have a nice feel of him for the first time. He's a lovely big athletic horse with a beautiful stride. He pulled up great, is in great shape and right where Gai wants him." **Super Cool (Aus)** (Fastnet Rock {Aus}) holds the rare distinction of a course-and-distance victory. The 4-year-old gelding took the G2 Vase S. here a year ago, interestingly at the hands of It's A Dundeel. He recorded his first top-level victory in the G1 Australian Derby Mar. 9, and although he is yet to win since, he has been twice-placed in top company this season, most recently finishing third in the G1 Caulfield S. Oct. 12. Jockey Kerrin McEvoy has gone down to 109 pounds to maintain the ride on Darley's G1 Caulfield Guineas winner **Long John (Aus)** (Street Cry {Ire}), and both he and trainer Peter Snowden will be hoping their sophomore can erase the Cox Plate memories of their last Guineas winner, **Helmet (Aus)** (Exceed and Excel {Aus}), who failed to complete the double when eighth of 14 in 2011. Three-year-olds have a spotty record in this race, being victorious on just three occasions in the last 20 years and, like It's A Dundeel, Long John will have to navigate a wide draw.

BLACK CAVIAR IN FOAL

Black Caviar (Aus) (Bel Esprit {Aus}), Australia's standout 15-time Group 1-winning sprinter, has been confirmed in foal to Exceed and Excel (Aus), according to published reports. Breeder Rick Jamieson made the announcement during the unveiling of a statue in the 7-year-old's honor in Victoria, Australia yesterday. Black Caviar, who won all 25 of her career starts including Royal Ascot's G1 Diamond Jubilee S., concluded her career with a victory in the G1 T.J. Smith S. at Randwick Apr. 13. She amassed earnings of A\$7,953,936. Exceed and Excel, who is based at Darley's Kelvinside Farm in the Hunter Valley and shuttles to that operation's Dalham Hall Stud in Newmarket, England, was Australia's champion sire of 2012-13, and is responsible for such Group 1 winners as Excelebration (Ire), Helmet (Aus), Margot Did (Ire), Overreach (Aus) and Guelph (Aus). His 2013 fee is A\$88,000.

BLACK-TYPE PREVIEWS

LUCKY AND READY

Samaready (Aus) (More Than Ready), winner of last year's G1 Blue Diamond S., has rewarded the patience of her connections with two resounding victories this season, and she goes postward as the heavy favorite in today's G1 Manikato S. at Moonee Valley in Melbourne, Australia. The 4-year-old, who carries the silks of part owner Vinery Stud, went undefeated through her first four outings as a juvenile, including the Blue Diamond, G3 Blue Diamond Prelude and G2 Reisling S. before finishing third behind Pierro (Aus) (Lonhro {Aus}) in Australia's juvenile showpiece, the G1 Golden Slipper. An injury later that year put Samaready on the sidelines for more than a 12 months, but she showed no rust when clinching the G3 Theshark.com.au S. at trainer Mick Price's Caulfield base Aug. 31, and devastated her rivals over this track-and-trip in the G1 Moir S. Sept. 27. Second that day was the ever-consistent 6-year-old gelding **Buffering (Aus)** (Mossman {Aus}), who has won or hit the board in 26 of 35 career outings--including seven wins over this trip--and was racing off 111 day's rest in the Moir.

An unlucky sixth in the Moir was **Bel Sprinter (Aus)** (Bel Esprit {Aus}), who hit his best form last season when victorious in the G1 Galaxy S. and third behind Black Caviar (Aus) (Bel Esprit {Aus}) in the G1 T.J. Smith S. The Jason Warren charge was making his first start since finishing second in the G1 KrisFlyer International Sprint at Kranji in Singapore May 19. That event was won by the globetrotting **Lucky Nine (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire}), who makes his Australian debut and his first start since that victory here. Winner of the G1 Hong Kong International Sprint in 2011, the 7-year-old last year added the G1 Queen's Silver Jubilee Cup and G2 Jockey Club Sprint to his mantle, and has this year indicated he is nowhere near finished, collecting Sha Tin's G1 Chairman's Sprint Prize Feb. 17 prior to his Kranji victory. Seven of Lucky Nine's 12 victories have come over this trip, although he will have to buck a trend that has seen him go 0-for-4 first up.

Shamexpress (NZ) (O'Reilly {NZ}) returns to the Australian turf off a failed British campaign earlier this year. Victorious in the G1 Newmarket H. when last seen Down Under Mar. 9, the Danny O'Brien charge could manage no better than ninth in the G1 King's Stand S. at Royal Ascot June 18, and seventh in the G1 July Cup. The 6-year-old mare **Arinosa (Aus)** (Dash For Cash {Aus}) seems to be improving with age, rising from the handicap ranks to claim the G2 Sapphire S. and G3 Park S. earlier this year. She was a first-up winner of the G2 Premiere S. at Randwick Oct. 5, and looks to win a Group 1 at the first attempt at a distance she enjoys.

MEDICEAN COLT ON TOP AT ARQOCT FINALE

Arqana's addition of an extra day's trade for this year's October Yearling sale did not dampen buyer enthusiasm, and yet another high clearance rate saw fewer than one in every five offered failing to find new homes as the four-session extravaganza drew to a close. Aggregate yield, including €40,000 in private sales, surged forward a whopping 34% to a record €15,071,500, whereas the average and median showed single-figure gains, advancing 5.8% and 8.7%, respectively. However, those indicators were dragged down a notch as winning bids succeeded at

lower levels than earlier in the week. Leading the way from within the first hour was hip [517](#), a Medicean (GB) colt presented by Eric Lhermite's Haras de Grandcamp, who went the way of agent Alain Decrion, acting on behalf of Jean-Claude Seroul, for €68,000. Out of the 2009 Listed Prix Ronde de Nuit victress Peach Pearl (GB) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}), the February-foaled bay improved on a €45,000 tag he gained at this venue's December Sale last year. Frederic Rossi's Marseille base is his likeliest destination. "He is a lovely colt, maybe a bit heavy, but has quality," Decrion told *Racing Post*. "It has given me a lot of pleasure to be able to buy him." **Cont. p8**

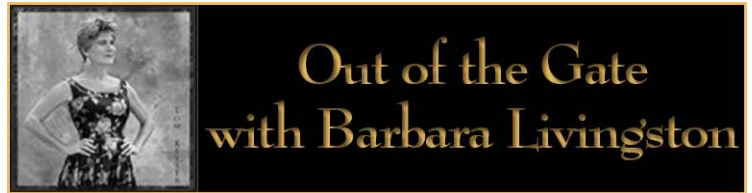

The second-highest price of the day was the €45,000 paid by George Mullins for hip [530](#), a Panis colt from Haras de Cordelles. Already named Spectacle Attendu (Fr), he is a sibling of three winners, including the 2011 Listed Prix Hampton victor Spectacle du Mars (Fr) (Martillo {Ger}), and is from the family of the 2000 G1 Prix Marcel Boussac heroine Amonita (GB) (Anabaa). At the close of trade, Arqana's Eric Hoyeau commented, "Activity was sustained throughout the four days, and the record percentage of horses sold of 82.7% is the figure which best illustrates this dynamic. Buyers, even more numerous this year, very much came forward hailing largely from Europe, but also from Qatar, and even from Russia. We would most particularly like to thank French trainers who came from all over France to buy their new recruits. We wish them every success with their purchases and very much hope they might have champions of the ilk of Treve or Vorda on their hands. The analysis of our first three yearling sales, which have been stamped with a record turnover and a much improved number of yearlings sold compared to last year, is very encouraging for breeders, which have every reason for being very confident in the future. We once again were able to note that the yearling market is very much dependent upon the offer; it is therefore very much the quality of the individuals that makes the difference and leads to such good results." 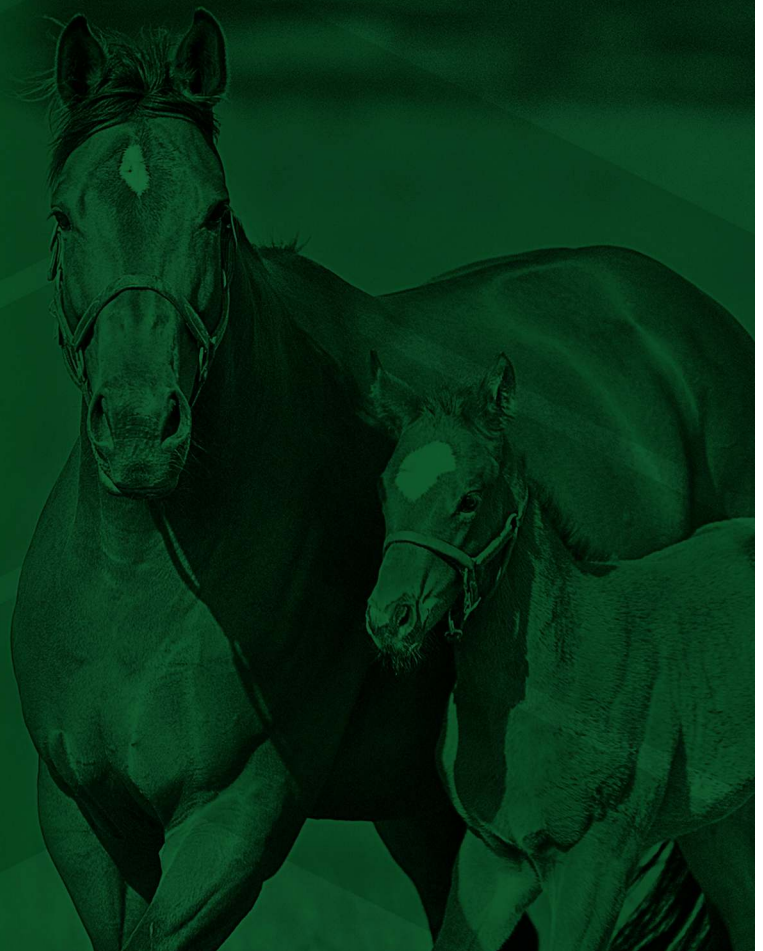

BRIDGET OPPENHEIMER DIES

Bridget Oppenheimer, a leading Thoroughbred owner and breeder in South Africa for over 40 years, has passed away at the age of 92. Mrs. Oppenheimer was one of the great icons of South African racing, and was affectionately referred to as "Queen" or "Queen Mum" of South African Racing. Bridget's late husband, Harry Oppenheimer, was one of the world's wealthiest men, and was chairman of both De Beers and Anglo American Corporation for over a quarter of a century. Together Harry and Bridget shared a love of horse racing and bred horses since 1945 at their Mauritzfontein Stud, based near Kimberley in South Africa. The couple owned a number of successful racehorses and together won Africa's greatest race, the G1 Durban July, on four occasions, the first of these in 1959 with Tiger Fish (SAf) and most recently with Spanish Galliard (SAf) in 1992. Since Harry's passing in August 2000, Bridget has gone on to win the Durban July on a further two occasions, with Greys Inn and Hunting Tower (SAf). Greys Inn would later represent Mrs. Oppenheimer in Grade I races in Dubai, Hong Kong and Australia, including a run in the G1 Melbourne Cup. The twilight years of Bridget Oppenheimer's racing involvement would arguably be her greatest, predominantly through the success of her stallion Fort Wood. Imported in 1994 from France, Fort Wood has sired three Horses of the Year and has been Champion Sire in South Africa on two occasions. His very first runner was Horse Chestnut (SAf), the best horse the Oppenheimers would ever own, and arguably the best horse in South African history. Horse Chestnut would win the South African Triple Crown and the G1 J&B Met--the country's second biggest race--by 8 lengths. He was shipped to the U.S. in 2000 where he won the GIII Broward H. by six lengths on his American debut before breaking down prepping for the GI Donn H. and G1 Dubai World Cup. Mrs. Oppenheimer's final year of racing ended on a high with her filly Cherry on the Top (SAf) winning the Triple Tiara and being crowned South African Champion 3-Year-Old Filly. Mrs. Bridget Oppenheimer, together with her husband Harry, will go down as all time greats of the sport of horse racing.

Barry Irwin's two-part Q and A with Louis Romanet and Jim Gagliano, et al. provides a welcome overview of our progress (or rather our lack of progress) regarding the regulation of medications. For me, the most important question was asked by Mr. Romanet: "It's clear that a sport with [performance enhancing] medication today is unacceptable in any other sports federation around the world. Why should it not be the case for horses?"

Regarding Lasix, we find ourselves at an impasse on regulating its use in America. The current situation shows that attempts to regulate Lasix have met with bureaucratic obstacles and intense resistance from American trainers. The Jockey Club has no power of enforcement and the Breeders' Cup has waffled and capitulated on previously announced restrictions. Basically, there is no real sheriff in Dodge. Perhaps, therefore, it is time to look for another approach. But, let's first follow the money.

Trainers have a “revenue dilemma.” Generally, they want to use Lasix because it benefits their revenue stream. Although their arguments for the necessity of Lasix are couched in terms of what is “good for the horse,” it is obvious that it is also good for the trainer. Instead of time off for a known bleeder, they can give the horse Lasix and continue charging the owner daily training fees and possibly collect another check from racing the horse. By using Lasix in training and on race day, the trainer’s revenue stream is rarely interrupted unless a significant injury requires a lay-up. Additionally, by using Lasix they are getting an edge over those who do not use Lasix.

Thus, the permissive use of Lasix also creates a “competitive dilemma” for the vast majority of trainers when their horse is not a bleeder. Given the acknowledged performance enhancing benefit of Lasix and the fact that virtually all other horses in a race are on Lasix (whether or not they are true bleeders), a trainer has little choice but to use Lasix if they want to compete on a level playing field. Even though they may be setting up their horse up for fewer career starts due to the effects of chronic dehydration, they are at least on equal footing in the race at hand if they too use Lasix.

From my perspective, the root problem to overcome appears to be the economic impact for the trainer and the owner. As attempts at regulation have largely failed thus far, let’s take a stab at an alternative approach and possibly solve the revenue and competitive issues surrounding the use of Lasix.

Rather than continue seemingly futile attempts for compulsory phase-out of race-day meds, one possibly effective approach would be to address the money issue directly and provide a form of revenue incentives for trainers and owners for not using Lasix.

Here are some initial suggestions for an interim period until we can eliminate the inequities caused by use of Lasix.

1. For all races in America, including the Breeders’ Cup, allow up to 10 pounds in weight allowance for horses running without Lasix. The Jockey Club will determine the actual weight allowance which may vary by age, gender and race specifics. We already employ this approach in order to level the playing field regarding use of inexperienced jockeys and in having various weight-for-age and gender race conditions.

2. For Breeders’ Cup stallion nominations, deeply discount the nominating fee for any stallion that won or placed in all of his graded stakes races without the use of Lasix.

3. For Breeders’ Cup foal nominations, deeply discount the nominating fee for any foal that is sired by a stallion that won or placed in all of his graded stakes races without the use of Lasix.

While we wait for race-day meds to be finally eliminated nationwide, these potential revenue incentives for trainers, owners and breeders will create heightened awareness of the issue and may have an immediate and positive impact on the over-use of Lasix.

AGA KHAN SOPHOMORES LIGHT UP GOFOCT

Two offerings from His Highness The Aga Khan's ever-popular draft, **Timikar** (Dynaformer) and **Zand (Ire)** (Zamindar), lit up yesterday's Goffs Open Yearling and Horses-in-Training sale when both selling for six-figure sums as darkness fell. Despite those high-profile trades and an increased offering of 30% more head than last year, the clearance rate went down and the sale aggregate advanced just 13%. As a consequence, the average suffered a 9.6% downturn, and the median also slipped back by 15.6%.

Sent up as hip [254](#) by John Oxx's Currabeg Stables, Timikar is out of the 2007 G3 Denny Cordell & Lanwades Stud Fillies S. victress Timarwa (Ire) (Daylami {Ire}), and shed maiden status at Roscommon in just his second start last month. He was knocked down to Hubie de Burgh's opening bid of €225,000 and is bound for an Australian campaign. "He's a lightly raced and beautiful colt," de Burgh told *Racing Post*. "Dynaformer has done very well in Australia and his stock tend to get better with age." Stablemate and fellow 3-year-old Zand broke through at Leopardstown last October, but has failed to make an impact in three subsequent black-type starts, including a last-out fifth in this month's Listed Finale S. at the Curragh. Offered as hip [257](#), he went the way of Emerald Bloodstock's Peter Kelly for €100,000. "I've bought him for a Swiss businessman and the plan is for him to be campaigned on the Flat in Ireland," Kelly told *Racing Post*. Earlier in the day, a Holy Roman Emperor colt, presented as hip [104](#) by John Tuthill's Owenstown Stud, topped the yearling section of the sale when acquired by renowned pinhooker Willie Browne's Cloran Bloodstock for €30,000. Out of an unraced sibling of North American stakes winners Nymphenburg (San Romano) and La Habitant Time (Iskandar Elakbar), the April-foaled bay also hails from the family of Hawk Wing, and is slated to reappear in one of next year's Breeze-Up catalogues. "He's a very nice colt and he's some walker," Browne told *Racing Post*. "He looks a sharp sort, but still has some strengthening up to do. Let's hope he's fast."

REVVING UP

It's six weeks to the International Races, which means all the heavy hitters begin to emerge from the woodwork in Hong Kong in a pair of handicap preps this weekend. Reigning Horse of the Year **Military Attack (Ire)** (Oratorio {Ire}) kicks off the season as the 133-pound highweight in the Sha Tin Trophy H. at a 1600-meter distance likely too sharp for him to win, particularly first-up, but designed to get him to the G2 Jockey Club Cup Nov. 17. The 5-year-old was a revelation last year, closing his season with four straight wins, including a 1 3/4-length defeat of **California Memory** (Highest Honor {Fr}) the G1 Queen Elizabeth II Cup Apr. 28 ahead of a 3 1/4-length success from stablemate **Dan Excel (Ire)** (Shamardal) in the G1 Singapore Airlines International Cup May 18. "I'm sure he's going to run well on the weekend, but everyone has to understand that the grand final is in December and whatever he does on the weekend he's going to improve into the Jockey Club Cup and from that trial into the Hong Kong Cup," trainer John Moore assured. Richard Gibson saddles a pair of progressive types in Hong Kong Derby hero **Akeed Mofeed (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}) and **Gold-Fun (Ire)** (Le Vie dei Colori {GB}). The former, an expensive private purchase, was somewhat disappointing when fifth in the QE II and has a tightener under his belt this term, a one-paced ninth behind Gold-Fun in the National Day Cup H. over 1400 meters Oct. 1. Akeed Mofeed should improve for that run and for this one, and he is likely to follow the same path to international day as Military Attack. **Frederick Engels (GB)** (Iceman {GB}) is the marquee name in the Premier Bowl H., in which he will tote the high weight. Runner-up in a pair of domestic Group 1s last winter, including a narrow defeat at the hands of the classy Lucky Nine (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}), he was sent to Meydan for the G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen, but nothing went right and he trudged home in eighth. Frederick Engels exits a second in the Sha Tin Sprint Trophy H. up the 1000-meter straight Oct. 1.
