HIGH ON THE HILL

With Toormore (Ire) (Arakan) finished for the season, today's G1 Racing Post Trophy at Doncaster is up for grabs, with Paul Smith's supplemented **Kingston Hill (GB)** (Mastercraftsman {Ire}) defending an unbeaten record. Green on debut over seven furlongs at Newbury Sept. 21, the grey was still showing signs of immaturity when adding the G3 Autumn S. over this

trip at Newmarket last time Oct. 12, and trainer Roger Varian has taken the plunge. "Kingston Hill has done nothing wrong and I have been very happy with his condition since he won the Autumn S. two weeks ago," he said. "The trip and ground should be fine and, although this is another step up, I am confident that he will be there or thereabouts." Aidan

O'Brien has been the go-to guy when looking for the winner of this in recent times, having supplied that in three of the last four renewals. His last two, Camelot (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}) and Kingsbarns (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), had a similar profile to the stable's supplemented **Century (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}), who scored on debut at The Curragh Oct. 13. Impressive on that occasion, he is joined by the maiden **Johann Strauss (GB)** (High Chaparral {Ire}) and wide-margin Tipperary scorer **Buonarroti (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}). In a strong renewal, Godolphin run the similarly supplemented **Pinzolo (GB)** (Monsun {Ger}), who is two-for-two after taking part in the Aug. 16 Newmarket maiden won by Motivator (GB) and Frankel (GB) and Newbury's Haynes, Hanson & Clark Conditions S. Sept. 20. "Pinzolo has physically come on from his win at Newbury and he's a middle-distance prospect for next season, so stamina will not be a concern," trainer Charlie Appleby commented. "He is one of our better 2-year-old colts and I am hopeful of a good run." Toormore's trainer Richard Hannon supplies Middleham Park Racing's unbeaten **Chief Barker (Ire)** (Azamour {Ire}), who beat the subsequent G1 Fillies' Mile winner Chriselliam (Ire) (Iffraaj {GB}) in the Listed Ascendant S. over a mile at Haydock last time Sept. 7. "Doncaster have had more than 12 millimeters of rain this week, so inevitably the ground will be slow, so we have decided to run Chief Barker and not Toormore, who will now be put away until next year, when he will have a Guineas preparation," Hannon explained. "Toormore is all class but his speed would be blunted by soft ground, whereas Chief Barker, a good horse in his own right, is more the grinder, so arguably better suited to the testing conditions." **Field p6**

OXBOW RETIRED TO TAYLOR MADE

Calumet Farm's **Oxbow** (Awesome Again--Tizamazing, by Cee's Tizzy), game winner of the 2013 GI Preakness S., has been retired from racing and will enter stud for the 2014 breeding season at Taylor Made Stallions for a fee of \$20,000, stands and nurses. Bred by Richard Santulli's Colts Neck Stables, Oxbow, produced by full-sister to dual GI Breeders' Cup Classic hero Tiznow (Cee's Tizzy), was a \$250,000 Keeneland September Yearling acquisition. He broke his maiden over seven furlongs towards the tail end of 2012, before making the rest of his nine starts in graded-stakes company, six of those Grade 1s. An 11 1/2-length winner of the GIII Lecomte S. Jan. 19 ([video](#)), the bay colt was beaten just a half-length when fourth in the GII Risen Star S. Feb. 23 and was run down by his stablemate and subsequent GI Travers S. hero Will Take Charge (Unbridled's Song) in the GII Rebel S. After proving 1 3/4 lengths too good for his rivals in the Preakness ([video](#)), Oxbow rounded out his Triple Crown campaign with a solid runner-up effort to Palace Malice (Curlin) in the GI Belmont S. after attending the fastest early pace since Secretariat's historic victory in 1973. **Cont. p12**

WEISBORD OFFERS ADVICE, GIVES THANKS

Barry Weisbord, president and co-publisher of the *Thoroughbred Daily News*, was honored as the 24th recipient of the John W. Galbreath Award for Entrepreneurship by the University of Louisville's Equine Industry Program Thursday night. The award was presented at an intimate dinner held at the University Club at Louisville that was hosted by Tim Capps, director of the Equine Industry Program.

The Galbreath award, named after the renowned businessman, sportsman and philanthropist who founded Darby Dan Farm in Kentucky, is given to a person who has achieved entrepreneurial excellence, with criteria including success in business, creativity, vision, risk-taking, and the respect of peers and associates.

Students from the program attended the event, and were offered Weisbord's 10 Commandments of business, which began with, "You shall always be as prepared as possible," and concluded with, "You shall always remember your word is your bond. Do what you say you will do."

Weisbord gave a brief overview of his career, stretching back to when he was a junior in college and, along with his friend Alan Goldberg, got a summer job walking hots for trainer Walter Kelley at Aqueduct.

"At the time, I was just a fan of Thoroughbred racing," said Weisbord. "Since that day, I have never left the horse industry. I have never applied for a job. I have never drafted a resume."

Weisbord went on to train briefly--he ultimately relinquished those duties to Goldberg--before founding the bloodstock portfolio management company Executive Bloodstock in 1979.

In the 1980s, he helped found Matchmaker Breeders' Exchange, which facilitated the sale of stallion seasons and shares. "I expanded Matchmaker from a yearly auction to a weekly exchange with my partner Johnny Jones III, and we filled an office with co-workers who shared our vision, loved the horse business, and worked harder than people in Lexington were used to working," said Weisbord, who laughed, "They answered the phone at 6:00 at night, when those sort of hours were unheard of."

He added, "It's great to see people go on to fruitful careers after they leave your employ, and I'm proud that a number of people from that staff went on to assume major industry positions. They include Darley's Charlie Boden, Claiborne's Bernie Sams, your own Tim Capps and Highclere's Harry Herbert, all of which went on to outstanding careers."

Weisbord later helped establish the American Championship Racing Series, and is currently the chairman of Trakus, the data and graphics system that tracks individual horses through a race. He also sits on the Breeders' Cup board of directors, and co-chairs its Enhanced Experience committee.



Weisbord devoted much of his speech to acknowledging the mentors and business associates who helped and inspired him: Allen Jerkens, David Willmott, R.D. Hubbard, Michael Brod, his accountant Ron Etkin and attorney Frank Becker, his longtime business partners and friends Rich Santulli and Robert "Bat" Masterson, his friend Bobby Flay and Jerry Frankel, "a lifelong entrepreneur who has been one of my greatest inspirations."

He noted Darby Dan's John Phillips, Galbreath's grandson, who was on hand, as were Denali Stud's Craig and Holly Bendoroff, who have boarded Weisbord's mares for over 30 years.

Weisbord also addressed, "my incredible, steady co-pilot, Sue Finley," his co-publisher at the *TDN*. "Like at Matchmaker, together, we have collected an amazing group of people who not only share, but execute our vision perfectly every day."

Weisbord added, "For centuries, the horse business has been a place that has a reputation of attracting rogues. And yet, every person I have named...is a person whose word is their bond, and their handshake is better than a contract. And for that, I'm immeasurably proud."

Weisbord admitted that, "in the face of declining handle, declining foal crop, declining interest," his optimism about the future of the Thoroughbred industry might appear misplaced, but, he said, "I think [those problems are] fixable."

He detailed a three-part solution that included an improvement of the gambling experience and introduction of proposition bets; an improvement in sports quality; and an enhancement of the on-site experience.

In the "sports quality" category, Weisbord said a series of races that pits the best horses against each other on a regular basis, with "commensurate financial awards," is still necessary.

"I don't think we can be successful if we're the only sport that doesn't crown our champions on the field, and doesn't have any idea where they're going to show up next," he said.

Weisbord closed out his speech by thanking his family--his wife Sarah, soon-to-be 6-year-old daughter Juliette, and his twin boys Josh and Brad, the latter of whom followed his father into the horse business and who was on hand to give Weisbord a belated birthday gift--a signed saddle towel of Dubai World Cup winner Animal Kingdom.

There are likely fewer horses more deserving of a Group 1 victory than Buffering, and yesterday the ever-reliable performer got the monkey off his back at long-last when holding on in the dying strides of the Manikato. On the board a remarkable 28 times in

37 starts, Buffering has finished second or third at the highest level nine times from 18 attempts, including three occasions at the hands of Black Caviar. Buffering last visited the winner's circle in the Apr. 27 G2 Victory S. at Doomben, and unlike most of Australia's top-

level performers, he continued to race through the Australian winter, finishing fourth in the G1 BTC Cup at Eagle Farm May 11, third in the G1 Doomben 10,000 May 25, and second in the G1 Stradbroke H. at Eagle Farm June 8. A short holiday ensued, and Buffering returned Sept. 27 to finish second to runaway victress Samaready (Aus) (More Than Ready) in the G1 Moir S. over this track and trip. Keen from the outset here with Hong Kong raider Lucky Nine hot on his heels, Buffering galloped along in second through the early stages before moving up to take the lead about 700 meters out. **Manikato S. cont. p6**

With Lucky Nine still breathing down his neck and Shamexpress (NZ) (O'Reilly {NZ}) circling three-wide to challenge, Buffering swung into the short Moonee Valley straight with an advantage of about 3/4 of a length. Shamexpress began to back up at the 100-meter mark as Lucky Nine began to roll, but it was too late, as Buffering managed to hold on by a short head. Samaready was headstrong while racing midpack through the early stages, but failed to fire when it mattered. Trainer Robert Heathcote was understandably ecstatic after the victory. "Finally!" He exclaimed. "He's had 18 goes at a Group 1 and he gets the job done in a million-dollar race. That's something special."

Heathcote quipped, "They say Lucky Nine is the best sprinter in the world, but I've got one better. He just puts it in every time. They say this is the place legends are made, and he's a legend to me."

Lucky Nine's regular rider Brett Prebble was in an upbeat mood about the gelding's effort, his first outing since a victory in the May 19 G1 KrisFlyer International Sprint in Singapore. "He ran super but just hit a flat spot at the 450 meters, which he never does," Prebble said. "When he straightened up he was back to his usual self. He was so courageous, and one more bound I had [Buffering]."

"He's done us proud," Lucky Nine's trainer Caspar Fownes said, adding that his charge's next start would be the G1 VRC Classic at Flemington Nov. 9. "What an effort and he'll improve a lot from that. I was concerned about his fitness coming into this race. He'd probably done too well here in Melbourne. Coming to the bend they swamped him but then his big heart kicked in. Another stride and we're probably there."

FEAR OF FABRE

Andre Fabre usually makes his cross-channel raids count, and it cannot be anything other than highly significant that he chooses Newbury's G3 Horris Hill S. for the Wertheimers' exciting **Galiway (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}) today. The half-brother to top-flight performers Silent Name (Jpn) (Sunday Silence) and Salto (Ire) (Pivotal {GB}) recorded a narrow, but snug debut win over a mile at Saint-Cloud Sept. 27, and is open to bountiful improvement. "He is a promising 2-year-old and I thought this would be a good opportunity for him to get some good experience, as there are not many races left for him in France," his trainer told *PA Sport*. "I want him to have another run this year without running in a Group 1. I want to take things more slowly with him. For him to travel to England and see a new course will be good for him. Newbury is a nice course, so it will be a good opportunity for me to go there as well. I have had runners there before, but it was many years ago. The ground shouldn't be an issue for him. His dam loved soft ground. I hope he can run well, but I would be more hopeful than confident." Of the home team, another unexposed and unbeaten colt is **Piping Rock (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}), who comes into this on the back of a four-length defeat of the subsequent nursery scorer Hartnell (GB) (Authorized {Ire}) in a conditions event over this trip at Salisbury Oct. 2.

Along with the July 30 G3 Molecomb S. runner-up **Anticipated (Ire)** (Whipper) and Sept. 11 Kempton conditions scorer **Day of Conquest (GB)** (Major Cadeaux {GB}), he represents the all-conquering Richard Hannon yard, successful four times in this race. The John Sadler trainee was most recently eighth on dirt in Santa Anita's Sept. 28 GI Awesome Again S. When asked what led to the decision to ship to Lexington, Lael Stables's **Willcox Inn** (Harlan's Holiday) also likes Polytrack. The 5-2 morning line favorite overcame a slow pace to annex Arlington's GIII Washington Park H. by a nose Aug. 31, and checked in third last out behind GI Breeders' Cup Mile contenders Silver Max (Badge of Silver) and Wise Dan (Wiseman's Ferry) in this venue's rained-off GI Shadwell Turf Mile Oct. 5. Claiborne Farm and Adele Dilschneider's **Lea** (First Samurai) can contend with his best. A winner of last November's GIII Commonwealth Turf, the homebred was second to Wise Dan in Churchill's GII Firecracker H. June 29 and third to that one in Saratoga's GII Fourstardave H. Aug. 10. The AI Stall pupil was most recently fourth cutting back in the slop in Saratoga's GI Forego S. Aug. 31.

Off the mark by 16 lengths over this trip at Listowel Sept. 17, Jaber Abdullah's silkbearer put Ballydoyle's highly regarded Guerre (War Front) firmly in his place in The Curragh's Listed Blenheim S. dropped back to six 12 days later, and trainer Paul Deegan is hoping he can continue to make forward strides. "This has been the plan since he won the last time," he explained. "He's in good form and it's all systems go. We're very happy with him, Chris [Hayes] has ridden him a couple pieces of work and he's delighted with him. He's going the right way--the rain has come, which is good, and conditions should be ideal for him. He goes there with a real live chance, hopefully, and will take a bit of beating." Aidan O'Brien has saddled four of the last nine winners, and puts forward the Oct. 20 Birdcatcher Nursery third **Craftsman (Ire)** (Mastercraftsman {Ire}) and **Michaelmas** (Elusive Quality), who has not been seen since winning a five-furlong maiden at The Curragh May 6, but who obviously holds high rank in the stable pecking order. Having taken this with the filly Big Break (GB) (Dansili {GB}) 12 months ago, Dermot Weld attempts to repeat the feat with Khalid Abdullah's **Lanyard** (Mizzen Mast), who comes here on the back of a five-length debut score over a mile at Listowel Sept. 17.

'GROOM,' 'TALES' OPT FOR BOLD RULER

Neither **Strapping Groom** (Johannesburg) nor **Forty Tales** (Tale of the Cat) would have been out of place in next Saturday's GI Breeders' Cup Sprint, but the connections of both have instead opted for today's GIII Bold Ruler H. Claimed by Drawing Away Stable and trainer David Jacobson for \$35,000 from Carl Domino and Kinsman Stable, the 6-year-old entire provided an immediate return on that investment when he led box to wire in this venue's 6 1/2-panel Lion Cavern S. June 26. He annexed Saratoga's Kid Russell S. two weeks later, and upended the Spa's seven-panel GI Forego S. Aug. 31 at 15-1. Strapping Groom enters off a third-place run in the six-panel GI Vosburgh Invitational S. Sept. 28. "I thought he ran very well in his last race," said Jacobson. "A lot of those big names are at the Breeders' Cup, so I think he's going to be very tough in here. He's doing really well and we're very excited about the race." Forty Tales strung together wins in the GIII Derby Trial S., GII Woody Stephens S. and GII Amsterdam S. over the spring and summer, but was fourth as the favorite in Saratoga's GI King's Bishop S. Aug. 24 and filled the same slot in the Vosburgh. "When we decided not to do to the Breeders' Cup Sprint, this became the most logical option," offered trainer Todd Pletcher. "Seven eighths is probably his ideal distance." Dogwood Stable's **Big Screen** (Speightstown) crossed the wire first in the rained-off Jaipur over track and trip June 7, but was placed second for interference. Most recently, the grey took the grassy one-mile Who's To Pay S. here Sept. 21.

DONNA LOOKS TO RECAPTURE THE GLORY

Sunday's G1 Tenno Sho Autumn at Tokyo Racecourse provides an intriguing clash of two previous winners, as well as the return of reigning Horse of the Year **Gentildonna (Jpn)** (Deep Impact {Jpn}). The imposing 4-year-old filly swept Japan's Triple Tiara last year and capped off a spectacular season with a

thrilling victory over the previous year's Triple Crown hero Orfevre (Jpn) (Stay Gold {Jpn}). A planned bid for the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe was shelved when she failed to find the winner's circle in two outings earlier this year, finishing second in the G1

Dubai Sheema Classic

Mar. 30 and third in the G1 Takarazuka Kinen at Hanshin when last seen June 23, but trainer Sei Ishizaka indicated confidence that his charge will return to her best. "She's shaping up nicely," he said. "It will have been a while, but we feel like she's getting there, step-by-step. She's just taking it slowly but surely and will be fine as long as she gets to the race in one piece." Defending race winner **Eishin Flash (Jpn)** (King's Best) finished well behind Gentildonna in ninth in the Japan Cup, but she could well have her hands full with him this time as he bids to become the first back-to-back winner since Symboli Kris S in 2002-03. "I really think he's completely come into his own," Ikee said. "We're hoping the going gets tough in the Tenno Sho.

And if that [happens], since the Takarazuka Kinen winner [Gold Ship {Jpn}] won't be around, Danon Ballade should win hands down--or at least that's we're hoping how it turns out," Ikee said. Ikee will also saddle Tosen Jordan (Jpn) (Jungle Pocket {Jpn}), who captured this race two years ago but has yet to win since. Ikee admitted his charge is not what he used to be. "He's not like he was two years ago," Ikee said. "He's gotten slower with age, and it might take a bit more time to get him up to speed."

When we bought him as a yearling, he was so athletic that it looked like you could put a saddle on him and run him. He was one tough son of a gun and as durable as they make them. On top of his great pedigree, Oxbow has the most important trait a stallion needs, and that’s his natural speed and ability to carry it over a distance of ground.”

HENNY HUGHES SOLD TO JAPAN:

Henny Hughes (Hennessy--Meadow Flyer, but Meadowlake), sire of last year’s Champion 2-Year-Old Filly and current GI Breeders’ Cup Distaff contender Beholder, has been sold to Yushun Company in Hokkaido, Japan. The 10-year-old, who is currently serving the Southern Hemisphere season at Rangeview in Western Australia, will take up stud duty in Japan in 2014. Henny Hughes stood the 2013 Northern Hemisphere season at Walmac Farm in Kentucky. Winner of the 2006 GI King’s Bishop and GI Vosburgh H. for Zabeel Racing under the care of Kiaran McLaughlin, Henny Hughes entered stud at Darley’s Jonabell Farm in Lexington in 2007, and shuttled between that operation and Darley’s Kelvinside Farm in Australia until his sale to Rangeview in 2012. Later that year Beholder won the GI Breeders’ Cup Juvenile Fillies en route to championship honors, and a deal was made to shuttle Henny Hughes to Walmac. From nine runners in Japan, Henny Hughes has sired graded winners Henny Hound and Keiai Leone (Jpn). A fee has not yet been revealed.

SOUTH AFRICA BANS ANABOLIC STEROIDS

Falling in line with the recent position taken by the International Federation of Horseracing Authorities, the Board of the National Horseracing Authority of South Africa announced yesterday that anabolic steroids will be banned in- and out-of-competition in that country. The ban will be introduced Dec. 1 and will go into effect June 1, 2014, allowing six months for treated horses to be cleared of the drugs. Random testing will take place after June 1, and any trainer or owner violating the rule will be found guilty of an offence.

"I'm very excited to see my best friend," said Pedroza, who expects Douglas to arrive in California next Wednesday from Florida. "I can't wait."

Rahystrada Calls It a Day...

Owner Robert Courtney Jr. has called time on the career of **Rahystrada** (Rahy--Ministrada, by Deputy Minister) following the 9-year-old gelding's fifth-place performance in a Keeneland allowance test Thursday afternoon. Trained for the bulk of his career by 'Scooter Hughes,' Rahystrada made a pair of starts at the \$50,000 claiming level at the age of five in 2009, but went on to win no fewer than five graded stakes, in the process becoming the first horse to win the GIII Arlington H. three times (2010, 2012 and 2013). He celebrated his biggest pay day in the 2011 Colonial Turf Cup and was third in the 2012 GI Arlington Million. Rahystrada, who will live out his days on his owner's Stonebridge Farm, retires with a record of 46-14-5-8 and earnings of \$1,383,334.

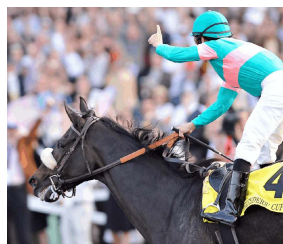
