PLETCHER SEES A WIDE-OPEN CLASSIC

Dogwood Stable's **Palace Malice** (Curlin) will look to put an exclamation mark on his 2013 season in Saturday's GI Breeders' Cup Classic, but trainer Todd Pletcher knows the well-travelled colt faces a tough task.

"It's a really deep field," Pletcher said of the 12-horse Classic. "It's one of those things where you wouldn't be surprised if a number of different horses win it. **Fort Larned** (E Dubai) to win it again, it wouldn't surprise you. If **Mucho Macho Man** (Macho Uno), judging by the way he ran in the [Sept. 28 GI] Awesome Again, won it, it wouldn't surprise you. **Game On Dude** (Awesome Again) certainly wouldn't surprise you. And you're not even talking about **Ron the Greek** (Full Mandate), **Flat Out** (Flatter), **Palace Malice** or **Will Take Charge** (Unbridled's Song). It's a nasty race."

Palace Malice will be making his 10th start of 2013 Saturday. His year began at Gulfstream over the winter and he participated in two-thirds of the Triple Crown, finishing 12th in the GI Kentucky Derby and winning the GI Belmont S. He won the July 27 GI Jim Dandy S. and was fourth in the GI Travers S. before running second in his first start against older horses in the Sept. 28 GI Jockey Club Gold Cup.

"It says a lot about him, physically and mentally, that he's been able to do that," Pletcher said of Palace Malice's campaign. "He seems to thrive on it, actually. He's gained weight through the process and has gotten bigger and stronger as he's gone along."

Another sophomore tackling elders in the Classic is the Travers winner **Will Take Charge**. Trainer D. Wayne Lukas is happy with how the strapping chestnut is coming into the Breeders' Cup and he thinks he has history on his side.

"Historically, 3-year-olds have done well in the Classic," Lukas said. "I won with **Cat Thief** [in 1999], so I don't worry about the age thing."

Three-year-olds have won the Classic nine times, but not since **Raven's Pass** (Elusive Quality) in 2008.

Lukas is looking forward to an exciting race.

"You have a good blend of early speed, middle-of-the-race stalkers and late runners," Lukas said. "It should be an honest pace and a good race."

MOTT PRAISES 'OTHER' DISTAFF ENTRANT

Conditioner Bill Mott will send out Besilu Stable's **Royal Delta** (Empire Maker) to try to win her third-straight GI Breeders' Cup Distaff Friday, but he'll also saddle fellow **"TDN Rising Star"** **Close Hatches** (First Defence) in the same event and was quick to point out that runner's credentials yesterday.

"She deserved to run here," Mott said of Juddmonte's GI Mother Goose S. and GI Cotillion S. winner. "I don't particularly like running against myself. I don't see why anybody would want to do

that, but there are certain instances, I think, if you're in the Kentucky Oaks or the Kentucky Derby or the Breeders' Cup. If those situations arise, you just have to do it." The Hall of Famer, who also has two chances in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic in **Flat Out** (Flatter) and **Ron the Greek** (Full Mandate), added, "I don't think I'm running a horse [in **Close Hatches**] that doesn't deserve to run. Both fillies deserve to run and have their chance at it. Whatever happens, happens on the day. Both have earned their way in here. It's a championship day and--you know what?--at the end of the day will the best horse win? Well, the winner is going to be who the winner is. Hopefully they'll get a clean trip and a fair chance."

BREEDERS' CUP BULLETIN

Point of Entry Impresses McGaughey

Phipps Stable and Stronach Stables' **Point of Entry** (Dynaformer), favored when a troubled second in last year's GI Breeders' Cup Turf, was a longshot to even make the race this term after suffering a non-displaced condylar fracture of his left hind cannon bone while winning the June 8 GI Manhattan H. He underwent surgery to repair the fracture and is on target to make his first start in five months Saturday. The 5-year-old has come back in top shape, according to trainer Shug McGaughey, who was on hand to watch the bay gallop 1 1/4 miles over the main track at Santa Anita Wednesday.

"Every work has gotten better and better," McGaughey said. "It's a tall task, but with a horse like him, it's not quite as tall. He's a very good horse and he handles his training well. He's good and sound right now, knock on wood. All indications are he'll run a good race."

Still, McGaughey acknowledged the long layoff was a lot to overcome.

"It's hard to be overly confident when we haven't run since June 8 and coming off an injury," the Hall of Famer said.

"The injury won't be a factor at all. I don't think the rest will be a factor. I think if he's the best horse and gets some racing luck, I think he'll be awful tough."

Point of Entry overcame traffic to be a closing second behind **Little Mike** (Spanish Steps) in last year's Turf. It was his only loss in seven 2012 starts.

"I was very disappointed," McGaughey said of the 2012 Turf. "He just didn't shake loose until too late and just didn't get there. He deserves to win a race like this, especially with what happened last year. I'm pumped up that he's got the opportunity to give it a try again."

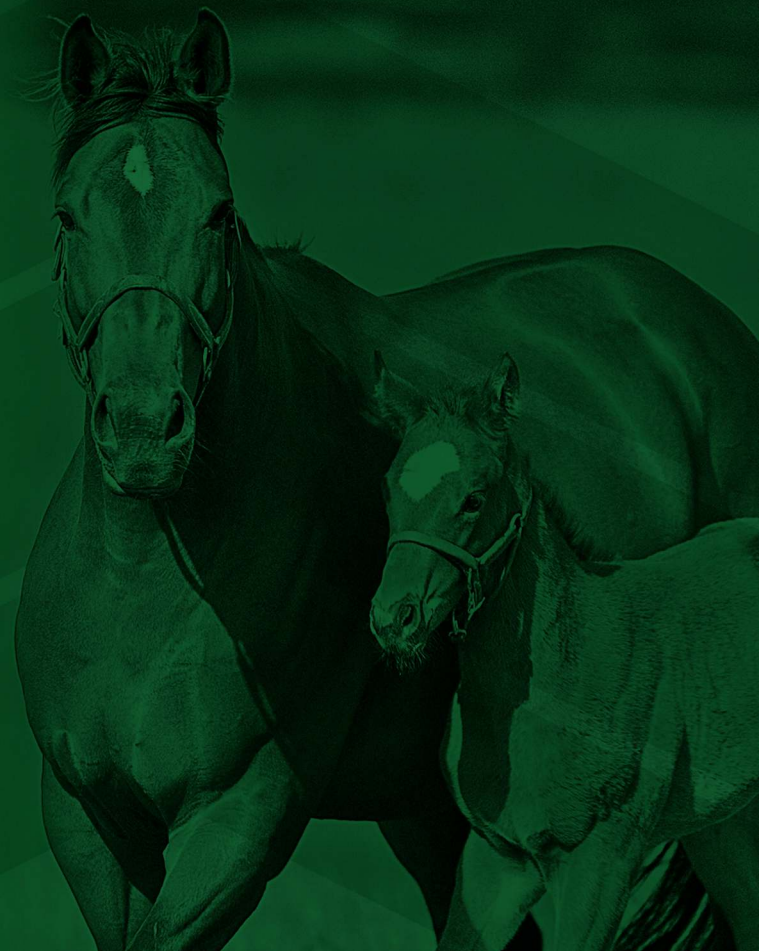

'Dan' Doing Well Post-Ship

Trainer Charlie LoPresti has done everything in his power to keep conditions as close to how they were leading up to **Wise Dan** (Wiseman's Ferry)'s victory in the 2012 GI Breeders' Cup Mile, and all has gone according to plan this time around as the Mort Fink colorbearer prepares to defend his title Saturday. "When we took the blanket off, he put on quite a show bucking and kicking," LoPresti said of the Horse of the Year's antics Wednesday after shipping in the day before. "It was great to see. You don't want to see them come out dull and almost sound asleep." Of Wise Dan's schedule for the rest of the week, LoPresti said, "I will take him to the turf [Thursday] morning, paddock school [Thursday] afternoon and jog him on the dirt Friday morning," LoPresti said. "He is on the same schedule as last year except we got here a day later last year because of Hurricane Sandy." Wise Dan was most recently second in Keeneland's off-the-turf GI Shadwell Turf Mile Oct. 5.

Laughing, Travel Buddy Settle In

GI Breeders' Cup F/M Turf hopeful **Laughing (Ire)** (Dansili {GB}) arrived at Santa Anita Tuesday night from her central New Jersey base. The 5-year-old mare, campaigned in Europe until she was purchased by Rich Santulli during her 3-year-old season, used to be a nervous flyer, but a travel buddy has made her a perfect traveler. Laughing is accompanied during shipping by the retired racemare Funzionaire.

"'Funzi' goes everywhere with her," said Beth Cumberland, assistant to trainer Al Goldberg. "They are best buddies who travel together, go out to the track together, jog together, and get turned out in the paddock every day together. They are totally bonded, so Alan had to ship them together. They told us when Laughing came to us that she was sulky and wouldn't eat. Look at her now. Having Funzi around definitely boosted her self-confidence. She's blossomed and this year has been a big turnaround for her."

Laughing is unbeaten in four 2013 starts, most recently winning the Sept. 28 GI Flower Bowl Invitational S.

Twilight Eclipse on Track

Twilight Eclipse (Purim), who set the world record for 1 1/2 miles on the turf when he won the GII Pan American S. in 2:22.63 at Gulfstream in March, arrived from New York Tuesday for his engagement in Saturday's GI Breeders' Cup Turf. The 4-year-old flew from New York to Louisville and Oklahoma City before arriving at Santa Anita about 6:30 in the evening. He was out for a jog over the main track at 7 a.m. Wednesday.

"He had a long flight and they had to work around a storm along the way," explained Josh Flores, assistant to trainer Tom Albertrani. "But he shipped well and ate right up. He's showing us some good life this morning, so it looks like all is well."

Sambora, Braxton, Chenoweth to Perform

The Breeders' Cup announced yesterday that performances from musicians **Richie Sambora**, **Toni Braxton** and **Kristin Chenoweth** will be incorporated into Saturday's Breeders' Cup telecast. Sambora, lead guitarist for rock band **Bon Jovi**, will perform "Call to the Post" in place of a traditional bugle at 7:20 p.m. during NBC sports coverage, while Braxton will sing the National Anthem at 6:35 p.m. on the same station. Tony Award winner **Chenoweth** will perform "The Best is Yet to Come"--the Breeders' Cup adopted anthem--during GI Breeders' Cup Classic coverage on NBC at 8:00 p.m. In addition, **Shea Leparoux**, daughter of trainer **Mike Mitchell** and wife of jockey **Julien Leparoux**, will sing "God Bless America" during the opening ceremonies.

HONOURS EVEN AS TWO TOP TATTS

A rapid-fire evening bidding spell at Park Paddocks saw top billing divided between the Dubai-bound **Validus (GB)** (Zamindar) and **Goodwood Mirage (Ire)** (Jeremy), a new recruit to the jumping ranks, with both horses sold for 380,000gns.

A large draft from Juddmonte woke up the big hitters and the expensive purchases continued through select consignments from the stables of Luca Cuman

and Andrew Balding. The late flurry--bringing the total of six-figure lots on the day to 16--swelled the day's turnover to 8,058,600gns, a rise of 10%, with an improved average of 29,519gns (up by 11%) and median of 14,000gns (up by 8%).

Again, some expensive buy-backs affected clearance, and this was the only sector to register a decline, falling eight points to 84%.

The tally for the three days of trade stands at 20,096,700gns and with another 172 horses in training to sell during today's final session, last year's aggregate of 20,761,100gns is well within reach.

From Goodwood to Cheltenham?...

The 100 members of the Goodwood Racehorse Owners Group enjoyed a good payday when parting with their dual winner Goodwood Mirage. The 3-year-old colt (lot [1084](#)) attracted a swathe of potential buyers representing Australian, Dubaiian and National Hunt interests, with bids thrown in from all corners of the ring by Alastair Donald, Paul Moroney, Anthony Stroud and Harold Kirk, but it was Guy Upton who prevailed, signing in the name of Jonjo O'Neill Racing.

Goodwood Mirage started his career under the tutelage of John Dunlop, who trained close to Goodwood at Arundel. The colt won on his sole start at two for Dunlop at Newmarket and after the trainer's retirement last year, he was transferred to another Sussex trainer, William Knight, for whom he added another victory, this time at the track after which he was named.

The Danehill Dancer stallion Jeremy has caught the attention of the jumps crowd in recent seasons, largely thanks to the exploits of exciting juvenile hurdler Our Conor (Ire), and it is at this code which Goodwood Mirage will now be aimed, joining O'Neill's Jackdaws Castle base in Gloucestershire for one of the trainer's existing clients. **Cont. p6**

"I thought he was the stand-out of the sale," said O'Neill. "He's got a lovely attitude and he's a really free mover."

Speaking on behalf of the large syndicate of owners, many of whom had made the trip to Newmarket to watch their horse sell, Gail Brown said: "He's such a lovely looking horse, he sold himself really. We've already reinvested in the yearling market and bought an Azamour colt for 36,000gns during Book 2 of the October Sale." **Cont. p6**

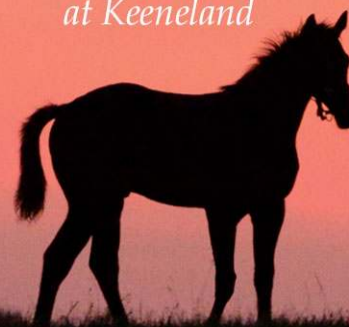

Desert Troops Aligned..

Anthony Stroud was the signatory for 4-year-old gelding Validus (lot [1194](#)), the most expensive on his list of purchases for the Dubai Carnival, which also includes recent Cambridgeshire H. runner-up Code Of Honor (GB) (Zafeen {Fr}) and Well Acquainted (Ire) (Orientate).

Surprised by how far he had to go to secure Validus, one of four six-figure lots from Luca Cumani's Bedford House Stables consignment, he said, "We really liked him. I didn't think he'd be that expensive but we managed to get a few others that we thought were reasonable so it all evens out in the end."

Code Of Honor (GB) (Zafeen {Fr}) (lot [1079](#)), now rated 99, was a 200,000gns purchase and was described by Stroud's buying partner David Loder as "one of the most progressive horses in the sale".

The colt's former trainer Henry Candy certainly agrees with that assessment. He said, "I'm very sorry to see him go really. He's still improving and we have seen the best of him yet. I think that's a fair price for him."

Having failed to reach his reserve as a yearling, Code Of Honor raced for his breeders Johnny Byrne and David Clark, winning three of his nine races before running the favourite Educate (GB) to a short-head with his late closing run in the Cambridgeshire Sept. 28.

Well Acquainted (Ire) (Orientate) (lot [1072](#)) set Stroud's client back a further 135,000gns. His dam Stunning Rose (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) won twice in Canada and is a daughter of the GII Schuylerville S. winner Golden Reef (Mr Prospector). **Cont. p8**

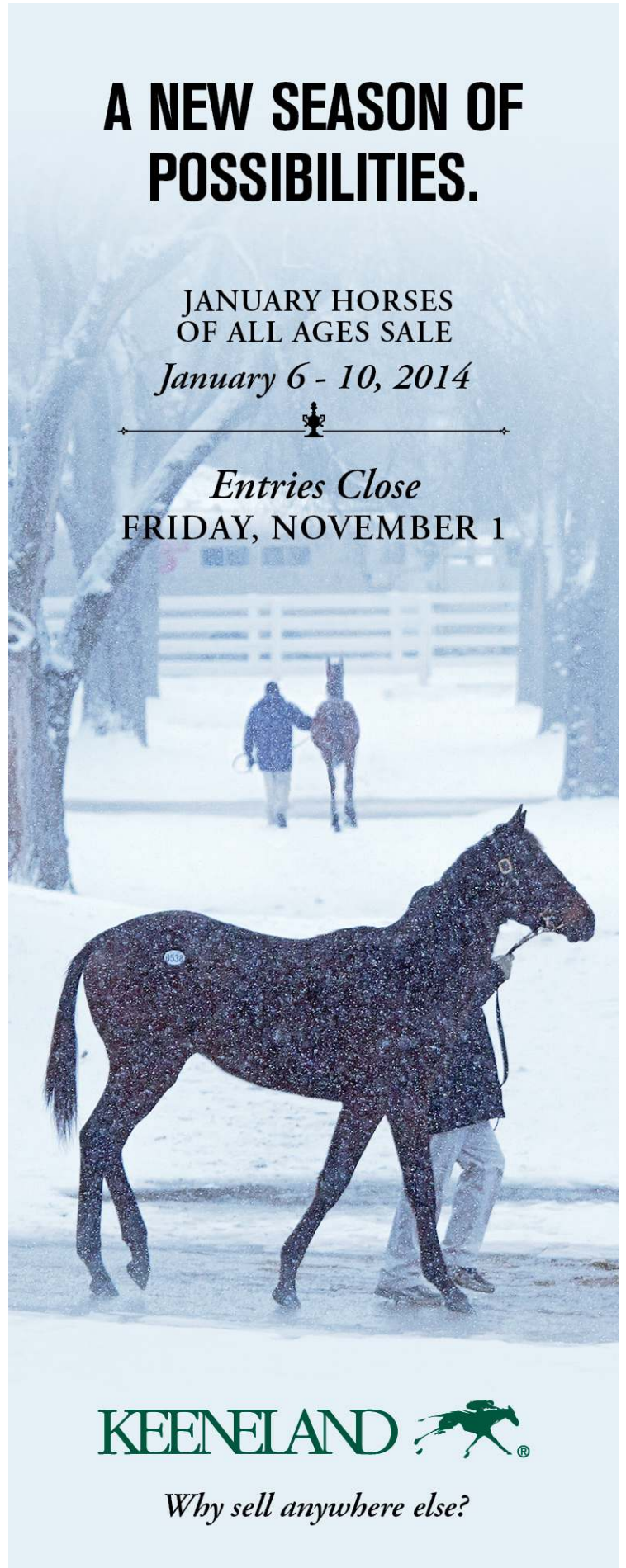

Juddmonte Popular as Always...

With dual Australian group 1 winner Foreteller (GB) (Dansili {GB}) as the poster boy for the Juddmonte draft at the horses-in-training sale, it was no surprise to find that Dansili colts were the order of the day. Four fetched six-figure sums as Prince Khalid Abdullah's sizeable consignment went through late in the session, with the first and most expensive being Passage Of Time's brother **Continuum (GB)** (lot [1141](#)), who was sold to Peter Hedger for 240,000gns.

The Sussex-based trainer said, "I'm going to wrap him in cotton wool, he's the most expensive horse I've ever bought! He's for some new owners from the construction industry. We'll geld him, but he'll stay on the Flat to begin with and he could go hurdling in a year's time."

Three lots later, another from Lady Cecil's Warren Place, the listed winner Disclaimer, went for 180,000gns to Alastair Donald, buying on behalf of a new Australian client.

"Dansili's done well there and this is a nice, neat horse who likes fast ground and looks like there's improvement to come," said the agent.

Also en route to Australia will be **Fledged (GB)** (Dansili {GB}) (lot [1152](#)), who was bought on behalf of Simon O'Donnell of OTI Racing who had been present at the sale from the start but had to leave shortly before the former John Gosden trainee went through the ring to catch his flight home. The 3-year-old colt was twice a winner this season at up to a mile and six furlongs and looks an ideal cups prospect.

Juddmonte's Dansili was not the only sire of expensive lots from the draft, however, with dual winner **Modern Pupil (GB)** (lot [1156](#)), a son of Sinndar (Ire) being claimed for 130,000gns by Saudi Arabian buyer Khalid Bin Mishref, and the beautifully bred **Defendant (GB)** (Medicean {GB}), out of a sister to Danehill, eventually being knocked down for 155,000gns after a disputed bid meant he was brought back into the ring and reoffered. Qatari owner Adbullatif Saad A Al-Muslamani had the final say in the second battle, with Alastair Donald the under-bidder.

All told, 42 Juddmonte horses sold for the grand sum of 1,784,500gns.

Australia Calling, Again...

The merits of the late Irish National Stud sire Verglas (Ire) have already been advertised in Australia via his son Glass Harmonium (Ire), who was bought privately by Paul Moroney from Sir Michael Stoute's stable and subsequently won the G1 Mackinnon S. and G2 Eagle Farm Cup for the agent's trainer brother Mike.

Father-and-son training team Bevan and Richard Laming, based in Clyde, Victoria, will train Verglas 3-year-old Glacial Age (Ire) (lot [1023](#)) after Richard signed for the Group 3-placed colt at 140,000gns. Late in the day, Laming also went to 220,000gns for lot [1205](#), the Andrew Balding-trained 3-year-old Danehill Dancer (Ire) colt **Refectory (Ire)**, who had added some listed black type to his page since the publication of the catalogue. **Cont. p9**

The list of European horses heading to Australia is ever increasing. Gai Waterhouse gained another staying son of Manduro (Ger), this one from Luca Cumani's draft when Johnny McKeever snared the listed Noel Murless S. runner-up **Greatwood (GB)** (Manduro {Ger}) for 180,000gns.

David Baker, buying for trainer Paul Perry, made his second purchase of the sale when bidding 160,000gns for yet another Luca Cumani consignee, this one the 4-year-old treble winner **Rockalong (Ire)** (Rock Of Gibraltar (Ire)).

Guy Mulcaster signed for juvenile winner Fracking (Ire) (Intikhab) early in the day at 100,000gns and the gelding is another recruit for trainer Chris Waller, while Warrnambool trainer Aaron Purcell went to 65,000gns to buy **St Jean (Ire)** (Teofilo {Ire}) from the Shadwell draft. The 3-year-12-furlong winner was knocked down to Anthony Bromley of Highflyer Bloodstock on Purcell's behalf.

The sale concludes today with the final batch of horses in training followed by a short session of 40 yearlings comprising Book 4 of the October Sale.

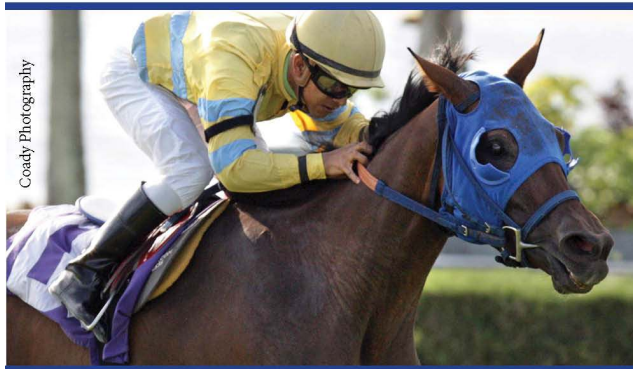

INTERNATIONAL APPEAL AT FASIG-TIPTON by Christina Bossinakis

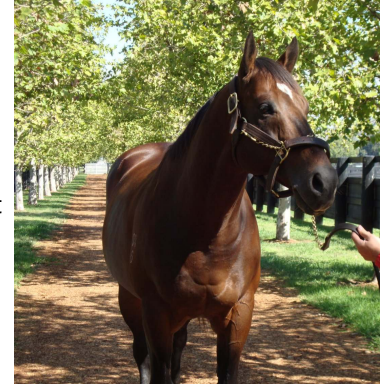
Typically one of the major stops for buyers looking for bloodstock with international flare, Monday's Fasig-Tipton November sale provides plenty of interesting prospects that fit the bill.

Among this season's most intriguing offerings is [Hip 195](#), **Mi Sueno** (Pulpit). Out of GI Ashland S. heroine Madcap Escapade (Hennessy), the 6-year-old was secured by Mike Moreno's Southern Equine as a weanling for \$1.7 million at the 2007 Keeneland November sale. In living up to her illustrious pedigree early, Mi Sueno romped in the GIII Sorrento S. at Del Mar before adding a win in the GI Darley Debutante S. Consigned by Bluewater Sales, the mare has an unraced 2-year-old filly by Medaglia d'Oro in addition to a yearling filly by Street Cry (Ire). Sent to England to be bred last year, she sells in foal to European Horse of the Year and 10-time Group 1 winner Frankel (GB) (Galileo {Ire}).

Something of a novelty in this year's catalog is [Hip 97](#), **Mantilla** (Gone West), a daughter of the graded stakes winner and Grade I-placed Didina (GB) (Nashwan). The 4-year-old mare is a half-sister to Tantina (Distant View), the dam of Irish highweighted miler and G1 Dubai Duty Free winner Cityscape (Selkirk) in addition to Group 2-scorer, Bated Breath (Dansili), runner-up in the GI Nearctic S. Mantilla, a descendant of Broodmare of the Year Best of Show (Traffic Judge), hails from the extended female family of European juvenile champions Xaar (GB) (Zafonic) and Malinowski (Sir Ivor) in addition to Grade I winners Blush With Pride, Close Hatches, Jazil, Rags to Riches and Senure. Purchased by Brookdale Farm for 105,000gns at Tattersalls December in 2012, Mantilla remained in Europe and was sent to leading Australian sire Redoute's Choice (Aus) (Danehill). Retired to Arrowfield Stud in 2001, Redoute's Choice stood his first Northern Hemisphere season at the Aga Khan's Haras de Bonneval in France this year.

“At first, it was undetermined to whom we were going to send her to, but once we heard Redoute's Choice was going to shuttle to France, we decided to send her to him,” explained Brookdale Sales Director of Sales' Joe Seitz. “Since it was a new concept to stand a horse coming up from Australia, we thought it might make some sense to take advantage of him while he was there. So, we left the mare in Europe to go to Redoute's Choice.”

When asked if the U.S. marketplace could support a mare with international appeal, Seitz explained, “We think she will be well received, because she is out of a wonderful, budding family that people from around the world will respect. She is by a top stallion Gone West, she is attractive and she is in foal to one of the best horses in the Southern Hemisphere. We feel the industry is becoming so globalized that most people will recognize and appreciate this pedigree more than they might have in the past.”

Offering a truly international page is [Hip 142](#), the 4-year-old Shamarbelle (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}). Consigned by Bedouin Bloodstock, the bay filly is a daughter of Helsinki (GB) (Machiavellian), a full-sister to G1 Dubai World Cup hero and leading top sire Street Cry (Ire) who brought \$3.9 million at the 2004 Keeneland November sale. Shamarbelle is a half-sister to multiple champion Shamardal (Giant's Causeway) and a full-sister to Geoffrey Chaucer, winner of the G2 Breresford S. at The Curragh Sept. 29. Shamarbelle sells in foal to Speightstown.

Also on tap are a pair of fillies that got their start overseas before making their mark in the U.S. First through the ring is [Hip 22](#), **Clenor (Ire)** (Oratorio {Ire}), out of Chantarella (Ire) (Royal Academy). Third in the G3 Balanchine S. at The Curragh June 30, the bay registered her first win for trainer Doug O'Neill at Del Mar Aug. 7 before adding a victory in the one-mile Oak Tree Juvenile Fillies Turf S. at Del Mar Sept. 2. the track, she won the GII Royal Heroine Mile S. and GIII Wilshire H. and was runner-up in the GI Matriarch S. A full-sister to Group 3 victor Young Pretender (Ire), the 5-year-old is a granddaughter of Park Heiress (Sadler's Wells), a 3/4-sister to champion juvenile and sophomore New Approach (Ire) (Galileo) and European middle-distance highweight Dazzling Park (Ire)

(Warning {GB}). Park Heiress is also a 3/4 sister to Alluring Park (Ire) (Green Desert), dam of Group 1 winner Was (Ire) (Galileo) in addition to a yearling full-sister to Was who brought a world record 5-million guineas at the recent Tattersalls October Yearling sale.

While it might appear to be a risky proposition to sell stock outside of its region of significance, Seitz believes there is no risk when presenting the right product.

"If it's real quality, it doesn't matter where the stock is from, they appreciate it," said Seitz. "If it crosses that stratosphere into really high quality, it will catch the attention of the astute buyers and it will sell accordingly."

CTS TO HOST \$1M SALES RACE *by Liesl King*

At a glittering media function at Taboo in Johannesburg Wednesday, the Cape Thoroughbred Sales company (CTS) announced that it will be hosting the first \$1-million race in Africa. Known for its out-of-the-box thinking, CTS, who annually hosts the innovative inner-city sale, the Cape Premier Yearling Sale, has taken another quantum leap in announcing Africa's richest race for graduates of the 2014 Cape Premier Yearling Sale and the 2014 CTS March Yearling Sale. The race far surpasses the current richest race in Africa, the R3.5 million G1 Vodacom Durban July. CTS Chairman Chris van Niekerk announced that the prize money will be split over the first five places, with the winner receiving \$500,000, second place \$200,000, third \$150,000, fourth \$100,000 and \$40,000 to the fifth-placed horse. The vendor of the winning horse will receive \$10,000 as well.

In what must be the biggest return on investment ever seen, Van Niekerk went on to explain that for the 2014 Cape Premier Yearling Sale, the buy-in would be a mere R5,000 per horse for the buyer, with no cost to the vendor and for the 2014 CTS March Yearling Sale, the buy-in would be R5,000 per horse for the buyer and R5,000 for the vendor. From 2015 onwards, the buy-in for both buyer and vendor at the Cape Premier Yearling Sale will be R15,000 each per horse, while the buy-in at the CTS March Yearling Sale will be R10,000 per horse for both buyer and vendor.

The first \$1-million race in the history of South African racing is scheduled to be run over 1400 meters at Kenilworth Racecourse in January 2016 and will only be open to graduates from the 2014 Cape Premier Yearling Sale and the 2014 CTS March Yearling Sale.

Before I cover the ideas, let me outline the foundation that supports horse racing. Visualize it like a three-legged stool, where leg number one is the bettors, anteing up \$11 billion on our sport annually. It is the takeout from their bets that provides the majority of the revenue to the other two foundation legs, racetracks and racehorse owners. The sport only stands tall when all three legs are strong. If there were no betting, it would stop revenue and immediately bring an end to most racing. As we know, without financially solid racetracks, there could be very little racing. Without race horse owners, we would have no horses to race. These three legs keep racing alive for all the rest of the industry. If there were no racing, there would be no need for stud farms or broodmares or yearling sales or track vets or sales agents. If we focus on improving the sport for bettors, tracks and race horse owners, the rest of the sport's supply chain should prosper.

As a very small and inconsequential player in the horse racing sport, I have little to lose compared to most readers. But that does not make me blind to potential modifications that could make a big difference in our future. Here are five ideas.

1) Accept the financial reality that high on-track revenue is history.

In 1980, about 90% of all handle was bet at the track. Today only 10% is bet as on-track handle. Only handle (the amount bet) drives track revenue and owners' purses (not considering \$400 million in slots subsidies). Giant grandstands, fancy clubhouses and good restaurants for a clientele that sits and bets 500 miles away are pointless. The golden days at Keeneland, Del Mar or Saratoga are wonderful, but every track faces a different audience reality and for many, the future is focused on betting by customers that are far-removed physically. That contains some good news, because electronically, we can reach a huge audience--almost everyone in the world. And, if we lose key Metro tracks to land development (Hollywood Park, Bay Meadows, Detroit DRC, they can be replaced on lower cost, remote land thereby improving race track financials. A few live luxury racing facilities with big on-track handle can and will co-exist with remote racing (Kentucky Downs or Delta Downs). But not everyone can skip work and go to the races. Frankly, it is time for the old guard, like me, to quit reliving the good old days, and demanding that we go back to full grandstands. **Cont. p18**

Since every track receives a big chunk of its revenue from simulcasting, it is time for the industry to have a fair, realistic and integrated business plan for every track. Keeneland's big on-track handle, and large simulcast facility and night racing at Delta Downs where 97% of the handle is off-track, should have a mutual revenue producing relationship that is fair to both. Repeat, fair to both. Our current model based upon a financial war between tracks for a share of a shrinking pie is a proven failure. Instead the industry needs to work together to grow the pie so everyone gets a bigger slice.

We are not alone in this situation, as each fall one million fans attend a weekly NFL game, but 22 million more watch on TV. The NFL is 96% off-track, using our terminology. The NFL has an integrated financial plan. Stadium attendance provides about one third of total revenue and goes directly to the two teams, while TV provides about two thirds of the revenue and is shared equally among teams regardless of market size (understanding that they jointly produce the really big show for a national audience).

2) People love to gamble, so we need to give them a game they can and will play.

We desperately need a new betting game for a totally new audience.

In the little town where I grew up, GeeGee, a neighbor lady, played the daily double every day--when she could find someone to carry her bet to the track for her. If she were alive today, I fear GeeGee would be betting at the corner convenience store every day--on the lottery.

Over the last 20 years, lottery sales have exploded. Lottery handle in this country is currently \$78 billion per year (seven times racing) and growing daily. And get this, lottery takeout rate is 35%, double that of horse racing.

Meanwhile, betting on horse racing is stagnant. Today's \$11.5 billion racing handle is about the same as 20 years ago, despite inflation, and has declined from its peak of \$16 billion in 2006.

Consider why people play the lottery: fast, easy, convenient, huge get-rich payouts, low skill required. Why not start simple and easy, at the corner, horse race betting? It would likely require some track-to-track cooperation, and some changes to state laws, but so did slots, and we were certainly willing to fight the slots legalization battles. The technology is available, the infrastructure is available, and obviously the customers are available. The good news is the American public is betting big bucks. The bad news, it's not at the race track. They don't dislike horse racing, we are just unhandy, and invisible. Think about exciting horse racing-based games (pick 10, straight 8, powerball-type Pick 16. Be creative!). I don't pretend to know how to design these games themselves, but that expertise is available. The key is to sell these tickets through a wide and convenient network, and select the winning numbers by horse races, rather than ping pong balls.

Fact: if only 5% of the current lottery handle was bet on horse racing based games (due to the higher takeout structure), track revenue and purses would grow by 50%.

Importantly, there is no reason why these new bets which appeal to a totally different audience, and which are sold conveniently, would have any adverse impact on our traditional betting. Traditional handicapping could continue unchanged, as new horse racing based games are installed, with totally different take out rates, and separate mutual pools. Old game and new game can co-exist.

Maybe it is even time to rethink franchising betting at convenient and quality venues like sports bars and restaurants. (But please, eliminate the filthy old traditional OTB's).

This argument reminds me of the days long ago when McDonalds was trying to convince their organization that drive-thru windows had potential. I was told that many of their older store managers found it a hard pill to swallow. Today drive-thru windows provide 60% of their total sales.

It is time to get on with designing and installing betting games to attract a vast, new and untapped audience.

3) Make the most of the available race horse population.

Any race track manager will tell you that full fields of competitive horses generate the most betting (handle). Unfortunately, historical ways of controlling race horses by track stall allocation discourages trainers from shipping. It is common to pressure or even take stalls away from a trainer that ships a horse out to another track. I fully understand the track's point of view; but the tracks' singular focus is not good for racing overall.

What if one horse in the trainer's string doesn't fit the races at the local meet, or the targeted race does not fill, or the race overfills and the horse is excluded? Then what is good for the track, is not good for the other two legs...owners and bettors.

Gooseneck trailers and interstate highways have completely changed the way we think about moving horses and the distance we are willing to travel for a race. Our Kentucky based horses easily ship to six nearby states to race, as is true in other regions. In a realistic example: a horse stands in a stall at an Ohio track that could be in a fitting race in Indiana. Another horse in a stall in Indiana could be running in Kentucky, while one in Kentucky could be running in Ohio. But all 3 horses are restricted from racing due to track stall policy.

While the willingness to ship is relatively new, stall policy and starter payments are historical. It is time get creative with stall policy and purse distribution to attract horses, and to help offset two of the owner's highest expenses.

In 2012, if such a change had resulted in half of the racing horses in America shipping to just one additional race in the entire year; it would have increased average field size from 7.9 to 8.5 and raised average starts per horse from 6.3 to 6.8. Good for tracks, good for owners and good for bettors.

4) Let's quit looking down our nose at our sports money makers.

If a rock concert does not sell enough tickets to cover the costs of a big name Rock Star, will the promoter book more of his concerts? When Satish Sanan brought the statistics to light a few years ago, I was shocked to learn that a majority of our graded stakes races are financial losers.

He reported that in 2008, of the 566 graded stakes races, only 49 graded races generated enough handle to fully pay the purse.

In another 229 graded races total takeout (both track and purse share) did not cover the purse. And in 27 graded races, the total handle (all money bet) did not exceed the size of the purse. Think of it, these statistics factually demolish the oft repeated mantra that the key to our future is more high quality racing. What is shocking is that our best racing, graded stakes, is being subsidized by the lesser aspects of the sport.

The stakes schedule continues because it showcases the best of the sport and the breed, but obviously the funding mechanism of the sport (betting) often does not see it that way, nor generate enough handle to pay for this showcase.

The real financial workhorse of the industry is the middle-level experienced claimer. A full field of \$10,000 claimers with enough form to attract the bettors will almost always generate sufficient handle to cover its purse. So, it seems strange that the industry caters to the stars, while it ignores the true heavy lifters. The tracks need to acknowledge that the owners and trainers of the mid-level horses are the critical funding mechanism for the business and treat them like the revenue generators they are. Maybe if tracks worked a little harder to enhance the owners' experience at all levels, we could attract more people to the excitement of owning a racehorse. Only a few tracks make any effort to acknowledge the owners and trainers that supply the talent that puts on the show. Turfway Park's recent addition of an owners' lounge just off the saddling paddock is a classy touch and a step in the right direction. Who's next?

I often hear that we should actually encourage some smaller tracks to go out of business in order to improve the overall quality of racing, reduce the breeding of poor quality horses and channel betting dollars to the high quality tracks. No data or statistics verify that when a small track closes, the overall sport benefits.

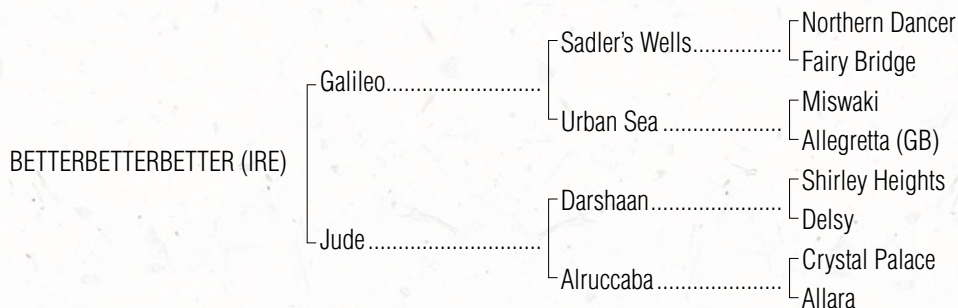

Many of our stars, (Mott, Asmussen, Lukas, McPeek, McCarron, Bailey) started at the smaller tracks, which are our sport's farm system. When Detroit's Pinnacle Racetrack closed two years ago and left five million people without a local racetrack, neither tracks in Chicago, Ontario or Ohio nor racing in general profited or picked up the slack. As for the horses, about half of those Michigan runners were nicely bred Kentucky horses that just never lived up to their well-intentioned breeders' expectations.

The point is, let's not shoot ourselves in the foot. We would likely be surprised to learn that at many larger tracks, simulcast revenue (much of it from bets on races at smaller tracks on nights, mid-week and off season) is funding their stakes program and is the difference between profit and extinction.

5) Quit seeing the other racetracks as the competition.

Racetracks make decisions every day that may look good internally but are bad overall. Why should I as a weekly bettor be forced to reach each track through a middle man? Why? Because the tracks made it so difficult. Most tracks only established in-house ADW's years after the competition, and when they did, each used a different internet system (program). Each track wanted me to fund a separate advanced deposit account. Some tracks provided live video, most didn't. The tracks with their singular focus on profiting off of each other forced me to go to a secondary supplier (ADW), thereby reducing their profit margin and owners' purses.

If the tracks had worked together, they could have saved software development costs, installed a single industry-wide deposit mechanism (like a debit card), agreed upon consistent and easy-to-use betting software (like excel) and a best-price rebate system (no one can beat their price). Working together, tracks could have developed a single video site so I could watch the races remotely and free and...they could have owned me. Instead, every track chose to go it alone and in the end channeled hundreds of millions of dollars to the middle men (ADW) instead of the bettors (rebates), the tracks (higher margins) and the purses (more revenue) for owners.

I continue to hear the gruesome history, but in the end the sport slept through another major opportunity and they are sleeping through some right now. It is just the latest example of the industry's resistance to change until it is obvious, well underway and the horse is out of the barn.

Opportunities still exist for the tracks to work together for the good of the sport: i.e. a schedule of Saturday stakes races that provides time to see and bet the entire day's graded races; cross-track combination bets on the major stakes of the day; or cooperative stabling/starter payment programs. It is never too late to start doing the smart or logical thing for your customers. Some people tell me it is too late for an industry-wide ADW, and I reply that customers switch phone companies, internet providers and credit card companies everyday, but only if .and when the new provider has a better idea. So let's try some new ideas.

The makeup of the "ABC" organizations that speak for our sport are dominated by very talented breeders and stud farms. Obviously, their interests and efforts are focused on the breeding and sales side of the business. But schmoozing a wealthy owner and attracting broad bettor interest and billions of dollars in new betting handle from the American middle class public require totally different skills and thinking.

The racehorse owners have a huge stake in this sport and are some of the brightest and most innovative business people in the nation. Many are leaders in their industry and know how to influence a broad audience. The sport needs to harness their knowledge and expertise in designing, implementing, and marketing exciting new betting products and efficient practices that could make a world of difference in a sport where as Ray Paulick says, "new ideas flow like a trickle." We do have new and exciting ideas, some of which are just plain common sense. What we lack is an industry, a system or an organization willing and able to implement some of them.

WELCOME TO THE JUNGLE

Jim Rome at a loss for words?

That's what **Mizdirection** (Mizzen Mast)'s dramatic win over the boys in last year's GI Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint ([video](#)) has seemingly done to the brash sports radio/television host and owner.

"I've thought about this every single day since it happened and it's still kind of hard to explain," Rome, 49, revealed. "It really was the most surreal, spectacular day of my life that didn't include a wedding or the birth of my two kids [Jake, 12, and Logan, 8]."

Off at 6-1, Mizdirection broke alertly from post 11, but was quickly outsprinted to race in 10th through an opening quarter in :21.11. With Hall of Famer Mike Smith remaining cool, the flashy gray was guided to the extreme outside as they crossed over the main track and punched home impressively to inhale favored Unbridled's Note (Unbridled's Song) by a half-length. The \$85,000 KEESEP yearling and \$50,000 FTMMAY juvenile is owned by Rome in partnership with Bill Strauss and several others.

"I hadn't planned for it," said Rome, who celebrated with a post-victory dinner at The Derby. "I'm telling you, until she crossed that line, it never dawned on me that this horse could ever win a race like that, and I adore her and love her--I'm her biggest fan."

Just like last year, Mizdirection will be heading to the big one after spending some time on the shelf. She kicked off her 5-year-old campaign with three straight wins, including the GIII Las Cienegas S. going down the hill at Santa Anita Apr. 13. She tired to finish fifth when stretched to a mile over a yielding course in Belmont's GI Just a Game S. most recently June 8. Mizdirection, a perfect six-for-six over this course, and perfect in five down the hill, entered the 2012 Championships following a second-place finish in the Great Lady M S. at Hollywood in late May. She is trained by Mike Puype.

"We had nothing to lose last year," Rome admitted. "She was 20-1 on the morning line and I was just *really* happy to be there. For the longest time, we couldn't even get into a stakes race, much less win one until we bought into Mizdirection."

Rome continued, "But all of sudden, there's a big bull's eye on her back. The stakes feel different and the pressure feels much more intense. And if we know anything about her, she's pretty good off layoffs, she knows that course--which is kind of tricky--and as long as she keeps training the way she has [fired a six-furlong bullet in 1:11.80 Oct. 12], I think she's got a good shot."

Not Built in a Day...

While it's been well-documented that Rome wasn't exactly always racing's biggest cheerleader, it's very clear where his heart lies now after being selected as an inaugural Breeders' Cup Ambassador in 2012. Others to receive the prestigious honor include celebrity chef Bobby Flay, country music star Toby Keith and former New York Yankees manager Joe Torre.

"Some people like to throw this in my face a little bit," Rome explained. "Hey, weren't you the guy who used to clown that sport?' I always say, 'Yeah, a little bit,' but it's not nearly as much as people seem to think. It's kind of funny that this thing's done a full 180. It's really an amazing honor. To even just attend the Breeders' Cup was a great thrill. But to be a part of it as an Ambassador and to be involved in the whole thing [as an owner], is just incredible."

Like most natives of Southern California, Rome was introduced to the sport by visiting Del Mar Racetrack. While initial ownership recruiting attempts by Little Red Feather's Billy Koch proved fruitless, it was Rome's wife Janet who finally got him on board.

"We would go to Del Mar once a summer usually--go to the track, have a few drinks, put on a nice suit and have some fun--and Billy Koch from Little Red Feather, inevitably, would just run into me," Rome commented. "He'd say, 'You should do this. You should do this. You'll like it.' And I always had no interest whatsoever."

Rome continued, "My wife said to me one day, 'You know what, you need a hobby. All you're doing is working. It would be a nice release for you. Let's just do it. Let's buy a piece of one of his horses--I think you'll have fun with it.'"

She was right.

Rome finally took Koch up on his offer and bought into Little Red Feather's Wing Forward (Arg) (Arch). The dark bay dramatically blew by them all after caboosing a field of 12 to win an allowance race at Santa Anita in his first start in this country back in September 2007.

"Of course, the worst thing that could happen, did happen," Rome joked of how he became hooked. "We had a horse running at 15-1 who came from out of the clouds to win, and it hit me in my veins. I got stuck--it was like a jolt. After that, I kept looking for more horses to buy. I couldn't get enough of it."

Whether it's a cheap claimer or a Breeders' Cup winner, it's all the same for Rome and his other half while walking down the shedrow.

"There's so many things about the sport that I like, but first and foremost, the biggest hook for my wife and I are the horses," Rome said. "We've fallen in love with every last one of them. We're crazy about Thoroughbreds."

Although scaling back his operation slightly and focusing more on quality for the moment, Rome's Jungle Racing has carried as many as 15 runners at its peak. He currently has five horses in training--either wholly owned or in partnership--including the defending Turf Sprint champ. Rome's current broodmare band of one is anchored by Surfer Girl (Brz) (Wild Event), who carried his black-and-blue silks to several allowance placings before being retired in 2010. The Group 1-placed Brazilian mare produced a Pulpit filly in 2012 and a Sky Mesa filly earlier this spring. She is currently in foal to dual Classic winner Big Brown.

"I'm trying to regroup and reset," Rome commented. "The Breeders' Cup, once you get a taste of that, it makes you so much more hungry to get more. But at the same time, it's a really hard thing to do [win a Breeders' Cup race]."

The private purchase of the talented female sprinter Gypsy Robin (Daaher) earlier this year led to an unexpected exchange with her former owner, NFL wide receiver and fellow Breeders' Cup Ambassador Wes Welker. Since switching hands and transferring to Puype, Gypsy Robin has captured Del Mar's Sept. 4 C.E.R.F. S. over subsequent GII Raven Run S. victress Madame Cactus (Cactus Ridge) and has also placed second in Keeneland's GII Thoroughbred Club of America S. last time Oct. 5.

"Welker is funny--we have a good professional relationship, but he's not a guy that I talk to a lot," Rome said. "One day he hits me on Twitter with a direct message--it was really out of the blue and very random. And he's like, 'Man, are you guys ever going to run Gypsy? Or are you going to leave it all out there on the practice track?'"

Rome continued, "You know how horse people are, we all stick together. When I talk to these guys [Welker, University of Louisville basketball coach and Breeders' Cup Ambassador Rick Pitino, etc.] on one of my shows, when we set up those interviews beforehand, rather than, 'Hey, how are you doing and how's the team?' It's more like, 'Hey, how are your horses doing?'"

Rome's nationally syndicated radio program, *The Jim Rome Show*, airs on more than 200 stations and boasts more than two million listeners. Based in the Los Angeles area, he is also the host of *Jim Rome on Showtime* and *Rome* on the CBS Sports Network. How have his fans (1.16 million followers on Twitter)--or clones, as Rome refers to them--handled all of the newfound chatter about horse racing?

"It is kind of a hard sell and I have to be leery of that fact," Rome said with some disappointment. "If it were up to me, I would talk about it all the time, but I know I'm going to lose some people, so I have to pick my spots. My responsibility is to create a show that's compelling and riveting every single day. The Breeders' Cup situation was interesting because I opened my show the following Monday and said, 'Look, I'm not going to bang you over the head with it and I'm not going to go on about it for three hours, but I want to share some thoughts. It was an amazing moment of my life that I want to share, and we'll go as far as you want.'"

Rome concluded, "They carried it for about two hours, which is about an hour and a half more than I expected."

Win or lose this weekend, you can count on Rome to have plenty of "smack" to dish Monday.

BREEDERS' CUP CLASSIC

Game on Dude (Awesome Again) will be looking to prove third time lucky in the Classic. Second in the 2011 race after making a mess of the start, he was seventh as the favorite a year ago, but the 6-year-old gelding has looked better than ever this term. He is unbeaten in five starts in a more focused 2013 campaign and will be making his first start since winning the Aug. 25 GI TVG Pacific Classic. After running second in the 2012 Del Mar centerpiece, Game on Dude prepped for the Breeders' Cup with a win in the GI Awesome Again S. Connections opted to skip the extra prep this year and the additional time off could make all the difference.

In the absence of Game on Dude, **Mucho Macho Man** (Macho Uno) dominated the Awesome Again to earn his first victory since the 2012 GII Suburban H. The strapping bay was a gallant runner-up in last year's Classic and has now run two of his best lifetime races over the Santa Anita surface.

Defending Classic champion **Fort Larned** (E Dubai) has had an adventurous 2013 campaign, starting with the Mar. 9 GII Gulfstream Park H. when he stumbled out of the gate, losing jockey Brian Hernandez and streaking loose around the track. He got back on track two starts later with an impressive 6 1/4-length victory in the June 15 GI Stephen Foster H. Fifth in defense of his GI Whitney H. title Aug. 3, he got a class break with an easy wire-to-wire victory in the Sept. 28 Homecoming Classic at Churchill Downs.

Will Take Charge (Unbridled's Song) has taken charge of the sophomore division with wins in the Aug. 24 GI Travers S. and Sept. 21 GII Pennsylvania Derby. Trainer D. Wayne Lukas has maintained all along that the imposing chestnut needed time to figure out the racing game and is just starting to come into his own. If he continues to improve, he could give he elders a lesson at Santa Anita.

Belmont's Sept. 28 GI Jockey Club Gold Cup was won in dominating fashion by 21-1 outsider **Ron the Greek** (Full Mandate), but that's not the only race on his resume to suggest that he's a major contender here. The Bill Mott trainee annexed last year's track-and-trip GI Santa Anita H. with a sweeping move. Jockey Club runner-up **Palace Malice** (Curlin) took the GI Belmont S. and handily beat Will Take Charge in the GII Jim Dandy S., but was done in by a rough start when a close fourth in the Travers. **Cont. p4**

BREEDERS' CUP MILE

No Breeders' Cup race is easy to win even one time, let alone two or more times. Despite that fact, the GI Breeders' Cup Mile has produced the most multiple winners of any of the Championship races (Miesque, 1987-88; Lure, 1992-93; Da Hoss, 1996, 1998; and the irrepressible Goldikova, 2008-10). Morton Fink's **Wise Dan** (Wiseman's Ferry) will look to join that illustrious foursome when he takes to the Santa Anita

turf to face a field roughly comparable in talent to the one he defeated 12 months ago. Though it was the rallying cry of many horse racing pundits for connections to campaign the horse more

ambitiously and/or on the dirt this season, trainer Charlie LoPresti and Fink have remained true to their cause and kept the 6-year-old exclusively on the grass. The popular chestnut made his first three starts of the season, taking the Apr. 12 GI Maker's 46 Mile and the GI Woodford Reserve Turf Classic May 5 before overcoming an eventful (and literally) hedge-clipping trip and 128 pounds in the GII Firecracker H. June 29. Connections sportingly accepted a 129-pound impost for a title defense in Saratoga's GII Fourstardave H. Aug. 10, and Wise Dan obliged, then successfully followed up with a second consecutive score in the GI Woodbine Mile Sept. 15. Very little went according to plan when Wise Dan went in search of a second straight GI Shadwell Turf Mile Oct. 5, as the race was rained onto the equivalent of a 'sloppy' Polytrack, he was wide throughout and couldn't quite reel in **Silver Max** (Badge of Silver). Many will view that as a potential chink in the armor, but they'll do so at their own risk.

Last year, it was Excelebration (GB) (Exceed and Excel {Aus}) the bettors thought could be the fly in the ointment, and the 3-year-old **Olympic Glory (Ire)** (Choisir {Aus}) will be one many gravitate to this time around. Winner of the G1 Grand Criterium to close out a 4-for-5 freshman season, the bay validated odds-on favoritism in the G3 Greenham S. Apr. 20, but flopped in 11th in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches May 12. He returned from a three-month freshening in Deauville's G1 Prix Jacques le Marois Aug. 11 and just failed to catch Moonlight Cloud (GB) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) and filled the same spot in the G1 Prix du Moulin Sept. 15, but turned it around in the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. over boggy Ascot turf Oct. 19. Whether the underfoot conditions or the addition of blinkers made the difference, Olympic Glory is certain to have his share of backers this Saturday.

The red-and-white silks of Charlotte Weber's Live Oak Stud were carried to victory by Miesque's Approval (Miesque's Son) in the 2006 Mile at Churchill, and **Za Approval** (Ghostzapper) takes another crack at Wise Dan today. Scratched from the Fourstardave due to ease in the ground, he tried the champ in the Woodbine Mile, but had to settle for a gallant runner-up effort.

Private Zone (Macho Uno), second in all three of his previous attempts over this track, including the GI Malibu S. in December, has been at his best since returning from a disappointing trip to Dubai. The speedy 4-year-old put behind a ninth-place finish in the G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen Mar. 30 with a game tally in Del Mar's Pirate's Bounty S. Sept. 4. He did all of the heavy lifting in Belmont's GI Vosburgh Invitational S. Sept. 28 and simply refused to let **Justin Phillip** (First Samurai) beat him in a roughly run stretch duel. Private Zone is the lukewarm morning-line favorite at 3-1 here. **Secret Circle** (Eddington), hero of the 2011 Breeders' Cup Juvenile Sprint at Churchill Downs, will attempt his best

impersonation of popular two-time GI Breeders' Cup Mile hero Da Hoss. Sidelined after finishing a distant second behind former stablemate Bodemeister (Empire Maker) in last year's GI Arkansas Derby in April, Secret Circle returned to the races in style with a sharp optional claiming tally over track and trip Oct. 14. **Gentlemen's Bet** (Half Ours) has run races fast enough to win this when capturing the Iowa Sprint H. June 28 and finishing a game third behind Justin Phillip and **Bahamian Squall** (Gone West) in Saratoga's GI Alfred G. Vanderbilt H. Aug. 4. He didn't quite handle the switch to Polytrack when a non-threatening fourth as the 2-1 favorite behind **Sum of the Parts** (Speightstown) in the GIII Phoenix S. at Keeneland last time Oct. 4. Defending Sprint winner **Trinniberg** (Teufflesberg) would be a much bigger surprise than he was last year at 13-1. A debut victor going 5 1/2 furlongs at Saratoga Aug. 23, the grey--who is a member of the first crop of Classic-placed Dunkirk--did all the dirty work early and had to gut it out to hold on for a narrow score over the classy fellow ★ **"TDN Rising Star"** ★ Honor Code (A.P. Indy) in the one-mile GI Champagne S. Oct. 5. He'll need to prove he can handle the extra yardage here, as he looked to be out of gas at the finish of the Champagne, the fast pace notwithstanding.

Strong Mandate (Tiznow) didn't show his best when fifth--beaten 12 1/4 lengths--in his career bow at the Spa July 22, but rebounded to blow the doors off his foes while sporting blinkers for the first time Aug. 17. Sent off at generous 7-1 odds for a sloppy renewal of the GI Hopeful S. Sept. 2, the D. Wayne Lukas pupil beat his rivals into submission, bounding home a 9 3/4-length winner. Since last year's victory, Mizdirection has taken the GII Monrovia S. over this course Jan. 6, then stretched out to a mile to annex the GII Buena Vista H. Feb. 18. She returned to the

downhill turf course to score decisively in the GIII Las Cienegas Apr. 13, but makes her first start since failing to handle Grade I milers in the June 8 Just A Game S. over a Belmont turf course that was softer than she likes it. She entered off a similar lay-off 12 months ago.

Unbridled's Note (Unbridled's Song) will look for redemption, having rallied well here last year to be second, beaten a half-length. Third behind Jimmy Creed (Distorted Humor) and Private Zone (Macho Uno) in the GI Malibu S. over the main track Dec. 26, the Mike McCarty colorbearer changed tactics for a front-running victory over **Chips All In** (North Light {Ire}) in the Joe Hernandez H. over this course Feb. 23. Second to Jimmy Creed in the GII Potrero Grande S. back on the dirt Apr. 6, he never factored when eighth in the sloppy GII Churchill Downs S. on the Derby undercard and enters off a game third behind Chips All In and **Boat Trip** (Harlan's Holiday) in the GIII Eddie D. S. down the hill Sept. 27.

Trainer Peter Miller opted to send the speedy **Reneesgotzip** (City Zip) here instead of the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint at six panels on dirt or GI Breeders' Cup F/M Sprint at seven. The 4-year-old, who completed last year's trifecta, has made only four starts since that finish, winning the Skillful Joy S. at Betfair Hollywood Park Dec. 1 before just failing to hold off Book Review (Giant's Causeway) in the Dec. 26 GI La Brea S. to close out the year. The Lanni family colorbearer returned from a seven-month hiatus with a 5 1/2-length victory over Executiveprivilege (First Samurai) in a salty Del Mar allowance July 18 prior to a front-running romp in the GIII Rancho Bernardo H. at Del Mar Aug. 18. She comes off another layoff for this one, but she runs well fresh. **Cont. p15**

With defending GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Sprint heroine **Groupie Doll** (Bowman's Band) appearing to have lost a step or two this season, but still favored at 5-2 on the morning-line, there are plenty of different directions to go in this wide-open renewal. **Book Review** (Giant's Causeway), victress of Santa Anita's 2012 GI La Brea S. over a stellar cast--including Reneesgotzip (City Zip) and My Miss Aurelia (Smart Strike)--may have the home-field advantage. In addition to that key victory over track and trip, the chestnut also owns a pair of strong runner-up efforts going long at Santa Anita in the GII La Canada S. Jan. 20 and the GII Santa Maria S. Feb. 16. The Gary and Mary West colorbearer punched her ticket to the big dance with a decisive come-from-behind victory in Betfair Hollywood's "Win and You're In" GII A Gleam H. July 13. She didn't seem to be handling the surface too well in the early going of Saratoga's "Win and You're In" GI Ballerina S. Aug. 23, but got more comfortable throughout, and came charging from seventh to close to within a head of the streaking **Dance to Bristol** (Speightstown) in a thriller. That narrow decision extended Dance to Bristol's winning streak to seven, and the Susan Wantz runner has also captured Belmont's GIII Bed O' Roses H. June 15 and Saratoga's

GII Honorable Miss H. July 29. Dance to Bristol couldn't overcome a speed-favoring Belmont surface when a distant second behind the unbeaten New York-bred Cluster of Stars (Greeley's Galaxy) in the GII Gallant Bloom H. most recently Sept. 21. Groupie Doll, meanwhile, has only lined up four times since her 2012 tour-de-force in this event. A heartbreaking second to Stay Thirsty (Bernardini) in Aqueduct's GI Cigar Mile H. Nov. 24, she began her 5-year-old campaign with a troubled third going a mile in Ellis Park's GIII Gardenia S. Aug. 10. Groupie Doll looked like she was back in top form after setting a new track-record in the GII Presque Isle Downs Masters S. Sept. 9, but could do no better than third behind **Judy the Beauty** (Ghostzapper) when defending her title in Keeneland's GII Thoroughbred Club of America S. last time Oct. 5. A return to dirt and an extra furlong of real estate should work in her favor, however. **Cont. p17**

The bay came into her own this summer, starting with a win over Dayatthespa (City Zip) in Monmouth's GIII Eatontown H. June 29. She proved that victory was just the beginning when posting a 6-1 front-running upset of the GI Diana S. at Saratoga July 27. Laughing wired the field at the Spa again in the GII Ballston Spa S. Aug. 24 and repeated that performance in Belmont's GI Flower Bowl Invitational at this distance Sept. 28, earning a free ride to this contest. Her stablemate Tannery (Ire) (Dylan Thomas {Ire}), second in the Flower Bowl, further flattered that race's form with a hard-fought victory in last Sunday's GI E. P. Taylor S. at Woodbine. She will have to contend with the locally based turf distaffers **Tiz Flirtatious** (Tizbud) and **Marketing Mix** (Medaglia d'Oro), but if she continues on this roll, she will give them a run for their money.

Pamela Ziebarth's homebred Tiz Flirtatious did not make her first start until October of her 3-year-old season, but has proved worth the wait with wins over dirt and synthetic surfaces in addition to the grass. Never off the board in any of her 12 starts, she suffered her only defeat of 2013 to this point when runner-up to Marketing Mix in Hollywood Park's GI Gamely S. May 27. The dark bay overcame a glacial pace in the GII John C. Mabee S. at Del Mar Aug. 11 to defeat **Lady of Shamrock** (Scat Daddy). Tiz Flirtatious scored her first Grade I victory and stamped her ticket to this test last out with a score over Marketing Mix in the GI Rodeo Drive S. at this course and distance Sept. 28.

Runner-up in this event last year, Marketing Mix followed her Gamely victory with a win against the boys in the GIII Sunset H. over 12 furlongs at Hollywood Park July 14. The Glen Hill Farm colorbearer was a disappointing fourth to **Dank (GB)** (Dansili {GB}) as the favorite in Arlington Park's GI Beverly D. S. Aug. 17 and was a head behind Tiz Flirtatious when attempting to defend in the Rodeo Drive. Her familiarity with this track, proven ability at this distance, and the fact she has faced--and defeated--many of these opponents may work in the Tom Proctor trainee's favor this time. **Cont. p18**

Stable's **Sweet Reason**, a daughter of 2006 Breeders' Cup Juvenile hero Street Sense, has established herself as the best on the right coast this season, with a spectacular and improbable maiden victory in an off-turf race in the slop at

Saratoga Aug. 9 followed by an even more impressive victory in the Sept. 1 GI Spinaway S., also over a wet strip. She proved she was not just an off-track sensation last time out in the GI Frizette S. at Belmont Park Oct. 5, when, trying the mile for the first time, she went for the gap at the end of the temporary rail and lingered well behind. She rallied past all her rivals, bar **Artemis Agrotera** (Roman Ruler), and stamped herself the favorite for this championship showdown.

That is until last Sunday, when she lumbered around the Santa Anita main train in an unconventional and somewhat alarming fashion, covering the distance in a sluggish 1:46.80. Trainer Leah Gyarmati insists she is a lazy horse when she's out there on her own, but many will view that breeze as a way to work some others into the equation.

Artemis Agrotera is a perfect two-for-two entering the Juvenile Fillies and was a front-running 11 3/4-length debut winner versus her fellow New York-breds going six furlongs at the Spa Aug. 16. She trained up to the Frizette, where she sat a perfect stalking trip from second and responded professionally for a 1 1/4-length tally. The Broman runner is well bred for this added distance and a bit more, as her dam is a sister to GISW Stephen Got Even (A.P. Indy). She will be well-supported, but could find herself further back than she's been to this point in her career and will have to overcome the inside stall.

★ **"TDN Rising Star"** ★ **She's a Tiger** (Tale of the Cat) is arguably the best of the West and should be at the head of affairs Saturday, though she might have to go hard from the 10 hole. A 3/4-sister to the good sprinter Smiling Tiger (Hold That Tiger), she has gone from a smashing Pleasanton nine-length maiden victory to winning the July 13 Landaluce S. and GI Del Mar Debutante Aug. 31 around a runner-up effort to **Concave** (Colonel John) in the GI Sorrento S. Aug. 7. She made the majority of the running in the GI Chandelier S., but got tired in the waning stages of that initial two-turn voyage and was outstayed by **Secret Compass** (Discreet Cat). Gary Stevens, who won the 1998 Juvenile Fillies with champion Silverbulletday, has always been and remains a believer that she can handle this trip, though there will be plenty of bettors willing to take the contrarian view.

Untapable (Tapit) is also perfect in her two trips to the post, a pacesetter victory in a 5 1/2-furlong maiden at Churchill Downs June 20 and a half-length score, with **Rosalind** (Broken Vow) third, in the GI Pocahontas S. in Louisville Sept. 7. She has impressed railbirds with her appearance and energy level since arriving at Santa Anita and could be the 'wise-gal' in this bunch. Awesome Feather (Awesome of Course) took the Juvenile Fillies for Florida in 2010, and Gil Campbell's **Scandalous Act** (Act of Duty) looks to follow suit. The homebred won the Desert Vixen S. at Calder July 20 and added the Susan's Girl S. Aug. 24, then gained valuable two-turn experience when completing the sweep of the Florida Stallion Stakes by a combined 22 lengths in the My Dear Girl S. Oct. 12.

She lacks the recency of some of her rivals, but off her previous form, enters the Juvenile Fillies with a couple of important angles. Though bred for much further and not for turf, she proved a handy debut winner going 5 1/2 on the lawn at Hollywood July 12, then transitioned to the Poly in the Sorrento. She found herself further back in the Debutante than she'd ever been before, but came home well enough with a final furlong in :12.58. She should love the main track, the distance and, perhaps most importantly, the flow of this race. Tempera (A.P. Indy) won the Sorrento and was third in the Debutante before stretching out to upset the 2001 Juvenile Fillies at Belmont at nearly 12-1.

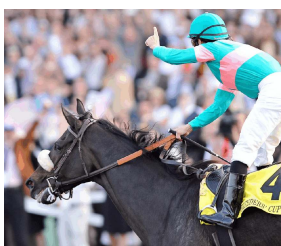
