'MACHO' LANDS CLASSIC THRILLER

Just 12 months removed from being dealt a narrow defeat in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic, Reeves Thoroughbred Racing's **Mucho Macho Man** (Macho Uno) was the one delivering the bad news Saturday afternoon, as he got his nose down on the wire just ahead of GI Travers S. winner **Will Take Charge** (Unbridled's Song) to land the winner's share of the \$5-million purse. **Declaration of War** (War Front) sat a perfect trip just behind the speed and stuck on gamely in the final furlong to be beaten a neck, despite hanging on his left lead through the stretch.

The victory made heart-transplant recipient Kathy Ritvo the first female trainer to saddle a winner of this country's richest race. It also capped a magical comeback season for 50-year-young Gary Stevens, who rode the winners of the Distaff and Classic. But after the race, Ritvo was focused on deflecting the attention to the horse.

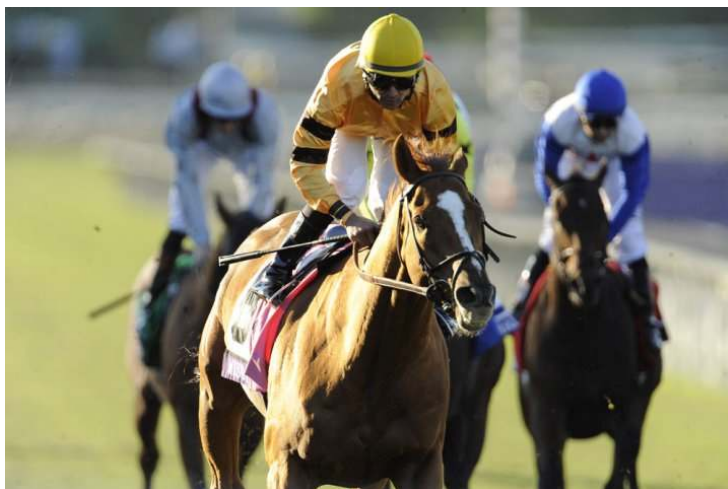
"I'm happier for my horse," she commented. "He deserves it. When [jockey] Gary [Stevens] waved the stick, I figured he won. He got a great trip. Gary did a fantastic job. When he used 'Macho,' 'Macho' showed up. He is a good horse. I'm excited. If I didn't have the support of my family, I wouldn't be here." **Cont. p3**

'WISE' FLIES IN MILE

It's been a season full of adversity for Morton Fink's **Wise Dan** (Wiseman's Ferry). Be it underfoot conditions, lofty weight assignments in handicap tests and even an 11th-hour jockey change. The great ones overcome all that is thrown in their direction, and the handsome chestnut made his case for a second consecutive Horse of the Year title by outfinishing a game **Za Approval** (Ghostzapper) to become the latest multiple winner of the GI Breeders' Cup Mile. With the win, he becomes the fourth horse from last year's Breeders' Cup meeting. **Silentio** (Silent Name {Jpn}) ran a blinder to finish third and well clear of pace-pressing **Silver Max** (Badge of Silver) in fourth. **Cont. p7**

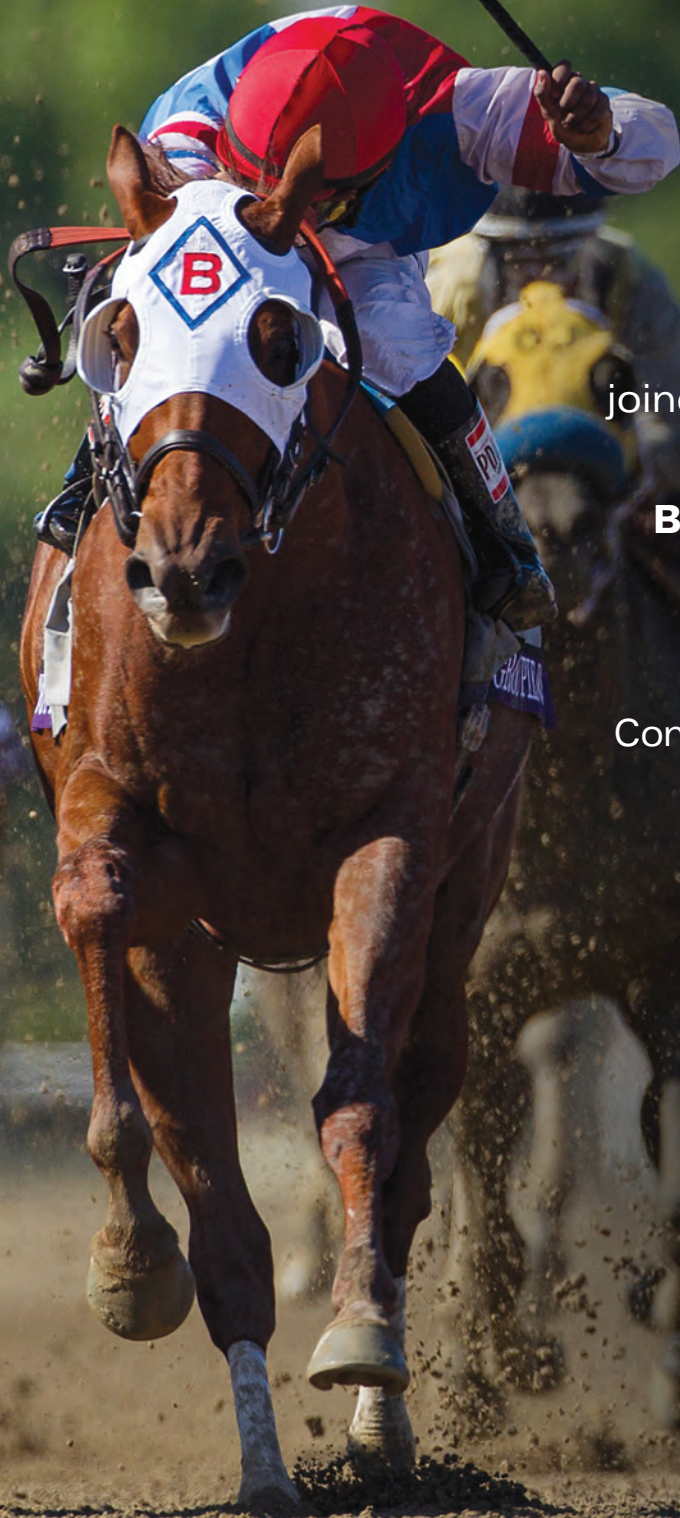

Late Foal on a Roll...

A June foal, Mucho Macho Man broke his maiden for Kathy Ritvo's husband, current Gulfstream Park executive Tim Ritvo, in his third career start and was multiple Grade II placed before heading south for the winter. Winner of the GII Risen Star S. at three, the striking bay returned to New Orleans to be third in the GII Louisiana Derby and gave an outstanding account of

himself when rounding out the triple behind Animal Kingdom (Leroidesanimaux {Brz}) in that year's GI Kentucky Derby. An allowance winner in late 2011, Mucho Macho Man defeated Ron the Greek (Full Mandate) in the Sunshine Millions Classic before adding wins in the GII Gulfstream Park H. and GII Suburban H.

Runner-up in the GI Woodward S., he couldn't quite get to Fort Larned (E Dubai) and missed by a half-length when ridden by Mike Smith in this event. He caught a sloppy track in defense of his title in the Sunshine Millions Classic and was pulled up, as Ron the Greek romped by 11 1/4 lengths. Given some time off, the Florida-bred had to deal with a good Belmont strip and was defeated into third at odds-on in the Criminal Type S. at Belmont Park this past June 14, but hinted at a return to his better form by rounding out the trifecta behind Cross Traffic (Unbridled's Song) in the GI Whitney H. at Saratoga Aug. 3. Scratched from the GI Woodward S. when the track came up sloppy again, Mucho Macho Man was sent to the West Coast for the GI Awesome Again S. Sept. 28. With Gary Stevens taking over at the controls, he turned in a monster effort to best Paynter (Awesome Again) by better than four lengths. Would there be a fairy tale ending?

Flexing His Muscles...

Sent off the 4-1 second choice behind 17-10 Game On Dude (Awesome Again), Mucho Macho Man jumped alertly and, despite a field loaded with speed, actually led through the opening furlong flanked to his inside by Travers runner-up **Moreno** (Ghostzapper) and to his outside by Fort Larned and Game On Dude. Making his dirt debut in his final career appearance, Declaration of War was tucked just in behind the leaders with Joseph O'Brien riding high in the saddle, while Will Take Charge and GI Belmont S. winner **Palace Malice** (Curlin) settled in the latter half of the field. By the time they made the clubhouse turn, Stevens had eased Mucho Macho Man just off the speed and dropped his nose onto the tail of a three-wide Game On Dude before steering out to the four path turning up the backside. Moreno began a steady retreat, leaving Fort Larned momentarily alone on the lead at the 4 1/2-furlong pole, but the battle was joined in earnest by Game On Dude and Mucho Macho Man, who looked the more serious danger while never asked for run. By the quarter pole, it was clear it was not to be Game On Dude's day, as Mucho Macho Man set sail for the wire, but Declaration of War steered off heels and took aim on the leader into the final furlong. He hung on his left lead and couldn't quite get there, but Will Take Charge emerged a serious threat in the final 100 yards. Still two lengths away at that point, he plugged on relentlessly and it took a photo to separate the two at the wire. It was another neck back to the valiant Irish raider in third, while last year's Classic hero Fort Larned settled for fourth. **Cont. p5**

The Comeback Kid...

When Gary Stevens announced to the racing world last winter than he intended to return to the saddle, it's likely that not even he could envision the success he's found over the last eight months. He teamed with D. Wayne Lukas on Oxbow (Awesome Again) to win the GI Preakness S. just months into his comeback and was able to book nine mounts for the Breeders' Cup. His Friday was capped by Beholder (Henny Hughes)'s stirring success in the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff before capping off the weekend in the grandest possible way.

"This was a tremendous experience to win this race at my age [50]," said Stevens, winning the Classic for the first time in 13 tries. "I never expected to be in this situation. This is the ultimate feeling. It's the icing on the cake of my career."

Stevens recollected his trip, saying, "He was super, super sharp today. My intention in any big race is, I don't care if you're coming from off the pace or you're laying up close, you need a good, clean break. And he left there like a quarter horse today and actually outbroke them. I could have put him on the lead, had him on the lead. But he's so push-button. I let him roll away from there for a 1/16 of a mile, and Moreno came up on the inside and Game on Dude on the outside and Fort Larned. We were rolling. I just slid my hands back a little bit, and he shut it down, it's exactly what I wanted him to do. He's a big, long striding horse, and he was powerful down the back side. He was really pretty aggressive. Not rank at all, but giving me a feel different than what I had in the Awesome Again. And we rolled into the turn, and I knew that I had Game on Dude anytime I wanted him."

Another Bitter Defeat for the Dude...

Despite a brilliant season with wins in the GI Santa Anita H. and GI Pacific Classic, Game On Dude faltered again on racing's biggest stage, losing any chance he had at a Horse of the Year title. "The pace was real fast," jockey Mike Smith commented. I didn't know what else to do. Do I take back or not? He's a free-running horse and I already have a pretty good hold on him. I tried to ease out and see if he'd drop in a little on me and he was on it. Gary (Stevens on winner Mucho Macho Man) was right there too. The point I knew my horse wasn't going to get it was on the backside when Gary came to me, I squeezed him a little to put some distance between us and I couldn't. I knew I was in trouble right then. The weekend has been great, but I wish my two big horses [Game On Dude and Royal Delta in Friday's Distaff] would have run better."

It has also been a memorable season for the Lukas barn, though the narrow defeat in the Classic wasn't going down too easily. "He's really developed into a beautiful horse and he did everything right today," Lukas stated. "It's just a heartbreak that he lost. He did everything right. The jump after the wire we got him."

Joseph O'Brien was full of praise for Declaration of War's effort. "He's run a great race," he said. "It took him about a furlong to settle and then he got into a lovely rhythm. I had to wait a little bit for the gap to come at the head of the stretch, but he ran on really well and I have no complaints."

TOUCH OF MAGIC

Coolmore had several live chances coming into Saturday's Breeders' Cup card, but it was one of the longest priced runners in the group--12-1 shot **Magician (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire})--who landed the big prize for the team the GI Breeders' Cup Turf. Settled near the back of the field as the free-wheeling 95-1 longshot **Teaks North** (Northern Afleet) took them through opening splits of :24.02 and :46.94, Magician remained unhurried through three quarters in a testing 1:10.67. Starting to show signs of life midway down the backstretch, the Irish bred continued to advance steadily heading into the turn as defending champion **Little Mike** (Spanish Steps) moved up along the inside to take control, while trying to fend off three-time Group 1 heroine **The Fugue (GB)** (Dansili {GB}) and **Vagabond Shoes (Ire)** (Beat Hollow {GB}) to his outside. As the three leaders battled down the stretch, it was Magician bowling down the center of the course who got up in time to best The Fugue by 3/4 of a length, with **Indy Point (Arg)** (Indygo Shiner) closing to be third. Vagabond Shoes was fifth and defending champion Little Mike faded to seventh.

"He's one of the best horses I've ridden in a long time," said winning rider Ryan Moore.

"He switched off nice at the beginning. I was a little farther back than I wanted to be, because he got a bump at the turn and he lost his back end, but he leveled off nicely, got his balance. From there he took me where I wanted to be."

Magician was a close-up second in his second career start in a seven-furlong test at Dundalk before bounding home a six-length winner over the soggy Curragh turf last fall. Fading to seventh after a trouble-ridden trip in the seven-panel G3 Killavullan S. at Leopardstown in October, the dark bay was shelved until marking his return with a four-length score May 10 G3 Dee S. going 1 5/16 miles at Chester. Given plenty of support for the May 25 G1 Irish 2000 Guineas, Magician strode home a 3 1/2 length winner before faltering to ninth in his most recent start in the one-mile G1 St James's Palace S. at Royal Ascot June 18.

"What happened the week before Ascot, [Magician] knocked his behind leg in the stable and the trainer had a great idea that we'd put him in the spa to get a little bit of feeling out of his leg," O'Brien said. "When we put him in the spa, he was perfect 20 minutes. He had five more minutes to go to get out of it and a sparrow flew in the door and right between his two ears. I can just tell you that he jumped out of the spa, and doing it, he bruised both his front legs." Cont. p7

He continued, "Obviously, [Dr] John [Halley] had a big job to get him to Ascot and to get the swelling down out of his legs, and that's what he did. But with the benefit of hindsight, I probably shouldn't have run him. He just was a bit sore, and he went through a traumatic week really. But with the benefit of hindsight, I shouldn't have done it. But, listen, he had a long break after it, and this is the result really. It was just one of those freak things."

As for the 3-year-old's successful comeback, O'Brien said, "It's been a job well done by the team to achieve this. I have to thank Michael [Tabor] whose idea it was that we should move him up in trip to a mile and a half." As for the game runner-up The Fugue, trainer John Gosden said, "She's run a great race. We came a bit wide into the straight. We've beaten a very good Argentinian horse [Indy Point], but the form is very hard to assess as the winner [Magician] hasn't run since June. He's a bit of a joker in the pack [of cards]. She ran her race. She improved her position. She just got beat at the end." Also proud of his mount's effort, Gary Steven said of Indy Point, "He gave me a big run. It was a game effort. He's a very nice horse and I enjoy riding him. He dug in and gave me everything he had. I couldn't ask for anything more from him."

As was the case with the winner, **Point of Entry** (Dynaformer) was also returning from a five-month layoff, and while displaying an impressive turn of foot late, fell only 1 3/4 lengths short of the winner in fourth. "He had a good trip," said rider Joel Rosario.

"He made a little run but he might have gotten a little tired. He was coming off the layoff, but he ran a good race." Added trainer Shug McGaughey, "It was just too much ground to make up, especially coming off a layoff."

HOY Has Tough Campaign...

Trainer Charlie LoPresti was the architect of a 2013 campaign similar to his championship season, beginning with wins in the GI Maker's 46 Mile in April and the GI Woodford Reserve Turf Classic May 5 before carrying 128 pounds to victory in the GII Firecracker H. at Churchill Downs June 29. He returned to Saratoga to defend his title in the GII Fourstardave H., successfully toting 129 pounds to a win over pacesetting King Kreesa (King Cugat) Aug. 10, then recorded his second straight success in the GI Woodbine Mile Sept. 15, besting Za Approval by a clear 3 1/2 lengths. LoPresti opted for one final prep in the GI Shadwell Turf Mile, which became the GI Shadwell Polytrack Mile and a Sixteenth when torrential rains washed the race off the grass. Many reasoned that he exerted too much effort chasing Silver Max around the track that day, but LoPresti insisted the horse was as good or better than he was last year and he was 4-5 to prove it this time.

The Shadwell winner was quickest away and led clear until being joined outside by Obviously (Ire) (Choisir {Ire}), who crossed and cleared, but was forced to go the opening quarter mile in :21.94. Za Approval found himself a few paths off the rail in midfield, while Jose Lezcano followed that one's move up the backstretch. Obviously, third in last year's Mile, took them into the final turn after a half in a suicidal :44.47 and soon had Silver Max off the bridle, but Za Approval rolled up menacingly three wide at the quarter pole with Wise Dan winding up a bit further back.

The Live Oak runner struck the front in upper stretch and looked for a few strides like he might pull the upset, but Wise Dan kept to his task and pegged him back for a successful title defense.

"Holy straight. He's a real special horse," said LoPresti, who took a dig at those who wondered if Wise Dan had lost a step. "If you can get him covered up, he's a much easier ride. This one's for John Velazquez who was really keen to ride the horse, but we had every confidence in Jose [Lezcano] and we had to go to 'Plan B.'"

DANK PULLS RANK IN F/M TURF

The European domination of the weekend's turf racing continued in Saturday's GI Breeders' Cup Filly/Mare Turf, as James Wigan's Dank (GB) (Dansili {GB}) raced prominently, took command outside turning

for home and held off a late challenge from fellow foreigner **Romantica (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}) to score by a comfortable half-length margin. The victory gives the 4-year-old filly--now a winner of two of the most important Grade I races for turf distaffers in this country--an

inside track for an Eclipse Award. It was the sixth Breeders' Cup victory for legendary trainer Sir Michael Stoute, who also saddled Islington (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) to a win in the event when held here in 2003. Stoute paid tribute to his help at home for getting the filly ready for this run. "With a very, very good team behind her, that is the first thing," he stated when asked what it takes to prepare a horse for the trans-Atlantic journey. "We leave nothing to chance where the traveling is concerned, because that is of utmost importance. But she has a great temperament. This is what helps her, a great attitude, very good filly."

Dank, heroine of last year's G3 TBA Atalanta S. at Sandown Park, has taken her game to a new level since turning four. A nose winner of the G3 Qatar Bloodstock Dahlia S. at Newmarket May 5, she followed with a close third in the G2 Duke of Cambridge S. at Royal Ascot June 19. Dank punched her ticket to the Beverly D. with a win in the G2 Kilboy Estate S. at The Curragh July 21 prior to a victory in the GI Beverly D. S. at Arlington Aug. 17. "I don't think she was at her very best at Royal Ascot," Stoute continued. "There was an incident just before the race. I think she should be unbeaten this year. If [owner James Wigan] allows us to keep her going, she'll show them how good she is."

Stalk and Pounce...

Hard held early after breaking smartly from her rail draw, Dank was still giving jockey Ryan Moore a good workout as they headed to the clubhouse turn. Finally settling into a nice rhythm on the backstretch as longshot **Emollient** (Empire Maker) led through a half mile in :47.50, she began to set her sights on the pacesetter from the outside. Dank poked her head in front as they straightened for home, and was never seriously threatened by the late surge from the runner-up. "She had everything right today and I could ride her that way," Moore said. "I didn't have to take too many chances, because she was the best filly in the race. She wasn't as brilliant today as in her last race, but she still ran a very good race today." Dank becomes the sixth Breeders' Cup winner for trainer Sir Michael Stoute. "We knew from stall one we wouldn't get pushed on the inside," Stoute commented. "She seemed a bit fresh early on, but Ryan knew what to do. I don't mind going into the winner's enclosure. I'd like to keep her in training next year and I'm going to have to be quite persuasive." Dank is owned/bred by London Thoroughbred Services' James Wigan. "Well, they're the best," Dank said of the connections. "I couldn't say anything more. They're fantastic. I've got the utmost confidence, and it's lovely to be with them." Will we see Dank again next year? "I'd love to come back," Wigan concluded.

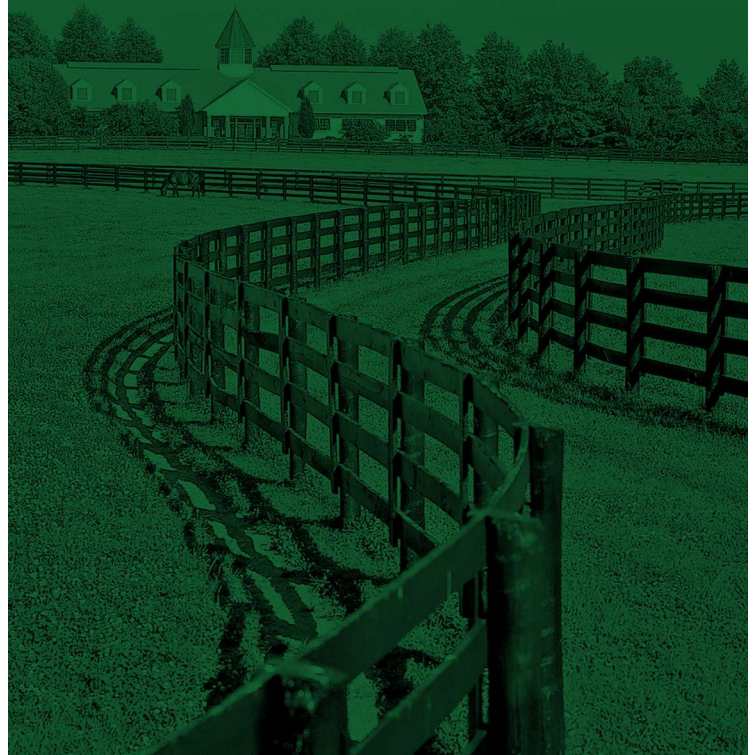

The first foal from two-time Grade II winner Justwhistledixie (Dixie Union), who was the likeliest candidate to give Rachel Alexandra (Medaglia d'Oro) a run for her money in the GI Kentucky Oaks in 2009 only to be a late scratch, New Year's Day was picked out by the Wests' bloodstock advisor Ben Glass for \$425,000 at Keeneland September last fall. He made a favorable impression in his 5 1/2-furlong debut over the Del Mar Polytrack Aug. 17 and was off just two weeks' rest when he returned to graduate in a mile maiden. Baffert elected to skip the GI FrontRunner S., won by **Bond Holder** (Mineshaft), to train up to this, and it all came together Saturday.

Drawn inside with the majority of the speed drawn widest in SW **Diamond Bachelor** (War Front), Champagne S. winner Havana and GI Hopeful S. hero Strong Mandate, New Year's Day landed in midfield and was able to save ground as **Conquest Titan** (Birdstone) led from **Rum Point** (Malibu Moon) and Strong Mandate out wide. We're starting to get to know each other. It looks like a good team."

She's a Tiger, who just missed in the Chandelier, bounced away from the gates for Gary Stevens and was able to take a clear lead into the first turn tracked through by Artemis Agrotera, Florida raider **Scandalous Act** (Act of Duty) and a rail-skimming Secret Compass.

Rio Antonia was at the tail end of that leading group in about seventh position while racing two or three paths off the inside. The pacesetter had to work fairly hard through the opening exchanges, getting the opening quarter in a demanding :22.55, but the key move of the race

was launched by Javier Castellano midway up the backstretch, as he guided Ria Antonio past **Concave** (Colonel John) and into a forward position while dropping down onto the fence. All the way up into fourth after a half in a taxing :45.31, Ria Antonia came back out to the three path for the run around the final turn, rallied past a tiring Artemis Agrotera and had aim on She's a Tiger as they turned for home. She drew alongside at the sixteenth pole and looked to have the momentum, but She's a Tiger came out and bumped slightly with Ria Antonia. They crossed the line one-two, but, in a majority decision, reversed the outcome.

Rosalind (Broken Vow) rallied for third ahead of favored Sweet Reason, who appeared to be going best late, but flattened out to finish fourth.

"Javier [jockey Castellano] says she got bumped right before she was going to go by," commented winning trainer Jeremiah Englehart. "It's right there; you can see it on the replay. After that, you have to take the horse down. If that horse changes course and doesn't make contact, you say, ok, leave it up. But once you make contact it has to come down." She's a Tiger's trainer Jeff Bonde was understandably despondent. "This is heartbreaking--heartbreaking. There is nothing else I can say. She is still a wonderful filly, but this is just heartbreaking."

Say What?...

"I don't usually root that much for my horses. But when I saw her, I was looking at the infield TV and I saw Javier get her in a nice position to make a run down the backside and was kind of picking horses off one by one. And I'm thinking well, she's 29-1, she'll probably fade here at some point because I was getting excited. Then when I saw him, he still hadn't cracked a whip yet, that's when I knew that she was going to finish. She was turning for home. I thought it looked like we were going to win the race, and I'm thinking, oh, my God, just remember, keep your clothes on, act professional. --trainer Jeremiah Englehart

Secret Compass Euthanized...

Dr. Wayne McIlwraith, the on-call veterinarian for the American Association of Equine Practitioners explained the injury to Secret Compass. "Secret Compass sustained a lateral condylar fracture with dislocation, which is an injury we can't bring them back from because when they dislocate on the track, they lose their blood supply, so she has been euthanized." An \$8,500 Keeneland November weanling purchase, Secret Compass made \$90,000 as a Keeneland September yearling and \$425,000 at OBS this past March. She broke her maiden at second asking and was fourth in the GI Del Mar Debutante ahead of her Chandelier success.

DEJA VU ALL OVER AGAIN IN SPRINT

Five years ago, trainer Bob Baffert sent Midnight Lute (Real Quiet), a horse owned by Paul Weitman, Karl Watson and Mike Pegram, to a victory in the 2008 GI Breeders' Cup Sprint off just a single prep that year. Yesterday, the conditioner showed just why he's in the Hall of Fame by doing it again with another horse owned by those connections--**Secret Circle** (Eddington). Better Than Ever...

The 4-year-old Secret Circle was making his first start in 18 months when he won an optional claimer sprinting six panels over Santa Anita's strip in 1:07 4/5 Oct. 14, and was something of a surprise favorite heading into the gate. Flashing speed, he was soon outfooted by **Sum of the Parts** (Speightstown) and

Gentlemen's Bet (Half Ours), who came up the rail to lead through hot :21 1/5 and :43 3/5 splits. Racing in the two or three path around the far turn and sitting three lengths off the pacesetters, Secret Circle tipped four wide as they turned for home

and took aim on Gentlemen's Bet, who had opened up by 1 1/2 lengths at the 3/16ths pole, and swept past that tiring rival in the final furlong. **Laugh Track** (Distorted Humor) came flying, but ran out of real estate and had to settle for second.

"I had a really good trip," said winning jockey Martin Garcia. "My horse was outside and the whole field was inside of me. I took advantage from there because I knew I had the best horse. I saw the other horse coming up on the outside and my horse started messing around, but by then it was too late to beat me."

Baffert was full of praise for his charge. "He's off that long, and then to win and run that fast, and then to come back and do it against the best sprinters in the world, it's like, boy, it's almost impossible," he said. "For him to pull it off, it just shows you he's...in a different area code. You can only do it with a super horse like a Midnight Lute or a Secret Circle."

Secret Circle, always blessed with ample speed, put himself on the Kentucky Derby trail in 2012 with consecutive wins routing in the GIII Southwest S. and GII Rebel S. at Oaklawn. He ran a well-beaten second to stablemate Bodemeister (Empire Maker) in the GI Arkansas Derby, and not long after was diagnosed with a sesamoid injury. The original plan was for four months on the sidelines, but he was gone much longer than that. "I almost had him ready last year, and then he had one of these little setbacks, something totally different," said Baffert. "But he came back this year, and we just freshened him up."

Baffert added, "What he showed today was incredible. What a race horse he is. Billy Bush was doing a segment on him the other day. I was showing him all the horses, Game on Dude, Paynter and everything, and we're walking around the barn. And I said, 'If you're back in the west in the old days and you wanted to rob a bank, this is the horse you want to get on right here. We're just so lucky to have him. I thank my friend Donato Lanni. When we got him, he said I think I found a sleeper, and sure enough he did. Here we are.'"

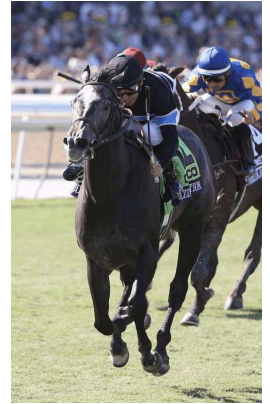

When In Rome...

Mizdirection launched her 2012 campaign with four straight victories, including the GIII Monrovia S. and the Clocker's Corner H. over this course and trip before finishing second in the Great Lady M S. at Hollywood in May. Given a lengthy break after that defeat, trainer Mike Puype masterfully worked her straight up to last year's Turf Sprint and she got the job done at odds of 6-1. She started off this season the same way as last year, winning the now GII Monrovia before adding wins in the one-mile GI Buena Vista S. Feb. 18 and the GIII Las Cinegas S. over this course and distance Apr. 13. Facing a yielding turf course for her latest, Mizdirection faded to fifth in the one-mile GI Just A Game S. at Belmont June 8. Sidelined once again, the 5-year-old was backed down to 5-2 favoritism to get the job done here. Mizdirection broke alertly and was eased back to a stalking fourth as Reneesgotzip showed the way through a quick opening quarter in :21.47. Euros Look to the Future...

European-based horses proved victorious in three of Friday's five Breeders' Cup races, and the winners have all emerged none the worse for wear and will look forward to the 2014 season in their various jurisdictions. Godolphin Racing Manager Simon Crisford was obviously pleased with the late-running victory by **Outstrip (GB)** (Exceed and Excel {Aus}) in the G1 Juvenile Turf and said the homebred son of Asi Siempre (El Prado {Ire}) will have a break before resuming in the new year. "We will aim him at all of the top mile races next season--the [G1] 2000 Guineas and the [G1] St James's Palace S. are the ones we are thinking about at the moment," he said. "It is a very exciting time for us, as he is a homebred." In the fillies' counterpart, **Chriselliam (Ire)** (Iffraaj {GB}) allowed trainer Charlie Hills to do what his father Barry Hills could not in posting a victory at the Breeders' Cup meeting. "This has put the icing on the cake for what has been a good year," Hills said of the G1 Fillies' Mile heroine. "I am looking forward to getting her home and getting her ready for next year's [G1] 1000 Guineas." **London Bridge (Arch)**, who outstayed his rivals in the GII Marathon to open Friday's proceedings, was sold prior to the race and is set to continue his career in Australia.

Dirt Mile Win Made 'Cents' to O'Neill...

Trainer Doug O'Neill was represented by his fourth Breeders' Cup winner, but first since logging one win in each year between 2005 and 2007, when **Goldencents** (Into Mischief) landed Friday's GI Dirt Mile. "He came out of it great," said O'Neill. "What a horse. He's a true champion. It doesn't matter what distance you throw at him, he'll show up and run a top race." O'Neill said he received a text from University of Louisville Hall of Fame basketball coach Rick Pitino, a minority owner of the 3-year-old colt, after the race. "He was real excited. He was happy and congratulated everybody. He was all pumped up." In winning Friday, Goldencents took his record over the local strip to three wins from five starts, including the GI Santa Anita Derby. Given his affinity for the surface, Goldencents is likely to make his next appearance in the GI Malibu S. Dec. 26.

Mandella Over the Moon Following Distaff...

Richard Mandella is one of the more mild-mannered amongst the training fraternity, so it would come as no surprise that the conditioner played it close to the vest following the victory of **Beholder** (Henny Hughes) in Friday's centerpiece, the \$2-million GI Distaff. "No, not me," he said, when asked if he whooped it up Friday night. "Just a quiet evening at home. We did watch some of the Breeders' Cup TV show. Golly, the track just looked great and, of course, we loved watching that race." Though connections could easily call time on a career that could well include an Eclipse Award this year in addition to the one she earned last year as champion juvenile filly, it would appear Beholder is set for a return to the races in 2014. "From the sound of what Mr. Hughes [owner B. Wayne Hughes of Spendthrift Farm] said yesterday in the interviews, he's going to want to race her again next year," Mandella confirmed. "That's plenty fine with me."

I'm sure we'll give her a rest now. I'll have her checked out from top to bottom; have her scanned and all. But I don't expect any problems. She's a very sound filly and she's always done well. She ate up last night and was fine at the barn this morning. I think it all looks good."

Caracortado Withdrawn from Turf Sprint...

Trainer Mike Machowsky informed the Santa Anita racing office Saturday morning that **Caracortado** (Cat Dreams) would be scratched from the GI Turf Sprint with a foot ailment. "He picked up a piece of cinder in his coronet band of his right front foot at some point this week and it turned into an abscess," the trainer said Saturday morning. "It's the same foot he had those frog issues [that had sidelined him for more than a year and a half], but this is a different thing." He added, "The cinder came out and the abscess cleared, but he's still tender. It's like a blister breaking; there's still a sore spot there. We jog him down the road and he takes some good steps, then some bad ones. He's just sensitive with it, and with this kind of horses and this kind of race you just can't go unless you're fully ready." Machowsky expressed optimism that Caracortado can make another comeback. "We can't run today, but I think he's going to be fine," he offered. "We'll give him some time off and I think he'll come back around."

Centralintelligence OK, To Undergo Surgery...

Centralintelligence (Smarty Jones), who suffered a fracture of the lateral condylar of the distal cannon bone in the fetlock joint, was to be transported to an equine clinic in Chino, California, to undergo surgery. Dr. Wayne McIlwraith will perform the procedure today. "He's got a cast on, but he will be OK," Alfredo Morfin, foreman for trainer Ron Ellis, said of the 5-year-old gelding.

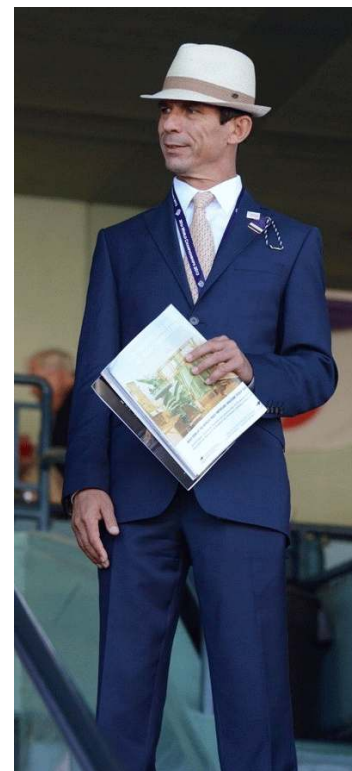
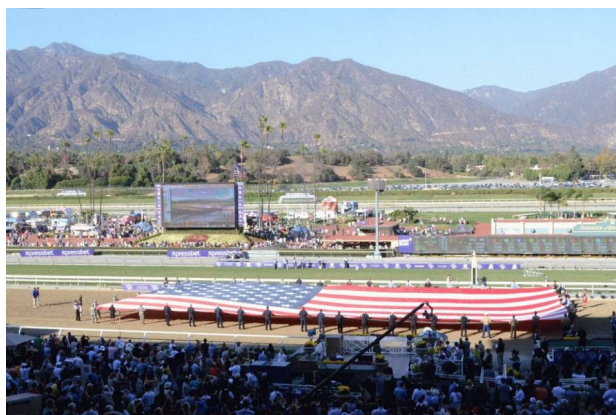

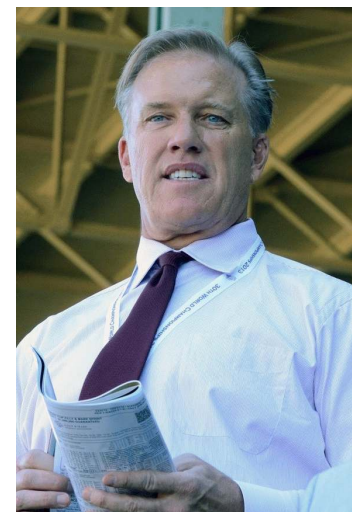

[on Thanksgiving Day]," said winning trainer Phil Sims. "We were a little concerned about the one-turn mile, but last year she won a 6 1/2-furlong sprint here. She's got that one big run and it doesn't matter how far the distance is. We were hoping it would work out, and it did."

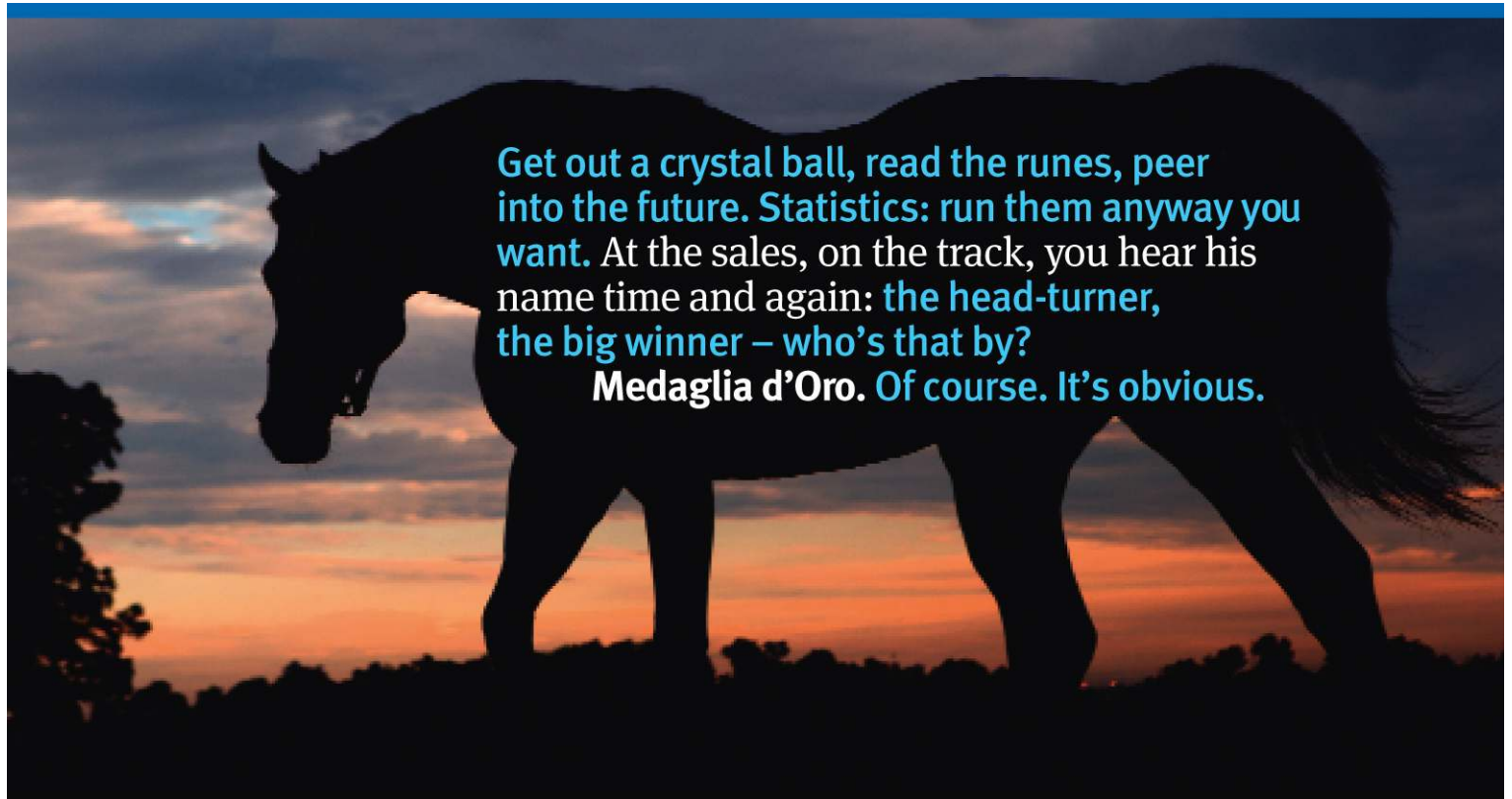

An A\$4,000 purchase from last year's Inglis Autumn Yearling Sale, Polanski proved himself a bargain buy yesterday when he became a Group 1 winner in Flemington's G1 Victoria Derby. Unveiled in a modest event at Cranbourne Mar. 28, Polanski failed to make a big impression early in his career last season, recording his lone victory from four outings in his third start at Caulfield May 11. After a pair of sub-par runs to begin his sophomore campaign—a seventh in the G2 Danehill S. here and an eighth

in the G2 Bill Stutt S. at Moonee Valley—Polanski sprang to life, capturing the Uci S. here Oct. 5 when stretched out to 1800 meters, and adding the G3 Norman Robinson S. at Caulfield when given an additional 200 meters Oct. 19. It appears the longer the better for Polanski, as he recorded a stylish victory over 2500 meters here. Settled midpack early under a hard hold from Hugh Bowman, Polanski began to work his way into the leading group on the run around the final turn.

Five-wide at the top of the lane, the bay put his head in front at the 400 meter mark. He never looked in any danger from there, stretching his advantage to three lengths on the wire. Side Glance spent the early part of his career plying his trade in the British handicap ranks for the Balding family’s Kingsclere Stud before jumping up to win at listed level at Ascot in April 2011. Another listed score followed at Windsor before a third in Ascot’s G2 Summer Mile, after which the progressive then-4-year-old was scooped up by Qatar’s Pearl Bloodstock. After an encouraging third in the Arlington Million Aug. 17, Side Glance finished sixth, beaten just four lengths, in his Australian debut in the G1 Cox Plate last weekend. Breaking near the back of the pack here under jockey Jamie Spencer, the pair quickly moved up on the outside to take command of a slowly-run affair. Swinging into the lane with a short advantage, Side Glance extended his advantage to a couple of lengths in midstretch, and managed to hold off a bevy of fast-finishees. “It was a big thrill on a great day like this to get a Group 1 winner, and it’s a great credit to the team,” Balding told *Racingandsports.com.au*. “He was bred at home, my mother bred him, and he’s become a favorite and this is his first Group 1 win, so it’s very special. Jamie has always got on well with the horse and he gave him a beautiful ride today, and I think it made the difference between winning and not.” Balding did not indicate what was next for the veteran galloper, but did say he would like to return next year to defend the Mackinnon title.



A speed-filled field of 12 juveniles will look to see out a one-turn mile in today's GII Nashua S. at the Big A. Favored on the morning is Joseph Bucci's \$400,000 Fasig-Tipton Florida buy **Manhattan Johnnie** (Roman Ruler). Well-backed in his sloppy six-furlong unveiling at Belmont Sept. 21, the Eddie Kenneally pupil led through fast splits, but kept right on going to a 5 1/2-length success. Also stretching out from six panels at Belmont is **Cairo Prince** (Pioneerof the Nile), who earned his diploma by 2 3/4 lengths in stalking fashion Oct. 6. "This is a big step up from a maiden win, but it seems like we do that all of the time with the young ones," offered trainer Kiaran McLaughlin. "He should get the distance. He's doing well and worked well [on Sunday, breezing four furlongs on Belmont's training track in :48.90]." 'STONE', 'MARIA' SQUARE OFF IN TEMPTED

Stoneway Farm's **Stonetastic** (Mizzen Mast) and Repole Stable's **"TDN Rising Star"** **Stopchargingmaria** (Tale of the Cat) headline the one-mile GIII Tempted S. for 2-year-old fillies at Aqueduct today. The former was well-backed for her 5 1/2-furlong Monmouth debut Aug. 10, and justified her price with a 12 1/2-length romp. Favored again in Churchill's GII Pocahontas S. Sept. 7, she came up a half-length short of Untapable (Tapit) to be second. "[The Pocahontas] was a good race to try her around two turns, and she did everything but win and came up only a half-length short," said trainer Kelly Breen of the 1 1/16-mile affair. "We're hoping to try her around two turns again, and she has some grass in her pedigree, so we can try that down the road. She posts fast times in her workouts, but we've been working on getting her to settle down and rate. We're happy with the way she rated last time, and we're hoping she'll rate again in [in the Tempted]. With the race being one turn, the first quarter-mile might be a little quicker, which could help her rate." Stopchargingmaria was also a sharp first-up winner, having graduated by 5 1/2 lengths at the Spa July 19. She was a well-beaten second to Sweet Reason (Street Sense) in that venue's GI Spinaway S. Sept. 2, and most recently checked in third behind Artemis Agrotera (Roman Ruler) and Sweet Reason in Big Sandy's GI Frizette S. Oct. 5. She's joined by stablemate **Potosi's Silver** (Badge of Silver), a Starlight Racing colorbearer who donned cap and gown by 6 1/4 lengths second out over 5 1/2 furlongs in Elmont Sept. 22. "Potosi's Silver seemed to handle her last assignment well so we'll see how she handles the stretch out in distance," said Pletcher. "Stopchargingmaria has run well every time, and this should suit her."

FOR ROBINSON, KRONFELD'S EBLOUISSANTE CLOSES A CHAPTER

Lou Reed died this week. He was 71. The man who managed the rock 'n' roll pioneer's career for over a decade, Eric Kronfeld, also died this year, in May. He too was 71.

Kronfeld, who left behind a wife and four children, wasn't as widely known as the Velvet Underground founder, of course. Though as Zenyatta's breeder and the man who campaigned Grade/Group 1 winners like Nereid and Mrs. Penny, he didn't lack for recognition in Thoroughbred circles. Moreover, those who knew him considered him as complex, dynamic and interesting as, well, a Lou Reed.

In racing, one of the people closest to Kronfeld was Winter Quarter Farm's Don Robinson, who boarded Kronfeld's broodmares for over 25 years. Robinson was just as much a part of Zenyatta's success as Kronfeld himself, having been involved with four generations of the Horse of the Year's family. Robinson still thinks often about Kronfeld's sudden decline and passing, which followed a battle with cancer.

"I haven't been able to shake it all this year," admitted Robinson this week. "As we got older, through Zenyatta and through family, we became what I would consider to be close friends. For me, it's very sad."

YOU CANT CATCH ME

Indeed, emotions figure to run high when Kronfeld's racing and breeding stock are offered through Winter Quarter in the coming days at the Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale. The Kronfeld horses number just eight, and sell during sessions one, three and eight.

The star of the show, without a doubt, is Zenyatta's half-sister **Eblouissante** (Bernardini--Vertigineux, by Kris S.). The 4-year-old homebred goes through during Tuesday's opener as [hip 130](#), and carries enormous appeal. Selling as a racing or broodmare prospect, she showed big potential in her first two starts. She was tabbed a **"TDN Rising Star"** winning on debut at Hollywood Park last November ([video](#)), then doubling up in a Santa Anita allowance two months later ([video](#)). Trained by the same man who called the shots for Zenyatta, John Shirreffs, Eblouissante joined Shirreffs's inaugural string in New York this past spring. In her first start outside of California, in the GIII Shuvee H. at Belmont in July, she was injured in a gate mishap and never ran a step, finishing last of six.

"She should have been scratched," said Robinson. "She broke a tooth and was bleeding out of the mouth. What happened was she got in the gate and, like Zenyatta, didn't love it in there. She was fine, however, until the filly in the stall next to her acted up. She got fractious, and the starter grabbed her ear, I think, and with that family, you don't ever do that. So she went straight up in the gate, nearly 17 hands, and nearly pitched over backward. She was cut up a little bit, but thank God she didn't suffer any serious injuries."

But you know how cautious John Shirreffs is, and he wanted to give her plenty of time to make sure that, psychologically, she was fine. And honestly, that evening after the race I felt very good about it; she had recovered and was herself. She ate and was looking around and was fine. I'm really sorry she couldn't have another run before the sale, but it just wasn't meant to be. She's racing sound, and is definitely a racing prospect in addition to being a broodmare prospect. If yours truly were the buyer, she'd go back to the racetrack."

Long Time No See...

Don Robinson first met Eric Kronfeld back in the mid-1980s. Or, first talked to him then. Kronfeld, a longtime music executive, manager and lawyer, had a handful of broodmares he kept in Pennsylvania. When they came to Kentucky to be bred, Kronfeld began boarding them at Winter Quarter. But he and Robinson had never met in person, and it would be a long time before Robinson saw the white of Kronfeld's eyes.

"Heck, it must have been six, eight years before we met face to face," said Robinson, who ultimately began board Kronfeld's mares year-round.

"He had a yearling at the July Sale, and he flew down for the day and came to the farm. That was the first time."

In that first group of mares Kronfeld sent to Winter Quarter was For the

Flag (*Forli)--Zenyatta's second dam.

"She was from Newstead [Farm], and Eric always understood the meaning of pedigree, and he bought a good one. Did he ever," said Robinson.

For the Flag produced four stakes winners, including Vertigineux, the dam of Zenyatta and another terrific racemare, the MGISW Balance (Thunder Gulch).

Kronfeld sold both mares as yearlings, parting with Zenyatta for just \$60,000 at the 2005 Keeneland September sale. The fact he didn't race her hardly diminished the thrill Kronfeld felt when he watched her race...on TV.

"He never saw her race in person one time," said Robinson. "He was incredibly superstitious. [Zenyatta's owner] Jerry Moss asked him to be by his side several times, and he wouldn't do it. But he followed every second of it. He just felt it wasn't his place to be there."

Kronfeld wasn't sure it was Robinson's place to be there, either.

"The first year she went to the Breeders' Cup I said, 'Hell, I'm going!'" said Robinson. "And there was silence at the other end of the phone. And so I said, 'Eric, you don't understand--I'm a member of the Breeders' Cup, I *have* to go.' And he said, 'Oh, if you *have* to go.'"

In Zenyatta's first Breeders' Cup run, in the 2008 GI Ladies' Classic, Zenyatta dispatched of an ultra-classy field with ease at Santa Anita. A year later, she defeated males in a heart-stopping last-to-first win in GI Breeders' Cup Classic.

"The day she won the Classic was maybe the most exciting I've ever seen at a racetrack, and I think most people that were in attendance would agree," said Robinson. "It was electric. Thirty minutes after that race everyone was still around; the crowd was still on its feet. I saw people crying. It was really something. And for me, Eric was behind part all of that."

Always on the move, Kronfeld made frequent trips to China and other overseas destinations, but last year made the decision to enjoy the fruits of his labor. At last year's Keeneland September Sale, a few months before he became seriously ill, he purchased three yearling fillies to race.

"He always dabbled, but to buy several fillies to race here in the States, that was a new one," said Robinson. "It was a new little splash for him, and he was really excited about it. For the first time, he was really set to enjoy it. He had his horses in his back yard for the first time, with John moving a string to Belmont, and he was really looking forward to it."


All three fillies, all unraced, are now entered in the sale. They are: Pine and Dandy (Lemon Drop Kid) ([hip 2445](#)); Social Assassin (Giant's Causeway) ([hip 2497](#)); and Lady Catelyn (Malibu Moon) ([hip 2688](#)). There's also an unraced 3-year-old filly, Insatiable (Medaglia d'Oro) ([hip 715](#)).

"It's going to be a buyers' opportunity," said Robinson. "Lady Catelyn was with Bill Mott, Pine and Dandy was with Christophe Clement, and John had Social Assassin. And all three trainers really liked them. They're all three patient trainers who don't rush 2-year-olds, and all three had minor issues and were given time."

A few weeks ago in Kentucky, the theft of 65 cases of the sought-after bourbon Pappy Van Winkle made local headlines. The *New York Times* even picked up a story on it. The whodunit made Robinson think of Kronfeld, a big fan of Pappy.

"When I heard about the theft, I just couldn't wait to email Eric about it," said Robinson. "He would have loved it. *It was probably Kronfeld*, is what I was thinking."

It also made Robinson think of the few days he spent with Kronfeld in New Orleans, when the University of Kentucky's basketball team was in the hunt for a national championship in April of 2012. Kronfeld urged Robinson to make plans to attend the Final Four, but Robinson shrugged him off, saying he was busy with the breeding season.

"What do you think this sh*t's going to happen every year?" Kronfeld retorted.

"He taunted me enough that I said, 'Ok, if they beat Louisville [in the semi-finals], we'll meet in New Orleans,'" said Robinson. "They did, and we did, and Kentucky won the tournament. And we just had a fantastic time. As you probably know, if you ate and drank with Eric, you ate the best, and you drank the best. And you had fun. He really was a fascinating guy."

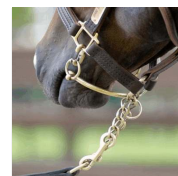
