CUP FLAVOR AT FASIG NOVEMBER

Fasig-Tipton holds its November Sale, which annually boasts some of the most exciting few hours of horse trading anywhere in the world, tonight at Newton Paddocks. With a focus on young racing and broodmare prospects, the sale once again received a big boost from the Breeders' Cup World Championships, held Friday and Saturday at Santa Anita. Included are four mares who competed in the Breeders' Cup themselves, led by the brilliant **Mizdirection** (Mizzen Mast) ([hip 104](#)), who successfully defended her title in the GI Turf Sprint for owner Jim Rome and partners. Padua's Grade II winner **Authenticity** (Quiet American) ([hip 206](#)) added \$200,000 to her bankroll with a third in the GI Distaff, while **Summer Applause** (Harlan's Holiday) ([hip 164](#)) ran a fine fourth in the GI Filly & Mare Sprint. The Grade II winner **Great Hot (Brz)** (Orientate) ([hip 57](#)) was a troubled seventh in the same race. All four mares took a red-eye charter flight Saturday night and arrived at the Fasig-Tipton grounds around 3:00 a.m. local time.

"I am literally standing here looking at Mizdirection and Authenticity right now," said Fasig-Tipton President Boyd Browning, Jr. when reached by phone yesterday. "I saw them load off the van [last night], and they're in fine shape. It's truly amazing how good they look."

Browning added of the Breeders' Cup, "It was two great days of racing, and it's fantastic when a filly like Mizdirection beats the boys again. It's exciting to have her on the sales grounds, as well as the other horses that ran in California. Several mares got significant updates, as well. It provides a lot of energy for the sale."

Saturday night, Fasig announced a late addition to the November Sale--a Tapit weanling half-sister to the GI Breeders' Cup Classic winner **Mucho Macho Man** (Macho Uno). The Blake-Albina Thoroughbred Services-consigned filly will be the last horse through the ring as [hip 222](#).

"We've been having discussions with them throughout the week in case Mucho Macho Man won the Classic, and at around 9:30 last night we hit the 'go' button," said Browning. "We want to provide a high level of service as a company and be adaptable to our customers' needs, and when an opportunity presents itself for someone to sell a filly like her, given an update like that, we want to provide flexibility. She should be desirable in the marketplace, and it's a good time to sell." **Cont. p3**

PRINCE REIGNS IN NASHUA

Cairo Prince gave freshman sire Pioneerof the Nile (Empire Maker) his first graded stakes winner when he aired in Aqueduct's GI Nashua S. yesterday afternoon. The Kieran McLaughlin trainee broke from the outside stall and rated professionally just behind the early pace. The gray asserted from the three path entering the lane and steadily opened up to earn his

black-type in style.

Cario Prince is now two-for-two after winning his debut going six panels at Belmont Park Oct. 6.

"There was a strong headwind down the backside," said Arthur Magnuson, assistant McLaughlin. "We thought he'd be pretty close, but you worry at the five-sixteenths pole about how much he has left after he's made a run into that wind. Of course, you're also excited about the [GI] Remsen [S. Nov. 30] and Florida and next year in May. [Whether he runs in the Remsen] is totally up to Kieran, Mr. [Paul] Braverman, Mr. [Harvey] Clarke, and Mr. [Terence] Murray."

"He keeps improving," commented pilot Luis Saez. "Today, he was impressive. On the turn, he wanted to run, so I let him, and he was flying. I had a lot of horse at the top of the stretch and he just kept going."

The sale did have at least one significant late scratch. The Grade I-winning **She's a Tiger** (Tale of the Cat), DQ'd from first to second in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, is an out.

Beyond horses with Breeders' Cup connections, the November Sale sports a bevy of Grade I-winning fillies and mares, including **Joyful Victory** (Tapit) ([hip 80](#)) from Taylor Made, and not one but four Grade I winners from Bluewater Sales--**In Lingerie** (Empire Maker) ([hip 73](#)), **Careless Jewel** (Tapit) ([hip 103](#)), **Mi Sueno** (Pulpit) ([hip 195](#)) and **Champagne d'Oro** (Medaglia d'Oro) ([hip 215](#)).

"We're very fortunate to be well supported by owners and consignors with a terrific group of horses," said Browning. "And terrific groups of horses generally make for a pretty good sale. We're very thankful to the people who gave us an opportunity to present their horses, and we hope they'll be rewarded."

November realized big gains in average and gross last year, thanks to the sale of 15 seven-figure fillies and mares, including the \$10 million Havre de Grace (Saint Liam). A total of 134 horses went through the ring, with 87 selling for \$60,220,000. The average of \$692,184 was up 67% from the previous year. The median of \$190,000, however, was down 5%.

GOFFS RIDES THE WAVE OF SUCCESS

With its highly successful flagship Orby sale last month still burning bright in the memory, Goffs officials have every reason to be optimistic heading into their November Sale of foals, yearlings and breeding stock, set for Nov. 18-23 at the Kill Paddocks in Co. Kildare, Ireland. Not only will they be riding the momentum of a

€2.35-million Orby topper—a modern-day Irish record—but they have also assembled arguably the best catalogue in the sale’s history, with the dispersal of Paul Makin’s Paulyn Ltd a welcome addition to an already strong assembly, which includes foals by the likes of Galileo (Ire),

Montjeu (Ire) and New Approach (Ire), and three mares carrying the first-crop foals of Frankel (GB).

“As the shop window to the world for Irish bloodstock, Goffs November Sale is all about the best,” said Goffs Chief Executive Henry Beeby. “We are extremely thankful to the Irish breeders who, following year-on-year increases recorded at this sale, have once again supported Goffs with more and more of their best and allowed us to compile a superior catalogue of strength, depth and diversity.

“This year of course is even more special. We are honored that Paul Makin chose Goffs as the auction house of choice for the dispersal of his world-class band of broodmares, foals, yearlings and horses-in-training. I think it is safe to say that the combined collection of horses on offer at Goffs this November will not be matched anywhere else in the world this year.”

The sale gets underway Nov. 18 with the November Foal Sale, which runs through Nov. 21 and is followed by the concise November Yearling Sale on the evening of Nov. 21. The November Breeding Stock Sale picks up proceedings Nov. 22 and 23, featuring the 25-strong Paulyn Dispersal Nov. 22.

The Goffs November Foal Sale reached new heights in 2011 when it was topped by a trio of first-crop foals by Sea the Stars (Ire)—the leader bringing €850,000 and another pair fetching €800,000.

These represent the top three prices paid for foals in Europe over the last 10 years, an accomplishment that Beeby believes has elevated the Foal Sale to “a market-leading position.” While last year’s Foal Sale understandably struggled to maintain those colossal heights across all key indicators—it experienced an 11% decrease in average and 6% drop in median—it did post an increased aggregate, up to €14.7-million from €14.3-million.

Beeby was quick to point out that it is not just the top level of the market that buyers will find at the Foal Sale. This sale has developed into a popular shopping destination for both pinhookers and end-users at all levels of the market, and is designed to help buyers shop within their preferred price range.

“The overwhelming majority of European pinhookers are Irish-based, so they’re buying at their home market when they come to Goffs,” Beeby explained. “So that’s why we get such a good selection of pinhookers, because we’re nearly guaranteed to have every single pinhooker in Europe at the sale. The foals are graded through the week--and then catalogued alphabetically by session--so they hopefully improve as the week goes on. **cont. p7**

“The average last year on the Monday was just over €8,100, whereas the average on the Thursday was over €55,000, and the average got better each day, as did the top prices,” Beeby continued. “So you’re looking at what I would describe as a rising tide. It means that people wanting to deal at the €10,000 to €20,000 bracket can come straight in on Monday and find a good, diverse strong catalogue, and the foals improve in terms of pedigree and quality as the week goes on. But there is serious value to be had in each session, and you’ll find the main pinhookers will be at every session, and they’ll make sure they look at every single foal in the place.”

If buyers weren’t inspecting every foal already, they may be inclined to do so now, as a pair of the sale’s most successful graduates have been scooped up for lowly sums in recent years. Lethal Force (Ire) (Dark Angel {Ire}), winner of this year’s G1 Diamond Jubilee and G1 July Cup, was purchased for €9,500 out of the Rathasker Stud consignment in 2009, while G1 Prix de la Foret and G1 Betfred Sprint Cup winner Gordon Lord Byron (Ire) (Byron {GB}) cost just €2,000 from Owenstown Stud in 2008. Astaire (Ire) (Intense Focus), winner of this year’s G1 Middle Park S. and G2 Gimcrack S., was a €45,000 Foal Sale graduate.

This year’s catalogue features 928 foals, up from 877 last year. Leading sires represented include Galileo (Ire), Exceed and Excel (Aus), Montjeu (Ire), Fastnet Rock (Aus), New Approach (Ire), Oasis Dream (GB) and Invincible Spirit (Ire). Stallions represented by their first crop include Canford Cliffs (Ire), Dream Ahead, Poet’s Voice (GB) and Pour Moi (Ire). “We’re very pleased with the catalogue--we think it’s every bit as good as any previous year,” Beeby said. “We have slightly more horses than last year, which is a result of the strength of the last few years’ sales. Really what we have in there is the cream of the Irish foal crop. It’s a strong catalogue and will offer foals at all levels of the market. It depends on people’s physical assessment of the foals, but on paper they read as well as any foal catalogue we’ve had.”

Directly following the conclusion of the foal sale on the evening of Nov. 21 will be the compact November Yearling Sale of 20 lots. **cont. p8**

This sale is in its infancy, having been developed just three years ago to cater to yearlings who, for a variety of reasons, were forced to bypass one of the more select yearling sales earlier on the calendar.

“It’s what you would call a reactive sale rather than a sale where we actively go out and look for the horses,” Beeby explained. “Being honest about it, nobody aims their yearling at the start of the season to the Goffs November sale at this time of year. We introduced the sale a few years ago because a significant vendor of ours had a yearling that, for a very small reason, couldn’t make the Orby sale, and he said, ‘Now there’s nothing in Goffs I can send this horse to.’ So we said, ‘Why don’t we introduce a section, when everyone’s here for the foals, that is a backup for people.’”

A handful of standouts on paper include [lot 929](#), a Dark Angel (Ire) colt out of a sister to Hong Kong Horse of the Year Military Attack (Ire); [lot 934](#), a Tamayuz (GB) filly out of a sister to G1 Irish 1000 Guineas winner Samitar (GB); [lot 946](#), a Rock of Gibraltar (Ire) half-brother to Grade I winner Obviously (Ire), and [lot 947](#), an Exceed and Excel (Aus) colt out of a sister to Group 1 winner Menhoubah.

“This sale is for a really nice yearling who, through no fault of its own, didn’t quite make it to one of the preferred sales earlier in the season,” Beeby said. “The top price last year was €120,000 and for year one it was €100,000, so there’s a great opportunity there.”

The dams of Extortionist (Ire) (Dandy Man {Ire}), Venus de Milo (Ire) (Duke of Marmalade {Ire}) and Lily’s Angel (Ire) (Dark Angel {Ire}) will also go through the ring.

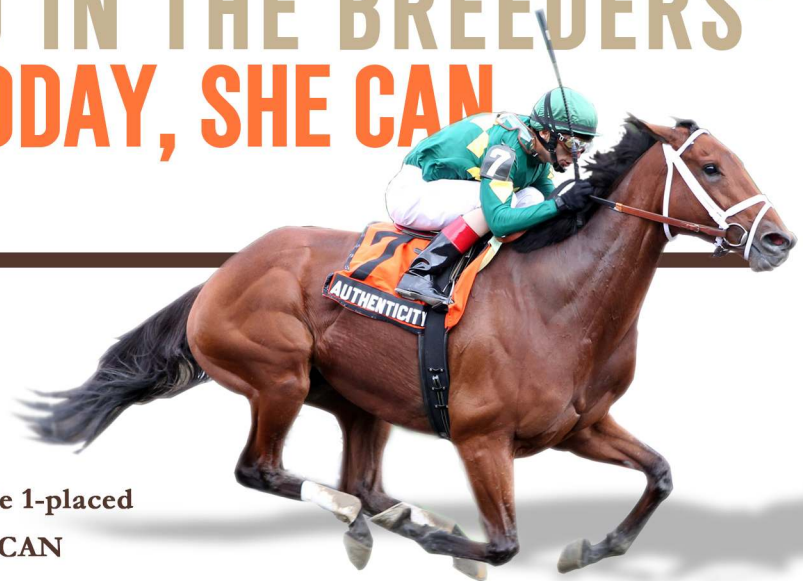

“There is absolutely no doubt that the breeding stock catalogue is the best breeding stock catalogue we’ve produced for as long as anyone can remember,” Beeby said. “It’s an outstanding bunch both with and without taking into account the Paulyn horses. Leaving them to one side for a moment, this is a catalogue that has taken a serious step up. It’s very, very strong, and when you add the Paulyn horses in it becomes exceptional. I’d say it would match any catalogue that we’ve produced, and that has been produced, this year for breeding stock.”

The November Breeding Stock sale of 2011 followed in the blueprint of that year’s foal sale by producing a record price for a filly or mare at the auction house—the €2.3-million paid by Oceanic Bloodstock for multiple group-winner Banimpire (Ire) (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}). While last year’s Breeding Stock Sale was unable to hit the same astronomical individual price tags—the topper bringing just €450,000—it managed to post gains in average (5%), median (10%) and gross (up to €8,154,000 from €6,948,200) from the exact same number of horses offered. In addition, the buyback rate was down to 26% from 34%—all encouraging signs of a market and a sale on the improve.

The Paulyn Factor...

The dispersal of a prominent operation always adds heightened buzz to a sale, and those attending the Paulyn Dispersal at the Goffs November Breeding Stock Sale Nov. 22 will be witness to the biggest dispersal in Europe since the dissemination of prominent owner/breeder Jim Joel’s bloodstock at Tattersalls in 1986. Australian native Paul Makin established Paulyn Ltd. in 2007 as the moniker for his European racing and breeding operations, and in seven years he has cultivated an enviable collection of bloodstock, of

The six foals to go through the ring will include a Galileo (Ire) filly out of Fleeting Spirit; a Galileo filly out of Funsie and therefore a half-sister to Authorized and a full-sister to last year's Tattersalls topper, and a Galileo half-sister to Gilt Edge Girl. The three yearlings to be sold are another Galileo filly out of Fleeting Spirit, a

daughter of Oasis Dream (GB) and Gilt Edge Girl and a Galileo filly out of Piste Noir, who is a full-sister to multiple graded/group winner Three Valleys. 'Man' of the Hour

One day after recording her most important victory as a trainer, Kathy Ritvo was thankful for all the blessings that culminated with **Mucho Macho Man** (Macho Uno)'s win in Saturday's GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Santa Anita. "We had no doubts," affirmed Ritvo yesterday. "We had faith in the horse. He was showing us all the right signs that he wanted to continue training."

Ritvo, who received a second chance at life by receiving a heart transplant five years ago, became the first female trainer to saddle the winner of the Classic in the 30-year history of the Breeders' Cup World Championships.

"How about that? I hope I'm the first of many," said Ritvo. "With the heart transplant and having a second chance, it's an amazing thing. Selfless people donated their loved one's organs to give me a second chance, and to be in this place, it's hard to come up with words."

According to Ritvo, the Dean and Patti Reeves runner is scheduled to ship to Gulfstream Park in South Florida Tuesday night.

"The calls have been unbelievable," she said. "We're very grateful to be here. I'm very blessed to be here. I wouldn't be here without my donor family. Without my family, I wouldn't be here. Without Finn [Green] managing the horse, I wouldn't be here. Without my team--Nicky [Petro] galloping the horse every day and my assistants and all my help, I wouldn't be here. It's been a team effort."

Mucho Macho Man, who also won the Sept. 28 GI Awesome Again S., had faced plenty of adversity this year, Green revealed Sunday.

"All of those issues were on top of something that we hadn't talked about," said Green. "He came out of [a seventh-place finish in] the [2011 GI] Belmont S. with a wind issue. We addressed it, took care of it [surgically]. The horse is an unbelievable horse. He's had more problems than people have known about."

As for what lies ahead for the 5-year-old, Green said, "If he stays racing sound and fit and he's going to be better off on the track than on the farm, he could stay in training."

Should Mucho Macho Man stay in training, the \$10-million G1 Dubai World Cup in late March could be an option. The chestnut spent part of the last summer at Fair Hill Training Center, which has a Tapeta surface, similar to the one found at Meydan, the site of the World Cup.

Euros Head Home

Declaration of War (War Front), who ran third behind Mucho Macho Man (Macho Uno) in Saturday's GI Breeders' Cup Classic, appeared no worse for wear Sunday morning and was expected to leave the quarantine barn yesterday evening for Los Angeles International airport before shipping back to Ireland with stable companions GI Breeders' Cup Turf hero **Magician (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), **Giovanni Boldini** (War Front), Friday's GI Juvenile Turf runner-up, **Cristoforo Colombo** (Henrythenavigator) (seventh in the GI BC Mile) and **Wilshire Boulevard (Ire)** (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}) (ninth in the GI BC Juvenile Turf).

Declaration of War will join the Coolmore Stud stallion roster in 2014, while Magician is expected to remain in training next year, according to his trainer Aidan O'Brien.

"Magician is by Galileo and they all seem to improve with age especially from 3- to 4-years-old," O'Brien said.

A possible early season target for Magician is the \$5-million G1 Dubai Sheema Classic at the end of March on Dubai World Cup night.

Dank (GB) (dansili {GB}), who won the GI Filly & Mare Turf, was also in good form Sunday morning. A final decision on whether or not she'll run in the G1 Hong Kong Cup in December will be made after the filly returns to England.

The decision has not been made whether she will remain in training in 2014.

Also possible for the Hong Kong International races in December is **The Fugue (GB)** (Dansili {GB}), who finished runner-up to Magician in the Turf.

Among those likely to return to training in 2014 is the Richard Hannon-trained **Olympic Glory (Ire)** (Choirir {Aus}), who has almost certainly run his last race for 2013. Not expected return next season is the blue-blooded **Romantica (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), who finished second in the GI Filly & Mare Turf. The daughter of champion Banks Hill (GB) (Danehill) will join Juddmonte Farm's broodmare band. Questionable to return in 2014 is **Planteur (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}), who was a disappointing 11th in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic.

Dan the Man

Wise Dan (Wiseman's Ferry), repeat winner of the GI Breeders' Cup Mile, departed Santa Anita Sunday morning for a flight from Ontario that left shortly after 5 a.m., local time, and landed in Louisville, Kentucky shortly after 11 a.m. (ET).

"Well, for those people who thought he had lost a step, he showed them yesterday," trainer Charlie LoPresti said prior to catching a flight. "He is truly an amazing horse. He overcame adversity yesterday and still won."

Wise Dan was ridden to victory by Jose Lezcano, filling in for John Velazquez who was injured in Saturday's GI BC Juvenile Fillies.

"I feel terrible for Johnny," LoPresti said. "I was watching the race, but I did not see who went down. Lezcano's agent called me and said Jose was open in the race and I was relieved there was somebody in the room that had ridden him before. Jose now has won four Grade 1s on him."

When asked if the 6-year-old might contest the Nov. 29 GI Clark H., a race he won in 2011, LoPresti said, "There is no reason to run in the Clark; he is done for the year. If Game On Dude had won the Classic, we could have come back to try to win a Grade 1 on dirt, but this horse has nothing to prove."

Regarding when LoPresti might bring Wise Dan back in 2014, he said, "We will just take it step by step. A lot of it depends on weather, and if it is a bad winter in Kentucky, you may not see him until the summer."

Some R&R for Beholder

Beholder (Henny Hughes), Friday's GI BC Distaff winner, is done for the year, according to trainer Richard Mandella.

"She's going to get a nice break after we give her a good going over," the trainer said Sunday morning. "We're going to do the check up from A to Z--bone scan, body scan, all of it. She had an ulcer in her throat last spring and we'll make sure everything is good there. Then we can start to have some fun and plan a campaign with her for next year." **cont. p13**

Regarding a 2014 campaign, he added, "I talked to [owner] B. Wayne [Hughes] and he said it's a go. She's such a versatile filly, I think we can do a lot of things with her. I might want to try her on the grass. She's got the kind of action that says she might do well on it. Her race down at Del Mar [on Polytrack]--she just won that so easy. I think she's the kind that could run on most anything. We'll think about traveling with her, too, but it will have to be the right race and the right track. She's a bit of a handful on the road. But places like Keeneland and Belmont Park are easy for the horses to adapt to, so maybe we could look at things there. It ought to be fun."

Mott Team Return to Payson

Five horses trained by Bill Mott were expected to ship to Payson Park in Florida this morning, the Hall of Famer confirmed Sunday. **Close Hatches** (First Defence) and **Royal Delta** (Empire Maker) (second and fourth, respectively, in GI BC Distaff) **Emollient** (Empire Maker) (fourth in GI BC Filly & Mare Turf) and **Flat Out** (Flatter) (eighth in the GI BC Classic) will be joined by Classic entrant **Ron the Greek** (Full Mandate), who was scratched due to a quarter crack last Thursday.

"All of the horses are fine and they are going to Payson Park in Florida in the morning," confirmed Mott.

A decision on the future plans for two-time champion Royal Delta, the beaten favorite in the Distaff, will likely be made this month.

"It should be in a couple of weeks," Mott said. "That hasn't changed."

Mott also indicated that Flat Out and Ron the Greek are likely to remain in training in 2014.

"I guess there are decisions to be made, I suppose, to see if any offers come in as a stallion, but there is nothing on the table right now," he said. "Flat Out is going to Florida, but if he is doing really well he could come back in the GI Cigar Mile [at Aqueduct Nov. 30]."

Of his top two finishers in this year's Breeders' Cup, Mott said,

"They were good, solid races," he said. "Emollient got beat a length for the whole thing. She's a 3-year-old filly running against older. Close Hatches the same thing. There were some positives coming out of it. Half good and half not so good."

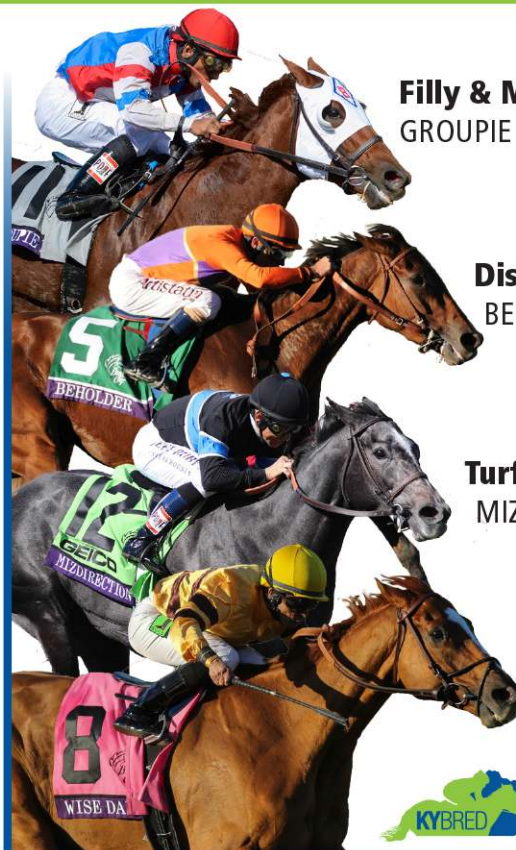
Silentio Continues On

She's a Tiger Done for the Year

She's a Tiger (Tale of the Cat), who crossed the wire first only to be demoted to second behind Ria Antonia (Rockport Harbor) in Saturday's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, is done for the year, according to trainer Jeff Bonde.

"This is the biggest heartbreak I've ever felt in my 47 years on the track," said Bonde. "It was going to be the biggest win of my career and then it was gone. I feel so bad for the owners [Dedomenico, Aldrich and Hernandez] and the horse. Maybe someday I'll understand it all better, but for now it just plain hurts."

Winner of her first two starts, including the July 13 Landaluce S., she added a win in the GI Del Mar Debutante S. Aug. 31. She also finished runner up in the Sept. 28 GI Chandelier S. and Aug. 7 GII Sorrento S. this season.

"She's going to be put away and won't race again until next year," Bonde continued. "She's had a hard campaign and earned a rest. We think we're going to have a really good 3-year-old filly next year."

Baffert Looks Back on Stable's Efforts

Trainer Bob Baffert was victorious in two Breeders' Cup races, taking the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint with **Secret Circle** (Eddington) and upsetting the Juvenile with **New Year's Day** (Street Cry {Ire}). However, for the second consecutive year, **Game on Dude** (Awesome Again) finished out of the money as the favorite in the Classic. "Game On Dude, well, what can you say," Baffert said. "He's a one-dimensional horse with a target on his back and they don't give one like him any breaks. You know they were saying 'Don't let that horse get in front of you.' And so when he can't clear, when he can't get out there and into that high cruising speed of his, he's in trouble. It just didn't happen for him. I felt sorry for him."

As for the Sprint winner, Baffert said, "Secret Circle, he's just a beast. He's so big and strong. If you want to see what a real sprinter looks like, come see him. I told a guy that if he was going to rob a bank and had to get out of there real fast, this was the one horse he'd want. I thought he ran a spectacular race Saturday. I was in awe of it. He just might be the best sprinter I've ever had. I don't think anyone's seen a sprinter like that since [two-time Breeders' Cup winner] Midnight Lute. He's so competitive and he wants to win so much. He lost all that ground and kept on grinding, kept on coming. He's just a fighter."

Baffert had similar praises for New Year's Day. "He ran some race, didn't he?" he said. "His first race at Del Mar was a sprint and he came running. Then we sent him a mile there and he just ate them up. He's a true distance horse, there's no doubt about that. The way he ran yesterday, on the inside, and the way he came on was terrific. If that race was a mile and an eighth he was going to open up on them. He's just full of talent, but the light isn't fully on yet. He's still learning."

We might think about running him back at Hollywood [in the CashCall Futurity Dec. 14]."

Book Review (Giant's Causeway), who finished ninth in the Filly and Mare Sprint, may retire following that effort. "I had a message from [owner] Gary [West] this morning that he's thinking about retiring her and breeding her," said Baffert.

Marketing Mix Retires

Marketing Mix (Medaglia d'Oro--Instant Thought, by Kris S.) will retire following her fifth-place effort in the Filly and Mare Turf, according to Glen Hill Farm's Craig Bernick. GI Ballerina S. winner **Dance to Bristol** (Speightstown --Dance to Dawn, by Louis Quatorze) will retire following her sixth-place effort in the Filly and Mare Sprint. According to trainer Ollie Figgins III, the filly bled during the race. "She had never bled before," Figgins said. "She will leave Monday for New York and then van to Bowie. She is going to be a broodmare and go to Kentucky. Now the job is to find the next good one." One the board in 18 of 20 starts, Dance to Bristol retires with 10 wins and earnings of \$980,880.

Handle, Attendance Up

All-sources handle for the 14 Breeders' Cup World Championships races was \$136,539,014, a 7% increase over last year's 15 Breeders' Cup-race total of \$127,676,366. The 2013 full-card handle was \$160,704,877, an 11% increase over last year's figure of \$144,272,332. Saturday's 12-race Breeders' Cup card was \$109,183,731, up 13% from the 2012 handle of \$96,685,567.

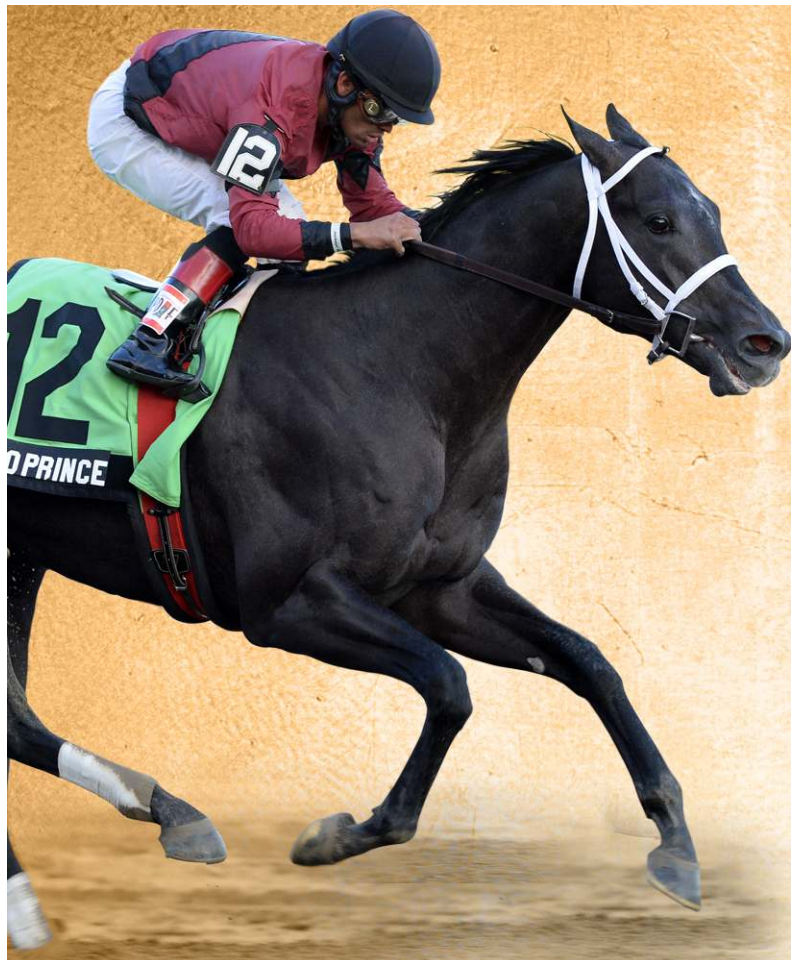
The on-track handle for the two days at Santa Anita was \$21,043,110, a 2% increase over 2012's total of \$20,680,143.

Attendance was up more than 5% from a year ago, with Saturday's 58,795-strong crowd pushing the two-day total 94,628. Last year's two-day attendance was 89,742. Saturday's crowd was 6.6% more than the 2012 total of 55,123.

"We enjoyed a spectacular two days of racing, topped off by Mucho Macho Man's thrilling victory in the Classic before a prime time television audience, and courageous repeat performances by Wise Dan in the Mile, Groupie Doll in the Filly & Mare Sprint, and Mizdirection in the Geico Turf Sprint," said Breeders' Cup President and CEO Craig Favel. "We're thrilled with the crowd over both days, strong wagering levels and our gracious hosts here at Santa Anita, Arcadia and the greater Los Angeles area."

Smith Earns Bill Shoemaker Award

Jockey Mike Smith won his second consecutive Bill Shoemaker Award for outstanding jockey at the Breeders' Cup. Smith won the GI Breeders' Cup Marathon with London Bridge (Arch), GI Juvenile Turf with Outstrip (GB) (Exceed and Excel {Aus}) and the GI Turf Sprint with Mizdirection (Mizzen Mast). Smith holds the record for most all-time Breeders' Cup victories with 20. "It was a great honor to win the award last year for the first time, but winning it a second time means much more to me because it's so much harder to do," said Smith.

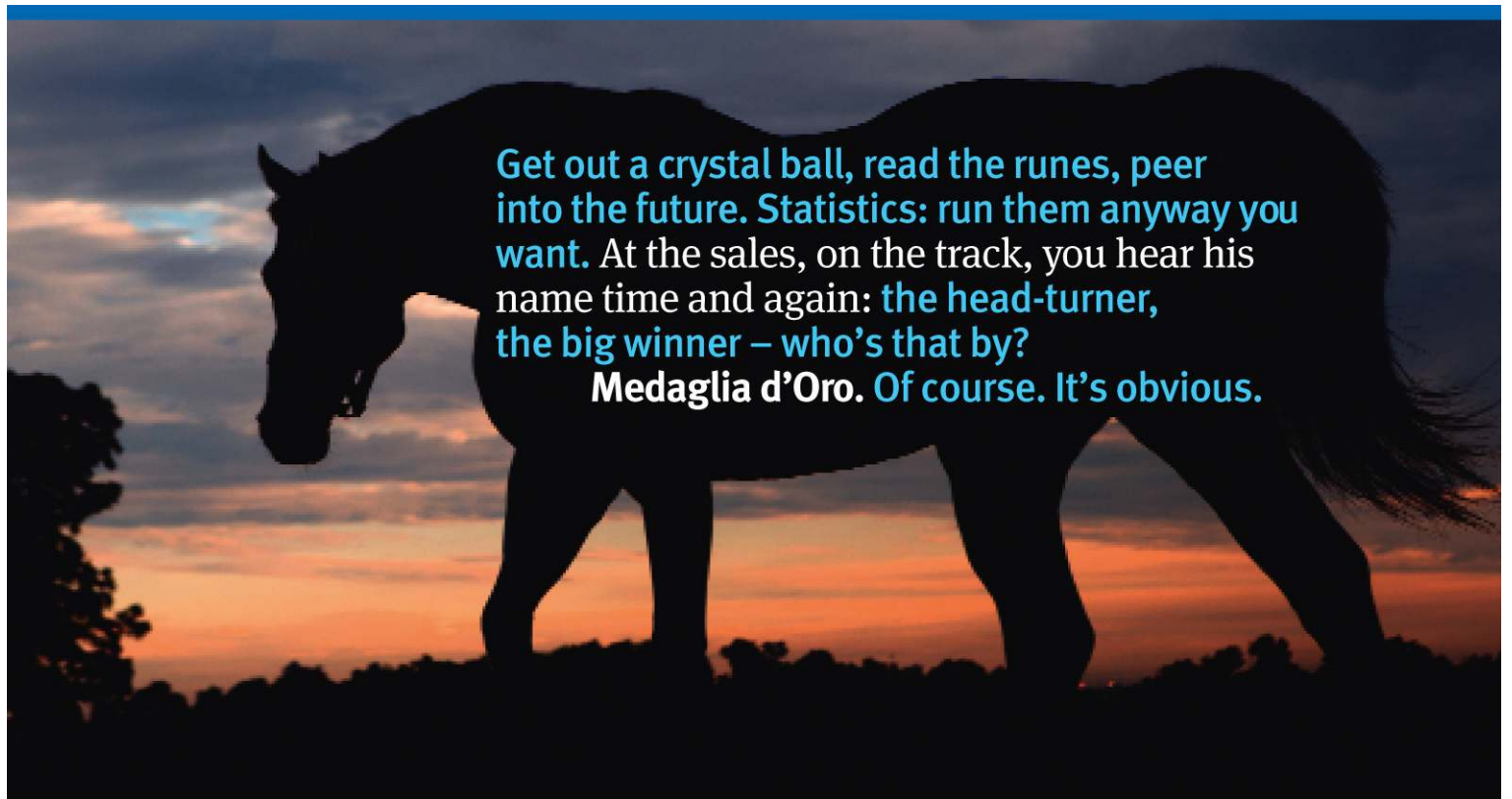

Favored this time, the Todd Pletcher

runner assumed a narrow advantage over Divided Attention through an opening quarter in :23.64. The leading duo was soon joined by another Pletcher representative, Potosi's Silver, who came up on the inside as the trio rolled through a half in :47.74. Ready to dispense of her rivals at the quarter pole, Stopchargingmaria drew off in the lane to post an eye-popping 10 3/4 length margin. "The way the race unfolded, it looked like nobody wanted the lead," said Michael McCarthy, assistant to Todd Pletcher. "[Jockey] Javier [Castellano] went ahead and did the right thing by putting this filly in there early. He established position and was able to improve on it from there. 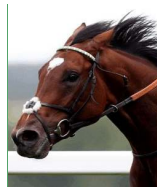

AN ALL-OUT AUSSIE SHOWSTOPPER

In these days it is a rarity for a horse race to truly transcend the realms of the sport and capture the imagination of the wider public, but that is exactly what the Melbourne Cup has done year-after-year since 1861, and tonight 'The Race That Stops a Nation' will once again bring Australia to a halt as 24 of the world's best routers attempt to write their names into the country's sporting history in the A\$6-million showpiece. Horse racing is celebrated in Australia like in no other country--Melbourne Cup Day is a public holiday in the State of Victoria and on the eve of the race, the streets of Melbourne are closed to accommodate the Melbourne Cup parade of each contenders connections--and the Flemington faithful may just be treated to a vintage renewal of their prized race this year, with two returning winners, a strong international brigade and a five-horse assault from the popular Lloyd Williams/Robert Hickmott axis. Early favoritism belongs to the Gai Waterhouse-trained **Fiorente (Ire)** (Monsun {Ger}), who stamped himself as a serious horse by finishing second here last year in his Australian debut after being purchased and imported from Britain.

Fiorente went on to finish third in the G1 All Aged S. in his lone autumn outing Apr. 27, and has indicated that he retains his ability throughout the spring, winning Moonee Valley's G2 Dato'tan Chin Nam S. Sept. 14, followed by a fourth in the G1 Turnbull S. Oct. 5 and a recent third in the G1 Cox Plate Oct. 26 while defying a

wide post under the co-heaviest impost.

Waterhouse will also saddle **Tres Blue (Ire)** (Anabaa Blue {GB}), a progressive 3-year-old who makes his Australian debut off a pair of group victories in France and a second in the G1 Deutsches Derby. Tres Blue will be the first horse to carry the colors of upstart Round Table Racing, and will benefit from a light weight assignment. "He's in the race with 51 kilos [112

pounds] on his back, and thankfully he has traveled well and everything has gone to plan so far," said Round Table Racing Director Bruce Slade. "He's come off two strong weight-for-age races in France and came here confident and full of himself, but Gai has got him to refocus. He's on a steep learning curve, bright eyed, happy and happy horses run to their best."

Back For More...

If it's in fact true that winning races gets into your blood, then winning multi-million dollar international showpieces must be spellbinding. Two of today's runners, **Dunaden (Fr)** (Nicobar {GB}) and **Green Moon (Ire)** have been there, done that, and they're back for more. Dunaden, in fact, is back for third straight year, having taken the spoils by the narrowest of nostrils over **Red Cadeaux (GB)** (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}) in 2011 and finishing 14th under top weight last year.

The 7-year-old Pearl Bloodstock colorbearer has remained remarkably consistent over three international campaigns, and his record this summer in Europe—third in the G1 Prix Ganay, second in the G1 Coronation Cup and second in the G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud—indicates he may still be as good as ever. He looks to rebound from an uncharacteristic

eighth in the G2 Prix Foy Sept. 15. Green Moon is one of five-strong Lloyd Williams/Robert Hickmott brigade, and is in fact one of the least-fancied of the bunch, having compiled a rather uninspiring record off his upset win last year. His campaign has been all about the build-up to a title defense here, however, with most of his assignments coming at much shorter than his preferred distance. Like Dunaden, Red Cadeaux is back for a third shot at the Cup having finished second and eighth the past two years, and last year's G1 Hong Kong Vase winner could get away at a sneaky price off five consecutive losses. These three Cup veterans carry top weights at 129, 127 and 124, respectively.

Numbers Game...

Eliciting a greater number of participants reasonably enhances the odds of victory, and that's the chance owner Lloyd Williams and trainer Robert Hickmott are taking today. In addition to Green Moon, they will send out Group 2-winning import **Sea Moon (GB)** (Beat Hollow {GB}), last-out G1 Caulfield Cup winner **Fawkner (Aus)** (Reset {Aus}), last season's G1 Sydney Cup winner **Mourayan (Ire)** (Alhaarth {Ire}), G1 Metropolitan winner **Seville (Ger)** (Galileo {Ire}) and 2011 G1 St. Leger winner **Masked Marvel (GB)** (Montjeu {Ire}). Williams has already won the Cup four times, and his best chance at a fifth could be Sea Moon, a hard-knocking former British campaigner who appears to be rounding back into form off almost a year layoff and relocation to Australia. He collected the G2 Herbert Power S. at Caulfield in his most recent start Oct. 12.

The Great Euro Invasion...

The overriding tale of the Melbourne Cup in recent years has been the dominance of European-invaders or foreign-bred imports. Horses with a foreign suffix have captured eight of the last 10 runnings of the Cup, and it is arguable that this year's international team is one of the strongest in recent years. In addition to some of the aforementioned contenders, it also includes the likes of **Dandino (GB)** (Dansili {GB}), **Mount Athos (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}) and **Royal Empire (Ire)** (Teofilo {Ire}). Runner-up in the G2 Jockey Club S. and G2 Hardwicke S. in his native England over the summer, Dandino was a dominant winner of the American St. Leger at Arlington Park Aug. 17, but solidified his status as a Cup favorite with a stirring second-place finish in the Caulfield Cup in his Australian debut. Trainer Marco Botti trained last year's American St. Leger winner Jakkalberry (Ire) (Storming Home) to a third-place finish in the Cup, and Dandino's managing owner Darren Dance commented: "After having Jakkalberry here last year, Marco Botti said that if you're going to bring a horse half way around the world that it makes sense for him to run in both races. He was really trained up for the Caulfield Cup--he went super--but while there is a little double over him over two miles, he has gone to another level under this trainer, and drawing barrier four gives me a lot of confidence." Mount Athos bids to give trainer Luca Cumani his first Melbourne Cup winner from eight tries, including his own agonizingly unlucky fifth place finish last year.



Melbourne Cup cont.

After opening his campaign with a nine length victory in the G3 Ormonde S. at Chester May 10, the 6-year-old looked as if he may have fallen out of form, with dismal performances in the G2 Hardwicke S. at Royal Ascot and the G2 Goodwood Cup, but a strong runner-up effort in the Listed March S. at Goodwood Aug. 24 indicated he is back on track. Godolphin's Royal Empire has finished first or second in all but one of 10 outings this year, including a victory over Red Cadeaux in the G3 Geoffrey Freer S. Aug. 17. Godolphin have finished second in the Cup three times, and trainer Saeed bin Suroor indicated that he thinks Royal Empire may be the operation's best shot yet.

Kerrin McEvoy, Darley Australia's regular jockey who partners Royal Empire for the first time, also expressed confidence in the 4-year-old. "I think this is the right horse--we are looking to do better than in previous years," McEvoy said. "Royal Empire is doing really well, two miles is no problem, he likes good-to-firm ground and I'm happy with the barrier draw."

This will mark the first time since 2006 that legendary Australian trainer Bart Cummings will not saddle a horse for the Melbourne Cup after his Precedence (NZ) (Zabeel {NZ}) just missed the cutoff at 25 in the order of entry. Cummings has won a record 12 Melbourne Cups.

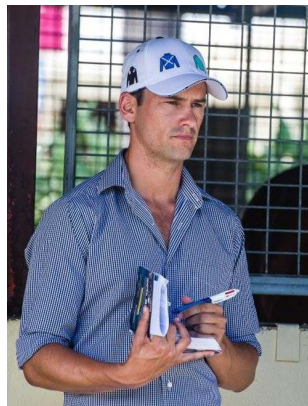
SLADE SINGING ANYTHING BUT THE BLUES

While the name of their Melbourne Cup contender may be Tres Blue (Ire) (Anabaa Blue {GB}), Bruce Slade and the partners of Round Table Racing are hoping to be feeling the opposite of blue following tomorrow's A\$6-million G1 Melbourne Cup.

Tres Blue will be the first Melbourne Cup starter—and in fact, the first starter of any kind—to carry the colors of Round Table Racing. Founded in September by

28-year-old Slade, the Sydney-based Round Table Racing sets up partnerships to race horses with Australian Hall of Fame trainer Gai Waterhouse, for whom Slade spent three years as Bloodstock Director before going out on his own just two months ago. While with Waterhouse, Slade was involved in purchasing such standouts as G1 Golden Slipper and 2-year-old Triple Crown winner Pierro (Aus) (Lonhro {Aus}), Group 1 winner Glencadam Gold (Ire) (Refuse to Bend {Ire}) and Fiorente (Ire) (Monsun {Ger}), last year's Melbourne Cup runner-up who will oppose Tres Blue as one of the favorites tomorrow. **cont. p25**



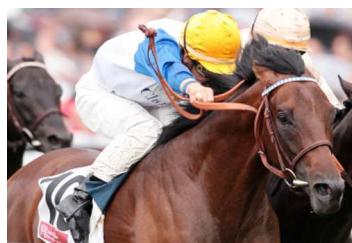

“What I did with Gai before was buying horses and selling them into partnerships,” Slade explained. “I’ve always wanted to do that myself, and Gai gave me her blessing to go off and do that. The basis of the business is giving people the best possible racing experience through first-class service, and hopefully Group 1 results.”

Slade, who has a Bachelor of Commerce degree from the University of Otago in New Zealand, spent time working at Rich Hill Stud in New Zealand and Arrowfield Stud in Australia before earning the 2008 NZTBA Sunline International Management Scholarship, which took him to work placements abroad at Cheveley Park Stud in Newmarket, Coolmore in Ireland and Taylor Made Farm in Kentucky. He spent time as a marketing assistant and bloodstock representative for New Zealand Bloodstock before taking up his role with Waterhouse, but Slade said he has always had an interest in managing racing partnerships.

“It’s something I have experience doing and something I enjoy doing, and I think it works very well in Australia, the building of these partnerships to give

people the opportunity to spread their risks and buy into a high-quality level of horse with smaller shares and smaller ongoing costs,” Slade said. “I enjoy being with people, and I think we’re blessed to be in racing. The more people we can get involved in

the game and give a better experience to, the better for the whole industry. I just don’t think there’s anything like this game. You think about turning out a winner, and there’s not much else like it. Where else do you see grown men hugging or crying on each other’s shoulders?” **cont. p25**

Slade expressed his desire to give his owners the opportunity to compete at Group 1 level, and that is what they will be doing right off the bat with Tres Blue, who finished second in the G1 Deutsches Derby in Germany in July for trainer Henri-Alex Pantall before recording back-to-back wins in the G3 Prix de Reux and G3 Grand Prix de Deauville, both going 13 furlongs, Aug. 4 & 25. According to Slade, Horst Rapp, the German-based original owner of Tres Blue, had Melbourne Cup aspirations with the 3-year-old colt. So, in a deal completed in late September by bloodstock agent James Harron, Rapp maintained a 35% interest in Tres Blue, with four additional Round Table Racing partners sharing the remainder. He shipped from France to England shortly thereafter to see out his quarantine period under the supervision of trainer Ed Vaughan in Newmarket, and arrived at the International Horse Centre at Werribee Racecourse in Melbourne Oct. 20.

“He’s crossed the biggest hurdle, which is traveling over here,” Slade said. “He’s put on 20 kilos since he got here, which is very good. Gai’s been down to visit him three times now, and her comments were that he’s very light on his feet, he carries himself very well and he’s very typical of a refined European staying horse that we’d expect to stay the two miles, which is obviously a very important part of the Melbourne Cup. She’s been over the moon, and Tom Berry, who will ride him in the Melbourne Cup, traveled to Melbourne

[Oct. 20] and spent the whole week with the horse, riding him everyday from fast work to slow work, and hopefully that’ll aid in building a relationship with the horse and getting to know him a bit better, which should come in handy come Melbourne Cup day.”

Tres Blue will exit from barrier 20 in the 24-horse field and will carry 112 pounds, and second-smallest impost, which includes a weight break for a 3-year-old competing against older horses. Slade said his team has no plans yet for their horse beyond tomorrow’s race, but hope to compete in more international events down the road. “Depending on how he performs [in the Melbourne Cup], we can then map out what we’ll do with him as a 4-year-old,” Slade said. “The beautiful thing about this horse is that he should just keep improving. **cont. p26**

“He’s a late-maturing 3-year-old that stays, so he should just keep improving as a 4-year-old, and we certainly would love to compete at the top level next year as well, and hopefully in time he’s a horse we can travel internationally to perform for the owners.”

As for his future aspirations for Round Table Racing, Slade said he will look to add to his stable at this year’s yearling and ready-to-run sales, as well as continuing to source prospects abroad.

“In the short term we’re just building very slowly and making sure we focus on quality horses,” he said.

“If we do that hopefully the success comes. We’ll be going into the yearling sales this year and next year, and if we can [have between five and 10 horses next year] I’d be very happy. We would also look at getting tried horses out of places like Europe and New Zealand, and ready-to-run sales. Anything that fits the profile to be Group 1 class, we’re interested in. It’s just about trying to get our horses to the big races on those big carnival days, and letting our clients experience that. That’s our goal. Touch wood we can have some success and some luck and all those good things.”

TO THE EDITOR

Following up on my previous letter, which was published on the *TDN* of Oct. 17 regarding what the IFHA recently stated in its annual report, I wish to inform the racing industry that the betting turnover in Italy for horse racing, up to the end of the month of October 2013, has been € 631,734,289 compared to the one of last year through the end of October which was € 792,984,701. I do believe that now everybody in the world will understand that the Thoroughbred owners are not able to get 34% of their expenses back, simply because the Ministry of Agriculture hasn't got the financial resources to meet its liability toward the Italian industry for the year 2013 (the same situation as existed for 2012). Calculating the average takeout from the National Totalizator, the percentage to the betting shop network, the tax, the Ministry of Agriculture, Breeding & Racing Dept, so far has cashed more or less € 80,000,000. By the end of the year it will get more or less € 95,000,000. In this situation it seems impossible for that department to pay the prize money to the successful owners, breeders, trainers and jockeys to assure decent prize money for the 2014 Pattern races (if there are any left) and to assure the winners of those races get the money before the end of the world. (I have mentioned official figures.)

P. S. Just to inform you that the Ministry of Agriculture, Breeding & Racing Dept, has not allowed UNIRE TV to show the two days of the Breeders' Cup. The Italian punters have nonetheless found their ways to wager and to watch all the races at a big loss for the Italian breeding and racing system.

Two further lots attracted seven-figured prices yesterday: [lot 113](#), an Australian-bred daughter of Teofilo (Ire) who was picked up by Form Bloodstock from the Balmoral Stud consignment for R1,200,000 (US\$121,543), and [lot 216](#), a Captain Al (SAf) half-brother to last year's South African Champion 2-Year-Old Vercingetorix (SAf) (Silvano {Ger}) from Klawervlei Stud that cost Andre van Vuuren of Misty Meadows R1,000,000 (US\$101,286). While yesterday's session posted four seven-figure horses over Friday's two, Friday's session-topping son of Encosta de Lago (Aus) ([lot 104](#)) remained the highest price of the sale at R1,800,000 (US\$182,315).
