GRUPIE DOLL RETIREMENT ON HOLD

Groupie Doll (Bowman's Band), who successfully defended her title in last Saturday's GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Sprint before selling to Mandy Pope's Whisper Hill Farm for \$3.1 million at the Keeneland

November Sale Wednesday, will remain in training and will be pointed for the GI Cigar Mile H. at Aqueduct Nov. 30. "When I purchased Groupie Doll, my sole intention was for her to be retired and become a mom," Pope stated.

"However, after spending time with her and speaking with her previous connections, I felt that she may still want to run a few more races. I asked Dr. Larry Bramlage go over her from her nose to her tail and he felt there was no reason for her career to end now. Everyone who has been around Groupie Doll says she is rounding into the best form of her career and I feel the racing public deserves to see superstars run as long as they are happy and 100% sound." While there has been a change in the ownership of the 5-year-old mare, Buff Bradley will continue in the role of trainer. "To insure that Groupie Doll continues to receive the exact same care and attention to which she is accustomed, I have made the decision that Buff Bradley and his team will oversee the remainder of her racing career." Pope added, "It is only right that he continue as her trainer and I am delighted and honored that Buff has agreed to share this exciting time with me." Groupie Doll was beaten by the slimmest of noses in last year's Cigar Mile. As the winner of a Breeders' Cup race, she stands to run for the winner's share of a \$1-million purse. The base prize money for the Cigar Mile is \$500,000.

BOOK 2 CLOSES WITH DOUBLE-DIGIT GAINS

Book 2 at Keeneland November closed out with another round of across-the-board gains yesterday in Lexington, with the session average of \$103,676 up 25.1% and the median of \$85,000 up 21.4%.

That left the cumulative average at \$187,795, up 22.4%, and the cumulative median at \$110,000, up 37.5%

The buy-back rate was once again very solid, registering 19.1% for Friday's session. The cumulative RNA rate is 19.9%.

"Book 2 has been very successful," confirmed Keeneland's Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell. "Both days were very equal. There was quality both days and the market reacted to it."

Of the sparkling buy-back rate, Russell added, "There is confidence in the market, from both buyers and sellers."

Friday's session was topped by the dam of the recent GI Breeders' Cup Sprint winner Secret Circle (Eddington). **Ragtime Hope** (Dixieland Band), an 11-year-old mare selling in foal to Arch, was hammered down to Stonestreet Thoroughbred Holdings for \$675,000. 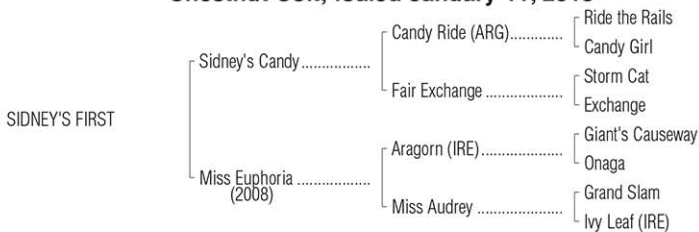

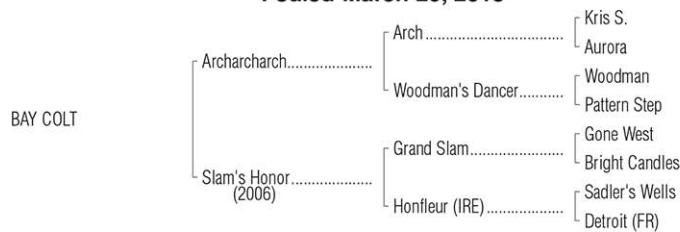

Stonestreet also landed the day's second-highest-priced horse, the \$460,000 **Revel in the Win** (Red Bullet), another mare with another nice update. Consigned by Elm Tree Farm as [hip 844](#), she is the dam of GIII Bourbon S. winner Poker Play (Harlan's Holiday) and sold in foal to that one's late sire.

The weanling market continued to be exceptionally strong at November. On the day, no fewer than 37 weanlings brought six figures. Three brought \$300,000 or more, another trio brought \$200,000 or more. The top-priced weanling Friday was a \$325,000 colt by Lemon Drop Kid--Forest Valentine who sold to Woods Edge Stable for \$325,000. Indian Creek consigned the colt as [hip 1103](#).

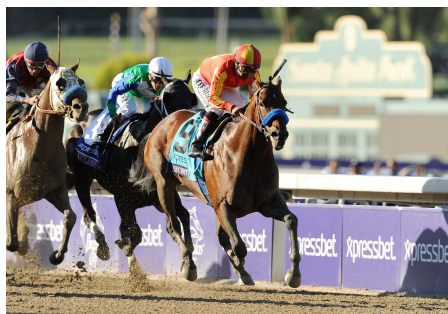
"I thought the foal market today was as strong, if not stronger, than the first day," Russell said. "If you led an exceptional foal up there, they gave you premium money. The competition for these horses is exceptional."

"And there is competition on the mares, too," Russell continued. "It is great to see with the mares people are back into long-term investment. That is what this market needs and it is back. People are looking forward to having foals and then selling them on. It's a good thing."

The Keeneland November sale continues today at 10 a.m. and runs through next Thursday.

Secret Circle Has Ragtime Hope in Demand..

After a lively bidding exchange, Stonestreet's John Moynihan signed for **Ragtime Hope** (Dixieland Band)--the dam of recent GI Breeders' Cup Sprint winner Secret Circle (Eddington)--at a session-topping \$675,000 during Friday's fourth session of the Keeneland November sale. The 11-year-old mare ([hip 835](#)) sold in foal to Arch and was consigned by Indian Creek.

she's going to be the dam of a champion and she's a nice addition to our broodmare band," Moynihan said.

Tom Ryan of SF Bloodstock and Eaton's Reiley McDonald were underbidders on the mare.

Secret Circle, winner of last year's GIII Southwest S. and GII Rebel S., was sidelined after a runner-up effort in the GI Arkansas Derby. He has made only two starts this term, but made them count, winning a six-furlong allowance in 1:07 4/5 before his victory in the Sprint.

Indian Creek's Shack Parrish acknowledged the Sprint victory made a big difference in the mare's price Friday.

"He was phenomenal that day," Parrish said of Secret Circle's Breeders' Cup performance. "I really can't say how much it affected the price, but I am sure it increased it substantially."

Ragtime Hope was purchased by Thomas Willmott for \$50,000 as a Keeneland September yearling in 2003 and the stakes winner raced under the Waterfall Stables banner of Willmott and his brother Peter Willmott. Peter Willmott also campaigned Grade I winner Eddington. Secret Circle was the second of four foals Ragtime Hope produced by Eddington before she was bred to Arch this year.

"The owner bred to Eddington because he owned both sides," Parrish said. "Going to a different sire line probably helped [the mare's price]--Arch is an incredible sire."

Willmott boards his mares at the Lavin family's Longfield Farm near Goshen, and the farm's general manager Allan Lavin admitted Friday that there had been some thought to selling Ragtime Hope last year.

"[Willmott] thought about selling her last year, but we thought Secret Circle had more to do," Lavin explained. "We were kind of waiting on Secret Circle, so it worked out well."

The mare's final price was about what Lavin expected.

"She is in foal to the right horse, it's a good mating and I think a lot of people were really impressed by Secret Circle," he said. "I think horsemen can really appreciate what he did and what he accomplished."

Pauleeanna Looking to Grow Broodmare Band...

Devon Strickland, sitting alongside bloodstock agent Chris Brothers, added **Seaside Escape** (Bernardini) ([hip 866](#)) to her family's growing broodmare band at Pauleeanna Thoroughbreds with a final bid of \$330,000.

The 4-year-old Seaside Escape sold in foal to GI Breeders' Cup Classic winner Blame and was consigned by Robert Courtney, Jr., who purchased the mare for \$90,000 at last year's November sale. She is out of graded stakes winner Promenade Girl (Carson City).

"She is a classy mare, she comes from a live family right now," Brothers said. "In the yearling market, trying to buy Blames was very hard. We just liked the mare all around, we liked the depth of the family and there is just a lot of action going on."

Of the price tag, Brothers added, "It was a little higher than we thought, but that is the way the market is right now."

Seaside Escape was Pauleeanna's second purchase at the Keeneland November sale. The farm also purchased **Stormy Tak** (Stormy Atlantic) ([hip 505](#)) for \$250,000 during Thursday's session of the auction.

Pauleeanna is based in Micanopy, Florida.

"We've been in business about a year now," Strickland, who previously served as resident veterinarian at Adena Springs South, explained. "We are breeding to sell and we have five broodmares so far."

Strickland operates Pauleeanna along with her father, Mike Wickham and her brother Mike, Jr.

"I've been involved with racing for a long time, but the farm has been a family dream of ours," Strickland said.

At last year's November sale, Pauleeanna purchased three mares: Groundswell (Forest Wildcat); Imagine (Giant's Causeway); and Shop for Gold (Speightstown).

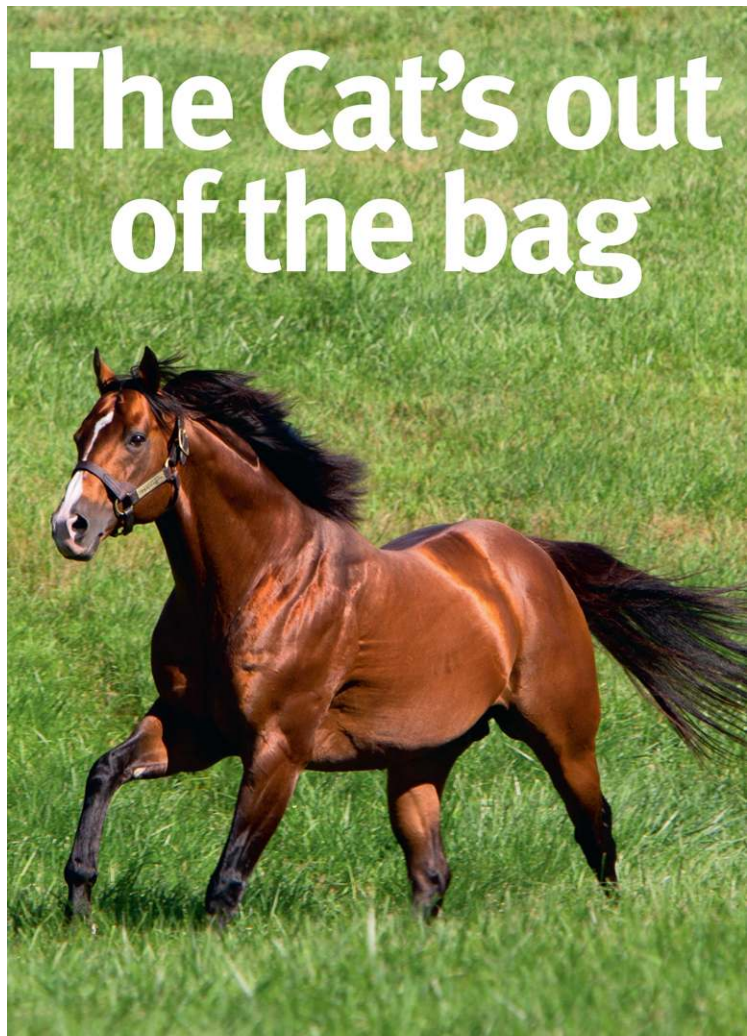
"We just bought a second farm, so we can probably go to 12 to 15 broodmares," Strickland added.

Courtney Enjoys Banner Week...

Robert Courtney, Jr. purchased **Seaside Escape** (Bernardini) for \$90,000 at last year's Keeneland November sale--an auction which saw the mare's dam, Promenade Girl (Carson City), sell for \$335,000 and her weanling half-sister by Bernardini bring \$360,000.

Courtney reoffered Seaside Escape Friday at Keeneland and the mare, now in foal to Blame, sold for \$330,000.

"She was a lovely mare then and mares were a little bit cheaper," Courtney explained. "She was the only filly that I bought last year that wasn't a black-type filly, but I thought there was a lot of upside in that pedigree and it got better. If horses come running under Promenade Girl, that mare could be worth a fortune."



Discreet Cat was such an exceptional racing talent, it now seems blindingly obvious that he would, in turn, sire exceptional racing talents. **G1 horses in each of his first three crops: his early successes have ensured big quality books of mares in 2012 and 2013.**

Courtney, the grandson of Keeneland co-founder W. H. Courtney, operated Crestfield Farm along with his father Robert Courtney, Sr. for three decades. He now owns the 200-acre Stonebridge Farm near Lexington and focuses on buying young mares.

“I have been trying to buy these fillies off the track,” Courtney explained. “The plan is to buy the mares, put stud fees in them and re-sell them.”

Courtney purchased **Maid of Heaven** (Empire Maker) for \$200,000 at last year’s Keeneland November sale, put the mare in foal to GI Belmont S. winner Union Rags and sold her at the Fasig-Tipton November sale for \$400,000 Monday.

Courtney also sold a weanling filly by Discreet Cat for \$87,000 at Keeneland Friday. The youngster ([hip 822](#)) was out of Pray for Grace (Songandaprayer), a \$36,000 purchase out of the 2012 Keeneland January sale. Pray for Grace, with this filly in utero, RNA’d for \$30,000 at last year’s November sale.

“I’ve only put three horses through the ring so far,” Courtney said. “I’ve put two mares and a baby through and we’ve already grossed out over \$800,000. You’ve got to do it in this game; you’ve got to have a lick every now and then and it doesn’t happen every year.”

Courtney looks to buy about five mares a year, but he admitted he was finding it harder to buy at this year’s November sale.

“These mares are tough to buy in here,” he said. “I’ll probably have to wait until [Keeneland] January. Or maybe go over for the [Tattersalls] December sales. I’ve been lucky over there, too, buying fillies. It’s just the guineas to the dollar is a little bit not our way right now.”

Courtney, an Army veteran, said he can’t imagine not being involved in the racing game.

“I’ve been lucky to have raised a lot of really good horses,” he said. “My dad and I raised five champions and over 100 stakes winners. The only two things I’ve done in my life, I was a soldier when I was a young man, 42 years ago, and I’m in the horse business.”



To cap it all...

Five-D Sells Weanling Half to 'Kat' for \$300,000...

The Dobozi family's Five-D Thoroughbreds bred and was the majority owner of the very good **Kathmanblu** (Bluegrass Cat), and yesterday sold an Awesome Again weanling half-brother to the Grade II winner for \$300,000. That was the joint second-highest price paid for a weanling Friday. Produced by the MSP Abba Gold (Devil's Bag), the colt was consigned by Brookdale Sales as [hip 971](#) and was purchased by Ben Glass, agent for Gary and Mary West.

"He's real athletic and showed himself real well out here," said Brookdale's Joe Seitz. "He was energetic and professional, and coming off his sister selling for \$600,000 at Fasig-Tipton four nights ago, there's a good buzz about the family. He just came to life out here, and his sire's on fire--he's having a heckuva year--and it was just a perfect storm of good things."

The colt became the highest-price Awesome Again weanling to sell at public auction since two from the Adena sire's first crop brought \$500,000 and \$310,000, respectively, back in 2000.

"I knew he'd sell well, but that would have been the top end of what I thought," said Seitz. "It was a very good sale."

Five-D Thoroughbreds purchased the colt's dam Abba Gold for \$35,000 as a juvenile-in-training in 2000. Kathmanblu, her second foal, was bought back for \$57,000 as a KEESEP yearling in 2009 and went on to earn nearly \$585,000 for Five-D and partner Wind River Stable. Her wins included the 2010 GII Golden Rod S.

Kathmanblu was offered as a racing or broodmare prospect at the 2012 Keeneland November Sale, but was bought back for \$475,000. Sold privately thereafter to Glencrest, she was put in foal to Smart Strike and sold earlier this week to Shadai Farm for \$600,000.

West's Nab AA Colt; Glass Mulls 2yo Champ Race...

End-users Gary and Mary West and stable manager Ben Glass have actively participated in the weanling market for years, and their 2013 results on the track show why. Their Grade II-winning sophomore **Flashback** (Tapit) was a \$260,000 KEENOV weanling in 2010, while Grade III winner **Poker Player** (Harlan's Holiday) was bought here for \$120,000 in 2011.

Glass has purchased at least six weanlings at Keeneland November, including yesterday's co-second-highest-priced weanling, the \$300,000 Awesome Again--Abba Gold half-brother to Kathmanblu from Brookdale Sales.

"We knew he was going to bring some money, and Mr. West told me to step up and get him," said Glass. "He's a half to a Grade II [winner] and looked the part. We'll send him over to Dell Ridge and let Dez Ryan [farm manager] grow him up, then send him down to Jeff Kirk in Ocala and break him. Then we'll put him in the racing stable, and, hopefully, he'll be one of the ones who can run."

Glass purchased three horses yesterday, all weanling colts, all by Awesome Again. He also secured a youngster out of Dream Delight ([hip 1069](#)) who made \$190,000; and a son of MGSW French Park ([hip 1110](#)) for \$150,000.

"We hate to let that market get by us--we always try to have a little play in the weanling market," said Glass.

"We're a little more selective here, a little more picky. If there's a question mark, Mr. West would rather pay a little more for them later on and make sure they've come the right way."

One West star who didn't come by way of the weanling sales was the recent GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile S. hero **New Year's Day** (Street Cry {Ire}), who in just his third career start rallied up the rail to defeat Havana (Dunkirk). New Year's Day was a \$425,000 KEESEP purchase.

Glass said the colt exited the Juvenile in good shape, but that no plans had been made. "It's up to [trainer] Bob Baffert--he's the captain of the ship," said Glass. "He came off the longest layoff of any Breeders' Cup Juvenile winner in the 30-year history of the race. He hadn't run in 61 days. So I'm sure it took a little out of him, with a performance like that. However, they say he's bucking and kicking and playing, and that he came out of it really well. But I'm sure Bob will let him catch his breath."

New Year's Day appears to be in the driver's seat for an Eclipse Award as champion juvenile, but Juvenile runner-up Havana, winner of the GI Champagne S., could draw support, as well. Baffert has had great success in the GI CashCall Futurity, a Hollywood Park centerpiece each December, and a win there would seal the deal for New Year's Day. For Glass, however, the matter was settled on Breeders' Cup day.

"We missed the FrontRunner [at Santa Anita Sept. 28] with a temperature, which was a shame," said Glass. "But he won the Breeders' Cup Juvenile handily, and if the writers can't see he beat the best on the day he's supposed to, then naughty on them. To me, I think he's got to be the 2-year-old champion."

Haynesfield Colt Brings \$300k...

A colt from the first crop of GI Jockey Club Gold Cup winner **Haynesfield** (Speightstown) was one of the top-priced weanlings yesterday after selling to Becky Thomas for \$300,000. Bred by Brereton Jones and consigned by his Airdrie Stud as [hip 1130](#), the colt was produced by High in the Park (Ascot Knight) and is thus a half to the GI Met Mile winner Divine Park (Chester House), who stands at Airdrie.

Jones purchased High in the Park, then 14, for \$205,000 at the 2008 Fasig-Tipton November Sale, and has done well with her. He sold the foal she was carrying, a filly by Medaglia d'Oro, as a yearling for \$350,000 at the 2010 FTKJUL sale, a few months before selling an Indian Charlie weanling colt from the mare for \$200,000 at KEENOV.

"We're obviously thrilled with the result, but it's a horse we expected to sell well," Airdrie's Bret Jones, Brereton's son, said yesterday. "He's typical of what we're seeing from the Haynesfield foals--he's very well-balanced, very strong--and having supported Haynesfield with some of our very best mares, we've seen quite a few of his foals. Breeding a mare that has already thrown a Grade I winner to a freshman stallion is maybe not the norm, but we really believe in him and want to give him the best shot possible."

Airdrie went four-for-four on the day selling its weanlings. It also sold a homebred weanling filly from the second crop of resident stallion Majesticperfection (Harlan's Holiday) ([hip 1171](#)) to Peter O'Callaghan for \$160,000.

"She was a really special filly," said Jones.

Jones added of the weanling market, "It's very strong. I see a lot of consignors giving each other high fives, and that's a great thing."

Thomas, who also landed an Arch--Aristra (Afleet Alex) weanling colt for \$260,000 yesterday, said she bought the Haynesfield for an undisclosed end user.

"I loved him--*loved* him," Thomas said. "He had a great walk, was very good looking, and we're very happy to support Airdrie. Haynesfield was a true New Yorker; he was based in New York, and I thought he might end up there [as a sire]. But Mr. Jones has supported the New York program by foaling some mares there, and I have a New York-bred by him. It's just a good fit." Thomas operates Sequel Stallions in upstate New York.

Visit Proves Profitable for Jones...

Russell Jones, who co-founded the Walnut Green bloodstock agency, is always on the lookout for young mares to buy with an eye towards reselling and the horseman enjoyed success late in Friday's session of the Keeneland November sale. Jones purchased **Midnight Visit** (Henny Hughes) for \$80,000 at last year's November sale. He put the 5-year-old mare in foal to GI Belmont S. winner Union Rags and looked on as she sold for \$220,000 to Grousemont Farm.

"I bought her just to breed to Union Rags," Jones said after buying consignor Noel Murphy of Castle Park Farm a congratulatory beer at the Keeneland bar.

Midnight Visit ([hip 1188](#)) won the Love is Eternal S. at Aqueduct in 2011 and was third in two other stakes races. She is a half-sister to graded stakes placed Wild Chick (Forest Wildcat).

Asked what he liked about the filly, Jones said, "Physically she was a very appealing mare and she had a good race record, she was a stakes winner in New York and she came from a good family. All the pieces were there that I look for in young mares. I love to buy mares right off the track."

Of the price tag, he added, "That was about where I thought it would be. I was thinking somewhere between \$175,000 to \$225,000. So we were at the upper end of the range, but I would have taken more."

Jones founded Walnut Green with his late brother Richard in 1980. He sold the agency to Mark Reid in 2005.

"I buy five or six mares a year, fillies off the racetrack, to breed and resell next year," Jones explained. "I've already bought three so far this year."

Jones did admit he was finding the market more competitive this year.

"I'm having to pay more than I did last year," he said. "Last year was the last really good year of being able to buy them. This year is much tougher."

JAPANESE PREVIEWS

WHO WILL BE THE QUEEN OF KYOTO?

Tomorrow's G1 Queen Elizabeth II Cup at Kyoto marks the first major clash of sophomore fillies against older mares in Japan. The 3-year-old brigade, which benefits from a four-pound weight break, is headed by **Meisho Mambo (Jpn)** (Suzuka Mambo {Jpn}), dual

Classic winner of the G1 Yushun Himba (Japanese Oaks) May 19 and G1 Shuka Sho Oct. 13. While Meisho Mambo has proven to be the best of her generation, she faces a tall task, and must buck a trend that has seen just one winner of this race in

the past decade come into the race off a victory. "Even among 3-year-olds, a horse aiming for the Queen Elizabeth [II Cup] clearly has an advantage over a horse who went all out for the Shuka Sho," Meisho Mambo's trainer Akihiro Iida commented. "But [Meisho] Mambo's got heart; she's one tough horse." Another sophomore that has flashed considerable talent is **Denim and Ruby (Jpn)** (Deep Impact {Jpn}), who checked in third in the Oaks and fourth in the Shuka Sho, which bookended a score in the G2 Sho Rose S. Sept. 15. Typically slow out of the gate in the Shuka Sho, Demin and Ruby found herself shuffled too far back on the short run into the first turn and could only manage fourth, but could benefit from the longer run into the first turn here.

Lachesis (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}) is short on experience but certainly not on ability. The 3-year-old bay comes into this contest off back-to-back allowance victories at the distance, the most recent an eye-catching score over this track on the Shuka Sho undercard. The older generation is also well represented, with the likes of **Verxina (Jpn)** (Deep Impact {Jpn}) and **Whale Capture (Jpn)** (Kurofune) set to line up. Second here last year, Verxina cracked a streak of five straight runner-up efforts--five at the top level--with a victory over Whale Capture in the G1 Victoria Mile May 12. She could manage only eighth in the G2 Kyoto Daishoten Oct. 6 off a layoff, but is known to improve second up. Whale Capture, winner of the G2 Fuchu Himba S. at Tokyo Oct. 14, looks for her first win at the distance, but a pair of third-place efforts in the Oaks and Shuka Sho of 2011 indicate she is capable of seeing out 2200 meters.

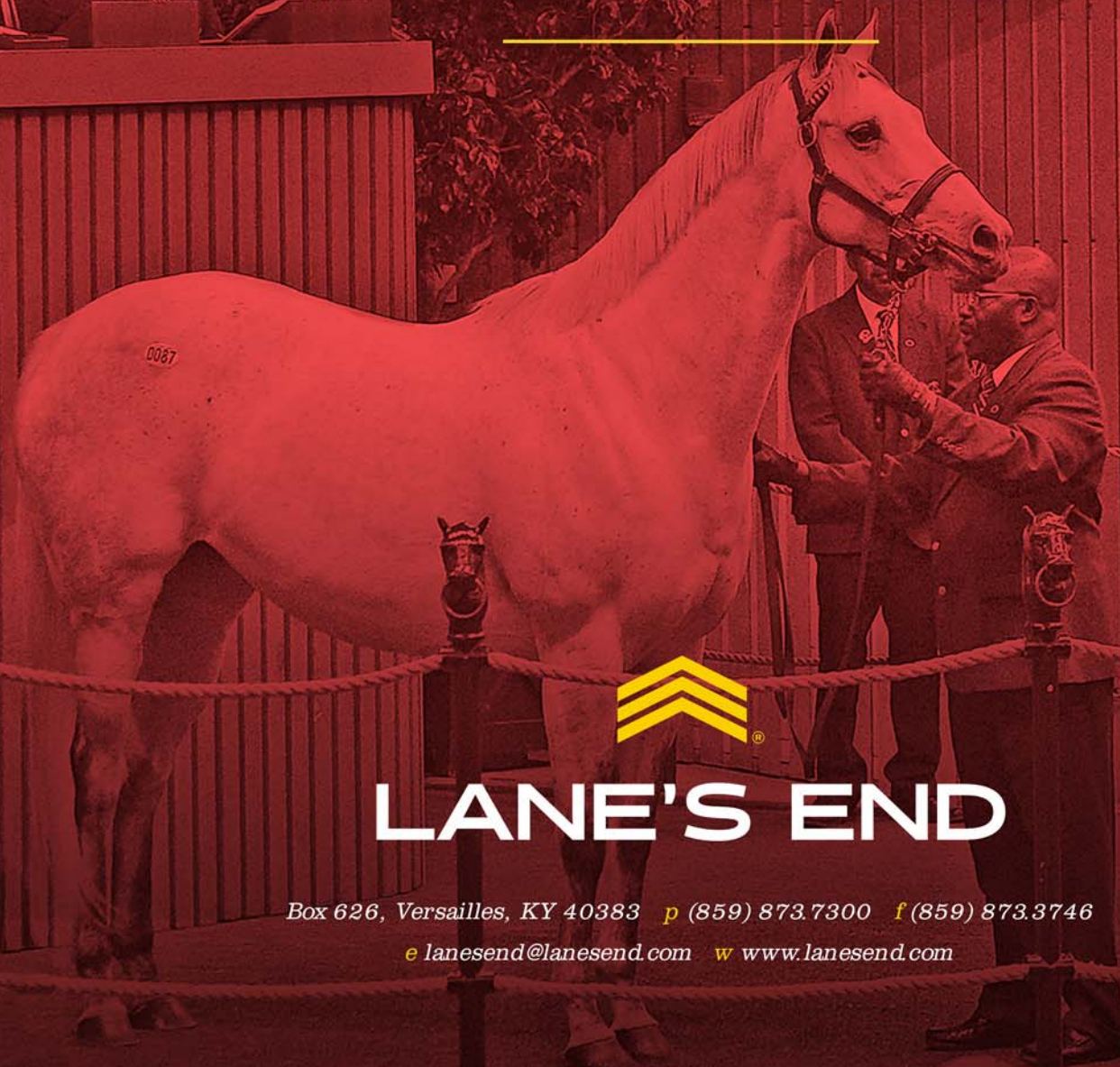

RACETRACK ROUND-UP

McPeek is Fully Loaded for Churchill Fall Stakes...

Conditioner Ken McPeek is coming into the Churchill Downs' fall stakes with an all-star line up that includes two Breeders' Cup placed horses.

Rosalind (Broken Vow), a close third in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, is a possibility for the GII Golden Rod S. at Churchill Nov. 30. The GI Hollywood Starlet S. at Betfair Hollywood Park Dec. 7 is a possibility as well. The debut winner was third in the GII Pochontas S. and second in the GI Darley Alcibiades S. coming into the Breeders' Cup.

"We still think that the juvenile filly [championship] might be wide open," McPeek said. "We think that if enough good ones hook up in the Starlet, there's a chance that the winner of that race could be the champion."

Golden Ticket (Speightstown), runner up to Goldcents (Into Mischief) in the GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile, could face that rival again in the GI Cigar Mile at Aqueduct Nov. 30.

"It's not definite, but that's where we're leaning," McPeek said. "We think he's really good at a mile and if all goes smoothly, we'll head that way."

McPeek named Churchill's GI Clark H. Nov. 29 as another possibility for the dead heat winner of last year's GI Travers S.

"We would like another Grade I for him," McPeek said. "But we're not ruling out the race here. We'll nominate him."

McPeek's other stakes contenders include: GIII Virginia Oaks runner-up **Praia** (Distorted Humor) for the GII Mrs. Revere S. Nov. 16; GII Virginia Derby hero **War Dancer** (War Front) and **Frac Daddy** (Scat Daddy) in the GIII Commonwealth Turf S. Nov. 16; **Flashy American** (Flashy Bull) in the GII Falls City H. Nov. 28; **Streethomealabama** (Street Sense) in the Golden Rod, and **Arctic Slope** (Van Nistelrooy) in the GII Kentucky Jockey Club S.

MCCOY HIT HISTORIC MILESTONE

Jumps jockey AP McCoy yesterday became the first rider of that discipline to ride 4,000 winners when he piloted the JP McManus-owned and Jonjo O'Neill-trained Mountain Tunes (Concorde's Tune) to victory at Towchester. McCoy's win tally puts him well clear of the next winningest rider, Richard Johnson with 2,567. The 39-year-old McCoy, who has been Britain's champion jumps jockey 18 times, said he was pleased to achieve the feat for McManus and O'Neill, his longtime friends and supporters. "To do it for Jonjo and the McManus's is brilliant, as they've been so good to me," McCoy told *BBC*. "It was always, hopefully, going to be in JP's colors. I've had the same agent, Dave Roberts, from day one, and his dad sadly passed away yesterday so I'd like to dedicate this to him." McManus paid tribute to McCoy, saying: "What a man and what a ride. I think he was more pleased because when he came in he said it was a nice horse! That ride sums him up. I remember when he first came to the UK. Christy Roche brought him to my attention and he said, 'You know this AP, he's getting seven pounds and he should be giving weight away.' Little did we think that day that he'd ride 4,000 winners, but full marks to him, he's dedicated to the game and he's a pleasure to have around. Every day you deal with him is a joy."

IS IT TIME TO RENEW SCHOLARSHIP IN AMERICAN RACING? by Barry Irwin

When I worked at *The Blood-Horse* in the winter of 1970, I remember how excited everybody was about publication of the Experimental Free Handicap. When I edited *The Thoroughbred of California* in the early 1970s, I remember how excited we were to see how the California-based and -bred juvenile would be treated in the weights.

Back in those historic days, breeders hoped like hell that fillies bred and raced by them would get any weight assignment, even if it was down in the 106-pound level, because in that era, having a filly that got weighted meant something for a future broodmare. Broodmare bands were built on such ratings by successful breeders.

In late January, when the panel charged with producing the Experimental Free Handicap for next season reveals its weights, the number of professional horsemen and women that give any sort of hoot at all wouldn't be enough to start a game of Texas Hold 'Em.

There are a few reasons for the decline in import of the Experimental Free Handicap and the apathy with which it is received by the racing and breeding public.

The main reason, which not so coincidentally is the same reason that *The Blood-Horse* no longer produces its year-end Free Handicaps, is that those whose responsibility it has been to create the weights have demonstrated an annoying lack of interest in generating the scholarship and work necessary to bring meaning to the task at hand.

This is especially true of *The Blood-Horse* weights, which were produced by some of the greatest minds the game has ever known, as best exemplified by F. E. (Jimmy) Kilroe. Doing the weights took time and thought and dedication. When the task fell upon the shoulders of the next generation, it was allowed to lapse into oblivion, thereby robbing the racing and breeding industry of one of two sources for classifying the best older racehorses to compete in North America on an annual basis.

The Experimental Free Handicap is still produced, but political correctness, lack of scholarship and lack of interest on the part of those hired to generate the weights has sapped the list of its vigor and importance.

In the old days, just a few years after the Gutenberg Bible was produced, professionals and fans alike would eagerly await publication of the weights, in some cases just to see what lightly raced juvenile had caught the eye of the handicapper. The weights back then generated a lot of Triple Crown buzz.

Nowadays, given the restrictions placed on the exercise, horses that do not make their mark in a stakes race are never seen on the Experimental Free Handicap. The list is now made of horses that ran at least fourth in a graded or listed stakes race, one suspects because these horses are easier to locate and identify. It would take work to find and evaluate the diamonds in the rough.

What once was a great pursuit to uncover and reveal future nuggets of greatness has now turned into a boring recitation of the obvious.

Kilroe's Free Handicaps and *Daily Racing Form's* similar lists for many years complimented the exercise of classifying horses for the American racing industry and concentrated on the older runners, while the Experimental Free Handicap concerned itself with 2-year-old males and females.

I remember pestering the handicapper responsible for *The Blood-Horse* Free Handicap about when he was going to send his ratings to the editor, because I wanted to find out where horses of mine in the 1980s stood on the list compared to others runners in North America. I wanted confirmation that horses of mine such as Prized and Political Ambition compared favorably with other 3-year-old grass horses.

The great thing about Kilroe doing the weights is that even though he grew up on the East Coast and was the racing secretary for the New York Racing Association, he was not a homer and he endeavored to do the best job he could in evaluating North America's best runners.

Kilroe was a man of great integrity and, like *The Blood-Horse* editor Joe Estes, a man nobody ever accused of sucking up to an owner by giving a runner of his a better rating. Their like was rarer than a Triple Crown winner.

Today, with *The Blood-Horse* Free Handicap long gone, with the Racing Manual a shadow of its former self, with the old Racehorses of Such and Such a Year long gone, North American racing must rely solely on the anemic and tired Experimental Free Handicap as its only attempt at meaningful weights.

North America, you must realize, may be the only racing jurisdiction in which there is no system for the publication of ratings and weights to classify its best horses.

I race all over the world and have done so

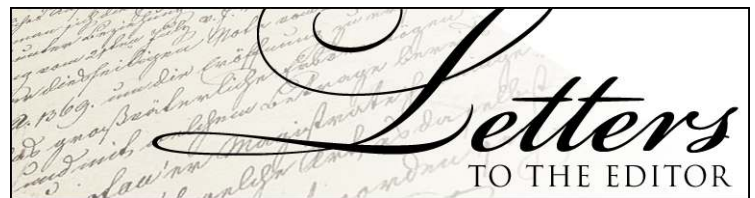
for several decades. I am not alone in this, as several other Americans annually race horses abroad. We that do realize the level of scholarship that is applied by the Jockey Clubs of other nations in rating horses for the benefit of breeders, trainers, horseplayers, the media and racing fans. English and Irish racing is in the main virtually totally dependent on ratings from its racing authorities.

While European countries produce full sets of international ratings and local ratings, we in the good old United States of John Wayne must be content with Mike Watchmaker's top 10 in various categories as published once a week in *Daily Racing Form*. No knock against Mike, but how can one compare this with what Kilroe used to generate?

People like me now rely on speed figures generated by the likes of Jerry Brown, Len Friedman and Andy Beyer to classify horses. Timeform has entered the arena, but so far their numbers are inconsistent and hard to relate to for Americans.

Americans are entitled to have their horses classified. It is the responsibility of The Jockey Club and its affiliates and the Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association to hire the right people to produce a full and comprehensive list of weights/ratings for the North American Thoroughbred population.

Right now, as part of the International Federation of Horseracing, weights for the very, very best American-based horses are generated. But that is the tip of the iceberg. We need and crave more than that. And we deserve an Experimental Free Handicap that is done without any guidelines and preconditions. We need an Experimental Free Handicap that looks at the most talented runners, regardless of whether they made their mark in stakes company. That is where scholarship must be applied.

In commemoration of the 40th anniversary of Secretariat's retirement parade at Aqueduct Racetrack, The New York Racing Association, Inc. (NYRA) has released "[The Secretariat Collection](#)," a YouTube playlist with all 15 starts the renowned colt made in New York.

In addition, on Saturday NYRA will give away Secretariat posters (while supplies last) to the first 1,000 guests who enter Aqueduct near the clubhouse escalator.

During his stellar career, Secretariat won 16 of 21 starts, including a sweep of the Triple Crown. His most memorable performance came in the [1973 Belmont S.](#), which he won by 31 lengths in 2:24 for 1 1/2 miles, records that still stand.

Secretariat, trained by Lucien Laurin for Meadow Stable, made 15 starts at NYRA's tracks, winning 10 times, including the [Sanford](#), [Hopeful](#), [Futurity](#), [Bay Shore](#), [Gotham](#), [Marlboro Cup Invitational H.](#) and [Man o' War](#).

The video collection also includes Secretariat's [debut loss](#), his disqualification in the [Champagne](#), his disappointing third-place finish in the [Wood Memorial](#) and his defeats at the hands of a pair of horses trained by H. Allen Jerkens in the [Whitney H.](#) (won by Onion) and the [Woodward](#) (won by Prove Out).

In his final New York start, Secretariat won the 1973 Grade 1 Man o' War, his turf debut, by five lengths. He competed once more, taking the Grade 2 Canadian International, and returned to New York for formal retirement ceremony on November 6, 1973 at Aqueduct.

The collection also features a [special installment of "History of the Game"](#), a series hosted by Richard Migliore, that focuses on the retirement ceremony and includes rare footage.

Secretariat was inducted into the Hall of Fame in 1974 and stood at Claiborne Farm in Kentucky until his death in 1989 at the age of 19.

New Pool for Kentucky Derby Future Wager:

Edited Press Release

For the first time, Churchill Downs will add a fourth pool to its popular Kentucky Derby Future Wager and it will coincide with closing week of the racetrack's 25-day Fall Meet Nov. 27 through Nov. 30.

The dates for the four Kentucky Derby Future Wager pools are:

Pool 1: Wed., Nov. 27-Sat., Nov. 30

Pool 2: Thurs., Feb. 6-Sat., Feb. 8

Pool 3: Thurs., Feb. 27-Sat., Mar. 1

Pool 4: Thurs., Mar. 27-Sat., Mar. 29

The date for the only Kentucky Oaks Future Wager pool is:

Pool 1: Thurs., Feb. 27-Sat., March 1

The fields for the four Kentucky Derby Future Wager pools and the single Kentucky Oaks Future Wager pool will be selected by a panel of racing officials and journalists. Individual horses included in Pool 1 will be announced Nov. 25.

Thoroughbreds in the pool regardless of whether those horses have been nominated to the Kentucky Derby, the Triple Crown or the Kentucky Oaks.

Both wagers offer \$2-minimum win betting and exacta wagering, which is available in the form of \$2 minimum straight exacta bets or \$1-minimum exacta boxes and part-wheels. No scratches or betting refunds are permitted in either wager, but wagering on a Derby or Oaks Future Wager horse will be suspended immediately if Churchill Downs determines that injury, illness or other circumstance revealed during a pool would prevent a horse from competing in their respective race.

"Our intent is to present pools that are more true to the future wager concept," said John Asher, Churchill Downs' Vice President of Racing Communications. "Two years ago, we made adjustments to our schedule. Rather than offer pools concurrent with major prep races, we moved them to a week or two in advance of those races and we saw increases in betting."
