



CO-SESSION TOPPERS AT KEENOV

One broodmare and a racing or stallion prospect topped the day of trade at Keeneland November Monday, each bringing \$200,000 during another session that showed strong year-over-year improvements. A total of 304 horses sold for a gross of \$8,960,100, good for an average of \$29,474, up 43% from last year. The median of \$24,500 saw rise of 44% since last term, while the buyback rate was a low 11.98%. **Bella Felicita** (El Prado {Ire}), in foal to Macho Uno, was the highest-priced mare of the session. Consigned by Adena Springs as [hip 2218](#), she was purchased by Preferred Equine, agent for Lindy Farms. The 5-year-old horse **Worldly** (A.P. Indy), who was a recent third in the GII Breeders' Cup Marathon, was purchased by Xavier International Bloodstock. Consigned by St. George Sales, [hip 2423](#) is out of MGISW Urbane (Citidancer) and is a full-brother to Suave, a MGSW millionaire. The highest-priced weanling of the day was a colt from the first crop of Eclipse winner Gio Ponti (Tale of the Cat). Consigned by Beau Lane Bloodstock, agent, as [lot 2355](#), the Jan. 11 foals was purchased by JCDW for \$165,000. Adena Springs was the session's leading consignor, with 30 horses selling for \$1,091,700; while El Aventurero Stables was the leading buyer, purchasing five horses for \$267,000. **KEENOV cont. p3**

duty at Juddmonte Farms' Banstead Manor Stud in Newmarket, England. Racing as a homebred for Juddmonte's Prince Khalid Abdullah, Zamindar won the 1996 G3 Prix de Cabourg before placing in the G1 Prix Morny and G1 Prix de la

Salamandre. The full-brother to G1 2000 Guineas winner Zafonic proved to be an even greater success at stud, with additional Classic winners Darjina (Fr) and Zenda (GB), as well as Group 1 winners Coquerelle (Ire) and Timepiece (GB), amongst his more than 50 black-type performers. Zamindar achieved such success while covering small books, resulting in fewer than 700 foals from 13 crops. Simon Mockridge, Stud Manager at Banstead Manor, described Zamindar as "a grand servant, and a pleasure to be around."

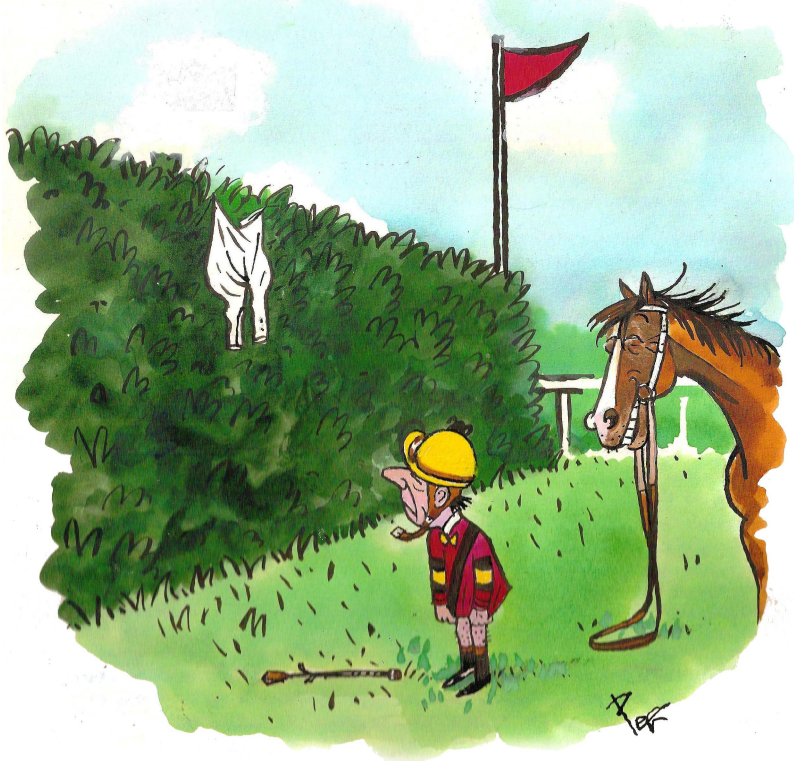

Topping Mare Addition to Young Barn

The session-topping mare Bella Felicita was purchased by Dave Reid of Preferred Equine, agent for Lindy Farm. Lindy Farm, an industry-leading Standardbred farm in Somers Connecticut, expanded their equine reach into the Thoroughbred industry about five years ago. The farm, who has partnerships with Ice Wine Farm, has about twenty horses in training and a "handful of mares," according to Dave Reid. Most of the horses involved with the farm are in training with conditioner Wesley Ward, including No Nay Never (Scat Daddy), who Ice Win Stable owns with Coolmore. The successful 2-year-old won the G1 Prix Morny at Deuville and Royal Ascot's G2 Norfolk S. this season. The successful colt's future is influencing the decisions of Lindy Farm today. "We have a good 2-year-old this year named No Nay Never who won over in Europe," Reid explained modestly. As for the farm's eagerness to buy the \$200,000 mare, he said, "In the back of their mind they're looking for mares to potentially breed to No Nay Never.

"Wesley had Pleasant Price (Indy King) [a GSW & GISP whose second dam, My Marchesa, produced yesterday's co-topper], who was out of this family, and we there was a catalogue update [in Rookie Sensation's recent GII Twilight Derby victory] so I know we over

paid, but she's a young mare, so we figured we'd take a shot. And Wesley liked her as well." Bella Felicita is out of a stakes-winning mare who produced MGSW Mark One (Alphabet Soup), MGSP Golden Corona (Gulch) and the Japanese stakes winner Daiwa Carson (Carson City). She is also a half-sibling to recent GII Twilight Derby winner Rookie Sensation (Unbridled's Song).

As for their further transition into a solid Thoroughbred establishment, Reid commented, "We're looking to acquire mares, but the market is so strong now that it's tough to get into the market. We're still on a learning curve and obviously, it's tough being on a learning curve going into a bullish market."

"The great thing about her is her page, and she has all her conditions--just a nice filly," said WinStar's Elliott Walden.

2556, Zloty, f, 2, Exchange Rate--A. P. Reality, by Pulpit

Consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency, agent for Bradley Thoroughbreds

A registered Florida-bred selling as a racing or broodmare prospect, this filly ran third on debut going two turns on the lawn at Saratoga Aug. 18--a length back of eventual Grade III Kitten Kaboodle (Kitten's Joy)--then came back to graduate for the Chad Brown barn in a similar test at Belmont Oct. 3 ([video](#)). She was sent off favored in the Chelsea Flower S. Oct. 27 and ran a very good third after a five-wide trip ([video](#)). She was produced by the multiple graded performer A. P. Reality. "This filly's 16.1 hands tall, and really looks like one who will mature into an exceptional 3-year-old," said Pete Bradley, whose Bradley Thoroughbreds owns her.

2713, Montana Native, f, 3, Yes It's True--Special American, by Quiet American

This progressive filly won off by 3 1/2 lengths in the Broom Dance S. at Saratoga July 24 ([video](#)). 2788, Commandment, c, 2, Sky Mesa--Heavenly Humor, by Distorted Humor

Consigned by WinStar Racing, agent

From the stakes-winning Heavenly Humor, a durable seven-time winner, this colt was 12 lengths back at the first call in his debut sprinting six panels at Churchill on Saturday, but came with a strong late run to be second, beaten a half length ([video](#)). "He was extremely impressive on Saturday with just one five-eighths breeze under his belt," said WinStar's Elliott Walden. "We rushed him a bit to get him in before the sale, and I think he has a lot of improvement in him."

2797, Doubles Partner, h, 6, Rock Hard Ten--Serena's Sister, by Rahy

Consigned by WinStar Racing, agent

Doubles Partners, selling as a racing or stallion prospect, is a three-time stakes winner of over \$680,000. His victories include graded stakes in 2010 (GIII American Turf), 2011 (GIII Tampa Bay S.) and 2012 (GIII Canadian Turf S.). He had a busy early campaign in 2013 when he finished second in both the Sunshine Millions Turf and the Tampa Bay S., and has been off since winning a Belmont optional claimer June 3 ([video](#)). "He's a beautiful horse who has not been overrated," said WinStar's Elliott Walden. "You see turf horses like him all the time at age seven or eight. Has a lot of class." Doubles Partner was produced by a full to champion Serena's Song.

2807, General Election, c, 3, Harlan's Holiday--Menekineko, by Kingmambo

Consigned by WinStar Racing, agent

General Election, a half-sibling to GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile runner-up Ready's Echo (More Than Ready), has won four of 10 lifetime, including three in stakes company. The \$150,000 OBS March grad, a first-out winner at Churchill on dirt, rallied to win the John Battaglia Memorial S. over Turfway's Poly in early March. He underscored his versatility by taking the GIII Arlington Classic on turf May 25 ([video](#)) and recently doubled up in graded company in the GIII Jefferson Cup S. at Churchill Sept. 28 ([video](#)). "He has been a consistent, tough horse all year," said WinStar's Elliott Walden. "He broke his maiden on dirt, he's a stakes winner on synthetic, and he's a graded winner on turf--he can run on anything."

2812, Hardest Core, c, 3, Hard Spun--Lillybuster, by Housebuster

Consigned by Adena Springs, Agent V

From a half-sister to the champion and good sire Gilded Time (Timeless Moment), this colt hasn't been worse than second in his last five--all on the tough New York circuit. He ran second to Balance the Books (Lemon Drop Kid) in the Stroll S. at the Spa Aug. 14 and, in his latest, closed into slow fractions to win a Belmont optional claimer Oct. 5 ([video](#)).

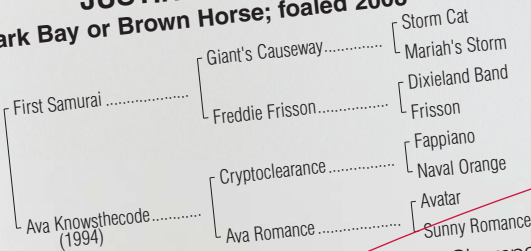

PRICE SURGE

To those of us who have seen the rises and falls in Thoroughbred prices for the last 35 years, the 30% surge in prices at the major North American auctions this year is something we think about in context. Example: it's not just that prices are up, but they are up, at a fairly consistent 30% level, in three major auction trading sectors: yearlings, weanlings (not that surprising, perhaps, given the yearling surge) and--maybe more unexpectedly--broodmares and breeding prospects. Owning broodmares has been a very unpopular pursuit the last few years--a lot of people couldn't get out of them fast enough--but now the tide has very definitely (and very suddenly) turned. It doesn't happen in every case that the Thoroughbred market predicts the general economy, but it has to be, in this case. The money is starting to flow again, and the Thoroughbred market this year is a good example of that.

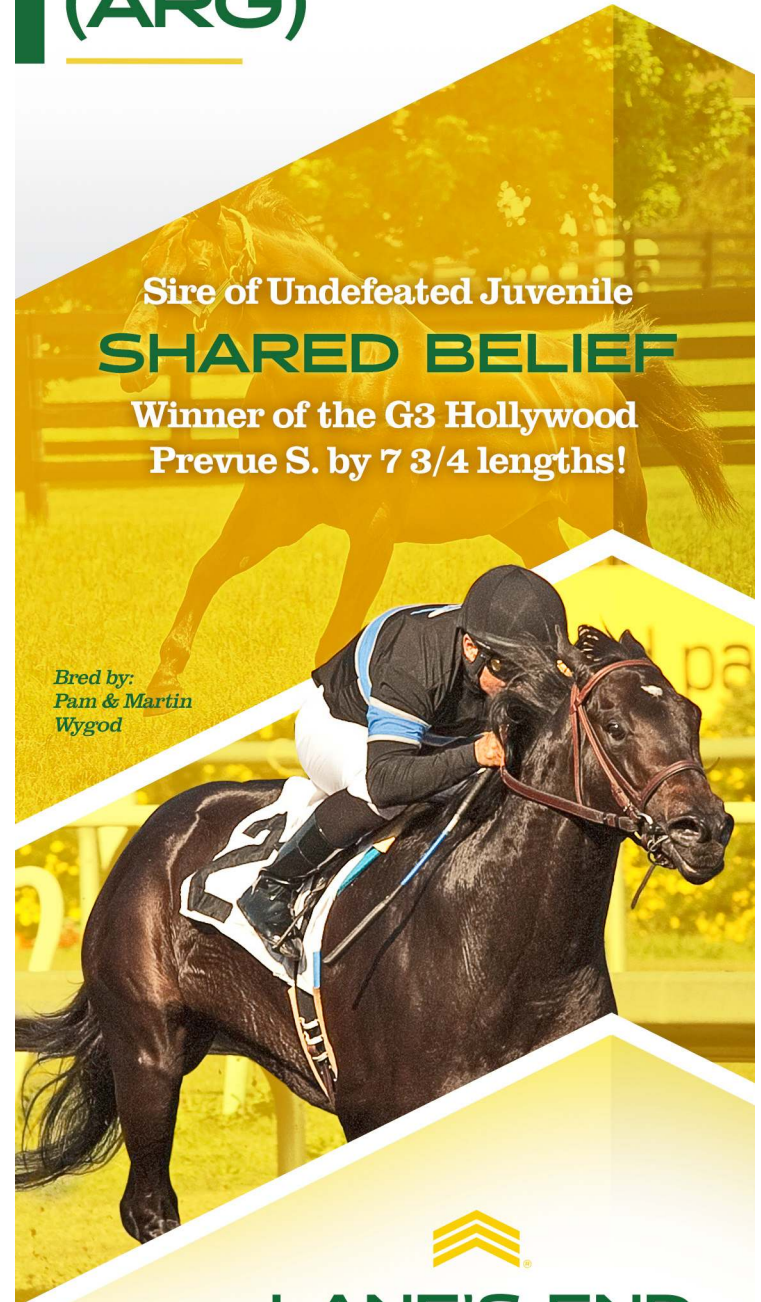
One thing that has never happened in the two great price surges (1978-1983 and 1998-2007) and the two tremendous market crashes (1986-1993 and 2008-2012) is that it has never been a one-year phenomenon. I'm pretty famous for making, with infectious conviction, resounding declarations like "the 2013 sales are the beginning of an upswing that will last at least until 2016." But that is how the market has behaved for the last 35 years. Importantly for breeders, in previous upswings, increases in stud fees have lagged a year behind the rises in auction prices. That appears to be the case again this year; most 2014 stud fees have now been published, and breeders should take note of how few are rising, or if they are, not by very much. No matter what the mares cost you, either this year or before, 2014 is the year to bet that the stud fee you agree to pay will look like a reasonable buy at the 2016 yearling sales. Historical statistics prove that the highest profitability for breeders was achieved around 1998-2000, from stud fees bought in 1996-1998, or just when the upswing out of deep recession began.

It's getting almost fashionable to say 'the rising tide floats all boats,' but it certainly rings true when you look at the prices paid for weanlings, particularly by first-year (F2013) sires, with their first foals selling. As you'll see from the accompanying table, six sires with seven or more foals sold, through the end of Book 3 on Sunday (and including OBS) have averaged over \$60,000. One tip that a sire is throwing good foals is when you see a high multiple of stud fee coupled with a high ratio of median to average. Rhis year, though, five of the top six have high median-to-average ratios, and even the one who doesn't, Airdrie's **Haynesfield** (Speightstown), had one sell for \$300,000. **cont. p9**

That's pretty important, to start with, and he still averaged \$61,500 for his other five sold, with a median for those five of \$52,000 (84% of average). This could well be a very good sire crop, because there are a lot of foals by these sires bringing \$100,000+, but also it must signal that there is a voracious demand for weanlings.

Ashford's **Uncle Mo** (Indian Charlie), as expected, topped F2013 North American sires of weanlings through the end of Book 3, with 15 sold for an average of \$129,800, and a median of \$110,000 (85% of average). Castleton Lyons' **Gio Ponti** (Tale of the Cat) is running a very strong second, with an average of \$120,875 through Sunday, and a median of \$120,000--99% of the average. A winner of more than \$6 million, three Eclipse awards, and runner-up to Zenyatta in the 2009 GI Breeders' Cup Classic and to Goldikova in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile a year later, Gio Ponti is very much a horse Europeans who complain that there is nothing for them to breed to in America need to take a closer look at.

Haynesfield, who's had the highest-priced foal sell of any first-year North American stallion (the \$300,000 colt at Keeneland) was third on average \$95,571). WinStar's **Sidney's Candy** (Candy Ride {Arg}), had 12 average \$93,000, with a \$90,000 median (97% of average); Claiborne's **Trappe Shot** (Tapit) has averaged \$84,769, with an \$80,000 median (94% of average). With a median of eight times his \$10,000 stud fee, Trappe Shot may be the real find of the sale, even given the rising tide; interestingly, in a different market, his sire Tapit recorded similar statistics with his first weanlings in 2006. Completing the sextet with \$60,000+ averages was WinStar's **Drosselmeyer** (Distorted Humor), who has averaged \$65,357, with 21 foals sold through Sunday, of 23 sent through the ring. Those numbers also read well.

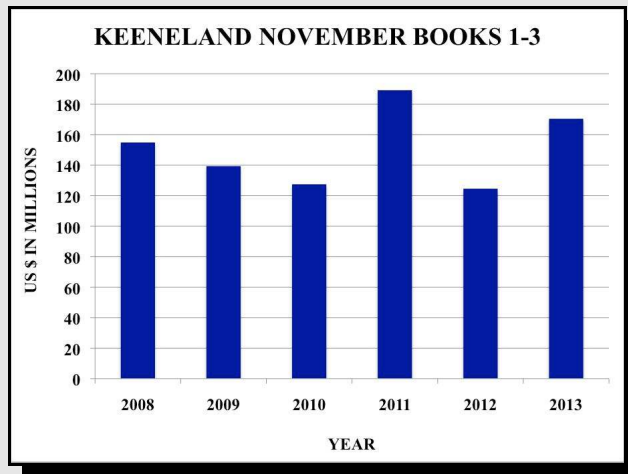

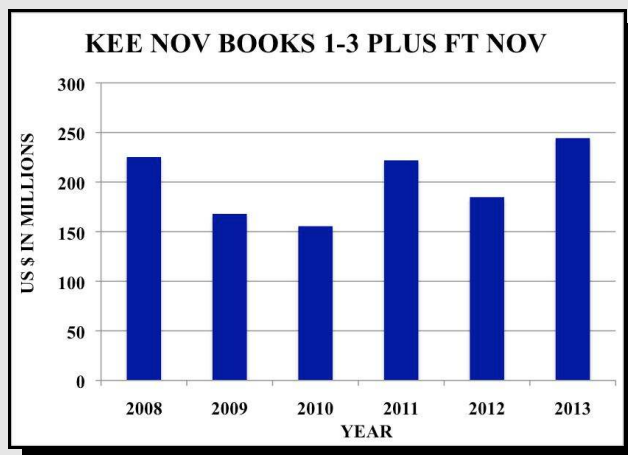


"The 30% surge in prices at the September Sale signaled the Recession is over – not just in the horse business, either – and the results so far at the November sales confirm it. Keeneland's first six days (Books 1-3) are up 37% in gross (\$46m), with a quite remarkable 82.5% sold from those sent through the ring, and over 66% sold of those catalogued. Including Fasig-Tipton, November's first seven days are up 32% in gross (\$60 million) from 2012. More good news for breeders is that stud fees are not rising nearly as fast – for 2014, at least."

Among covering sires, the great **Frankel (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}) is in a class of his own, with his four mares in foal averaging \$1,437,500, and plenty more fireworks to follow at the European mixed sales over the next few weeks. The North American leader is WinStar's **Bodemeister** (Empire Maker), with 16 mares in foal averaging \$255,825. Lane's End's **Union Rags** (Dixie Union) is a clear second, with 10 mares averaging \$202,500. Lane's End's **The Factor** (War Front) looked good with 15 mares averaging \$102,933, just ahead of Ashford's **Stay Thirsty** (Bernardini), who's had 11 average \$101,455. MOVEMENT TO ADOPT UNIFORM RULES CONTINUES TO GAIN SUPPORT *Message from the National Thoroughbred Racing Association*

A nationwide movement to adopt uniform national reforms addressing changes to medication regulation, enforcement and laboratory testing continues to gain support and momentum.

As of Nov. 1, nine states, including the entire mid-Atlantic region, have approved the new medication reforms that are a central component of the reform effort. The states are Delaware, Maryland, Massachusetts, New Jersey, New York, Pennsylvania, Texas, Virginia and West Virginia. The rules are currently under consideration in Arkansas, California, Idaho, Illinois, Indiana, Kentucky, Minnesota, Ohio, New Mexico and Wyoming.

Three laboratories that conduct equine drug testing for six racing jurisdictions have received accreditation from the Racing Medication and Testing Consortium (RMTC) and laboratories conducting testing for 19 other racing states have applied for RMTC accreditation. Laboratories receiving full RMTC accreditation are The University of California-Davis (which tests samples for racehorses in California and New Mexico) and HSL Sports Science (which conducts testing for Kentucky, Maine and Virginia).

The Ohio Department of Agriculture has been granted interim accreditation by the RMTC, with only a site inspection remaining before it receives a full accreditation designation.

Industrial Laboratories (which conducts testing for Arizona, Colorado, Minnesota, North Dakota, Oklahoma and Wyoming), Truesdail Laboratories (Arkansas, Idaho, Indiana, Massachusetts, Nebraska, New Jersey, Oregon and Washington), Dalare Associates (Delaware and West Virginia), New York Drug Testing and Research Program (New York) and Pennsylvania Equine Toxicology and Research Laboratory (Pennsylvania) have applied for RMTC accreditation.

Significant progress is also being made in the area of third-party administration of Furosemide (otherwise known as Lasix or Salix). The Furosemide restrictions require that Furosemide be the only medication authorized for administration on race day and limit Furosemide administration to no less than four hours prior to post time for the race in which the horse is entered. The Furosemide restrictions also require that the administration of Furosemide be performed only by third-party veterinarians or veterinary technicians who are prohibited from working as private veterinarians or technicians on the racetrack or with participating licensees. **cont. p12**

The program is under way or in the process of being established in no fewer than 14 states, including Colorado, Delaware, Kentucky, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, Minnesota, New Jersey, New York, North Dakota, Pennsylvania (at Penn National), Texas (at Lone Star Park and Sam Houston Race Park), Virginia and West Virginia.

A total of seven states have committed to implementation of the Multiple Medication Violation (MMV) Penalty System and regulators in many other states have indicated a desire to adopt the MMV Penalty System once the uniform medication rules are passed in their respective jurisdictions.

“We urge all racing states to adopt these rules in their entirety,” said NTRA President and CEO Alex Waldrop, who also serves as Chairman of the RMTC. “They are comprehensive and far reaching, and they establish a process for future modification to reflect the latest scientific research and development. These rules are in the best interests of the health and safety of our human and equine athletes, enhance the integrity of our sport, ensure a level playing field for our competitors, assist horsemen who race in multiple jurisdictions and accomplish the uniform regulation of racing in the United States.”

The reforms were developed by the RMTC, the industry’s scientific advisory organization consisting of 25 major racing industry stakeholder organizations, and the Association of Racing Commissioners International (“RCI”), the industry’s association of state regulatory bodies responsible for the integrity of racing. RMTC recommended the Reforms to RCI and RCI voted to incorporate the Reforms into their official Model Rules earlier this year. Individual regulatory bodies must now move to adopt the Reforms.

In late September, the NTRA sent a letter to pari-mutuel regulators urging them to adopt uniform national reforms addressing much-needed changes to medication regulation, enforcement and laboratory testing. The letter was co-signed by more than 50 racetracks and industry organizations. Several more racetracks have signed on as co-signatories to the letter. The new co-signatories are Churchill Downs in Louisville, Ky.; Arlington Park near Chicago; Fair Grounds Race Course & Slots in New Orleans; Calder Casino & Race Course near Miami; Tampa Bay Downs in Florida; and Kentucky Downs in Franklin, Ky.

Frine was the latest to advertise the up-and-coming Spanish racing scene when causing an upset here with a game first black-type success. Breaking her maiden over 1 7/16-miles at Dax Aug. 17, she was sent back to Madrid to add to her tally over 10 furlongs Sept. 22 before winding up fourth in the Listed Prix Panacee over a 1 1/2 miles here a month ago. Positioned near the early pace trapped out wide, the bay was sent into the lead passing the furlong pole and delivered a telling burst to settle the issue.

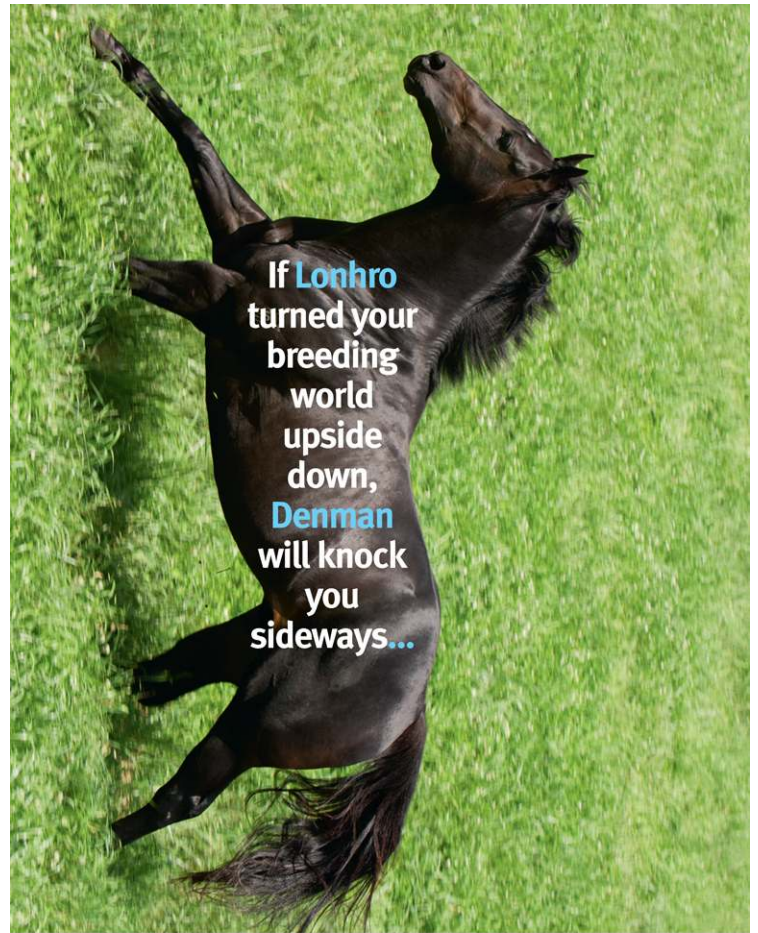

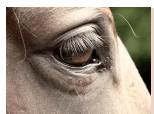

One of the great imponderables of Thoroughbred breeding is what Sunday Silence might have achieved had his connections stuck to their original plan of standing him alongside his sire Halo at his birthplace, Stone Farm.

Of course, there were no doubts about Sunday Silence's talent as a racehorse, as he had earned the Horse of the Year title in 1989 with victories in the Kentucky Derby, Preakness and Breeder's Cup Classic. The question was whether American breeders would have been eager to pay \$50,000 to use a stallion whose trainer Charlie Whittingham once described as "a classy freak that everyone misjudged."

The freak reference reflected the fact that Sunday Silence's first three dams were daughters of Understanding, Montparnasse II and Hillary.

Sunday Silence's cause probably wasn't helped by the record of Halo's other Kentucky Derby winner, Sunny's Halo. Again, here was a horse with some less-than-familiar names in the bottom half of his pedigree (his first two dams were daughters of Sunny and

Daumier). By the time Sunday Silence's future as a stallion was being decided, Sunny's Halo had been represented by just one graded winner from four crops of racing age (the GISW Dispersal).

I can only conjecture that the initial response to

Sunday Silence was disappointing. Instead of heading to Stone Farm, he was sold to Zenya Yoshida, who had originally bought a 25% interest earlier in 1990. Yoshida snapped up the remaining 75%, for a total investment of \$11 million, and the Shadai Farm supremo never made a shrewder investment.

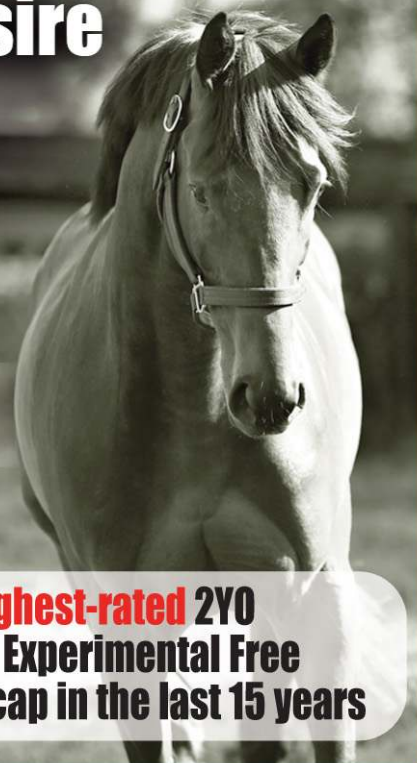

Although Sunday Silence died as long ago as August 2002, he still exerts an enormous influence on the country where he could be said to have reshaped the breed. Over the past weekend in Japan, the Queen Elizabeth II Cup at Kyoto provided a third Group 1 victory for Meisho Mambo, a filly by Sunday Silence's son Suzuka Mambo. Meisho Mambo was chased home by Lachesis, a filly by Sunday Silence's highly successful son Deep Impact; and Aromatico, a filly with a dam by Sunday Silence. Over at Tokyo, daughters of Sunday Silence also supplied first and second in a Group 3. Yet another Sunday Silence mare was responsible for the winner of the previous day's G2 Keio Hai Nisai S., in which second and third were sired by sons of you know who.

It's surely a measure of Sunday Silence's brilliance that--more than 11 years after his death--the leading sires' table in Japan currently features *nine* of his sons in the top dozen, with Deep Impact leading the way by a comfortable margin. The other sons in the top 12 are Daiwa Major (fourth), Heart's Cry (sixth), Manhattan Caf, (seventh), Gold Allure (eighth), Fuji Kiseki (ninth), Neo Universe (10th), Stay Gold (11th) and Agnes Tachyon (12th). Meisho Mambo's sire Suzuka Mambo scrapes into the top 20 in 20th position, and there's also Zenno Rob Roy in 15th, making it a total of 11 sons in the top 20 (with another of the top 20 having a dam by Sunday Silence).

Sunday Silence also holds a very commanding lead on the broodmare sires table, with his sons Dance In The Dark, Special Week and Fuji Kiseki also featuring in the top 10. His daughters have been similarly dominant in every year since they finished second behind Northern Taste's daughters in 2005 and 2006, so Sunday Silence is currently heading for his seventh-consecutive broodmare sire title. Add to this his 13 consecutive years as champion sire and his achievements are very similar to those of another breed-shaper in Sadler's Wells.

Since Sunday Silence gained his final title in 2007, this king of stallions has been succeeded by his sons Agnes Tachyon (2008), Manhattan Cafe (2009) and Deep Impact (2012). It is still early days, but the leading first-crop sire in Japan this year is Maturida Gogh, a durable Group 1 winner from Sunday Silence's final crop who made his stud debut at the age of seven.

Thanks to her Group 1 victories in the Yushun Himba, Shuka Sho and Queen Elizabeth II Cup, Meisho Mambo has amassed more earnings in Japan this year than any other horse, which represents a considerable achievement for her sire Suzuka Mambo.

This son of Sunday Silence was considered good enough to contest all three legs of the Japanese Triple Crown in 2004, his closest finish being his fifth in the Derby equivalent. He did bag a major prize, though, taking the spring edition of the G1 Tenno Sho over two miles as a 4-year-old, but his career record stood at only four wins from 19 starts.

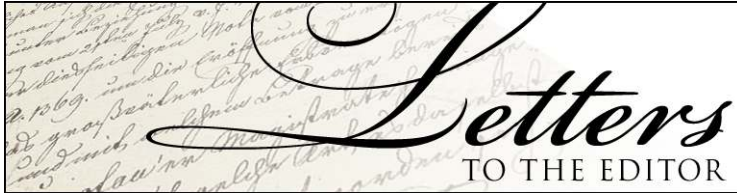
As a son of Sunday Silence from the highly successful Native Partner family, Suzuka Mambo was bred along similar lines to Dance In The Dark, winner of the Japanese St Leger, and Dance Partner, heroine of the 1996 Queen Elizabeth II Cup.

Dance In The Dark went on to sire three winners of the Japanese St Leger and once finished second on the sires' table, but Suzuka Mambo hadn't scaled similar heights until Meisho Mambo emerged from his third crop, numbering 54 foals. One interesting aspect of Suzuka Mambo's pedigree is that he is out of a Kingmambo mare.



One of Kingmambo's sons, the Japanese Derby winner King Kamehameha, has enjoyed plenty of success with Sunday Silence's daughters, notably siring the Japan Cup winner Rose Kingdom.

Although Meisho Mambo's sire and her first three dams all raced in Japan, her bloodlines are essentially American, as all four of these ancestors were sired by American-breds. In fact, she is inbred 4x4 to Mr. Prospector, 4x5 to Nijinsky II and 4x5 to Hail To Reason. With Nureyev and Danzig also in her pedigree, Meisho Mambo has four lines to Northern Dancer and, with Halo also in her pedigree, she has several lines of Almahmoud.



GUNNAR NORDQVIST:

This is my take on the strike of Nov. 5, when French racing lost its face, both in the country, but probably more so to the outside world. I would like to clarify the reasons for the strike and what has happened in its wake up to this point.

Racing followers around the globe never saw the results of the three Group races programmed to take place at Maison-Laffitte on the Nov. 5--the G2 Criterium Maisons-Laffitte, G3 Prix Miesque and G3 Prix Seine et Oise. With 15 runners from abroad, England, Ireland, Germany, Belgium and Norway, the racing and breeding fraternity was in for a good day at the races.

But alas, that was not to be, due to a strike by personnel at France Galop, the entity who manages French Thoroughbred racing.

Observers in foreign lands quite rightly wonder what is going on. One has to go back slightly in time to understand.

On Nov. 4, the day before the strike, FG issued a statement after a board meeting, where they stated the following:

1. The re-building project of Longchamp will go forward as planned.
2. FG will look into a plan to economize, and Maisons-Laffitte is the racecourse that is under proposition to close down.

The latter statement is what created the strike and that has created upheaval in racing across the whole country. And please note, dear reader, that not one single professional was asked their opinion, nor was any union representative consulted.

One of democratic order does wonder how any statement like the above can be made public without any form of consultation, hence one can understand the strike. Any reader can imagine that the swords and axes were sharpened for the combat soon to be. It has to be added that Maisons-Laffitte is not only a racecourse, but also a training center with some 700 horses.

Here we are, only a few days later on the day of the strike, and those who have the French Racing Channel EQUIDIA were served a multitude of images of journalists interviewing, among others, the person at FG who is responsible for the training centers and racecourses owned by FG. The poor man was not even aware that he was being interviewed live and wanted to do a re-take! That is certainly the only fun part in this!

On Nov. 6, all unions represented were called to a meeting with FG, and after a short time all union representatives left the table and walked out, without anything further being said. FG issued a statement the following day retracting all previous statements and that the board meeting scheduled for Nov. 25 was suspended immediately. FG will now wait for the new managing director to take his place before meetings with unions, staff and professionals will take place.

From the above, one can understand the strikers, but also how sincerely upset all professionals are. Whoever made public the press statement on Nov. 4 must surely understand how angry and confused all professionals were. And to do it the day before important racing was scheduled to take place shows how dangerous this is. Unconscious is a word that has been heard, but dangerous is probably a more accurate description.

French racing has for several years professed itself to be the *only* racing country that has a healthy industry (at least in Europe). With the above in mind, I am certainly not subscribing to that.

Unfortunately, the damage has been done, the "bad will" has done away with any consensus that existed before. Sadly, the one certain casualty is racing and breeding professionals.

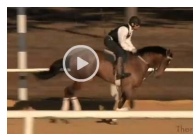
