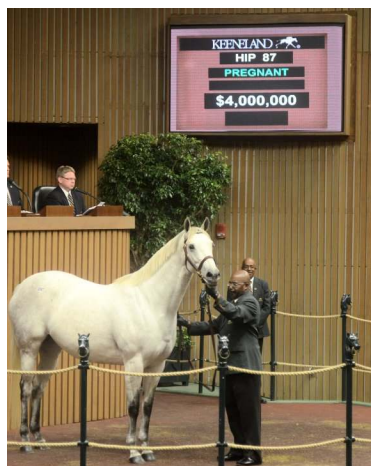
SPECTACULAR GAINS AS KEENOV WRAPS UP

The marathon Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale concludes its 10-day run yesterday in Lexington, Kentucky, but not before putting an emphatic exclamation point on a resurgent 2013 sales season. The bloodstock market figured to make a big jump forward after both the juvenile and yearling sales

realized gains, and so it proved at the industry's bellwether event. In total, 2,457 horses sold at November for \$197,189,000. That was up 37.7% from the 2,414 horses that sold for \$143,025,600 in 2012.

The resulting average was \$80,256, up 35.5% from \$59,248. But it was the median--signifying great depth in the marketplace--that enjoyed the biggest gain, rocking forward 59.1% to \$35,000. Last year's median was

\$22,000. The other figure that reflects market depth--the RNA rate--was also superb, coming in at a very low 14.5%. The 2012 RNA was 23.3%.

"It's been a terrific sale," said Keeneland's Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell. "And the most interesting part was that each segment of the market was up the same. It wasn't top heavy. Europe, for instance, seems to be very top-heavy at the moment. We have a good top, but I also think we have a very strong middle market, and I think that's healthy for our industry."

The November Sale was topped by the \$4 million **Awesome Maria** (Maria's Mon), who sold from the complete dispersal of E. Paul Robsham Stables that was handled by Lane's End. M.V. Magnier struck for the Grade I-winning millionairess, selling in foal to Giant's Causeway. The reigning champion female sprinter **Groupie Doll** (Bowman's Band) brought the second-highest price when hammered down to Mandy Pope's Whisper Hill Farm for \$3.1 million. Selling just days after she defended her title in the GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Sprint, she was offered by Tom Evans's Trackside Farm. **Cont. p3**

“Groupie Doll, Awesome Maria, [the \$2.15 million] **Eblouissante** [Bernardini]...having mares like that set the table for the sale, and created momentum that carried on through,” said Russell.

The top-priced weanling at November was a colt by War Front out of Zenyatta’s half-sister Treasure Trail (Pulpit) who made \$800,000 to the bid of Aisling Duignan. Claiborne Farm consigned the colt.

November’s leading buyer was the Chilean-based Don Alberto Corp., which acquired 32 horses for

\$10,640,000, an average of \$332,500. Don Alberto Corp. purchased the 417-acre Vinery property in September, and has been working to populate the farm with the likes of **Reach the Stars (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), its highest-priced

November purchase at \$850,000. The 6-year-old mare, sold by Eaton Sales, is a half to champion Escena (Strawberry Road {Aus}) and was offered in foal to Tapit.

Russell said Keeneland has taken great pains to attract foreign buyers to its sales, and said the principals of Don Alberto are longtime associates of the sale company’s Associate Director of Sales Tom Thornbury. “Mexico was the first-ever country we went to recruiting. Chile was the second,” said Russell, who added, “When people buy farms or get involved in the horse business, this is where they come. If you look at the leading buyers at this sale in the last decade or so--WinStar Farm, Stonestreet, Besilu Farm and now Don Alberto--many of them were setting up farms for the first time. When people need top horses, they come to Keeneland November.”

A Closer Look at the Weanlings...

“If you could perform a sort of alchemy and turn yearlings into weanlings right now, you could make a lot of money,” said bloodstock agent Pete Bradley midway through the Keeneland November Sale. Indeed, weanlings were in hot demand at November. How much so? Well, if you compare the 2013 weanling prices versus yearling prices for the top stallions in the nation, several saw their weanlings realize a higher average price. Admittedly, this is something of an apples-to-oranges comparison, as for the most part, sires have many fewer weanlings put through the ring, and one or two home-run horses can seriously affect the average. The quality of mares a stallion receives from year to year might also greatly affect their averages. Still, these are interesting numbers from some important sires:

In total, there were 859 weanlings who sold at November for an average of \$61,548. The median for a weanling was \$37,000. In 2012, there were 924 weanlings who sold for an average of \$47,050 and a median of \$25,000. So the average was up 30.8%, while the median was up by nearly a half: 48%.

In both years, a son of War Front topped all weanlings at a bid of \$800,000.

...And At the Mares...

The fact that the weanling market was up so much is remarkable considering that segment of the market was already considered exceptionally strong in recent years. Less strong was the mare market, which generally takes much longer to see a return on investment, and which took the biggest hit after the 2008 financial crisis. But in-foal mares once again found themselves in hot demand at November. In fact, the year-over-year figures are staggering. In 2012, there were 1,212 horses who were cataloged as broodmares that sold for an average of \$59,584 and a median of \$20,000. Twelve months later, the 1,230 horses that sold as broodmares averaged \$90,244--a jump of 51.5%. The rise in median to \$35,000 was even higher, a whopping 75%.

"The last two Septembers [September Yearling Sale] have been very good, and now I think people are realizing, with the way that supply and demand is--that 'Oh, I should have supply,'" said Keeneland's Geoffrey Russell. "The long-term investor came back into the market this year. They want mares because they realize they can sell their offspring at a profit." **Cont. p6**

Russell said breeders were also encouraged by the action--or inaction, perhaps--of stud farms over the last few weeks.

"The studmasters have been announcing their stud fees, which are on par with 2013 fees," he said. "Yes, the obvious horses have moved up [in price]--that's what the market does--but fees are for the most part at a reasonable level, and that will allow breeders to get a good return on their investment if the market continues to improve."

Russell said he expects a reversal in the diminishing number of mares being bred in recent years. But he believes the market learned a valuable lesson from the 2008 crash.

"I think the breeders and consignors have gotten very market savvy, and there's no use breeding something for the sake of breeding it," he said. "Pre-2008, people bred for the sales ring and they didn't care; now they realize they can't do that. Because while it's very good out there right now, it's also very fair."

The 3-year-old **Kimbolton** (First Defence--Skimble, by Lyphard), a half-sister to the two-time GI Pacific Classic winning Skimming (Nureyev), topped Thursday's finale at Keeneland. Grovendale purchased the broodmare prospect, [hip 3552](#), for \$135,000 from the draft of Mill Ridge Sales, agent.

Kimbolton is a Juddmonte-bred daughter of MGSW Skimble, who hails from the immediate family of the Grade I winners Contredance (Danzig), Wince (Selkirk) and Marketing Mix (Medaglia d'Oro). A New York-bred filly from the first crop of the Grade I winner Dublin (Afleet Alex) topped Thursday's weanlings on the strength of an \$85,000 bid from BG Stables. Vinery Sales/Millennium Farms, agent for Legend Land I, consigned the daughter of Time for Karakorum (Fly So Free). Dublin stands as the property of Spendthrift Farm at Keane Stud in New York. His 2014 fee has been set at \$7,500. **Cont. p7**



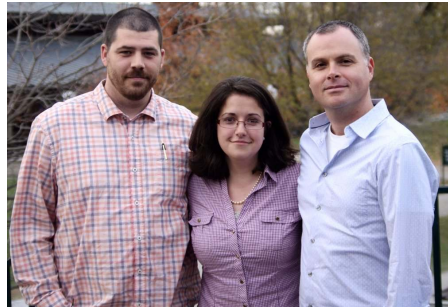

Other 'Worldly' Misfire Works for Schumer...

It's a story that a lot of bloodstock agents can relate to: A client is looking for horse. You find a horse. You pay for the horse. The client no longer wants the horse.

It's a hazzard of the job, and usually the story ends with the horse being sold to someone else, often at a loss to the agent. But for the Louisville-based agent

Chad Schumer, the story didn't end with a loss. Instead, it ended with a trip to the Breeders' Cup, and on Tuesday at Keeneland November, a \$200,000 sale.

The horse at the center fo the story is the 6-year-old

Worldly, a smartly

bred son of A.P. Indy out of the dual Grade I winner Urbane (Citidancer) who is a full-sibling to MGSW Suave.

Back in May, Schumer--who does a lot of buying for overseas interests--got an order from a Saudi Arabian client for a racing and stallion prospect. Schumer came to the client with Worldly, a stakes winner who placed second in the GIII Northern Dancer S. and GIII Ohio Derby at three.

"I've probably bought 100, 150 horses for this client--no problems," said Schumer.

Schumer vetted Worldly, who was being sold by his owner/breeder, Samantha Siegel's Jay Em Ess, and got the thumbs up. But he was soon faced with a dilemma. He didn't have the money in hand from his client, and risked missing out on the horse if he didn't buy him right away.

"I had two choices at that point--pay for the horse myself, and risk being stuck with him. Or I could *not* pay for the horse, and risk losing him and angering these people I buy all these horses for," explained Schumer. He chose the former. He fronted the client and bought Worldly on his own dime.

Here's where things got a bit tricky. At the same time, a second, unrelated bloodstock agent in Saudi Arabia gave Schumer a specific request for an A.P. Indy stallion prospect out of a Grade I-winning mare. That, of course, fit the description of Worldly. But it also fit the description of a horse name **Keep Me Informed** (A.P. Indy--Awesome Humor), who on May 5 had just won a Belmont optional claimer by 3 1/4 lengths for a \$50,000 tag.

"They were pointing Keep Me Informed to the Brooklyn H. [contested over 1 1/2 miles at Belmont], and I thought he'd be the perfect horse for them--their two biggest races in Saudi Arabia are distance races on the dirt," said Schumer.

Confusing the two A.P. Indys, the second bloodstock agent in Saudi Arabia told Schumer's client, "Don't pay what you're paying for Worldly--the horse just ran for a \$50,000 tag," according to Schumer. Schumer's client got cold feet and dropped out, and all of the sudden Worldly was Schumer's.

Schumer wasn't thrilled about the situation, but he kept it in perspective. "I thought, this sucks, but it is Worldly--he's a stakes winner, multiple graded-placed, huge pedigree, beautiful horse," said Schumer. He sent the horse to Darby Dan to quarantine, figuring he'd still be able to sell him overseas. But the trail went cold and no buyers came forth.

"And at that point, I figured, well, he's sound, I might as well put him back in training," said Schumer. His associate Sean Nix recommended a young Kentucky-based trainer named Brendan Walsh, and decided to give the Irishman a chance.

Two weeks in, Schumer began getting favorable updates on Worldly. "Brendan was getting very, very high on him, which of course was getting me very high on him," laughed Schumer. "So we started talking about races. I told him I didn't want to run at Saratoga. I didn't want to run at Churchill. I wanted to run at places where he could win and earn money."

The men targeted the 1 1/4-mile, \$100,000 Prairie Meadows H., a race Worldly won in 2011. He didn't win, but gave a good account of himself, finishing a well-beaten second to the Grade I winner Golden Ticket (Speightstown).

Encouraged, Schumer and Walsh moved him on to the \$175,000 Governor's Cup at Remington Aug. 17. Worldly again ran second, but this time beaten only a head, and that after a horse came over on him in upper stretch.

"He re-broke when [the winner] Prayer for Relief came to him, and he was only beaten a head," said Schumer.

Next on the agenda was the inaugural, \$175,000 Homecoming Classic at Churchill Downs Sept. 28.

"The GI Jockey Club Gold Cup and the GI Awesome Again were being held on the same day, so I thought all the bears would go there," said Schumer. However, when he found out that the connections of the defending GI Breeders' Cup Classic winner Fort Larned (E Dubai) had rerouted to the Homecoming, Schumer insisted to Walsh that they scratch. **Cont. p10**

Walsh stood firm, however, and introduced a new idea: the GII Breeders' Cup Marathon. "I thought he was crazy, but said that we'd give the Homecoming a shot, and if he ran well, then we'd think about the Breeders' Cup," said Schumer.

Worldly did run well, finishing 3 3/4 lengths in third behind Fort Larned, and Schumer and his crew were on their way to California.

Becoming the first Breeders' Cup starter for Schumer and Walsh, Worldly was given a 5-1 chance in the

Marathon and ran a bang-up third ([video](#)). He raced wide into the stretch the first time in a mid-pack position under David Cohen, moved to take a narrow lead going into the far turn and looked the most likely winner wheeling into the stretch. He began to flatten at the eighth

pole however, and had to settle for third, beaten 1 1/4 lengths by London Bridge (Arch).

"He ran a fantastic race," said Schumer. "The whole thing was a blur; I had an NBC camera right in my face. Sean was in front of me, Nancy [Sexton, another associate] and Brendan were standing on a bench--it was some experience."

Schumer's hope of offering a Breeders' Cup winner at Keeneland November didn't quite happen, but Worldly drew plenty of attention this past Tuesday selling during the racing-age session, and was hammered down to Xavier International Bloodstock for \$200,000. St. George Sales offered Worldly as [hip 2423](#).

"It was a fantastic sale," said Schumer. "And ironically, he's going to Saudi Arabia."

Schumer said the price was fair, and was just thankful of the ride Worldly took him on. "Of course you want more, but he's 6 years old, and I was great with the price," he said. "He earned \$125,000 for me, made \$200,000 here at Keeneland, and he took me to the Breeders' Cup. All I've been doing the last few days is running by his stall and feeding him peppermints."

GI Woobine Mile and a nose second in that year's GI Breeders' Cup Mile, was euthanized Thursday after breaking down in a routine gallop at Keeneland. He was vanned to Rood and Riddle Equine Hospital in Lexington, where he was examined by Dr. Larry Bramlage, but radiographs

revealed an injury to a hind pastern that was too catastrophic to repair. "He was out for a routine gallop. He trained like a million dollars, there was not a pimple on that horse and when he come out of the turn he took a bad step I guess," trainer Charlie LoPresti told the Lexington *Herald-Leader*. "He was packing his hind leg and I thought he might have stung his foot. For precautionary reasons we took him to the clinic and when Dr. Bramlage took the radiographs, there it was. It was like a Barbaro situation. Just his whole hind pastern was shattered in about six places. When I saw the radiographs...I knew we wouldn't be able to save him." Bred by Donna Arnold in the name of her Four D Stable, Turallure had a breakout season at four, winning the Opening Verse S. and the GII Bernard Baruch H. before scoring at 6-1 at Woodbine.

He was an 11-1 chance in that year's Breeders' Cup Mile and came from last to be beaten by the narrowest margin by Court Vision (Gulch). Overall, Turallure won six times from 26 career starts for earnings of \$1,378,997.
