AN 'EMOTIONAL' VICTORY IN MRS. REVERE

With a furious rally from out of the clouds, **Emotional Kitten** (Kitten's Joy) scored a deja vu-inducing victory in the GII Mrs. Revere under the Twin Spires Saturday evening, giving owner/breeders Ken and Sarah Ramsey their 12th graded stakes win this season with a son or daughter of their superstar stallion. Taking up her usual spot well off the pace in the early going while saving ground, the Wesley Ward trainee looked to be going in the wrong direction on the home turn as she was shuffled nearly all the way back to last. Undeterred, pilot Victor Espinoza worked his mount into the clear with help of left-handed encouragement, and she kept on coming to snatch victory from New York invader **Effie Trinket** (Freud) in the shadow of the wire. **Dance Again** (Awesome Again), a 54-1 outsider, spiced up the trifecta. **Cont. p3**

'RIVER' RUNS THROUGH THEM

Touched down to 5-2 favoritism in the last click, Tucci Stables's **River Seven** (Johannesburg) proved his 10-length romp in Woodbine's Labeeb S. last time out Oct. 19 was no fluke with a hard-fought 3/4-length victory in Churchill's GIII Commonwealth Turf S. Away alertly, the bay tucked into a pocket spot as **Frac Daddy** (Scat Daddy) showed the way. Squeezing through horses in midstretch, he reeled in the pacesetter and held that foe safe at the wire. Fellow Canadian invader **Kaigun** (Northern Afleet) got up for third at 25-1. "I thought he'd be second [early], but I looked outside and there were a couple of more speed horses than I anticipated, so I took a hold of him," winning rider Shaun Bridgmohan said. "I was just biding my time with him and when we came around the turn it just kind of unfolded in front of us. The horse in front of me kicked on a little bit and made some room and he just finished really well." **Cont. p5**

CLASH OF THE TITANS IN JOCKEY CLUB CUP

The paths of the two best horses in Hong Kong, dual International Group 1 winner **Military Attack** (Ire) (Oratorio {Ire}) and **California Memory** (Highest Honor {Fr}), two-time defending champion of the G1 Hong Kong Cup, collide once again in this afternoon's G2 Jockey Club Cup, the course-and-distance prep for main event Dec. 8. After splitting the field in the Hong Kong Derby during his 4-year-old season in 2012, **Military Attack** ascended through the ranks last term, belying 10-1 odds to best **California Memory** in the G1 Queen Elizabeth II Cup in April before accounting for stablemate and G2 Jockey Club Mile chance **Dan Excel** (Ire) (Shamardal) in the G1 Singapore Airlines International Cup the following month. **Military Attack** resumed as the 133-pound top-weight in the Oct. 27 Sha Tin Trophy H. and finished off his race well to be sixth, beaten three lengths. He carries a penalty here, as does his chief rival, but should improve while saving something for three weeks. **Cont. p8**

Emotional Kitten took seven starts to break her maiden, graduating in a \$75,000 seller at Gulfstream last December. She returned to the winner's circle two starts later in a Keeneland allowance this April, and got her nose down on the wire in Pimlico's Hilltop S. in May. Second behind Emollient (Empire Maker) in Betfair Hollywood Park's GI American Oaks July 13, she was third in the Aug. 17 GI Del Mar Oaks--a day when three other Ramsey-owner Kitten's Joys won at the highest level. She came with too little, too late last time to be seventh behind fellow Ramsey colorbearer Kitten's Dumplings (Kitten's Joy) in Keeneland's GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup Oct. 12.

California-based Victor Espinoza rode Emotional Kitten in the American and Del Mar Oaks, and was happy to get on a plane to don the red and white here.

"That was nice--even at nighttime it was worth it," he said. "I came here because I knew the trainer and owner wanted me to ride because they're shooting for a record of stakes wins in a year. She ran great with me in California and Wesley Ward said 'You have to come!' It's been an unbelievable year for the Ramseys."

Emotional Kitten is out of a half-sister to these connections' good turf sprinter Cannonball (Catienus). She has a yearling full-sister and a weanling half-sister by Giant Oak.

Brought along in typically patient Shug McGaughey fashion, the lightly raced Imagining broke through at the graded level here against a solid-looking bunch. Second at the end of his sophomore season in the 2011 GI Hollywood Derby, the Phipps homebred resurfaced the following spring at Belmont for a pair of allowance scores. He went missing after a fifth-place finish in GII Nijinsky S. last July, and returned again in an easier spot to win at Keeneland this April. Tenth as the favorite in Pimlico's GII Dixie S. on Preakness Day, the chestnut capitalized on comfortable early fractions to take the Spa's restricted Idle Rich S. Aug. 25 by 5 1/2 lengths. He could do no better than sixth in Belmont's GI Joe Hirsch Turf Classic Sept. 28, but entered off a victory in that venue's 10-furlong Bowl Game S. Oct. 17. Wrestled farther off the pace than usual by Joel Rosario, Imagining traveled in the clear towards the back half of the field rounding the first of three turns while clearly wanting to do more. He tugged his way up passing the finish line for the first time to be third hitting the next bend, and remained in that position to the top of the stretch. Unable to get his hoofs completely under him until midstretch, Imagining eventually leveled off to open up enough daylight to hold safe bids from Hangover Kid and the patiently ridden Grade I-winning filly Tannery. **Cont. p5**

"I thought he'd be racing on the lead or in second, but he broke a little slowly and I had to race behind horses," said Rosario. "They weren't going all that fast, and we were able to move up. I asked him turning for home, and he gave it to me."

McGaughey, who took the two previous runnings of this affair with Boisterous (Distorted Humor), added, "[Joel] let him settle in and get to the outside, which is where he wanted to be. I was glad to see that; I said to myself when they were going down the backside, 'I hope he punches from here,' because it would be something different for him. It was a pretty good bunch of horses--I think we're moving on up."

The Hall of Fame conditioner said Imagining could either ship back to Inglewood for the GII Hollywood Turf Cup S. Dec. 14 or wait for a race down at Gulfstream Park.

The winner's Grade III-winning second dam Get Lucky also produced Grade I winner Girolamo (A.P. Indy) and GSW and Grade I-placed Accelerator (A.P. Indy), as well as the dams of GI Kentucky Derby winner Super Saver (Maria's Mon) and GI Haskell winner Bluegrass Cat (Storm Cat)--both also by A.P. Indy. Get Lucky, a daughter of Grade I winner Dance Number, is herself a full-sister to champion 2-year-old Rhythm, winner of the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile and GI Travers S.

Commonwealth Turf S. cont. from p1

A winner of the GIII Grey S. in Etobicoke as a juvenile, River Seven kicked off his 3-year-old year the way most of the better Ontario-bred boys do--on the Queen's Plate trail. Fourth in the Queenston S. in May and eighth in the Plate Trial in June, the bay could only muster a 10th-place run in the July 7 Queen's Plate behind stablemate Midnight Aria (Midnight Lute). He fared much better when filling that runner's void in Fort Erie's Prince of Wales S. on the dirt July 30, finishing second there and again in the grassy Breeders' S. Aug. 18. Cut back three furlongs for a nine-furlong allowance test Sept. 29, River Seven was run down late by **Golden Sabre** (Medaglia d'Oro). Nobody was getting to him last time in the one-mile Labeeb, however, as he relished the yielding going to trounce his elders and earn a 105 Beyer Speed Figure.

This was the first win at historic Churchill Downs for trainer Nick Gonzalez. "If I could find the right words for saying how I feel right now with a victory in a stakes race here as a trainer, I'd probably have to lie to you or make up some crazy word," he said. "It's wild."

Having run into a smart rival in **"TDN Rising Star"** and subsequent G3 Prix la Rochette runner-up Decathlete (Medaglia d'Oro) over this trip on debut at Deauville at the start of August, Kiram went one better at Fontainebleau at the end of the month before registering a smooth success in the G3 Prix Eclipse at Chantilly Oct. 11. Settled towards the rear early from his wide draw, the homebred followed This Time as that rival worked his way to the front end down the outer inside the final quarter mile. Overwhelming him inside the final 150 meters, he asserted for an ultimately comfortable score in this race delayed by last week's strike. "I think he is class, as it is not easy to make up so much ground and quicken on that kind of ground," trainer Jean-Claude Rouget commented. "I hope he will stay further next year, as there is hope on the dam's side but we will wait to find out."

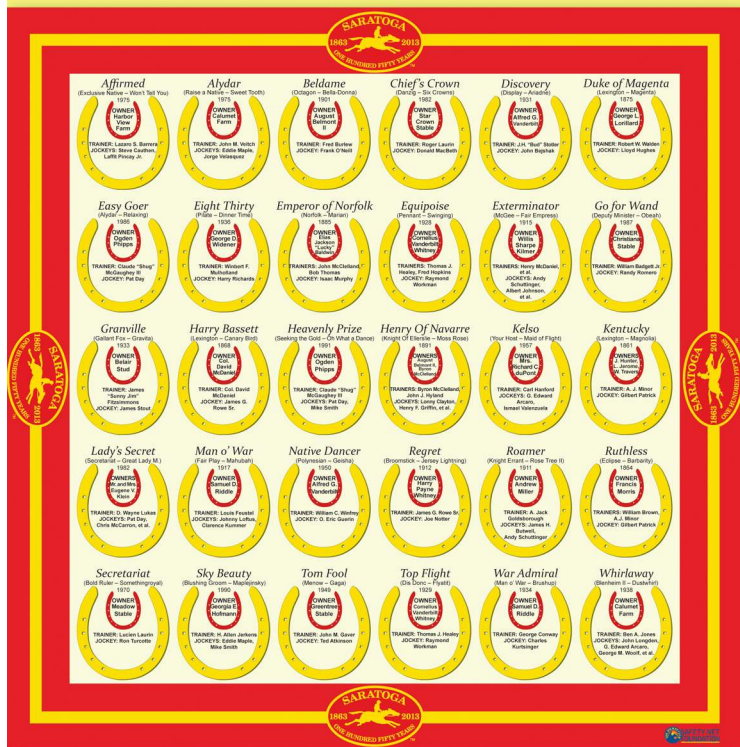

Prepping for the Big A's Nov. 30 GI Cigar Mile H., the likely repeat champion female sprinter was clocked in :48.61 (15/79) for a four-panel breeze over the Belmont training track.

"She breezed really well," said Buff Bradley. "She went the first eighth in :12 2/5, finished up really well and galloped out strong, too, in 1:01 3/5. [Exercise rider] Jada [Schlenk] said 'perfect,' which is pretty good for me. She wasn't even breathing hard when she got back." Groupie Doll, who came up just a nose short of Stay Thirsty (Bernardini) in the 2012 renewal of the Cigar Mile, will be running for a \$1 million purse thanks to added incentives added by NYRA for past Breeders' Cup winners. Bradley said he is likely to breeze Groupie Doll again next Sunday.

Also working Saturday for the Cigar Mile was Godolpin's **Alpha** (Bernardini), most recently eighth in the GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile Nov. 1. The two-time Grade I winner went :48.14 (7/79) over the same surface and distance as Groupie Doll, finishing a head behind workmate Long River (A.P. Indy). "He breezed very well; we're happy with the breeze," said trainer Kieran McLaughlin. "He galloped out well, and all systems are 'go' for the Cigar Mile." With Groupie Doll and Dirt Mile winner Goldcents (Into Mischief) listed among the Cigar Mile probables, McLaughlin acknowledged that winning will be a tough task. "We're going to keep our options open because [the race] is coming up tough, but we're pointing that way," he said. "We're happy with him, he likes New York, he doesn't ship well, so we're pointing to the Cigar Mile, even though it's coming up tough."

Also on the tab for McLaughlin was Namcook Stables, Paul Braverman, Harvey Clarke, and Craig Robertson III's impressive recent GII Nashua S. winner **Cairo Prince** (Pioneerof the Nile), who will look to remain unbeaten in the Big A's GII Remsen S. the same day. He covered the four furlongs of Belmont training track in :48.89 (17/79). "He worked well, also in company," said McLaughlin. "He looked great doing it with [workmate] Truth Is (Medaglia d'Oro), and we're pointing for the Remsen."



Will Take Charge Preps for Clark...

Willis D. Horton's **Will Take Charge** (Unbridled's Song) had his first work yesterday at Churchill Downs since coming up just a nose short of Mucho Macho Man (Macho Uno) in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic two weeks earlier. Eyeing the GI Clark H. in Louisville Nov. 29, the D. Wayne Lukas pupil was timed in an easy :49 flat (35/84). "The timing is pretty good," Lukas said of the decision to run in the Clark. "I almost wish there was more to the season, because he is good right now. It's a prestigious race in many ways. It's a Grade I and if we could get another Grade I against older competition around two turns, I think it would be significant." With wins in the GI Travers S. and GII Pennsylvania Derby earlier this year, the Hall of Fame conditioner believes Will Take Charge has already done enough to earn the Eclipse Award for champion 3-year-old, and said a start in the Clark had little to do with trying to pad his runner's resume for that reason. "I think he's already sealed it," Lukas said of the year-end award. "I would rather take the position that the Clark is a significant race with Grade I status and a nice purse, and an opportunity to showcase our horse again. I've been dealing with six or seven different farms that are interested in standing this horse. None of them at any time said to me, 'Well, if he's 3-year-old champion, what about that?' That has never come up in the conversation. They're looking at the merit of what we've already done, the body of work we've already done."

Also working Saturday at Churchill for the nine-furlong event was Bourbon Lane Stable's **Bourbon Courage** (Lion Heart), five furlongs in 1:00.20 (2/48); and Donegal Racing's **Finnegans Wake** (Powercourt {GB}), 1:01.50 (16/48).

Believe You Can to Return on Turkey Day...

Following a 1:00.80 five-furlong breeze under the Twin Spires yesterday, trainer Larry Jones revealed that Brereton Jones's 2012 GI Kentucky Oaks heroine **Believe You Can** (Proud Citizen) will return to the races in Churchill's GII Falls City H. on Thanksgiving Day, Nov. 28. "That's our game plan," her trainer said. "We'll just keep our fingers crossed that all continues to go well." He added, "Our galloping out was what we hadn't been doing, but she galloped out much better today [in 1:14.40 for six furlongs]. We've got time for one more work next Saturday and we'll know for darned sure, but she's moving along kind of like we thought she should and could." The homebred kicked off her 4-year-old season with a pair of listed stakes victories at Fair Grounds, but was subsequently third as the even-money favorite in Churchill's GII La Troienne S. on the one-year anniversary of her Oaks win before fading to last of six in Saratoga's GI Ogden Phipps H. May 27. Alan Garcia, aboard for Saturday's work, could pick up the mount on Believe You Can in the Falls City as regular pilot Rosie Napravnik is expected to ride at Fair Grounds that day.

SOUTH AFRICAN BREEDING & RACING CONTINUE DESPITE LONG ODDS

Those who breed horses in places where there is plenty of water, good grass, consistent climates, available quality veterinary care, localized industry and educated work staff should know that they have it relatively easy compared to the conditions with which some South African breeders must contend.

Considering that there is a need to irrigate in order to have grass, hay or grain, the South African farmer is already contending with costly, unreliable water resources. There has been an ongoing drought in the Northern interior of South Africa this year, creating

near desperate conditions for man and animals.

Add to that the fact that some breeding farms are likely to be many hours apart, necessitating long trips and thus creating a feeling of isolation for some breeders. Breeders elsewhere should think of themselves as extremely fortunate in comparison, and we haven't even added the fact that South African horsemen are hamstrung by their inability to export their breeding and racing product due to the stifling protocol directly related to the rare occurrence of African Horse Sickness in their country. It should be noted, however, that those farms in the Western and Eastern Cape regions enjoy considerably better conditions than those to the Northern interior. There is more than ample rainfall, constant and more abundant water resources, closer proximity to other farms, centralized veterinary care, and greater safety and security, and the Cape region remains an African Horse Sickness "Free Zone."

Those breeding and racing in South Africa are determined to "crack on," as did their predecessors. As you leave Cape Town and head North, you can still see the ruts left by the wagons that carried the Afrikaner families and their belongings as they attempted to distance themselves from British rule in the Cape. Their chosen path was immediately nearly vertical, through steep, rocky passes eventually leading them to open but desolate range farther into the interior. Against impossible odds, these pioneers settled towns, along rivers and in far-flung valleys, coining names for their towns like Colesberg, Graaff-Reinet, Ceres, Bloemfontein, and Middleburg, and hammering out a community and farm culture with strong, deep roots.

As more and more illegal immigrants move into Northern South Africa from war-torn nations and those of crumbling economies to the north, this has initiated an apparent white migration to the South. Many large corporations are moving their headquarters from the North, specifically from Johannesburg, to smaller, quieter, and safer towns in the South, such as Stellenbosch, Wellington, and Franschhoek--closer to Cape Town and the majority of horse farms and tracks located in the Western and Eastern Cape region.

A similar change has taken place in the sale of Thoroughbred horses. The newly established Cape Thoroughbred Sales Company has staged its Cape Premier Sale in Cape Town, and the sale will next year be held Jan. 23 and 24. This will mark the third year of this high-flyer sale of South African yearlings. This sale company was created to circumvent the negative aspects of marketing yearlings in Johannesburg. The distance from the Cape, where the majority of breeders are established, to Johannesburg requires a long, arduous van ride for the yearlings and their attendants. The sale in Johannesburg requires costly rentals of accommodations for consignors and crew, and the venue itself is in a particularly tough neighborhood, where safety for seller and buyer alike is compromised. Additionally, because the horses have been introduced to an area where African Horse Sickness may be more likely, movement from the sales involves a costly quarantine period if moving to the South. These and other impediments make foreign investment unlikely, if not impossible.

The Cape sales have been staged at the enclosed, air-conditioned Cape Town International Convention Center, located in the heart of South Africa's most beautiful and vibrant city. The 2-year-old sale is held at nearby Durbanville Racecourse, in the delightful, sleepy little community of



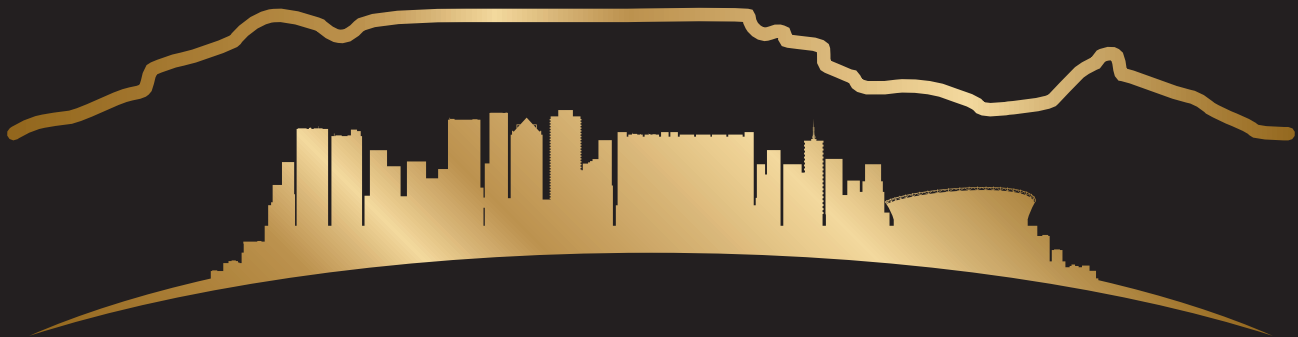

the same name. The Cape Premier Sale is held in late January, allowing consignors and buyers to enjoy the holiday atmosphere of Cape Town. Those buyers from cold, Northern climates will particularly enjoy the warm, laid-back environment found at the sale. They will also find the cream of the South African yearling crop, like graduate Soft Falling Rain (SAf) (National Assembly), who recently won the G2 Joel S. at Newmarket. There are lots of wineries and wild animal preserves nearby, along with lovely beaches, fine restaurants, and lovely hotels or quaint guest houses--whatever your preference. It is certain that buyers will find instant community with horsemen from South Africa. **Cont. p13**

For those selling, the Cape Thoroughbred Sales Company ensures payment to their consignors within 30 days of sale. This alone has made selling in the Cape most attractive for the breeders. Those breeders who established this new sale company and the strong board of sophisticated businessmen who currently operate the company have envisioned a sale company with the very best interests of the breeders at heart. They have some magnificent plans for the future development of their sales, along with grand plans to support racing for all of South Africa, with particular interest in the Cape region. The plans are exciting, and what has been done thus far is extraordinary. In fact, for 2014, they have given buyers a million reasons to attend the Cape sales. They have just announced that Cape Thoroughbred Sales will be hosting the first US\$1-million race in Africa, restricted to graduates of the Cape January and March Yearling sales. Now that is progressive thinking.

Along with veteran yearling inspector John Kramer and cameraman-driver Wayne Marks, I once again traveled the length and breadth of South Africa in October, looking to find some gems for the Cape Premier Sale in January and also those slated for the March Cape Sale. We started our trek in the Bonnievale and Robertson area of the Western Cape. We began at Klawervlei Stud, where John Koster showed us an elite group of stand-out juveniles, led by two lovely Distorted Humor fillies, a Distorted Humor colt, and a handsome Speightstown colt, which should generate some interest from foreign buyers. Klawervlei is a major stallion station, standing perennial favorite Captain Al (SAf) along with a big draft of other young sires, including champion and international star Jay Peg (SAf). Mike Sharkey presented another stellar group at Highlands Stud, owned by the Beck family. They have a Tapit yearling slated for the sale, and while I was there, a Tapit won in South Africa. That should help to market the American stallions there. Highlands stands champion sire Dynasty (SAf) and new sire, Great Britain (GB), and their kids did not disappoint.

At Maine Chance Farm, where leading sire Silvano (Ger) stands, John Slade paraded a great bunch of yearlings for us. Silvano not only leads the sire list in South Africa, but he also had the German Derby winner this year. They also have a sharp new sire Querari (Ger), whose babies are sensational. Veronica Foulkes showed us a handsome string at her Normandy Stud in Ashton. This is a serious horsewoman, who knows her stuff. We found some nice ones at Zandvliet Stud, the farm and winery of Dan de Wet, birthplace of the mighty Pocket Power (SAf) and where the Zandvliet Shiraz is making a recognized name for itself. We stopped at the Beaumont Stud of Anton Shepherd, breeder of now two-time Horse of the Year Variety Club (SAf) (Var)--quite an accomplishment for this neat, small farm.

Next we visited the Winterbach Stud of Dr. Hendrik Winterbach. He and his son are not only raising fine horses, but they have begun growing hydroponic barley to feed their stock. This is a very complex process, but the resultant feed is consistent and nutritious, reducing the need for mixed feeds (and thus reducing cost), and the horses love it. It looks like the answer to feeding at the track, where grazing is limited.

We had a look at a couple of nice yearlings at Collingwood, the farm of renowned horsewoman Pat Schafer and her husband David, who hails from Alberta, Canada. In Franschhoek, a lovely, upscale community, we came to Nutfield Stud, where the horses were nearly as pretty as the barns and setting. From high on a hill at Avontuur Stud, we could see the ocean while we had a look at a strong group of yearlings.

At Avontuur, Pippa Mickleburgh lords over horses, a winery and restaurant, all of acclaim. She stands champion sire Var and newcomer Oratorio (Ire) at Avontuur.

From there, we stopped in at Arc en Ciel Stud, where a transition is underway from horse farm to wild animal preserve. Manager Craig Carey, with his wife Amanda (Administrative Head of Cape Thoroughbred Sales) and children, will soon leave to carry on their Thoroughbred interests elsewhere. The breeding and sales of exotic animals has become quite lucrative lately. A Cape buffalo bull recently fetched US\$4 million at auction, and breeding stock of kudu, impala, giraffe, rhino, and big cats have become extremely valuable. *Cont. p14*

Game preserves in the North--Botswana, Namibia, Zambia, Rwanda, and Tanzania, for instance--have become over-populated in recent years. Longer periods of drought have placed additional pressure on water and grazing lands. With herd populations on the rise

and resources dwindling, the herds are becoming stressed and disease-ridden, which threatens their ultimate survival. That is the impetus for the many game preserves that have sprouted up throughout South Africa. The object is to have breeding stock in place for the eventual replacement that will be necessary when the big preserve numbers show decline. As for the danger of extinction to the rhino, over US\$100 million in horns have been sold in 2013.

Poachers kill their quarry and remove the horn, leaving the carcass to rot. The horn is sold to Asian interests to be used as a purported aphrodisiac. The governments have become so alarmed that they are considering "farm-raising" rhino. By doing so, the horns (which grow back) can be harvested legally and humanely, and these magnificent animals will, hopefully, not face extinction. In the Northern Cape, in the endless desert area known as the Karoo, many horse and stock farms have recently sold to game preserve interests.

Our next adventure was North, through the Ceres Valley, on our way to Beaufort West and North to Kimberley. On the way there, we stopped in a big canyon, in which lies the farm of Mary Slack, named Wilgerbosdrift, where

they stand Tiger Ridge and Right Approach (GB). They always have a great string entered, and this year was no exception. Just down the road, into the boxed end of the canyon, we visited Dr. Bennie van der Merwe at his farm, Moutonshoek

Stud, where he stands new young sires Mambo in Seattle and Marchfield. We found a number of good yearlings there.

In Ceres, we found the usual four or five extremely nice yearlings that they present each year at Daytona Stud, and from there, we headed to the Rosedene Stud of Graeme Koster. Graeme and his family also own a picturesque bush camp, named Ko-Ka Tsara, where they had us stay overnight. The accommodations were first rate, and there is plenty of wildlife to watch while there. Graeme showed us a good many yearlings, which he has slated for the later March Sale in the Cape.

While in Kimberley, the site of the original diamond rush in Africa, we had a look at "The Big Hole," where they extracted over 13.6-million carats worth of diamonds. Kimberley, as a result, became quite a popular city. In fact, it was the first city in all of Africa to have electric lights. The diamonds are gone, but the pink flamingoes still come back every year--by the thousands. Also in Kimberley is the Mauritzfontein Stud of the recently deceased Mrs. Bridget Oppenheimer, where Fort Wood, a major South African breed-shaping sire, stands. Mrs. Oppenheimer has been dubbed "the Queen Mum of South African racing" and her death is a huge loss for the industry there.

From Kimberley, we headed east to Colesberg, home of Gary Player Stud. This man is a legend, and he is breeding some very nice horses there. We found a couple that certainly fit the Cape Sale. We left Colesberg and headed to Graaff-Reinet, a small town in the higher altitudes of the Eastern Cape. It is a lovely, clean, neat little town, with perhaps the loveliest church in the entire country as its centerpiece. Just outside Graaff-Reinet is the farm of Johann and Gaynor Rupert, Drakenstein Stud. This is their secondary farm, as the primary farm and vinery is located in the Western Cape. They raise the weanlings to yearlings at this farm, along with an ever-expanding game preserve, which covers thousands of acres. Drakenstein stands Trippi, Horse Chestnut (SAf), and What a Winter. They have had tremendous sales success of late, and the group they showed us will make a splash, too.

Leaving the interior, we headed to the coast to the sprawling, industrial, and commercial harbor city of Port Elizabeth. There, we visited with the Parkers, Rose and her son Ashley, at Ascot Stud, where they stand Sail From Seattle and Bold Silvano (SAf), who are both going to make a big name for themselves. Rose took us for a tour of the farm, which ended at a cabin overlooking the sea. It was quite a spectacular spot, and amazing to be in a field of mares and foals and just pop over the hill to find the sea.

While in Port Elizabeth, we visited with Luciano Passerini, General Manager of Fairview Race Course, where they have just recently installed a Polytrack surface to complement their turf course. They didn't go with Polytrack because of rain; rather, because of the lack of rain there. It is expensive to water a dirt surface, and with Polytrack they will have a consistent, dust-free surface, with little need for water as the temperature is never stifling hot. **Cont. p15**

We wrapped up the inspection trip in the Hemel 'n Arde Valley, just over the mountain from Hermanus, a neat little seaside village where the whales come to calve each year. This valley is so lovely, it is almost overwhelmingly so. There are several outstanding vineries in this valley, along with several productive horse farms. According to Barbara Sanne of Oldlands Stud, it is because the temperature in the valley is never too hot, nor too cold. It is a beautiful place to raise either grapes or horses. There in the valley is the Hemel 'n Arde Stud of David Hepburn-Brown, who showed us a good number of nice yearlings. David also helps oversee his neighbor's farm, owned by entrepreneur Hassan Adams, owner of the Burger King franchises in South Africa. Adams is rapidly developing a new farm that will rival any other in terms of facilities, and he hopes to breed proper racehorses there in the future. Adams is also passionate about elevating the status of racing in South Africa, and he is putting his money where his mouth is. He has offered to put millions into the enhancement of purses in the Cape, and he is soon to promote both racing and wine production (particularly that which originates in the Hemel 'n Arde Valley) to attract a younger, more sophisticated racing crowd. This would be one man to watch in years to come. He is likely to have a great positive influence on the sport in South Africa.

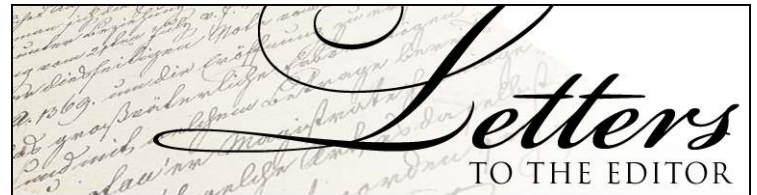

Leaving this wonderful country becomes more difficult each year. As the friendships developed have become closer, I have more understanding and greater respect for the passion they have for what they do. With the recent worldwide contraction of racing and breeding, we have seen more and more pressure on the small breeders and racing stables. Just as in the U.S., a number of smaller breeders in South Africa have gone by the wayside. The pressures are greater in South Africa because of the previously mentioned climate changes and the resultant lack of water and grazing, along with the development of wild animal preserves and their need for the same lands that horse farms now occupy. The consolidation of the racing and breeding industry in the Western and Eastern Cape region will likely continue to occur. The Cape Thoroughbred Sales Company was created at exactly the right time for breeders. The positive benefits will enhance sales and racing, and with the possible reduction in quarantine time for exports in the future, South African breeders, particularly those in the Cape region, are poised to enjoy a profitable run.

Those South Africans who labor in the production of racehorses and those who enjoy this magnificent sport are prepared to "crack on" resolutely. They battle elements, labor issues, water and grazing shortages, disease, governmental indifference, and an international restriction of movement that would kill any other country's industry. Mark Antonini, writing about RNAs in his [letter to the editor](#) yesterday, took exception to the notion that a low percentage of RNAs indicated a strong market. Mr. Antonini, it is well known that figures don't lie, but liars do figure; people can use figures to make whatever points they want. In this instance, it seems obvious to sellers at Keeneland's November sale that it was truly a sellers' market and the low RNA rate was a fact and not a guess. The only way one can determine whether the RNA rate was low because of a sellers' market is to ask the sellers. Secondly, Mr. Antonini also suggests that RNAs should be counted for the stallion averages, because they reflect some sort of gauge at to value. In my experience, all a RNA represents is a figure set by a seller that goes unsupported by the market, so it is completely irrelevant to anybody but the failed vendor.

I too have pondered how to gauge the state of the market by factoring in RNAs (or 'passed ins' in Southern Hemisphere-speak). There's one problem with Mark Antonini's proposition. There is no way of telling whether, on the way to the RNA figure, there has ever been a genuine arms-length bid on the said horse. We all know that many times there is no bid other than from the consignor, his nominees and/or the auctioneers, and invariably the last bid is by one of those. So, without some hard evidence, the RNA is pretty useless as a means of determining market value.

On Friday Nov. 16, the European Commission has officially stated that the Italian budget for next year has been fixed or, better, the figures have been fixed.

To falsify the truth is in the DNA of the majority of Italians.

Racing wise, the story is the same and, betting wise, no changes at all when the Italians seat at the International table.

As you probably don't know, Italy is represented in the European Pattern Races Committee by a gentleman who works for the Ministry of Agriculture, but is paid by an Association of race goers involved with Milan's San Siro racecourse for the simple reason that Italian law doesn't allow public entities and institutions to have on their payrolls external consultants.

Can you imagine in America the Secretary of State, who works for the Government, being paid by somebody who he has to control?

Since Nov. 1, Italian punters and racing enthusiasts are not allowed to watch foreign races anymore or to wager on them.

Today, Sunday Nov. 17, a horse bred by the Irish branch of an Italian family, the Caianis, named Hurricane Fly (Montjeu), will run in the G1 StanJames Moriana Hurdle at Punchestown, best odds available 4-7, but generally 1-8--and if he wins he will become the most accomplished horse in the history of the turf, with 17 Group 1s on his CV. But no Italian will be able to watch that performance, which will put the horse in the position to beat John Henry, in terms of group races won.

As a consequence of that ban, the betting turnover is down 30% plus, compared to the same month of November last year.

As I stated before, by the end of this year, the Ministry of Agriculture, racing and breeding department, will get around €90 million, which are not enough to meet all the liabilities of the Ministry and the loss will be around €20 million.

There is a decree, dated Jan. 31, issued by the same ministry, which gives €231 million to the breeding and racing industry, but the trouble is that the Italian government hasn't got any money for such a things, so the prize money for the last quarter of the year 2012 has not been paid yet, and peanuts have been paid this year, so far.

There is another decree, issued by the Ministry of Finance, which should allow payments for €20 billion to the suppliers of the State (total due is over €90 billion), but nobody has seen any money, or just peanuts, once again.

We haven't seen any budget for racing for next year yet, we don't know the number of fixtures, the amount of the prize money available for both owners and breeders, we don't know what sort of money will be available for group races (if any will be left), etc.

The problem is that the Ministry of Agriculture cannot guarantee the payment of the prize money to either the local owners and breeders and to the foreign owners who will succeed in winning races in Italy in the year 2014.

In my opinion, it will be difficult, better impossible, for the European Pattern Races Committee to confirm group races in Italy for the year 2014. Despite any figures, the guy representing Italy will bring at the meeting, because, I repeat, there will be no guarantee that all the winners and places will get their money.

Forget about the ratings: it's better to close both eyes on the ratings needed to be qualified for group races than not having the money if you win.

The members of the International racing and breeding community now are aware and updated of the Italian racing situation.

Italy must lose the Pattern Races: at that stage the Italian betting, racing and breeding world will understand that they have to start from scratch building a betting system which will be able to finance the industry, without any aid from the Italian state, like everywhere in the world.

At the moment, some people want to privatize racing and running it with the money provided by the Italian state.

This is bizarre, isn't it?
