FROZEN FILLY HEATS UP RING AT GOFFS

A first-crop daughter of Ballyhane Stud's Frozen Power (Ire) (Oasis Dream {GB}) brought a bid of €82,000 (US\$111,025) from Michael Carthy to lead the second session of an increasingly strong Goffs November Foal Sale.

With the pinhookers really starting to hit their stride, a pleasing clearance rate of 83% for the day--up by

seven points on last year thanks to 202 of the 242 foals offered finding buyers--echoes the improvements seen through most of the yearling season and led to a 39% rise in turnover of €3,108,650. Again there were boosts for both average and median, the former settling at €15,389 (up

18%) and the latter at €11,000 (up 16%).

The day's top foal ([lot 437](#)), consigned by Ballynaslaney Stud for Tony Cosgrave, is a half-sister to Parbold (Ire) (Dandy Man), who chased home War Command for second in the G2 Coventry S. at Royal Ascot in June. He subsequently placed in two more Group 2 contests--the Vintage S. and Gimcrack S.--and another well-credentialed half-sibling is the dual listed winner Majestic Myles (Ire) (Majestic Missile {Ire}).

Carthy, of Kilmoney Cottage Stud, bought the filly for a client who plans to sell her next autumn. "We bought a Zebedee filly for €67,000 on this day last year and then sold her during Book 1 of Tattersalls' October Sale for 220,000gns," Carthy said. "This is another lovely filly with a good horse [Parbold] still running for the family."

Brendan Holland of Grove Stud took home the top colt of the day, a son of Monsieur Bond (Ire) ([lot 429](#)) bred by Declan Lyons, for €66,000.

"He's a really good, solid colt and the stallion has worked well with this family already," said Holland, referring to Monsieur Bond's good sprinters, the full-siblings Ladies Are Forever (GB) and Hoof It (GB), who are out of a half-sister to the colt's dam, the 2-year-old winner Existentialist (GB) (Exceed and Excel {Aus}).

Another first-crop weanling, this time a son of multiple Group 1-winning sprinter Dream Ahead (Diktat {GB}), hit the leader board when bought by agent Mick Flanagan for €58,000. **Cont. p3**

TRF SETTLES NY LAWSUIT

The New York Attorney General's office and Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation have reached a settlement of the lawsuit brought against the TRF's directors. The complaint, filed by Attorney General Eric Schneiderman in May 2012, charged the charity's board had neglected its duties by taking on more racehorses than the group could afford to care for, resulting in the neglect and mistreatment of the animals.

Under the terms of the settlement, the TRF will add an Attorney General-appointed veterinarian to its board. The revamped board will also include a director nominated by an animal welfare organization and one nominated by members of the nation's horse racing and breeding industry, according to a statement from the Attorney General's office. Also, a five-person committee, consisting of the three new directors and two current board members not named as defendants in the lawsuit, will be established to recruit a new, full-time chief executive officer for the organization. The lawsuit also claimed the TRF improperly used funds from an endowment from the estate of Paul Mellon to secure loans. Under the settlement, the TRF agreed to not use endowment funds to secure any future loans.

Under the agreement, CEO and board chairman John Moore and director Diana Pikulski will resign from the board of directors within a year of a new CEO being hired. "The settlement reflects the fact that the allegations were baseless all along," commented Pikulski, who will continue on as the TRF's director of external affairs. **Cont. p5**

The third foal of the young Stravinsky mare Whisper Dance was another good result for leading vendor John Kilpatrick's JK Thoroughbreds, which on Monday sold the joint-session-topping filly by Big Bad Bob and offered this colt on behalf of his breeder Stonecross Stud.

"I've seen quite a few of the Dream Ahead foals and they seem to be good types," said Flanagan. "This was a really good colt--he looks fast like his dad--and he's correct with a good walk. He's been bought for a client in Ireland and will be reoffered."

Market Approval

A pair of colts by Approve (Ire) sold for €53,000 and €52,000, demonstrating the market's continuing keenness for the young son of Oasis Dream (GB) who has stood at Morrinstown Lattin Stud since his retirement in 2011. His fee of €5,000 during his first three years looks very reasonable when set against the returns for his first crop of yearlings this season. The 58 sold recorded an average just shy of €30,000. Pinhookers taking a chance on his foals this year will be hoping his first runners are as precocious as he was. Approve broke his maiden on his second start in May and went on to win the G2 Norfolk S. and G2 Gimcrack S.

Michael Fitzpatrick, signing under the name Goodwill Bloodstock, picked up the more expensive of the pair, [lot 269](#), consigned by Harcourt Stud out of Reign Of Fire (Ire) (Perugino), the producer of three juvenile winners to date and a half-sister to GIII Will Rogers S. winner Media Mogul (GB) (First Trump {GB}). Fitzpatrick later also went to €53,000 for a solid Kodiak half-brother to six-time winner Unknown Rebel (Ire) (Night Shift) consigned by Ridge Manor Stud as [lot 412](#).

The young pinhooker enjoyed some profitable touches with his yearlings earlier this season and reinvested €47,000 in another colt ([lot 333](#)) by one of the season's leading first-season sires in Europe, Intense Focus (Ire), and from the further family of GI Acorn S. winner Gabby's Golden Gal (Medaglia d'Oro).

Eddie O'Leary of Lynn Lodge Stud opted for [lot 228](#), the €52,000 Approve colt out the unraced Pennekamp mare Miznapp (GB), who has the listed-placed Clean Bowled (Ire) (Footstepsinthesand {GB})--another Lynn Lodge pinhook--among her winners. The late April colt was consigned by O'Leary's former employee, Ken Carroll, who now operates under the Lewinstown Stud banner and is offering four foals this week.

Roderic's Bestseller

Eamonn Reilly of BBA Ireland, acting on behalf of an unnamed Irish client, plumped for the most expensive first-crop son of G1 Irish 2000 Guineas winner Roderic O'Connor (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) to sell so far, paying €52,000 for the Ballybin Stud offering ([lot 379](#)). He is out of Begin The Beguine (Ire) (Peintre Celebre), a granddaughter of Lord Howard de Walden's good broodmare La Papagena (GB), the dam of Grand Lodge.

Another youngster who will be returning to the sales ring before too long is the Arcano (Ire) colt out of Manuelita Rose (Ity) (Desert Style {Ire}) ([lot 215](#)), who will join Tally Ho Stud's yearling draft for next year after being knocked down for €44,000.

Charlie Vigors of Wiltshire-based Hillwood Stud has made the trip to Ireland with his wife and business partner Tracy and stepped in for [lot 275](#), a Dandy Man (Ire) colt offered by Tom Whelan's Church View Stables on behalf of his breeder David Harrison. The winning bid of €40,000--trumping the O'Callaghan team of underbidders from Yeomanstown Stud--was a welcome one for Harrison, who, until a fortnight ago owned just one mare, this colt's dam, Roskeen (Ire) (Grand Lodge).

"She's been with me from the start and has been great," said Harrison, a former stallion man at Darley's Kildangan Stud who is based in Kildare close to Whelan's farm. "Tom's been a great help to me and I can't thank his team enough for this. There was plenty of interest in the colt, which was a relief."

Harrison doubled the size of his broodmare band recently when purchasing the winning Cheveley Park Stud filly Lyric Piece (GB) (Dutch Art {GB}) for 35,000gns at Tattersalls Horses-in-Training Sale. Roskeen was unraced herself, but has already produced two winners--Zahr Alyasmeen (Ire) (Iffraaj {GB}) and Great Crested (Ire) (Clodovil {Ire}).

The third of four days of foal trade at Goffs begins today at 11 a.m. local time.

TRF SETTLES NY LAWSUIT

"We're looking forward to moving ahead with our important mission without this litigation hanging over us," Pikulski continued.

"Our herd--just under 1,000 horses--remains in fine condition as we head into winter, just as it has been throughout this entire ordeal," Moore said in a statement. "We are relieved to have behind us this nuisance suit that the NYAG should be embarrassed to have initiated. It has been costly, a serious distraction, and a waste of both the taxpayers' money and the scarce time and attention of our small and dedicated staff."

In a statement regarding the settlement, Schneiderman said, "New York needs the Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation to be fiscally sound and responsibly managed."

"Our agreement to remake the board of directors will help put this important charity back on solid financial ground and able to care for the animals it receives--and it gives TRF a shot to reclaim its place as one of America's leading Thoroughbred organizations. As it was previously constituted, the foundation's board proved unable to conduct necessary financial oversight and management."

According to TRF attorney Barry Ostrager, there will be no changes to the TRF's governance. "The Board is free to add directors if it wishes in addition to the three new 'independent' directors," Ostrager said in a statement. "The Executive Director will report to the TRF Chairman and the Board. There are no surviving claims or sanctions with respect to any fiscal issues. All claims were dismissed with prejudice and the 'defendants' are immunized from any liability."

Power Broker Retired to Hill 'n' Dale

GI FrontRunner S. winner **Power Broker** (Pulpit--Shop Again, by Wild Again) has been retired from racing and will stand the 2014 season at Hill 'n' Dale Farm for a fee of \$10,000.

The \$360,000 KEESEP yearling broke his maiden when taking the FrontRunner as a juvenile under the colors of Gary and Mary West. As a 3-year-old, he captured Belmont's Easy Goer S. June 8 before rounding out his career with

a second in the GI Haskell Invitational July 28 and a victory in the GI Indiana Derby Oct. 5 for trainer Bob Baffert. Power Broker is out of a stakes-winning half-sister to GISW Miss Shop (Deputy Minister) and GSW Trappe Shot (Tapit). "Power Broker was a grade I-winning 2-year-old who trained on," said John Sikura, President of Hill 'n' Dale Farms.

"He is by an important sire of sires, who has sired the likes of Leading Sire Tapit. This pedigree continues to deepen with graded stakes performers and is highly respected in the sales ring. We expect him to be very popular with breeders. The West's racing and breeding operation is first class, and they will be supporting the horse with very nice mares." Power Broker retires with a lifetime record of 10-4-2-1 and earnings of \$865,612.

EURO DEBUTANTES

Europe's three major season-ending mixed sales are already underway. Today is the third of four days of Goffs' November Foal Sale, to be followed on Friday and Saturday by mares and fillies. The exception are the foals and yearlings in Paul Makin's Paulyn Dispersal on Friday, featuring six filly foals--three by Galileo and one each by Dansili, Oasis Dream, and Montjeu--followed by the sale of Chicquita (Montjeu), second to subsequent Prix de l'Arc winner Treve in the G1 Prix de Diane, then winner of the G1 Irish Oaks in her only subsequent start.

There were three \$4-million-plus mares in Kentucky this month, and there figure to be three more in the European sales: Chicquita at Goffs; and, in Newmarket, G1 Epsom Oaks winner Dancing Rain (in foal to Frankel), and Immortal Verse (in foal to Dansili), the top 3-year-old mile filly of 2011, when she won the G1 Coronation S. at Royal Ascot and followed that up by beating three-time G1 Breeders' Cup Mile winner Goldikova in the G1 Prix Jacques le Marois at Deauville. Dancing Rain and Immortal Verse are the respective highlights of the Monday and Tuesday sessions of Tattersalls' December Sale at Newmarket, Dec. 2-3. Tattersalls sells yearlings next Monday, foals Tuesday-Saturday (that includes Thanksgiving Day, for any visiting Americans), and "Mares, etc." the following week. Then Arqana wraps up the sales season with their Mixed Sale in Deauville, Dec. 7-10.

This week sees the sale debuts of foals from the first crops of 10 different sires who are represented by 10 or more weanlings catalogued among the three sales. In fact, 2011 G1 Epsom Derby winner **Pour Moi** (Montjeu) has the fewest catalogued among the double-digit debutantes--18, starting with eight this week at Goffs; nine next week at Tattersalls; and one at Arqana. In all, the 10 sires have 375 foals catalogued--an average of 37.5 per sire! None, however, stood for more than the €20,000 fee at which Pour Moi debuted in 2012.

Eight of the 10 sires are based in Ireland, including three at Coolmore, two at Ballyhane, and one each at Ballylinch, Rathbarry, and Islanmore--the original home of Big Bad Bob and now the residence of his close relation **Elusive Pimpernel** (Elusive Quality), featured in Emma Berry's opening-day Goffs coverage yesterday. Cara Fantasy, Elusive Pimpernel's dam, is a considerably younger half-sister of Persian Fantasy, granddam of Big Bad Bob and third dam of Snow Fairy. Elusive Pimpernel won the G3 Acomb S. at York, then ran second to St. Nicholas Abbey in the G1 Racing Post Trophy at two, and won the G3 Craven S. at three before running a close fifth to Makfi in the 2011 G1 English 2000 Guineas.

That's even better form than Big Bad Bob had when he went to stud, and when the Big Bad Bob team priced Elusive Pimpernel at €1,500, breeders took the hint. There were 20 foals from his first crop selling at Goffs this week (most have sold already), plus one at Tatts' next week.

After Pour Moi at €20,000, two sires were tied for the next highest 2012 entering stud fee, at €17,500 each: **Canford Cliffs** (Tagula) at Coolmore, and **Dream Ahead** (Diktat) at Ballylinch. Both had form with Frankel (Galileo), unbeaten in 14 starts and rated 147--the highest ever, in 65 years of rating horses--by *Timeform*. A whole generation of stallion prospects have to be rated on how close they got to Frankel, and what they did when they didn't have to run against him. Horses like **Excelebration** (Exceed and Excel), who went to stud this year and has his first mares selling in foal (as does Frankel) and **Farhh** (Pivotal)--who goes to stud next year--have had their reputations enhanced by themselves turning around and trouncing lesser Group 1 rivals after placing behind Frankel. Excelebration ran second four times and third once behind Frankel, yet won three Group 1's, including an impressive three-length win in the 2012 G1 Queen Elizabeth S. on British Champions' Day, in Frankel's absence. Frankel had stepped up to 10 furlongs by that time, and closed out his career that day with an easy win over Cirrus des Aigles in the G1 Champion S. Previously, he had twice trounced Farhh, by six lengths and seven lengths in the G1 Sussex (one mile) and G1 Juddmonte International (10 1/2 furlongs), respectively. In his only subsequent start last year, Farhh was beaten a head by Moonlight Cloud, back at a mile, in the G1 Prix du Moulin de Longchamp. This year Farhh went two-for-two, winning the G1 Lockinge S. at Newbury (one mile) in May, then coming back to beat Cirrus des Aigles himself in the G1 Champion S. on British Champions' Day last month.

Canford Cliffs only met Frankel once, in what proved to be his final career start, the 2011 G1 Sussex S., when Frankel was three and Canford Cliffs was four. Winner of the prestigious 2009 G2 Coventry S. at Royal Ascot, Canford Cliffs stuck to that trip when third to Arcano in the G1 Prix Morny in what proved to be his final start at two. Brought back as a miler in 2010 by the Hannon team, he was upset by stablemate Dick Turpin (Arakan) in the seven-furlong G3 Greenham S., then was third behind Makfi and Dick Turpin in the G1 English 2000 Guineas at a mile. Then he went on a tear, winning the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas, the G1 St. James's Palace S. at Royal Ascot, and the G1 Sussex S. (defeating the year-old Rip Van Winkle). That got the attention of the Coolmore boys, and when Canford Cliffs returned at four in 2011, the Coolmore team were part-owners. He duly won the G1 Lockinge, defeated Goldikova in the one-mile G1 Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot for his fifth consecutive Group 1 win--and then met Frankel, then a 3-year-old meeting older horses for the first time. Canford Cliffs was probably beaten when he went wrong, ended up five lengths second to Frankel in a four-horse field, and never ran again. There are 38 foals from Canford Cliffs' first crop selling over the next couple of weeks.

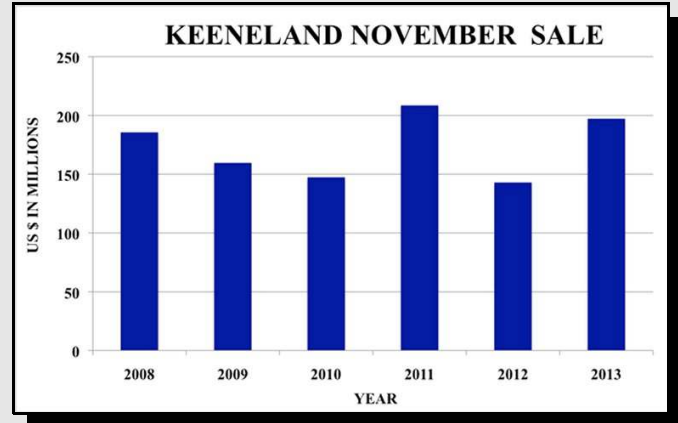

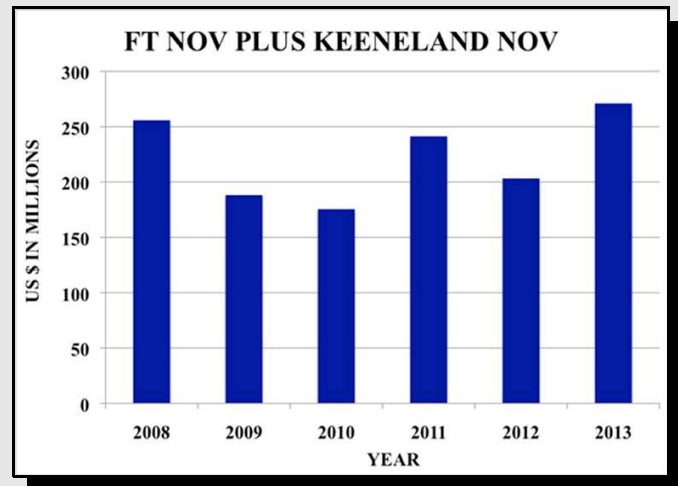
"The Kentucky November Mixed sales completed an incredible run last week with a total 33% gain (nearly \$68-million) in revenue and an average of \$104,814 for 2,586 horses sold. Keeneland itself was up \$54-million, or 38% in average; between their September and November sales, their gross is up \$115-million from last year. Incredibly, compared to the 2008 (immediately post-crash) November sales, over 2,000 fewer (38%) horses were catalogued, but just 17% (514) fewer sold as the clearance rate from the catalogues improved from 53% to 68%."

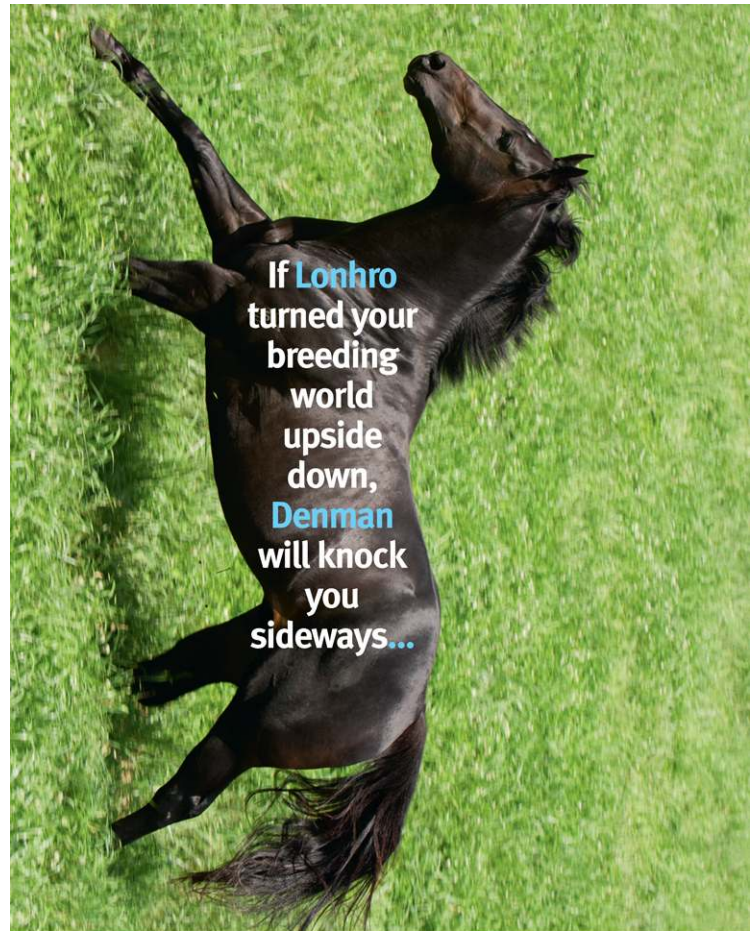

Dick Turpin, for his part, had won his first four starts at two, all at six furlongs, including the G2 Richmond S. at Goodwood, then was beaten twice at seven furlongs in two top Group 1 races, the 'Lagadere' on Arc day, and the G1 Dewhurst. As noted above, he came out at three and twice finished in front of Canford Cliffs, when upsetting him in the G3 Greenham, then when running second to Makfi (Canford Cliffs third) in the G1 English 2000 Guineas. Dick Turpin then ran second to Lope de Vega in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains; and second again, this time to Canford Cliffs, in the G1 St. James's Palace S., before winning the G1 Prix Jean Prat--all at a mile. At four in 2011, Dick Turpin won two Group 2 races over a mile in England and a Group 1 in Italy, and was fifth behind Frankel in the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. on the inaugural British Champions Day. Like Canford Cliffs, he was a relatively inexpensive purchase by Peter and Ross Doyle for the Hannon team (Canford Cliffs was £50,000 from Doncaster; Dick Turpin cost €26,000 from Tattersalls Ireland), Dick Turpin stands at the English National Stud, and 23 foals from his first crop are in the sales.

Dream Ahead had sold for just \$11,000 as a yearling at Keeneland in September 2009, and was a £36,000 purchase by Blandford Bloodstock for Khalifa Dasmal as a Doncaster 2-year-old in 2010.

Trained by David Simcock, he won his first three starts at six furlongs, including the G1 Prix Morny in his second start, and a nine-length trouncing of Strong Suit in the G1 Middle Park S., on soft ground, in his third start. Then Dream Ahead took on Frankel in the G1 Dewhurst at seven furlongs, trying to achieve the Middle Park-Dewhurst double last completed by Diesis (now they are run on the same day as part of the British Champions Series, in which the top British 2-year-old races are now so muddled up that no one, including the organizers, know what's what, or even what's supposed to be what). He was a soundly beaten fifth of sixth, after which Dream Ahead's connections were pleasantly surprised to find their horse had been rated co-champion European 2-Year-Old, along with Frankel, with Official Ratings of 126. Dream Ahead tried Frankel once again, in the 2011 G1 English 2000 Guineas, in which Frankel destroyed the opposition with a 10-length lead after the first half-mile; Dream Ahead was fifth that day, and reverted to sprinting. In fact, Dream Ahead was unbeaten in all of his five starts at six furlongs, four of which came in Group 1 races; he twice defeated Bated Breath in six-furlong Group 1 races at three, the July S. at Newmarket, and the Haydock Sprint Cup, and added a fifth Group 1 when defeating Goldikova in the G1 Prix de la Foret at seven furlongs. There are 38 foals from Dream Ahead's first crop catalogued for the sales, coincidentally the same number as Canford Cliffs.

The Coolmore team figured as the owners of two more of the Irish sires with first foals selling this week, **Zoffany** (Dansili), who they kept for stud, and **Roderic O'Connor**, one of four 2011 Classic winners by Galileo out of Danehill mares, who they sold, and who now stands at Ballyhane Stud. Zoffany won five of his seven starts at two, including the G1 Phoenix S. at six furlongs, and was third in the G1 National S., to Pathfork. At three Zoffany ran second in two Group 1's, including when nearly catching Frankel, in what the latter's jockey, Tom Queally, described as the worst ride he ever gave Frankel, in the G1 St. James's Palace S. at Royal Ascot. Roderic O'Connor was second to Frankel in the 2010 G1 Dewhurst S. and won the 2011 G1 Irish 2000 Guineas. There are 59 foals from Zoffany's first crop catalogued to sell (42 this week), while Roderic O'Connor has 43.

Rathbarry Stud stands Acclamation, and added his son, **Lilbourne Lad**, to their roster after his successful 2-year-old campaign in 2011 which saw him win three of his first four starts, including the G2 Railway S. at The Curragh, and run second in the G1 Middle Park S. The idea is to try and emulate Dark Angel, another son of Acclamation who was retired after his 2-year-old campaign and has become a very successful sire, including of 4-year-olds--like Lethal Force. There are 46 foals from Lilbourne's Lad's first crop at the sales. Another at Ballyhane, along with Roderic O'Connor, is Frozen Power, a son of Oasis Dream who raced for Godolphin, and won the G2 German 2000 Guineas in 2010.

The type of sire Ballyhane invariably does well with, there are 54 foals from Frozen Power's first crop at the sales, including 45 this week. There's a preponderance of stallions standing in Ireland among this group, as you can see, and the more expensive of the two with 10+ catalogued at the sales who stand in England is **Poet's Voice**, from Dubawi's first crop. Racing for Godolphin, he won the G2 Champagne S. at Doncaster at two, and the G2 Celebration Mile and G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. at three, defeating Rip Van Winkle. A popular choice for those who can't get in to Dubawi since he's become a complete superstar and Europe's number two sire, behind only Galileo, there are 35 foals from Poet's Voice's first crop catalogued for the sales, 30 of them at Tattersalls next week.

THE FRANKEL FACTOR (Continued)

For two or three years, the Tsui family's Sea The Stars, a half-brother to Galileo, no less, by Cape Cross, was hailed as 'the Secretariat of Europe.' He went six-for-six as a 3-year-old in 2009, winning the G1 English 2000 Guineas, the G1 Epsom Derby, and the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe. In between the Derby and the Arc, he ran three times at 10 furlongs, defeating top-class Coolmore horses (Rip Van Winkle, Mastercraftsman, and Fame and Glory in the G1 Eclipse, the G1 Juddmonte International, and the G1 Irish Champion S., respectively) in each. He earned a rating of 140 from Timeform at the end of the year.




Then along came **Frankel**. Named after the legendary Bobby Frankel, Juddmonte's long-time trainer in California, who had died in 2009, Frankel was trained by another legend, Sir Henry Cecil, and in retrospect probably Frankel, and his wife, Lady Jane, were what kept Henry going the last few years, and as everyone knows he finally lost his battle against cancer earlier this year. It's a sad postscript to the career of quite possibly the greatest racehorse we've ever seen, but at least Henry was able to mastermind his career in what became his last, and possibly greatest accomplishment of a brilliant career.

Frankel ran four times at two, winning the G2 Royal Lodge S. at a mile in his third start, then backing up in distance to win the G1 Dewhurst at seven furlongs over subsequent G1 Irish 2000 Guineas winner Roderic O'Connor. He had a tune-up in the seven-furlong G3 Greenham at Newbury in April of 2011 in his first start at three, knocking off Excelebration for the first of five times. He had the G1 English 2000 Guineas won after a half-mile, scorching out to a 10-length lead and sauntering home. He then won the G1 St. James's Palace S. at Royal Ascot--effectively the European Mile championship for 3-year-olds--where he hung on by 3/4 of a length from the fast-finishing Zoffany after his dedicated pilot, Tom Queally, who rode him in all of his 14 starts, by his own admission panicked and let Frankel open up too soon. He didn't make that mistake again.


Frankel finished off his 2011 campaign by winning two more mile races, by five lengths from Canford Cliffs in the G1 Sussex S., and by four lengths over Excelebration in the G1 Queen Elizabeth S. on the inaugural British Champions Day card. Last year, as a 4-year-old, Frankel went five-for-five, never starting at odds higher than 30 cents on the dollar. He won three races at a mile, defeating Excelebration in the first two, the G1 Lockinge S. and the G1 Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot (by 11 lengths), then defeating Farhh by six lengths in the G1 Sussex S. He and Farhh both stepped up to 10 1/2 furlongs for the G1 Juddmonte International--there the margin was seven lengths. Frankel signed off with an easy 1 3/4-length win over mudlark Cirrus des Aigles back at Ascot for the second British Champions Day, in the G1 Champion S., also at 10 furlongs. As noted above, *Timeform* awarded Frankel a rating of 147--the highest ever--at the end of last year, and the fact that horses he easily handled--Excelebration, Farhh, and Cirrus des Aigles--themselves dominated Group 1 company when Frankel wasn't in town does suggest the ratings, and the form, are absolutely rock-solid.

Four mares in foal to Frankel have already averaged \$1,437,500 at the American sales, and there are 12 catalogued in Europe, two at Goffs and 10 at Tattersalls, including G1 Epsom Oaks winner Dancing Rain. They'll lift the average, that's for sure. A total of 15 stallions which covered their first mares in 2013 are represented by 10 or more mares in foal at the upcoming sales, including four with 20 or more catalogued.

Excelebration, who as noted above dominated the 2012 G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. at a mile after Frankel stepped up to 10 furlongs, has 22 mares catalogued in foal. Yet another with form behind Frankel is Newsells **Park's Nathaniel**, a son of Galileo out of the blue hen Magnificent Style (making him a 3/4-brother to the \$10.5-million broodmare, Playful Act) who was trained for Lady Rothschild by John Gosden. Nathaniel met Frankel twice, in the first and last of his 11 career starts. He was beaten 3/4-length by Frankel in a one-mile maiden race at Newmarket when both made their first starts as 2-year-olds, then finished third behind Frankel and Cirrus des Aigles in his and Frankel's final start, the G1 Champion S. at 10 furlongs in the 2012 edition of British Champions' Day. In between Nathaniel established himself as another top-class performer when out of Frankel's shadow: he defeated the previous year's G1 Epsom Derby winner Workforce in the G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth S. as a 3-year-old; at four in 2012, Nathaniel defeated Farhh in the G1 Eclipse S. at 10 furlongs, then went down by a nose to the previous year's 'Arc' winner, Danedream, in the 2012 'King George', and was second to Snow Fairy in the G1 Irish Champion S. before his final run at Ascot. Nathaniel's consistency was such that he was rated RPR 127 in four of his last five starts. Nathaniel stood his first season at Newsells for £20,000 this year, and there are 20 mares catalogued in foal to him at the sales. Excelebration, Farhh, Cirrus des Aigles, Nathaniel--the form of all four of these horses both with Frankel and without him is exceptionally strong.

Two stallions which figure to have considerable appeal to breeders who like speed and precocity have the highest number of in-foal mares catalogued among first-year covering sires: Juddmonte's **Bated Breath** (Dansili, 34 catalogued) and Tweenhills' **Harbour Watch** (Acclamation), with 25. Bated Breath was a Group 2 winner who was beaten a total of 1 1/2 lengths in four different Group 1 sprints; his own sire, Dansili, never won a Group 1 either (neither did Distorted Humor, Pulpit, or War Front), and look how well they've all done. Harbour Watch was another Peter Doyle yearling buy for Richard Hannon (58,000gns. from Tattersalls), and won his first three starts impressively, including the G2 Richmond S. at Goodwood, but, a piece of him having been bought by the young Qatari owner, Sheikh Fahad Al Thani, injury intervened, and Harbour Watch never did get back to the races. But by Acclamation, already a successful sire of sires with Dark Angel, and with a towering reputation as a 2-year-old, Harbour Watch is another sure to have a big following among commercial breeders. Bated Breath stood for £8,000 this year, Harbour Watch for £7,500.

"The disciplinary panel hearing involving Gerard Butler has concluded this afternoon," tweeted the BHA. "Panel will now consider evidence before publishing result, any penalties that may apply and reasons for their decisions in due course. It is unlikely that result, penalty and reasons will be published before end of this week. [The] BHA cannot comment further until this time."

"The 2013 Autumn Sale posted results which were in all points similar to last year, with a strong interest in horses with good jumps profiles," Arqana Chairman Eric Hoyer commented. "The number of yearlings sold at this year's four sales is close to a thousand, with a record figure of €54 million, up by 26% compared to last year. This year, the market has shown a genuine vitality across its different segments. The range of different sales was beneficial to both vendors and buyers, who had the advantage of true benchmarks. HOLY ROMAN EMPEROR COLT TOPS NZB SALE

The opening session of New Zealand Bloodstock's Ready to Run Sale at Karaka produced increases, with the average up 13% and the median up 4.8% from 2012 figures. During the session, 107 lots sold for \$8,787,500. The average was NZ\$82,126 and the median was NZ\$55,000. The buy-back rate was 43%. A year ago, 111 juveniles grossed NZ\$8,063,000 for an average of NZ\$72,640 and a median of NZ\$52,500.

A colt by Holy Roman Emperor (Ire) topped the session when selling for NZ\$320,000 (US\$197,336) to Anton Koolman's Fraternity Thoroughbreds. Out of Rule the Waves (Aus) (King's Best), [lot 201](#) was consigned by Lyndhurst Farm. The juvenile's second dam is group winner and multiple Group 1 placed Regal Sea (NZ) (Dahar). Koolman and his wife Margaret had been absent from Karaka in recent years, but purchased two lots Tuesday. The couple also paid NZ\$240,000 for a colt by Exceed and Excel (Aus) ([lot 155](#)).

"I'm not a committed breeze-up sale guy and I haven't bought here for a while, but we have found a few we like," commented Anton Koolman "I liked [lot 201]'s type and Holy Roman Emperor is going well in Hong Kong and Singapore so, although he was a lot of money, we wanted him and were prepared for that. He'll go to Australia and then on to Hong Kong to be trained by Paul O'Sullivan."

Willie Leung's Magus Equine secured the day's second highest priced lot, going to NZ\$300,000 for a gelding by Bernardini out of Miguelita (Aus) (Danahill). [Lot 122](#) was also consigned by Lyndhurst Farm.

"I love Bernardini and paid a bit more than I expected to for this horse, but Bernardini is doing very well in Australia and America at the moment," said Leung. "This horse is a big, strong mover and I know he'll take a little bit more time to strengthen up, so I will leave him in New Zealand for more education before sending him up to Hong Kong. The New Zealand Ready to Run Sale always brings me a bit of luck, so I always enjoy coming here to buy."

At the close of business Tuesday, NZB Co-Managing Director Petrea Vela said she was happy with the depth of the buying bench.

"We are very pleased with the strong and diverse international buying bench we've got here at Karaka, as strong as we've ever seen," Vela commented. "There's very good competition on a number of the horses on offer, which has been reflected in the average and median far exceeding last year's records. This is the second biggest Ready to Run catalogue we've had here in over 10 years and, with the increased numbers, matching last year's clearance rate was always going to be a challenge and that has proven the case. After some quiet patches early on, it picked up over the afternoon and hopefully we can see some strengthening to the clearance again tomorrow."

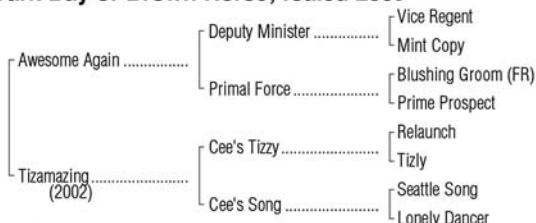
