GLITTERING JEWEL CHICQUITA SETS RECORD

Widely billed as the 'jewel in the crown' of one of the best credentialed bloodstock dispersals in living memory, **Chicquita (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}) held the packed ring at Goffs in her thrall as she became the most expensive Thoroughbred ever sold at public auction in Ireland at €6 million. Peter and Ross Doyle eventually prevailed in a protracted bidding duel with James McHale. Neither party would divulge for whom they were operating, with Peter Doyle confirming the Irish Oaks winner was bought by a "very good long-term client," while McHale was acting for "overseas clients." Chicquita (lot 1128) was the last of 24 lots through the ring from Paul and Lyndall Makin's distinguished Paulyn Dispersal and, echoing the audacious bidding style of Makin himself, McHale leapt straight into the fray, opening the bidding at a cool €3 million.

A game of high-stakes ping pong ensued as the Doyles, to the hard left of auctioneer Henry Beeby, exchanged fire with McHale tucked out of their sight to Beeby's right and taking telephone instructions.

When questioned as to his reason for selling Chicquita after her last-start Classic victory, Makin--famed for his enjoyment of sales ring theatre--said he was "selling on the sizzle." Sizzle the filly certainly did, bringing the curtain down on several hours of enthralling entertainment for bloodstock enthusiasts as blueblood followed blueblood into the arena. Even without the Paulyn Dispersal, the figures for the first day of the November Mares' Sale rocketed, with a 51% rise in turnover to €10,978,200, and a 72% upturn in average to €71,753. The median was also up, by 15%, to €23,000, while the clearance rate soared by 10 points to 85%. For the 24-lot Paulyn Dispersal, a total of €12,734,000 was accrued at an average of €530,583, bringing a first-day tally of €23,712,200. The turnover for the whole of last year's mare auction was €8,155,500. **Cont. p3**

FOUR INDICTED ON FRAUD CHARGES AT PENN

The United States Attorney's Office for the Middle District of Pennsylvania unsealed indictments against three Penn National-based trainers and a track clocker alleging fraud in connection with races at the Grantville track. Charged individually in separate indictments were trainers David Wells, who most notably orchestrated the 22-race winning streak of Rapid Redux; Sam Webb; and Patricia Anne Rogers; and Danny Robertson, the track clocker. Each of the indicted stands accused of having committed wire fraud. The three trainers are charged with "allegedly devising a scheme to defraud those betting on Thoroughbred races at Penn National Racetrack by attempting to administer, and administering in violation of state racing rules and regulations, substances prohibited from being introduced into a horse within 24 hours of when the horse is scheduled to race." Robertson is accused of falsifying workout times or completely fabricating times for workouts that never occurred, in exchange for cash given to him by trainers both "known and unknown" to the Grand Jury. In that he transmitted this information to Equibase in Kentucky, he too is accused of wire fraud. **Cont. p9**

While Chicquita's final price passed a private offer made to Makin pre-sale by €2 million, the vendor admitted that he was offered a lump sum "superior to the amount fetched in the ring" for the entire dispersal, but turned it down to honor his deal with Goffs.

"I'd have preferred to watch the cricket, but that was fabulous," said Australian-born Makin after leaving the ring.

"We've broken a record in Ireland--I love that--and I also think there were a few bargains there today, but how do you beat €6 million for a gorgeous filly like that? I still think she could have beaten [G1 Arc winner] Treve (Fr) (Motivator {GB}), but I didn't see the point of running her again when I knew I was selling her. She's

only had four starts and I've left her for someone else. Good luck to them."

While Makin admitted that the dispersal brought an end to his involvement in breeding, he won't be turning his back on racing completely.

"I'll still race a few--I'm bound to bid on something in the ring--but I won't breed again."

Having bought back a yearling three-quarter brother to Derby winner Authorized (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) at Tattersalls in October, Makin gave the horse to his son Alexander, who plans to name the Galileo (Ire) colt Blazing Away and race him in his own colors.

Classic Winner Not the Only Draw...

Ever since news of the Paulyn Dispersal broke in early September, the date for the precious collection's appearance in the sales ring has been inked in the diaries of bloodstock professionals around the world, and there was barely room to move in the Goffs auditorium. As the appropriately named colt Achtung (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}), a brother to Derby winner Authorized (Ire) and the first of the draft, appeared in the ring, auctioneer Nick Nugent quipped to the crowd, "We have your attention now, don't we?"

The three colts offered included Gll Swaps S. victor **Chief Havoc** (lot 1105), who brought a bid of €380,000 from John McCormack to race on in Saudi Arabia. Along with Chicquita, two other millionaires

emanated from the dispersal--all 24 offered on Makin's behalf by The Castlebridge Consignment and realizing a total of €12,734,000, with champion sprinter **Fleeting Spirit (Ire)** (Invincible {Ire}) (lot 1120) the second in line. The 8-year-old mare sold in foal to Galileo for €1.1 million, and is

heading to Japan after being signed for by Emmanuel de Seroux standing with Riki Takahashi.

The regally-bred Sadler's Wells mare **Song (Ire)** (lot 1126), bought for Makin by Badgers Bloodstock for 1.7 million guineas in 2009, became the first mare to be offered in foal to Frankel (GB) in Europe, and she will remain in Ireland at Khalid Abdul Rahim's Friarstown Stud. She was bought on his behalf by stud manager John Egan, who is also a jockey and trainer, for €1 million.

"I thought she'd sell for more than that, but we're delighted to have her and she'll be coming back to Friarstown," Egan confirmed.

World Class...

Potential buyers came from around the world to assess the Paulyn stock, and **Sparkle Plenty (Ire)** (lot 1108), a 3-year-old Galileo three-quarter sister to Derby winner Pour Moi (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}), will be heading to France after being bought for €650,000 by Ecurie des Monceaux, who bred Chicquita in partnership with Lady O'Reilly's Skymarc Farm.

"She has plenty in her favour with a beautiful pedigree and a promising young sister who is in the best hands. She's an impressive filly with a lovely frame," said Henri Bozo, who manages Monceaux for Lucien Urano and sold Chicquita as a yearling for €600,000. "It's exciting for us to think that Chicquita is playing such an exciting part in today's sale." Heading further afield to America is **Bounding Away (Ire)** (lot 1111), Fleeting Spirit's Galileo yearling who was signed for on behalf of an unnamed American client by Gordian Troeller at €180,000, while U.S. operatives Alex Solis and Jason Litt were pushed to €260,000 for an Oasis Dream (GB) weanling out of Sir Percy's sister **Lady Karr (GB)** (Mark Of Esteem {Ire}) (lot 1116).

"We came here especially for the dispersal, and it's great to have been able to buy this filly," said Solis. "Oasis Dream has done really well in the U.S., and we thought this was the type of family to take over there. Grass horses are so superior in this part of the world, so you've got to take a shot when you get a chance." **Cont. p5**

Lady Karr herself ([lot 1123](#)) was later sold to Irish-based Eadling Farm for €165,000. The 12-year-old was not in foal after being covered by Invincible Spirit, but has already produced the multiple group winner Mikhail Glinka (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}).

Funsie to Newsells Park Stud...


The Paul Makin-bred Hydrogen (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) led all yearlings in Europe last year when selling for 2.5 million guineas to Sheikh Fahad Al Thani. His dam **Funsie (Fr)** (Saumarez) ([lot 1121](#)) had already found fame as the dam of Derby winner Authorized, but she too was in the dispersal, offered barren, and sold to John Warren for €550,000. Warren was acting on behalf of Newsells Park Stud, the home of Nathaniel (GB) (Galileo {Ire}), but also share-holders in new Royal Studs stallion Al Kazeem (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}), both of whom are under consideration to be the 14-year-old's next mate.

The same price was also paid by Flaxman Stables Ireland for G1 Prix de l'Abbaye winner **Gilt Edge Girl (GB)** (Monsieur Bond {Ire}) ([1122](#)), who was offered in foal to Australian superstar stallion Redoute's Choice (Aus). This was a major draw for the Niarchos family's representative Alan Cooper, who said: "I really like the Redoute's Choice cover, and she's a lovely mare from a family that has produced plenty of good 2-year-olds."

Frankel Fever Continues...

Sneaking into the day's top five among the Paulyn horses was Group 3 winner **Hazel Lavery (Ire)** (Excellent Art {GB}) ([lot 1131](#)), one of the trio of mares sold in foal to Frankel at Goffs. Bought by Eaton Sales last December for 280,000gns, the 4-year-old's cover by the world champion inflated her price tag this time around to €850,000 when eventually knocked down to Ed Sackville.

"She's in foal to the greatest horse the world has ever seen," said the agent, who was acting for an unnamed entity. "She'll be staying in Europe."

The third mare to sell in foal to Frankel was South African Grade 1 winner **Chocolicious (SAf)** (Kahal {GB}) ([lot 1135](#)), who was consigned for Darren Dance's Australian Thoroughbred Bloodstock by Ballyhane Stud. The 6-year-old was bought by agent Oliver St Lawrence for €400,000.

Though overshadowed to a certain extent by the day's events, it's never wise for serious breeders to ignore a draft of fillies and mares from Aga Khan Studs, so there was unsurprisingly decent interest in the Barathea (Ire) mare **Shawara (Ire)** ([lot 1055](#)), the dam of G1 Yorkshire Oaks winner Shareta (Ire) (Sinndar {Ire}), who was sold with a February cover by Sea The Stars (Ire). David and Diane Nagle of Barronstown Stud are her new owners, having parted with €550,000 to secure the half-sister to Classic winner Shawanda (Ire).

Bound for California...

The New Approach (Ire) 3-year-old **Bunairgead (Ire)** ([lot 1150](#)), bred and raced by Jim and Jackie Bolger and the winner of the listed Lenebane S. at Roscommon in July, will race on in America. She was knocked down to agent Gordian Troeller for €520,000 and will be trained in California by Jim Cassidy.

"She was a stand-out in the sale outside the Paulyn Dispersal, and she will continue her racing career for a very good client, Deron Pearson," said Troeller.

Bunairgead is out of Seeking The Gold's listed-winning daughter Montecito, herself a daughter of multiple stakes winner Storm And Sunshine.

Citadel Graduates Also Shine...**

While Makin's horses predictably dominated much of the day's proceedings, there were plenty of highlights from other significant consignments, including the continuation of the dispersal of Gerry Oldham's stock from Citadel Stud. James Delahooke and Barry

Weisbord combined to snare the most expensive of that draft when buying G3 Prix de Flore winner **Albisola (Ire)** (lot 1063) in foal to Arcano (Ire) for €420,000. The 8-year-old's yearling filly by Raven's Pass was sold for €520,000 to Shadwell during last

month's Orby Sale, while her half-sister Tonnara (Ire) is the dam of two recent Group 1 winners in Most Improved (Ire) (Lawman {Fr}) and Ectot (GB) (Hurricane Run {Ire}).

"She's been bought for Bobby Flay and she's likely to stay in Europe," commented Weisbord. "We're trying to assemble a really nice group of mares, and she has a good race record, has produced a good filly and is from a family which produces plenty of good horses. She may well go back to Raven's Pass."

Albisola was followed through the ring by her 4-year-old half-sister **Pembina (Ire)** (Dalakhani {Ire}) (lot 1064), who brought a bid of €400,000 from Adrian Nicoll of BBA Ireland. Both mares were offered by Brendan Hayes' Knocktoran Stud.

Al Kazeem's First Book Grows...

Tim Lane, who manages Welsh-based Oakgrove Stud for John Deer, breeder of treble Group 1 winner Al Kazeem (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}), went to €320,000 for the 4-year-old Anabaa filly **Serenada (Fr)** (lot 1091), who was offered by Rathbarry Stud in foal to their stallion Acclamation (GB). "We'll be buying one or two mares to send to Al Kazeem, and will have a look at Tattersalls and also in France," Lane said. "This is a nice commercial cover and she should produce an early foal. She's from a seriously good family, with nine sisters being bred from at the moment, which is a great help."

Penn National Indictments cont. from p1

In its entirety, the statement from the State's Attorney reads:

The United States Attorney's Office for the Middle District of Pennsylvania announced the unsealing of indictments charging three thoroughbred horse trainers and an employee of Penn National Racetrack in Grantville with fraud in connection with horse races at that track. The indictments were returned by a federal grand jury in Harrisburg on Wednesday and were unsealed following arrests of four individuals earlier today.

According to United States Attorney Peter J. Smith, David Wells, 39, of Grantville, Sam Webb, 63, of Jonestown, Patricia Anne Rogers, 43, of Hummelstown, and Danny Robertson, 63, of Hershey, were charged individually in four separate indictments.

Wells, Webb and Rogers, all horse trainers, were charged with allegedly devising a scheme to defraud those betting on thoroughbred races at Penn National Racetrack by attempting to administer, and administering in violation of state racing rules and regulations, substances prohibited from being introduced into a horse within 24 hours of when the horse is scheduled to race.

The indictment also alleges that it is also a violation of state law to rig or attempt to rig a publicly exhibited contest such as a thoroughbred horse race. Races at Penn National Racetrack are simulcast to approximately 116 sites across the United States and in other countries by wire and television to allow bettors to wager on the Penn National races without being in attendance at that track.

According to the indictment, Robertson was employed by the track as the clocker to provide racing officials and others with the official workout times for horses at Penn National, information relied upon by the betting public. The trainers, like the owners, stand to profit financially from the purse offered for that race if the horse that is entered finishes in first, second or third place.

The indictment charging Webb alleges that Webb was detected by track security personnel on May 2, 2013, in a stall at the racetrack in possession of hypodermic syringes, needles and bottles of medications preparing to inject the horse "Papaleo" that Webb trained and which was scheduled to run in the sixth race that day. The horse was scratched from the race by racing officials.

*The indictment charging Rogers alleges that Rogers was caught by track security personnel on August 21, 2013, at a stall at the racetrack in possession of hypodermic syringes and needles and bottles of medications and was observed injecting or attempting to inject a substance into a horse named "Strong Resolve" that she trained and that was scheduled to run in the second race that day. The horse was scratched from the race by racing officials. Rogers was also charged with conspiring with a person known to the grand jury to attempt to commit wire fraud. **Cont. p10***

Penn National Indictments cont.

The indictment charging Wells alleges that Wells, both a trainer and horse owner, for several years up to and including February 2012, would routinely inject prohibited substances into horses he trained and other horses he both trained and owned, by use of hypodermic syringes and needles and otherwise. It is also alleged that Wells was routinely in possession of those prohibited items at the racetrack in violation of state rules, regulations and laws.

The indictment charging Robertson alleges that Robertson was an employee of the racetrack, working in the capacity of clocker whose duties included being present when horses would have their official workout. Robertson was to verify that the horse being timed was the actual horse the trainer represented it to be, to accurately record the distance each horse ran, and the time it ran that distance in and then to provide that information to racing officials for inclusion in the official public daily racing program.

Robertson also allegedly sent the workout time information interstate by wire via computer to Equibase, a Kentucky based company that provides information on a racehorse's past performance and workout times to media outlets and publications as well as on its own website. The workout time information is allegedly relied upon by the betting public in deciding which horses to wager on in any given race.

The Robertson indictment alleges that Robertson, in exchange for cash given to him by trainers known and unknown to the grand jury, would provide false workout times to racing officials and to Equibase. The times Robertson turned in allegedly, at times, included completely fabricated time for horses that did not workout at all at the track. The indictment alleges Robertson profited personally from the scheme, the betting public was defrauded and Robertson's employer, Hollywood Casino and Racetrack, was denied of its right to Robertson's honest services.

The investigation which is continuing is being conducted by the Harrisburg office of the FBI, the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture's Horse Racing Commission, the Pennsylvania State Police, the Dauphin County District Attorney's Office, and the U.S. Department of Agriculture.

Each defendant faces up to 20 years imprisonment and a \$250,000.00 fine if convicted of wire fraud or attempted wire fraud. Each defendant faces an additional 5 years imprisonment and a \$250,000.00 fine if convicted of using and attempting to use the intestate wire mechanism provided by the simulcasting of races to defraud or for attempting to defraud the public through the rigging of a publicly exhibited contest in violation of state law. Rogers faces an additional potential 20 year term of imprisonment and a \$250,000.00 fine if convicted of the charge of conspiring to commit wire fraud.

Prosecution has been assigned to Assistant U.S. Attorney William A. Behe.

The case has been assigned to Senior U.S. District Court Judge William W. Caldwell.

Indictments and Criminal Informations are only allegations. All persons charged are presumed to be innocent unless and until found guilty in court.

A sentence following a finding of guilty is imposed by the Judge after consideration of the applicable federal sentencing statutes and the Federal Sentencing Guidelines.

Under the Federal Sentencing Guidelines, the Judge is also required to consider and weigh a number of factors, including the nature, circumstances and seriousness of the offense; the history and characteristics of the defendant; and the need to punish the defendant, protect the public and provide for the defendant's educational, vocational and medical needs. For these reasons, the statutory maximum penalty for the offense is not an accurate indicator of the potential sentence for a specific defendant.

On behalf of the track's parent company Penn National Gaming, Director of Operations Dan Silver released a statement saying:

"Management at Hollywood Casino at Penn National Race Course has confirmed that four individuals were arrested on track property Friday morning. Three of the individuals were licensed trainers that run horses at the racetrack and the fourth was an employee of the track. The employee has been suspended without pay pending the outcome of the investigation. The trainers in question are not employees at Penn National. Management is awaiting taking any possible action pending determination by the Pennsylvania State Horse Racing Commission on the status of the trainers' licenses. Hollywood Casino takes this matter very seriously and will cooperate fully with law enforcement for the swift settlement of these issues."

JACKPOT COAST IS CLEAR

This year's renewal of the GIII Delta Jackpot S. has big shoes to follow, in a sense. Last year's running featured Itsmyluckyday (Lawyer Ron) and Mylute (Midnight Lute), horses who would go on to fill out the minor placings behind Oxbow (Awesome Again) in the GI Preakness S. this past May; while 2012 Jackpot winner Goldencents (Into Mischief) is in line for a potential Eclipse Award after posting a sensational victory in the GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile three weeks ago. Whether the 10 freshman colts and geldings set to go postward this afternoon will achieve such heights will be learned later, but the 'now' horse appears to be John Oxley's **Coastline** (Speightstown), pegged as the 5-2 morning-line favorite. BAFFERT EXONERATED IN SUDDEN DEATH CASE

A 26-page report issued Thursday absolves trainer Bob Baffert of any guilt in a case surrounding a cluster of seven sudden deaths of horses stabled at Hollywood Park between November 2011 and March 2013. "There is no evidence whatsoever that California Horse Racing Board (CHRB) rules or regulations have been violated or any improper activity played a part in the sudden deaths," the report stated, adding that Baffert and his employees were fully cooperative during the course on the investigation. Of the seven horses that died, three had definitive diagnoses; three had presumptive diagnoses with specific pathological finding; and one remains unexplained, with a suspected diagnosis of cardiac failure as a result of 'mild-moderate A-V node inflammation.' While deeming the cluster of deaths as "exceptional," the report indicates that no illicit activity contributed to the situation. The report describes the use of medication and veterinary services, at least as it relates to the seven deceased horses, as 'moderate.' The report specifically addressed the barn's use of the substance Thyro-L (Levothyroxine) and called the blanket prescribing to all horses in the barn 'unusual' while acknowledging its widespread use at the racetrack. In the case of the Baffert barn, the report observes that the use of the thyroid hormone was more of a supplement than that of a medication. Baffert told investigators that he had been using the product for over five years, as he thought it helped to 'build up' his horses, though it is well known that the product is commonly used to assist in weight loss. Baffert told investigators he discontinued the use of the product in April following an internal review of his supplement program. Baffert expressed relief that he had been deemed not guilty, saying on Twitter: "I'm gratified that CHRB completed its investigation and found there was no wrongdoing. My focus will always be on the best care for my horses."

OAKS WINNER BELIEVE YOU CAN RETIRED

Breton C. Jones's **Believe You Can** (Proud Citizen--El Fasto, by El Prado {Ire}), upset winner of the 2012 GI Kentucky Oaks, has been retired from racing, it was announced Friday. Bred by her owner, the dark bay won three of her five juvenile appearances, including the GIII Tempted S. and added the Silverbulletday S. and GII Fair Grounds Oaks before posting a 13-1 surprise on the first Friday in May. It was the second Oaks win in five years for Jones, who won the 2008 running with Proud Spell, another daughter of Proud Citizen. Kept in training this season at four, Believe You Can won the Tiffany Lass S. by 10 1/4 lengths Feb. 2 and the Mar. 9 New Orleans Ladies' S. by better than five lengths. She was aiming for a start in the GII Falls City H. Nov. 28, but did not train to the satisfaction of Larry Jones and was shipped to her owner's Airdrie Stud in Lexington. Believe You Can heads to the breeding shed with eight wins from her 14 career trips to the post and earnings of \$1,280,324.



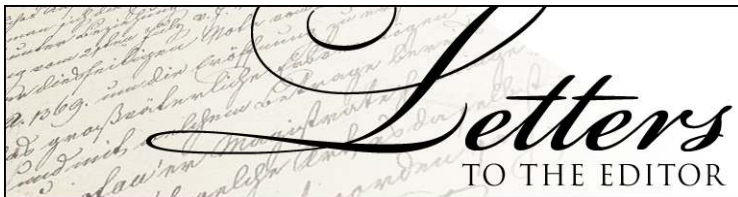
RACETRACK ROUND-UP

Will Take Charge Drills for Clark...

The GI Breeders' Cup Classic runner-up **Will Take Charge** (Unbridled's Song) put in his final breeze in preparation for the GI Clark H. at Churchill Downs Nov. 29. The Willis Horton colorbearer worked five furlongs in 1:01, the seventh fastest of 23 works. The GI Travers S. hero clocked splits of :12.40, :24, and :35.40 and he galloped out six furlongs in 1:16.40. Trainer D. Wayne Lukas was pleased with the work. "He just ran," Lukas said. "It's 27 days from the Breeders' Cup to the Clark, so he really didn't need a lot. He's really thriving and it's kind of surprising. I thought maybe the Breeders' Cup would set him back and we might have to give him a month or so to fill up, but that hasn't been the case. I don't know if it's because he's home here and he's eating better, but he's really had a good three or four weeks."

Clark Heavyweights Are Also Highweights...

Multiple Grade I winner **Game On Dude** (Awesome Again) and impressive sophomore **Will Take Charge** (Unbridled's Song) were assigned the highest weights for Churchill Downs' GI Clark H. Nov. 29. Bob Baffert trainee **Game On Dude** was assigned 126 pounds, while D. Wayne Lukas pupil **Will Take Charge** received 123 due to his age. Baffert will work **Game On Dude** over the weekend and take the weight into consideration in making his final decision on shipping to Churchill. "They've weighted him like he's Horse of the Year, so I guess that's a compliment," Baffert said. "I'm glad Huffman isn't down on the horse like everyone else is." Assigned weights for other likely starters in the Clark include: **Golden Ticket** (Speightstown), 120; **Prayer for Relief** (Jump Start), 118, **Bourbon Courage** (Lion Heart), 117; **Easter Gift** (Hard Spun), 116; **Finnegans Wake** (Powerscourt {GB}), 116; and **Jaguar Paw** (Giant's Causeway), 115.



INJUSTICE

I was reading an article the other day about how Michael Vick served 21 months in prison followed by two months of home confinement for fighting dogs. While dog fighting is outlawed in every state, it was not the state of Georgia that prosecuted Vick, but instead it was the federal government! Such actions are extremely rare.

Mr. Vick was charged by a federal grand jury with violating federal law 18 USC 371, conspiring to travel in interstate commerce in aid of unlawful activities. Under our Constitution, the federal government has jurisdiction over an activity otherwise regulated by the state if that activity affects interstate commerce.

Sadly, the federal government's compassion shown for pit bull dogs has been absent in the terrible mistreatment of Thoroughbred horses that is occurring daily at racetracks across America. Every week in the United States 24 Thoroughbred horses die while racing and countless others are broken down and maimed for the rest of their lives because they are being drugged to enhance their performance. These wonderful animals are given countless numbers of so-called "therapeutic" drugs that are in essence performance enhancing drugs. These include pain killers like Butazolidin, which thins the blood causing horses to bleed, and of course Lasix to remedy the bleeding. Lasix has also been proven to leach calcium from the bones of human beings which makes them susceptible to more fractures, etc.

By enacting the Interstate Horseracing Act of 1978 ("IHA") the federal government has allowed the simulcasting of races and off-track betting all across America. Ironically, the abuse of Thoroughbreds is now regularly televised and wagered upon under the authority of the IHA. The drugging of America's Thoroughbreds to enhance their racing performance clearly affects interstate commerce, and yet the federal government has thus far not acted to stop the cruelty inflicted upon these animals or the deception perpetrated upon the public by the use of these drugs.

Should we conclude that Washington cares more about pit bulls than it does about horses, notwithstanding that these brave animals pulled our covered wagons across America and carried us into battle time and time again? Or is Washington callous to the consequences its citizens must endure from wagering on drugged horses?

While the drugs flow, there exist all of these effete horse organizations who don't do one thing about drugs or lift one finger to try to change the status quo. Maybe if Mr. Vick had had these organizations turning a blind eye and minimizing the cruelty of dog fighting he would not have suffered the fate that he did.

And so the beat goes on. Next week 24 more horses will die and countless others will be crippled. Four percent of our fans will have deserted us by the end of the year as they do every year. It is my hope that the federal government will wake up and do something about all of this. Nobody else will. Nobody else can.

**Keefe to Compete in Triathlon for Charity:**

This will be Keefe's second triathlon. He completed his first in 2011 in a time of 11 hours and 42 minutes. Lot 53 was purchased for R1,500,000 at the Cape Premier Yearling Sale Book 1 in January, and was sent back through the ring by owner Marcus Jooste here. A son of first season sire Seventh Rock (Aus) recorded the second highest price of the sale when bringing R1,400,000 (*US\$139,044*) from Andre Van Vuuren. [Lot 120](#) is the first foal from the Group 1-placed Valeta (SAf) (Var), who is in turn a daughter of Group 1 winner Sarabande (SAf) (Goldmark {SAf}). Van Vuuren, continuing his spending spree from the Bloodstock South Africa Ready-To-Run Sale earlier in the month, also shelled out R900,000 (*US\$89,381*) for a daughter of leading sire Dynasty (SAf). The only other youngster to hit seven figures was [lot 84](#), a daughter of Windrush who is a full-sister to champion and four-time Group 1 winner Mother Russia (SAf). The bay was picked up by Marcus Jooste's Mayfair Speculators from Normandy Stud for R1,000,000 (*US\$99,341*). Statistics for the sale were not immediately available.
