## CLARK OFFERS CLASSIC REDEMPTION

Narrow GI Breeders' Cup Classic runner-up **Will Take Charge** (Unbridled's Song) and ninth-place finishing favorite **Game On Dude** (Awesome Again) will each look to end the season on a high note in today's GI Clark H. at Churchill Downs. The former, eighth in the GI Kentucky Derby last time he ran in Louisville, put it all together in the second half of this season to emerge as the consensus top U.S. 3-year-old. Second in Saratoga's GI Jim Dandy S. July 27, the Willis Horton colorbearer annexed that venue's GI Travers S. Aug. 24 before doubling up in Parx's GI Pennsylvania Derby Sept. 21. Given an 8-1 chance while facing his elders for the first time in the Nov. 2 Classic, the D. Wayne Lukas trainee overcame some traffic trouble at the top of the lane to end up on the wrong end of a win photo with **Mucho Macho Man** (Macho Uno).

Diamond Pride LLC, Lanni Family Trust, Mercedes Stable LLC and Bernie Schiappa's **Game On Dude**, meanwhile, will look to erase the memories of his second-straight Classic no show. The Bob Baffert pupil annexed the GIII Native Diver S. at Betfair Hollywood Park a month after checking in seventh in the 2012 Classic, and returned at six seemingly better than ever. He won his first five races of the year--including three Grade 1s--by a combined 24 1/4 lengths, culminating in a

devastating 8 1/2-length tour de force victory in Del Mar's GI Pacific Classic Aug. 25. Trained up to the Classic this time, the dark bay pressed the pace out wide before coming up empty. The earner of over \$5.6 million still gets the narrow morning-line nod over **Will Take Charge** at 8-5 vs. 9-5, and did finish second to **Drosselmeyer** (Distorted Humor) in the 2011 Classic here. Breaking from the rail, he'll carry top weight of 126 lbs. "They've weighted him like he's Horse of the Year, so I guess that's a compliment," Baffert said. "I'm glad [Churchill Downs racing secretary Ben] Huffman isn't down on the horse like everyone else is." **Cont. p5**

Two years ago, the first crop of **Sea The Stars** (Ire) dominated the foal sales, and the six-time Group 1 winner was back in the limelight Thursday when his daughter out of **Our Queen Of Kings** (GB) (**Arazi**) led **Tattersalls'** second foal session at 320,000gns.

**Lot 761**, the half-sister to stakes winner and producer **Spinning Queen** (GB) (**Spinning World**), entered the ring after darkness had fallen, and was quickly the subject of a lively bidding war between **Hugo Lascelles**, **John Clarke**, **Philipp Stauffenberg** and **Charlie Gordon-Watson**, which was ultimately won by the latter.

Overall trade was lively on the day, with a record second-session turnover of 6,825,700gns (up 24%), and the average of 33,791gns also rising by 27%, while the median of 27,000gns represented another big increase of 35%. 

Blue-blooded Wine Prince concluded her first career on a high note with a decisive tally in her final start before heading to the breeding shed. The chestnut had always shown an affinity for this track, breaking her maiden second out by open lengths here last May before a solid allowance success under the Twin Spires two starts later that June. She earned valuable black-type with a front-running tally in last August's GIII Monmouth Oaks, and found only Grace Hall (Empire Maker) better in the GII Indiana Oaks two months after that. Wine Princess resurfaced a seven-length winner in an eight-panel optional claimer here Apr. 27, but could do no better than fifth in the track-and-trip GII Fleur de Lis H. in June. She returned to Monmouth for a runner-up finish to Joyful Victory (Tapit) in the GII Molly Pitcher S. in July, and filled the same slot in the local Locust Grove S. Sept. 7. Purchased privately by John Sikura's Hill 'n' Dale Farm after a third-place run in Keeneland's GI Juddmonte Spinster S. Oct. 6, she carried previous owner Becky Winemiller's silks again when second to Don't Tell Sophia in the GII Chilukki S. Nov. 2 and was outfitted with those colors one more time for this.

Forwardly placed while three wide into the first turn, Wine Princess was well-rated by career pilot Shaun Bridgmohan in a joint second through splits of :25.01 and :49.30. She inched slightly closer after six furlongs in 1:13.51, but favorites Don't Tell Sophia and Flashy American looked to be breathing fire in behind. The former advanced four wide as Wine Princess wrestled the lead away from pacesetter Magic Hour (Awesome Again) as they straightened, but she failed to switch her leads on cue and Wine Princess made her pay for it with a burst of energy in the run to the line.

"It was emotional because I've ridden her every time she's run," Bridgmohan said after the race. "I've been around her when she first got here--I worked her first half-mile. She's run hard every time and it's gratifying to get one of these for her. She deserves it."

Trainer Steve Margolis was quick to thank owners Becky and Jimmy Winemiller for their handling of the \$475,000 KEESEP yearling. "This filly's been special from the

get-go," Margolis said. "Becky and Jimmy have been so good. They've always said 'Do what's best for the filly.'... Technically, the deal with Hill 'n' Dale was to run her through the end of the year, but I don't think there's anything in December, so we'll send her over to Hill 'n' Dale on Sunday. For us, it couldn't have ended on a happier note."

After foaling Wine Princess, Hall of Famer Azeri was consigned by Hill 'n' Dale to the 2009 Keeneland November Sale and sold to Katsumi Yoshida for \$2.25 million in foal to Distorted Humor. The resulting filly, Amelie (Jpn), earned \$214,737 on the track. Failing to produce a foal in the subsequent two years, Azeri dropped a Deep Impact (Jpn) colt this season.

Palace continued to flatter his connections' astute claim, earning an initial graded tally in the 100th renewal of this traditional holiday feature. Scooped up for just \$20,000 from WinStar Farm and Bill Mott while graduating by 11 3/4

lengths at Belmont last October, the New York-bred proceeded to reel off three straight victories, reaching the century mark on the Beyer Speed Figure scale for a starter/optional claiming tally on the inner track here in December. After a pair of runner-up efforts, he

switched to the turf to best open optional claiming foes in Elmont in July. Fourth on the Spa sod the following month, he returned to dirt and winning ways to annex that venue's Chowder's First S. for New York-breds and followed up most recently with a victory in Belmont's restricted Hudson H. Oct. 19. Guided by Cornelio Velasquez to sit at the back of the first flight against the rail, the bay advanced in between horses approaching the straight and tipped out as Grade I winners Strapping Groom and The Lumber Guy fought it out up front. Strapping Groom won that battle, but he was immediately confront by Palace to his outside and could not fend off that rival's advances.

"I really think he likes sitting off the pace as a come-from-behind sprinter," winning trainer Linda Rice said. "He seems to relish that, and, now that we have figured that out, he's doing great." She added, "I was really excited about today's race, because it is quite gratifying. The fact he's a son of [2000 GI Hopeful S. and GI Futurity S. winner] City Zip (Carson City)--I trained [Palace's] father, who was such a tremendous racehorse--makes it really cool."

Lightly raced Majestic Stride, most recently seen finishing a close fourth at 30-1 odds in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint at Santa Anita Nov. 2, re-broke in the stretch to justify odds-on favoritism here. A second-out graduate at Oaklawn Park in January of 2012, the bay went missing after setting the pace in a division of that track's GIII Southwest S. a month later. He resurfaced this September for a Barretts optional claiming tally and prepped for a jump into the deep end with an allowance win over the same track and trip as the BC Sprint Nov. 2. Finding himself back up close to the pace this time after rallying from seventh last out, Majestic Stride chased stablemate Anillo (Aragorn {Ire}) with Chosen Miracle (Ghostzapper) applying pressure to the Jeff Bonde trainees three deep. The opening quarter went up in a swift :21.86, and Color of Courage--off since July of 2011--seemed poised to make a last-to-first bid as he ranged up powerfully nearing the straight. Majestic Stride had other ideas, however, as he took over from Anillo past the half in :44.35 and braced for a challenge. Called upon for more by Edwin Maldonado at the eighth pole, the chalk stiff-armed his pursuer and drew off to earn back-to-back Underwoods for Bonde, who scored last year with Smiling Tiger (Hold That Tiger). "That was the plan--to give Anillo a head start and sit second--but [Chosen Miracle] kind of pushed me the first quarter mile and I didn't want to put too much pressure on our other horse," Maldonado offered. "I knew he was going to win today because he had a little trouble in his last race, the Breeders' Cup. He's a nice horse."

Far back in the GI Dirt Mile Nov. 1 as winner Goldencents (Into Mischief) ran them off their feet over a speed-favoring Santa Anita surface, the 4-year-old briefly looked like a possible winner at the top of the lane, but could only manage a clear second-place finish. The 2012 Travers dead-heat winner earned a career-best 105 Beyer Speed Figure when second to Fort Larned (E Dubai) in the track-and-trip GI Stephen Foster H. in June. **Cont. p6**

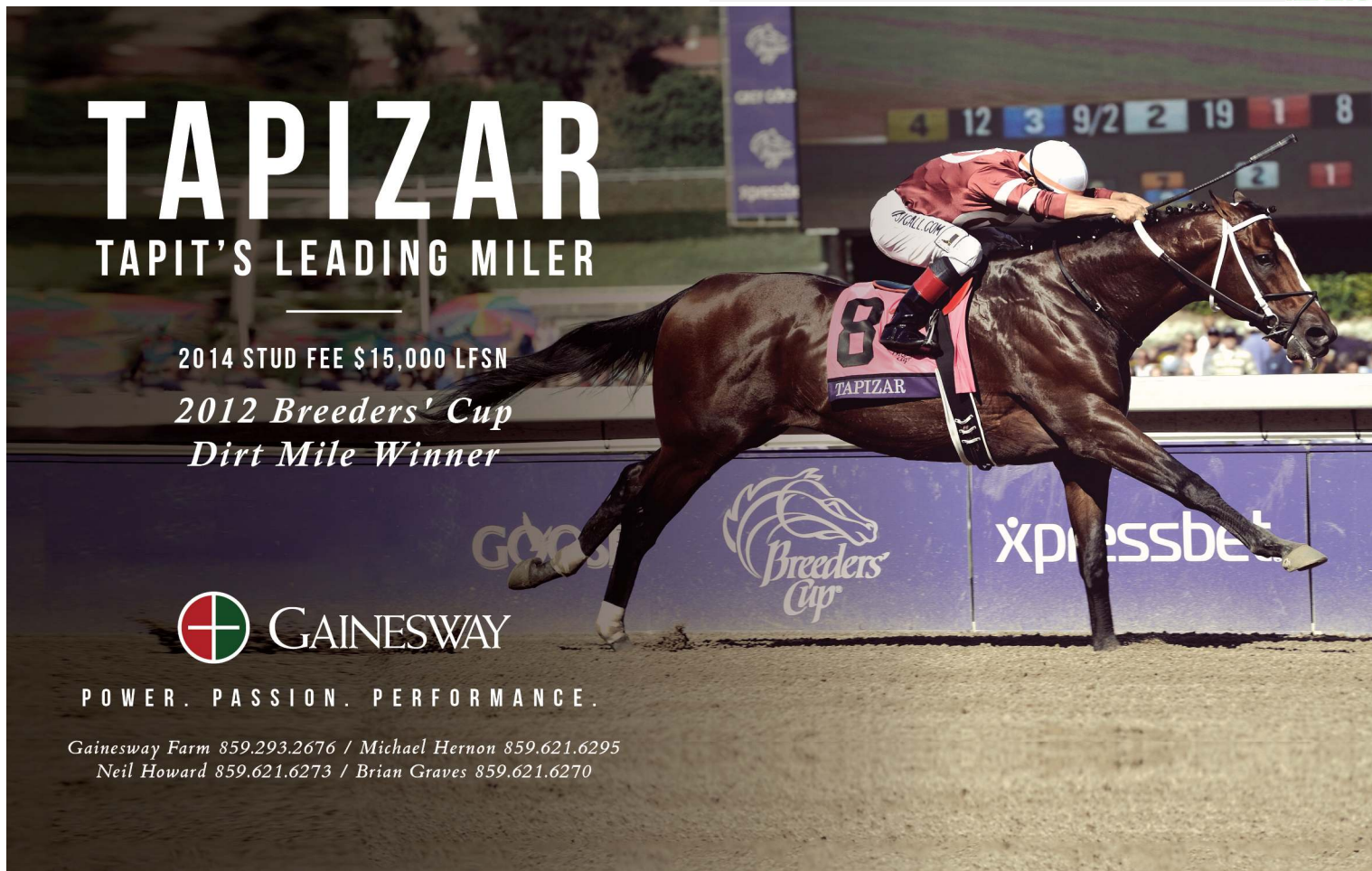

An intriguing longshot could be Bourbon Lane Stable's ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ **Bourbon Courage** (Lion Heart). The luckless bay was third with trouble here last year before kicking off his 4-year-old campaign with a second-place finish in Gulfstream's GI Donn H. Feb. 9 and third in the GII New Orleans H. Mar. 30. He was forced to steady early in the local GII Alysheba S. May 3, and ran on for fourth before being promoted to third behind Will Take Charge's half-brother Take Charge Indy (A.P. Indy). The Kellyn Gorder representative most recently returned from the bench to settle for second behind **Our Double Play** (Grand Slam) in a 7 1/2-panel allowance in the slop here on Halloween. He definitely needed that race last time and came out of it well," trainer Kellyn Gorder said. "He's put in some nice breezes since then... and he's ready to roll. I know we'll play the role of underdog, but that's okay. We're happy with where our horse is and I'm anxious to see him run again."

**KEEP AN EYE ON THE 'PRIZE' IN CITATION**

Heerensperger and Nelson's **Winning Prize (Arg)** (Pure Prize) returns to the turf today and faces a well-matched group as he seeks his first U.S. stakes score in Betfair Hollywood Park's GII Citation H. A three-time Group 1 winner on grass in his native Argentina for conditioner Nicolas Martin Ferro, the dark bay showed immediate promise Stateside when airing by a sharp four lengths over subsequent GIII Eddie D. S. winner Chips All In (North Light {Ire}) in a one-mile Del Mar allowance Aug. 22 for new trainer Neil Drysdale. Aggressively spotted after that, Winning Prize did little to disgrace himself when fourth--two spots behind Wise Dan (Wiseman's Ferry)--in Keeneland's rained-off GI Shadwell Turf Mile Oct. 5. Drawn outside, the 4-year-old figures to race prominently. Wertheimer & Frere homebred **Silenzio** (Silent Name {Jpn}), winner of the GII Sir Beaufort S. at Santa Anita some 11 months ago, seeks his first win since then, but may be coming off a career-best effort. Dismissed at 31-1 in the Nov. 2 GI Breeders' Cup Mile, the Gary Mandella pupil briefly looked like a winner before settling for a close third behind Wise Dan and Za Approval (Ghostzapper). The always dangerous Christophe Clement barn boasts a 4-2-2-0 record in 2013 when shipping to Southern California and will be represented here by Waterford Stable's **Summer Front** (War Front). The bay put together back-to-back wins in April's GIII Miami Mile H. at Calder and Monmouth's GIII Cliffhanger Aug. 25, but faded to seventh after making a wide bid in the Shadwell Turf Mile.

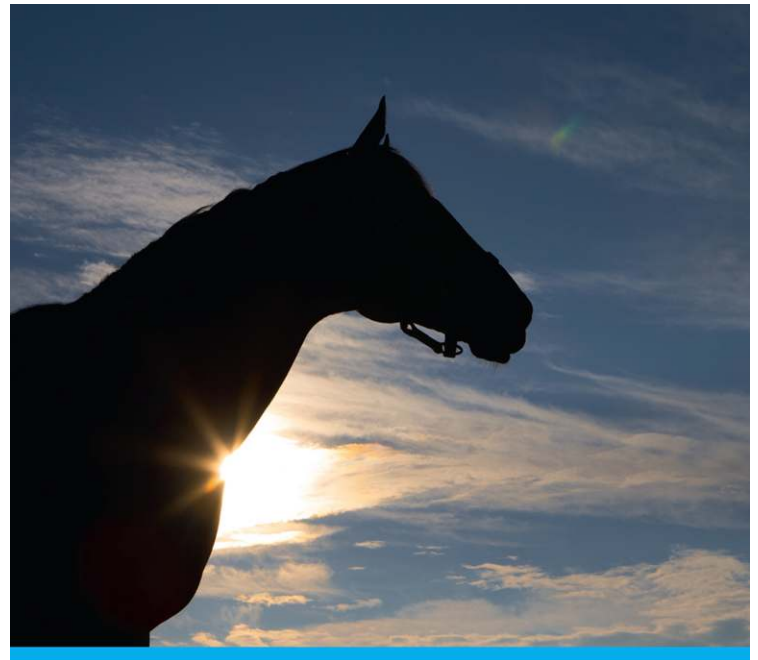

Newsells Park Stud had a tremendous yearling sale in Newmarket, selling the 3.6-million guineas Galileo (Ire) colt to Coolmore, and this filly--the most expensive foal of her sex to sell in Europe so far this year--was the highlight of the Royston farm's six foals sold in the session. The sextet included the lot directly after the sale-topper ([lot 762](#)), an Exceed And Excel (Aus) colt out of the dual-winning Galileo (Ire) mare Jane Austen (Ire), who was knocked down to John Ferguson for 130,000gns.

The 16-year-old Our Queen Of Kings, who was bought by Newsells Park Stud for 500,000gns in December 2008, is in foal to their resident stallion Nathaniel (GB), as is her daughter Spinning Queen. A delighted Julian Dollar, general manager at Newsells Park, said: "She was a lovely foal with a lovely pedigree, and we think a lot of her 3-year-old [half-brother], King of the Danes (GB) (Dansili {GB}), who is in training with Mark Johnston. We think he could be a stakes horse next year."

The Sea The Stars filly will reside at Watership Down Stud until she's ready to go into training, having been bought for an undisclosed client by Gordon-Watson. The agent said: "Everything was right about her. She's a beautiful mover and better than most of tomorrow's fillies. Spinning Queen is in good hands [with the Rothschild family] and it's such a good fillies' family. I'm a big believer in Sea The Stars--I think he will really come good next year."

"I've bought a yearling a year too early!" declared the agent. "His brother paid for him. I didn't expect to have to go that far, but he was a lovely colt and Teofilo is a top stallion."

The colt, whose dam Artisia (Ire) (Peintre Celebre) is a half-sister to triple Hong Kong Group 1 winner Military Attack (Ire) (Oratorio {Ire}), was presented for sale by Drumachon Stud.

### Zoffany The Pick For Hyde...

Robert Pocock's Stringston Farm has enjoyed a good couple of days, selling all eight foals offered for a total of 241,500gns, headed by a 130,000gns colt by Zoffany (Ire) ([lot 660](#)). The first foal of Mount Crystal (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire})--sold carrying the foal for 24,000gns in the same ring last December--was bought

by Timmy Hyde, who claimed another colt by the young Coolmore sire at Goffs last week and was back in the fray late in the day at Tattersalls, signing for Trickledown Stud's Zoffany half-sister to Group 3 winner Lesson In Humility (Ire) (Mujadil) ([lot 776](#)) at 120,000gns.

"His foals look as though they'll be runners--he is getting very good stock," said the Camas Park Stud owner of Zoffany, who covered 173 mares in his first season at Coolmore Stud at a fee of €7,500. So far, six foals by the son of Dansili (GB) have been sold at Tattersalls for an average of 69,833gns, making him the leading first-season sire at the sale.

While his stock are untried, those sired by Dutch Art (GB) are routinely successful in the ring and on the track, making the Cheveley Park Stud stallion a safe bet for the pinhooking fraternity. [Lot 739](#), a colt offered by New England Stud out of the Giant's Causeway mare Helen Glaz (Ire), was greeted by a busy sales ring, with Willie Browne holding off a number of rivals to have the last say on the relative of Street Cry (Ire) and Shamardal at 110,000gns.

"This is a lovely horse, and Dutch Art does it all," said Browne, who is buying in partnership with Mark Dwyer. "When you consider what foals by some of the unproven first-crop sires are making, perhaps he wasn't so expensive."

Reinforcing the popularity of Dutch Art, Shadwell's Angus Gold went to 130,000gns late in the day for the Bumble Mitchell-bred and -consigned filly out of Kerry's Dream (GB) (Tobougg {Ire}) ([lot 799](#)).

### Rain Forecast For Monday...

Liam Norris has a big week ahead as he and his wife, Jenny, prepare to sell the Oaks winner Dancing Rain (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) for Martin and Lee Taylor on Monday through their Clairemont Stud. In the meantime, Norris, who buys in partnership with William Huntingdon, has been patrolling Goffs and Tattersalls in search of a batch of foals to pinhook. Clairemont posted a decent set of returns at the recent October Sale, selling five yearlings in Book 1, all for six-figure sums, and the team added a son of Iffraaj (Ire) ([lot 619](#)) to next year's offerings--which include a Dream Ahead filly bought at Goffs--when going to 90,000gns for a February-born colt out of multiple winner Solva (GB). The Singspiel (Ire) mare is currently in foal to Exceed And Excel (Aus).

"His dam was rated 90, and he was expensive enough, but the stallion has had a really good year. He was a lovely colt from a really good draft of foals from Kevin [Mercer] at Usk Valley Stud," said Norris.

Other buyers clearly agreed with his assessment, as nine Welsh-bred Usk Valley foals raised a tally of 318,800gns for Kevin and Susan Mercer, including 72,000gns given by Blandford Bloodstock for a smart daughter of Exceed And Excel (Aus) ([lot 622](#)) out of the listed winner Nantyglo (GB) (Mark Of Esteem {Ire}).

"This is all down to my staff, who work really hard and do a cracking job," said Mercer. "I'm delighted with the results. We were just really lucky to have a good bunch of foals this year."

Norris and Huntingdon returned to action later, signing for Norelands Stud's Rip Van Winkle (Ire) colt ([lot 779](#)) out of a Danehill Dancer (Ire) half-sister to GII Honeymoon H. winner Country Garden (GB) (Selkirk) at 75,000gns, swiftly followed by an Invincible Spirit (Ire) filly from Jockey Hall Stud ([lot 787](#)) for 85,000gns.

### McEvoy Back In The Auction Ring...

Colm McEvoy of Osberstown Stud has enjoyed success as a breeder through dual Group 3 winner Maureen (Ire) (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}), and he added a son of Teofilo (Ire) to his clutch of foals back in Naas when paying 75,000gns for [lot 600](#), a son of the unraced Danehill Dancer (Ire) mare Whos Mindin Who (Ire).

"There are plenty of nice horses on the page, and he was a good correct colt. Hopefully he'll stay that way and we'll bring him back next October," said the retired auctioneer.

Whos Mindin Who's full-brother is the G2 Champagne S. winner Westphalia (Ire).

**From Newmarket to New Zealand...**

It's common to hear an Aussie or Kiwi twang to an accent during Tattersalls' Horses-in-Training Sale, but Australasian buyers are not so prevalent during the foal sales.

One who has braved the cold of Park Paddocks to complete the first part of a long-term project is New Zealander Paul Willetts, who is in Newmarket to buy a handful of staying-bred foals to take back to his home country.

"I managed to buy one yesterday and I hope I might be able to buy three or four. I'm also going on to France for Arqana's December Sale," said Willetts, whose passion for Thoroughbreds was ignited on a trip to the UK 30 years ago during a stint working at Whitsbury Manor Stud in Hampshire. Further experience was gained in Germany before his return to Auckland.

"The best pedigrees in the world are here for horses that want more than a mile, certainly for grass horses,"

he continued. "There's been so much success for European horses with staying blood in Australia in recent years, but it's expensive to come and try to buy the form horses. Together with a small group of associates, I'm hoping to get in at ground level, choose individuals that I like without being swayed by fashion, and take them back to New Zealand early next year, when it will be our summer time.

"You can ask me in five years' time if the project has been a success, but we won't be in any rush with these horses, so there's plenty of time for them to adjust to their new environments, and obviously they'll be around six months younger than their southern hemisphere counterparts."

Willetts' eye for a good horse at a value price has been perfectly illustrated by A\$22,000 yearling Buffering (Aus) (Mossman {Aus}), whose nine Group wins include a hat-trick of Group 1s, most recently in the Winterbottom S. while Willetts was on his way to England. The 6-year-old gelding's prize-money tally is now in excess of A\$ 4-million.

The first candidate for the new venture was selected on Monday--a Sakhee colt out of the G2 Ribblesdale S.-placed Uvinza (GB) (Bertolini) at 14,000gns. While it's unusual for such young horses to be transferred from one side of the world to the other, there has of course been a very good precedent set: Makybe Diva (GB) (Desert King {Ire}) is a graduate of the 1999 Tattersalls December Foal Sale. History relates that the great mare fared none too badly in her adopted home country of Australia.

### ST NICHOLAS ABBEY FACES BATTLE

Coolmore has announced that three-time G1 Coronation Cup hero **St Nicholas Abbey (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}) faces an uphill struggle in his continued battle to recover from serious injury and a series of major surgeries. Announcing a bulletin via Twitter, a Coolmore statement read, "St Nicholas Abbey is struggling to overcome the laminitis in his left front foot. This is indeed life threatening and is the single biggest complication he has faced since his initial lifesaving surgery. The worry is that if the condition progresses and further sinking of the pedal bone takes place, it may prolapse through the sole of his foot. In spite of this, St Nicholas Abbey is very comfortable, being just a little ouchy when walking in his first steps and better thereafter. His appetite and demeanor remain incredibly good. Intensive veterinary treatment continues and includes maggot therapy for the slight discharge at the toe of the laminitic foot, and a daily session on a vibrating plate. The next few weeks are critical for St Nicholas Abbey. We are just hoping that he can turn the corner."

## NONANT-LE-PIN: SOLIDARITY AGAINST A HUGE INDUSTRIAL WASTE DUMP

*The case of Nonant-le-Pin highlights a recurring issue in democratic countries: the weakness of governments in relation to world conglomerates and their multi-millionaire chairmen.*

A mega-platform for industrial waste storage and waste sorting has been planned for Nonant-Le-Pin in Normandy, in the heart of a major French Thoroughbred breeding region, home to 160 stud farms and with a number of horse trainers within a 20 km radius.

Facts about this huge industrial waste dump: 150,000 tons of waste is expected to be brought in by the company Guy Dauphin Environnement (GDE) per year--this means almost 100 trucks of waste per day on our country roads, almost 30 metres of stocked waste, smoke, bio gas and fires over a minimum 17-year period.

Originally blocked by the regional prefecture in 2010, GDE went to the high court over the issue in 2011 and won the case, with the judge claiming that there was no reason to deny the licence. Since then, there have been concerted attempts to get the case reviewed by those involved in the racing and breeding industry.

The dump will have a major impact on the stud farms in the region.

The problem is that this dump will pollute the land. This is a certainty. You only have to look at the other GDE centers, where there are many problems of pollution, such as fires, smoke, dust and more.

So one can imagine the consequences that such a dump will have on the horses and on the stud farms' activities. All the horse specialists and vets know indeed that horses need an unpolluted environment.

We have conducted a study into the economic impacts which has revealed the following: the losses to the stud farms will amount to between 300 and 500 million euros over the 17 years during which the dump would be functioning.

One could never imagine the English or Irish governments allowing their major stud farms to be impacted by this type of activity on their doorstep.

Delphine Batho, the former Minister of Ecology, had asked for a review of the case, given the additional information provided about the risky hydrogeological situation. But nothing has really happened since this statement.

The former French Minister of Ecology did indeed ask for a second opinion on the hydrogeological situation after the publication of the findings of Pierre de Bretizel, former hydrogeologist at the Bureau de Recherches Géologiques et Minières (BRGM), the French public reference institution for the domain.

Pierre de Bretizel highlighted the huge hydrogeological risks for the river basin of the Orne. The waste dump is on a groundwater table which lies just beneath the surface and on two rifts, which increases the risk of pollution.

Following this announcement, the French administration surprisingly chose BURGEAP, the environmental engineering company, to give the second opinion. Indeed, BURGEAP concluded on the innocence of

Trafigura, chaired by Claude Dauphin, the owner of GDE, in the case of the tragedy of the Probo Koala in the Ivory Coast in 1996 (when a ship chartered by the Dutch-based company Trafigura offloaded toxic waste on the Ivory Coast and was later blamed by the UN for the deaths of 17 and the injury of over 30,000 Ivorians.)

BURGEAP's report on the Probo Koala accident mentioned that toxic waste was not responsible for the chemical pollution of the lagoon. The pollution more likely came from industrial waste, agricultural fertilizers and the activities of the port.

But if Trafigura was innocent, why did it give around \$200 million to the Ivory Coast State? **Cont. p14**

And why did the French administration choose BURGEAP when its independency in relation to GDE is questionable? Another unanswered question.

We have witnessed a shoddy manipulation from the French administration and from the prefect in order to justify the opening of the waste dump. The goal of this was to gain official evidence supporting the creation of the dump. The government could then give its authorization, thus avoiding the payment of damages to GDE associated with the refusal of permission.

These financial damages could be legitimately avoided given that we have brought to the public authorities the crucial scientific and economic facts which support the opposition to GDE. The government therefore has enough evidence to oppose GDE without paying excessive damages.

This indicates that the second opinion by BURGEAP was only an alibi for the French administration and does not answer the main question asked by Pierre de Bretzel.

**Meanwhile, we have asked for a judicial review of the GDE proposed dump, citing the problems of an adjacent railway line and other factors that were not considered by the original judicial decision. We have also asked for an expert environmental assessment.**

Surprisingly, the Prefect Jean Christophe Moraud tried to block this assessment.

The case of "Nonant-le-Pin" is becoming a huge issue in our democracy. This is why we made an appeal to the highest administrative court last March. We are, however, still waiting for the outcome.

Recently, some neighbours of the waste dump, farmers, livestock farmers and residents asked the Tribunal de Grande Instance (Crown Court) for an expert assessment of the air, water and soil before the opening of the dump.

In case of pollution, this will allow for an assessment of the economic and environmental damages due to the dumping of 150,000 tons of industrial waste per year.

Surprisingly, the prefect said that the court could not grant the expert assessment. However, the Procureur of the Republique declared a few days later that this was incorrect. Through this declaration, the prefect was undermined.

Moreover, the latter revealed his support for the waste dump by protecting GDE from an expert assessment of the environment.

Despite the opposition of the prefect and of GDE, the Tribunal de Grande Instance decided on Aug. 12 to order two expert assessments: The first on the quality of the air, water and soil before the opening of the dump; and the second on the hydrogeological situation of the field where the waste dump is located.

This is a very important decision for us because these new expert assessments should lead to a new approach for the French government.

More generally, the case of Nonant-le-Pin highlights a recurring issue in democratic countries: the weakness of governments in relation to world conglomerates and their multi-millionaire chairmen.

In the present case, Claude Dauphin, ranked amongst the richest in France, owns GDE and chairs Trafigura, the world's second-largest commodity trading company. He sponsors many major football stadiums in France and makes donations towards causes, which puts him in the favour of the politicians. Consequently, he benefits from many influential friendships.

Before next year's world equestrian events (sponsored by American company Alltech), we have the opportunity to

take steps towards preventing the dump from opening and a bad image of Normandy being created due to the pollution. **Cont. p15**

Firstly, the government would be able to rely on the work of a parliamentary information mission which would allow light to be shed on:

- The conditions in which the administrative tribunal was able to authorize the creation of the waste dump, despite the negative opinion of the public enquiry commission and the prefect at the time;
- The method of stocking waste and the capacities for waste storage which currently exist in France;
- The pathways towards resolving the conflict.

Certain politicians, however, are still hesitating on launching this information mission, which would only reveal the weaknesses of the case and the arrangements with the waste company.

In parallel, the government could declare a moratorium in order to achieve complimentary environmental studies on the risks of this waste dump, especially since in a vote last February, the regional council voted unanimously in favor.

Additionally, the government has all the scientific, economic and fiscal elements which would allow it to negotiate with GDE on good terms in order that GDE abandons its project.

It is incomprehensible that a representative of the French Republic is so openly in favor of a project to create a waste dump despite France already having sufficient capacities for waste storage. Indeed, if allowed to operate, this dump would be the first and largest of its kind in Europe!

Through its intervention against the demand for an expert environmental assessment of the neighbors of GDE, the prefect unmasked itself: he is defending the interests of GDE against those of the population, the environment and the activities linked to breeding. Why?

These facts should prompt us to start an investigation.

Finally, our recent demonstration in July and the civil blockage of the entrance of the dump since October, demonstrate that we have the capacity to block the passage of lorries carrying waste in order to protect our land and traditional activities.

In conclusion, we need the solidarity of all to definitively stop the opening of this senseless waste dump.
