In his two prior appearances beneath the Twin Spires, Willis Horton's **Will Take Charge** (Unbridled's Song) was beaten a combined 37 3/4 lengths. Suffice to say that

his third trip to Louisville went a little better. The strapping chestnut colt with the big, white blaze just kept on coming in the stretch and chopped down favored **Game on Dude** (Awesome Again) to score by a short head in a heart-stopping renewal of

the GI Clark H. Friday afternoon, and in all likelihood, sewed up the Eclipse Award for champion 3-year-old male. It was the second Clark win for trainer D. Wayne Lukas, who saddled Surfside (Seattle Slew) to a victory over the boys in 2000. "If you look back in the history books, that made Surfside a champion," the conditioner offered. "She was probably not going to be champion until she won it here. It made her a champion so I'm hoping history repeats itself. We've done all we had to do today." **Cont. p3**

the Judge (Ire) (Lawman {Ire}) topped proceedings at 450,000gns.

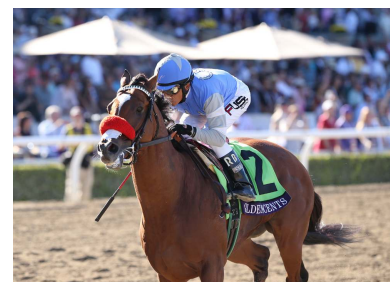
In 2012, the turnover for all four days of the foal sale stood at 24,132,700gns and, with a day's trade still to come, that total has already been passed this time around. The aggregate currently stands at 26,695,600gns,

with the third-day total of 17,731,500gns--record turnover for a single day at a European foal sale--being up 35% on last year. Fifty-eight foals breached the six-figure mark on Friday, while 23 sold for 200,000gns or more, bouncing the average up to 90,931gns (+26%), with a median of 60,000gns (+21%) for 195 sold. The clearance rate of 81% represented a two-point drop. **Cont. p12**

## HAVE THIS CIGAR, YOU'RE GONNA GO FAR

Today's GI Cigar Mile H. has attracted as diverse a field as anyone could hope for, with a pair of Breeders' Cup winners and four other Grade I winners, each of whom are entitled to a bonus should they score. No Breeders' Cup winner has ever followed up in the Cigar, but **Goldencents** (Into Mischief) and **Groupie Doll** (Bowman's Band) will try to change that this afternoon.

No fewer than five sophomores are set to face the starter, including the GI Dirt Mile winner, who will tote top weight of 120 pounds while spotting his rivals anywhere from one to seven pounds. This year's GI Santa Anita Derby winner found life too tough along the Triple

Crown trail, finishing a distant 17th in the GI Kentucky Derby and a well-beaten fifth in the GI Preakness S. before taking some time off. The second half of his season has centered around middle-distance tests, but he was unlucky each time when second in the six-furlong GI Bing Crosby S. at Del Mar July 28, in the GII Pat O'Brien S. going seven panels Aug. 25 and in the GI Santa Anita Sprint Championship back at three-quarters of a mile Oct. 5. He drew widest of 11 in the Dirt Mile, but outfooted all of his rivals to the lead and, despite setting a searching pace, remained well clear to the wire. **Cigar Mile H. cont. p8**

12-1 winner of Oaklawn's Smarty Jones S. Jan. 21, he was sixth to the Bob Baffert-trained Super Ninety Nine (Pulpit) in a sloppy renewal of the GIII Southwest S. Feb. 18 before handing stablemate Oxbow (Awesome Again) a head defeat in the GII Rebel S.

Mar. 16. Connections passed the GI Arkansas Derby in favor of training up to the GI Kentucky Derby, and a spot of trouble outside of Verrazano (More Than Ready) at the head of the stretch cost him perhaps a few spots and he finished eighth in the "Run for the Roses."

Seventh to Oxbow in the GI Preakness S. May 18 and 10th in the GI Belmont S. June 8, Will Take Charge got blinkers off for the GII Jim Dandy S. July 27, and the adjustment seemed to do the trick, as he flashed home to be a length behind Belmont winner Palace Malice (Curlin) in second. Largely dismissed at 9-1 facing a rematch with that foe as well as Kentucky Derby hero Orb (Malibu Moon) in the GI Travers S. Aug. 24, Will Take Charge tossed his hat into the ring for year-end honors with a nose defeat of loose-on-the-lead Moreno (Ghostzapper). With a lucrative option open to him against his own age group, trainer Wayne Lukas opted for the GII Pennsylvania Derby Sept. 21 over the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup the following week, and that decision also proved fruitful, as the colt charged home to best Moreno by a decisive 2 1/4 lengths. He headed to Santa Anita a horse clearly on the come, but was sent off as just the 8.60-1 fifth choice--with Palace Malice a dime shorter--in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Santa Anita Nov. 2. Though he was forced to cover ground for most of the trip and despite being fanned six wide when the real running began at the quarter pole, he stayed on with grim determination and fell a nose short of Mucho Macho Man (Macho Uno). Will Take Charge had, in many circles, clinched a championship, but Lukas rolled the dice on one additional start. It came up 'Yo' in seasonal start number 11. **Cont. p4**

**Another Tough Trip...**

Longshots **Our Double Play** (Grand Slam) and **Jaguar Paw** (Giant's Causeway) both beat Game on Dude away from the gate and took them past the grandstand for the first time, as Will Take Charge was trapped three wide outside of the rail-skimming GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile runner-up **Golden Ticket** (Speightstown) and **Prayer for Relief** (Jump Start). **Easter Gift** (Hard Spun) settled slightly worse than centerfield with the late-running **Bourbon Courage** (Lion Heart) and **Finnegans Wake** (Powerscourt {GB}) behind him. Well aware that Game on Dude prefers to be on or near the business end of

things, Mike Smith wisely made an early move to get Game on Dude into a pace-pressing spot outside of Our Double Play as the field turned up the backstretch. Luis Saez was still unable to clear the inside traffic and had no choice but to travel three wide on Will Take Charge to the half-mile marker, where he began to get after his colt in earnest, and the duo advanced into fourth under a heavy drive with three furlongs to race. It was at that point that Smith sent Game on Dude after Our Double Play, and the Californian led, traveling

confidently turning for home. Saez and Will Take Charge were forced into a four-wide run outside of Jaguar Paw at the quarter pole, but he had aim on 'the Dude' if he was good enough entering the final eighth of a mile. With Saez leaning noticeably to his right in the saddle and getting after his mount with a sharp left-handed whip, Will Take Charge kept to his task and grabbed the favorite in the final jump in a finish remarkably reminiscent of Game on Dude's loss to Drosselmeyer in the 2011 GI Breeders' Cup Classic. Easter Gift rallied well from the back of the pack for third.

"The horse broke so well," Saez summarized. "Game On Dude was inside of me...I followed him all of the way because I knew I had to beat him. When we came to the three-eighths [pole], I saw he moved and he had a lot of horse. I had too much horse, so when I asked him, my horse was very intense and gave me everything."

The winning conditioner said that the decision as to whether Will Take Charge races on in 2014 is up to the owner.

"We're standing here on the glow of a win, but we could have got beat today and that maybe would have made it more difficult for the [Eclipse Award] voters and made it more difficult for a [breeding] syndication at some place down the road," Lukas said. "That was a pretty ballsy move. We stepped right up here and got it done."

Winner of a second-level allowance over this course and distance Mar. 29, Royal Lahaina threw in a clunker when fifth of sixth to fellow New York shipper Disposablepleasure (Giacomo) in the GIII Sixty Sails H. at Hawthorne Apr. 20. The dark bay upset the off-turf Mariensky S. at Belmont June 7, but failed again to reproduce that form in graded company, finishing double digits behind Authenticity (Quiet American) in Saratoga's GII Shuvee H. July 20. Second to Summer Applause (Harlan's Holiday) in the Lady's Secret S. at Monmouth Aug. 25, she was most recently fourth in the GIII Turnback the Alarm H. in her first run for this barn at Belmont Oct. 26. Royal Lahaina jumped fairly and settled in midfield as Fantasy of Flight (Tiznow) set an easy tempo in advance of longshot OI Donyo (Curlin). The plot was unchanged as they passed the half-mile marker in a leisurely :48.20, but Jose Ortiz took a confident look under his right arm leaving the three-eighths marker and allowed Royal Lahaina to come after the front-runners. She made a line of three across the track turning for home, was in front under a hand ride a few strides later and was not for catching in the final 50 yards. Centring, who was hard at work in the middle stages, found her best stride late for second. "She broke very well and I was able to get perfect position on the outside," the winning rider explained. "At the three-eighths pole I knew I had a lot of horse so I just waited a little bit. When I asked her to go, she did."

Victorious in three of his first four starts, including the GIII Sir Beaufort S. last winter, Silentio couldn't quite solve the talented Suggestive Boy (Arg) (Easing Along) when third to that one in the GII Arcadia S. Feb. 2 and second in the GI F. E. Kilroe Mile S. Mar. 2. Last of five, but not horribly disgraced, behind Horse of the Year Wise Dan (Wiseman's Ferry) in the GI Maker's Mark Mile S. at Keeneland Apr. 12, the homebred was given a bit of a breather and resumed with a closing third to top miler Obviously (Ire) (Choisir {Aus}) in the GII Del Mar Mile H. Aug. 25. Allowed to train up to a rematch with Wise Dan in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile, the handsome dark bay dove down to the inside and looked dangerous for a few strides and settled for an excellent third, beaten 1 1/2 lengths, at 31-1.

Winning Prize was hustled away from the stalls and managed to win the race into the first turn, while Silentio settled in about sixth position, three wide, but with cover behind longshot Bio Pro (War Front) as they turned up the backstretch with East Coast raider Summer Front racing just to the inside of the favorite. Silentio was asked for some run by Rafael Bejarano and they edged into third on the turn, but were soon confronted and passed by Summer Front. Bejarano elected to stay inside, and that made the ultimate difference, as he rallied outside of Winning Prize and just held off Summer Front for a well-deserved success.

at Belmont and he popped a career-best Beyer in besting **Forty Tales** (Tale of the Cat) by a decisive 1 1/2 lengths. The latter's stablemate Verrazano (More Than Ready) signs off on his career today and will try to leave a mark on prospective breeders. Victorious in the GI Wood Memorial S. in April, he was well down the field in the GI Kentucky Derby, but was brilliant in winning the GI Haskell Invitational S. July 28. Well-beaten as the 8-5 favorite in the GI Travers S. Aug. 24, he exits a fourth in the Dirt Mile, but trainer Todd Pletcher believes the race is a toss.

"I don't think he loved the track," the conditioner offered. "It's hard to gauge because he had such a rough trip going into the first turn. The track was so speed-biased that day that it was impossible to make up ground."

**Flat Out** (Flatter) retains top form as he nears the completion of his 7-year-old campaign. One of his two victories this season came in Belmont's GIII Westchester S., that track's prep for the GI Met Mile, and the Florida-bred ran lights-out to tag Cross Traffic (Unbridled's Song) on the money, earning a gaudy 116 Beyer. An unlucky third in the Met, he would go on to win the GII Suburban H. in July before just missing in the GI Woodward S. in late August. He has become more tactical this term and can make a run from close range at what could be very appealing odds. Flat Out was most recently eighth in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic, but trainer Bill Mott brought To Honor and Serve (Bernardini) off an unplaced run in that event to win the Cigar in 2011.

Purchased for \$500,000 earlier this year at the Fasig-Tipton Florida sale, the dark bay was dubbed a **"TDN Rising Star"** after an impressive graduation over next-out winner Coastline (Speightstown) Sept. 13. The Patrick Byrne trainee finished fourth to that rival in his next outing here in the Street Sense S. Oct. 27. Adding blinkers last time, Almost Famous romped home to a six-length optional claimer score at this track and trip Nov. 9 and achieved a career-high Beyer Speed Figure of 86. The speedy front runner receives the services of jockey Corey Lanerie who was aboard for his last victory.

Hall of Famer Bill Mott saddles **Dobra Historia** (Unbridled's Song) for owner George Prussin in this black-type bow. The gray earned his diploma on second asking at this distance over the Keeneland Polytrack Oct. 4 and was a soundly beaten second to Almost Famous here last time Nov. 9. He displays a respectable worktab and his off the pace running style may benefit him in this speed laden affair.

Donegal Racing's **Culprit** (Street Sense) ran third on debut here Sept. 7 and returned to finish a disappointing seventh in the off-turf GIII Bourbon S. at Keeneland Oct. 6. "He came into us a little bit weedy and not quite as developed as we thought he would be when we bought him as a yearling," Romans said. "We thought he was one of our best, but it took him awhile to get his feet under him. He's one of my best and a horse that I think has a huge future if he just continues to improve."

"She ran huge in the optional claimer and then came back and won, so we like her a lot," said trainer Kiaran McLaughlin. "We won last year with Dance Card, so we're hoping Wedding Toast will be as good as the Gazelle winner, because Dance Card is a very nice filly." Repole Stable's **Galloping Giraffe** (Tapit) was a distant second behind Wedding Toast in her runaway optional claiming victory Sept. 11, but returned with a victory against restricted company in the Oct. 24 Punkin Pie S.

The chestnut, a son of the world-record holder One Hot Wish (Bring the Heat), graduated by five lengths as the 3-5 favorite in his Apr. 7 bow over the Keeneland Poly, and the form of that race was validated when the runner-up, Solitary Ranger (U S Ranger), returned to take the GIII Arlington-Washington Futurity in late summer. He was perhaps even more impressive in his last appearance, a seven-length allowance score at Keeneland Oct. 13 and was acquired privately following that victory.

**Global View** (Galileo {Ire}) debuted with a running-on fourth behind the promising Guns Loaded (D'Wildcat) in a Del Mar maiden July 20, but looked a different animal altogether when racing away to take a down-the-hill test by a widening 1 3/4 lengths Oct. 27. The \$500,000 KEESEP yearling will need to negotiate this added distance, but is a slam-dunk to do so off his massive pedigree. California-bred **Aotearoa** (Good Journey) parlayed a perfect trip into an upset victory over Diamond Bachelor (War Front) in the Zuma Beach S. at Santa Anita Oct. 6, and was supplemented to the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf, in which he finished seventh. He should appreciate this softer competition this afternoon.

Foreign shippers don't exactly have a sparkling record in the G1 Japan Cup Dirt, but that has not discouraged George and Lori Hall and trainer Kelly Breen from taking a shot with **Pants On Fire** (Jump Start). The winner of

this year's GII Monmouth Cup and GIII Ack Ack H., the 5-year-old was most recently seventh in the GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile Nov. 1. The good news for Pants On Fire is that the lone foreign-based winner--from 27 starters--in the Japan Cup Dirt has been the American-trained

Fleetstreet Dancer (Smart Strike). Pants on Fire gets the services of Hall of Fame jockey Gary Stevens for the first time, and should the pair emerge victorious, they will bank more than US\$1.2 million. Back to defend his crown is last year's winner **Nihonpiro Ours (Jpn)** (White Muzzle {GB}). Victorious at odds of 18-1 last year, the 6-year-old has won or placed in all three outings this year, but has been sidelined by injury since finishing second to **Hokko Tarumae (Jpn)** (King Kamehameha {Jpn}) in the Teio Sho at Ohi June 26. Hokko Tarumae has been on a roll this season, having won six of eight outings. His five-race win streak was snapped when second to **Espoir City (Jpn)** (Gold Allure {Jpn}) in the G1 Mile Championship Oct. 14, but he rebounded with a victory in the JBC Classic Nov. 4, and is the even-money morning line favorite here. His only other loss on the year came at the hands of **Grape Brandy (Jpn)** (Manhattan Cafe {Jpn}) in the G2 Tokai TV Hai Tokai S. Jan. 20. Grape Brandy followed that victory with a win in the G1 February S., the JRA's only other Group 1 event on the dirt, but could manage only 10th in his last outing, the G3 Miyako S. Nov. 3. This year will mark the last running of the Japan Cup Dirt, as it will next year be reverted to Chukyo Racecourse and renamed the Champions Cup while remaining at the same distance.

Julian Dollar was out of the traps fast for the sale-topping filly ([lot 1055](#)), the second foal of G3 St Simon S. winner High Heeled (Ire) (High Chaparral {Ire}). The Newsells Park Stud manager opened the bidding at 300,000gns, but his move was swiftly countered by Charlie Gordon-Watson, who in turn had to give way to John Ferguson, buying on behalf of Sheikh Mohammed.

"She's got the quality, the pedigree and is by a great sire. Very few foals of this nature are brought to sale and she's from an outstanding breeder," said Ferguson, paying tribute to James Wigan, who also bred this season's dual Grade I winner Dank (GB) (Dansili {GB}). Wigan's West Blagdon Stud consigned a much-admired clutch of seven foals, with all sold for 1,177,000gns.

They included a filly by Fastnet Rock (Aus) out of a Pivotal (GB) half-sister to G1 Prix du Moulin winner Grey Lilas (Ire) (Danehill), which Hugo Lascelles made the winning bid on at 320,000gns.

While Ferguson has played an active role at Tattersalls, signing for 16 weanlings to the tune of 2,664,000gns, the passionate National Hunt racing supporter, who also trains a string of jumpers just outside Newmarket, had one eye on the racing at Doncaster. The young Darley-bred hurdler Mijhaar (GB) (Shirocco {Ger}) did not disappoint his trainer from afar, earning himself quotes for the Supreme Novices' Hurdle at the Cheltenham Festival next March with a flamboyant first jumping success. Ferguson will also miss his stable star Cotton Mill (GB) (Tiger Hill {Ire}) in today's G1 Fighting Fifth Hurdle at Newcastle while he remains in Newmarket for the final day of the foal sale.

A pair of colts by New Approach (Ire)--lots [1017](#) and [854](#)--were also on the Ferguson list of purchases, and fetched 280,000gns and 250,000gns, respectively. The former was Moyns Park Stud's son of Group 3 winner Walk On Bye (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}), herself a daughter of champion sprinter Pipalong (Ire) (Pips Pride {GB}). Lot 854, a half-brother to G1 Dubai Duty Free winner Al Shemali (GB) (Medicean {GB}), was offered by Minster Stud, owned by Willie and Elaine Carson, who enjoyed recent Breeders' Cup success with Chriselliam (Ire) (Iffraaj {GB}). Ferguson also gave 240,000gns for a colt by Sea The Stars (Ire) from the Darley-bred mare Magic Tree (UAE), who is now owned by Andrew Wardall of Alvediston Stud. Magic Tree was sold for just 2,800gns in 2005, but two of her half-brothers--Kirklees (Ire) (Jade Robbery) and Mastery (GB) (Sulamani {Ire})--have subsequently become Group 1 winners, and she herself has produced G2 York S. winner Mukhadram (Ire) (Shamardal), as well as the Group 3-placed Woodland Aria (GB) (Singspiel {Ire}).

### Goerlsdorf's Day in the Sun...

As is traditional for German-bred horses, [lot 969](#), by Sea the Stars (Ire) out of Sanwa (Ger) (Monsoon {Ger}), is already named Sea the Sun (Ger) and her new owners, the Tsui family, will be hoping she sees plenty of winner's enclosures after going to 320,000gns to buy her from breeder Heike Bischoff of Gestut Goerlsdorf. John Clarke, the Tsuis' representative, signed the ticket in the name of the family's Sunderland Holdings Inc. As the owner/breeders of the filly's sire, they own plenty of his offspring, including his first stakes winner, the John Oxx-trained My Titania (Ire).

"We have been delighted with Sea The Stars' first crop, as they are backward horses and we never expected too much from them as juveniles, so what they have done this year has been a bonus," said Clarke. "They've all needed a bit of time, and at least one run to get the hang of things. My Titania is a star and will be aimed at next year's [G1] 1000 Guineas."

Sea the Sun hails from one of the very best families in the German stud book, her dam being a sister to the Classic-winning trio of Samum (Ger), Schiaparelli (Ger) and Salve Regina (Ger). Furthermore, the weanling's full-brother Sea The Moon (Ger), a **★ "TDN Rising Star" ☆**, was one of the most promising juveniles of the season in Germany and could yet add another G1 Deutsches Derby to the family's haul--he is currently the winter favourite for next year's Classic and is still owned by his breeder.

"I hope she'll be really lucky for her new owners," a delighted Bischoff said. "This is the best price we have ever got for a horse at auction. She was so calm and relaxed, even after 120 shows, but she has a great temperament just like her mother. She's quite small, but all the fillies in the family are small."

Bischoff keeps 45 mares at Gestut Goerlsdorf, 80 miles north of Berlin, but only breeds from half of them each year.

"We're a long way from the stud farms in Britain and Ireland, and I don't like my mares to travel when they are in foal or with their foals," she explained. "So Sanwa is not in foal at the moment, but I hope to send her back to Sea the Stars."

### Stars Still Shining Bright...

After one of his daughters topped the second session of the December Foal Sale, Sea the Stars remained a really warm order on a very cold day at Tattersalls. Fourteen of his 16 foals offered through the sale so far have returned six-figure sums, including a filly out of the Galileo (Ire) mare Gaze (GB) from yet another good German family, which features the likes of Group 1 winner Gonbarda (Ger)--the dam of recent G1 QIPCO Champion S. winner Farrh (GB) (Pivotal {GB})--and Gaze's outstanding half-brother Fame and Glory (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}). The buyer of [lot 944](#), at 235,000gns, was Shadwell's Angus Gold. "My own experience of Sea the Stars is very positive--I'm very pleased with the promise his runners are showing and we have some nice horses by him," Gold said.

"Obviously, this filly will take a little while, but she showed herself really well and I just hope she's as good as she looked here."

The filly was the sole representative in the sale for her consignor Windmill Farm. While it's a new name on the scene, the lady at the helm of the operation, Fiona Marner, is an old hand at immaculately presenting young horses for sale, as she did with this filly, whom she bred with 21 associates in the Windmill Farm Partnership. At Park Paddocks with one of her co-breeders, Lionel Godfrey, Marner, said:

"We bred her under an Enterprise Investment Scheme--it made sense for a number of us to get together and we were so lucky we were able to buy this beautiful mare. We get a very good tax break through the EIS."

Shadwell was also the name on the docket for [lot 996](#), Barronstown Stud's daughter of New Approach out of the stakes-placed Kitty Kiernan (GB) (Pivotal {GB}), who fetched 320,000gns, and for the Aqlaam (GB) half-brother to top 2-year-old and new Darley sire Reckless Abandon (Exchange Rate) ([lot 978](#)) at 200,000gns.

### Galileo Hunters...

Patrick Lawley-Wakelin made the trip to Newmarket from Virginia in search of a Galileo (Ire) foal, and he found his ideal candidate in Altissimo (Fr), ([lot 1009](#)), a full-brother to G3 Blue Wind S. winner Galatee (Fr) out of a Mountain Cat half-sister to G1 Breeders' Cup Classic winner Arcangues (Fr) (Sagace {Fr}).

"I've been trying to buy a Galileo for a while," said Lawley-Wakelin after snapping up the late April colt for 300,000gns. "This is a really athletic colt with a great page. He's for a longstanding client and he could be reoffered as a yearling."

Another Galileo colt in demand was [lot 1048](#), the chestnut son of G1 Irish 1000 Guineas winner Saoire (GB) (Pivotal {GB}). Blandford Bloodstock's Tom Goff signed at 325,000gns for the colt, who has been bought to race for an undisclosed client. His half-brother Requisition (Ire) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) is a listed winner and Group 3-placed, while two full-brothers, a yearling and a 2-year-old, have sold for €425,000 and €390,000, respectively, this year and last. "It's been a wonderful year and we're delighted with the prices for these two," said Brendan Boyle, who manages the stud on the Somerset/Devon border. "Prowess is not in foal this year, but she'll be going back to New Approach. She's still a young mare and hopefully on an upward curve. Marling is in foal to Oasis Dream and is likely to go to Declaration Of War next year."

The final session of foals begins today at 9.30 a.m. local time.

## AL SHAQAB RACING APPOINTS HERBERT

Representatives of Sheikh Joaan Al Thani yesterday unveiled some of the owner's exciting future plans at a press conference in London, headed by the announcement of Harry Herbert as racing advisor.

Herbert established Highclere Thoroughbred Racing 21 years ago, and he will continue as managing director of the syndication group alongside his new role with

Sheikh Joaan's Al Shaqab Racing. Herbert will also continue as racing consultant to the Cartier Awards and manage the Royal Ascot Racing Club horses. He is also a director of Newbury Racecourse and a Jockey Club member. Al Shaqab will be run as a separate entity from Herbert's offices at West Woodhay in Berkshire.

"I am extremely honored and excited to be invited by H E Sheikh Joaan to be his racing advisor," said Herbert, who has been in discussions for some time with the owner and his head of media, Nasser Al-Kaabi, about the role. "I first spoke to Nasser a few months ago about this, and it has not been an overnight decision. We needed to talk about how all the various roles would work, especially Highclere, which I have spent 20 years growing up. Sheikh Joaan wants me to keep the contracts that I have, including the Cartier Awards, which I have done for 23 years and is another thing that is close to my heart. There's also the Royal Ascot Racing Club, which has five horses and is part of the Highclere contract. It's very manageable to do everything."

"I spoke at length to Sheikh Joaan and Nasser, and it was very reassuring to me that he didn't in any way want this role to end Highclere and my association there."

A great season for Sheikh Joaan saw his filly Treve (Fr) (Motivator {GB}) win the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, while he has planned for the future by signing Frankie Dettori as retained rider in the summer. He has also made a big impression in the sales ring when setting a European record price of 5-million guineas for a Galileo (Ire) filly at Tattersalls in October. Al-Kaabi stressed the importance of building a good equine and human team.

"Al Shaqab Racing is one of the emerging forces in Thoroughbred racing. Our goals and objectives are to be everywhere all over the world and to have the most successful racing organization across the world," said Al-Kaabi.

"To achieve that we need to have the best horses and trainers. The appointment of Harry is a big asset to our Thoroughbred future."

He continued, "The winning feeling is tremendous, and it's a sport that takes your breath away. Sheikh Joaan is interested in being in the sport and expanding his interest. It's a passion for us that started many years ago with Arabian horses, and now we are continuing with Thoroughbreds."

### *Herbert Looks Forward...*

Harry Herbert, who comes from a family steeped in turf history, is relishing the latest chapter in a career that has seen a big racing involvement on both sides of the Atlantic. Herbert, 54, is the son of the late Lord Carnarvon, the Queen's long-term racing manager, and his brother-in-law John Warren now fills the same position.

His career began in the U.S. in 1982 with Bloodstock Research and he went on to work for the Matchmaker Group, a bloodstock sales, finance and promotion company run by now TDN co-publisher Barry Weisbord.

"The sport of Thoroughbred racing is in every pore of my body, my father instilled it in me," said Herbert. "And this represents an opportunity to be involved in the highest level of racing. To try and help Sheikh Joaan to achieve those aspirations is a huge privilege to me and I'm really looking forward to it. I've worked in racing for 30 years, and when I was with Matchmaker I was involved in setting up the International Turf Festival at Washington D.C., then we got involved at Hollywood Park. We then did the Matchmaker sponsorship at York to create the International there."

Since returning to Britain, where he set up HMH Management Ltd in 1985, he has been at the forefront of racing syndication, and he believes that experience will stand him well in the new position.

"It's very much a racing role, as an advisor overseeing the number of horses Al Shaqab have in training in Europe--in France and in Britain. There is an awful lot going on at the moment, but I'd like to think I could advise on," he added. "For me personally, the process of seeing where the horses fit in is important. We'll try to get some order into telling Sheikh Joaan what his horses are up to and a good information flow. I hope that in a year's time there will be more Group 1 races notched on the board and there won't be too much seconditis."

Al Shaqab will be run completely separately from Herbert's offices, and he can see his team expanding in years to come.

"Al Shaqab Racing will be based at the Highclere offices, but in a different part and they will not overlap. I don't know how many people we will end up with. We'll start with myself and my PA and then get an assistant--there's a job possibility there--and the team will expand as we develop," he said.

### *Al Shaqab Expands to America...*

Sheikh Joaan is set to have 110 Thoroughbred and Arab horses in training next season, of which 50 will be based in Britain, and he is also set to become an owner in America for the first time.

Nasser Al-Kaabi revealed that there is a long-term plan to be more involved in American racing, and next year Al Shaqab Racing will have horses with Todd Pletcher.

“At this time we are focusing on Europe, and in the future we hope to expand to America and Australia, but we will do it in an organized manner to meet our objectives,” said Al-Kaabi. “We are sending a couple of horses this year to Todd Pletcher and we are going to expand our American racing gradually, because racing in the U.S. is very intense and different from anywhere in the world. We want to study the market very well, and when we have done that we will put our foot in there. We have sent horses that have pedigrees to do well on sand to Todd Pletcher.”

Sheikh Joaan bought Haras de Bouquetot in France last year, which will house the stallions Planteur (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) and Style Vendome (Fr) (Anabaa) in 2014, and he is on the lookout for another stud farm in Europe as his breeding interests expand.

“We will also have a stud farm in the UK or Ireland in the years to come, but that is the future and it is something we will study well to meet our expectations,” added Al-Kaabi. “We have Planteur and Style Vendome at stud in France now, and in the future the likes of Toronado and Olympic Glory could be great stallions.”

Al Kaabi would not be drawn when asked whether Sheikh Joaan might try for G1 Oaks winner Dancing Rain (Ire) at Tattersalls on Monday, but added: “We are in the market at most of the sales and we will be buying some broodmares this year. We work with everybody, we have multiple agents and multiple trainers--that is our strategy. We take the experience from each person and benefit from it. Each trainer has their speciality, so it’s a good way to do it.”

### *Sponsorship on the Horizon...*

Sheikh Joaan’s cousin Sheikh Fahad and his brothers are big sponsors in British racing through QIPCO, and it is likely that Al Shaqab Racing will follow suit in the near future.

Al-Kaabi revealed that discussions are taking place about sponsorships, although nothing has yet been announced.

“The UK is very important to us and we are going to expand here in the future and are going to sponsor some races under the Al Shaqab banner--we are in negotiations at the moment,” he said. “We want to sponsor the best races, but everybody knows they have sponsors at the moment.”

Meanwhile, Sheikh Joaan’s horses will no longer be running in his name or in his predominantly grey colors next season.

“We are working on new silks, which we will announce shortly, and the horses will race under the Al Shaqab Racing banner next year,” added Al-Kaabi, who added that Sheikh Joaan is looking forward to welcoming Frankie Dettori back to the saddle next year.

“Frankie is a major asset to us--we believe we made the right choice when we chose him and we were very sad when he had his injury,” Al-Kaabi said. “We hope he is with us for many years to come, and I hope he is soon back on track.”

Al-Kaabi added that, despite the successful year, his team realizes just how competitive racing is and that Sheikh Joaan’s will to win won’t always be satisfied.

“Sheikh Joaan has ambitions and when he enters into a race--he wants to be number one,” he said. “He doesn’t accept being second; for him, coming second is losing. We are in this organization to lead and we hope we can do a good job,” Al-Kaabi said. “We don’t look at anybody else in racing. We just do our job in our own way, but our competition is big with the likes of Coolmore, Godolphin and Shadwell--a lot of well-established operations.”

“For us to be on top of the others is an amazing feeling, but it’s difficult--this year we had Treve, a spectacular filly and one of a kind,” he concluded.

**King Kreesa 'On the Mend' in Hong Kong...**

**King Kreesa** (King Cugat) is being observed by Hong Kong Jockey Club veterinarians for a case of travel sickness, and according to Dr. Chris Riggs, is "on the mend" but not yet out of the woods as it relates to a start in the G1 Longines Hong Kong Mile Dec. 8. "He had a bit of an elevated temperature and there are a couple of things that we look for in a horse's blood profile, like white cell counts and inflammatory proteins, which are indicators in this sort of situation," Riggs told South China *Morning Post*. "A horse suffering with travel sickness won't eat and he will be dull and depressed and King Kreesa is not displaying those signs. He was treated with antibiotics and he is responding as we would hope, but the next few days will be important, obviously."

Four-time Group 1 winner **Novellist (Ire)** (Monsun {Ger}--Night Lagoon {Ger}, by Lagunas {GB}) will command a fee of ¥4,000,000 (about US\$39,000) when he begins his stud career at Shadai Stallion Station next year, according to Twitter reports. Shadai's flagship stallions **Deep Impact (Jpn)** (Sunday Silence) and **King Kamehameha (Jpn)** (Kingmambo) were listed as being booked full, with fees not disclosed.

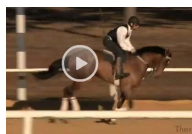
