



## A MILLION REASONS TO PURR

The first two days of the Tattersalls December Mares' Sale had already produced four millionaire mares, and a fifth topped the third day of trade when Group 3 winner **Purr Along (GB)** (Mount Nelson {GB}) was

bought in partnership by Qatar Racing and Newsells Park Stud for 1-million guineas (US\$1,720,319).

Another 8,863,500gns was added to the burgeoning gross at the 2013 December Sale, a third-day aggregate which was up by 20% on last year's turnover. With a seven-figure transaction

always likely to bring the average up, the strength in depth of trade was illustrated by another steep rise in the median to 25,000gns (+47%). The average of 48,701gns was an improvement of 39%, and the clearance rate also climbed four points to 83%, with 189 of the 219 offered lots changing hands.

Consigned through her trainer William Muir's Linkslade Stables, the 3-year-old Purr Along ([lot 2129](#)), whose dam Purring (Mountain Cat) was also sold in the session for 180,000gns ([lot 2045](#)), was knocked down to Newsells Park's Julian Dollar, but the sheet was signed by David Redvers of Qatar Racing.

"She's for the Secret Gesture partnership," said Redvers, referring to the Newsells Park Stud-bred G1 Epsom Oaks runner-up, who was part-sold to Qatar Racing following her facile victory in the Lingfield Oaks Trial. "We're very pleased to have another exciting filly to race for Qatar Racing and Newsells Park. She's been carefully handled by her current trainer, and no plan has yet been made for her future trainer."

Sheikh Fahad Al Thani, standing with Redvers and Dollar, added with a grin: "She's a beautifully bred filly. [Newsells Park Stud's] Mount Nelson is my second favorite stallion, after Dunaden (Fr)."

Hutton Goodman of Mt. Brilliant Farm, seated with manager Jody Alexander, made a determined play for the G2 Prix du Calvados winner, as did underbidder Clive Edginton, who has horses in training with William Muir. **Cont. p3**

## DESPITE OBJECTIONS, NYRA BOARD APPROVES INCREASED ADMISSION COSTS

The New York Racing Association handles more than \$2 billion a year and is coming off a year in which it lost \$10.5 million on its racing product, but the numbers that turned yesterday's meeting of the Reorganization Board of Directors into a spirited debate were \$2 and \$3. Those are the amounts NYRA management is proposing to increase admission costs by at Belmont and Saratoga, a move that some Board members saw as necessary in order to help stem the organization's annual losses while others saw it as a counterproductive move that will alienate fans and ultimately decrease revenues.

When the revenue from the slots at Aqueduct is factored in, NYRA is making a profit. But its newly hired CEO and President Chris Kay has made it his mission to make the racetracks profitable, exclusive of the slots money. With that in mind, a budget was submitted to the Reorganization Board yesterday that includes cuts and increases in projected revenue streams with the goal of achieving a \$250,000 profit in 2013. Most of the provisions in the budget were met with little objection, but that was far from the case when it came to proposed increases in admission costs.

NYRA management intends to increase the costs of grandstand admission at Belmont and Saratoga from \$3 to \$5 and the clubhouse fee from \$5 to \$8. Fans do not have to pay to enter Aqueduct. Kay said the increased admission costs will yield \$1.8 million in extra revenue. **Cont. p10**

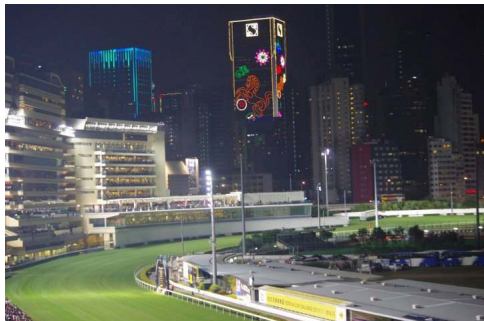

Just four lots before Purr Along established the session-topping price, the classy **Euphrasia (Ire)** (Windsor Knot {Ire}) ([lot 2125](#)) got the tempo going when bringing 500,000gns from Bill Dwan of The Castlebridge Consignment, who signed the docket as Emerald Bloodstock.

An eight-length maiden winner at The Curragh last October, Euphrasia gained an all-important black-type victory in this May's G3 Irish Stallions S. at Naas. After an ambitious foray at the highest level in the G1 Irish Champion S. and G1 Irish St. Leger--both off the board finishes--the 4-year-old stepped back in class to take Leopardstown's Listed Trigo S. Oct. 26.

Dwan, who stepped out of his usual role as consignor to sign the docket for an undisclosed Irish client, said he thinks Euphrasia is Group 1 class.

"The plan is for her to stay in training next year," Dwan confirmed. "Hopefully she can contest all the big races next year, hopefully pick up a Group 1 then go to the paddocks. She seems to be on the improve. She's a gorgeous filly; a great physical."

Euphrasia, a 12,000gns Tattersalls October Book 2 purchase by trainer Joseph Murphy three years ago, was offered by Murphy on behalf of a partnership.

**Anew Mate for Al Kazeem...**

Another well-credentialed mate for Al Kazeem (GB) was confirmed for next year when Nicolas de Watrigant of Mandore International went to 280,000gns to secure **Anew (GB)** (Oasis Dream {GB}) from the Juddmonte draft ([lot 2088](#)).

Though unraced, the 3-year-old filly hails from one of the best families in the stud book. Her dam Kid Gloves (GB), who is currently in foal to Frankel (GB), is an In The Wings (GB) half-sister to the outstanding producer Hasili (GB) (Kahyasi {GB}).

There was interest in the smart bay filly from Japanese buyer Keisuke Onishi and also Andy Williams of Australia's Arrowfield Stud, who had to make do with the role of underbidder as de Watrigant went in to bat for Sheikh Joaan Al Thani.

"She'll suit Al Kazeem very well and Sheikh Joaan holds a number of shares in him," said the Frenchman. "She's got the page and is very good looking. Sheikh Joaan was very keen to get into this family."

De Watrigant later went to 425,000gns for another mare to be included in Al Kazeem's book when buying **Light Up My Life (Ire)** (Zamindar) ([lot 2130](#)) from Overbury Stud for 425,000gns. Now three, the relation to Group 1 winner **Fallen For You (GB)** (Dansili {GB}) won twice as a juvenile and garnered black-type when placed in the G2 May Hill S. and G3 Oh So Sharp S.

On the day a media statement was released to quash rumors that the Juddmonte Farms racing and breeding operation is for sale, the draft of Juddmonte fillies provided the traditional Wednesday highlight, with a total of 23 sold for 1,627,000gns. Throughout the whole sale Juddmonte raised 2,676,000gns (\$4,604,018) from the sale of 51 fillies and mares.

Jono Mills of Rabbah stepped in for Dansili (GB) 3-year-old **Premium (GB)**, a half-sister to GI Northern Dancer Turf S. winner **Redwood (GB)** (High Chaparral {Ire}), paying 190,000gns for [lot 2108](#), the 94-rated winner.

"She's a winning Dansili, and a half to a Group 1 winner," Mills said. "We have lots of stallions that would suit her, and she'll probably go to New Approach (Ire) or Dubawi (Ire). She has a really strong pedigree, with Dancing Brave under the third dam."

Another top seller from the draft was [lot 2103](#), **Imprecation** (First Defence), a half-sister to Classic winner **Nebraska Tornado** (Storm Cat), who is likely to be on her way to America after she is covered in Europe early next year.

"She's been bought for a client of Denali Stud," confirmed agent James Delahooke, who signed for the 3-year-old at 130,000gns.

**Brooks Wins the Battle for Classy Lady...**

Trainer Charlie Brooks made a return to Tattersalls to assist in the purchase of Group 3 winner **Ardbrae Lady (GB)** (Overbury {Ire}), who was bought for a new partnership for 260,000gns.

Offered as [lot 2037](#) and in foal to Fastnet Rock (Aus), the 10-year-old mare has already produced two black-type horses--Jackaroo (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) and Jammy Guest (Ire) (Duke Of Marmalade {Ire})--from her three winners. Her filly foal by Sea the Stars (Ire) made €250,000 when sold at Goffs two weeks ago.

"Charlie selected her--he loved her," said Tom Goff, who signed the ticket. "She's a quality mare and we're very switched in to Fastnet Rock. We've bought quite a few by him here and in Ireland."

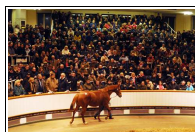

**Butler Banned cont. from p1**

In five of the nine cases, the drug in question was Sungate, and was administered by veterinarians. It was revealed during Butler's disciplinary hearing Nov. 18 and 19 that, in the other four cases, a drug called Rexogin, which contained stanozolol at 10 times the concentration of Sungate and is not approved for use in horses, was used, and was obtained and administered by Butler himself.

The situation first came to light in late February, when a visit to Butler's yard by the BHA yielded one positive test for stanozolol. Butler later admitted he had administered stanozolol to other horses in his care on the understanding from veterinarians that the substance did not breach the rules. Butler's seven charges surrounded his administration of the treatments himself, a practice that is restricted to licensed veterinarians, failing to keep adequate records, and "acting in a manner prejudicial to the integrity, proper conduct, and/or good reputation of horse racing in Great Britain, failure to act with due regard to the interest of horses under his care, and failure to take all reasonable steps to ensure the safety and welfare of horses under his care."

Adam Brickell, Director of Integrity, Legal and Risk for the BHA, said: "BHA's position, which was upheld by the Disciplinary Panel, was that the most serious charges related to Gerard Butler's gross failure to look after the best interests of four horses in his care, which amounted to conduct that was seriously prejudicial to the integrity, proper conduct and good reputation of the sport. The gravity of the breaches of the Rules of

Racing escalated when, in the course of cross-examination during the Disciplinary Panel hearing, Gerard Butler finally provided evidence as to where he had purchased the drug in question from, and admitted that the product he had administered himself to four horses was not the equine veterinary product Sungate, but instead an unlicensed stanozolol-based product called Rexogin, manufactured for use in humans. Furthermore, the Panel accepted that Butler had administered this product by intra-articular injection using a method restricted by law to qualified veterinary surgeons." **Cont. p9**

“The Panel also pointed to the fact that Butler took no veterinary advice before carrying out these procedures, did not have the horses properly assessed prior to their treatment, made no recording in his medication records of having injected the horses and that he subsequently allowed the horses to be treated by veterinary surgeons without informing them of the prior administrations. Furthermore, they noted that it is not appropriate for a trainer to say he is able to undertake an invasive veterinary procedure on the basis that he had seen veterinary surgeons performing the procedure, that he created unnecessary risks for the horses in obtaining the drug from an unlicensed source and that his behavior in administering the injections was consistent with the underhand and covert manner in which he purchased the drug.”

“Taking this all into account, the Panel summarized that the actions of Butler represented ‘an appalling breach of his duty to look after the interests of the horses in his care, and amounted to conduct that was seriously prejudicial to the integrity, proper conduct and good reputation of horse racing in Great Britain.’”

“The charges also related to five other positive samples taken from horses which were administered Sungate on the advice of and by a veterinary surgeon. The Rules are clear that the licence holder, in this case Gerard Butler, is wholly responsible for the presence of prohibited substances in horses in his care and control. However, it remains of concern to BHA that a practicing vet regularly treating racehorses, and therefore presumably familiar with the Rules, should have recommended and administered such a product to a horse in a trainer’s care or control.”

“This is an area we are continuing to explore and consult on with a view to strengthening our position. If the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons chooses to follow up on this specific matter, we would assist as required, as we have done on previous occasions.”

The 47-year-old Butler began training in 1998 after stints as assistant to Colin Hayes in Australia, Wayne Lukas in the U.S. and John Dunlop in the U.K. He recorded his most important victory in his second season when garnering the G1 Coral-Eclipse with Compton Admiral.

Kay said that NYRA's increases would put its admission costs in line with comparable racetracks, mentioning Santa Anita, Del Mar and Arlington Park. But a handful of Board members said the increases would send the wrong message to the public and would ultimately backfire.

"Raising admission prices, particularly at Belmont, is a mistake," said Board Member Barry Ostrager. "It's going to reduce on-track handle. We're going to cause more people to wager off track versus on track. Attendance has increased at Belmont and the attendance at Saratoga was satisfactory. If it's not broke, why fix it? You're going to alienate fans and lose handle, and lose money off this overall."

"People are already reluctant to come to the track," Board Member Earle Mack said. "You can get into a lot of other tracks now for free. Yes, we're in the red and we have to raise revenue, but that doesn't mean we go about this willy nilly without studying all the facts."

Board Chairman Dr. David Skorton called for a straw vote and seven members said they were in favor of passing a 2014 budget that included the increases while four were against. When the issue was brought to a formal vote it passed 10-1, with Barry Ostrager the lone 'no' vote.

There was a concession to revisit the issue in March before the Belmont spring meet begins.

NYRA also plans to jack up the fees it charges to those importing its simulcast signal and save some money by closing Aqueduct for training during the summer months when Belmont and then Saratoga are open. It will also experiment with Monday racing in the winter starting in January, substituting that day for Wednesdays. The idea is to be the only premier simulcast signal offered that day and be free of competition from Gulfstream.

Kay explained that it is important to make the racing end of NYRA's operation profitable so that the revenue from the Aqueduct slots can be put to good use. Presently, the slots money is used to cover the losses NYRA accrues with its racing product.

"We need to use the VLT funds to grow our business," Kay said. "That's why we need to break even or better."

When asked if he were surprised by the negative reaction to the admission increases among some Board members he replied: "This is a tough issue and as I said in my comments, change is difficult. It would be a lot easier for our management to team to keep everything the way it has been and then what would we have? I guess I have to take my hat off to people on our management team who have said we are willing to make these changes in the organization and with the business model."

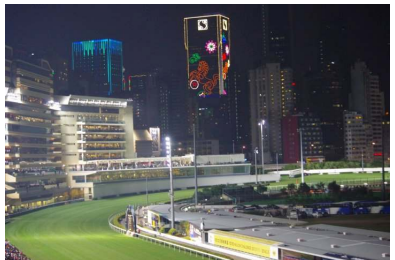

Imagine a track in the middle of the Upper East Side in New York. A knowledgeable crowd of roughly 15,000 people crammed in to watch Wednesday night's



International Jockeys' Championship, which was won by the Aussie Kerrin McEvoy. The statesmen representing America--Mike Smith and Gary Stevens--didn't land a blow, but hopefully they had as much fun as we did up in The Gallery restaurant. More later...

## A Fool and His Money...

Any male tourist walking by himself in Kowloon will be solicited. Often. At night, by madams--prostitution is legal here--who cajole and needle and, grabbing your arm, promise all kinds of things that will alter your worldview. Being impolite is hard for any Upstate New Yorker, and I've said, "I'm sure it would be lovely, but thanks, no," a few dozen times. Every street has at least one or two small shops, often with a bored-looking Indian or Pakistani tailor inside, a tape measure draped around his neck.

As you pass by, their associates outside are full of verve, however, and pull out every trick to try to convince you that a new, handmade suit is the most important purchase you'll make this year.

I had said no to maybe five or six guys already on Monday when a small, sharply dressed Indian on Canton Rd. convinced me to at least *talk* to his boss. I usually crumble under the application of even the most modest forms of sales pressure, and so essentially had committed to a purchase by following him into a nearby shopping mall. We didn't talk as we took a flight of stairs up, and then two escalators, before arriving at a small shop in a far corner of the mall near a service entrance. The windows were covered completely with decorative paper and Polaroid photos of clients being measured by the tailor.

We were greeted by another small Indian, wearing square, wire-rimmed glasses, who immediately began showing me swatches of wool. This is the Super 150, that's the Super 200. What was I looking for?

Well, I wasn't, really. But I quickly decided that I wasn't going to have the opportunity to buy a hand-tailored suit in Hong Kong very often, so started picking out some fabrics. I went with a dark gray. We started talking prices. He threw out some numbers, I winced a few times. He came back with new numbers, I furrowed my brow. Finally, he threw out a figure that didn't elicit any facial tics. He threw in a shirt, too. I didn't have 'yes' out before he started taking measurements.

Ten minutes later, as I walked back out on to Canton Rd., I was pretty sure the shop would still be there the next day when I came back for my first fitting. Not 100%, but reasonably confident. It was, as it turns out, and so now we'll wait and see what sort of duds I'll be wearing to the International Races on Sunday.

manner, masterfully guiding the Francis Lui-trained **Home With Glory (Ire)** (Captain Rio {GB}) to a front-running upset at odds of 27-1 ([video](#)) for 12 crucial points. Suguru Hamanaka, having his first-ever ride outside of Japan,

was up for second (6 points), while Ryan Moore picked up four points in third.

It was the same tactics with a different pilot in the second leg of the challenge, as Christophe Soumillon sent 3-1 favorite **Flying Chaparral (NZ)** (High Chaparral {Ire}) into a clear lead with a circuit to travel and made every pole a winning one, besting the McEvoy-ridden **Expectator (Aus)** (Oratorio {Ire}) by a convincing 3 1/4 lengths ([video](#)), with Mike Smith picking up his only points of the evening with a third-place effort. The winner gave Lui a training double on the evening.

The third leg of the series also went the way of chalk players, as **Fun 'N' Games (Aus)** (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}) was given a pace-pressing ride from the inside by Italian and G1 Dubai World Cup-winning jockey Mirco Demuro a late burst from **St Yazin (NZ)** (Keeper {Aus}) and Richard Hughes to score by a diminishing neck ([video](#)). Purton earned his first points of the night with a third.

McEvoy held a 6-point advantage into the final race over Demuro and Soumilion, with Hughes and Hamanaka in with a chance should they emerge victorious. But all of the chief protagonists were bankrupt, and Purton managed to work his way into second place in the competition, piloting 19-10 chalk **Majestic Anthem (Aus)** (Dubawi {Ire}) to a 2 1/4-length victory over Frenchman Maxime Guyon and the slow-starting **Formula Won (Ire)** (Dutch Art {GB}) ([video](#)). Moore was third atop the Richard Gibson-trained Great Charm (Aus) (Henny Hughes).

"I'm very delighted to have won this event, it's a great competition," said McEvoy, who earned HK\$500,000 (US\$64,491) for the victory. "There are some great names on this trophy, and to have my name on it, too, is a great thrill. I was on an outsider in the first leg, but he got a cheap lead and had enough kick to hold on. In the second, I drew a nice gate, and was able to save energy for the final furlongs and getting points was a bonus. It's been a fantastic experience riding with such greats as Gary Stevens and Mike Smith, and I'm grateful to the Hong Kong Jockey Club for inviting me here, and I hope I can come again. I last rode at Happy Valley in 2004, but never rode a winner, so it was nice to put that right tonight."

American Gary Stevens had a reasonably tough night at the office. His best result was a ninth-place effort in the second of the four events.

Pearl Bloodstock's **Dunaden (Fr)** (Nicobar {GB}) and Ronald Arculli's **Red Cadeaux (GB)** (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}), victorious in the G1 Longines Hong Kong Vase in 2011 and 2012, respectively, see their paths cross yet again in the 2400-meter test this coming Sunday.

The two veterans got to know each other very well in the 2011 G1 Melbourne Cup, with Dunaden just getting his nose down on the wire before defeating Red

Cadeaux into a dead-heat for third. The Mikel Delzangles runner was even-money to successfully defend his Vase title 12 months ago, but could do no better than a flat fifth, as Red Cadeaux scored at 9-1 for Arculli, a

former chief executive of the Hong Kong Jockey Club. Dunaden was not among the original invitees to the Vase, as connections thought backing up after a run in the G1 Japan Cup could prove too taxing. But the 7-year-old entire has bounced out of a longshot fifth to Gentildonna (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}) in fine form despite some adversity.

"He lost a shoe in the Japan Cup and we found it on the bend, but we could not figure out whether he lost it during the race or after," Delzangles explained.

"Anyway, his hoof remained a little warm until his arrival here and the blacksmith has done a good job fixing it. Dunaden is as good as ever now. He knows his routine nowadays, so there's nothing we will change and I hope he will do well on Sunday. We had planned to keep him in Japan for the [G1] Arima Kinen [Dec. 22], but as it happened, he would have had to stay on his own for a month. He would have hated it and we opted for another visit to Hong Kong. He knows his whereabouts here and found some of his usual travelling mates. It's only two weeks between runs which is tight, but the horse looks to be happy and fresh. The trick is just to keep him happy."

Red Cadeaux turned in his final piece of serious work ahead of Sunday's race, going six furlongs on the turf in 1:21.1, with a final 400 meters in :25 flat.

No Japanese sprinter had ever really landed a blow in the G1 Longines Hong Kong Sprint prior to 2012. Then again, the country had never sent over a short-tracker who had remotely the quality of **Lord Kanaloa (Jpn)** (King Kamehameha {Jpn}), and the 5-year-old did little to suggest anything was going to strip him of his title this weekend with a nifty workout Wednesday morning. Sent out over 1200 meters, Lord Kanaloa closed his final half-mile in :49.5, with a scintillating final two furlongs in :21.5.

"It was just like his usual gallop and I am happy with that today," said Shogo Yasuda, assistant to trainer

Takayuki Yasuda. "Actually I tried to relax him in the gallop, but as it was his second time in Hong Kong and he is used to this environment, I felt he still needed more spirit. So I drove him a bit strongly at the end of the

stretch run. He is in top form physically, so I will try to raise him mentally in the following three days."

Lord Kanaloa will be having just his fifth start of the year this weekend. He has won three of his four starts this season and stretched out successfully to a mile to win the G1 Yasuda Kinen June 2. Given a bit of a break, he just missed in the G2 Centaur S. at Hanshin Sept. 8, but got back to winning ways with a defense of his title in the G1 Sprinters' S. Sept. 29. He will be making the final start of his career Sunday.

**Formidable Females Feature in Mile...**

No female has won the G1 Longines Hong Kong Mile since the late Sunline (NZ) (Desert Sun {GB}) defeated local darling Fairy King Prawn (Aus) (Danehill) in 2000, but two top-shelf females will try to stop that streak this weekend.

George Strawbridge's **Moonlight Cloud (GB)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) will look to conclude a perfect season in an event which has been dominated over the years by locally based horses.

The Strawbridge homebred enters off a trio of Group 1 victories, including the G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest going 1300 meters Aug. 4 and the G1 Prix Jacques le Marois over the mile a week later, but she saved her best for her last.

Trailing the field in the G1 Prix de la Foret on Arc day Oct. 6, she unleashed an impossible turn of foot to defeat the re-opposing Gordon Lord Byron (Ire) (Byron {GB}) by three lengths. Moonlight Cloud appears to have settled in nicely since her arrival and worked a leisurely 800 meters over the all-weather track in :57.8 (:29.9, :27.9) Wednesday morning. Trainer Freddy Head explained that the Mile was always in the cards this year.

"I liked her piece of work this morning over the dirt track, which rode a bit softer than the previous days, according to the mare's rider, Philippe Coppin," Head explained. "George Strawbridge decided to send her here rather than another tilt at the Breeders' Cup because he figured she would be better off on this racecourse. The mare has developed year after year since she arrived at my yard, but never as much as last winter, oddly enough. She has become stronger but wiser, too, and she's much easier to deal with nowadays."

Winner of the G1 1000 Guineas, G1 Coronation S. and G1 Sun Chariot S., she passed on the Champions Day meeting as Ascot when the ground

**Nifty Pre-Cup Moves for Outsiders...**

**Neatico (Ger)** (Medicean {GB}) comes into Sunday's G1 Longines Hong Kong Mile with a significantly lower international rating than the likes of **Military Attack (Ire)** (Oratorio {Ire}) and **Cirrus des Aigles (Fr)** (Even Top {Ire}), but a slick breeze over the turf Wednesday morning suggests he may be ready for a big effort in Sunday's richest race. A winner

of four of his last five outings, the 6-year-old finished off a 1200-meter workout with a final quarter mile in a slick :22 under raceday jockey Andrasch Starke.

"Neatico looked good today," said trainer Peter Schiergen, who also orchestrated the career of G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe winner Danedream (Ger) (Lomitas {GB}). He travelled well and I'm happy with him. Neatico has won four races on good ground this year." Neatico's marquee win came in this year's G1 Bayrisches Zuchtrennen July 28.

Japanese horses have won the Cup on three occasions, but not since Agnes Digital (Crafty Prospector) in 2001. **Tokei Halo (Jpn)** (Gold Halo {Jpn}) will be a decided longshot Sunday, but brings outstanding form over the 2000-meter distance into the race. The 4-year-old won three straight going the metric

10 furlongs earlier this year, including the G2 Sapporo Kinen Aug. 18, but failed to fire when 10th at 3-1 in the G1 Tenno Sho (Autumn) Oct. 27. Connections allowed the bay to roll down the lane Wednesday, and he capped off 1200 meters of work with a final couple of furlongs in a solid :24.5.

"He settled very well--he wasn't too relaxed and he wasn't too tense, he was just how we would want him," commented jockey Yutaka Take, who was aboard for the move. "He keeps good form and hopefully he can be set for Sunday with this good condition."

Trainer Hisashi Shimizu added that he'd like an inner gate when post positions are drawn Thursday.

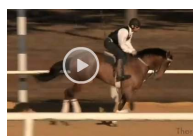
