ARQANA BREEDING STOCK SALE BEGINS TODAY

Arqana will begin its final sale of the year today when it kicks off its December Breeding Stock Sale, set for Dec. 7 to 10 in Deauville. The catalogue includes 947 foals, broodmares, and fillies in and out of training, plus 10 wildcard entries. last to finish just a half-length back of She's a Tiger (Tale of the Cat) and Ria Antonia (Rockport Harbor) in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies at Santa Anita Nov. 2. "Rosalind's a lot more accomplished at this stage in her career," McPeek told the *TDN* when asked to compare this year's charge with last year's winner Pure Fun (Pure Prize). "She's already been second twice and third once in three graded races, whereas Pure Fun hadn't even started in a graded race until this point. So we feel pretty good about our chances this year as compared to last." **Cont. p4**

2014 GRADED STAKES LIST RELEASED

The Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association's American Graded Stakes Committee announced its list of U.S. graded and listed stakes races for 2014 yesterday.

Out of 713 races reviewed, graded status was assigned to 455 of them, two fewer than last year, while listed status was given to 190 races. Five graded races were upgraded and three new Grade III races were named.

There were also 30 non-listed black-type races upgraded to listed status. Three graded races and 25 listed races from 2013 were considered no longer eligible for grading in 2014.

The La Troienne S. at Churchill Downs was upgraded to a Grade I, while Saratoga's Prioress S. and Calder's Princess Rooney H. were downgraded from Grade I to Grade II. Four races were upgraded to Grade II status: Oaklawn's Azeri S., and Gulfstream's Sabin S., Holy Bull S., and Swale S. The Charles Town Oaks, Del Mar's Torrey Pines S., and Santa Anita's L.A. Woman S.

Seven races were downgraded from Grade II to Grade III: Aqueduct's Go For Wand S., Santa Anita's Santa Barbara S., Belmont's Vagrancy H. and Dwyer S., Saratoga's Sanford S., Del Mar's La Jolla S., and Gulfstream's Hutcheson S. Santa Anita's El Encino S. and San Luis Obispo S. and Betfair's Jim Murray H. were not eligible for grading in 2014. Monmouth Park's Sapling S. and Thistledown's Ohio Derby were downgraded from Grade III to listed.

There were 30 races upgraded to listed status for 2014 and 16 races downgraded from listed to non-listed black-type status.

Perhaps the most intriguing runner in the field is Bad Boy Racing LLC and Whizway Farms's **Taste Like Candy** (Candy Ride {Arg}), who garnered the **TDN Rising Star** distinction when she romped home a 6 1/2-length debut winner sprinting at Santa Anita Oct. 20, earning a field-best 85 Beyer Speed Figure. Trained by Hall of Famer Jerry Hollendorfer, who has conditioned half of the last four Starlet winners, the bay is bred top and bottom for this trip. **Bajan** (Speightstown) took the seven-panel Moccasin S. here Nov. 9, while **Arethusa** (A.P. Indy) aired by 8 1/4 lengths in the track-and-trip Sharp Cat S. Nov. 16.

While McPeek said he has no worries about Rosalind handling another surface--noting that the versatile filly seems to prefer synthetic and that her :49 flat breeze over the track Tuesday was "a piece of cake"--he does have one concern. "With her, there are always pace concerns," he noted. "But we'll just let her run her race. You would like to think she can outclass them either way. But pace is definitely an issue. We'll leave that up to [rider] Joel [Rosario]--he's been a pretty good judge of pace this year." Winchell Thoroughbreds homebred Untapable came into the Breeders' Cup as a bit of a buzz horse off her win in the Pocahontas, but seemed to be fading in Arcadia before she was forced to check completely out of it when Secret Compass (Discreet Cat) broke down. She has remained out West with trainer Steve Asmussen's Santa Anita string, and seems to be working well over that strip in the interim. Though she has never tried synthetic, Untapable's half-brother Paddy O'Prado (El Prado {Ire}) was second over Polytrack in Keeneland's 2010 GI Blue Grass S. and did most of his best work on the grass. Reddam Racing's **Concave** (Colonel John) returns off short rest, having finished third in the GIII Delta Downs Princess two weeks ago. Also forced to check out of the BC Juvenile Fillies, the Doug O'Neill pupil took Del Mar's GII Sorrento S. over the Polytrack Aug. 7 before finishing third to She's a Tiger in that venue's GI Del Mar Debutante three starts later.

'HAY' LOOKS TO RETURN TO WINNING WAYS

Pegram, Watson and Weitman's 3-year-old filly **Fiftyshadesofhay** (Pulpit) figures to be a short price facing mostly fellow 3-year-olds in Betfair Hollywood Park's GII Bayakoa H. Scratched from Churchill's GII Falls City H. on Thanksgiving for this spot, the bay is 7-3-2-2 on conventional dirt this season. Highlights of her campaign include victories in Pimlico's GII Black-Eyed Susan S. May 17 and the GIII Iowa Oaks at Prairie Meadows the following month. She also finished second to Beholder (Henny Hughes) in the GI Las Virgenes S. and third in the GI Santa Anita Oaks, and completed the GI Alabama S. exacta behind Princess of Sylmar (Majestic Warrior) at the Spa in August. The Bob Baffert trainee has been off since settling for third at 2-5 after setting a hot pace in the GII Indiana Oaks Oct. 5 over a sloppy track. She broke her maiden in her lone attempt over this surface last November. Ramona Bass, Claiborne Farm and Adele Dilschneider's **Spellbound** (Bernardini) makes her first start since finishing one spot behind Fiftyshadesofhay in the Santa Anita Oaks. Jerry Hollendorfer has won two of the last three renewals of this race, and has two chances to make it two-for-four. Sophomore **Broken Sword** (Broken Vow) cruised by 5 1/2 lengths in a Golden Gate optional claimer Nov. 10, earning a 90 Beyer Speed Figure for what was her first synthetic route attempt. Tommy Town Thoroughbreds representative **Curvy Cat** (Ministers Wild Cat) finished second to **Warren's Venada** (Affirmative) in this venue's Cat's Cradle H. for state-breds at 7 1/2 furlongs Nov. 17.

AUSTRALIAN PREVIEWS

LUCKY LOOKS FOR KINGSTON CROWN

Luckygray (Aus) (Bradbury's Luck {Aus}) added a second G1 Railway S. to his tally at Perth's Ascot Racecourse two weeks ago, and tomorrow he will look to defend his title in the G1 Kingston Town Classic over his favorite course. After performing with consistency at the highest levels over this circuit the past two years, the 6-year-old was transferred to Melbourne for a campaign in the big leagues this year. He failed to hold his form for trainer Robert Smerdon, and was sent home in November to finish fourth in the G2 Lee Steere S. for new trainer Trevor Andrews prior to his Railway score. Luckygray will be reopposed by an old rival, **Mr Moet (Aus)** (Mosayter), who beat him home in last year's Railway before finishing second in the Kingston Town Classic. Mr Moet fared slightly better than Luckygray in Melbourne this year, placing third in the G1 C.F. Orr S. in February, but he failed to hit the board in some of the Australian spring's most important contests recently, and checked in seventh in the Railway two weeks ago. G2 Western Australia Guineas winner **Ihtsahymn (Aus)** (Ihtiram {Aus}) makes his first start against older rivals, and **Elite Belle (Aus)** (Canny Lad {Aus}) is a late-blooming 5-year-old mare who makes a class jump.

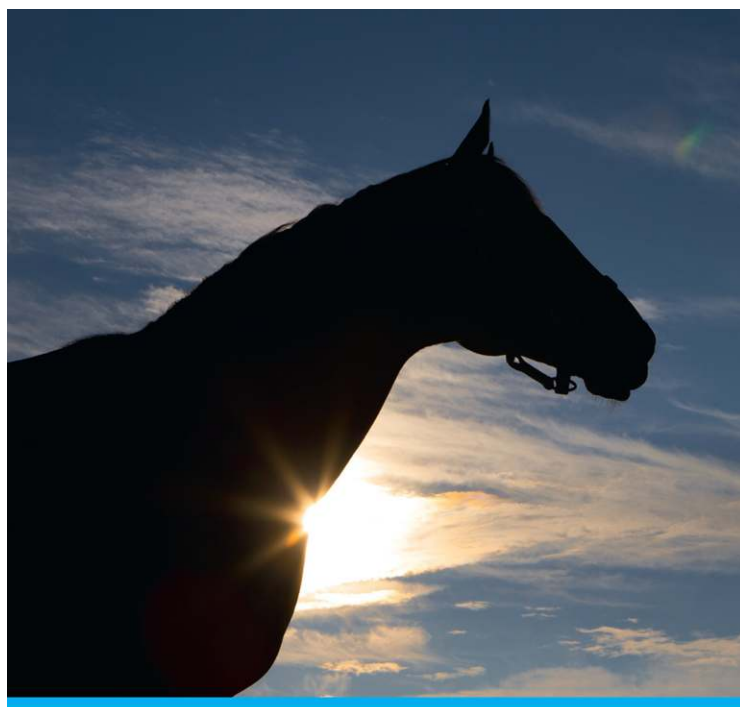

A STAR ON THE RISE

With divisional honors on the line in tomorrow's G1 Hanshin Juvenile Fillies, the Hanshin faithful will be hoping to witness the coming out of a star in the mould of *Vodka* (Jpn), *Buena Vista* (Jpn) or *Apapane* (Jpn), who all annexed this prestigious event on their respective routes to stardom. **Harp Star (Jpn)** (Deep Impact {Jpn}) could be one to fit that profile. Off the mark at Chukyo July 14, the bay jumped up in class to take the G3 Niigata Nisai S. Aug. 25, sweeping from last to first with an eye-popping stretch rally to win by three lengths. The second and fifth place finishers that day have each gone on to win a pair of stakes, including **Marble Cathedral (Jpn)** (Daiwa Major {Jpn}), who reopposes here. "We [gave her a break] after the last race," said Harp Star's trainer Hiroyoshi Matsuda, who has won this race three times. "She came back to us having filled out a little, but she's getting sharper with each week. We've had our sights set on this race for a long time, so we need to make sure she gets the work in. As things stand, she is on the heavy side. The potential is definitely there. She runs far better on turf in the actual races than in training on woodchip. We're hoping she improves leaps and bounds, the way she did from her debut to the Niigata Nisai S." **Forevermore (Jpn)** (Neo Universe {Jpn}) warrants a serious look on the merits of a pair of authoritative victories to kick off her career, in a Niigata maiden Aug. 11 and a Tokyo allowance Oct. 5. While her trainer, Yuichi Shikato, admits it will be a big class jump for his charge, he notes she is in top form. **Horai Akiko (Jpn)** (Johannesburg) has opened her career with two track record-setting performances in three outings, including her most recent effort, a neck victory in the G2 Daily Hai Nisai S. Oct. 5. She also took the Kokura Nisai S. Sept. 1, and looks to keep her perfect record intact.

DEVIL IN THE...

“The details are not details. They make the design.” That’s what the American artist and designer Charles Eames said once, and while it’s doubtful he’s directly influenced the Hong Kong Jockey Club--no one’s heard of Charles Eames, including me (I found the quote on brainyquote.com)--the spirit of his statement has informed the HKJC’s efforts this week in hosting the International Races. The best example of which was Friday night’s Gala Dinner at the Hong Kong Exhibition Centre, an annual celebratory dinner that, for the first time, also recognized the world’s three top-ranked Thoroughbreds in a ceremony dubbed, oddly enough, The World’s Best Racehorse Ceremony.

First, the easy part, the winners: Wise Dan (Wiseman’s Ferry), the two-time GI Breeders’ Cup Mile winner and defending U.S. Horse of the Year, checked in third with a ranking of 129 pounds. The top spot, at 130 pounds, was deservedly shared by two of the fairer sex, the now-retired Black Caviar (Aus) (Bel Esprit {Aus}), and the breakout 3-year-old superstar Treve (Fr) (Motivator {GB}).

Criquette Head-Maarek was on hand to accept the award for the last named, and said training the G1 Prix de l’Arc de Triomphe heroine for Sheikh Joaan Al Thani was a “dream come true,” particularly because her father, Alec Head, planned the mating and her family raised Treve as a youngster.

The owner/breeder of Wise Dan, Morton Fink, deputized what I was told was a friend of 65 years, and the best man at his wedding, to accept on his behalf. The friend read a statement from Fink, who thanked his “pillars of support,” his wife Elaine and daughter Bonnie Fink Marcus, as well as trainer Charlie Lopresti and his wife Amy, and Patchen Wilkes farm manager Barry Ezrin, who raised the multiple champion.

The hard part is capturing the style that went into the event. Patrons at the cocktail hour, held on the third or fourth floor of the conference center, were quickly equipped with flutes of champagne and greeted by a pair of slender models in white silk-and-feather bustiers, poised on stilts, who strutted (slowly) about the room, striking poses and bending for photo ops. Similarly dressed models, sans stilts, were hooped in illuminated serving trays, on which sat small trays of foie gras.

Other waiters brought along bits of caviar and lobster on croutons and tuna tartare blinis; glasses of chardonnay and sangiovese were delivered in clockwork fashion.

Four large doors, each 30 feet high and the width and shape airplane wings, eventually opened to reveal the dining area, a cavernous room that comfortably held three- or four-hundred guests (I'm 100% guessing here), which was made to feel much more intimate by the scale of the three massive viewing screens behind the stage, which made folks even in the back rows feel like they were inches from the action. A chocolatey forest mushroom and black truffle soup was served; raw salmon and caviar on silver dollar pancakes, lobster and avocado timbales, and crab claws comprised the second course, Veal Wellington or Chicken Verde were the options for the main.



On stage, improbably, there was a compelling fashion show of...wrist watches (from title sponsor Longines). (Really, it takes some doing to pull off a watch fashion show in front of hundreds, but a multi-national cast pulled it off...)

The video and audio presentations were Hollywood-caliber. The lighting and atmosphere were first rate.

In all, the Hong Kong Jockey Club met, or maybe established, a standard that few jurisdictions in the world can. A terrific night.

STABLELAB ON THE RISE

By Kelsey Riley

In June, Irish entrepreneur Heinrich Anhold put five years of research and development on the line when he launched StableLab, the first handheld blood test for equines. With StableLab, horse people would for the first time be able to detect infection within minutes while at the horse's side, eliminating the need for time-consuming and costly lab reports. Furthermore, through the identification of Serum Amyloid A (SAA)—a protein produced by the liver to carry immune cells to the source of inflammation--users of StableLab would be able to detect and monitor infection before the horse started to show outward signs (for a more detailed report on how StableLab works, [click here](#)).

For these reasons, StableLab has been an intriguing revolution for both racing stables and stud farms. The results and growth since the company's launch just five months ago, however, has been beyond even the ambitious Anhold's wildest imagination.

"People are getting a lot more excited about the results than we expected," Anhold explained. "There's been a few interesting things that have come out of our case studies so far, which has really helped us a lot."

For the next four days, Anhold will be on hand at the American Association of Equine Practitioners Annual Conference in Nashville, Tennessee, where Hagyards Equine Medical Institute and Rood and Riddle Equine Hospital will feature StableLab at their booths, in addition to presenting the compelling results of a series of case studies conducted since the summer. Anhold explained that partnerships with Lexington's two largest veterinary hospitals has been key in uncovering some exciting new uses of StableLab.

“We’ve run 120 properly controlled case studies, and what we’ve seen is that the marker we use, SAA, responds much more aggressively to infection inflammation, and responds not very often in non-infection inflammation,” Anhold said. “That’s a big surprise, because it was previously just an inflammatory response, and now what we actually have is a marker of infection. It means you can be much more specific in diagnosing what’s wrong with the horse, and in understanding if the horse needs antibiotics or not. What we’ve also seen is that tests respond very rapidly in response to infection, and stay elevated until the infection clears. That means the hospitals can use it to monitor if antibiotic treatment is working or not. People are getting very excited about having a blood test that can do that, because no other blood test has ever done that before.”

Anhold also noted that StableLab, already popular in training yards for monitoring the health of racehorses, has been widely adopted on stud farms for the purpose of detecting diseases in young foals, which can prove lethal before outward signs are apparent.



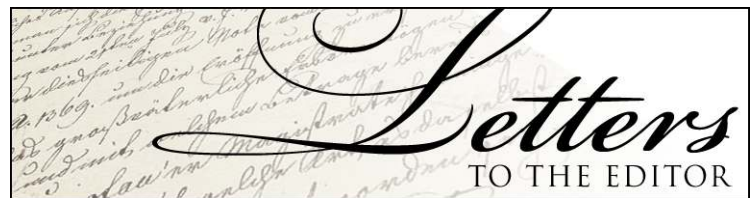

“The breeding farms are starting to use this as a screening tool for diseases like rhodococcus,” he explained. “This is something very new to be able to use it as a proper screening tool, not to just keep an eye on foals and

hope that you spot something in time. This is something that can be used as part of a routine to really control disease outbreak, and really understand what’s happening.”

The demand for StableLab has been such that its users are now requesting a service rather than simply a product, Anhold said. Therefore, in the near future, the company will begin offering its clientele comprehensive reports to interpret the results of the tests, including recommendations on its use and comparison of disease outbreak to other stud farms or training yards in the area.

“It’s going in a lot of directions at the minute, and they’re all going really well,” Anhold said. “It’s just been a tremendous start for us, so we’ve been very lucky. We had a product, we let it out there, and it’s starting to create new markets and new systems for people.”

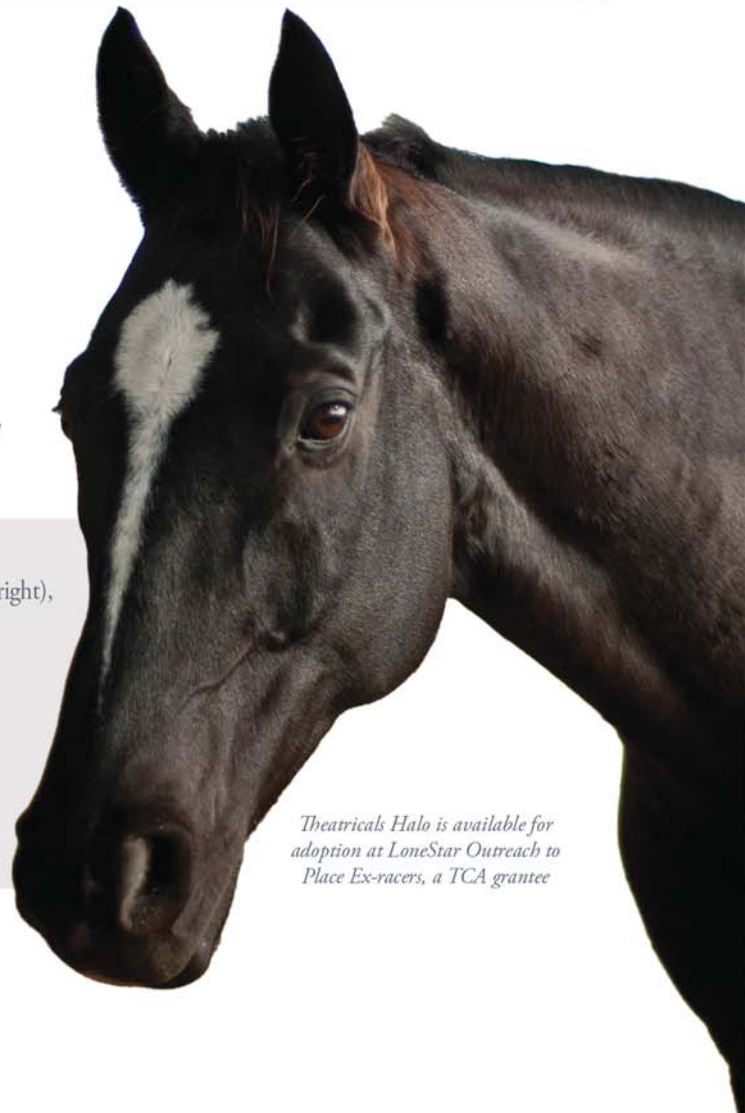

STRONACH JOINS WHOA

Edited Press Release

Global horseman Frank Stronach, leading Thoroughbred owner, breeder and proprietor of three of the industry's most famous racing venues, has joined the Water Hay Oats Alliance (WHOA) as a supporter of federal legislation to rid North American racing of race-day medications.

In a letter last week to WHOA, Mr. Stronach, founder of Adena Springs and one of the sport's most successful horse owners and breeders, said, "racing can not only survive the elimination of race-day medications, but it will flourish and invigorate itself while cultivating new fans from around the world".

The Canadian-based entrepreneur, whose company

The Stronach Group owns six major race tracks, including Santa Anita Park, Gulfstream Park, and Pimlico Race Course, becomes the first major track owner to join the group of influential owners and breeders pushing for the United States and Canada to join the rest of the world's major jurisdictions in banning all medications, including anti-bleeder medicines and painkillers, on race day.

"We as track operators, horsemen and regulators must do everything we can to eliminate race day medications and consider the support of federal legislation to create a more uniform set of rules and regulations," Stronach wrote. "The integrity of our sport and safety of our athletes, both human and equine, should and must always be of paramount concern. I hope you join me in promoting the elimination of race day medications."

The movement has gradually garnered support by some of the industry's most influential owners and breeders, including many members of the Jockey Club. None bring wider influence to the reform effort than Stronach. Before purchasing several of the sport's leading tracks, he forged glittering owner and breeder credentials as founder of Adena Springs which he started in Kentucky in 1989. Since then Stronach/Adena Springs has won 12 Eclipse Awards, including eight as leading breeder and four as leading owner. In Canada, Stronach has been honored with Sovereign Awards nine times as leading owner and nine times as leading breeder.

His premier racing facility, Santa Anita Park, has been selected as site of the Breeders' Cup for three consecutive years from 2012 through 2014. In addition, The Stronach Group owns Laurel Park, Portland Meadows, Golden Gate Fields, a 2,000-acre stallion complex in Bourbon County and Palm Meadows Training Center in Boynton Beach Florida.

ALL-WEATHER PROPOSAL FOR NEWCASTLE

Newcastle racecourse and Arena Racing Company (ARC) yesterday launched a consultation program to consider the development of a floodlit synthetic track at the Gosforth Park venue, with an initial target of racing on the new surface in 2015. Current proposals will see the existing turf track replaced with an all-weather surface, incorporating the only floodlit straight mile in the world, and a general upgrading of facilities. "We are very excited by these proposals," said Newcastle's David Williamson. "Should these plans proceed, then they will enhance Newcastle racecourse as one of the pre-eminent racing and events venues in the UK." ARC's Tony Kelly added, "The development of an all-weather track in the north has long been an ambition of ours, and this proposal would develop the best floodlit all-weather track in the world, given the superb, wide galloping track and our ability to incorporate a floodlit straight mile. This track would fit superbly within the ARC all-weather Championship, and would give us the ability to possibly share finals day with Lingfield Park. We hope to lodge a planning application in early 2014 once we have completed our consultation exercise."
