‘BELIEF’ FIRES CASHCALL WARNING SHOT

Jungle Racing, Hollendorfer, Solis II, et al’s **Shared Belief** (Candy Ride {Arg}) worked six panels in a best-of-eight 1:12.60 at Betfair Hollywood Park yesterday as he prepares to face as many as 11 fellow juveniles in that venue’s GI CashCall Futurity Saturday.

A seven-length debut winner for breeders Pam and Marty Wygod and trainer Jedd Josephson at Golden Gate Nov. 10, the dark bay was subsequently purchased privately by a group that includes trainer Jerry Hollendorfer, bloodstock agent Alex Solis II and Jim Rome’s Jungle Racing. “I’ve worked with Jerry [Hollendorfer] for about a

year now,” Solis said Sunday when asked about the details of the private purchase. “He told me [the Wygods] had a horse for sale and to take a look at him and put together a partnership. I went up north the next morning at 5 a.m. and liked what I saw. I did my homework on him. He had a real good [speed] figure and his maiden race was very impressive. All the credit goes to Jerry.” Solis, whose father Alex Solis has won the Futurity a record-tying four times as a rider, added, “Usually it’s so difficult to put these things together, but this was so fast, it was ridiculous. Jerry took a third, and out of my two thirds, I sold pieces to Rome, Jason Litt and KMN Racing.” Hollendorfer, Solis, and company’s investment quickly paid major dividends as Shared Belief cruised home by 7 3/4 lengths in the seven-panel Gill Hollywood Prevue S. The gelding, who is a supplementary nominee for the \$750,000 CashCall at a cost of \$15,000 to enter and \$15,000 to start, is expected to be joined by fellow Hollendorfer pupil **Tamarando** (Bertando), winner of the GI Del Mar Futurity Sept. 4 and most recently of the track-and-trip Real Quiet S. for breeders Mr. and Mrs. Larry Williams. MURTAGH HONORED AT AWARDS

Johnny Murtagh yesterday picked up the Flat Award at the annual Horse Racing Ireland awards ceremony at Leopardstown, seeing off Jim Bolger, Kevin Manning, Aidan O’Brien and Joseph O’Brien in the process. Turning his hand to training this year as well as riding a clutch of big-race winners, the longstanding premier jockey was successful on 30 of his 125 domestic rides and saddled a further 15 winners from his Curragh base, with Royal Diamond (Ire) (King’s Best) bagging the G3 Long Distance Cup at the British Champions meeting at Ascot in October. He also rode the G1 Irish Oaks winner Chicquita (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) and G1 Pretty Polly S. scorer Ambivalent (Ire) (Authorized {Ire}) and steered the impressive Novellist (Ire) (Monsun {Ger}) to success in the G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth S. “It’s a huge honour and I’m privileged to be here,” Murtagh said. “When you look at the other people in this category, I really wasn’t expecting to win. I think being both [a trainer and jockey] helped me win today. I’m in a wonderful position, I’m training some nice horses and riding some really good ones again and they are winning.”

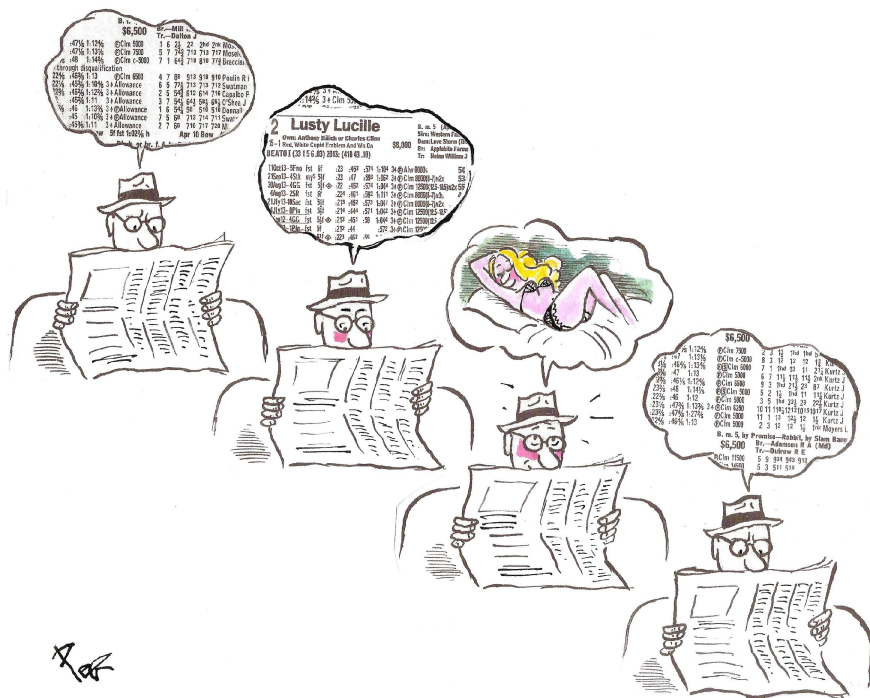

Another CashCall Futurity entrant who must be supplemented for the race is Ken and Sarah Ramsey's **We Miss Artie** (Artie Schiller), winner of the GI Dixiana Breeders' Futurity on Keeneland's Polytrack Oct. 5 before finishing a troubled seventh on the Santa Anita dirt in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Nov. 2. Among the others exiting the Juvenile are Reddam Racing's GI FrontRunner S. winner **Bond Holder** (Mineshaft) (fourth) and Fog City Stable's lightly raced ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ **Tap It Rich** (Tapit) (fifth). Also expected to run are: the John Sadler-trained and C R K Stables-owned pair of **Kobe's Back** (Flatter) and **Candy Boy** (Candy Ride {Arg}); the Ken McPeck-trained duo of Magdalena Racing's **Rankhasprivileges** (Einstein {Brz}) and Magic City Thoroughbred Partners' **Sheikinator** (Curlin); J K Racing's **Brother Soldier** (Brother Derek); Brewster Racing Stable, et al's **Karma King** (Pure Prize); and Gary and Mary West's **Poker Player** (Harlan's Holiday). 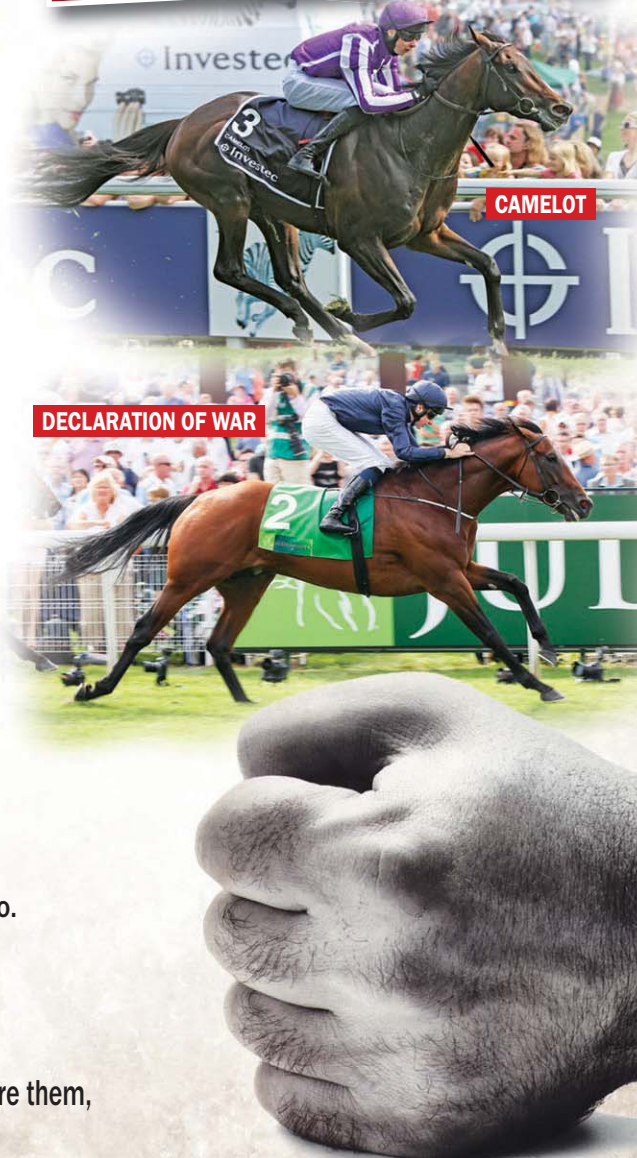

During his racing career, Storm Cat was pretty good at coming out on top in a close finish, showing the sort of spirit which was to become a feature of his progeny's success story. He won his second start by a neck and three starts later he pushed his nose ahead of Danzig Connection's to take the GI Young America S. Unfortunately, he couldn't quite repeat the display against Tasso in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, when he led virtually everywhere but the finish line.

Storm Cat appears to be involved in another very tight finish this year, this time in his role as broodmare sire--and I use the word "appears" advisedly. According to the *Blood-Horse* on Dec. 9, the former Overbrook star ranks second to A.P. Indy, with Storm Cat's total of \$14,635,997 lagging just \$42,365 behind his rival's. But, the accompanying small print includes "as supplied to The *Blood-Horse* by The Jockey Club Information Systems, Inc., earnings exclude monies from Japan and Hong Kong." (Note: *TDN* sire lists also do not contain earnings from Japan or Hong Kong).


I mentioned my puzzlement over this arbitrary exclusion in a *TDN* piece nearly two years ago: "*I guess that this is done because the prize-money in those countries is deemed disproportionate to that in the majority of other countries and can therefore slant the statistics,*" I suggested.

Statistics from the International Federation of Horseracing Authorities confirm that prize-money in Hong Kong and Japan are at a different level. The average prize-money per race in 2012 was equivalent to €110,947 in Hong Kong and €45,851 in Japan, whereas the figures for the U.S. and Canada were €16,136 and €20,013, respectively. But Hong Kong and Japan aren't the only countries capable of distorting the figures. The average for the 320 races staged in the United Arab Emirates equated to €103,865. Yet, inconsistently, these races are included in the Jockey Club's figures. **Cont. p5**

This year, Darshaan ranks third on the table behind A.P. Indy and Storm Cat, but he owes nearly \$3.5 million--virtually a quarter of his total--to the UAE exploits of Sajjhaa. Similarly, the 15th-ranked Acatenango owes \$6 million of his total to Animal Kingdom's victory in the G1 Dubai World Cup. Meadowlake and Arch are other substantial beneficiaries from the World Cup meeting.

If a daughter of Storm Cat had supplied the winner of one of these fabulously rich prizes in Dubai, the stallion would have been given the credit, but not if the victory came in Japan or Hong Kong. It doesn't make sense! Perhaps it would be preferable if The Jockey Club provided two tables, one all inclusive and the other without Japan, Hong Kong or the UAE.

The truth is that Storm Cat would currently enjoy a huge lead on the broodmare table if he received credit for the tremendous results achieved this year by his daughters' Japanese runners. He currently ranks fourth on Japan's table of broodmare sires, thanks principally to Kizuna (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}) (G1 Japanese Derby), Ayusan (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}) (G1 Japanese 1,000 Guineas) and the excellent Lord Kanaloa (Jpn) (King Kamehameha {Jpn}) (a Group 1 winner in the Takamatsunomiya Kinen, Yasuda Kinen and Sprinters S.). With support from their fellow group winners Hiraboku Deep (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}) and Red Spada (Jpn) (Taiki Shuttle), they have built a total of ¥1,922,941,000, which I believe equates to \$18,658,470.

Of course, Storm Cat also received a boost of around \$1.1 million when Lord Kanaloa thrashed an international field of sprinters to record his second success in the G1 Hong Kong Sprint Sunday. In the process, the son of King Kamehameha improved his career figures to an impressive 19-13-5-1.

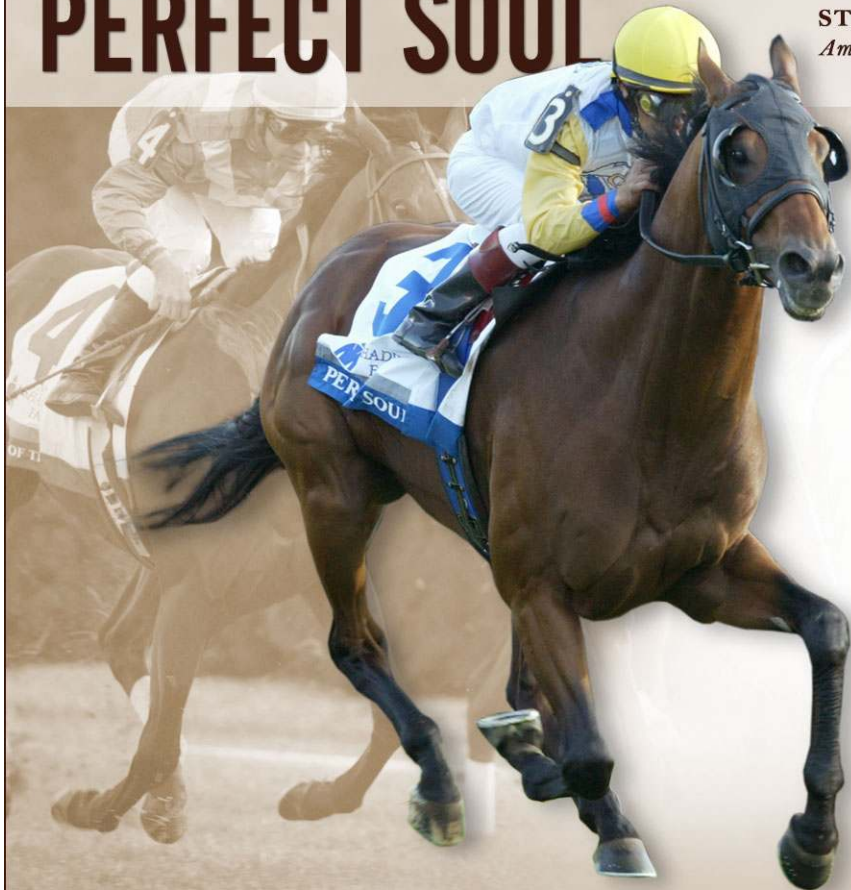
Add all this to the earnings of Storm Cat's daughters' earnings elsewhere in the Northern Hemisphere and you arrive at a staggering total of more than \$34,000,000. Not bad for a year's work!

Of course Storm Cat's broodmare daughters have also had something of a banner year in the U.S., enjoying the limelight via the likes of Close Hatches, Sahara Sky, Honor Code, Global View, Govenor Charlie, Tapicat and Noble Tune. Now the name of the very promising Streaming can be added to the list, following her triumph in the GI Hollywood Starlet S. on only her second start.

The last few weeks have seen some spectacular prices for young Group 1-winning fillies and mares, such as Chicquita (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) (€6,000,000), Dancing Rain (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) (4,000,000gns) and Immortal Verse (Ire) (4,700,000gns). The sky would probably also be the limit were Streaming ever to be offered for sale. After all, she is a granddaughter of Better Than Honour, the brilliant broodmare whose price soared to \$14 million when she was offered at Fasig-Tipton in 2008.

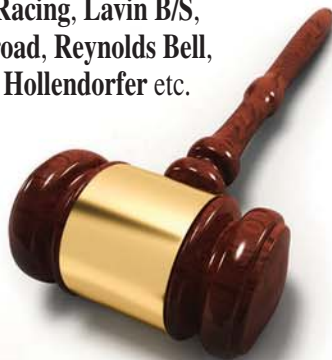

Streaming's dam Teeming repaid less than \$70,000 of the \$1,500,000 she had cost as a weanling, but she won three of her four starts as a 4-year-old. Although not in the same class as her Belmont S.-winning siblings Rags To Riches (A.P. Indy) and Jazil (Seeking the Gold), she is making amends as a broodmare, Streaming being her fifth winner from five foals.

There are similarities between Teeming's pedigree and that of Rising Tornado, the dam of this year's two-time Grade I-winning filly Close Hatches (First Defence). Both are daughters of Storm Cat and both have the celebrated Best In Show as their third dam. Also, their respective Grade I winners in 2013 were sired by members of the Mr. Prospector male line, Close Hatches being by First Defence and Streaming by Smart Strike.

As a son of Mr. Prospector, Smart Strike had obvious appeal as a mate for Teeming. For a start, Jazil was sired by another son, Seeking the Gold, and Kingmambo, Jade Hunter and Miswaki are other sons of Mr. Prospector with a Grade I winner to their credit from the Best In Show family.

Smart Strike also sired that good filly Denomination, a four-time Grade III winner at up to a mile and an eighth in France and the U.S., from another Storm Cat mare. The Smart Strike--Storm Cat partnership also has another talented juvenile filly this year in the shape of Fascinating, beaten only half a length by She's A Tiger in the GI Del Mar Debutante and a length by Secret Compass in the GI Chandelier S.

Equine Soundness and Sports Medicine Program:

Many participants in Thoroughbred public auctions agree that yearling sales participants have become hyper-focused on the use and subjective opinions contained on radiograph reports to a point where buyers are purchasing reports and opinions rather than horses. This has occurred despite mounting scientific evidence [Kane et. al 2003; Cohen et. al 2006; Preston et. al 2012; Meagher et. al 2013] that very few abnormal radiographic findings have been scientifically shown to affect future racing performance, even though yearling sales price is reduced by common abnormalities [Preston et. al 2012].

A case in point for what is lost in this approach is multiple Grade I winner Flat Out, who captured the GI Cigar Mile last week at age seven. This horse was purchased for \$85,000 mostly because the buyers believed in the consignor and the whole-horse. The radiograph report said "NSF" throughout, but the buyer's vet said the horse had a sesamoid issue. Another potential bidder and friend of the buyers decided not to bid on the horse because his vet also failed the horse during a separate radiograph review. In the case of Flat Out, ignoring a lack of pedigree and multiple negative opinions with no scientific basis led to the purchase of a whole lot of horse. There are many other similar stories and the real question is then whether these cases are the exceptions or are they in fact, the rules? Experiencing this pattern of horses outrunning human subjective opinions is what led this reader to spend seven years obtaining a PhD in veterinary epidemiology and to the belief that only reliable scientific research methods can answer important soundness questions affecting our horses.

On the racing front, there is sharp division over the issue of race-day medication use, particularly Lasix. Exercise Induced Pulmonary Hemorrhage (EIPH) is known scientifically to be common and is believed by many to be performance limiting. Yet, no studies over time have documented whether the condition reoccurs or if there is variation in severity of EIPH or whether there is any long-term impact on racing careers [Hinchcliff et. al 2009]. Nonetheless, everyone in U.S. racing has an opinion on the Lasix issue.

Preliminary data from a study that is underway [Preston et. al under review] confirms that classification of the severity of EIPH by grade during a single examination is not representative of the grade(s) experienced by most horses during training and racing, or even that particular horse during its career. Like many health conditions, EIPH is not a static event during the career of a racehorse. Further understanding of the dynamic nature of equine health conditions and their impact on racing performance is important to fill the void in the scientific literature.

Against this backdrop of soundness questions our industry continues to ignore the fact that we can hardly get horses to the track while continuing instead to attempt to microscopically predict, without scientific evidence, which horses will race. Figures reported for US racehorses by The Jockey Club Fact Book on-line show a decreasing number of lifetime starts since before 1970, which now averages only six lifetime starts. Yet, there were no radiograph reports nor Lasix in 1970. Today, in one successful foreign racing jurisdiction where many medications used routinely in the U.S. are prohibited during training and racing (including Lasix), horses are averaging almost 20 lifetime race starts [Preston et. al under review]. Although direct comparisons cannot be made without further studies, the question of what is going on with our (U.S.) racehorses remains.

We, as an industry, need to join the world of transparent scientific study for answers to these questions based upon peer-reviewed evidence based medical research that focuses on the whole-horse throughout a dynamic career of many health conditions and multiple performance failures and successes. If we continue our present approach of using subjective opinions measured in a static moment, without science, we are leaving the racing athlete out of the equation and hurting the health of our industry in the process.

CHARLES TOWN UNVEILS '14 STAKES SCHEDULE

Charles Town has released its stakes schedule for 2014, which is highlighted by the \$1.5-million GI Charles Town Classic Apr. 19 and the newly upgraded GIII Charles Town Oaks Sept. 20. The Charles Town Oaks purse has been increased by \$100,000 to \$500,000 this year. "Between being graded for 2014 and how productive the Charles Town Oaks has been to date, we felt moving the purse to \$500,000 should give us a true, marquee race that we can build a better event around," said Charles Town Vice President of Racing Erich Zimny. "As a \$500,000 graded race in late September, it's our hope that the Charles Town Oaks can have some [GI] Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Sprint implications going forward." Groupie Doll, second in the 2011 renewal of the Oaks, has annexed the last two runnings of the BC F/M Sprint. In total, excluding the not-yet-finalized West Virginia Breeders' Classics, Charles Town will hold a total of 25 stakes races worth \$3.55 million. The 2014 meet begins Jan. 2.

FIGURES UP FOR F-T DECEMBER SALE

The multiple stakes winning **Mystic Love** (Not For Love) attracted top price of \$100,000 during Monday's Fasig-Tipton Midlantic December Mixed Sale in Timonium. The topper was consigned by Bill Reightler, who also signed for the racing or broodmare prospect on behalf of Greenmount Farm. The 3-year-old, who sold as [hip 95](#), won last year's Selima S. and Dania Beach S. She was most recently third in the Nov. 9 Geisha S. The \$100,000 top price matched the high figure from a year ago, brought by a weanling by Read the Footnotes. The sale boasted gains from last year's edition, with 133 hips selling for a total of \$1,516,700. The average of \$11,404 was up 38.8% from last year and the median of \$5,000 was up 25%. The buy-back rate was 28.1%. "We were thrilled," Fasig-Tipton's Paget Bennett said of the results. "I think everyone was a little apprehensive with the weather issues, but you know, that has never stopped people from getting to a horse sale." As for this year's increase in figures, Bennett commented, "You're always hoping you can stay on par with the year prior, so exceeding that was great. Maryland has always been a good spot. People from all over came to shop the horses and the results reflected what we had to offer."

Zito Scores First Claiming Crown Victory

Hall of Fame trainer Nick Zito secured his first Claiming Crown victory Saturday when **Nevada Kid** (Silver Train) scored a wire-to-wire 2 1/4-length victory in the \$200,000 Jewel S. The nine-furlong event, which was restricted to horses who had started for a claiming price of \$35,000 or less at least once, was the richest of the \$1-million Claiming Crown's eight races.

Owners Ken and Sarah Ramsey, who won four races on the Claiming Crown card a year ago, added two more wins Saturday, with **Major Marvel** (Bernstein) winning the \$125,000 Emerald S. and

(Kitten's Joy) winning the \$125,000 Tiara S. The Ramseys now lead all owners with 12 Claiming Crown successes and trainer Mike Maker, who saddled Major Marvel, is the event's all-time leading trainer with 12 wins.

Trainer Marty Wolfson won the \$110,000 Glass Slipper S. for the second year in a row when Miller Racing's **Centrique** (Malibu Moon) raced home to a 1 1/4-length victory Saturday. Wolfson was represented a year ago by Starship Truffles (Ghostzapper), who went on to win the GI Princess Rooney H. before selling for \$1 million during the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky Horses of Racing Age sale.

Ribo Bobo (Louis Quatorze) came back on just 10 days' rest to win the \$110,000 Express S. The 5-year-old gelding, who was claimed three times, twice for \$6,250 and once for \$8,000 at Gulfstream last winter, earned a trip to the Jan. 18 Sunshine Millions Sprint with his front-running 2 1/2-length victory Saturday. "I don't do much with him--I just try to stay out of his way," winning trainer Jason Servis quipped. "He eats lots of dandelions, I can tell you that." Owner Mr Amore Stable lost Ribo Bobo in February, only to claim him back in March. Since then, the bay has won two stakes.

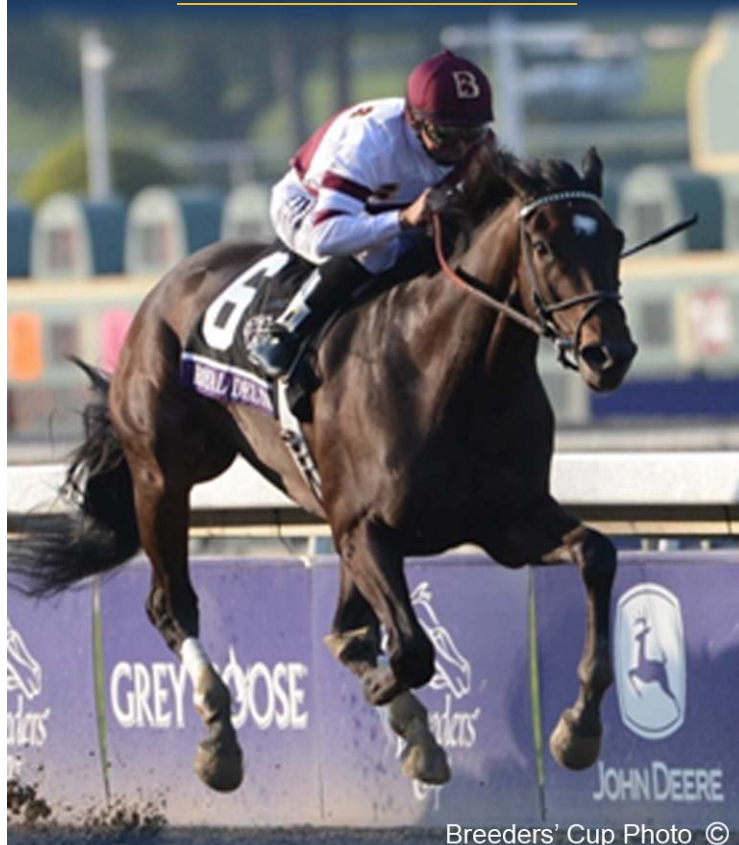
