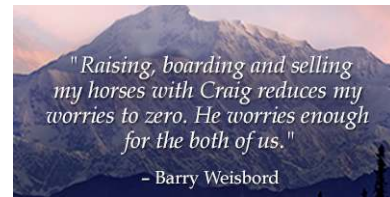

## A 'HOLL' OF A CHANCE IN THE FUTURITY

The GI CashCall Futurity will be run for the 33rd--and final time in its current incantation--at Betfair Hollywood Park this Saturday, and you have to go back a quarter-century to find the name of Hall of Fame trainer Jerry Hollendorfer on the trophy. The conditioner sent out

King Glorious to win the 1988 renewal, and he will have two live chances to add to that total with **Shared Belief** (Candy Ride {Arg}) owned by Hollendorfer in conjunction with Jim Rome's Jungle Racing LLC, Alex Solis II and George

Todaro and Mr. and Mrs. Larry Williams's **Tamarando** (Bertrando). Acquired privately off a blowout debut score at Golden Gate Oct. 19, the dark bay whipped up on his rivals by 7 3/4 lengths in the GIII Hollywood Prevue S. Nov. 10 and will try a route of ground for the first time this weekend. He drew post position six in a field of 13 and will have Corey Nakatani back in the irons. Tamarando makes his eighth start since June 30 in the Futurity. A winner of three of seven starts, the homebred took the GI Del Mar Futurity Sept. 4 and is exiting a course-and-distance success in the Real Quiet S. Nov. 23. Two of the last three winners of the Real Quiet (Comma to the Top, 2010; and Liaison, 2011) went on to double up in the CashCall. Trainer Bob Baffert has saddled the winner of the Futurity in three of the last five years, including Liaison, and will be represented by **"TDN Rising Star"** **Tap It Rich** (Tapit), who overcame a world of trouble in his career debut before returning on short rest to finish a respectable fifth behind stablemate New Year's Day (Street Cry {Ire}) in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Nov. 2. Ken McPeck is not bashful about shipping to California for these late-season tests and has supplemented both **Sheikinator** (Curlin) and **Rankhasprivileges** (Einstein {Brz}) for \$10,000. **CashCall Futurity field pxx**

## KHRC APPROVES UNIFORM DRUG RULES

By a unanimous vote of 11-0 (with a single abstention), the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission approved changes to the medication rules in the state Wednesday, joining 10 other states which took similar action earlier this year. The vote came during a regularly scheduled meeting of the commission at the Kentucky Horse Park and came eight days after the Equine Drug Research Council gave its stamp of approval to the changes. The changes should take between four and six months to take effect. The new rules are similar to those supported by several other racing organizations and establish varying withdrawal periods for some therapeutic medications. Including the Commonwealth, those states that have already approved uniform drug rules account for more than 60% of all pari-mutuel handle in the United States, according to published reports. Though there was strong opposition from some in the Standardbred community as it relates to certain of the regulations, the rules will be applied to horses of all racing breeds throughout the state.

## HK Stewards Rule on Jwala Tragedy

## HIGH HOPES FOR 2015 INVESTEC DERBY

Yet another Coolmore standout leads 409 yearlings entered for the 236th Investec Derby at Epsom Downs June 6, 2015. Coolmore has taken the last three renewals of Britain's richest race with Ruler Of The World (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), Camelot (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}), and Pour Moi (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}). The Irish group has 54 yearling entries, including a full brother to last year's G1 Investec Oaks runner up Secret Gesture (GB) (Galileo {Ire}). The yearling recently made headlines after bringing 3.6 million guineas at Tattersalls Oct. 8 in Newmarket.

Godolphin represents the majority of the 409 yearlings, with 71 entries. Headlining the group is an Oasis Dream (GB) colt out of 2000 Investec Oaks winner Love Divine (GB) (Diesis {GB}).

Andrew Coopers, Head of Racing and Clerk of the Course at Epsom Downs, said, "Yearling entry is still the most cost-effective route of having a runner in the Investec Derby and is the beginning of a dream for owners both large and small."

The testimony of six other riders was also included. "The stewards determined that this incident, while severe and with catastrophic consequences, did not eventuate as a result of careless, reckless or dangerous riding exhibited by an individual rider, rather

the incident was caused by a considerable number of circumstances occurring in close proximity which ultimately resulted in Jwala falling. Accordingly no further action was taken," the stewards said. Douglas Whyte, who rode **Charles the Great (Ire)** (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}) before winning the final two International Races, was expected to come under fire, but Chief Steward Kim Kelly could not find fault with the jockey's decisions. "Inside the 200m, and at around the 150m-- there was a clear run for Charles the Great, there wasn't acres of room, but there was room for a horse to progress into that run, and that if there was no shift from the inside then he would have progressed into that run easily," Kelly told South China *Morning Post* following the inquiry. "In fact, had he not positioned Charles the Great to take a run like that in any given race the stewards would be entitled to ask why, whether it be in a Group 1 or a Class 5 handicap." Drowne was cleared to leave Hong Kong Wednesday and returned to England about 9 p.m. local time.

**TAA AWARDS INITIAL GRANTS OF \$1 MILLION**

The Thoroughbred Aftercare Alliance announced initial grants totaling \$1 million to its 23 accredited Thoroughbred aftercare facilities yesterday at a press conference at the Global Symposium on Racing & Gaming, presented by the University of Arizona's Race Track Industry Program, at the Westin La Paloma Resort in Tucson. The announcement was made by Board Vice President Madeline Auerbach, who was joined by TAA Executive Director James Hastie and several other TAA Board members at the event.

The TAA is designed to serve both as the accrediting body for aftercare facilities and as a fundraising body to support them. It was initially funded by seed money from Breeders' Cup, Ltd., The Jockey Club, and Keeneland Association, and generates funding from automatic contributions from key points throughout a horse's life, from the stud farm to the sales ring to the racetrack.

This is the first round of financial grants that the TAA has awarded since its formation in February 2012. Individual grant awards were based on a comprehensive review by the TAA Grants Committee and Board, and the grants will be used for the ongoing care of retired Thoroughbreds.

"We're very pleased to award these grants to our accredited facilities, to recognize and support their efforts to care for our retired Thoroughbred athletes," said Jack Wolf, TAA Board President and a prominent Thoroughbred owner as founder of Starlight Racing. "Since the TAA was formed nearly two years ago, many people have been working diligently to fulfill the TAA's mission of accrediting aftercare facilities and

financially supporting them, and I'm thrilled to say that vision became a reality today. This is a major step forward for the industry in providing a long-term strategy for Thoroughbred aftercare, and we're all very proud. I'd also like to extend a special thank you to Breeders' Cup, Ltd., The Jockey Club, Keeneland Association, and all of our donors--from stallion farms, sales companies and racetracks to owners, breeders and fans: your support made these grants possible."

Anna Ford, who runs New Vocations Racehorse Adoption Program and sits on the TAA board, said that it was gratifying to see the industry stepping up to take care of the retired horses the industry produces.

“As both the program director of an aftercare organization and a horse racing fan, I’m extremely proud of the progress the industry has made over the last couple years,” said Ford. “Owners, trainers, and others involved in the racing industry are more aware than ever of the aftercare issues that retired racehorses face. There is still work to be done, but the creation and progress of the TAA is monumental.”


Ford cited the TAA’s institutional funding model as being key to its success. “It provides a simple way for all involved in horse racing to give a small percentage, which, at the end of the day, adds up to a large amount of ongoing support that so many aftercare programs desperately need,” Ford said. “For New Vocations, the funds we receive from the TAA will allow us to provide more retired racehorses with the proper rehabilitation and retraining needed to find a second career.”

James Gagliano, president and chief operating officer of The Jockey Club, echoed the sentiment on the importance of the TAA’s announcement to the industry.

“This is an important milestone for the Thoroughbred Aftercare Alliance and, more importantly, for the Thoroughbred industry,” said Gagliano. “It has been extremely encouraging to see the TAA achieve its goal of accrediting facilities and providing grants so quickly and we are thankful to a broad array of owners, breeders, breeding farms, racetracks, sales companies and other industry organizations and individuals. All of them should take pride in this progress.

“At the same time, we encourage other industry participants to join and support the TAA so we can continue to ensure the well-being of Thoroughbreds whose racing or breeding careers have ended.”

Michael Blowen, who runs Old Friends, agreed that the grant was important from both a tangible and intangible standpoint.

"It's huge in many ways," said Blowen. "It's not just the money part of it, but obviously that's the essence of the whole thing. When I first started out, I would go around to these farms and ask if they would donate a portion of this and a penny from here or a dime from there, and got nowhere. So the idea that they put together these seemingly disparate groups of people with a vested interest in making this a good sport, and got them to make a significant commitment, is huge, beyond any dollar amount. They were so diligent about the accreditation process that farms that might have been reluctant to kick in the first year, will see what rigorous standards they apply, and will kick in the second year, and hopefully the first year people will realize what a good investment it was."

More tangibly, said Blowen, "The first thing it does for us is that I have 50 acres in the back that need fencing, and I can take in eight more horses if I can get that fenced in. So that's the first thing I'm going to do. Then I can call the feed guy and tell him I can pay him. He'll be very happy."

**Paulick Wins Bergstein Award for Second Time...**

A story authored by *The Paulick Report's* Ray Paulick entitled "Fla. Investigation: Vet Said Cibelli Told Him 'Keep Me Out of It'" chronicling alleged wrongdoing by Tampa Bay trainer Jane Cibelli was honored Wednesday with the Stan Bergstein Writing Award at the University

of Arizona Race Track Industry Program's Global Symposium on Racing and Gaming in Tucson. Team Valor founder and CEO Barry Irwin presented Paulick, with a bronze trophy from renowned sculptor Nina Kaiser and the winning prize of \$25,000. Paulick's story was selected over nine other finalists by four judges--*Los Angeles Times* columnist Bill Plaschke, former *Sports Illustrated* and Kentucky newspaper columnist Billy Reed, *New York Post* columnist Ray Kerrison and HRTV analyst Jeff Siegel. Paulick's story included testimony from a veterinarian who was caught injecting a pain-blocking agent into the leg of one of Cibelli's horses hours before it was supposed to race. Less than a week after the story was published, Florida state racing officials suspended Cibelli for 60 days, and Tampa Bay Downs announced it would not be granting the trainer stalls nor would it allow the trainer to enter horses for the 2013-2014 meet. "I am very happy to see Ray Paulick get this honor," Irwin commented. "We created the award to praise, encourage, incentivize and celebrate turf writers. We felt encouragement was sorely needed because of the sorry state of the turf writing profession. The current state of racing journalism is best characterized by a shrinking to the downright disappearance of copy inches." Stories published between Nov. 2, 2012 and Nov. 1, 2013 in North America and about horse racing were eligible for the award. Finalists included all six stories in a *Thoroughbred Daily News* series entitled "A Painful Truth" on medication and the reform movement in racing, authored by Ryan Goldberg, Bill Finley and Lucas Marquardt.

**Regulation, Social Gaming Discussed at Symposium...**  
by Sandra Lynn Childress

The second day of the 40th annual Global Symposium on Racing and Gaming started off with the panel on *New Strategies in Regulating The Race - Ensuring There Continues to Be Racing to Regulate*. The moderator, Paul Estok, Executive Vice President and General Counsel, Harness Tracks of America, opened the session by having the individual panelists present on how changes in regulations were being implemented and their impacts. Each panelist landed on the same point of emphasis that deterrents save money in the long-term. Some of the examples used included: testing out-of-competition, maintaining integrity of the shared oversight, and establishing partnerships with others that have a similar strategic goal. Dr. Jennifer Durenberger, Director of Racing, Massachusetts Gaming Commission, concluded in the panel summary that what the racing industry must do is focus on safety initiatives, sensible/enforceable regulations, and a commitment to aftercare. Unless those three areas are strengthened, Durenberger argued, the industry may not exist in the long term.

The panel focusing on the *Untapped Potential of Social Gaming* was co-presented by Vin Narayanan, Editor-in-Chief, Casino City; and Hai Ng, Partner, Neomancer LLC. They spoke extensively on thinking outside the box and

outside of the industry on how to implement and capitalize on social gaming. Building an online following leads to conversion to new customers and guests, the presenters said. The most striking example that was presented was how the increased popularity of online poker also led to increased

traffic in live poker rooms. The reason being that anyone new to something (i.e. playing poker) can learn terms and their meanings, the processes of the game in a safe and less intimidating environment. The other way in which an entity can use social gaming to build brand loyalty is by creating an online game that rewards the player with a live-action redemption. An example that was presented was how a Las Vegas casino allows slot players to earn loyalty points in a game on Facebook that can be redeemed for things like show tickets and free mid-week hotel rooms.

## NTRA REPORT FROM CAPITOL HILL



### HEARING FOCUSED ON PUSH TO LEGALIZE ONLINE GAMING

On Tuesday, December 10, the House Subcommittee on Commerce, Manufacturing and Trade held a hearing entitled "The State of Online Gaming." The hearing focused on the current status of online gaming, including poker, and the push to legalize it at the state level.

Witnesses at the hearing were by invitation only and included: John Pappas, Executive Director, Poker Players Alliance; Andrew Abboud, Vice President of Government Relations and Community Development, Las Vegas Sands Corporation; Geoff Freeman, President and Chief Executive Officer, American Gaming Association; Les Bernal, National Director, Stop Predatory Gambling; Kurt Eggert, Professor of Law, Dale E. Fowler School of Law, Chapman University; and Rachel Volberg, Ph.D., Associate Professor, School of Public Health and Health Sciences, University of Massachusetts, Amherst.

Pari-mutuel wagering is the only interstate wagering currently permitted on the internet, but three states have legalized intrastate online gaming - Nevada, Delaware and New Jersey - to permit people physically within their respective borders to participate.

Several online gaming bills have been introduced in this Congress, including those to license, regulate and tax the activity. However, the NTRA Legislative team does not expect any immediate action by Congress on this issue.
