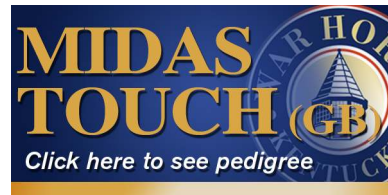

CURTAIN 'CALL' AT HOLLYWOOD

Saturday's GI CashCall Futurity will be the final graded stakes race ever held at Hollywood Park before the Inglewood oval closes Dec. 22, but what a way to go out. The \$750,000, 8 1/2-furlong contest for juveniles has attracted a diverse cast of 13 with many viable win candidates. Bob Baffert has won three of the last five renewals of this race and a record six overall,

and holds a strong hand again with the lightly raced **Tap It Rich** (Tapit). The \$510,000 KEESEP yearling did everything he could to get beat on debut at Santa Anita Oct. 12, but proved far too talented for his competition, overcoming a tardy start and wide journey to best **Candy Boy** (Candy Ride {Arg}) by 4 1/4 lengths and garner the **"TDN Rising Star"** moniker. Thrown right into the deep end off that head-turning effort, the Fog City Stable colorbearer was a creditable fifth in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Nov. 2, finishing a 3 1/4 lengths behind winner and stablemate New Year's Day (Street Cry {Ire}) despite covering more ground than any other runner in the field. According to Trakus data, Tap It Rich ran additional 57 feet more than the winner, which equates to nearly 6 3/4 lengths. "[Tap It Rich] is doing very well," Baffert told the *TDN* earlier this week. "He is a little bit of a high-strung horse like most Tapits are. He was relaxed his first race, but it woke him up a bit and got him on edge. Since the Breeders' Cup, we have been trying to get him to relax and he has been doing better. We have been focusing on nice long, slow works and he has settled down a bit."

CARLOS CARRIES HOPES OF ARGENTINA

Twelve months ago, Brazilian import Going Somewhere (Brz) (Sulamani {Ire}) was the upset winner of the G1 Gran Premio Carlos Pellegrini, defeating local champion Indy Point (Arg) (Indygo Shiner). Nonetheless, the "Argentine Navy" will disembark full of good hopes

in today's version of Argentina's showpiece race, being represented by the likes of **Cooptado** (Arg) (Equal Stripes {Arg}), winner of the G1 Argentine Derby; **Ecologo** (Arg) (Easing Along), hero of the G1 Gran Premio Jockey Club, the second leg of the local Triple Crown; fleet front-runner **Blood Money** (Arg) (Not for Sale {Arg}), and the ascendant **Bajista** (Arg) (Perfectperformance).

Cooptado appears the leading candidate, having also finished second in the G1 Polla de Potrillos (Argentine 2000 Guineas) and the G1 Gran Premio Jockey Club prior to his Derby victory. With Rodrigo Blanco in the irons, Cooptado can be expected to bide his time near the back of the pack before coming with a late stretch bid.

Flat Out to Spendthrift

Flat Out (Flatter--Cresta Lil, by Cresta Rider), who closed out a stellar career at the races with an authoritative victory in the GI Cigar Mile H. Nov. 30, will enter stud in 2014 at B. Wayne Hughes's Spendthrift Farm in Lexington, Kentucky. He will be added to the farm's popular "Share the Upside" program and will command a fee of \$10,000. Likely to go favored is Jungle Racing LLC, Hollendorfer, Litt, Solis II and Todaro's **Shared Belief** (Candy Ride {Arg}). A seven-length debut winner for breeders Pam and Marty Wygod and trainer Jedd Josephson at Golden Gate Oct. 19, the gelding was privately purchased shortly thereafter and turned over to Jerry Hollendorfer. The new connections were immediately rewarded for their investment when Shared Belief exploded to a 7 3/4-length victory over **Kobe's Back** (Flutter) in the seven-panel GIII Hollywood Prevue S. Nov. 10. **Brother Soldier** (Brother Derek) was a well-beaten third that day. Hollendorfer will also saddle GI Del Mar Futurity hero **Tamarando** (Bertrando), who returned to winning ways last time in the track-and-trip Real Quiet S. Nov. 23.

A trio of runners add some out-of-town intrigue. Ken McPeek will be represented by Magdalena Racing's GIII Delta Jackpot third-place finisher **Rankhasprivileges** (Einstein {Brz}) as well as Magic City Thoroughbred Partners's **Sheikinator** (Curlin), who broke his maiden last out at Churchill Nov. 16 after finishing runner-up on debut over the Keeneland Polytrack Oct. 4. Gary and Mary West's **Poker Player** (Harlan's Holiday) parlayed an inside-to-out trip into a victory in Keeneland's rained-off GIII Bourbon S. Oct. 6, but could do no better than eighth in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf. J. Paul Reddam, who owns race sponsor CashCall, will be represented by two horses here: Doug O'Neill-trained GI FrontRunner S. hero **Bond Holder** (Mineshaft), who was fourth in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile; and maiden **Electric Eddie** (Square Eddie), most recently second in the Real Quiet for Ben Cecil.

SETSUKO ‘DIVES’ BACK IN

Wertheimer & Frere homebred **Setuko** (Pleasantly Perfect) returns from an absence of nearly 21 months for today's GIII Native Diver H. at Betfair Hollywood Park. Though the gelding has only found the winner's circle twice in 18 career tries, he boasts runner-up finishes in the 2010 GI Santa Anita Derby--when it was still contested on a synthetic surface--as well as the 2011 and 2012 renewals of the GI Santa Anita H. on dirt. He stretched California's current leading older horse Game On Dude (Awesome Again) to a nose in the 2011 Big 'Cap, and was 3 1/2 lengths behind GI Jockey Club Gold Cup winner Ron the Greek (Full Mandate) last March in his most recent afternoon outing. The Richard Mandella trainee made just one other start in 2012, finally clearing his first-level allowance condition at Santa Anita in February. **Hear the Ghost** (Ghostzapper) is another looking to bounce back after an extended absence. The chestnut emerged as a major contender on the Triple Crown trail this March when he blew by favored Flashback (Tapit) while routing for the first time in Santa Anita's GII San Felipe S., but was forced to the sidelines with a knee injury the following month. Brought back in a 6 1/2-furlong optional claiming test here Nov. 7, the gelding got going too late to finish a useful second. Hall of Famer Jerry Hollendorfer, who owns Hear the Ghost along with Halo Farms, will saddle two other runners in the Native Diver. Mr. and Mrs. Larry D. Williams's **Rousing Sermon** (Lucky Pulpit) could kick off a stakes double for his connections with Tamarando (Bertrando) set to contest the GI CashCall Futurity two races later. A close second in the 2011 Futurity himself, the chestnut most recently annexed the restricted On Trust H. over 7 1/2 furlongs here Nov. 24. Hollendorfer's third representative is Bad Boy Racing LLC and Whizway Farm's **Blueskiesnrainbows** (English Channel).

Ecologo enters this contest off a two-month layoff since defeating Cooptado in Gran Premio Jockey Club. Blood Money destroyed his rivals in the G2 Casey S. and G2 Martinez S., but was a flat fifth in the Derby. Bajista won the G1 Gran Premio Provincia de Buenos Aires before facing older horses in the G1 Gran Premio Dardo Rocha, both at La Plata.

Those looking to extend Brazil's good fortune include **Ganesh** and **Generosidade**, while Peru is represented by **Ayahuasca** and **Dr. Action**.

The Pellegrini is the highlight of four Group 1 races on the card. **Juhayna (Arg)** (Johannesburg) and **Girlie (Arg)** (Pure Prize) appear the likely early favorites for the G1 Gran Premio Copa de Plata, while in the G1 Gran Premio Joaquin S. de Anchorena, the speedy **Infiltrada (Arg)** (Footstepsinthesand {GB}) will go against males seeking her first Group 1 victory, however, **Dont Worry (Arg)** (Sultry Song) will be a formidable foe. Sprinters will line up in the G1 Gran Premio Felix de Alzaga Unzue, with **Venerancia (Arg)** (Lode), **City Glam (Arg)** (Grand Reward) and **She's Happy (Arg)** (Speightstown) amongst the choices.

ALL ABOARD THE ASIA EXPRESS

All eyes of the Japanese racing faithful will be on Nakayama tomorrow as 16 juveniles line up for the Asahi Hai Futurity S., one of the country's most important 2-year-old events. **Asia Express** (Henny Hughes) cost owner Yukio Baba \$230,000 just nine months ago at OBS March, and the chestnut has already gone a fair way towards repaying that bill, having bankrolled almost \$170,000 with two victories on the rich JRA circuit to date. Both those scores, including his Nov. 23 victory over this distance in the Oxalis Sho, came on the dirt at Tokyo, so Asia Express will have to endure a surface switch and a hefty class jump. Early favoritism goes to **Pray and Real (Jpn)** (Durandal {Jpn}), who began his career with a pair of decisive victories on the NAR circuit before stepping up in class for the G3 Tokyo Sports Hai Nisai S. at Tokyo Nov. 16. He lost his unbeaten record that day, finishing second, but his professionalism and tenacity while beaten only a neck gives reason for confidence. After winning his debut at Hanshin Sept. 7, **Atom (Jpn)** (Deep Impact {Jpn}) went down to the filly Horai Akiko (Jpn) (Johannesburg) in the G2 Daily Hai Nisai S. at Kyoto Oct. 5. He was beaten only a neck, however, by Horai Akiko, who set a track record in the process, and the bulletins on Atom as he returns from a layoff are positive. **Bel Canto (Jpn)** (Sakura Bakushin O {Jpn}) receives a weight break as the lone filly in the lineup, however, she brings into the race some of the strongest form in the field. A debut winner at Kokura Aug. 3, she finished second to Horai Akiko next out in the Kokura Nisai S. Sept. 1, and rebounded with a victory in the G3 Fantasy S. at Kyoto Nov. 9. The North Hills Co. colorbearer tries 1600 meters for the first time. **Field p8**

Nov. 30, will enter stud in 2014 at B. Wayne Hughes's Spendthrift Farm in Lexington, Kentucky. He will be added to the farm's popular "Share the Upside" program and will command a fee of \$10,000.

Bred in Florida by Nikolaus Bock, the sturdy bay was trained during the early portion of his career by Charles 'Scooter' Dickey for Preston Stables LLC, winning the 2009 Smarty Jones S. at Oaklawn Park. After returning from an extended absence, Flat Out was second to the

Flat Out joined the barn of Bill Mott during the summer of 2012, checking in a big-figure third behind Fort Larned (E Dubai) in the Whitney before turning the tables in a successful defense of his title in the Jockey Club Gold Cup. Third to Fort Larned in last year's Breeders' Cup Classic, Flat Out earned a career-best 116 Beyer Speed Figure in defeating Cross Traffic (Unbridled's Song) in this year's GIII Westchester S. and was a decisive winner of the Suburban for a second time this past July. He was a troubled third when attempting a three-peat in the Gold Cup Sept. 28, but closed his career on a high note, scoring by 1 1/4 lengths in the Cigar Mile Nov. 30, besting a field that included five Grade I winners and two horses exiting Breeders' Cup victories.

"Flat Out has proven himself to be among the elite racehorses we've seen over the course of the last three years," said Ned Toffey, general manager at Spendthrift. "His brilliant win in the Cigar Mile is a fitting way for him to close out his tremendous racing career, and it showed he was top class among the best milers and best classic horses around. Physically, he's an awesome individual who's very well-balanced, handsome and correct, and his A.P. Indy sire line is obviously the preeminent sire line in North America today. European import **Amira's Prince (Ire)**--perfect in four attempts on this side of the pond since being purchased privately by Wachtel Stable, Eclipse Thoroughbred Partners and Gary Barber--is eyeing a return to the races. Conditioned by Hall of Famer Bill Mott, Amira's Prince stamped himself as one of the leading turfers in the U.S. following smart wins in the 1 3/8-miles

GII Mac Diarmida S. at Gulfstream Feb. 16 ([video](#)) and the 1 1/8-miles GII Mervin H. Muniz Jr. H. at Fair Grounds most recently Mar. 30 ([video](#)).

"After he won the Mervin Muniz, we had designs on running him in either the Woodford Reserve on Derby Day or the Manhattan on Belmont Day, as we thought those two options would offer a natural progression for him to step up into Grade I company," Eclipse President Aron Wellman commented.

"Bill [Mott], who has a remarkable gauge and is so in tune with this colt, just didn't think that he was moving as fluidly as he'd like to see, so we backed off on him. After a few weeks of downtime, he still wasn't his normal, smooth self, so we sent him in for a nuclear scan, which revealed that he had some bone bruising. There was never anything drastically wrong with him and he didn't require surgery or anything of that nature, but some good old-fashioned time off was in store."

After rehabbing with Bruce Jackson at Fair Hill, Amira's Prince returned to the worktab with an easy three-furlong move in :38 at Payson Park Dec. 11.

"It is very nice to see his name on the worktab again, no doubt," Wellman said. "Bill [Mott] has been enthused about the colt's condition since he came back into training within the past month. He went his first 3/8ths [Wednesday] morning, and he handled that well, so we'll take our time and bring him along at his own pace. So far, so good."

As for what's next, Wellman added, "Eclipse has two partners on Amira's Prince in Gary Barber and Adam Wachtel, so we all act as a team when it comes to substantive decisions, and, of course, a lot of our direction comes from Bill Mott. Without getting too far ahead of ourselves, preliminary discussions have identified the [GI] Gulfstream Park Turf H. Feb. 8 as a best-case scenario option for his primary early season target. In general, we'd like to see a season-long campaign which postures him for Eclipse Award consideration in the Turf division, as we believe he is that caliber of horse."

Amira's Prince, only one-for-seven during his European campaign for trainer David Wachman, including a close second in a Gowran Park handicap last August, showed marked improvement once shipped to these shores. With the addition of Lasix, he won a pair of optional claimers in Hallandale Dec. 22 and Jan. 19 prior to his aforementioned graded success.

"It was a huge bummer when we pulled the plug on his 2013 campaign as he was on the brink of taking the division by storm," Wellman offered. "In all four of his races [in the U.S.], he was brilliant. To dominate 12-furlong races the way he did and then cut back to nine furlongs and win the Mervin Muniz gate-to-wire with such authority says a lot about his natural ability and versatility."

Eclipse Thoroughbred Partners, launched in 2011, has hit the ground running, already campaigning Grade I winners Byrama (GB) (Byron {GB}), Capo Bastone (Street Boss) and In Lingerie (Empire Maker). **Cont. p10**

"It may sound absurd, but as far as equine athletes go, Amira's Prince is the most talented racehorse I've had the privilege of being associated with other than Animal Kingdom," Wellman, a former vice president of Team Valor International, concluded.

Danza--a promising and close third behind Corfu (Malibu Moon) and Wired Bryan (Stormy Atlantic) when last seen in the GII Saratoga Special S. Aug. 11 ([video](#)) --is also on the comeback trail for Eclipse Thoroughbred Partners.

"After the Saratoga Special, we detected an issue in a knee, which led us to decide to turn Danza out," Eclipse's Aron Wellman revealed. "It was the sort of thing we could have managed and gone on with him if we really were pressed to do so, but considering how much upside this colt presents, we thought it would be prudent to take the conservative path."

A narrow debut winner after pressing the pace throughout going 5 1/2 furlongs at Belmont July 12 ([video](#)), the cleverly named son of Street Boss (think '80s sitcom *Who's the Boss?*) outran his 14-1 odds with an impressive display in his stakes debut at the Spa. Outsprinted early through fractions of :21.62 and :44.02, Danza still had plenty

to do as Corfu and Wired Bryan began to throw down in the stretch, and found another gear when guided to the fence to finish within a half length of the top two. He earned a respectable 81 Beyer for the effort.

"Danza's performance in the Saratoga Special made it clear that he was a serious horse," Wellman said. "In his debut at Belmont, he pressed the pace the entire way and proved superior late. In the Special, he exhibited a completely different dimension by falling way off the pace and overcoming considerable adversity to rally in between horses and then down on the rail."

Danza--currently in training at J.J. Pletcher's Payton Training Center in Ocala, Florida, since August--is likely to rejoin Todd Pletcher's Palm Meadows string early next week if a scheduled breeze this weekend goes according to plan, Wellman reports.

"Should all go well, he should be ready to make his 3-year-old debut sometime in February, possibly sooner," Wellman commented. "Anytime a young colt flashes the type of talent and guts that Danza displayed in his two starts at two, the temptation is to start thinking Kentucky Derby. We think he may have the raw ability to be a Derby-quality horse, but to pencil in a prep race or say that we're working backwards from the First Saturday in May would be foolish at this stage."

Wellman concluded, "We think we've done right by him by giving him the time to develop, and if he comes back and blossoms as we expect him to, it's not far-fetched to believe that the sky is the limit."

Revolutionary, produced by GI Alabama S. heroine Runup the Colors, broke through with an 8 1/2-length decision in his fourth career attempt over the Big A inner Dec. 28, then overcame a world of trouble to narrowly capture the

GI Withers S. Feb. 2 ([video](#)). He also rallied from far back with a wide trip to get up for an impressive neck victory in the Louisiana Derby Mar. 30 ([video](#)) prior to his efforts in the first and final legs of the Triple Crown.

"He was a horse that had the Triple Crown trail kind of get to the bottom of him," Walden admitted. "I think he picked up 120 or 130 pounds on the farm since--that was kind of the objective."

Trained by Todd Pletcher, Revolutionary has already posted four workouts at Palm Meadows, capped by a five-furlong breeze in 1:02.20 Dec. 10.

"The Donn is on our radar, we'll see how he goes from here," Walden concluded. "He's been working well and working steadily, and Todd's been very happy with his breezes."

CASTELLANO BREAKS SINGLE-SEASON

RECORD Javier Castellano set a new North American single-season record for earnings Friday, guiding I Ain't Gonna Lie to a narrow victory in the third race at Gulfstream Park. The win took Castellano's seasonal earnings to \$25,655,988, eclipsing the previous mark of \$25,634,852 achieved just last year by the now-retired Ramon Dominguez. The 36-year-old paid tribute to his former colleague and competitor. "I am very proud to break the record," Castellano said. "One thing you work for all year round is this moment. I'm very proud to be at the level of Ramon Dominguez. He is such a classy guy." He added, "It feels so great. I am so thankful and blessed to be competitive with the top jockeys in the country. I appreciate all the opportunity from the owners and trainers, everybody involved, especially my agent [Matt Musikar]. He handled my business the right way."

Castellano, the two-time defending riding champ at Gulfstream, also finished atop the standings at Belmont Park this past spring and at Saratoga this summer and was the leading rider at Aqueduct before heading south for the winter. "I've been very blessed to ride in New York. The purses are good and they helped me break the record," he said. "I am thankful to participate at Gulfstream with the best jockeys in the winter. To be the consistent leading jockey all year round is very special for me, almost more impressive to me than breaking the money record. It's a lot of sacrifice to my family. My wife, my kids, they support me every single day, every single race. I don't have the words to describe how thankful I am and how much I appreciate everything. There are so many great riders out there. To be the number one earning jockey is unbelievable." Castellano has ridden the winners of over 3,600 races and was the regular jockey of Horse of the Year Ghostzapper in 2004 and of champion 3-year-old Bernardini in 2006.
