

**'EXPRESS' YOURSELF**

Asia Express (Henny Hughes) provided a dominant display to take Sunday's G1 Asahi Hai Futurity by 1 1/4 lengths while making his first start on turf.

The Asahi Hai Futurity has long been regarded as one of the most important juvenile events in Japan, and its honor roll includes the likes of Logotype (Jpn) (Lohengrin {Jpn}), who won this race last year en route to G1 Japanese 2000 Guineas glory.

Therefore, Asia Express has big hoof prints to fill, but the manner in which he handled his first turf outing yesterday suggests he is up to

the task. A \$230,000 juvenile purchase by Emmanuel and Laura de Seroux's Narvick International at OBS March, Asia Express made a late start to his juvenile campaign, but made up for lost time with a five-length victory on the dirt at Tokyo for owner Yukio Baba. Resurfacing in the 7 1/2-furlong Oxalis Sho S. on the same surface three weeks later, Asia Express managed to be even more impressive, scoring by seven lengths. While yesterday's winning margin was not as flashy, the victory was nonetheless authoritative. Riding the rail in midpack early under Ryan Moore, the chestnut tipped out for running room coming off the turn and charged down the middle of the track, hitting the lead inside the final furlong and winning with something seemingly left in the tank. Asia Express is the second Group 1 winner--and first in Japan--for Henny Hughes, who is set to stand his first season in that country at Yushun Company next year. It was the fourth Japanese Group 1 victory--and second of the season--for Ryan Moore, who piloted Gentildonna (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}) to a title-defending victory in the G1 Japan Cup three weeks ago. "He surprised me--he quickened up so well," said Moore. "When I rode him before, he looked like he was a horse with lots of gears. He's a special horse, because not many do both dirt and grass. His future should be bright. He feels like he hasn't got to the bottom of it yet--like there's more to come--so it'll be interesting to see how much progress he makes."

The chestnut assumed his usual position at the back of the field through the opening stages of this route. He was still along the rail in last the first time under the wire. He began to improve his position heading into the final turn and circled the field on the bend as Eagle Poise struck the front. Quaesitor found another gear, blew by Eagle Poise and won going away.

“There’s no point in running him unless it’s at least a mile and a quarter,” said winning trainer Ian Howard. “He just doesn’t show that much speed, but when it gets beyond a mile and a quarter, he has a chance.”

***Mucho Macho Man Breezes at Gulfstream***

In his second work since winning the GI Breeders’ Cup Classic Nov. 3, **Mucho Macho Man** (Macho Uno) breezed four panels in :49.94 and galloped out five furlongs in 1:03.77 at Gulfstream Park Sunday. “We keep meeting and we will make a schedule, but he’s just doing good with what he’s doing now,” said trainer Kathy Ritvo. “We let him work a half-mile today, and he went really well. He’s feeling good and came back great. His weight is amazing, he’s happy, and he’s doing really well. I just can’t ask him to be any better.”

***Plesa Points to Dania Beach with Yes I’m Lucky***

The Eddie Plesa-trained **Yes I’m Lucky** (Yes It’s True) will aim for a start in next Saturday’s GIII Dania Beach S. The juvenile has three stakes tallies to his name--Calder’s Frank Gomez Memorial S. June 22, Monmouth’s Tyro S. July 4 and the Laurel Futurity Sept. 21--and will look for his first graded score, having finished second in the GIII Sapling S. at Monmouth over the summer. “He’s doing great,” Plesa commented. “So we’re anxious to run him. Every time he comes over to the racetrack and runs in the afternoon he gives a 110% effort.”

***Belle Couture Debut Imminent***

**Belle Couture** (Aus) (Redoute’s Choice {Aus}), the 3-year-old half-sister to Australian sprint sensation Black Caviar (Aus) (Bel Esprit {Aus}), as well as champion All Too Hard (Aus) (Casino Prince {Aus}), could make her racetrack debut within the week, trainer Danny O’Brien told *Racingandsports.com.au*. “She’s not far away,” O’Brien told the website. “We’ll probably nominate her for a couple of races next week. It’s either give her another trial [Friday] or go to a country maiden, and I’m tipping towards taking her to the races, providing we can get to the right race.” Belle Couture, who won a jump out at Flemington last week, was a A\$2.6-million (US\$2,328,170) purchase by BC3 Thoroughbreds at last year’s Inglis Easter Sale. BC3 Thoroughbreds is currently at the center of media attention surrounding alleged links to a suspicious betting scheme. The ownership group is now under the control of administrators.

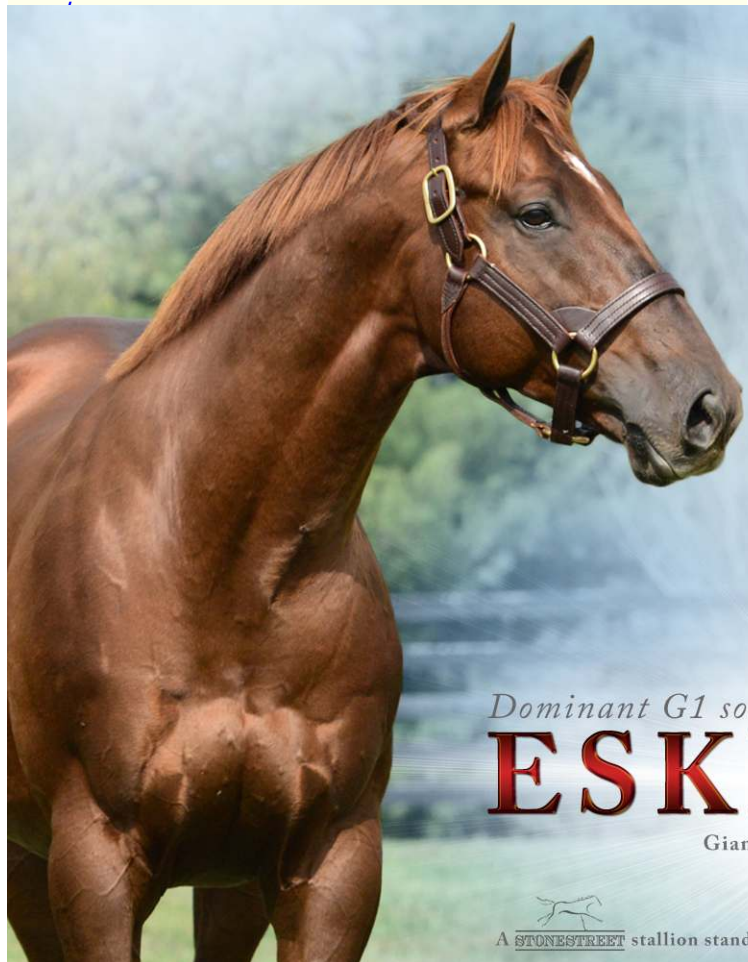

The news that NYRA's Board had voted unanimously--except for Barry Ostarger's lone and heroic "nay"--to raise fees on admissions, parking, boxes etc, and executive pay at NYRA racetracks flabbergasted me. In fact, despite waiting some time to simmer down, I am still angry.

Racetracks are a place people come to gamble. So are casinos.

Casinos lure customers with free admission, complimentary food and drink, entertainment, a varied choice of restaurants and bars and a host of other enticements. For big rollers, the lure can be free accommodations in lovely hotel suites, free return flights, and who knows what more. All with the hope and often the result that these people spend hours in windowless rooms (heaven forbid they realize the time of day or night) losing astounding amounts of money.

The lure of the racetrack is a day, for the whole family if so desired, in the open air in parklike settings, the sight of beautiful horses, jockeys, superb athletes all, the intellectual challenge of handicapping races, and the thrill and excitement of the races themselves. For this, however, the customer must pay admission, parking, overpriced food and drink and is expected to gamble good money on a game too many now believe is infested by drugs. At least, recently, honest and believable efforts are being made to correct this grave problem.

Comparisons are being made with baseball, football, basketball, etc., where admission and other fees are extremely high. But, please correct me if I am wrong: gambling on these games is still illegal, except in Las Vegas.

The biggest gamble in racing is made by breeders and owners. Without them there is no show. Without them unemployment soars because this industry is labor intensive.

Attendance is down because it is an expensive outing--maybe the same reason baseball stadiums are empty nowadays.

Because of enormous technological advances, the races can be seen on multiple screens and bets can be placed over the Internet.

So how to lure people to the live enjoyment of a day at the races?

Certainly not by making it more expensive. Rather, by making it less expensive

Free admission, free parking, affordable rates for clubhouse seats, better and less expensive food and beverage. Charge less for the concessions. Take a small percentage from the gross. Give concessionaires an incentive to make money, to compete to have the best hamburger, the best hot dog, etc.

Have known designers compete to have the coolest horse related caps, T-shirts, umbrellas, scarves, ties, etc., for sale. No giveaway days. Limited editions. It becomes a real choice. A very special souvenir. Every hundredth person entering the track gets \$10 to bet with. There are so many other ways to lure people.

At important race meets when attendance is high anyway, then have admission fees and higher fees for boxes and seats and parking, if you must. People will come because those are the days they want to see and be seen. Do not raise them too high. People aren't fools and don't like being taken as such.

Make all other race days a real bargain to go to the racetrack, and not a financial burden. And this includes Saratoga, except those really big race days.


A day at the races should be much more fun and lucrative (lower the take out) than staying at home watching on TV and betting over the Internet.

Have more respect and take better care of the breeders and owners. They are the ones who take the biggest gamble. Without them, you have nothing.

How about executive pay raises after you make some money, not before.

We have enough problems as an industry. We don't need any more nails hammered into the coffin.

**JOANNE NOR:**

I read with interest the letter from Barry Irwin to the *TDN* in Tuesday's edition regarding Lasix. Other complications exist from Lasix and other pharmaceuticals and environmental toxins. When the herbicide Glyphosate is combined with these pre-race pharmaceuticals and any other sources of environmental toxins, they can be lethal, as was noted by MIT researchers in the latest information on the effects of Glyphosate. It is quoted to be "the most biologically disruptive chemical in our environment," by MIT researchers and connects it with over 40 diseases. Similarly, a Russian study done on the herbicide noted body malfunctions such as total sterility after three generations of use. We are in the third generation now regarding exposure to our horses as Glyphosate was introduced in the nineties.

Glyphosate is used in our horse feed through the crops: sugar beets (in all sweet feed), soy, corn, some wheat, some flax, alfalfa, and bluegrass hay. The highest amounts are found in grains and sugar crops. These feed stuffs make up at least 75-100% of daily feed rations in our Thoroughbred racehorses.

The good news is that on December 6th on the big island of Hawaii, Mayor Bill Kenoi signed a Biotech GMO ban into law, stopping the use of Glyphosate in Hawaii. This action sets a precedent that other states may follow. Just two months ago, Mexico banned all GMOS because of the health issues with GMO corn in their country.

Many nations have completely banned GMOS and Glyphosate, and some have severe restrictions. One of the findings of the MIT researchers is that it magnifies the toxicity of any environmental toxin or drug introduced to the body by disallowing the liver to be able to de-toxify, and also that it simultaneously has the propensity of separating the endothelial wall of the heart's aorta, potentially setting the body up for massive hemorrhaging and cardiac arrest. The electrolyte-robbing power of Lasix just adds to that scenario.

This is my point: the combination of these things create these potential dangers, and others, and weaken the life, and performance of our star performers in the Thoroughbred industry. Not only do we need to stop the drugs, we need to stop biotech poison for profit in our horses' food chain. We need to label our feeds, so owners, breeders, trainers may make the call and educate on what is in our horses (and dogs' and cats') food. I equate this to the cigarette package. How many had to die before something was done? I am for the health of our horses, and we need to get educated on what this toxic chemical is doing to our breed, and all breeds.

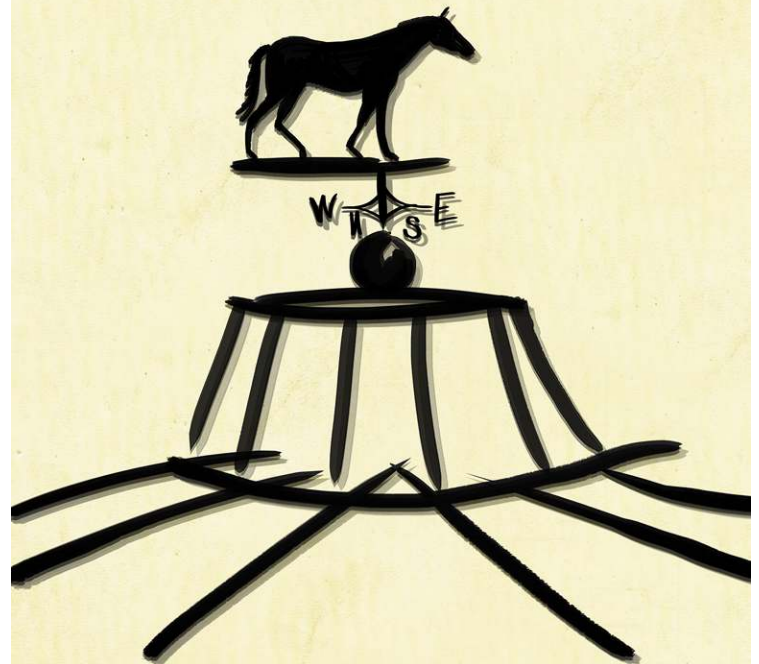
The Lasix is icing on the already baked cake, even before these horses get to the track.

Those two rivals exchanged bumps before Coup de Grace found his best stride and inched clear late to win by one length. Hy Kodiak Warrior was second and Gone as Wind (Smart Strike) was third.

"He's still learning the game, and that was one of the reasons this horse didn't run at Saratoga," winning trainer Chad Brown said. "He had all the talent in the world, and he was having some behavioral issues in the morning so we decided not to put him through the pressure of Saratoga. It's so busy up there, and he was showing some greenness intermittently in his training. Training for Fox Hill is great because [owner Rick Porter] just said, 'When he's ready, run him.' He got it together this fall, and he's doing real well."

Coup de Grace's performance impressed jockey Javier Castellano. "I let him see a target in the beginning and he rated pretty good, very kind," Castellano said.

"Turning for home, sometimes with young horses they look around a little bit but as soon as the horse came to him on the outside, he was focused. He just took off. He has a lot of talent, and we're looking forward to what's next." Brown added a stakes race could be next up for the talented colt. "The [Jan. 25 GII] Holy Bull would be a strong possibility because he's here, he's run over the track and he loves training here," Brown said. "I'll discuss that with Mr. Porter and, first and foremost, see how the horse is doing out of the race. We'll make sure we have him nominated everywhere, and we'll start to test this horse around two turns more than likely." **Cont. p2**

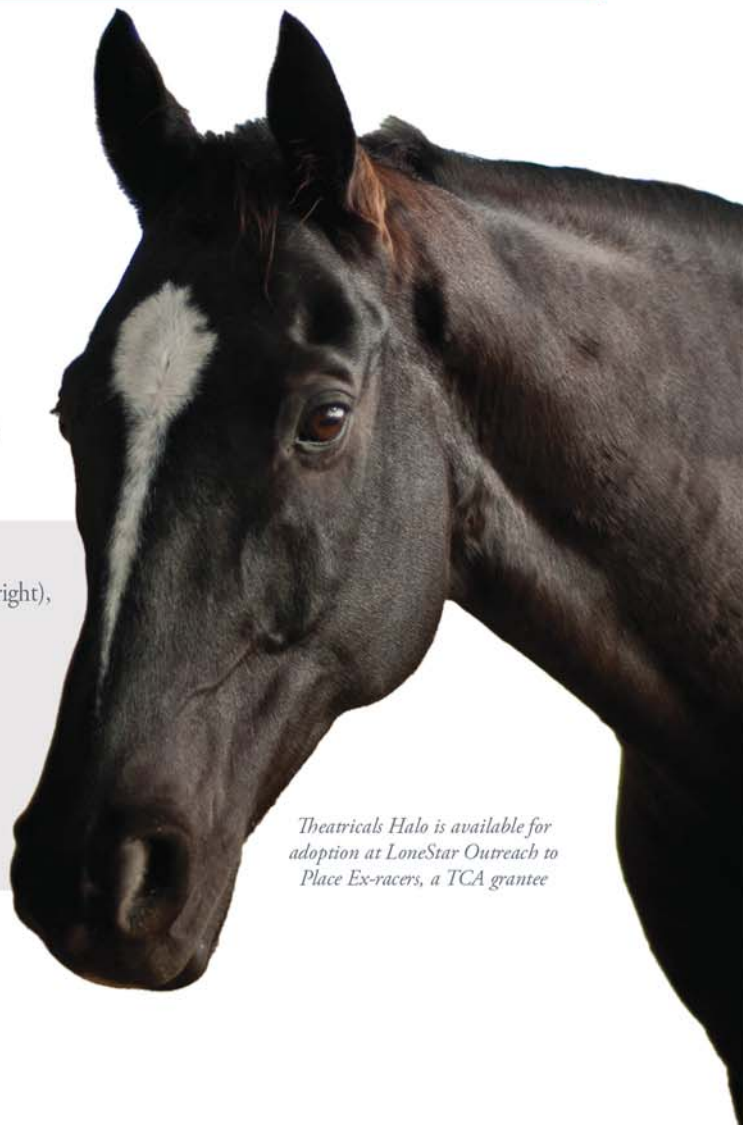

John Greathouse admits he has a soft spot for fillies by Malibu Moon and, understandably so, after the exploits of Devil May Care, who carried his family's Glencrest Farm silks to victories in the 2009 GI Frizette S. and 2010 GI Mother Goose S. and GI Coaching Club American Oaks, as well as a tilt at the GI Kentucky Derby. Glencrest was back in the winner's circle with another daughter of Malibu Moon yesterday at Gulfstream Park when Onlyforyou won a six-furlong allowance by a confident 3 1/2 lengths. Greathouse purchased the bay filly for \$115,000 out of the 2012 Keeneland September sale.

"I have to be careful with these Malibu Moons because I'm remembering what Devil May Care looked like and I see some of her in these horses and I get myself carried away," Greathouse admitted Sunday. "[Onlyforyou] didn't look exactly like her, but she closely enough resembled her where I thought for the kind of money we were spending, she was worth the chance."

The initial plan was to sell the filly as a 2-year-old this past spring, but she failed to attract the bidders at the Keeneland April sale.

"She had some vet issues that we were willing to live with and obviously the 2-year-old people weren't willing to live with and then the race people weren't willing to live with either, so that is the reason we still have her," Greathouse explained. "She was at Keeneland, but she didn't work good. She had worked better in the pre-breeze, but that day, for whatever reason, she was looking around and didn't work that good."

Onlyforyou didn't make her first start until Nov. 10, when she won her six-furlong debut by 2 1/4 lengths at Aqueduct. Greathouse thinks the extra time helped the filly.

"It might have been some of these physical things that she needed to work her way through," Greathouse said. "Some of these Malibu Moons, they are not nearly as precocious as 2-year-old people want them to be. They may want more ground and to expect some of these horses to go in there in :10 1/5 and then go a mile and an eighth in their 2-year-old year is sometimes stretching the imagination. You've got to see something to say 'Yes, this horse didn't work that fast, but she galloped out good and I'll sit and wait for her.'"

Still, Greathouse had seen enough from Onlyforyou that he jumped at the chance to buy the filly's dam out of this year's Keeneland November sale. Just two days before Onlyforyou broke her maiden at Aqueduct, Greathouse signed the ticket at \$50,000 for Erhu (Tactical Cat).

"I told the people [selling the mare], I think this filly can run," Greathouse said. "They said it was a partnership that was selling out and they didn't have a choice. I said, 'OK. As long as you know that I like the filly.'" **Cont. p3**



The graded-stakes placed Erhu, now 12 and in foal to To Honor and Serve, is also the dam of Dress the Part (Malibu Moon), a \$700,000 Keeneland September yearling in 2010. Her Street Boss colt, Wise Boss, brought \$250,000 at the 2011 September sale and her filly by Blame brought \$170,000 at this year's Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale.

"I was surprised," Greathouse admitted about Erhu's \$50,000 price tag. "Let's face it, they sold some high-priced foals out of that mare, so I was surprised to get her at that level. I was willing to pay more for her, but I was glad to get her at that level."

After Onlyforyou's performance Sunday, Greathouse said Erhu will most likely be visiting Malibu Moon again in 2014.

"[Before Sunday] I said, 'I have to wait and see this filly run back and know that I've got more than a filly who just broke her maiden before I spend that kind of money to breed to Malibu Moon,'" Greathouse explained. "But now, in all probability, that is where she'll go."

Let's face it, when somebody buys a \$50,000 mare and you're talking about a \$90,000-\$100,000 season--they don't make any sense together. And you and I both know that breaking your maiden is a long way from a 40-year marriage."

As for plans for Erhu's To Honor and Serve foal, Greathouse explained, "Most of these things we buy, they are for sale. If it's a filly, I'll look at it differently, but if it's a colt, I'll sell it."

In the more near-future, Greathouse is looking forward to watching Onlyforyou stretch out to two turns.

"I'm sure Mr. [Todd] Pletcher will bring up something in five or six weeks," Greathouse said of Onlyforyou's next outing. "And hopefully, it's two turns and we start to find out if that is something she wants. He'll tell me. The only thing he said to me was, 'I think she is a nice filly,' and that's probably as much praise as you're going to get out of him." *-Jessica Martini*
