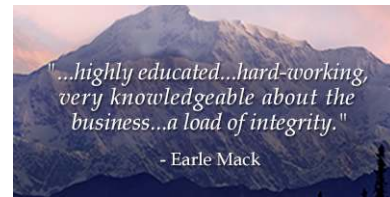

BAFFERT COULD START AS MANY AS THREE

For all he has accomplished in the Thoroughbred business, trainer Bob Baffert has but one victory in the GI Malibu S. to his credit courtesy of The Factor (War Front) in 2011. The silver-haired conditioner accounts for eight of the 28 nominees to the traditional feature of the opening day of the Santa Anita winter meet, and

could be represented by as many as three of the starters. Chief among those is Gary and Mary West's **Flashback** (Tapit), who will be making his second start off an extended layoff in the seven-furlong test. Favored in each of his five career appearances and never greater than 11-10, the full-brother to dual Grade I winner Zazu graduated at first asking in a single start at two

before romping by better than six lengths in the GII Robert B. Lewis S. Feb. 2. Runner-up to Hear the Ghost (Ghostzapper) in the GII San Felipe S. Mar. 9 and to Goldencents (Into Mischief) in the GI Santa Anita Derby Apr. 6, the gray was sidelined and made his return to the races in the Damascus S. on Breeders' Cup Saturday Nov. 2. Sluggish to start, he loomed up three wide on the turn, drifted wide into the lane and just failed to reel in the re-opposing **Zeewat** (Harlan's Holiday). Flashback, who drilled three-quarters of a mile in 1:11.40 Monday at Santa Anita, could be joined by a pair of stable companions next Thursday. "We'll have Flashback, [Zayat Stables'] **Zee Bros** (Brother Derek) and **Shakin It Up** (Midnight Lute) [entered in the Malibu]," said Baffert. "I've got some others that are possible, on the bubble." Winner of the Chick Lang S. at Pimlico in May, Zee Bros is unraced since a fifth in the GII Woody Stephens S. at Belmont June 8. Shakin It Up, who won the GII San Vicente S. over the Malibu course and trip Feb. 17, was last seen finishing fourth in the GIII Sunland Park Derby Mar. 24.

ORFEVRE TO GO OUT ON HIGH NOTE

Orfevre (Jpn) (Stay Gold {Jpn}), the 2011 Japanese Triple Crown winner, is set to bid farewell to the races in this Sunday's G1 Arima Kinen at Nakayama Racecourse. Regarded as the 'Peoples Race'--fans are allowed to vote for the horses they'd like to see

compete--the Arima Kinen has attracted only three of the top 10 votegetters--Orfevre, defending race champion **Gold Ship** (Jpn) (Stay Gold {Jpn}) and **Eishin Flash** (Jpn) (King's Best), the 2010 Japanese Derby winner and runner-up in this in

2011. Orfevre, second to Treve (Fr) (Motivator {GB}) in this year's G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe Oct. 6, skipped the G1 Japan Cup and should prove difficult to defeat here. "I could only admire how strong Treve was," trainer Yasutoshi Ikee said, looking back on the race at Longchamp. "I don't think I've ever seen a horse hit the switch rounding the last turn and still manage to pull away from the field. She could possibly be the world's best racehorse in decades. Orfevre ran a good race, left everything behind out there. The time he's been given to recover has made a huge difference for this race."

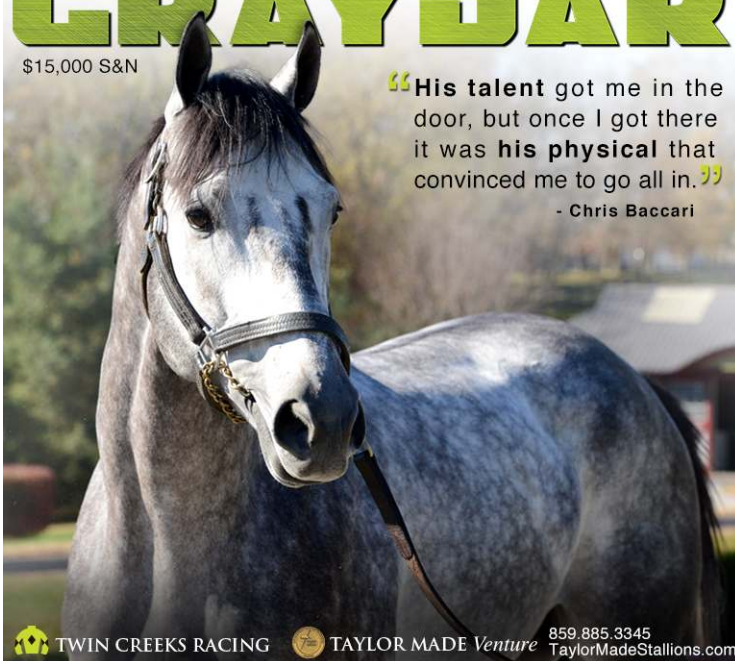

Berry Wins Hong Kong Appeal

Australian-based jockey Tommy Berry has successfully appealed against the severity of a ban handed down by Hong Kong Jockey Club stewards and will now be permitted to ride at the Magic Millions carnival meeting Jan. 11. Berry was originally suspended for 10 Hong Kong meetings from Dec. 15 through Jan. 16 after stewards accused him of not riding out a horse to the finish during the International Races meeting Dec. 8. Berry pleaded guilty to the charge, but appealed to have the suspension shortened to six meetings ending Jan. 6. He is set to ride debut winner Echo Gal (Aus) (Stratum {Aus}) for trainer Gai Waterhouse in the A\$2-million Magic Millions Classic.

From the desk of...

BUMPER CROP

A handful of Euros may stand for more money, but there sure can't be as many of them: by our count, there are 27 stallions retiring to stud in North America in 2014 for \$7,500 or more. Of the 27, we find 23 in Kentucky, two each in Florida and New York. I'm sure we can count on readers to let us know about any we've missed! This week, thumbnail sketches of the candidates:

Kentucky

Alternation (*Distorted Humor--Alternate, by Seattle Slew*)--Plied his trade mainly in the Midwest for owner-breeder Pin Oak Stud, to which he retires for \$7,500. He won the GII Peter Pan S. at Belmont Park as a 3-year-old and the GII Oaklawn H. at four, both at nine furlongs, and also won two Grade III's and earned over \$1 million. Pin Oak has always had a good following, and though he may not be the most high-profile sire to retire in Kentucky for 2013, you wouldn't discount his chances one bit.

Animal Kingdom (*Leroi des animaux {Brz}--Dalia {Ger}, by Acatenango {Ger}*)--Won the GI Kentucky Derby on dirt, the G1 Dubai World Cup on synthetic (Tapeta), and gave Wise Dan a fright in the 2012 GI Breeders' Cup Mile on turf; effective at distances from a mile to

10 furlongs, though his two best wins were at the latter trip. Has a great outcross pedigree, being by a son of Candy Stripes (by Blushing Groom) out of a German-bred mare by Acatenango. A great prospect, though a word of caution on the physical: his sire 'Leroi' is a medium-sized, Blushing Groom type, but

Animal Kingdom is a big, scopey type, likely throwing more to his damsire. I maybe wouldn't send him the same physical type you would send to 'Leroi'.

Data Link (*War Front--Database, by Known Fact*)--Grade I winner at a mile (2012 GI Maker's Mark Mile, at Keeneland); also second to Wise Dan in the same race in 2013), and won Grade II races at 8 1/2 and nine furlongs. Strictly a grass horse; he's a Grade I winner by War Front, standing at Claiborne for a very reasonable \$7,500, another in a string of 'righteous' stud fees at Claiborne for 2014.

Denman (Aus) (Lonhro {Aus}--Peach {Aus}, by Vain {Aus})--Won a Group 1 and two Group 2 races in Australia over seven furlongs among nine wins from 12 starts. He's by Lonhro, who's proven so popular in Kentucky as a 'reverse shuttler,' and is out of a mare by Vain, so he is bred to be fast. Given Lonhro's popularity, Darley decided to being Denman to Kentucky to reverse shuttle as well, and he'll be standing his first Kentucky season for \$15,000 in 2014.

Fast Bullet (Speightstown--Renfro Valley Star, by Dayjur)--Lightly raced chestnut made just seven starts over three seasons, his best win coming this spring when he led all the way to beat fellow Zayat runner Justin Philip (First Samurai) in the GII True North H. at six furlongs. Standing for \$7,500, Fast Bullet goes to stallion-maker Ben Walden's Pauls Mill Farm, which is also debuting I Want Revenge in 2014 (see below).

Flat Out (Flatter--Cresta Lil, by Cresta Rider)--Ran 29 times in all over six seasons, the last 23 of them in graded races from ages five through seven. He was in the first three in 16 graded races, including 11 Grade I races. He won three times at the highest level--two runnings of the 10-furlong Jockey Club Gold Cup and the GI Cigar Mile. He also won the GII Suburban H. twice. He is one of three new sires for Spendthrift next year and will stand for \$10,000.

Fort Larned (E Dubai--Arlucea, by Broad Brush)--Winner of 10 of 25 lifetime starts, including the 2012 GI Whitney H., the 2012 GI Breeders' Cup Classic (Beyer 115, defeating Mucho Macho Man) and this year's GI Stephen Foster H. leading all the way and drawing off by six lengths. He earned \$4.4 million overall, and ran Beyer figures of 107+ six times. He'll get a good shot at Adena Springs, where he'll debut for a \$15,000 fee.

Graydar (Unbridled's Song--Sweetest Smile, by Dehere)--Unbeaten in three starts this year, namely the GI Donn H., GI New Orleans H. (both 9 furlongs) and the GII Kelso H. at a mile, and was 5-for-6 lifetime. Succeeds his late sire at Taylor Made and deserves to be well supported. Had he made the GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile, he might well have given the winner Goldcents plenty to think about.

I Want Revenge (Stephen Got Even--Meguial {Arg}, by Roy)--Won the GI Wood Memorial in spectacular fashion at odds of 1-2 in 2009 and looked the favorite for that year's GI Kentucky Derby, but was sidelined by injury. He joins Fast Bullet as this year's Pauls Mill intake, which means he's gone to a farm which knows how to give them a good shot, and at \$10,000, he looks very fair value for a horse who was the likely Derby favorite.

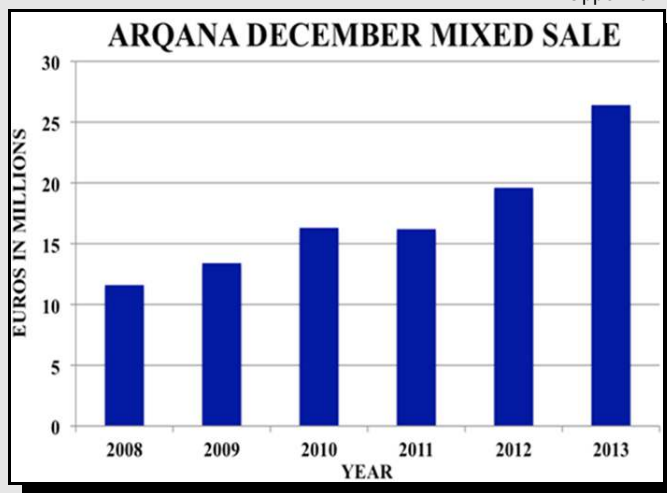

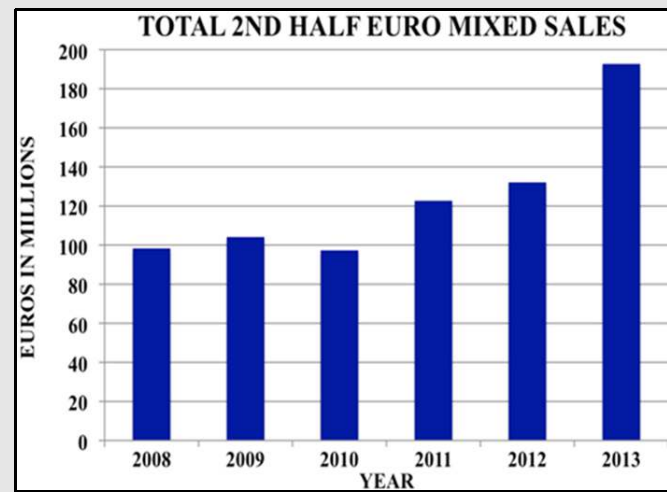

Jimmy Creed (*Distorted Humor-Hookedonthefeelin*, by *Citidancer*)--A \$900,000 yearling purchase, a good sprinter who won the GI Malibu S. at 7 furlongs on opening day of Santa Anita's 2012-13 winter meet and came back in April to win the GII Potrero Grande S. at 6 1/2 furlongs, both on conventional dirt. In that respect he is more like his sire and has a chance to further establish Distorted Humor as a sire of sires, which would be welcome. Reasonably priced at \$12,500,

which if memory serves is the price at which his sire kicked off, at the resurgent Spendthrift operation.

Justin Philip (*First Samurai--Ava Knowsthecode*, by *Cryptoclearance*)--Very useful sprinter who ran 32 times over four seasons and finally got his deserved Grade I win in this year's Alfred G.

Vanderbilt S. at Saratoga; also won the GII Woody Stephens and a Grade III, and placed in nine other graded races. Sprinters with this kind of record--danced a lot of dances, usually right there--often turn out to be much better sires than the bare facts of their records might suggest. Very

well bred--he's a half-brother to four other black-type winners, including Algorithms--and goes to Castleton Lyons for \$12,500.

Liaison (*Indian Charlie--Gallop Gal*, by *Victory Gallop*)--Won the GI CashCall Futurity as a 2-year-old and contested eight graded races from eight starts at three, and connections obviously thought a lot of him, as he ran in the GI Kentucky Derby and GI Travers S. and he did place in the GII Swaps S. and GII Jim Dandy S. He came back this year at four to win the GII Mervyn Leroy H. Both his graded wins were on synthetic at Hollywood Parl, but he also did win a stakes on conventional dirt and is another headed to Spendthrift, for \$10,000.

Morning Line (*Tiznow--Indian Snow*, by *A.P. Indy*)--A bit of a forgotten horse, being very lightly raced the last two seasons. Won the

GII Pennsylvania Derby and missed by a head in the GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile as a 3-year-old in 2010. He won the seven-furlong GI Carter H. at four and the GII Mervyn Leroy H. at five. A \$700,000 yearling acquisition and by Tiznow, who has a real chance to be a sire of

sires, Morning Line has retired to Lane's End for \$10,000.

Orb (*Malibu Moon--Lady Liberty, by Unbridled*)--Though, like many GI Kentucky Derby winners, he never won again after the Derby, that was his fifth win in a row,

which included the GII Fountain of Youth S. (defeating the theretofore unbeaten Violence) and GI Florida Derby. This is a horse with an aura: comes from Stuart Janney's probably oldest and best family and goes to Claiborne for \$25,000. He'll get serious support from a good

Claiborne syndicate and is sure to deservedly be one of this group's commercial leaders.

Overanalyze (*Dixie Union--Unacloud, by Unaccounted For*)--Could prove quite a shrewd buy for WinStar.

Though he wouldn't be a household name, he did win the GII Futurity S. and GII Remsen S. at two, and the GI Arkansas Derby at three earlier this year. He's by Dixie Union, also the sire of Union Rags, who is an underrated source of quality (he was, after all, a very good 2-year-old by Dixieland Band), and does have a few things going for him, including where he's standing. He debuts for \$10,000.

Oxbow (*Awesome Again--Tizamazing, by Cee's Tizzy*)-- This year's GI Preakness winner under an inspired front-running ride from the rejuvenated Gary Stevens, and also second to Palace Malice in the GI Belmont. At 78 his equally rejuvenated trainer, Wayne Lukas, isn't likely to have changed his methods, so Oxbow danced plenty of dances until his retirement after the GI Haskell, but that's no bad thing: Lukas has trained plenty of top sires. With the promise of his owner Calumet's support, Oxbow goes to Taylor Made, alongside Graydar, for \$20,000.

Paynter (*Awesome Again--Tizso, by Cee's Tizzy*)--An exciting sire prospect with a great advertising campaign, Paynter and Oxbow are actually 3/4-brothers, both being by Awesome Again and out of

full sisters to Tiznow. Paynter was a game front-running second to Union Rags in the 2012 GI Belmont S., then came back to win the GI Haskell in his next start. He didn't win a stakes this year, but ran a Beyer 114 winning a Hollywood Park allowance race over seven furlongs (synthetic) and was runner-up to Mucho Macho Man in the GI Awesome Again S., which I think we used to know as the

Goodwood. A horse with a lot of charisma and a big shot, he goes to WinStar for \$25,000.

Point of Entry (*Dynaformer--Matlacha Pass, by Seeking the Gold*)--Probably Dynaformer's last great shot to make a sire of sires, and a big shot he has, too: he won five in a row in 2012, including three Grade I's in New

York at 11-12 furlongs on the turf (Man O'War, Sword Dancer, Turf Classic) before just failing to peg back Little Mike in the 2012 GI Breeders' Cup Turf. He probably ran his best race ever when defeating none other than Animal Kingdom in the GI Gulfstream Park Turf H. at nine furlongs last February, and added his

fifth Grade I in the 10-furlong Manhattan in June. He goes to Adena Springs for \$25,000 and should appeal to Europeans as well as Americans. You wouldn't be looking for precocious 2-year-olds, but this is a horse who really will have the kind of support that could see him make a sire.

Shanghai Bobby (*Harlan's Holiday--Steelin', by Orientate*)--Unbeaten in five starts at two, including a five-length trouncing of subsequent dual Grade I winner Goldencents in the GI Champagne and a hard-fought

win in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile. Unbeaten 2-year-olds have a pretty fair record as sires, and it cannot have gone unnoticed that when Coolmore decided to replenish the Ashford roster, they acquired four consecutive champion juveniles: Lookin At Lucky (first 2-year-olds 2014), Uncle Mo (first yearlings 2014), Hansen (since sold to South Korea, first foals 2014), and Shanghai Bobby. He's by

Harlan's Holiday, which is also a plus as people like him, and will be standing for \$20,000.

Swagger Jack (*Smart Strike--Lyrical Prayer, by The Minstrel*)--Started out on grass but switched to dirt and was first or second in six consecutive races, culminating with a win in the GI Carter H. this April. By Smart Strike from a good Ned Evans family he'll have plenty of appeal. Goes to Millennium Farms for \$7,500.

Take Charge Indy (*A.P. Indy--Take Charge Lady, by Dehere*)--By A.P. Indy, which in itself is a good recommendation, out of triple Grade I winner and \$2.4-million earner Take Charge Lady--which makes him a half-brother to this year's pro-tem 3-year-old champion Will Take Charge. This horse ran two races which alone give him a big shot, in my view: he won the GI Florida Derby, which is as good a race for producing sires as any you can name:

and this year, at four, he ran a sensational race in the GI Alysheba at Churchill Downs, winning by six lengths in a Beyer 109. He goes to WinStar for \$20,000 and deserves to be well supported, which he will be.

Verrazano (*More Than Ready--Enchanted Rock, by Giant's Causeway*)--Won his first four starts, including a sensational 16-length allowance win at Gulfstream and the GI Wood Memorial, then returned in the summer to win the GI Haskell by nearly 10 lengths, running another sensational race to record a Beyer 116. Only Fort Larned and Flat Out among this year's retiring stallions--and both as older horses--ran figures that high in their careers. Verrazano goes to Ashford, though at this writing I believe they still have not announced a stud fee, leaving open the possibility that he remains in training in 2014. He was probably the most high-profile American 3-year-old of 2013 and is sure to command strong market support.

Treasure Beach (Ire) (*Galileo {Ire}--Honorine {Ire}, by Mark of Esteem {Ire}*)--Globetrotting Group 1 winner who ran second to Pour Moi in the G1 Epsom Derby, then won the G1 Irish Derby (RPR 122 in both races) and the GI Secretariat S. at Arlington, as a 3-year-old in 2011, and finished second to Point of Entry in the GI Turf Classic last year. Who wouldn't want a Group 1 Derby-winning son of Galileo? Goes to Pleasant Acres for \$10,000.

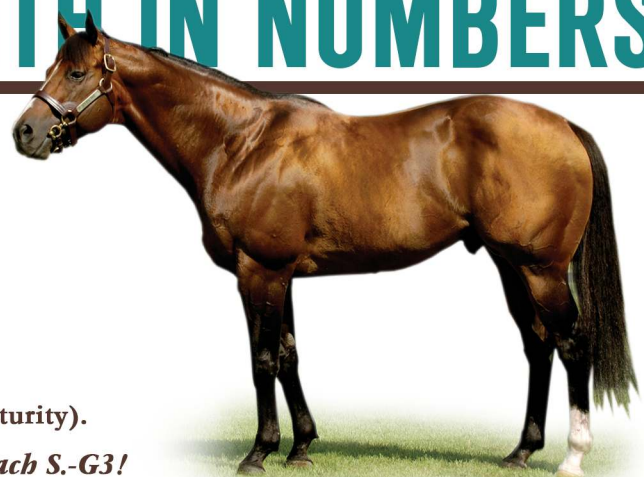

TAKE ADVANTAGE OF 2013 INCENTIVES BEFORE YEAR'S END

Industry members have until the end of this month to benefit from the strong 2013 investment incentives of 50 percent bonus depreciation and a \$500,000 expense allowance. Both incentives could benefit purchasers of horses, farm equipment and most other depreciable property. Below is a summary of each incentive:

Bonus Depreciation - allows taxpayers to write off 50 percent of the cost of new qualified depreciable property if the property is purchased and placed in service before 1/1/2014. Property is considered new if its original use commences with the taxpayer. Yearlings and new tractors, for example, may qualify for this incentive.

Expense Allowance - allows taxpayers to write off the cost of new or used qualified depreciable property, up to \$500,000, if the property is purchased and placed in service before 1/1/2014. The expense allowance is reduced dollar for dollar once qualified investments exceed \$2 million. In addition to yearlings, broodmares and horses of racing age may qualify for this incentive.
