

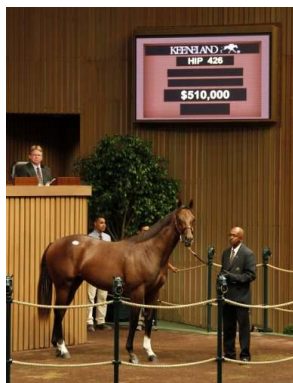

KEENELAND APRIL SALE ON HIATUS

The Keeneland April 2-Year-Olds in Training Sale, originally scheduled for Apr. 6, will not be held in 2015, according to a press release issued from Keeneland Tuesday afternoon. "The 'boutique sale' model has become increasingly difficult to construct," explained Keeneland President and CEO Bill Thomason. "The April sale lacks a critical mass of horses, a key factor which makes our September Yearling, November Breeding Stock and January Horses of All Ages sales so successful. We will suspend the April sale this year and continue to review its viability in years to come."

Last year's April sale drew a catalogue of 125 horses, with just 38 selling for \$8,769,000. In 2013, 59 April juveniles sold for \$11,640,000.

First held in 1993, April sale graduates include Grade I winners Palace Malice (Curlin), Lookin at Lucky (Smart Strike),

Big Brown (Boundary), Thunder Gulch (Gulch), Keeper Hill (Deputy Minister) and Gal in a Ruckus (Bold Ruckus).

"This was a difficult decision given the consistently positive racing results of our April sale graduates," Keeneland Vice President of Sales Walt Robertson said. "We decided not to delay so that our consignors will have ample time to make alternative plans for their horses."

ETHICS PROBES KEEP ASMUSSEN OFF 2015 HALL OF FAME BALLOT

The National Museum of Racing and Hall of Fame notified members of its voting panel Tuesday that trainer Steve Asmussen will not be allowed to appear on 2015 Hall of Fame ballots because of ongoing investigations into rules and ethics violations in New York and Kentucky.

"Our executive committee felt it didn't send the right message for somebody who's being investigated for animal cruelty and drug abuse violations to be eligible for the sport's highest honor," HOF communications coordinator Brien Bouyea told TDN.

Asmussen, the second-winningest all-time North American trainer (6,930 victories) and fifth-highest all-time purse earner (\$224 million), could not be reached for comment.

MAGIC LINEUP GOOD AS GOLD

Magic Millions kicks off the Southern Hemisphere yearling sale season this week when its Gold Coast Yearling Sale gets underway Wednesday at the Bundall sales complex in Queensland, Australia. Books 1 and 2 of Magic Millions' flagship sale see 912 lots catalogued over five consecutive days, and loud whispers on the ground suggest this year's renewal could be one of the strongest since the sale was born in 1986. A quick glance at the catalogue supports those rumors: there are 28 siblings to Group 1 winners set to go under the hammer, and 26 progeny of Group 1-winning mares.

Champion sires like Fastnet Rock (Aus), Redoute's Choice (Aus) and More Than Ready are well represented, and the first-season contingent is one of the strongest in recent memories, including such standout racehorses as Canford Cliffs (Ire), Dream Ahead, Foxwedge (Aus), Gio Ponti, Helmet (Aus), Pluck, Poet's Voice (GB), Pour Moi (Ire), Sepoy (Aus), So You Think (NZ), Uncle Mo and Zoffany (Ire).



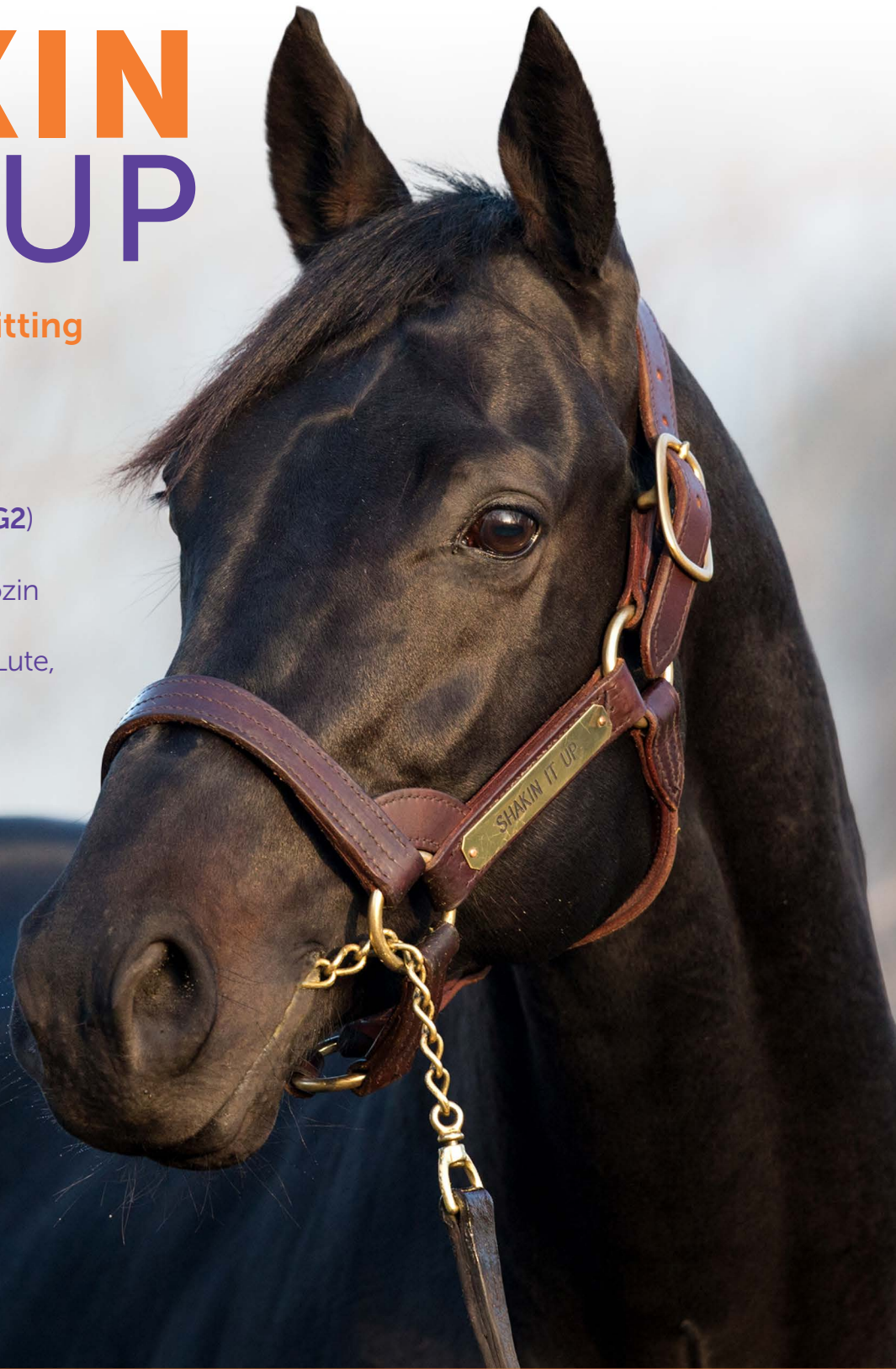

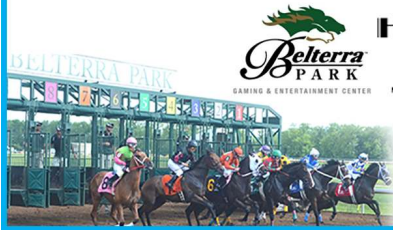

Ethics Probes Keep Asmussen off Ballot *(cont. from p1)*

Bouyea said Asmussen first became eligible for HOF voting in 2011, and that in 2014 he was selected by the nominating committee to appear as one of 10 candidates on that year's final ballot. But shortly after ballots were mailed last spring, an undercover video surfaced that depicted alleged ethical abuses within Asmussen's racing operation.

In the face of public pressure and subsequent commission-level investigations in two states, the HOF tabled Asmussen's candidacy and removed him from voting consideration.

Bouyea said that because the New York and Kentucky investigations are ongoing, that tabling will remain in effect for 2015.

"If it comes out that these investigations clear him of any wrongdoing, we will not have any problem bringing him back for consideration next year if he continues to be in good standing," Bouyea said. "We're not looking to blackball anybody."

Bouyea said he could not recall such a pre-emptive action ever occurring with regard to HOF voting. But he acknowledged that increasingly intense scrutiny is something that Hall-of-Fame candidates are facing in many sports.

"It's certainly something we're going to have to be dealing with [in future elections]," Bouyea said. "There have been a lot of trainers who have been fined or suspended, and I think any of them who have lengthy records are going to get a serious look about whether they'll be considered or not."

Bouyea said calls and emails to the HOF Tuesday were evenly split between supporters saying the HOF "did the right thing" by excluding Asmussen and opponents whose sentiment was "let the voters decide."

FINLEY FILES NYTHA ELECTION APPEAL

In response to a request for additional documentation to be used as evidence at an upcoming dispute resolution hearing, Terry Finley has filed an expanded letter of protest with the New York Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association, underscoring his demand for a new election to reconcile his claims of a deeply flawed process that led to his 14-vote defeat in the organization's Dec. 1 election for president.

Finley's initial Dec. 8 protest letter was a personally written three pages outlining the alleged failure of ballots to be mailed to all eligible voters and perceived conflicts of interest by election board officials.

But the Jan. 5 missive filed on Finley's behalf by the law firm Boies, Schiller & Flexner LLP is a 12-page legal salvo that accentuates Finley's claims of malfeasance in far greater detail (Click [here](#) to read).

Accompanying the protest letter are 29 separate exhibits and affidavits that purport to prove that balloting irregularities and the allegedly "biased" behavior of election board members aligned with incumbent president Rick Violette, Jr. "utterly compromised the integrity of the election."

In between Finley's two letters of protest, NYTHA had agreed to investigate and hold a hearing on his election complaints. But Finley then argued that the NYTHA board was essentially assigning itself to investigate its own alleged wrongdoings, a process that Finley's attorneys characterized in a Dec. 22 letter as "procedurally insufficient" and "fundamentally and fatally flawed."

NYTHA executive director James Gallagher confirmed Tuesday that he received Finley's second demand letter, but he declined to comment on the issue.

"It's clear. A new NYTHA election is necessary," Finley wrote in an email to *TDN*. "One that is fair, transparent and independent. One in which every single eligible NYTHA member is afforded the opportunity to cast a vote. I ask the members of the NYTHA board to do the right thing and immediately mandate a new election be conducted."

Finley, the president and founder of West Point Thoroughbreds, ran a hotly contested autumn campaign against Violette, but lost by a vote that was reported (but not confirmed by NYTHA) as 625-611.

In the days after his loss, Finley initially said he had no intention of protesting the outcome. But when he was "inundated" by potential NYTHA voters who claimed they had either not received ballots or received them too late to cast them, he concluded that as many as 1,000 eligible NYTHA voters might have been excluded from voting (Finley has twice revised that number upward, first to 1,500 and now 1,700).

In his initial protest letter, Finley voiced his concerns about both the voting irregularities and the allegedly insider-ish behavior of election committee members Gallagher, Alan Foreman and Craig Gegorek.

NYTHA responded by outlining an appeals process and scheduling a Feb. 10 closed-session hearing on the matter. Finley responded Dec. 22 by claiming that such a hearing would not be fair because, among other complaints, he would not be able to discover opposing evidence in advance of the hearing and that he would not be allowed to either listen to witness testimony or call his own witnesses. The hearing process that NYTHA put in place mandated that Finley file a "comprehensive and detailed written statement" by Jan. 5, so the package filed by his attorneys appears to satisfy NYTHA's requirement in the event that the hearing proceeds as outlined. The Jan. 5 demand letter includes a significant new point of protest, that "NYTHA's staff impermissibly tipped the scales of the election by providing between 100 and 150 'supplemental ballots' to selected NYTHA members and others without documenting the reasons for doing so."

The letter alleges that because these ballots were sent out selectively to Violette supporters, they should thus be considered void "in an election that turned on only 14 votes."

In summing up the argument for a new election, the Jan. 5 letter concludes, "Mr. Finley has obtained sworn affidavits from at least 16 eligible members... confirming that they were unable to vote in the election and would have voted for Mr. Finley. If...their votes had been counted, and nothing else about the NYTHA election was changed, Mr. Finley would be NYTHA's president today."

HEAD UPBEAT ON SON OF GOLDIKOVA

The first foal out of Wertheimer et Frere's champion racemare Goldikova (Ire) (Anabaa), the winner of 14 Group/Grade 1 races, including three consecutive renewals of the GI Breeders' Cup Mile, has followed in his dam's footsteps and is now in training with Freddy Head in Chantilly. **Goldikovic (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), who will celebrate his second birthday Feb. 3, is shaping up nicely, according to the conditioner. "He has been with me for a couple of months," Head told *Paris-Turf*. "He is a good-looking, average-sized colt with good balance. He has the loveliest of temperaments and has done everything we've asked him to do so far. I like the way he moves." Head continued, "It is obviously too early to think of a date for his racecourse debut, but all I can tell you is that he's got great potential." In 2014, Goldikova gave birth to a filly named Terrakova (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) and returned to the European champion sire for the third time. She will visit Wertheimer et Frere's 2013 G1 Prix du Jockey Club hero Intello (Ger) (Galileo {Ire}) this season.

An equally impressive international contingent of humans has descended on the Gold Coast, with Americans in town including B. Wayne Hughes of Spendthrift Farm, agent John Moynihan and Jon Kelly, who signed the ticket on last year's A\$1-million sale-topping colt by Redoute's Choice in his first visit to the sale. Hughes and Moynihan are in attendance for the first time.

Considering the growing appeal of Australian stock worldwide, it wouldn't be a surprise to see an increase in American purchases. Exports from Magic Millions sales increased by 47% in 2013/14, with the strongest growth coming from the U.S., which increased its purchases six-fold.

"We're very happy," said Magic Millions Managing Director Vin Cox. "There's a good vibe around the place. Everyone's busy--[Monday] was a worry because it was raining pretty heavily in patches, but everyone seemed to get around that."

The rainfall continued into the early hours of sales eve yesterday, but the clouds gave way in time for the barrier draw for Saturday's A\$2-million Magic Millions 2YO Classic and A\$1-million 3YO Guineas, which took place on the beach at Surfer's Paradise. The morning's festivities, which also included a display of horses galloping along the beach and a live

broadcast by local radio station Gold FM, drew heavy attendance from not only the racing public and personalities, but from the general public, which crammed every available space to witness the draws for Queensland's most important day of racing. Magic Millions Racing Women Patron Zara Phillips and ambassador Francesca Cumani were among those in attendance and Phillips, a British royal and Olympic equestrian, spoke about Magic Millions' incentives to increase the involvement of women in racing. **Cont. p7**

These efforts, which have been pioneered by Magic Millions' Katie Page-Harvey, include the Racing Women's Bonus, an A\$500,000 pot that is paid out to the first four all female-owned horses across the line in the 2YO Classic. The bonus is in its third year.

"I'm very honored that Katie has got me involved," Phillips said. "We're just trying to get more women involved in racing. I'm lucky I compete in a level playing field [in eventing], boys against girls, but trying to make that happen in other industries is hard work, so that's what we're trying to do."

Cox added, "The barrier draw on the beach was fantastic. The general public came out, there were a lot of people there and there was a lot of interest in it."

With the barrier draw festivities out of the way, the focus turned back to sales inspections, and indeed the sales grounds were teeming with visitors under spotless skies. Cox attributed the increased profile of the Gold Coast yearling sale to a few factors, including the drop in the Australian dollar and the recent announcement of Magic Millions' 2016 A\$10-million raceday.

"We're very happy with the internationals being here," Cox said. "The dollar has worked in our favor, but I wouldn't put it entirely on account of the dollar. There's a few things in play. Obviously our A\$10-million raceday has brought people out and put some focus on Magic Millions, and the Australian horse as well--we're competing internationally and are well recognized, and Magic Millions is now firmly on the international calendar as a sales venue to go to."

Next year's Magic Millions raceday will be the richest meeting in Australia and will include a diverse menu of contests for juveniles, sophomores and fillies and mares, including an A\$1-million 1800-meter race. Cox noted that interest in the sale has undoubtedly increased since the unveiling of the raceday late last month.

"It's really jumped up," he said. "You can only talk anecdotally, but I was out to dinner and the local restaurant manager said, 'I was going to buy a horse this year, but now I think I might buy two.' There's no doubt lots of trainers have got onto their clients about it. It's a huge incentive--A\$10 million for the life of the horse. And it's not restricted to 2-year-olds--it's 2-year-olds, 3-year-olds, fillies and mares, horses that get over 1800 meters, and there's a Queensland-bred race."

Such opportunities for horses outside the sprinting division have likely helped evolve Magic Millions from a sale reputed as a source of early sprinters to a sale that offers quality horses of all types.

"I'd say five or 10 years ago you would have said it was a one-dimensional catalogue, but we are getting a broader spectrum of horse nowadays--horses like High Chaparral and So You Think that will get a two-turn horse," Cox explained. "It's just evolved naturally. In the past we have sold Melbourne Cup winners, Atlantic Jewels, Shoot Outs, who won the Derby. We have sold those types of horses in the past, but it's now a much broader spectrum, which is great."

The pre-sale festivities will wrap up tonight with the R.M. Williams launch party at Surfer's Paradise, and then it's down to business, with the sale kicking off at 11 a.m. Wednesday Australian time.

233 HEAD FOR DUBAI WORLD CUP CARNIVAL

A total of 233 horses from 14 countries have been accepted for the \$38-million Dubai World Cup Carnival, which begins at Meydan Jan. 8. They include 31 Group 1 winners. Great Britain sends out the largest squad with 99 horses entered, headed by Charlie Hills's G1 Irish 1,000 Guineas and GI E.P. Taylor S. heroine **Just The Judge (Ire)** (Lawman {Fr}), Richard Hannon's 2013 G1 National S. scorer **Toormore (Ire)** (Arakan), Tom Dascombe's **Brown Panther (GB)** (Shirocco {Ger}), winner of this year's G1 Irish St Leger, Olly Stevens's **Peace And War** (War Front), winner of the GI Darley Alcibiades S. last time out, and Marco Botti's **Euro Charline (GB)** (Myboycharlie {Ire}), who was last seen winning the GI Beverly D. S. South Africa will be represented by 44 runners, all trained by Mike de Kock, who is the most successful international trainer in the history of the Carnival with 130 wins over the last decade. Seven of them are Group 1 winners, including last season's G1 Jebel Hatta victor **Vercingetorix (SAf)** (Silvano {Ger}). Ireland comes next with 25 horses entered, led by Ed Lynam's star sprinter **Sole Power (GB)** (Kyllachy {GB}). Norway sends out a strong draft of 23, headed by Rune Augen's **Sudirman** (Henrythenavigator), who won the G1 Phoenix S. last year and was recently transferred from the yard of David Wachman. Nine horses will ship from the U.S., including eight in the care of Saratoga-based Seth Bazel--the only North American trainer to race at the Carnival last year. They are headed by 2013 Canadian Horse of the Year **Up With The Birds** (Stormy Atlantic) and 2014 GI Cigar Mile H. winner **Private Zone** (Macho Uno). There will be 34 stakes races run over the 11 fixtures that make up the Carnival, with "Super Saturday," Mar. 7, and Dubai World Cup day, Mar. 28, as feature events. This year will see the 20th running of the \$10-million G1 Dubai World Cup, as well as Meydan reversing to dirt, following the switch to Tapeta in 2010.

MAJMU TO PASS J&B MET

Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid al Maktoum's **Majmu (Aus)** (Redoute's Choice {Aus}), South Africa's champion 2-year-old filly of 2013-2014, will not make her next start in the G1 J&B Met S. in Cape Town, trainer Mike de Kock confirmed Monday on his website. The news comes despite the lifting of the recent movement restriction ban on horses stabled at Randjesfontein, north of Johannesburg.

"Under current AHS conditions, it has been recommended that we move horses we intend to race in Cape Town to another centre or to Cape Town as soon as possible in case the movement ban is re-instituted, but I don't want to prepare Majmu elsewhere," the conditioner commented.

Winner of her first three trips to the post, Majmu, an A\$300,000 purchase out of the 2013 Inglis Easter Yearling sale, suffered her first defeat when a troubled fourth in the G2 Spring F/M Challenge S. at Turffontein Oct. 4. She bounced back to win the G3 Starling S. at that venue Nov. 1 and most recently shipped down to Kenilworth for a breakthrough Group 1 success in the Cape Fillies Guineas Dec. 6.

De Kock continued, "There are other overriding factors too. Majmu lost weight when she travelled to the Cape and back for the Fillies Guineas and had not put it back on after having had a month to do so. Taking another trip to Cape Town for a major race like the Met will be a bit hard on a young filly like her and could affect her Triple Tiara aspirations. We'd rather bide our time, the Highveld feature season is around the corner in Gauteng and it makes sense to keep Majmu stabled here in view of the Triple Tiara series. We had to make a decision whether Majmu would travel to Cape Town on Wednesday along with Pine Princess (SAf) (Captain Al {SAf}) and Alboran Sea (Aus) (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}), and after discussions with Sheikh Hamdan's Racing Manager Angus Gold this evening, we considered it to be in Majmu's best interest to take her out of the J&B Met."

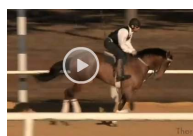

MEDIA ECLIPSE AWARDS ANNOUNCED

The National Thoroughbred Racing Association (NTRA), *Daily Racing Form* and the National Turf Writers and Broadcasters (NTWAB) announced yesterday that Barbara Livingston has won the 2014 Media Eclipse Award for Photography, while a pair of Writing Awards were earned by John Scheinman in the Feature/Commentary category and Joe Clancy in the News/Enterprise category.

Livingston will receive her third overall Eclipse Award for her photograph of Tapiture (Tapit) working out at Churchill Downs in a heavy rainstorm in advance of the GI Kentucky Derby.

“I’m very proud to record our sport’s history, and it’s an indescribable honor to win three Eclipse Awards,” said Livingston. “I’m very critical of my work but really like this photo, in part because it evokes emotion and excitement--something our sport so often inspires--and it was taken under very difficult conditions.”

Livingston captured the image on the morning of Apr. 28, just before Churchill was forced to close the track due to the torrential conditions.

“It wasn’t easy to convince the camera to choose Tapiture instead of the rain,” added Livingston. “I think the light source behind them, accentuating the rain, helped make the photo unusual.”

Scheinman garnered his first Eclipse Award for “Memories of a Master: The Determined Life of Dickie Small,” a piece which appeared on *The Blood-Horse* website remembering the life of the late Richard Small, a Maryland-based trainer who passed away from cancer at age 68 in April. The feature explores Small’s time before becoming a trainer, his modesty and success as a horseman, and his enduring love for the game in his final years.

“I’m thrilled to win the Eclipse Award and honored to win for this story on Dickie Small,” said Scheinman. “I invested more time and more of myself in this project than any other that I have written on horse racing.”

Clancy, too, secured his first Eclipse recognition for his news report, “Horse of a Lifetime,” which documented the story of dual-classic winner California Chrome (Lucky Pulpit) before and during his victorious effort in the GI Preakness S. The account appeared in the July edition of *Mid-Atlantic Thoroughbred* and focuses heavily on the public enthusiasm for the colt and his trainer, 77-year-old Art Sherman.

“Art was very open as I walked with him alone up to the track,” said Clancy when recalling the moments leading up to the Preakness. “It was just the two of us right before going to the paddock. Before the race, he was just very genuine.”

All three honors will be presented at the Eclipse Awards ceremony and dinner to be held Jan. 17 at Gulfstream Park.

Wagering at MJC Down in 2014:

Total average wagering for the 2014 season was down 2.2% from 2013, according to figures released yesterday by the Maryland Jockey Club. The average daily handle dropped from \$2.52 million to \$2.46 million per day.

The MJC conducted 142 live racing dates in 2014, three fewer than 2013, as well as 204 simulcast days. The MJC also announced yesterday that ground has been broken for the construction of new barns at Laurel Park.

“We broke ground before Christmas and 150 stalls will be finished with horses in them by April,” said Stronach Group Chief Operating Officer Tim Ritvo. “The Stronach Group has made great strides at Santa Anita and Gulfstream Park and Maryland is now our next big project. Within six months we hope to make an announcement of a solid plan of what racing will look like in the state. These plans have been on the drawing board for way too long and we are trying to focus on them right now and push forward. We would like to see Maryland become a big force in the industry. We appreciate the patience of our fans and horsemen.”

The Association of Racing Commissioners International has announced a modification to its Model Wagering Rules which will permit the carryover of Pentafecta pools to other tracks operated by a licensed racing association for which they are the pool host. The change, which was requested by the Canadian Pari-Mutuel Agency and Canadian racetracks, went into immediate effect in Canada.
