The top three finishers from Saturday's GIII Withers S.--**Far From Over** (Blame), **El Kabeir** (Scat Daddy) and **Classy Class** (Discretely Mine) have exited the race in fine form, according to their conditioners. "[Far From Over came out in good shape, ate everything up

today," said Byron Hughes, assistant to trainer Todd Pletcher. "I talked to Todd this morning and there are no immediate plans for him, but it looks like he'll be staying in New York."

John Terranova, conditioner of runner-up El Kabeir

was also pleased with how his charge exited the affair. "So far, so good," Terranova said of the Zayat colorbearer. "He cooled out really well after the race and is a nice, sound horse."

"I thought it was a good effort," Terranova continued. "We were second best, but [El Kabeir] put in a good, solid effort. If you look at the numbers, he's earned Beyer Speed Figures of 94, 95, and 93 for his last three races. He's an ultra-consistent horse, hopefully we can take that next jump forward in his next race."

Trainer Kieran McLaughlin was also satisfied with the third-place effort from Cheyenne Stable's Classy Class. "He ran very well," said McLaughlin. "He was engaged early by El Kabeir and they fought a hard battle for most of the race, setting it up nicely for Far From Over. Once Far From Over stumbled coming out of the gate, I thought we were going to make an easy lead, but Chucky [Lopez, aboard El Kabeir] came after us early. All things considered, we were pleased with the effort."

historic showdown. "Shared Belief was excellent this morning," Dan Ward, assistant to trainer Jerry Hollendorfer, said Sunday morning. "He ate all his feed. What happened in the past is not important. The only thing is the future, and that would include the [GI] Santa

Anita H. [Mar. 7]. He'll go back to Golden Gate tomorrow, train up there, probably come back the Wednesday before the race, keeping the same schedule as in the past."

The connections of Horse of the Year California Chrome had planned on sending their dual Classic winner to contest the G1 Dubai World Cup Mar. 28, and Saturday's loss has not changed their minds. "He's going to Dubai," trainer Art Sherman confirmed Sunday morning. "We're preparing for that. The horse came out the race well and ate up good."

PLETCHER SOPHOMORES WORK AT PALM BEACH DOWNS

A number of Todd Pletcher's top 3-year-olds worked at Palm Beach Downs over the weekend. Both GI Champagne S. winner **Daredevil** (More Than Ready) and GI Breeders' Futurity victor **Carpe Diem** (Giant's

Causeway) fired bullets with Daredevil completing five panels in :59.64 on Sunday and Carpe Diem going that same distance in :59.42 Saturday. "They're both training exceptionally well," Pletcher said. "Carpe Diem's breeze yesterday was very impressive. He came out of it well, and we're planning to go in the [GII] Tampa Bay

Derby [Mar. 7] with him. I thought Daredevil worked extremely well this morning also. We're planning to go in the [GII] Swale [S. Feb. 28] with him."

Starlight Racing's **Itsaknockout** (Lemon Drop Kid), who was successful in his unveiling Dec. 7 and annexed an optional claimer Jan. 4, will be aiming for the GI Fountain of Youth S. Feb. 21. He worked five furlongs in 1:00.22 Sunday. "I thought he breezed really well this morning," Pletcher said of Itsaknockout. "He's on schedule for the Fountain of Youth."

J S Bach (Tale of the Cat), an 8 1/2-length maiden winner Dec. 19, covered five panels in 1:00.94. "I was very happy with him this morning. He's either going to go to the [GIII] Southwest [S. at Oaklawn Feb. 16] or the [GII] Risen Star [S. at the Fair Grounds Feb. 21]." **Khozan** (Distorted Humor), who was tabbed a ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ in his debut Jan. 24, worked four furlongs in :49 flat.

"I think he's on a similar program to what Constitution (Tapit) was on last year," the conditioner explained. "He broke his maiden, won an allowance, and then won the Florida Derby. But we have a lot of options."

GI Hopeful S. victor **Competitive Edge** (Super Saver) breezed five furlongs in 1:00.22. "Competitive Edge is doing well," Pletcher offered. "We haven't decided on a first start [of 2015] yet."

With 32 sophomores nominated to the Triple Crown, Pletcher acknowledged that there will be races on the Derby trail when stablemates will face each other. "There's going to be certain cases where we're going to have to run more than one [horse in a prep]," he explained. "A lot of it is about timing. A good thing about this time of year is that there are preps pretty much every weekend, either here or in Tampa or Oaklawn or Louisiana, so we have some options to move them around. Then it's just about timing--when they ran last and what kind of schedule they're on."

PLETCHER VICTORS EXIT RACES IN FINE FORM

The Todd Pletcher stable had a successful weekend in both Florida and New York, with **Constitution** (Tapit) capturing the GI Donn H., **Mshawish** (Medaglia d'Oro) taking the GI Gulfstream Park Turf H., **Sandiva** (Footstepsinthesand {GB}) annexing the GIII Suwannee River S., and **Far From Over** (Blame) pulling a minor upset in Aqueduct's GIII Withers S.

"We were hopeful that we could have a big day," Pletcher said. "We felt like we had some horses that were training very well. In Mshawish and Sandiva's case, they were both coming off stakes wins at the meet, and Constitution, we knew he liked Gulfstream from last year. So we were optimistic, but at the same time, we knew they were difficult races to win." **cont. p4**

As for Far From Over, the conditioner noted that, “He came back well. Thankfully, he didn’t grab anything when he stumbled leaving the gate. I thought it was a pretty impressive effort to do that in his second start. I would say the most likely scenario is that he’ll stay in New York and run in the [GIII] Gotham [S. Mar. 7].”

Although Pletcher has not finalized his future plans for the rest of his runners, he did say that the G1 Dubai World Cup Mar. 28 is a possibility for WinStar and Twin Creeks Racing’s Constitution. “I talked to Elliott [Walden of WinStar] a little bit [Sunday] morning about Constitution,” Pletcher explained. “We’ve kicked around the idea of Dubai, but we haven’t committed to it yet. It’s certainly one of the options.”

VALID IN FINE FETTLE AFTER HOOPER WIN

Valid (Medaglia d’Oro) exited his GIII Fred Hooper S. victory in excellent conditioner, according to trainer Marcus Vitali. **Lochte** (Medaglia d’Oro) also returned from his seventh-place effort in the GI Gulfstream Park Turf H. well, Vitalia noted. “They came out of the races excellent,” Vitali said. “When you show up and run like they did, the next day, of course, they’re a little tired. I mean, I’m tired, never mind them.”

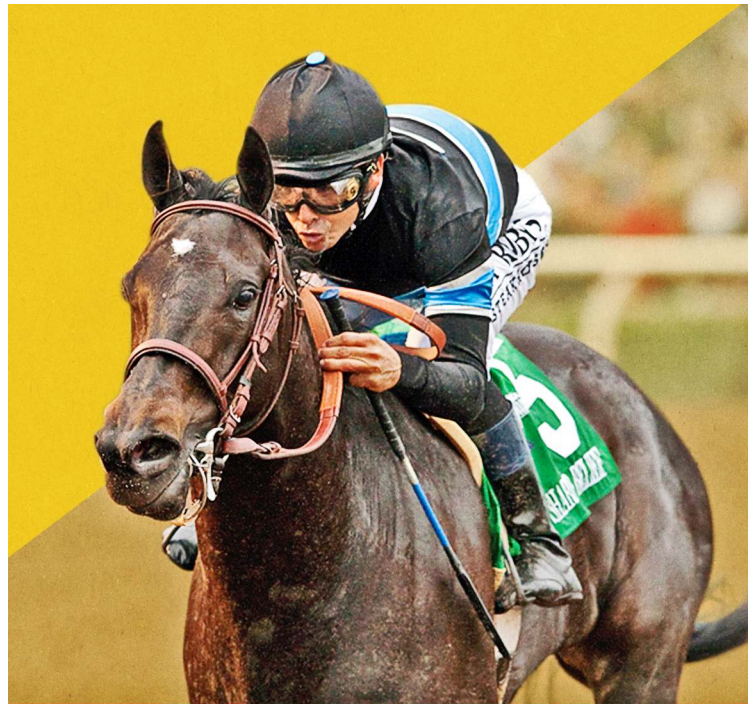
As for Valid’s race, Vitali said, “It was phenomenal. He’s a nice horse. The team did a great job with him. I don’t have anything picked out for him yet, but in a couple days I’ll start thinking about it. He ran huge.”

“I was a little disappointed we didn’t get any running room with Lochte,” Vitali continued. “It looked like we were in good position, just nothing opened up. We were in the box and, unfortunately in turf racing, that’s the way it goes. You’ve either got no horse or a lot of horse and nowhere to go. In our case it was a lot of horse with nowhere to go.”

BHA TO IMPLEMENT HAIR TESTING

The British Horseracing Authority will implement hair testing to screen for the retrospective administration of anabolic steroids as part of its enhanced zero-tolerance anabolic steroids policy, according to *Racing Post*.

Hair samples can be used to detect if a horse has received anabolic steroids at any point in its life. Under the BHA's new policy, which will go into effect Mar. 2, a racehorse may not be administered anabolic steroids at any point from birth to retirement from racing. Those found to have received anabolic steroids will be banned from racing for 14 months. All horses imported into Britain will be required to be accompanied by a negative anabolic steroids sample. In the U.S., yearlings are allowed to receive exogenous anabolic steroids until 45 days prior to sales.

"Hair sampling on its own could be used to bring charges in certain circumstances," BHA media manager Robin Mounsey told *Racing Post*. "Those circumstances would include the ability to prove in whose care the horse was in at the time of the administration, and that it was against the rules of racing to administer the substances in question."

Dr. Scott Stanley from UC Davis addressed the topic of hair samples for anti-doping at last week's Consignors and Commercial Breeders' Association educational seminar in Lexington, Kentucky. **cont. p8**

"I've spoken to sale companies to try to get ahead of this," said Stanley. "The vast majority of horses would be tested before going overseas to give the buyer or seller confidence, but we have yet to determine the most appropriate way to go."

He added, "The BHA responded with a very strong statement saying they will not have anabolic steroids in British horse racing," said Stanley. "Drugs remain in the hair almost permanently. The blood supply is what delivers the drug into the hair at the follicle as it is growing. We can also determine if it is multiple or singular administration."

Rouge Buck, a daughter of Eclipse champion older mare and six-time Group 1 winner Ginger Punch, extended her unbeaten record to three here en route to the G1 Oka Sho (Japanese 1000 Guineas) Apr. 12. A debut winner at Niigata last September, Rouge Buck followed up with a 2 1/2-length score in allowance company at Tokyo Nov. 9. Away sharply, the dark bay dropped back to travel in third on the rail, about four lengths off the pace. Tipping three-wide off the turn, Rouge Buck hit the lead in midstretch under mostly hand urging and won geared down. Ginger Punch was purchased by Katsumi Yoshida for \$1.6 million in foal to Bernardini at Fasig-Tipton November in 2009, and Rouge Buck is her third foal. While that resulting foal was unplaced in Japan, Ginger Punch also has a winning 4-year-old by Zenno Rob Roy (Jpn).

CASSE STRIKES FOR FASIG TOPPER

The opening session of the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky Winter Mixed Sale in Lexington got off to a slow start, posting declines when it came to both gross and average.

In total, 131 horses sold for \$3,968,400, an average of \$30,293 and a median of \$17,000. The RNA rate, from 33 horses not sold, was 20.1%.

Compared to last year, gross declined 11.3% and the average decreased 17.4%. The median, however, was up 6.3%. In 2014, the first day of the sale saw 122 horses sell for \$4,475,100, good for an average of \$36,681 and a median of \$16,000. The RNA rate was 20.3%.

Multiple graded stakes winner **Gamay Noir** (Harlan's Holiday) topped the session on Justin Casse's bid of \$375,000. This bested the opening session topper in 2014, when Devious Intent sold to Barbara Banke's Stonestreet Stable for \$350,000.

Another notable seller was stakes winner **Irish Presence** (Midnight Lute), who realized \$310,000. Forging Oaks Farm purchased the 5-year-old Midnight Lute mare, who is also graded stakes-placed, from Darby Dan Farm, agent.

Mares proved more popular than short yearlings yesterday, as only one youngster hit the six-figure mark. A bay Into Mischief filly ([hip 192](#)) born on Feb. 3 of last year went for \$180,000 at the very end of the night. Bill and Corinne Heiligbrodt bought the filly from Blake-Albina Thoroughbred Services, agent.

Out of the stakes-placed Carson City mare Lanai City, she hails from the same family as Breeders' Cup winners New Year's Day (Street Cry {Ire}) and Shared Account (Pleasantly Perfect).

The second-highest yearling of the session was a Jersey Town colt ([hip 74](#)), who brought \$97,000 from Machmer Hall. Consigned by Denali Stud, agent, the colt is out of the Bertrando mare Encouragement and comes from the same female family as champion Shared Belief (Candy Ride {Arg}).

Yesterday an even 200 horses were cataloged. The two-day sale concludes its run today with a much larger session, which runs from hips 201-616. For catalog, results and outs, or to watch the sale live, visit www.fasigtipton.com.

Star of the Show

Gamay Noir was the talking horse on the sale grounds yesterday, and she did not disappoint. The 5-year-old Harlan's Holiday mare topped the session when she sold to Justin Casse for \$375,000.

"I thought she might bring a touch more than that because she was the star of the show here," said Casse. "At the end of the day we are happy with the price point."

Proving what a difference a year can make, Gamay Noir ([hip 112](#)) entered the ring as a multiple graded stakes winner with earnings of \$346,866.

In 2014, Gamay Noir won the Rampart S. and Obeah S., which are both Grade III contests, after being claimed for \$100,000 by trainer Marty Wolfson.

“Myron Miller and the Farnsworth crew do an excellent job of finding mares like this and developing them,” said Casse. “This is just another example because it seems like, year in and year out, we are here trying to buy them.”

Not surprisingly, another thing going for Gamay Noir was her pedigree. The bay mare is by successful sire Harlan’s Holiday, who died in 2013, and she hails from a female family that has produced Grade I winners Al Mamoon, La Gueriere and Icon Project, among others.

“What was there not to like?” asked Casse of his purchase, who was consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency, agent. “Obviously there are no more Harlan’s Holidays coming. She is a very typical Harlan’s Holiday, a pretty version of the sire and out of an Unbridled mare. She comes from a deep family.”

Casse bought Gamay Noir on behalf of a new partnership. Although he declined to name those involved, Casse did say that the partnership was domestic. Gamay Noir was offered as a racing or broodmare prospect, but plans call for her to be retired.

“We will probably end up breeding her as soon as possible,” said Casse. “We will see [to which stallion], but I will have to discuss that with some of the partners.”

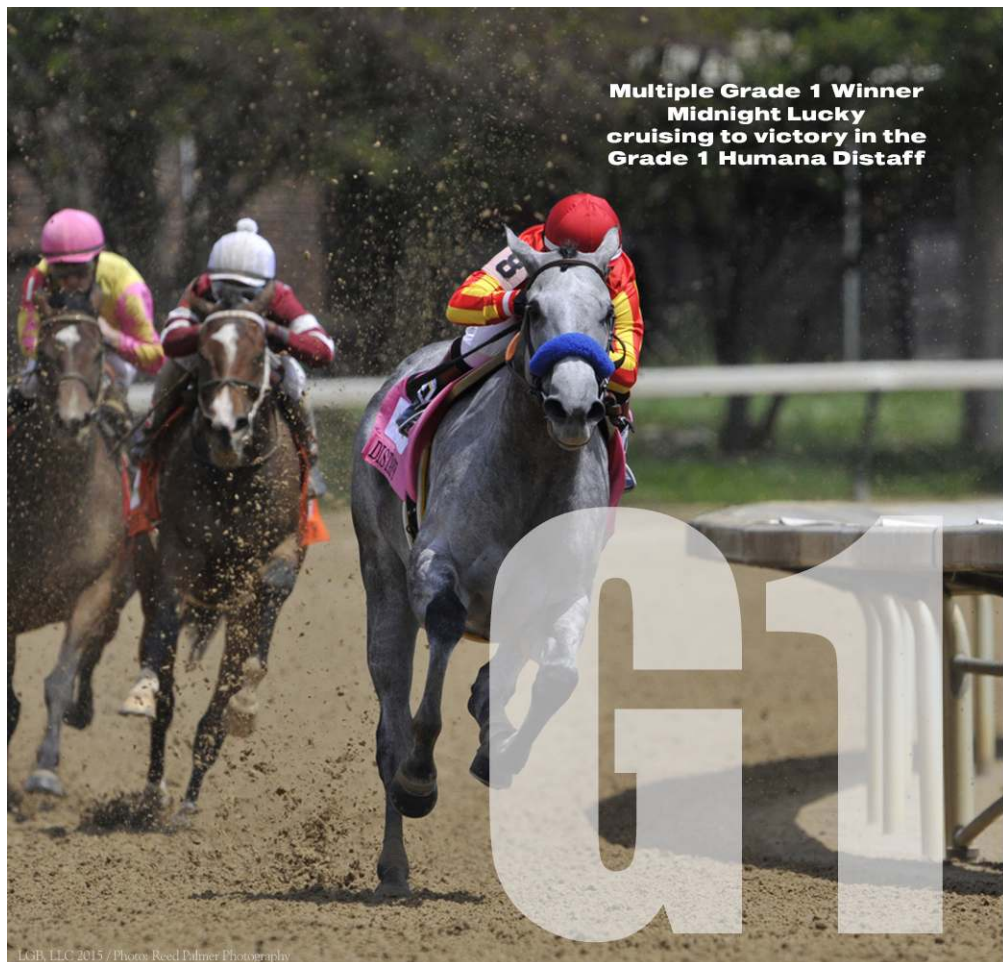
One and Done

Tom's on vacation, but he wanted her, so that's the one we came to get," said Calvin Crain, who signed the ticket. "That's the only one we wanted. It was a little bit more than we wanted to pay, but we knew some people wanted her. For a good horse, you have to pay more. That is the way it is."

On the track, Clearbrook won \$171,235 and hit the board in the Gill Orchid S. in 2014. Out of the Danzig mare Coherent, she is also a half-sister to English stakes winner Doc Hay (Elusive Quality). Taylor Made Sales Agency consigned the 5-year-old mare, and while Clearbrook was offered as a racing or broodmare prospect, motherhood appears to be in her near future.

"Tom is going to breed her here locally," said Crain. "She will stay right here. She isn't going anywhere. Smart Strike, you can never go wrong with a Smart Strike. You can breed her to what you want, and she is from a good family. She has a lot of upside."

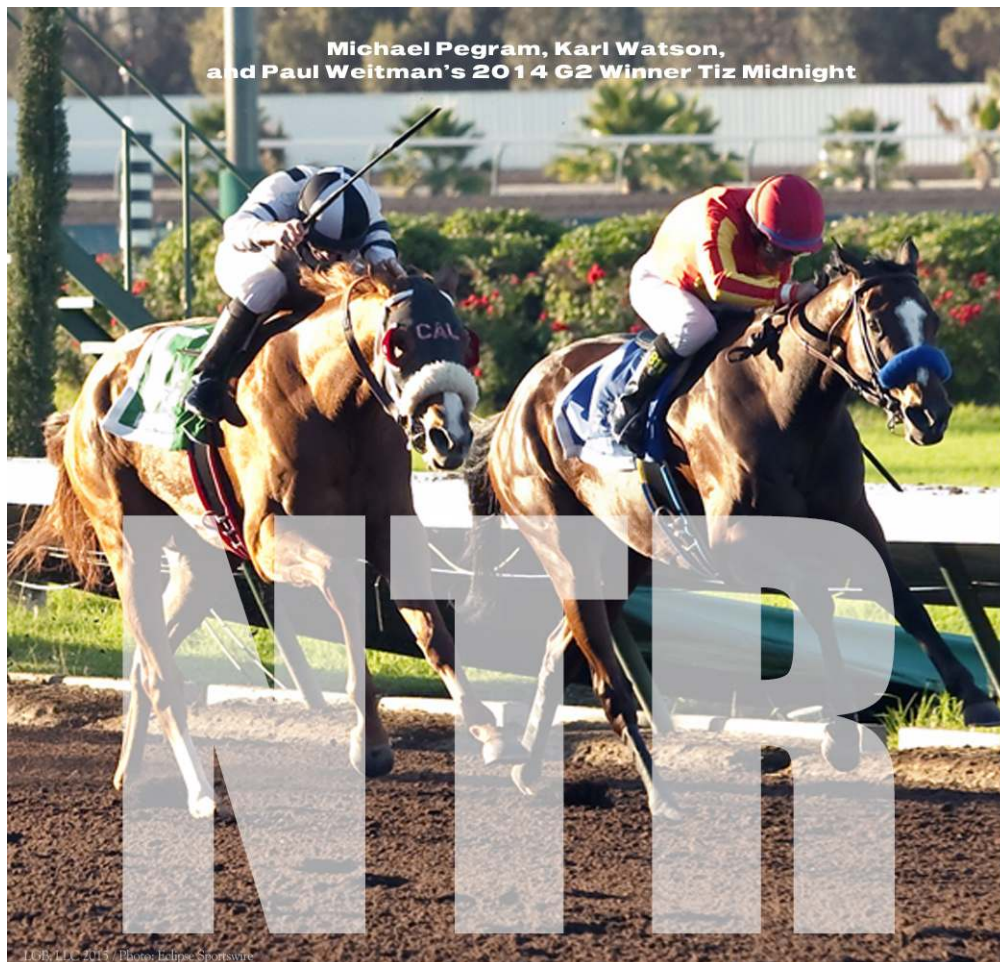

"When they are that wide turning for home, you start thinking, 'OK, we'll be happy with third or fourth,'" Bradley said of Delightful Joy's 3 1/2-length tally. "So for her to go on and win like that was really impressive."

Bradley purchased Delightful Joy for \$105,000 at last year's OBS April sale after the filly had worked a quarter in :21.3.

"We all know that anything by Tapit has a license to be a runner," Bradley said of his initial attraction to the filly.

"She was a little backward at OBS," he continued. "She worked well, but not super fast, and then she galloped out really well and really used herself well. And when you are working on a budget, those are the kind that you have to look for--not that she didn't work fast, but she didn't have that blazing fast work."

Delightful Joy was in training at Saratoga last summer before trainer Chad Brown decided to call time out.

"She was with Chad over the summer at Saratoga and he called me up and said we should just kick her out for a few months," Bradley explained. "She was just a little immature and we decided to give her some time. Then about two weeks ago after she worked, he called me and said, 'I think she's ready.' Chad can be prone to the understatement."

Bradley said patience has been the key to success so far with Delightful Joy and he expects to keep to that game plan going forward.

"We'll just regroup from here, see how she comes out of the race and let Chad decide what is next," he said. "We've gotten this far by letting the horse tell us what she wants to do. But I think she proved she is a very promising two-turn horse, to quicken up the way she did on a dirt track."

Asked if Delightful Joy could reach the heights of Dayatthespa, Bradley said, "It's almost too much to hope for that she could be another Dayatthespa. But Dayatthespa won impressively first time out, too, so you never know. Hope springs eternal."

Bradley Thoroughbreds has also enjoyed success with its pinhooking ventures in recent years and the bloodstock agent said he has high hopes as the juvenile sales season looms. The group's 2014 graduates include GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf winner Lady Eli (Divine Park) and Saturday's GIII Robert B. Lewis S. runner-up Firing Line (Line of David).

"We had a very good year last year and it's going to be hard to duplicate," Bradley said. "But we have some horses we're really excited about. We have a colt by Uncle Mo out of Alienated (Gone West) ([hip 106](#)) who will sell at Barretts and a Bernardini filly at OBS March ([hip 522](#)) who has all the tools. So we have a lot to look forward to." -*Jessica Martini*

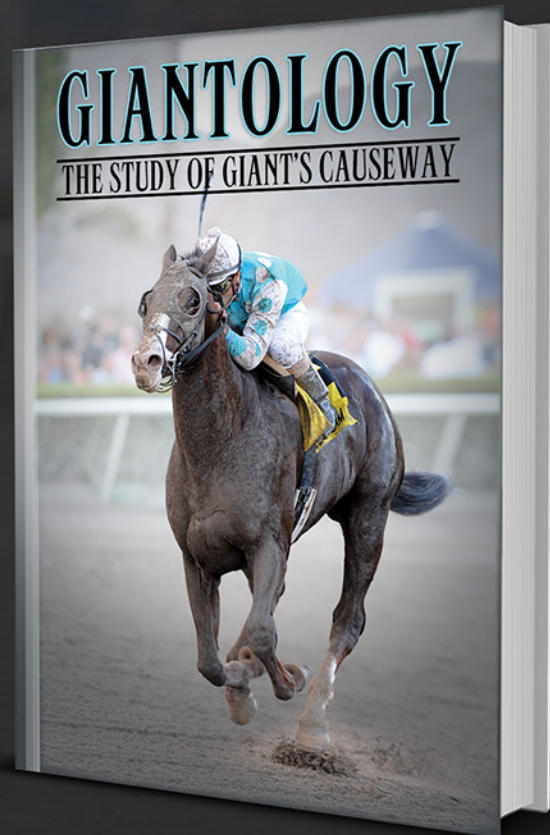

EquiLottery CEO to Testify on Behalf of Horse Racing Lottery Bill in Frankfort:

EquiLottery CEO and inventor of the patented lottery game with the same name, Brad Cummings will be testifying on behalf of SB74 in Frankfort, Kentucky on Tuesday, Feb. 10, according to a statement. The bill, which supports a lottery game like EquiLottery based on the outcome of live horse racing, will be heard in front of the Senate Licensing, Occupations and Administrative Regulations Committee at 10 a.m. in Room 169 of the Capitol Annex and is open to the general public.

"We have been overwhelmed by the support we've received from the Kentucky racing industry and our political support in Frankfort for EquiLottery continues to build momentum," said Cummings. "I am honored once again to go in front of this esteemed committee to deliver our vision for a product that can increase revenues for education and horse racing while greatly enhancing the popularity and exposure of a sport at the core of Kentucky's DNA."

Bill sponsor Sen. Julie Raque Adams (R-Louisville) will also testify on behalf of the bill, along with several leaders from Kentucky's signature horse industry. Additionally, a grassroots effort to raise the profile of SB74 has taken place, with over 12,000 emails sent to leaders in Frankfort in support of the bill since Feb. 3. EquiLottery was previously presented in front of a joint House and Senate Licensing and Occupations committee meeting last September at the historic Keeneland Race Course.

"Our efforts over the last seven months have proven there is great interest in EquiLottery across the country by racing and lottery interests alike," continued Cummings. "However, many have indicated they are looking to Kentucky to lead the way due to its status as the horse racing capitol of the world. If SB74 passes, we see our product being spread across the country and, in states where there is not year-round racing, an opportunity for EquiLottery to showcase Kentucky racing beyond the nearly 3,000 in state lottery terminals."

Eugenio Colombo Joins WHOA:

Bloodstock agent Eugenio Colombo has added his voice to those supporting federal legislation to prohibit the use of performance-enhancing drugs in horse racing through the Water Hay Oats Alliance. In a statement from WHOA, Colombo said, "Yes, we MUST run on zero medication for three simple reasons: 1) to protect the punters; 2) to regain respect from our society; and 3) prove that we are not animal abusers, but sportsmen who love horses.

Using Lasix and Bute, like any doping, is unethical and unintelligent. If these drugs give an advantage, since all horses are running on them, all it really does is just raise the training/vet costs to the owner.

Also, when running on zero medication, we will know the true racing ability of the horse and their real (not inflated) financial value.

Another point is to put back more emphasis on stamina in the breed. The "fast food" culture translates into cheap speed and has diminished the quality of the breed. In actuality, we breed 7-8 furlong horses and when we ask them to run 1 1/4 mile, they crash.

Any shortcut taken simply lowers the quality of the product. We are shooting ourselves in the foot...badly. I am very committed to supporting WHOA in its efforts to protect the quality and integrity of our industry."

STRONG START TO INGLIS CLASSIC

The Inglis Classic Yearling Sale Summer Book got off to a strong start in Sydney yesterday, with the average

and median both rising by more than 30%. A total of 136 horses changed hands from 162 offered for a buyback rate of 16%, which was up slightly more than three points from the corresponding session last year. The average jumped 32.6% to A\$45,169, while the

median was up 35.7% to A\$38,000. The gross was down A\$496,000 to A\$6,143,000, but with 63 fewer offered on the day.

“The team here at Inglis, in cooperation with our vendors, have set about lifting Classic to a new level,” said Inglis managing director Mark Webster. “With support from a larger and more diverse buying bench it was clear to everyone here today that we are well on our way to achieving that goal.”

Webster added, “The new February time slot has also proven popular with vendors and buyers. I am delighted for the average and median to be up by more than 30% on last year, but even happier to achieve a clearance rate through the ring of 84%--we know this will only improve further as the sale continues.”

The top price of the day, A\$310,000, was well clear of last year's A\$105,000 sale-topper, and was the highest price at the sale since 2007. That sum was paid by James Harron Bloodstock and Snowden Racing for [Lot 31](#), a New Zealand-bred colt by Per Incanto (Street Cry {Ire}) from Sledmere Stud. Per Incanto was a Group 3 winner and champion sprinter in Italy. He made two starts in the U.S. for Shadwell Stable and trainer Kieran McLaughlin, winning an optional claimer off an 11-month layoff prior to finishing up the track in eighth in the GIII Westchester S. Per Incanto is represented by his first Southern Hemisphere 2-year-olds this season and has had five winners. Lot 31 is out of Da Vinci Code (NZ) (Danasinga {Aus}), an unraced half-sister to Group 3 winner Tootsie (NZ) (Pins {Aus}).

Arrowfield's Smart Missile (Aus) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}) has been one of the most highly sought-after first-crop yearling sires so far at this year's Australian yearling sales, and a colt by that G2 Todman S. victor registered the second-highest price of the day yesterday when fetching A\$200,000 from Lyndhurst Farm. Consigned by Bell River Thoroughbreds, [Lot 41](#) is out of Dashie Diva (Aus) (Dash For Cash {Aus}), who has produced one winners from two to race. Smart Missile also sired the highest-priced filly of the day, [lot 123](#), who sold to trainer Mike Breslin for A\$110,000. The daughter of Hansuyen (NZ) (Zabeel {NZ}) is a half to Group 2 winner Champagne Harmony (Aus) (Choisir {Aus}). Hansuyen is a full-sister to Group 1 winners St Reims (NZ) and Champagne (NZ).

Another young sire son of Fastnet Rock, Hinchinbrook (Aus), currently sits second on the Australian first-crop sire table only to the deceased Beneteau (Aus) (Redoute's Choice {Aus}), and that Yarraman Park resident was also represented by a six-figure yearling yesterday in the form of [Lot 170](#). The bay colt from Fairview Park Stud was hammered down to Aquanita Racing for A\$115,000. He is out of Kianben (Aus) (Jan Murray), who has produced three winners from five to race and is a full-sister to the stakes winner Nan Tien (Aus).

A pair of yearlings brought A\$105,000 yesterday. The first through the ring was [lot 44](#), a colt by Magic Albert (Aus) purchased by Magus Equine. Bjorn Baker and Trainers Connections later went to that sum for [lot 160](#), a filly by Beneteau. *cont. p15*
