### MAFTOOL CARVES OUT GUINEAS SCORE

Godolphin's **Maftool** (Hard Spun) was the co-highest rated horse going into yesterday's G3 UAE 2000 Guineas on the basis of a victory in September's G3 Somerville Tattersall S. at Newmarket, but a bad break and eventual third in the Guineas trial Jan. 15 left him relegated to second choice on the U.S. morning line

behind that event's eye-catching five-length victor **Mubtaahij (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire}). Breaking much more satisfactorily yesterday fitted with a visor, Maftool and jockey Paul Hanagan settled about 1 1/2 lengths off the pace-setting **Burnt Sugar (Ire)** (Lope De Vega {Ire})

with Mubtaahij directly to their inside. Maftool and Mubtaahij swallowed up the tiring **Padlock (Ire)** (Key of Luck) in a matter of strides coming off the turn and disposed of Burnt Sugar just as quickly, leaving the two favorites to battle it out at the top of the lane. Maftool got his head firmly in front in midstretch but the result was never a foregone conclusion, with Mubtaahij battling gamely right down to the wire, where he missed by a head. It was 10 3/4 lengths back to Mubtaahij's stablemate and Guineas trial second **Ajwad (Arg)** (Not For Sale {Arg}) in third. **Cont. p9**

### FUTURE CHAMPIONS FESTIVAL FOR NEWMARKET

A new two-day Dubai Future Champions Festival, worth more than £2 million, has been approved by the British Horseracing Authority for 2015 and onward and will take place at the Rowley Mile in Newmarket Oct. 9 and 10. Friday's card will feature the £500,000 G1 Dubai Fillies' Mile for juvenile fillies (up from £200,000 last year), while Saturday's card will host the G1 Dubai Dewhurst S. for the same pot (an increase of £100,000 from last year), as well as the £250,000 Betfred Cesarewitch H. With the prize money boosts, the Dewhurst and Fillies' Mile will be the most valuable juvenile races in Europe. The support of Dubai has enabled Jockey Club Racecourses to boost the prize money for the festival by more than £500,000. Yesterday's unveiling follows the news several weeks ago that the G1 Middle Park S.--also for juveniles and run on the same card as the Dewhurst the last few years--would be moved to late September. **Cont. p6**

**HARMONIC HOPES TO HIT A HIGH NOTE**

Originally purchased as a pinhooking prospect, **Harmonic** (Congrats) looks to validate his owners' decision to race him themselves in Saturday's GIII El Camino Real Derby at Golden Gate.

Consigned by John Phillips' Darby Dan Farm on behalf of his breeder Mike Abraham at the 2013 Keeneland January sale, Harmonic was purchased by Darby Dan on behalf of a partnership for \$87,000 with the intention of reselling him at Keeneland September. However, when the colt RNA'd for \$70,000 at the September sale, the partnership, which includes Phillips, Darby Dan General Manager Robert Hammond, Rick Awtrey and Chad Schumer, decided to keep him and point him for the races.

"He's just a big, strong horse," Hammond said of Harmonic's appeal. "We are also always looking for future stallion prospects. That's the idea if we keep a colt."

The big colt took time to develop, but displayed talent against some tough company while doing so. After a wide trip and awkward start, the bay finished fifth on debut sprinting over the Del Mar synthetic July 26 in a test that included GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile upsetter Texas Red (Afleet Alex) and impressive allowance winner Prospect Park (Tapit).

Fourth in a one-mile Del Mar test won by Texas Red next out Aug. 20, Harmonic was running well before he clipped heels and fell in a one-mile event on the dirt at Santa Anita Oct. 4. That race was won by ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ One Lucky Dane (Lookin at Lucky) and Prospect Park finished second. Switched to the turf next out at Del Mar Nov. 7, the Jerry Hollendorfer pupil completed the exacta behind Rock Shandy (Lemon Drop Kid), who was most recently third in last Saturday's GIII Robert B. Lewis S. at Santa Anita.

Given a brief freshening, the bay resurfaced in a 1 1/8-mile test over the Golden Gate synthetic Jan. 16, the same distance as the El Camino Real Derby, where he broke from the eight hole as the 2-5 chalk. Trailing the field in the three path through glacial early splits of :24.56 and :51.48, Harmonic circled the field five wide rounding the far turn and charged clear to score comfortably with very little encouragement from Hall of Famer Russell Baze. **Cont. p4**

“He’s a big horse, so I think it took a while to get it all together,” Hammond said. “His first few races were won by Texas Red, Rock Shandy, who ran well in the [Robert B. Lewis] last week, and One Lucky Dane. Those were some tough races and he ran well. We just switched him over [to Golden Gate] to get some confidence and a win and to go 1 1/8 miles.”

The 46-year-old native of England added, “We were pleased [with his win]. We always knew he was good. We just kept getting bad draws and running against some big horses. We knew he would do something eventually and now he has, but you never know how far he will go.”

Harmonic, who was produced by a daughter of champion turf mare Wandesta (GB) (Nashwan), is one of just four horses in the race with a prep over this surface--with two of the other three being his stablemates Cross the Line (Line of David) and Stand and Salute (Saint Anddan)--and is the only one of those with a win over this distance.

“The win over this surface and distance is nice, but we are an outsider,” Hammond remarked. “Conquest Typhoon (Stormy Atlantic) is in there and he was fourth in the [GI] Breeders’ Cup [Juvenile Turf]. I think we are 20-1 [on the morning line] and that is probably about right.”

Harmonic is one of just two horses owned by Hammond, who previously served as WinStar’s Stallion Director. He is part of this same partnership on another Hollendorfer-trained sophomore named Steel (Mineshaft), who most recently finished fifth behind Cross the Line in the California Derby here Jan. 17.

When asked how he felt about his chances of collecting his first graded stakes win with Harmonic Saturday, Hammond chuckled and replied, “About 20-1.”

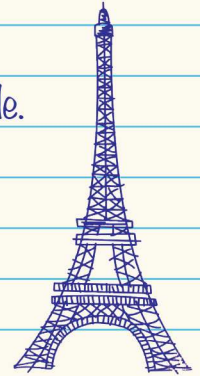

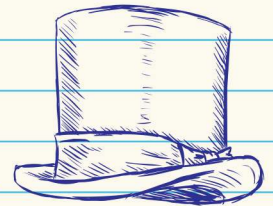

### BLINKERS FOR FROSTED IN FOY

Godolphin's **Frosted** (Tapit) will add blinkers for Gulfstream's GII Besilu Stables Fountain of Youth S. Feb. 21, according to trainer Kiaran McLaughlin. Last seen finishing a distant second to expected Fountain of Youth entrant Upstart (Flatter) in the GII Lambholm South Holy Bull S. Jan. 24, the homebred fired a four-furlong bullet in :47.55 at Palm Meadows Feb. 8. "We put some blinkers on him to work last week and he worked very well," McLaughlin said. "We're going to work him back on Saturday or Sunday, maybe with blinkers and maybe not, but he will run with them." Frosted broke his maiden by 5 1/4 lengths at the Big A Oct. 30, and finished a solid second after a wide journey in Aqueduct's GII Remsen S. Nov. 29. Irad Ortiz, Jr. has been aboard for the grey's last three starts. "Irada and I had talked about it two races ago," McLaughlin said of the decision to add the hood. "In the Holy Bull, when he hit him right-handed, he ducked over a path and a half or so. When he hit him left-handed he was OK. He just thought blinkers might not hurt us at all and might help him, so we worked him in them and he worked very well. We're going to go ahead and try them."

### MARAGH TO REUNITE WITH MAIN SEQUENCE

Rajiv Maragh will be reunited with champion older male and champion male turf horse **Main Sequence** (Aldebaran) for the GII Mac Diarmada S. at Gulfstream Feb. 21 after being forced to miss what would have been a winning ride in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf due to a broken arm. Maragh rode the Flaxman homebred in each of his three previous winning outings Stateside--the GI United Nations S. July 6, GI Sword Dancer Invitational S. Aug. 17 and GI Joe Hirsch Turf Classic S. Sept. 27. Hall of Famer John Velazquez was aboard for the Breeders' Cup. "Rajiv will ride him," confirmed trainer Graham Motion. "It's a hard thing for me, because Johnny rode him beautifully. He's one of the best out there, but Rajiv had a nice rapport with the horse. Motion added, "I don't think it's fair to penalize him because he was hurt and was unable to ride him in the Breeders' Cup. I'd be happy to have either one of them ride him. In fairness to Rajiv, it was his mount before he got hurt."

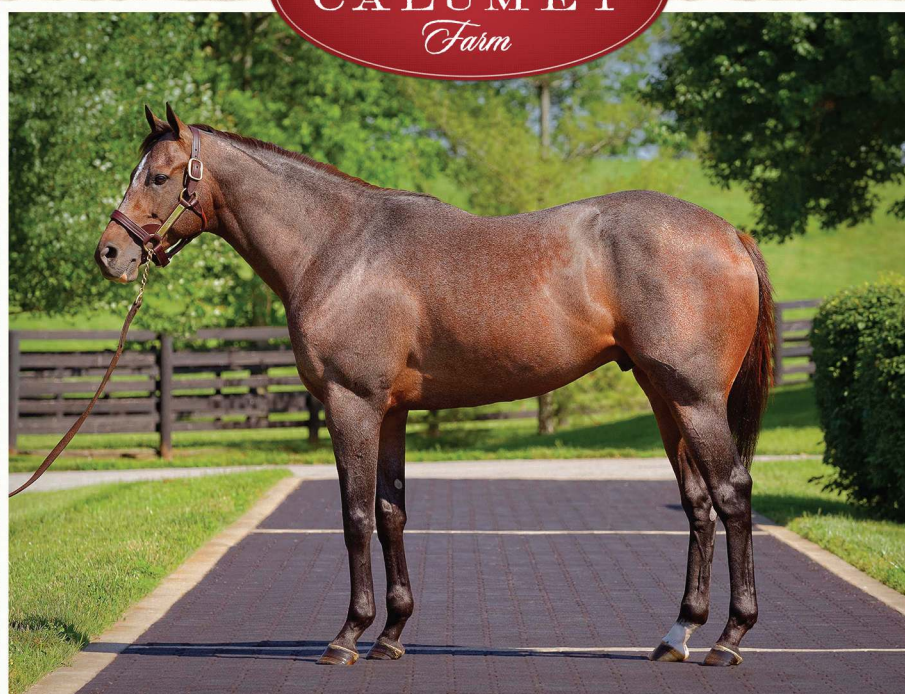

Yann's first professional experience took place at the Aga Khan's Sheshoon Stud and was followed by a spell at Kildangan Stud, where the young man familiarized himself with breaking-in and pre-training techniques.

Back in France after graduating from the Irish National Stud course, Poirier broke new ground when

creating his Haras du Chene as a facility dedicated to the early stages of a racehorse's career. Among the many horses he handled for a broad variety of breeders, owners and trainers were the Group 1 winners Sahpresa (Sahm), Chichicastenango (Fr) and Spirit One (Fr). Poirier was also an indefatigable activist and volunteer. He founded and chaired the Association of Pre-Trainers, and had recently played a pivotal role in the takeover of Haras National du Lion d'Angers by an association of breeders.

Yann Poirier is survived by a very united family--his wife Anne-Marie, who obtained her training license last year, daughters Juliette and Charlotte, as well as his parents and three sisters and brothers, including Arnaud, the founder and head of industry website and filming company France Sire.

In lieu of flowers, the family will raise funds for the medical treatment of injured jockeys.

A \$260,000 Keeneland November weanling purchase by Shadwell, Maftool finished second at first asking at Epsom in July under the care of Saeed bin Suroor in the Godolphin blue. The bay went one better to break his maiden next out at Pontefract Aug. 6, and a month later finished second to Burnt Sugar in the G3 Sirenia S. at Kempton. Stepped up an additional furlong for the G3 Somerville Tattersall S. at Newmarket Sept. 25, Maftool earned his first stakes score by 2 1/2 lengths. He was fifth, beaten six lengths, by Belardo (Ire) (Lope De Vega {Ire}) in the G1 Dewhurst S. to close out his European campaign, and made his UAE and dirt debut with the hard-luck trial third.

“The start was always a worry,” said winning rider Paul Hanagan. “The visor has certainly helped him today and won well. It is just that stall issue you have to think about but hopefully he still improving and learning. I am not sure we have seen the best of him yet.”

Tamarkuz recorded a pair of victories over the all-weather in England in the Godolphin blue as a juvenile, and while his sophomore campaign was restricted to two starts in that country, one of those was a win in a Kempton conditions event on the all-weather. The chestnut made two starts at last year's carnival, finishing fifth in a seven-furlong handicap in January and failing to finish to the race after unseating his rider under similar conditions in March. Tamarkuz finished a close second in his dirt debut in handicap company here Jan. 8, and prepared for this stakes debut with a 4 1/2 length score over this distance Jan. 22. Dictating matters down the backstretch, Tamarkuz's chances were improved when his chief market rival, the U.S. import Romansh (Bernardini), stumbled leaving the chute and was taken out of the race by jockey Mickael Barzalona. Tamarkuz had an advantage of three-quarters of a length heading into the turn, but that margin quickly grew as the field turned into the straight and the chestnut ran home an unchallenged four length victor and brought up a Group 3-double for his sire on the card.

"He is not the most straightforward," said winning jockey Paul Hanagan. "However, he is smart, very smart. The ability is certainly there and hopefully we can focus that in the right direction. He was impressive last time, but this was a big step up. Hopefully he has more to offer."

Tamarkuz is out of an unraced half-sister to dual Grade I winner Stay Thirsty (Bernardini) and Grade III winner and Classic-placed Andromeda's Hero (Fusaichi Pegasus).

## SMITH TO FACE 20 COBALT CHARGES

Australian trainer Darren Smith, who has been stood down from racing by stewards since May, has been charged with 20 cobalt positives. The charges encompass raceday samples from 17 different runners from Apr. 29 to Dec. 4, 2014. One of those runners, the 3-year-old filly Nisroc (Aus), was also found to have cobalt in her system during an out-of-competition check at Smith's Newcastle stable in May. Nisroc was one of 11 winners that tested positive for cobalt under Smith's care during that time period, and that group also included the Listed Eskimo Prince

S. winner Testarhythm (Aus). Smith's case will be heard Feb. 24, according to *Racing and Sports*.

Cobalt, which occurs naturally in the system in minute amounts, has been linked to equine blood doping, although its effectiveness is widely speculated ([click here](#) for a TDN feature explaining the uses of cobalt).

Three prominent Victorian trainers--Peter Moody, Mark Kavanagh and Danny O'Brien--are under investigation for cobalt positives, but none have been charged.

The Orr is often a good opportunity for true sprinters to steal a Group 1 while the routers are being wound up, and one who could fit the former profile is **Star Rolling (Aus)** (Casino Prince {Aus}). The 5-year-old gelding won the G2 P B Lawrence S. over this track-and-trip first-up in the spring, and he races fresh again here from a good draw in four. Last year's Queensland Derby winner **Sonntag (Aus)** (Teofilo {Ire}) is one who is certainly working towards longer targets, having put in his career-best over 2400 meters, but the Henry Dwyer charge has won over as short as 1500 meters. The Hawkes team-trained **Entirely Platinum (NZ)** (Pentire {GB}) won first-up over this trip at Rosehill in the spring, and four of his six career scores have come over this distance. The sophomore **Petrology (Aus)** (Fastnet Rock {Aus}) has come to the fore in his last few outings, winning a listed race at Flemington over 1800 meters Nov. 6 followed by the G2 Sandown Guineas when wheeled back to a mile nine days later. He was most recently second in the G3 Manfred S. over 1300 meters at Sandown Jan. 26 behind **Java (Aus)** (Medaglia d'Oro), another who has shown continued improvement as of late. The gelding rides a four-race win streak, with a score over this trip at Sandown Jan. 7, and tries the highest level for the first time.

## GOFFS FEBRUARY DRAWS TO A CLOSE

The Goffs February Sale drew to a close with its mares and mixed bloodstock session yesterday and posted encouraging figures. A total of 180 horses changed hands yesterday for

€2,873,600 and a buyback rate of 18.1%, which was down substantially from last year's mark of 36.1%. While the average was down 18.6% to €15,964, it is important to consider that last year's session was boosted by the sale of Jim Bolger's Group 1 winner Night Visit (GB) (Sinndar {Ire}) for €975,000. The median is therefore a more accurate reflection of the health of trade: it was up 41.7% to €9,000.

Including Wednesday's short yearling session, 330 horses changed hands at Goffs this week for €5,350,500. The cumulative average was up a shade to €16,214, while the median jumped 39.2% to €9,750. The buyback rate was down to 19.3% from 31.7%.

Yesterday proved to be a great day for the Grassick family's Newtown Stud, which sold the top two lots. The sale topper was [lot 446](#), the 6-year-old Oasis Dream (GB) mare Dreaming of Rubies (GB) who was bought by BBA Ireland for €220,000. The winning mare is carrying her first foal by Dawn Approach (Ire)--whose first crop will be foaled this year--and is herself a half-sister to two stakes producers, including the dam of G2 Gimcrack S. and G2 Norfolk S. winner Approve (Ire) (Oasis Dream {GB}) and listed winner Cape of Approval (Ire) (Cape Cross {Ire}). Dreaming of Rubies is also a half to the stakes-placed Alo Pura (GB) (Anabaa). Her dam, Rubies From Burma (Forty Niner), is a half to the G1 Fillies' Mile and G1 Prix Marcel Boussac heroine Culture Vulture (Timeless Moment).

Earlier in the day, agent Mick Flanagan had gone to €130,000 to secure [lot 349](#), the 12-year-old In The Wings (GB) mare Fringe (GB). The chestnut has produced three winners, including the G3 Prix Daphnis victor Master Carpenter (Ire) (Mastercraftsman {Ire}), and she was sold in foal to Champs Elysees (GB). She is a sister to the stakes winner and producer Mount Elbrus (GB) (Barathea {Ire}), and her dam is a full-sister to Rafha (Kris {GB}), the dam of Group 1 winner and leading sire Invincible Spirit (Ire). It is also the family of Italian champion filly Nayarra (Ire) and G1 Pretty Polly S. victress Chinese White (Ire).

Flanagan told the TDN, "She was the best mare in the sale, and in foal to an exciting stallion. Hopefully the Champs Elysees turns out to be a nice type. The mare will more than likely head down to Australia. Invincible Spirit, sire of I Am Invincible, appears under the second dam, which is obviously a big plus."

The only other six-figure sum of the day was paid by Watson Bloodstock for [lot 269](#), the 3-year-old colt Arif (Ire) (Nayef) from the Aga Khan draft. Arif was second first-out for trainer Mick Halford at Dundalk Dec. 19, and broke his maiden at that venue Jan. 16 after the catalogue was published. He hails from the family of G1 Irish St Leger winner Alandi (Ire) and G1 Irish Derby victor Alamshar (Ire).

Goffs Chief Executive Henry Beeby said upon conclusion of the sale, "Goffs has enjoyed an excellent run in recent years and we are delighted to have started 2015 in the same manner. Our two-day February Sale recorded the only six-figure prices at the new year European breeding stock/mixed sales with four in total."

He added, "Yesterday's full day of foals/just turned yearlings is the clear European market leader for the category and returned a truly vibrant trade to pick up where the November Foal Sale left off. We returned significant increases in every sector with last year's top price being eclipsed three times with a high of €145,000, and the number passing the €50,000 mark more than quadrupling."

He continued, "Whilst today's sale lacked a standout of the caliber of Night Visit, who topped last year, there was no easing off and today's statistics also show improvement, allowing us to have enjoyed yet more growth over the whole sale to build on the 45% rise of 12 months ago."

**EBF DEADLINE APPROACHING**

The deadline to register 2-year-olds to the European Breeders Fund by a stallion not registered to the EBF is Feb. 15. "Owners or trainers looking to campaign a horse in Europe should check that it is EBF nominated, as over 80% of 2-year-old maiden races are confined to EBF eligibles," said the EBF's Kerry Murphy. "In addition, your horse will become eligible to compete for a pool of over €4 million available in added prize money. This nomination stage largely relates to horses by stallions standing in the U.S., Japan, etc." The fee is currently \$3,000 or equivalent, and goes up to \$6,000 after Feb. 15.

Tapeta in February, and the highlight of his three-race summer campaign in Britain was a third in the Listed Gala S. at Sandown in July. Tha'ir was 11th, beaten 43 lengths, when trying dirt for the first time in a handicap here Jan. 22, but he looked much more at home back on the lawn yesterday. Stalking the lead in the three path under James Doyle, Tha'ir put his head in front passing the quarter pole and eventually shook off a stubborn [Berling \(Ire\)](#) ([Montjeu {Ire}](#)) inside the final furlong before holding off a host of other fast finishers. Tha'ir is a half to [Flashing Colour \(Ger\)](#) ([Pivotal {GB}](#)), whose [Monsun \(Ger\)](#) colt [Fast Lightning \(Ger\)](#) topped last year's BBAG sale in Germany at €450,000. [VIDEO](#). ### RECORD PRICE AT TASMANIAN SALE

Yesterday's Magic Millions Tasmanian Yearling Sale saw a close relation to recent Tasmanian star The Cleaner (Aus) (Savoire Vivre {GB}) sell for a Tasmanian record price of A\$100,000. Offered by Armidale Stud, the colt is by Savoire Vivre, the sire of The Cleaner, and out of Private Nip (Aus) (El Moxie), a half-sister to that dual group winner. Rob Slade of the syndication company Slade Bloodstock prevailed for the bay over Adelaide trainer John Hyam.

"He looks a real tough horse like his three-quarter brother The Cleaner," Slade said. "He will head to the John McArdle stable, so he's in great hands. Hopefully we can come back to Tasmania with him and win a race like the Launceston Cup."

**Lot 44** is a half to listed winner Twenty Grand (Aus) (Weasel Clause {Aus}).

With the exception of the buyback rate, which was up four points to 16.8%, figures were up across the board for the sale. A total of 89 yearlings changed hands for A\$1,543,000, up from last year's gross of A\$1 million. The average was up 31.7% to a record A\$17,337.

Armidale Stud was the consignor of the top three lots, and the second of those was the second-to-last lot through the ring, **lot 120**, who made A\$70,000 from Scott Brown. The colt by first-crop yearling sire Zoffany (Ire) is out of the appropriately named Genuine Blonde (Aus) (Sandpit {Brz}), and he himself is a chestnut with a bright flaxen mane and tail.

Genuine Blonde herself won Tasmania's Listed One Thousand Guineas, and her first foal of five to race was the stakes-winning Radha Rani (Aus) (Delago Brom {Aus}). The colt experienced a timely update Monday when his half-brother Genuine Lad (Aus) (Ladoni {Aus}) finished second in the G3 Hobart Cup.

The top-priced filly of the day was **lot 106**, a daughter of Sebring (Aus) picked up by Victorian trainer Darren Weir for A\$60,000. The dark bay is the first foal out of the Danzero (Aus) mare Cunning Lass (Aus).


Magic Millions Managing Director Vin Cox said of the day's results, "Having a record top price and a record average speaks volumes for the Tasmanian Racing industry. To that end we'd like to thank Tasracing's Dr. Elliot Forbes and David Manshanden and their team. The relationship formed between Magic Millions and Tasracing has gone from strength to strength. As good as the result was, we think we can improve on it in the years to come."

Forbes added, "This is a huge boost of confidence in the local industry and the quality of the Tasmanian product."
