



FASIG, GULFSTREAM OFFER FL DERBY BONUS

Fasig-Tipton and Gulfstream Park will offer a \$1-million bonus to the winner of the 2016 GI Florida Derby should that horse be a graduate of the 2015 Fasig-Tipton Florida 2-Year-Olds in Training Sale, which will be held for the first time at Gulfstream Mar. 4.

"This bonus is a unique way to celebrate Gulfstream Park's partnership with Fasig-Tipton," said The Stronach Group's COO and Gulfstream President Tim Ritvo. "Gulfstream is known for its world-class racing and by the many Classic and Grade I champions produced by the Florida Derby, and Fasig-Tipton's March sale is the premier 2-year-old sale. We think this initiative will also be fun for fans as they follow the horses through the sales ring and throughout their racing careers."

Added Fasig-Tipton President Boyd Browning, "This bonus should create even more interest in the sale and the 2016 Triple Crown trail. It is another wonderful reason to buy a horse on Mar. 4 at Gulfstream Park."

Only horses offered for sale will be eligible for the bonus--horses withdrawn or scratched will not be eligible. Should a dead-heat occur between multiple F-T Florida sales graduates, the bonus will be divided equally between owners.

The under-tack show for the sale will be held Monday, Mar. 2, with selling taking place Wednesday in the Gulfstream walking ring starting at 4:00 p.m.

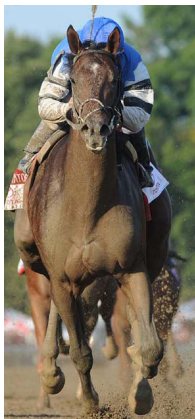

The China Horse Club has acquired a minority interest in Let's Go Racing and WinStar Farm's GI Champagne S. winner **Daredevil** (More Than Ready). The Todd Pletcher charge is scheduled to make his sophomore debut in Saturday's GI Fasig-Tipton Swale S.

"Let's Go Racing and WinStar are thrilled to have such an exciting new partner as China Horse Club, which recently approached us with an interest in buying into Daredevil," said Let's Go Racing's Bryan Sullivan. "China Horse Club's racing accomplishments at the highest level around the globe are nothing short of impressive."

The CHC has already had success at the Group 1 level with interests in Australia (GB) (Galileo {Ire}), who won the G1 English and Irish Derbys, as well as four-time Australian Group 1 winner Dissident (Aus) (Sebring {Aus}). SAFETY FIRST?

Godolphin's **Safety Check (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire}) failed to make an impact at last year's carnival racing exclusively on the Tapeta, but the switch back to the turf appears to have revived the 4-year-old, who looks for his third straight score in today's G2 Zabeel Mile. The Charlie Appleby trainee enjoyed two successes going seven furlongs on the grass in Britain in the summer, and was sixth in Newbury's Listed Dubai Duty Free Cup Sept. 19 to wrap up his European season. He was the cozy 2 3/4-length victor of a seven-furlong turf handicap here Jan. 8, and extended his record with a decisive four-length score in the G2 Al Fahidi Fort over the same track and trip Jan. 22. The 5-year-old gelding **Dark Emerald (Ire)** (Dark Angel {Ire}) has been progressive of late for trainer Brendan Powell, and hasn't finished out of the top two in his last six starts. He was second in a handicap over this course and distance to kick off his campaign Jan. 15, and recorded back-to-back handicap scores on the lawn Feb. 5 and Feb. 19. He tries black-type company for the first time in almost three years. **Cont. p8**

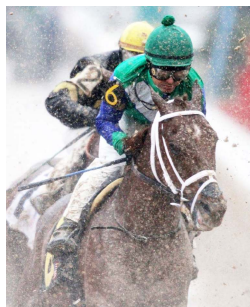

FAR RIGHT TO ARKANSAS DERBY

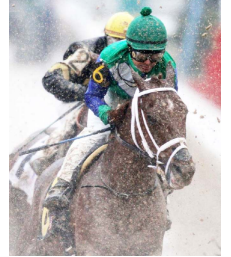
Far Right (Notional), winner of Sunday's GIII Southwest S., is expected to make his next start in the Apr. 11 GI Arkansas Derby. Connections have opted to skip the Mar. 14 GII Rebel S., the next race in Oaklawn's Triple Crown prep race series, to ensure they have a fresh horse for a possible tilt at the GI Kentucky Derby.

"We decided to try to not just get there [to the Kentucky Derby], but get there with enough healthy horse to do some damage," trainer Ron Moquett explained. "We're trying to get there with the most horse."

Southwest runner-up **The Truth or Else** (Yes It's True) is scheduled to make his next start in the Rebel, while Zayat Stable's third-place finisher **Mr. Z** (Scat Daddy) heads to Fair Grounds for the Mar. 28 GII Louisiana Derby. The Zayat family will be represented by juvenile champion **American Pharoah** (Pioneerof the Nile) in the Rebel.

Juvenile filly champion **Take Charge Brandi** (Giant's Causeway) is also possible for the Rebel.

"I guess we're going to have to look at it and see," owner Willis Horton said. "I haven't completely made up my mind yet, but I would like to run in the Rebel. That's exactly where I'd like to go." The other option for Take Charge Brandi would be the Mar. 7 GIII Honeybee S.

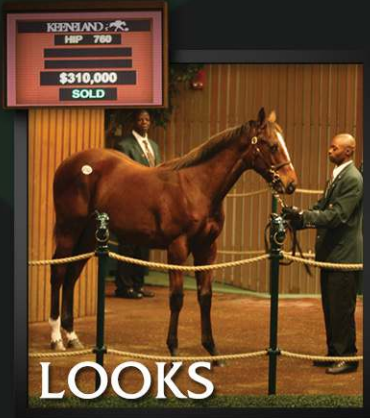

NERUD JOINS WHOA

Hall of Fame trainer, owner and Breeders' Cup founding director John Nerud has become the 1000th member of the Water Hay Oats Alliance (WHOA), which supports the passage of federal legislation to prohibit the use of

performance-enhancing drugs in horse racing. "I am 102 years old and have been training horses since 1937," Nerud said in a statement. "When they allowed Lasix they opened the door to a lot of trouble. I don't approve of its use because it gives racing a bad

image. The introduction of growth hormone and steroids has set the horse industry back many years because it has weakened the breed. The Breeders' Cup is in a lot of trouble. It was originated for only one reason, to market racing. They have lost their way."

HORSE PAC HITS \$3 MILLION DISBURSEMENT MILESTONE

Horse PAC, the bipartisan political action committee of the National Thoroughbred Racing Association (NTRA), has surpassed the \$3 million mark in total disbursements to federal political candidates and parties since its inception in 2002.

Horse PAC has supported more than 250 candidates and 75 Leadership PACs and is the horse racing industry's largest federal PAC. In the 2014 elections, Horse PAC-supported candidates won all 39 of their House contests and three of four Senate races for an impressive 97.6% success rate. The PAC disbursed \$452,500 in the last Congress.

"I want to thank the many individuals who contribute to Horse PAC for recognizing the important role it plays in supporting our industry's efforts in Washington, D.C.," said Horse PAC Chairman William S. Farish Jr. "I also want to express my gratitude to a small group of individuals who have contributed annually since the formation of Horse PAC."

Horse PAC supports federal political candidates who serve on Congressional committees that oversee matters pertaining to livestock and agriculture issues, Internet gaming, taxation, immigration and the Interstate Horseracing Act; are established Congressional leaders; understand horse racing's issues; have racetracks, breeding farms, training centers and ADWs in their states; are members of the Congressional Horse Caucus; or are emerging leaders meriting early support in their legislative careers.

RACING SCHOOL TURNING OUT CHAMPIONS

Newmarket has long been famed as a center of excellence for training racehorses, but perhaps less well heralded is the fact that it is also home to a center of excellence for training people.

The British Racing School, which sits on the outskirts of the town alongside the sprawling Godolphin empire, has been in existence for a little under a quarter of a century and during that time has been responsible for the likes of champion jockey Paul Hanagan and two bright new stars of the weighing-room, Andrea Atzeni and James Doyle. The riders are retained, respectively, by three of the biggest names in the game--Sheikh Hamdan Al Maktoum, Sheikh Fahad Al Thani and Sheikh Mohammed Al Maktoum--but producing top jockeys is just a small part of

what goes on at the 130-acre site which functions in the same way as the 80 or so racing yards in the town.

"We're just that far out of Newmarket that we're not on the beaten path, but we don't have to cross any roads and we have our own gallops here so we're really lucky. It's the most rewarding thing I've ever done by a mile," said Chief Executive Grant Harris, who succeeded Rory MacDonald in the role last summer. **Cont. p7**

“Rory was here at the start in 1983 and ran the Racing School for the last 22 years,” Harris added. “It’s the most fantastic place--Rory built this all up over that time, we’re a completely self-contained unit. I’ve inherited a wonderful job.”

As the father of two teenage daughters, Harris is well aware of the delicacies of dealing with young people on a daily basis. The trainees on the apprenticeship courses each year--which are conducted over either four, nine or 14 weeks depending on the level of ability and experience of the student--are aged between 16 and 18.

He said, “We run 14 courses throughout a year, for which we receive roughly 1,000 applications. We’d generally interview around 400 people and take 200. We’re paid by the industry to put 142 trainees into the work place each year and last year we provided 178.”

With running costs of around £3 million per annum, the school operates on a combination of government and industry funding and, as a charitable trust, also receives donations, with notable benefactors over the years including Paul Mellon, the Moller Foundation and the Childwick Trust, which was founded by the late owner-breeder Jim Joel.

Harris continued, “We have to get our trainees from young adulthood to adulthood and into the work place. I don’t want to sound pompous, but we do change lives here--we break the circle every now and then for people coming from pretty poor life chances. In 14 weeks we have to teach them everything.”

He added, “It’s great to see people flourish. We had four boys on the last course who couldn’t do a rising trot when they came here and 14 weeks later we’ve got them a job in a racing yard. But the journey only starts when they get to a trainer. We will teach them everything we can in the time we have them but they are under an apprenticeship for another 12 to 16 months once they are out in the work place.”

While the ability to ride a young Thoroughbred at speed is doubtless the key lesson learned at the British Racing School, it is far from being simply a glorified riding academy. Along with all manner of stable management--such as bandaging, plaiting and even sweeping yards--the apprentices, who live on site throughout the course, are given a fully-rounded training program that deals with issues such as fitness, finance and nutrition.

“For a lot of the trainees who come here it’s the first time they’ve ever been away from home so it’s an amazing thing to see them blossom when they are given a bit of responsibility,” said Harris. “We have a life skills program which is taught every evening and which deals with issues like cyber-bullying, drug and alcohol abuse, and sexual health.

“We’ve also instigated a cookery program over six weeks, which goes from the basics of cooking a baked potato and eggs through to a ‘bake-off’ in the last week where they have to produce a signature dish in pairs--we were surprised last week by two boys baking a lemon meringue pie,” he continued.

While the apprenticeships form the core of the British Racing School’s business, there’s also a wide range of courses taking place in Newmarket throughout the year.

Jockeys have to attend licence courses and all budding racehorse trainers are obliged to complete three modules at BRS

before applying for a licence. The school also offers training for racing secretaries, yard managers, point-to-point riders and pony-race jockeys-- including a Pony Racing Academy for children without access to their own ponies.

Furthermore, the expertise of the staff at BRS--which numbers almost 50 and includes jockey coaches who act as mentors to young riders--is regularly called upon by overseas racing bodies, with training having been provided at the school for apprentices from as far afield as Korea, Russia, Bahrain and Sweden.

Another factor which should not be overlooked is the role BRS plays as a home for retired racehorses. With so many courses running throughout the year, a squad of 66 Thoroughbreds and four ponies is required for training purposes, with all the horses having been gifted to the school by their owners. They range from the slow and untraced to superstar steeplechaser Our Vic,

who was a dual Grade 1 winner among his 13 victories. At 17, he is still brimming with enthusiasm and performs a vital role on the courses where conditional jump jockeys and point-to-pointers are required to face hurdles and fences.

The stableyard is expertly managed by Julie Lingham, an experienced former employee of Luca Cumani and Ed Dunlop, who takes as much pride in the horses under her care as she does in the trainees taught by her team. She said, “We have a

real range of horses here-- some are easier than others but when you think that they are sometimes being ridden by people with very little experience, it’s amazing the job they do.” **Cont. p8**

“Our oldest horse is 21 and he still loves his job,” she added. “We manage them very carefully and look at them as individuals. If we feel one horse could benefit from a quieter few weeks in the field or just trotting then we make sure that’s what he or she will get. We owe them so much really.”

Like so many government-funded operations, the British Racing School is to an extent at the mercy of whichever party happens to be in power. With a general election looming in May, there’s potential for changes to be implemented but with the current government’s focus on apprenticeship training for 16 to 18-year-olds, the school is in a strong position, especially given Prime Minister David Cameron’s positive comments regarding the racing industry on his recent visit to Newmarket. Harris said, “As a training establishment, we’re in the almost unique position of taking on trainees and guaranteeing them a job at the end of the course.”

With a shortage of racing staff throughout Europe becoming an ever-growing problem for trainers, Harris also feels a need to focus farther down the line. He added, “In my mind, there’s a lot of work to do with regard to the retention of staff. There’s no point in us just being a sausage machine pumping people into the industry if they are not staying in those jobs. It’s something we’re working on and the BHA is taking a good look at it too.”

“We’re constantly looking at ways in which we can improve the training and range of courses we offer here but it’s a process of evolution rather than revolution,” he said.

Outstrip (GB) (Exceed and Excel {Aus}) hasn’t won since taking the 2013 GI Breeders’ Cup Juvenile Turf, but he is nonetheless an interesting proposition. He came home last in the G1 2000 Guineas on seasonal debut last year, but then was third and fourth, beaten 3 1/4 lengths and three lengths, behind Kingman (GB) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) in the G1 St James’s Palace S. and G1 Sussex S. He was eighth in the G2 Joel S. to wrap up his British campaign Sept. 26, and was a well-beaten 11th when trying the dirt in the G2 Al Maktoum Challenge R1 Jan. 8. He should enjoy the return to his favored surface and trip. **Johann Strauss (GB)** (High Chaparral {Ire}), a recent purchase by Sheikh Mohammed bin Khalifa and partners from the Coolmore partners, flew late to be second in the Listed HH The President Cup at Abu Dhabi Feb. 15 off a nine-month layoff, and there is no reason to think he won’t improve with the seasoning. Formerly trained by Aidan O’Brien, Johann Strauss was regarded well enough to contest the G1 Racing Post Trophy as a maiden (he was second) and the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas eight days after breaking his maiden (he was fourth).

Godolphin’s **Local Time (GB)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) has made a seamless tradition from Group 3 winner on the turf in Britain to be unbeaten on the dirt at this year’s carnival, and she will be heavily backed to add to her black-type record in today’s G3 UAE Oaks. The Saeed bin Suroor charge suffered her lone defeat at first asking when fourth over the Lingfield all-weather in July, and after posting a pair of victories over the synthetic at Kempton she switched to the lawn to take the G3 Oh So Sharp S. at Newmarket Oct. 4. Local Time managed to nose out Ad Idem (SAf) (Jet Master {SAf}) in the seven furlong UAE 1000 Guineas Trial on seasonal--and dirt--debut Jan. 15, and the margin was a much more decisive 3 1/4 lengths when stepped up to a mile for the Listed UAE 1000 Guineas Feb. 5. **Cont. p9**



Second in the Guineas was Local Time's stablemate **Good Place** (Street Cry {Ire}), who has broken poorly in both her Meydan outings this term, the first resulting in a fourth-place finish in the trial. Good Place seeks her first win since a mile conditions race on the turf at Ascot in September. KING OF KINGS DEAD

King of Kings (Ire) (Sadler's Wells--Zummerudd {GB}, by Habitat), who provided trainer Aidan O'Brien with his first British Classic victory in the 1998 G1 2000 Guineas, has died at age 20 of heart failure in South Africa, according to *Racing Post*.

Raced by Sue Magnier, King of Kings was beaten just once in five juvenile outings, taking the Railway S., Tyros S. and G1 National S. at The Curragh. King of Kings won the Guineas in his first sophomore outing the following May, and was seen only once thereafter, when last of 15 in the G1 Epsom Derby.

King of Kings served at Coolmore's Irish and U.S. bases and later stood at Ashwell Stud in New Zealand before relocating to The Fort Stud in South Africa. King of Kings's progeny include New Zealand Horse of the Year King's Chapel (Aus) and Australian Group 1 winners Ike's Dream (Aus) and Reigning to Win (Aus), as well as the 2004 GII San Clemente winner Sweet Win.

Jill Fox, the owner of The Fort Stud, told *Racing Post* yesterday, "He passed away two nights ago and I was very privileged to have had a horse like him in my care. He was super intelligent and loved his work when covering mares. The main thing about him was his intelligence. He was the most lovely horse. He got some more mares in foal last year so we have a few more babies to come and he always produces horses with lovely minds."

CDI Reports 2014 Results:

Churchill Downs Inc. issued fourth-quarter and year-end results for 2014, reporting record fourth-quarter net revenues of \$168.3 million, a 4% increase over the fourth-quarter of 2013. Officials attributed the increase to the acquisition of Big Fish Games Dec. 16, 2014, offset by the loss of revenues from the cessation of pari-mutuel operations at Calder Race Course.

For the complete year, CDI produced record net revenues of \$812.9 million, a 4% increase over 2013. Company officials explained "revenues from the acquisitions of Oxford Casino and Big Fish Games coupled with a strong Kentucky Oaks and Derby week were partially offset by a decline in Racing Operations revenues from the cessation of pari-mutuel operations at Calder Race Course during the second half of the year and declines in revenues from certain other casino properties during the year."

"The company produced record net revenues and Adjusted EBITDA results for both the fourth-quarter and the full year of 2014," said CDI Chief Executive Officer Bill Carstanjen.

Carstanjen continued, "While we closed our acquisition of Big Fish Games in December, our record performance over the course of 2014 was largely driven by our racing, casino and TwinSpire.com businesses. We look forward in 2015 to continuing the momentum in our traditional businesses as well as the new contributions of Big Fish Games and its exceptional team."

Jerry Lambert Passes Away:

Jerry Lambert, among California's leading jockeys in the 1960s and '70s, died Monday. He was 74. Lambert was best known as the regular rider of Native Diver, with whom he won three consecutive renewals of the Hollywood Gold Cup from 1965 to 1967. "He was a great rider," said retired Hall of Fame jockey Donald Pierce. "I rode with him from the time he came to California in 1961 until I retired [early 1984]. Anytime he was in a race, you had to deal with him because he didn't make mistakes. He was very quiet, very low key and he'd come and beat you when you'd least expect it. He was a lot like Shoe. He was very quiet to be around and to ride with." Funeral arrangements are pending.

Bowman Second Chance Thoroughbred Adoption, was also honored Feb. 21 at the North Dakota Thoroughbred Association's Horsemen's Awards Banquet. Operated by Dr. Thomas Bowman, the operation was founded in 1993 to give retired race horses a safe-haven. Offering rehabilitation and rehoming services, the non-profit aims to give each horse the opportunity to start a new career.

The Prodigious Fund will be recognized at the Washington Thoroughbred Breeders and Owners Association's annual Awards Ceremony on Feb. 28. Started in 2008 by Emerald Downs, the organization was initially a means for the track to provide funds to aftercare facilities via a voluntary per start fee. The program was reinvigorated in 2012 and now aims to recognize and support positive efforts made within the Thoroughbred aftercare community for the re-homing, promotion and care of retired racehorses.
