### CHAMP FACES SIX IN REBEL

Just a few days short of five years ago, trainer Bob Baffert sent the previous year's 2-year-old champion to Oaklawn Park from his California base to make his sophomore debut in the GII Rebel S. at Oaklawn Park. Lookin at Lucky (Smart Strike) became the first of the conditioner's four winners in the span of five years in 2010, and **American Pharoah** (Pioneerof the Nile) will

look to do the same when he faces a half-dozen seemingly overmatched foes in the final local prep for the \$1-million GI Arkansas Derby Apr. 11. But whereas Lookin at Lucky arrived in Hot Springs a seasoned 3-year-old off a six-race juvenile campaign, American Pharoah joins

**Sakima**, by 2007 Rebel winner Curlin, as the field's least-experienced entrants with just three races under their belt. But his two victories have been much faster than anything else any of his rivals have put up, and moreover, he seems to have a significant tactical advantage this weekend as the lone apparent speed of the race. While Harry Rosenblum's big shooter Far Right (Notional) is waiting for the Racing Festival of the South, he will take a crack at American Pharoah with Sakima, though the chestnut has never crossed the wire first in his three starts.

### COBALT INVESTIGATIONS EXTENDED

Racing Victoria's investigations into positive cobalt swabs returned from four Victorian training stables will not be completed this month as originally anticipated, according to *Racing and Sports*. Under investigation are Victorian-based trainers Peter Moody, Mark Kavanagh, Danny O'Brien, and the partnership of Lee and Shannon Hope.

"There is a significant volume of work that has already been completed by the Compliance Assurance Team, particularly given that we are dealing with four different stables, each with its own set of circumstances to analyze and consider," said Dayle Brown, Racing Victoria's executive general manager of integrity.

"Whilst we are working as swiftly as possible with a very well-resourced team, we have gathered evidence during the course of the four investigations that we wish to further analyze, and this will take time."

Brown added, "It is critically important that we ensure that no stone is left unturned, which must be balanced against the desire of all parties for the investigations to be completed in a timely manner. We also understand the community's desire to know the specifics of each of our four investigations, however whilst they remain ongoing it would be inappropriate for us to comment on them further."

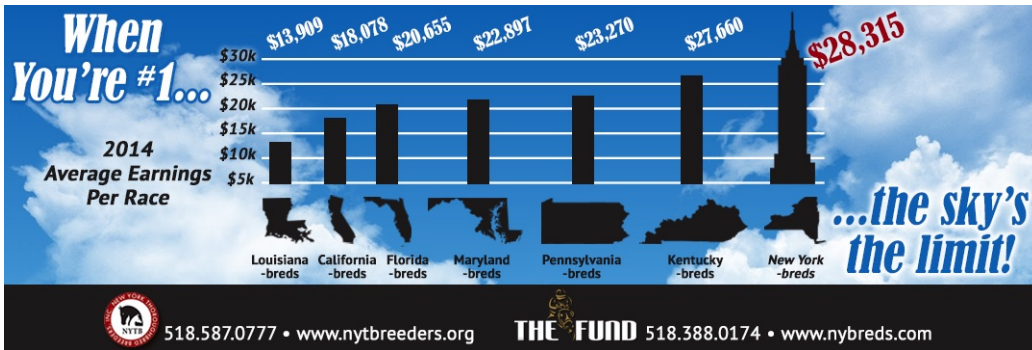

**JERKENS REMAINS HOSPITALIZED IN FLA**

Hall of Fame trainer Allen Jerkens remains in guarded condition in the intensive care unit of a south Florida hospital, his son, Jimmy, said Wednesday afternoon.

Jerkens, 85, was admitted to Aventura Hospital and Medical Center Feb. 28 with a severe infection. He showed some improvement after being treated with antibiotics, but his condition has not changed in the past week.

"All vital signs are still pretty good, but he still hasn't progressed beyond a semi-conscious state," Jimmy Jerkens said.

Jerkens is in his 66th year as a head trainer and ranks 11th in career victories and 14th in purse money earned. The Long Island native was based in New York through 2013, but remained in Florida following the conclusion of the Gulfstream Park's 2013-14 Championship Meet.

**MY MISS SOPHIA WORKS TOWARDS RETURN**

The 2014 GI Kentucky Oaks runner-up **My Miss Sophia** (Unbridled's Song), who sold for \$2.15 million at the Fasig-Tipton November sale last year, continues to progress towards her 4-year-old campaign for new trainer Bill Mott. The chestnut filly turned in a best-of-12 five-furlong work at Payson Park Tuesday in 1:02.00. It was her fourth work since joining Mott's

Florida base in January.

"She is starting to go through the training process of getting fit," said Mott, who trains the filly for Jon Clay's Alpha Delta Stables. "She's doing fine."

While no specific race has been determined for the filly's return, Mott said, "Hopefully

she'll be close to being ready to run in a month's time."

Racing for Mathis Stable and trainer Todd Pletcher, My Miss Sophia won last year's Gil Gazelle S. before finishing second behind Untapable (Tapit) in the Kentucky Oaks. She has not started since finishing fifth in last year's Lady's Secret S. at Monmouth Park, but her half-brother Materiality (Afleet Alex) was in the headlines recently when tabbed a "TDN Rising Star" after an authoritative score in Gulfstream Park's Islamorada H.

**FLAT STARS SPARKLE AT CHELTENHAM**

He's won Classics in Britain, Ireland, America and Italy, not to mention two Melbourne Cups; but, like many in Irish racing, Dermot Weld can't resist a tilt at some of jump racing's biggest prizes, and his training skills were demonstrated once more at Cheltenham with the rousing victory of **Windsor Park (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) in the G1 Neptune Investment Management Novices' Hurdle.

Owned by Dr. Ronan Lambe--who last year tasted Cheltenham glory with the Weld-trained Silver Concorde (GB) (Dansili {GB}) in the Champion Bumper

as well as Cheltenham Gold Cup hero Lord Windermere (Ire) (Oscar {Ire})--the 6-year-old has won his only two starts under Flat rules and may yet be seen back under that code this summer.

Weld, who trains six jumpers

alongside his Flat string on the Curragh, said, "He's a very versatile horse. He raced five times last year and won five times. He has done everything right and he's a joy to train. He could be entered for the [G1] Gold Cup [at Ascot] and we will review it--today was the day though. We probably first thought of this a year ago. It's a unique atmosphere, a unique occasion and I am very fortunate to win here."

While Dr. Lambe countered that the Ascot Gold Cup could be aiming a little high for Windsor Park, on pedigree he has every reason to be considered for classy contests on the level, for not only is he a son of the champion sire but his dam, Blissful (Mr Prospector), is a sister to GI Kentucky Derby winner Fusaichi Pegasus.


His trainer added, "He's a very nice young horse, hopefully he has many years to come and will be a lovely dual-purpose horse. He's a stayer with speed and I think he'll want two miles on the Flat. We'll see where we go. Punchestown will be a logical progression although there are a couple of Flat conditions races that we could look at. He could go chasing in the future, he could be a World Hurdle horse next year or he could stay on the Flat--he's pretty adaptable."

Sadler's Wells and his sire sons have long produced high-profile jumps winners, but proving that he's not to be outdone by his Flat championship rival Galileo is Dubawi (Ire), who gained a first major Cheltenham Festival success on Wednesday via his son **Dodging Bullets (GB)** in the G1 Queen Mother Champion Chase.

The race was arguably the most hotly anticipated contest of the week, featuring as it did the previous two winners, **Sire De Grugy (Fr)** (My Risk {Fr}) and **Sprinter Sacre (Fr)** (Network {Ger}). Neither had enjoyed a clear run into this year's contest, however, and before the field even turned for home both horses were being driven to stay in contention while Dodging Bullets, coming into the race on the back of two Grade 1 victories over fences, cruised ominously under Sam Twiston-Davies. Jumping the final two obstacles in tandem with long-time leader **Special Tiara (GB)** (Kay Tara {GB}), the 7-year-old fended off a last-gasp challenge from the admirable veteran **Somersby (Ire)** (Second Empire {Ire}) to gain the second of three wins on the day for champion trainer Paul Nicholls and an important feature-race victory for Britain.



## NTRA REPORT FROM CAPITOL HILL


### NTRA ANNOUNCES FEDERAL LEGISLATIVE AGENDA

The NTRA announced on Wednesday, March 11 its federal legislative agenda for the 114th Congress, which convened in January. Economic issues again dominate the agenda as tax matters re-emerge in the new Congress along with Internet gaming, immigration and racehorse drug and therapeutic medication regulation and testing.

"As always, we focus on legislation that directly affects our members and their Thoroughbred business activities, including horse racing, breeding and pari-mutuel wagering," said NTRA President and CEO Alex Waldrop, who directs the association's lobbying efforts. "Our agenda each year in Washington generally has two distinct objectives – offense and defense. We attempt to advance matters that can be beneficial to the industry and at the same time monitor and prepare to act on a range of issues that could pose harm to our industry."

NTRA's 2015 agenda primarily focuses on several major tax issues that impact the industry's bottom line. Topping the list is continuation of the uniform three-year depreciation of Thoroughbred racehorses that was secured in 2014. The NTRA also will continue its efforts to modernize tax withholding and reporting requirements now in place for winning pari-mutuel wagers.

Adding a little sparkle to the winner's enclosure was Dodging Bullets' breeder, Frankie Dettori, who had entered fully into the Cheltenham spirit by donning a brown trilby and three-piece suit. The leading Flat jockey was full of praise for his jumping counterpart Sam Twiston-Davies as he embraced him post-race and declared he had given the winner the perfect ride.

"Sam was very tactically astute and saved ground all the way. The horse jumped like a stag and was gutsy all the way to the line--it was just so exciting to watch," said Dettori, who partnered Dodging Bullets' sire in all but one of his eight starts, including the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas.

He continued, "I have to admit I was pretty nervous. I watched the race with his owners and my legs felt like they were shaking a little bit as I came down the stairs. This horse was bred to win a Derby but he wasn't very correct. He was sold pretty cheaply as a yearling but he's more than made up for it now."

The 8,000gns Tattersalls December Sale purchase, who is out of the unraced Kris S. mare Nova Cyngi, won twice on the Flat for trainer Andy Oliver before being sold privately to his current syndicate, which includes former British Horseracing Authority chairman Martin Broughton. **Cont. p6**

(Poliglote {GB}) in the RSA Chase brought up the first part of a double for that horse's owner, Ryanair boss Michael O'Leary of Gigginstown House Stud, which was completed by **Rivage d'Or (Fr)** (Visionary {Fr}) in the Glenfarclas

Cross-Country Chase for trainer Tony Martin.

Adding to the Nicholls trio of home wins was a scorching success for **Moon Racer (Ire)** (Saffron Walden {Fr}) in the G1 Weatherbys Champion Bumper--the only race of the meeting which is run on the flat for young jumps prospects. The David Pipe-trained 6-year-old was bought for £225,000 (\$335,000) last April, five days after making a winning debut in Ireland and he is now unbeaten in three starts.

**Sheikh Fahad In the Hunt for Cheltenham Glory...**

The St James's Palace Foxhunter Chase, the most prestigious event in the amateur jump jockeys' calendar that is run directly after Friday's Cheltenham Gold Cup, was given an interesting twist with the announcement that Sheikh Fahad Al Thani has purchased one of the leading fancies, **Current Event (Fr)** (Muhtahtir {GB}).

The 8-year-old, who was formerly in the care of Britain's champion jumps trainer Paul Nicholls, is now trained in the point-to-point field by Nicholls' employee Rose Loxton and will carry Pearl Bloodstock's yellow and blue-starred silks for his appearance at Cheltenham with rider Bryony Frost. He will not be the first runner for Sheikh Fahad at the Festival, as he formerly owned the multiple dual-purpose winner **Vulcanite (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire}) prior to the gelding's sale to JP McManus.

Away from the glare of Cheltenham, Sheikh Fahad has a significant runner today at Chelmsford City when his 2.5 million-guineas yearling purchase **Hydrogen (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}) lines up for the second start of his career in the 10-furlong maiden at 6.10 p.m. (GMT, 1:10 p.m. Eastern). The 4-year-old made his debut last May at Newmarket, finishing sixth of nine runners when contesting a mile-and-a-half maiden.

**WOODBINE TO REPLACE POLY WITH TAPETA**

Officials at Woodbine Racetrack outside of Toronto, Ontario, have announced that the existing Polytrack surface, in place since August 2006, will be replaced by a Tapeta track in time for the 2016 racing season. Construction on the new surface will begin immediately following the conclusion of the 2015 meet. Four December racing dates will be moved to Thursdays in November, normal dark days at the track, pending approval from the Ontario Racing Commission.

"At Woodbine, it's in our mandate to act in the best interests of horse racing and a regular, thorough examination of our track surfaces is paramount in that pursuit," said Jim Lawson, chairman of the board of the Woodbine Entertainment Group. "We went through an exhaustive consultation exercise in our search for the new main track. It's clear that Tapeta is the next generation of horse racing surfaces that we'll be proud to unveil in April of 2016."

Officials at the Woodbine Entertainment Group began exploring options to replace the main track in 2014, including a return to a conventional dirt surface, but, after consulting with industry stakeholders for their opinions, decided on sticking with a synthetic track, albeit a slightly different one.

"A surface that will endure racing and training through hot and cold climate extremes for more than eight months a year is critical for our horsepeople," said Lawson. "We also considered racing fans and horseplayers through this process. Field size, the number of quality races and wagering on Woodbine's thoroughbred racing product has grown appreciably in the synthetic track era. We see those metrics continuing to improve with the installation of Tapeta."

Sue Leslie, president of the local Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association, admitted that there was no unanimity among members as to the final decision, but praised WEG executives for their efforts in the process.

"The HBPA has appreciated WEG's regular and transparent communication with the HBPA's directors and its members as Woodbine reviewed options for a new racing surface," Leslie said. "While acknowledging that HBPA members were very split on their preferred surface, we are satisfied that WEG was thorough and open-minded in its review. The change of surface announcement is a good day for horsepeople and their horses."

Two stakes races, the \$125,000 Kingarvie S. and the GIII \$150,000 Valedictory S., originally scheduled for Dec. 5 and 6, respectively, will be moved up a week to Nov. 28 and Nov 29.

Woodbine will join Golden Gate Fields and Presque Isle Downs as the only North American facilities to conduct main-track racing on Tapeta. Arlington Park and Turfway Park are the lone remaining venues with Polytrack after the surface was recently removed at Keeneland and Del Mar.

With a \$610,000 KEESEP pricetag and a highly regarded half-brother that earned a record 114 Beyer Speed Figure at first asking on his page, it's safe to say that the bar was set high for Fox Hill Farms colorbearer Kentuckian.

The gray--favored at 3-5 in his Golden Gate unveiling Saturday-- certainly did his part by running away with an eye-catching 11-length graduation ([video](#)), stopping

the clock for six furlongs in a snappy 1:08 4/5. The 'TDN Rising Star' earned a 90 Beyer for the effort.

"He's been our number one pick all along," owner Rick Porter commented. "For me to pay that kind of money, [Tom] McGreevy and I thought he was a horse we really needed to have if we could get him."

Kentuckian--a half-brother to the aforementioned Hill 'n' Dale sire and fellow 'TDN Rising Star' Maclean's

Music (Distorted Humor)--showed promise in his initial works last November for Hall of Fame trainer Jerry Hollendorfer, firing a quick pair of three-furlong breezes before re-locating to Northern California earlier this year due to a foot issue. He posted three straight bullets over Golden Gate's Tapeta surface heading into his debut.

"Jerry [Hollendorfer] was excited as soon as he got him," Porter said. "He had an issue with a quarter crack that went on longer than we anticipated. Finally, he said, 'Why don't we send him up to Golden Gate because my wife's the best foot person that I know.' I said, 'If she's the best foot person, let's let her fix it.'"

Kentuckian's feet looked just fine Saturday. The son of the talented Unbridled's Song mare Forest Music showed the way through an opening quarter in :22.54. With his ears flickering back and forth just waiting for a command from Russell Baze at the top of the stretch, he was hand-ridden down the lane to the easiest of victories. Kentuckian, bred in the Bluegrass by Stonestreet Thoroughbred Holdings LLC, will be aimed at an entry-level allowance at Santa Anita, according to Porter.

This is the first year that Fox Hill has been represented with a West Coast string in California. Hollendorfer trains all four runners, including recent Gill Santa Ysabel S. third-place finisher Glory (Tapit).

"Jerry [Hollendorfer] tells me that [Kentuckian] likes the track at Santa Anita a lot, too," Porter offered. "We'll see how he does there. If he shows that he's as impressive as he was in his debut, then we'll look for something better. I like to get two races under their belt before we start looking for anything else. He galloped out extremely strong and Russell [Baze] said that he could've went around again."

Porter concluded, "The way he was twitching his ears, you could tell he wanted to do a little bit more. We're very excited about him. We didn't beat the best horses in California, but he got a race under his belt. We're just hoping that he's a good one. He's got a beautiful pedigree and I love the fact that he's out of an Unbridled's Song mare. There's no question that he's a two-turn horse." --By Steve Sherack

### NTRA Announces Federal Agenda for 2015:

Economic issues, along with Internet gaming, immigration and racehorse drug and therapeutic medication regulation and testing are the issues of highest priority in the federal legislative agenda for the National Thoroughbred Racing Association for the 114th Congress, which convened in January.

In the previous Congress, the NTRA was able to secure passage of three bills critical to the horse racing industry: standardized, 3-year depreciation for racehorses, a bonus depreciation structure which permits taxpayers to depreciate 50% of qualified property in the year it is purchased and placed into service (e.g. yearlings and farm equipment); and the expanded Sec. 179 expense allowance pegged at \$500,000 with a \$2 million threshold for qualified new or used property purchased and placed in service (e.g. broodmares, racing and stallion prospects).

These provisions were extended for one year in 2014 and will be up for renewal in 2015.

This year's federal agenda looks to continue the 3-year-depreciation while seeking to secure a longer extension of this provision along with bonus depreciation and the current levels for Sec. 179 expensing. The modernization of tax withholding and reporting requirements will also feature prominently on the NTRA agenda in the nation's capital. Rules currently in place do not reflect the modern wagering climate, the NTRA argues. The organization is now approaching this issue by seeking a clarification of the "amount wagered" from the Department of Treasury. NTRA believes that modernizing the way the IRS calculates the amount wagered to include all money bet into a single pool on a

winning wager would eliminate many of the reporting and withholding tickets and simplify racetrack IRS reporting obligations.

"The NTRA will continue to work with Treasury and its Congressional allies to push for this modernization, which will greatly improve the economics of pari-mutuel wagering for all concerned," Waldrop said. "The NTRA will be reaching out to all segments of the horse racing industry, including horseplayers, to coordinate and solicit comments in support of this important tax clarification."

Bills regarding medication regulation and testing, likely to include some sort of federal oversight, are also expected to re-emerge in the current Congress.

"The NTRA has taken no position on these bills as our membership remains divided on the issue of federal or central authority over testing for banned substances and the regulation of therapeutic medications," Waldrop commented. "However, the association continues to provide information and data to interested parties and remains committed to achieving consensus on this issue."

**Grayson-Jockey Club Allocates Money for Research:**

The Grayson-Jockey Club Foundation Board of Directors has approved a budget of \$1,100,500 to fund equine research in 2015. A total of 10 new projects will be funded, as well as two second-year projects and two Career Development awards to encourage young scientists. The budget also allows for a second call for research later in the year. Since 1983, the foundation has funded a total of 322 projects at 41 universities for over \$22 million.

"Thanks to the generosity of our donors, we are able to fund every one of the projects that our Research Advisory Committee evaluated as qualifying for support," said Edward L. Bowen, president of the foundation. "The fact that we also can reach out with a special call is a true bonus for us and, more importantly, for the horse."

The Career Development Awards program was initiated in 2006 with the first Storm Cat Award. This was named for the famous stallion that stood at Overbrook Farm, the family of foundation board member Lucy Young Hamilton. Mrs. Hamilton personally underwrites the \$15,000 stipends to assist in specific research by young candidates who pursue a career path in equine research. The 2015 Storm Cat Career Development winner is Aimee Colbath of Colorado State University.

The family of the late Elaine Klein has inaugurated another Career Development Award in memory of the distinguished equestrienne. The Klein Family Foundation is based in Louisville, Ky. The recipient of the inaugural \$15,000 Elaine Klein Career Development Award is Sophie Bogers of the Marion du Pont Scott Equine Medical Center.

Her 10 opponents include Carla Giral's once-raced homebred **Whippa d'Or (Fr) (Whipper)**, a half-sister to the European champion speedster and MG1SW Marchand d'Or (Fr) (Marchand de Sable), from the Stephane Wattel barn.

6.10 Chelmsford City, Mdn, £5,000, 3yo/up, 10f (AWT)

Qatar Racing Ltd's **HYDROGEN (GB) (Galileo {Ire})**, a sibling of the 2007 G1 Epsom Derby hero Authorized (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}), has been in the spotlight since acquired for a whopping 2.5 million guineas at Tattersalls' 2012 October yearling sale, and bids to bounce back from a subdued sixth going 12 furlongs at Newmarket in his belated debut last May. Opposition to the Peter Chapple-Hyam trainee includes Godolphin's homebred sophomore **Honourable Action (Ire) (Shamardal)**, who is a gelded son of the 2007 G1 Phoenix S and G1 Moyglare Stud S heroine Saoirse Abu (Mr. Greeley), representing the busy Charlie Appleby yard.

## Australasia

### FIGURES UP AT ADELAIDE BOOK 2

The Magic Millions Adelaide Yearling Sale drew to a close yesterday with a single-session Book 2, which posted gains in most areas. A total of 102 yearlings changed hands for A\$1,355,500, as compared to 89 sold for A\$1,009,300 last year. The average climbed 17.2% to A\$13,289, while the median jumped 15.6% to A\$9,250. Buyers were apparently more discerning this year, however, as the buyback rate was up 9% to 25%.

Magic Millions Adelaide Consultant Adrian Hancock summed up the sale by saying, "It was a good, solid day's selling with some exceptional prices for some choice lots thanks to a strong and diverse buying bench. Bidding was intense on the lots that were well presented and well conformed."

"It was pleasing for the complete sale to return the highest gross since 2007 and we look forward to this continuing to grow into the future," he added. "The combined sales have returned a clearance rate of over 80%."

"Vendors who supported the sale with quality lots were handsomely rewarded with well above expected results," he concluded. "We will work hard in getting more of these lots next year as we have proven we can attract the buyers and the good prices that come with them."

The highest price of the day was A\$87,500, for a filly by Strategic Maneuver (Aus) ([lot 353](#)). Magic Millions signed for the chestnut on behalf of a Victorian-based client.
