PURE GOLD

When Gai Waterhouse speaks, it is best to listen. Let's jog back to October 2011, when a near-black colt in her care won the Listed Breeders' Plate first out and Waterhouse declared him the next year's G1 Golden Slipper winner. That colt was Pierro (Aus) (Lonhro {Aus}), who not only won the Slipper, but swept the Sydney 2-year-old Triple Crown.

Fast forward three years to last October and Waterhouse was winning the Breeders' Plate again with another strapping dark bay, this time **Vancouver (Aus)** (Medaglia d'Oro). Vancouver earned 'TDN Rising Star' status that day for his sparkling 1 1/2-length score, after which Waterhouse was drawing comparisons between him and Pierro. Her predictions seemed in line, as Vancouver marched through the early part of an unbeaten autumn campaign, but the Slipper favorite was dealt a blow at Tuesday's post position draw when landing in gate 18 of 19. Waterhouse's confidence never wavered, however, and she told the media, "He'll win, and the most important thing is he'll be better odds."

How right she was. After scratches were announced, Vancouver moved into gate 16, and was hustled from the break by Tommy Berry to gain a prominent position. That plan came to fruition with the pair slotting in about sixth and three wide, finding cover behind stablemate **Speak Fondly (Aus)** (Northern Meteor {Aus}) while **Haybah (Aus)** (More Than Ready) set the pace tracked by Godolphin's **Haptic (Aus)** (Exceed and Excel {Aus}). Vancouver began to inch ever closer as the field rounded the turn and he swung off the bend five wide, but in the clear and full of gas. Berry let the reins out on the favorite at the 300-meter mark as stablemate **English (Aus)** (Encosta de Lago {Aus}) reached his shoulder, but the filly could not get past, getting to within no more than a half-length of her stablemate before he drew clear inside the final furlong to win by three-quarters of a length. **Cont. p9**

SKY'S THE LIMIT AFTER SPIRAL

Three Chimneys Farm and Besilu Stables's **Dubai Sky** (Candy Ride {Arg}) turned in a break-out performance in his synthetic track debut to run away with the \$550,000 GIII Spiral S. at Turfway Park yesterday. Drawn in the far-outside 11 hole, the 7-1 shot rushed up first time past the wire to sit fourth while out in the clear. He took closer order three deep after a half in :47.57, and poked a head in front leaving the home bend. The bay enjoyed a clear advantage at the head of the lane with a wall of horses lining up behind him, but nobody was getting to the Bill Mott trainee as he found another gear under energetic Jose Lezcano handling. **Conquest Typhoon** (Stormy Atlantic) was 2 1/2 lengths back in second, edging longshot **Firespike** (Flower Alley) by a neck. Favored **Metaboss** (Street Boss) made an eye-catching wide bid into the lane before flattening to finish sixth. "I had never ridden him before, but after watching his replays, he looked like a horse who wanted to be in the clear," said Lezcano, who also took the GIII Bourbonette Oaks one race earlier. "He broke good and took me there the whole way... He took me to the quarter pole, and after that I saw Mike Smith [on Conquest Typhoon] right behind me, so I had to go because my horse can be a bit lazy sometimes." **Cont. p7**

The betting public made Finnegans Wake, owner of a three-race winning streak, a can't-miss proposition in Saturday's GII San Luis Rey S., but Ashleyluvssugar had different ideas and outsprinted the 1-2 favorite to the wire to cause a minor upset.

Winner of a first-level Cal-bred allowance over the Del Mar Poly last August, the homebred flashed home to finish fourth in an open a-other-than going a grassy mile here Oct. 2. Given a breather following a narrow victory back on the synthetic surface in San Diego County Nov. 7, the bay failed to handle a wet-fast main track in a rained-off allowance over a mile Jan. 11, but he bounced back to best next-out winner Talco (Fr) (Pivotal {GB}) in a nine-furlong tilt when last spotted Feb. 5. With long-winded influences such as Arc winner Rainbow Quest and Breeders' Cup Turf hero Cozzene on his female side, Ashleyluvssugar appeared a candidate to stay this sort of distance and proved equal to the task. **Cont. p4**

Joel Blazing Aaron (Graeme Hall) lived up to his name and set a searching early pace for the distance while hounded along by Diamond Bachelor (War Front) as Ashleyluvssugar settled in fifth position and last-out GII San Marcos S. hero Finnegan's Wake clocking that one's activity from one spot further in arrears. The front-runners continued to run each other into the ground and covered half the trip in a suicidal 1:10.29, and as they reached the half-mile marker, the chief protagonists were chomping at the bit. Power Foot was first to come after the weakening pacesetters and he may have poked his head in front for a stride or two nearing the lane, but Ashleyluvssugar and Finnegan's Wake were coming with their runs in unison. Those two raced more or less on even terms into the final furlong, but despite spotting Finnegan's Wake a fair bit of experience, Ashleyluvssugar stayed on the better of the two for the victory.

"I had confidence going in. He relaxed like a dream for me," commented winning rider Gary Stevens, who deputized for jockey Mike Smith, in Kentucky to ride in the GIII Spiral S. "I knew if he would relax, we'd have a good chance. I was loaded going into the turn, a horse came up to our outside, he got headed but he's tough, he likes a fight."

Classic Point, trained for the majority of her career by the legendary Hall of Famer Allen Jerkens--who passed away earlier this week--and now conditioned by Jerkens's son Jimmy, paid a fitting tribute to "The Chief" here with a hard-fought second-consecutive graded stakes victory. A close second in the GII Honorable Miss H. at Saratoga in 2013, the homebred was transferred to Jimmy when the elder Jerkens elected to remain in Florida year-round last year. Fifth in the GII Gallant Bloom H. at Belmont Sept. 20, the chestnut aired by 6 1/2 lengths in that venue's restricted seven-furlong Punkin Pie S. when adding blinkers Oct. 13. She got her nose down on the line in the one-mile GIII Go For Wand H. at the Big A Nov. 28, and was making her seasonal debut. Classic Point sat perched off the pace in a wide fourth as heavily favored Merry Meadow (Henny Hughes) and Sweet Whiskey slugged it out. She ranged up

ominously as the chalk dropped back leaving the bend, and challenged Sweet Whiskey at the quarter pole. She finally wrestled the lead away from Sweet Whiskey a sixteenth from home, and called on all she had as the winning line loomed to deny fast-charging longshot You Bought Her.

"Obviously, the circumstances made it a little special," said Jimmy Jerkens. "When she first came down here she didn't do so well. She lost all her hair. My father said she did it to him last year around this time. That's why she hadn't run until today, when she finally came around. She's a very good workhorse. She'll very willing. She'll do anything you want. She's an absolute dream to train."

Owner/breeder Joseph Shields, Jr. added, "She's had two wonderful trainers. Paco [Lopez] rode her so

well. He didn't let up on her. She got the encouragement she needed and she won the race.

"I think that Jimmy has the ability to continue on the same level as Allen did. He has gotten some good horses, and that will make a big difference. As far as I'm concerned personally, I've known him for 25 years. I knew him when he was at Allen's barn. He's a good guy and I think his career is really starting to blossom.

"When Allen stayed down here, I gave him two horses. The two good fillies, this one and [GII Royal Delta S. entrant House Rules {Distorted Humor}]. I couldn't leave them down here. I hated to do it, but I left all the others with Allen. Allen actually asked me to send them to Jimmy in New York. And you know how Allen asks; there's no 'no.' It's worked out. He's learned from the master."

Transferred from Charles Forrest to David Fawkes last summer, Sheer Drama was second in a nine-furlong Saratoga optional claimer Aug. 15 before annexing Laurel's Thirty Eight Go Go S. Sept. 6. Ninth when trying synthetic in Presque Isle's HPBA S. Sept. 22, she resurfaced to finish second behind Dame Dorothy (Bernardini) in the Florida Sunshine Millions Distaff S. Jan. 17 and again behind heavy favorite House Rules in this venue's GIII Rampart S. going a sixteenth shorter Feb. 21. Tracking in third early before tugging her way up to force the issue down the backside, the homebred seized the lead from Swinger's Party and started to open up. Several lengths to the good of House Rules hitting the top of the stretch, Sheer Drama proved not for catching as she galloped away powerfully.

"She really ran a big race today," said winning pilot Joe Bravo. "The extra distance, she just loved it. She just kept accelerating through the lane... When we left the top of the lane, she just kept punching underneath me."

Added Fawkes, "I talked to [owner Harold Queen] this morning, and he said, 'Absolutely, two turns is definitely going to be a benefit.' And I like the shorter stretch out, too. Nothing hurts with that."

Fawkes also trained the winner's half brother Big Drama, best known for his win in the 2010 GI Breeders' Cup Sprint and subsequent Eclipse Award, but who also won the GIII Delta Downs Jackpot S. 1 1/16 miles at two.

"Her brother Big Drama, we always thought he'd run long," Fawkes noted. "It just happened that as he got older, he kind of liked sprinting. But he won stakes going long. He won the Florida Sire Stakes final. That was a mile and a sixteenth. He ran really big in the [GII] West Virginia Derby, and that was a mile and an eighth, I believe. He could run long, and she has no problem with it."

Third on debut going 1 1/16 miles at Saratoga in August, Dubai Sky went straight to the front and never looked back with the addition of blinkers over the same surface and distance at Belmont Sept. 20. He resurfaced to dead heat with stablemate Hard to Port (Afleet Alex) in a Gulfstream optional claimer Dec. 20, and out-headed another stablemate in Courtier (Pioneerof the Nile) in Hallandale's Kitten's Joy S. Jan. 24. Dubai Sky was getting first-time Lasix here from Mott, who won the 2008 renewal of this event with Adriano (A.P. Indy). His full-brother Twirling Candy currently leads the freshman sire list by 2-year-old sales price with six sold for an average of \$374,167. Dubai Sky, who was not an original nominee to the Triple Crown, has a yearling half sister by Smart Strike.

FIRING LINE STANDS OUT IN SUNLAND DERBY

Having thrown down on two straight occasions with 'TDN Rising Star' Dortmund (Big Brown), Arnold Zetcher's **Firing Line** (Line of David) gets out of the considerable shadow of that towering foe and looms a prohibitive favorite in Sunday's GIII Sunland Derby.

An impressive maiden winner at the tail end of the Bing Crosby meet at Del Mar Nov. 30, the \$240,000 Keeneland April graduate engaged in a race-long speed duel with Mr. Z

(Malibu Moon) in the GI Los Alamitos Futurity Dec. 20 and ultimately won that battle, but could not win the war, as Dortmund was able to stick his head across the wire first. Firing Line got first run on Dortmund in the GIII Robert B. Lewis S. Feb. 7 and

looked set to give Gary Stevens his landmark 5,000th career victory in North America, but the Bob Baffert trainee was somehow able to punch back from the rail and dealt the Simon Callaghan trainee a second-consecutive excruciating defeat. With news Thursday that the Bob Baffert-trained Lord Nelson (Pulpit) will not ship in for the race, the task facing Firing Line appears that much more straight-forward.

With plenty of other early speed signed on in the form of coast-to-coast Turf Paradise Derby hero **Why Two** (Bob and John), stretchout sprinter **Malibu Mogul** (Malibu Moon) and potentially **Tiznow R J** (Tiznow), the race could set up for **Where's the Moon** (Malibu Moon) to cash a nice check. Well-beaten in three Southern California starts for Peter Miller last season, the chestnut--produced by a half-sister to the dam of GIII Withers S. winner Far From Over (Blame)--has been much improved against far softer in these local environs. He broke his maiden by an impressive 6 3/4 lengths going a mile over this strip Feb. 13 and returned on eight days' rest to defeat 1-5 Cinco Charlie (Indian Charlie) and **Dirt Monster** (Line of David) in the Mine That Bird Derby last time out.

BAFFERT 'BACK' FOR MORE IN SP OAKS

The always dangerous Bob Baffert is looking for his fifth straight Sunland Park Oaks and sends out the duo of Spendthrift Farm's GI Las Virgenes S. heroine **Callback**, the even-money favorite on the morning line, and his wife's **Maybellene** Sunday. The former has done little wrong since a ninth-place debut behind 'TDN Rising Star' Lady Lake (Wildcat Heir) sprinting at Santa Anita Nov. 2. Off the mark at Los Alamitos Dec. 4, the bay was a closing second, good for a 90 Beyer behind Seduire (Elusive Quality) in the GII Santa Ynez S. back in Arcadia Jan. 3, one start prior to successfully stretching out to a mile while employing pacesetting tactics in the GI Las Virgenes S. Jan. 31. Winner of an optional claimer over the Santa Anita dirt Oct. 23, Maybellene was second in Del Mar's Desi Arnaz S. Nov. 16 and completed the trifecta in 'TDN Rising Star' Take Charge Brandi (Giant's Causeway's)s GI Starlet S. at Los Alamitos Dec. 13. Off the board in her stablemate's Las Virgenes win, she comes into the Oaks with an even fourth in the China Doll S. in her turf debut Mar. 7. Fellow Las Virgenes runner **Suva Harbor**, who ran sixth, could also have a say in the outcome. The John Sadler filly was first past the wire in the Island Fashion S. 2 3/4 lengths ahead of runner-up **Rousanne** going a mile over this strip last time out, but was disqualified for interference and placed eighth Feb. 22.

GIII Spiral S. - **Metaboss**, backed down to 9-5, looked to be making a run on the turn before settling for sixth.

GIII Sunland Derby - Can Firing Line handle the nine-furlong distance? Did those two heart-breaking defeats to Dortmund take something out of him? He should still probably win even if he doesn't fire his best shot here, but, hey, at around 3-5 or so, he's certainly worth taking a shot against. I'll go with the well-bred streaking local **Where's the Moon**, who has improved a ton since joining the dangerous Henry Dominguez barn. For a \$27,000 KEESEP purchase, the son of Malibu Moon has a ton of pedigree, too. Produced by the Grade I-winning Storm Cat mare Aldiza, the chestnut is a half-brother to Alchemist (A.P. Indy), dam of current unbeaten Derby hopeful Far From Over (Blame). After struggling to get out of his own way for Peter Miller in Southern California last fall, Where's the Moon has really put it together in three starts over this course in 2015. He broke through with a daylight maiden win at fifth asking Feb. 13, then returned just eight days later to impressively bring home the 1 1/16-mile Mine That Bird Derby. The Robison colorbearer will certainly have to take another leap forward to get the money here, but he should get the proper pace set-up and has been finishing his races like he wants more distance. The price should be right. **Selection #3 Where's the Moon (6-1).**

GIII Spiral S. - I was *so* close to picking Dubai Sky here, but the post scared me off and I ended up on overbet **Metaboss**. Good ride by Jose Lezcano, bad decision by me.

GIII Sunland Derby - He can obviously win, but I'm very much against expected heavy favorite Firing Line here. He finished off his juvenile campaign with a hard-fought second to Dortmund in the GI Los Alamitos Futurity, and returned in the GIII Robert B. Lewis S. to come out on the losing end of another tough battle with that runner. Simon Callaghan trainees tend to run much better first off the bench than second, and Firing Line has to be considered something of a question mark at this nine-furlong distance considering the way he let Dortmund come back on him last time. Morning line second choice Lord Nelson would've also been a play against if he wasn't expected to scratch, and I wanted to like Tiznow R J, but couldn't figure out a good reason to excuse his last effort. **Why Two** is a very interesting semi-longshot to consider here. He ran on strongly after a slow start to be fourth on debut behind good return allowance winner Well Maybe, and rallied resolutely to graduate over seven furlongs here next out. The chestnut set the pace and repelled two challengers to annex the Turf Paradise Derby last time, and seems like he'll get the additional sixteenth just fine. **Selection: #4 Why Two (8-1).**

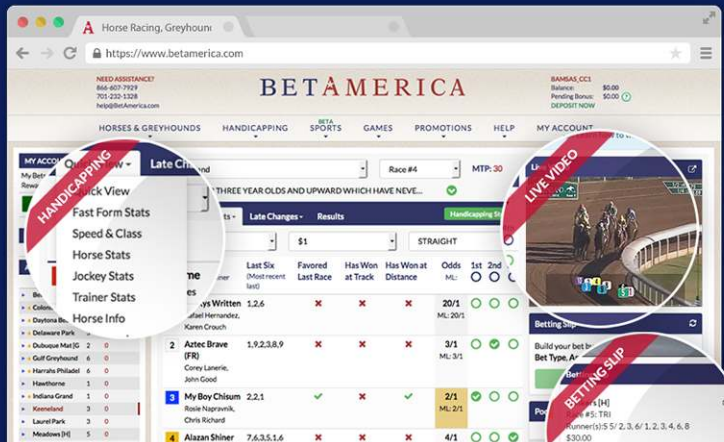

Coolmore's maiden filly **Lake Geneva**, third in the G1 **Blue Diamond S.** a month ago, made an eye-catching run up the inside to grab third. It was the sixth **Golden Slipper** win for **Waterhouse**, equaling the record set by her late father, the Hall of Famer **T J Smith**, and the second for **Berry**, who rode the **Waterhouse-trained Overreach (Aus) (Exceed and Excel {Aus})** to victory two years ago. It was an emotional victory for **Berry**, who lost his twin brother, jockey **Nathan Berry**, to an epileptic condition a year ago. In attendance yesterday were **Berry's** mother, partner **Sharnee** and newborn son **Kaidan**.

"I've got no words," **Berry** said yesterday. "Nathan is with me all the time. I've got my son here, **Kaidan**. One person leaves you in the world and another one comes along. I'm just so blessed to have my family here."

The **Breeders' Plate** is the annual starting point for what are considered the most high-class, precocious 2-year-old colts in **Sydney**, and when **Vancouver** strode to victory last year he was providing **Waterhouse** with her fourth-straight renewal of that event. In her first monthly column for the *TDN* in January ([click here](#)), **Waterhouse** described the 'non-negotiables' she has discovered in training her previous five **Slipper** winners, and as **Vancouver** progressed through the **Australian**

winter and early autumn, he continued to tick off each box.

Put away for the winter after the **Breeders' Plate**, **Vancouver** was partnered by **Berry** for the first time when winning the **G3 Canonbury S.** over 1100 meters at **Rosehill** Jan. 31. Some question marks arose

when **Vancouver** was removed from consideration for the **G2 Silver Slipper S.** Feb. 21, but he put any doubts to rest when roaring to victory in the **G2 Todman S.** over the **Slipper** distance at **Randwick** two weeks ago, soundly defeating **Furnaces (Aus) (Exceed and Excel {Aus})** and the previously unbeaten **Headwater (Aus) (Exceed and Excel {Aus})**. **Berry** continued the comparisons to **Pierro**--who won the **Silver Slipper** and **Todman** prior to the **Slipper**, **G1 Sires' Produce** and **G1 Champagne S.**--after the race.

"Like I said, he'll win the **Slipper** then go on and win the **Sires** and the **Champagne** by further," **Berry** said. "I've got one right. I hope I'm right about the other two. He just does it so easily. He had them covered easily today. He's a pleasure to ride." Cont. p10

Waterhouse wasn't as committed to the Triple Crown trail, however.

"He and Pierro are very similar," she told *Racing and Sports*. "They are both drop-dead gorgeous and incredibly masculine. But we'll just let the dust settle on today. I don't know whether this colt will go to the Sires'--I'm very mindful of his 3-year-old season. There has already been interest from studs and we want to make sure we do the right thing by him."

The Sires' Produce S. is on the first day of The Championships Apr. 4, with the Champagne three weeks later.

Of equaling her legendary father's Slipper record, Waterhouse said, "It's very exciting to be considered up there with my dad, and I'll tell you one thing, it was his training that did it, and nothing more."

Waterhouse credits her father for pushing her in her training career.

"The last words he said to me here at Rosehill before he died were, 'you make a man sick, you can't train the 2-year-olds,'" Waterhouse told *Racing and Sports*.

"When he passed away only two days after, I thought, 'I'm never going to let that be my thing.' He put me into motion."

Waterhouse trained her first Slipper winner, Ha Ha (Aus) (Danehill), three years later and brought up the trifecta that year.

Should Vancouver advance to the Sires' Produce and Champagne, those 1400-meter and one-mile contests, respectively, should be well within his scope. An A\$185,000 Magic Millions Gold Coast yearling from the Coolmore Stud draft last year, Vancouver is the 13th worldwide Group/Grade I winner and first Down Under for Medaglia d'Oro, who has also sired a pair of Group 3 winners in Australia and stands at Darley's Kelvinside Farm for A\$55,000. Vancouver is the first Golden Slipper winner for the Sadler's Wells sireline, and he also represents the highly prolific Sadler's Wells/Danehill cross that has been responsible for many Group 1 and Classic winners including Frankel (GB), Intello (Ger) and Golden Lilac (Ire), all by Galileo (Ire).

Vancouver is the second Group 1 winner out of Skates (Aus) (Danehill), who has also produced the Robert Sangster S. winner Juste Moment (Aus) (Giant's Causeway). The multiple stakes-placed Skates is herself closely related to Danehill-line stakes winners Murtajill (Aus) (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}) and Bradbury's Luck (Aus) (Redoute's Choice {Aus}). They are out of the Group 1 winner Skating (Aus) (Al Talaq), who recently died at Segenhoe Stud. Skates has a Pierro foal and is back in foal to Medaglia d'Oro.

A year ago, Irish galloper Gordon Lord Byron (Ire) (Byron {GB}) caused an upset when taking the G1 George Ryder S. at Rosehill. The lesson was clearly wasted on punters,

however, as they let Japanese raider Real Impact, a Group 1 winner in his homeland and victorious in the G2 Hanshin Cup last time out, set off at a neglected 10-1. The betting market was dominated by last year's G1 Caulfield Guineas

scorer **Shooting To Win (Aus)** (Northern Meteor {Aus}), but it proved a different story on the track as the 7-year-old Real Impact promptly made his presence felt despite starting from gate 12. **Cont. p11**

The son of Deep Impact set a solid pace under James McDonald, who was getting the leg-up for the very first time, and soon felt pressure from his rivals as the field entered the home straight. There was a lot left in the tank, though, and Real Impact fought on gamely, digging deep to fend off all challengers. As David Hayes and Tom Dabernig's dual Group 1 winner Criterion came along his inside and briefly put his head in front, the Japanese galloper still found extra to regain the lead and record a short head victory. The Chris Waller-trained 3-year-old Kermadec missed the break by a couple of lengths and was forced to settle at the rear, before coming home late to finish third, two lengths adrift. The second Japanese raider in the field, the better-fancied World Ace (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}) could only finish 11th and connections indicated that he would come on for the run.

Real Impact presented his native country with a third Group 1 trophy in Australia in almost 12 months, joining 2014 All-Aged S. scorer Hana's Goal (Jpn) (Orewa Matteruze {Jpn}) and G1 Caulfield Cup winner Admire Rakti (Jpn) (Heart's Cry {Jpn}). He is the only charge of trainer Noriyuki Hori to have made the trip Down Under ahead of next month's The Championships, and the conditioner commented through an interpreter, "We've received such great support and I'm very happy we've been able to repay it." Kiwi ace James McDonald was recording his second Group 1 win of the afternoon, following Contributor (Ire) (High Chaparral {Ire})'s performance in the G1 Ranvet S. and praised his mount's courage. "He's an awesome horse," he said. "He began really well and they said he can be a bit iffy [with the stalls] but he began and got into a lovely rhythm." The leading hoop continued, "I set him alight about 600 [meters] from home and he stayed on. [Criterion] fought really hard, but my horse found another gear once that horse got to him."

Real Impact (Jpn)'s next target is the A\$3 million G1 Doncaster Mile Apr. 4, where McDonald reckoned he would be hard to beat. The pair will be on for a rematch with runner-up Criterion, and co-trainer David Hayes commented, "It's a bit frustrating not to win, but it's good heading to the Championships."

No better than the fourth betting choice, Volkstok'n'barrell was prominent early for Williams, but was content to ease back into third and into the slipstream of Mongolian Khan, who was ridden unusually close to the pace of 150-1 outsider Pounamu (Aus) (Authorized {Ire}) by his regular pilot Opie Bosson. Hallowed Crown, narrowly favored over Randwick Guineas second Sweynessee (Aus) (Lonhro {Aus}) switched off nicely one from the tail, giving himself every chance to see out the 10-furlong trip. There was no change in the order as Pounamu took them into the final three furlongs, but the chief protagonists were winding up with their runs from the second flight. Hallowed Crown was gifted a run up the fence when Pounamu cornered wide into the stretch and Preferment launched his bid simultaneously, but Volkstok'n'barrell was letting down generously as Mongolian Khan weakened out. That trio fought it out into the final 50 meters, with Volkstok'n'barrell's superior stamina winning out on the day.

"Fantastic ride by Craig Williams, does he do his homework," winning conditioner Donna Logan told Racenet. "He knew the horse inside out when I spoke to him in the mounting yard. I came here really worried [if he'd measure up. We're good at home, but when you come here it's a different story. You're taking on real class horses and world class jockeys. I was worried--Ruakaka to Rosehill, my God, it's a big difference."

The win was especially sweet for Logan, whose longtime training partner and former husband Dean Logan passed away late last month after a battle with throat cancer.

"It's Dean's birthday, so thank God I did something right," she told Racenet.

Having only his fifth Australian start, Godolphin's Contributor produced the goods once again to claim his second consecutive Group 1 contest, this time the 2000-meter Ranvet S. at Rosehill. Starting a short-priced favorite against six opponents, including one from Japan and one from Hong Kong, Contributor

was held up by retained rider James McDonald to settle at the tail of the field, while the outsider Fast Dragon (Aus) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}) set leisurely early fractions. The tempo improved sharply with 800 meters to go as Fast Dragon (Aus) skipped over six lengths clear around the

home turn, but McDonald didn't panic and pushed Contributor along the inside before pulling off the heels of the tiring leader to surge to the lead.

So confident was McDonald that once clear of his rivals, he had a sustained look over his shoulder and, obviously satisfied with how far in front he was, put his whip away. Left to do battle for the places were Japan's recent Group 3 winner Tosen Stardom, who took second 1 1/4 lengths from the winner, and the pair of New Zealand-bred mares, Lucia Valentina and last year's Ranvet S. winner Silent Achiever (NZ) (O'Reilly {NZ}), who took third and fourth, respectively.

"I think he's stamped himself as one of the best horses in Australia," said McDonald of his mount, which he was riding to a fourth win from five starts Down Under, with the G3 David Jones Cup first up, the G2 Apollo S. and the G1 Chipping North S. three weeks ago preceding Saturday's triumph. Trainer John O'Shea, who recorded his first two wins at the highest level courtesy of the European import, praised the jockey's input in race tactics, saying, "James has always been adamant if we ride him a little bit quieter he'll accelerate better and you saw that today. It was a wonderful performance. That's why James is there for us because he does those things and gets them right." The conditioner added, "We've got to thank John Ferguson every day of the week for buying him."

The bloodstock advisor to Sheikh Mohammed Al Maktoum was on hand to watch Contributor toy with his rivals, and explained about the horse's path to Australia.

"Sheikh Mohammed saw this horse win at Royal Ascot, he won the Wolferton [H.], and we decided there and then that this could possibly be the horse for Australia. That's why he instructed me to buy him," Ferguson explained. **Cont. p13**

Contributer will now head to the A\$4-million G1 Queen Elizabeth S., the richest race of The Championships, where he is likely to start a hot favorite. Tosen Stardom will follow the same route and trainer Yasutoshi Ikee commented, "They went too steady and he will improve. It was first-up for him and his aim is the Queen Elizabeth."

Third behind the Waterhouse-trained Overreach (Aus) (Exceed and Excel {Aus}) in the 2013 Golden Slipper, Sweet Idea finally broke through at long odds for a richly deserved Group 1 success and give her trainer a double on the card.

Consistent throughout her career, but especially at this venue, the chestnut narrowly missed winning the G1 Coolmore Classic at this track last season, having won the G2 Light Fingers S. at Randwick a couple starts earlier and was returning to Rosehill first-up off a runner-up effort behind Bonaria (Aus) (Redoute's Choice {Aus}) in the G1 Myer Classic at Flemington Nov. 1.

Drawn four from the outside in stall 11, Sweet Idea was able to get over a bit to save at least some ground as favored Deep Field (Aus) (Northern Meteor {Aus}) burned across from the widest gate to set a strong pace. The front-runner appeared to be going well enough turning for home, but Blake Shinn was able to weave his way through traffic, shifted out wide at the furlong grounds and finished willingly for the victory. Kuro stayed on well for second ahead of Stonestreet Stables' Miracles of Life, who found herself far back in field and came with a solid late run to just drop a photo for second.

"She's an outstanding mare and I'm so thrilled for the connections. It's everything they've wanted," Waterhouse told Racing and Sports. "They just wanted the Group 1 and it has just eluded her that little bit. Blake rode her magically. He gave her time to settle. He let her get a breather and she just was too good the way she stormed home."

Sweet Idea could make her next start in the G1 T. J. Smith S. at The Championships at Randwick Apr. 4.

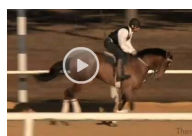

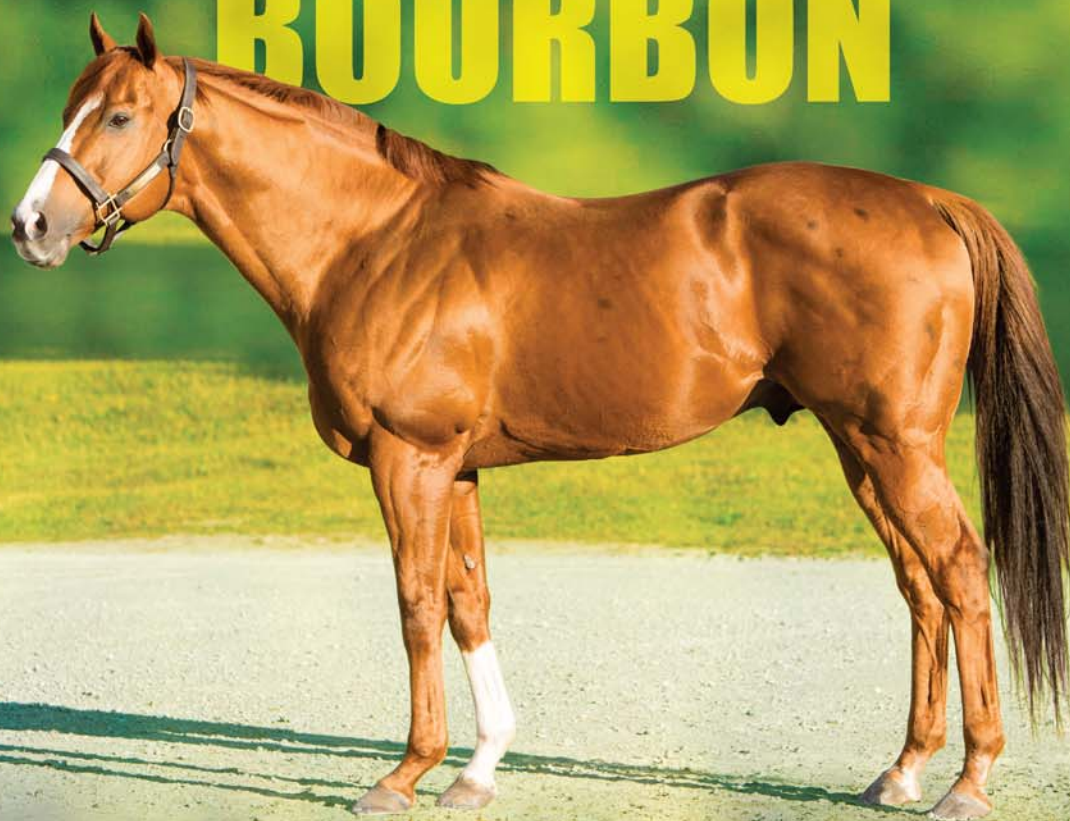

Figures Down at March Yearling Sale

A slightly smaller catalogue for the Cape Thoroughbred March Yearling Sale returned an aggregate down 26.8% from the 2014 edition at R28,190,000 (\$2,344,110), while the average price dipped 18%, reaching R118,945 (\$9,890). The median was the only indicator showing improvement, from R80,000 to R90,000 (\$7,483) (+ 12.5%). The clearance rate was once again very high at 92%. While six yearlings had achieved seven-figure prices last year, the dearest lot this time around was a R600,000 (\$49,892) colt by the Pivotal stallion Noordhoek Flyer (SAf), who will have his first juveniles on the track this season. [Lot 77](#) is out of the black type mare Tin Legs (SAf) (Western Winter {SAf}) and was knocked down to Markus Jooste's Mayfair Speculators, one of the leading investors on the South African scene who also made a splash in Europe last year, notably buying a €1.1 million Invincible Spirit (Ire) half-brother to the Group 1 winning filly Chicquita (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) at Deauville. The colt is now in training with Andre Fabre.

The leading purchaser with five lots bought for a total R2,175,000 was Rainbow Beach Trading. All graduates of the March Yearling Sale are eligible to run in a pair of races worth \$500,000 each, run at Turffontein over distances of 1160 meters and 1600 meters, with a \$1 million bonus going to the owner who would win both contests. Argentinian Group 1 Winning Mare Joins Delzangles

Pretty Girl (Arg) (Harlan's Holiday), a Group 1 winner and unbeaten in three starts in her native country, has arrived at the Chantilly stable of Mikel Delzangles to continue her career in Europe. She is owned by Brazilian Gilberto Sayao, who operates Stud RDI in his native country and bought a 100-hectare former dairy property in Normandy in 2013, which is currently being developed into a state-of-the-art stud farm. Sayao currently has seven horses in training in France, all with Delzangles. Most of them were bought at the European yearling sales by Sayao's advisor Philippe Jousset of France Turf International. Pretty Girl, who will turn four in August, was last seen when winning the 2000-meter G1 Gran Premio Copa de Plata by 3 1/2 lengths, and Delzangles told *Jour de Galop*, "We'll give her time to settle into her new surroundings, including from a climate point of view. She won't run until the Summer."
