DAY SIEZED IN BLUE GRASS

WinStar Farm and Stonestreet Stable's **Carpe Diem** (Giant's Causeway) showed the road to Louisville on the first Saturday in May can once again run through Lexington as he rolled home an easy three-length winner of Saturday's GI Toyota Blue Grass S. at Keeneland. "It was awesome," said Stonestreet owner Barbara Banke. "We knew we had a great horse. Todd [Pletcher] had him in great shape. I was happy to see that he loaded into the gate nicely. He broke well. And then, it was just a matter of Johnny [Velazquez] telling him to go at the right time and he went. It was really nice race. Like some of the other great horses I have had, he is a fighter and a contender."

The 2-5 favorite popped away from the stalls and shadowed **Ocho Ocho Ocho** (Street Sense) through an even pace. Ocho Ocho Ocho looked determined and carried a narrow lead into the lane, but Carpe Diem hit the gas at the head of the stretch and quickly put the race to bed. **Danzig Moon** (Malibu Moon) put in a decent run while four wide on the turn and stayed on for second, ahead of Ocho Ocho Ocho in third. With the victory, Carpe Diem becomes the first dirt horse to win Keeneland's GI Breeders' Futurity and Blue Grass since Round Table achieved the feat in 1956-57. *Cont. p4*

FINALLY FROSTED

Godolphin homebred **Frosted** (Tapit) finally delivered on the promise he showed in last year's GII Remsen S., driving to a two-length victory in Saturday's GI Twinspires.com Wood Memorial at Aqueduct. An ultra-game second despite a pronounced speed bias in last year's GII Remsen S., the gray colt was 5 1/2 lengths adrift of Upstart (Flatter) when second in the Jan. 24 GII Holy Bull S. He looked en route to certain victory in the Feb. 21 GII Fountain of Youth S. before fading harmlessly to fourth. "This has been a top, special project for my team, my brother, the grooms, etc," said winning trainer Kiaran McLaughlin. "We know he has a ton of ability and the last race really made us scratch our heads, asking 'Why?' He would go to the lead and throw his head up and stop. We did everything we could to change everything we possibly could that we thought went wrong, including the jockey just because we were changing everything. It all worked out and it's just a special win for our team and Godolphin because he's a homebred [by Tapit] and it enhances his resume by winning a race like the Wood." *Cont. p6*

DEVASTATING DORTMUND

Dortmund (Big Brown) remained unbeaten with a scintillating 4 1/4-length victory in Saturday's GI Santa Anita Derby. Kaleem Shah's juggernaut now heads to Louisville with a perfect six-for-six record and a pair of Grade I victories in tow. He will be looking to become the first unbeaten winner of the GI Kentucky Derby since his sire Big Brown won the Roses in 2008.

"Just to have a horse in the Santa Anita Derby is a thrill, but to run this well and win it, is unbelievable," admitted Shah.

"Ever since the San Felipe, this has been like March Madness for me. To be going to the Kentucky Derby with an undefeated horse like this and to be compared to horses like Seattle Slew and Smarty Jones is just amazing."

Trainer Bob Baffert, who will saddle juvenile champion **American Pharoah** (Pioneerof the Nile) in next week's GI Arkansas Derby, remained cautiously optimistic. "The feeling is like we've been here before; just enjoy the moment because the next race is going to be the one," Baffert said. "It's good to see this horse just really developing the way he has from his first start. I just love the way he ran today." *Cont. p3*

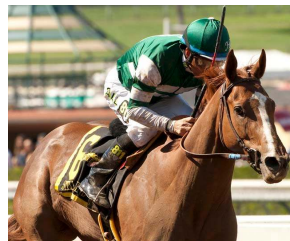

Devastating Dortmund (cont. from p1)

Dortmund was away with a little stutter step from his inside post, but recovered quickly and had a narrow advantage going into the first turn. Stablemate and 'TDN Rising Star' One Lucky Dane (Lookin at Lucky) and Cross the Line (Line of David) chased the 3-5 favorite, but the strapping chestnut always looked to be travelling with supreme ease through fractions of :22.46 and :46.36. Martin Garcia asked Dortmund for more turning for home and the colt lengthened his stride and effortlessly sailed clear down the lane.

Perfect in his three tries as a juvenile, including a victory over Firing Line (Line of David) in the GI Los Alamitos Futurity in December, Dortmund narrowly defeated that rival in the Gill Robert B. Lewis S. Feb. 7, and though some thought was given to passing the race, defeated Prospect Park (Tapit) and Bolo (Temple City) last time out in the Gill San Felipe S. Mar. 7.

"When we bought him, he looked like a really good horse, but he was just a big horse, and sometimes they don't turn out," Baffert said of Dortmund, purchased for \$140,000 at last year's Fasig-Tipton Midlantic May sale.

"He's a big, long-legged horse," Baffert continued. "When he made the lead and when he gets by himself like that, he'll idle on you a little bit, so he had to keep going."

Baffert added that One Lucky Dane also earned a trip to Louisville with his runner-up effort Saturday. "One Lucky Dane, he's a good horse," Baffert said. "He showed that last time. This distance is not going to be a problem for him. He'll go to the Derby. He qualified in Bob Baffert's eyes [in addition to qualifying points]. I don't need 40 points. They've got to qualify in my eyes."

"I've got respect for Ocho Ocho, and I think all the California horses are strong," said winning trainer Todd Pletcher. "We kind of anticipated [Ocho Ocho] might be the pacesetter. He set a :24 and :48 and you don't expect to put a horse away easily with those kind of fractions. But I liked what I saw [from my horse] the last eighth of a mile."

Connections of runner-up Danzig Moon are also thinking Churchill Downs. "He ran a big race and with a better trip we might have been even closer," said Norman Casse, assistant to his father Mark Casse. "I'm just glad the real Danzig Moon showed up today and showed that he's a serious racehorse. This race is redeeming because we thought he had a big shot at Tampa and he ran a bad fourth [behind Carpe Diem]. But I think he just didn't handle the track that day and today is a better indication of his ability."

Jim Cassidy, trainer of 'TDN Rising Star' Ocho Ocho, was keeping options open for the third-place finisher. "His effort was fine," Cassidy said. "I knew [Carpe Diem] was going to go with us. I'm sure Pletcher wasn't going to change his style, but he knew we were going to go and he didn't want us to open up too much on him. It was a hell of a match race there for a bit. We'll see what happens after this. I don't think I have any big plans right at the moment."

Carpe Diem, the \$1.6-million co-topper at the 2014 OBS March Sale, won the first two starts of his career, including Keeneland's GI Breeders' Futurity S. in just his second career appearance. The strapping chestnut was along for second, behind Texas Red (Afleet Alex) and just ahead of Upstart (Flatter), in last year's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile at Santa Anita Nov. 1. He was prepared to make his seasonal reappearance in the GII Tampa Bay Derby Mar. 7 and sat a pocket trip before outclassing that octet by five comfortable lengths.

A stakes winner and graded stakes placed on the track, Rebridled Dreams is the dam of multiple group placed Doncaster Rover (War Chant), as well as 2010 GI Dixiana Breeders' Futurity winner J. B.'s Thunder (Thunder Gulch). The 15-year-old mare produced a colt by Distorted Humor in 2013 and a filly by Malibu Moon in 2014. Her Disorted Humor colt sold to Spendthrift Farm for \$525,000 at last year's Keeneland September sale. She was bred back to Speightstown.

Finally Frosted in the Wood (cont. from p1)

Returning to the track over which he scored his maiden victory last October, Frosted was sent off at 2-1. Unhurried early, the gray found himself in last while racing three wide into the first turn. He tugged his way into closer order as **Toasting Master** (Congrats) and favored **Daredevil** (More Than Ready) set tepid fractions up front. Frosted was four wide turning for home as longshot **Tencendur** (Warrior's Reward) skipped clear into the stretch. The Godolphin homebred reeled in that New York-bred foe while under a hand ride from Joel Rosario and spurted clear in the final sixteenth.

"He didn't break that sharp and I didn't really want to send him out of there and be on the lead," Rosario said. "He was always there for me. I tried to get him to the outside, where he'd be comfortable. The whole way, he was taking me. That was a very good race. I wasn't concerned with [Tencendur] because I know when you ask him, he's always there for you."

Trainer George Weaver briefly thought he had the Wood winner when Tencendur turned for home in front. "I thought we had it turning for home and opened up, but I was watching from the ground [level] and I couldn't see what Kiaran's horse was doing," Weaver said. "We ran big. We were happy. I'm from Louisville and I'd love to run in the Derby. As long as the horse is in good shape, I'd be inclined to go."

The Gill Gotham S. winner **El Kabeir** (Scat Daddy), relegated to last at the halfway point, was ridden fairly quietly by C. C. Lopez on the turn and lengthened well enough in the stretch to be third. "He was running at the end," observed trainer John Terranova. "I watched him gallop out and he passed everybody. He was finishing really well but there wasn't any pace to soften up the frontrunners. We'll see how he is and figure it out from there. If he comes back out of this well, I think we'll get a lot stronger pace in a race like the Derby, and he can sit back and close. He's done that twice. I thought he made up a lot of ground there in the stretch."

Favored Daredevil's fourth-place effort was a puzzle for jockey Javier Castellano. "It wasn't perfect for us, the fractions were really slow but we had a good pace and a good rhythm," Castellano said. "I was really kind of surprised at how he finished the race."

"I really don't know why," Castellano continued. "He seemed fine. He pulled up good. But I couldn't go with the rhythm at the 3/8-pole and when I tried to move and go with the other horse, I couldn't keep up with them. I didn't finish today. I just didn't have it."

Frosted is out of Stonerside Stable homebred Fast Cookie (Deputy Minister), winner of the 2003 GII Cotillion H. Out of multiple graded stakes winner Fleet Lady, Fast Cookie is a half-sister to champion juvenile Midshipman (Unbridled's Song). The 15-year-old mare produced fillies by Bernardini in 2013 and 2014. She was bred back to Tiznow.

BAFFERT AND PLETCHER OWN THE DAY. SO WHAT ELSE IS NEW? *By Bill Finley*

Yes, anything is possible, particularly when it comes to a 20-horse rodeo where form sometimes goes out the window. But can you really see someone other than Todd Pletcher or Bob Baffert winning the Kentucky Derby?

Whatever chance those not named Todd or Bob had of winning the Derby diminished significantly yesterday as the two big guns from the sport's two most prominent stables performed magnificently.

Carpe Diem (Giant's Causeway) always did look like Pletcher's best hope for winning the Kentucky Derby and he looks even better now that he turned in a dominating performance in the GI Toyota Blue Grass S. at Keeneland. This is a horse without a flaw. He is beautifully bred, he is fast and classy and he has had a perfect route to the Kentucky Derby, winning at Tampa Bay prior to yesterday.

Pletcher might have everything he needs to win his second Kentucky Derby, but it wouldn't hurt if he went out and bought a Baffert voodoo doll. It's quite possible that the only thing that stands between Pletcher and a Kentucky Derby win with Carpe Diem (or maybe Materiality?) is Mr. Baffert.

There weren't many knocks on **Dortmund** (Big Brown) coming into yesterday's Santa Anita Derby, but if you absolutely had to find one, it was that he never blew his competition away. His last three wins came by the margins of 1 1/4 lengths, a head and another head. That was not at all the story yesterday.

He was a winner every step of the way, controlling the pace while comfortably in hand under Martin Garcia before drawing off to a dominant win. As is the case with Carpe Diem, it's impossible to find a flaw with this horse, who is undefeated in six starts and has already won over the tricky Churchill Downs surface.

For good measure Baffert finished second in the Santa Anita Derby with the improving **One Lucky Dane** (Lookin at Lucky), who stamped his ticket to the Kentucky Derby with the effort.

While Baffert could not have had a better day, the Pletcher barn had a serious setback in the GI Twinpires.com Wood Memorial as favorite **Daredevil** (More Than Ready) looked nothing like a serious Kentucky Derby contender when finishing fourth. Either he's not that good or he's ill suited to nine furlongs and longer.

The Wood winner **Frosted** (Tapit) will give Godolphin another crack at the Kentucky Derby, a race noticeably lacking on its resume. He's a tough read. Running against the grain of a huge rail bias, he finished second in the Remsen last year and entered Derby prep season near the top of most everyone's Top 10 list. Then his stock fell with a second-place finish in the Holy Bull and a dull fourth in the Fountain of Youth. Was yesterday a case of Frosted finally putting it all together or him beating a weak field? Either way, his win lacked the sizzle that was so evident at Santa Anita and Keeneland.

It was also, of course, a day that saw a handful of notable horses run their way out of the Kentucky Derby picture. There were a lot of people jumping on the bandwagons of **Bolo** (Temple City) and **Prospect Park** (Tapit) prior to the Santa Anita Derby, but neither ran well enough for anyone to believe they have a serious chance 27 days from now in Louisville.

That may not be the case with Gotham winner **El Kabeir** (Scat Daddy), who finished third in the Wood Memorial. With veteran Chuck C. Lopez aboard, he was ridden like the only objective was to get some exercise as a warm-up for the Derby. He was kept curiously far back early before offering only a mild bid on his way to a non-threatening third.

He will likely run better in the Kentucky Derby, but that probably doesn't mean a thing, as Pletcher and Baffert have so many potent weapons between them that everyone else might be racing for third and fourth.

Baffert will likely have the Derby favorite, which will either be Dortmund or **American Pharoah** (Pioneerof the Nile). The latter will be 1-5 or lower next week in the last major prep left, the GI Arkansas Derby. Baffert's team will likely be rounded out by One Lucky Dane.

Carpe Diem will be right up there, the second or third choice. And it's not impossible that he will be the favorite. Unless the bettors fall in love with the UAE Derby winner **Mubtaahij (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire}), Florida Derby winner **Materiality** (Afleet Alex) looks like the fourth choice. Pletcher's lineup could also include GII Fountain of Youth winner (via disqualification) **Itsaknockout** (Lemon Drop Kid) and GII Louisiana Derby runner-up **Stanford** (Malibu Moon).

That would mean seven of the 20 starters will be either Baffert or Pletcher horses and the top four choices in the betting could come from those two barns. Thirteen or so other stables will also be involved in the Derby, but, for them, it figures to be a long afternoon.

Circling the field on the backstretch, the chestnut was on even terms with Luminance turning for home, swiftly shut the door on that rival in the lane and cruised clear to a dominating victory. The win was extra special for owner Kosta Hronis. "I've been coming to this track my whole life to win that race," Hronis, who co-owns Stellar Wind with his brother Peter, said. "We've always attended this track growing up and to come to Derby Day and watch these special races and to be part of it was really amazing. And to win it; once we saw she was going to win the race, I just stood up and I was in awe that we could be part of it. She looked good all the way around. She looked comfortable. I knew if she didn't get caught in traffic and she was sitting out it would be great. If you keep the best horse out of trouble, that's a good sign and Victor [Espinoza] kept her out of trouble. I thought we maybe moved a little bit too early, but she's a really talented filly. She wasn't going to be caught today."

Winning trainer John Sadler thinks his charge will only get better the further they go. "She really wants more distance," revealed Sadler. "This horse has a tremendous amount of stamina. It worked well last time [in the Santa Ysabel]. She broke a little slow [in that race] and settled off kind of a slow pace, and so today, I said, 'I wouldn't change anything. Do what you've been doing.'" Sadler confirmed Stellar Wind will now head to Louisville. "The plan is to go the GI Kentucky Oaks," he said. "That's the idea. It's a month away, so the spacing is right. Hopefully, we'll be there the day before the Derby." **Cont. p9**

Last year's GI Kentucky Derby-winning jockey Victor Espinoza admitted the Kentucky Oaks was on his mind Saturday. "Today, I rode her a little bit more because I think she needs a good race before going into the Kentucky Oaks," Espinoza said. "Her last race was too easy for her. I wanted a harder race for her today. I think she's a Kentucky Oaks filly. I have confidence because she can do anything. That's what I like about her. I can put her inside, I can swing her to the outside, I can go wide and it's still OK. She's such a big filly, with such a long stride that it's easy for her."

Stellar Wind is the first foal out of the Keswick Stable's bred Evening Star. The 9-year-old mare produced a filly by Exchange Rate in 2013 and a colt by Birdstone in 2014. She was bred back to Run Away and Hide.

The victory marked the first Grade I tally for the aforementioned journeyman rider.

"It's been 40 years in the making," Clark commented. "I thank God for Mr. Brereton Jones and Larry Jones--I wouldn't be here if not for them."

He continued, "It was a great trip. I thought I'd be more forwardly placed, maybe even on the lead. She's a nice filly just coming into her own and you can pretty much put her wherever you want her to be. She relaxed nice. Down the backside she's laying third and her ears are flicking back and forth, and I thought 'Boy, this is pretty good.' When I called on her she just accelerated."

Lovely Maria, a debut winner going five furlongs at Delaware last September, finished a well-beaten second behind recent GIII Honeybee S. heroine Sarah Sis (Sharp Humor) in an allowance sprinting over this course last fall. A narrow runner-up in an optional tagger at Fair Grounds in late November, she concluded her 2-year-old campaign with a disappointing fourth as the 2-1 favorite while making her two-turn bow in a muddy renewal of Remington's Trapeze S. Dec. 14.

"I saw some pretty serious speed--and she does stalk--so I told Junior [Alvarado] the strategy was up to him," said Samantha Randazzo, assistant to winning trainer Linda Rice. "If she went to the lead, it was fine or if she found herself in a stalking position, that was OK too. Junior rode a wonderful race. This was the best race of her career so far."

Stopchargingmaria was making her first start since finishing second in the GI Beldame Invitational last September and her first for new owners Town and Country Farms. "We knew she'd probably get outrun in the first part of the race, so we basically wanted to try to get her going down the backstretch, and she did," commented John Velazquez, aboard the runner-up. "She put in a good effort and when I pulled her out she put up a fight. She just got a little tired at the end."

Favored Lady Sabelia tired down the lane and finished last of six. "She broke out of the gate like she usually does and took the lead nice and comfortable," jockey Horacio Karamanos said of the beaten favorite. "I had plenty of horse to the five-sixteenths. I asked a little bit at the quarter pole and she gave me a little kick, but when the others came, she didn't try."

The late bloodstock agent Buzz Chace signed the ticket at \$275,000 to purchase Lady Rapper on behalf of Schwartz at the 2006 Keeneland September sale. The mare raced just twice and Princess Violet is her second foal. She produced a colt by War Chant in 2013 and a First Defence filly in 2014. She was bred back to Candy Ride (Arg) last year. Princess Violet's second dam is Grade I placed She's Got the Beat.

He chased home recent G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen eighth-place finisher Salutos Amigos (Salute the Sarge) in his last three trips to the post, including a pair of second-place finishes over the inner track in the GIII Toboggan S. Feb. 7 and GIII Tom Fool H. Mar. 7, respectively.

Last year's narrow GI Vosburgh S. runner-up was hard held on the inside in third after breaking from post one as longshot Green Gratto set fractions of :22.73 and :46.41. Loaded for bear at the top of the stretch beneath Jose Ortiz, he was swung off the rail shortly thereafter and brushed with comebacking two-time Grade I winner Palace (City Zip), who was beginning to tire. Dads Caps never lost his momentum, however, and kicked clear down the lane to become only the sixth back-to-back winner in the 115-year history of the Carter. Favored 'TDN Rising Star' The Big Beast (Yes It's True), winner of last summer's GI King's Bishop S., got going too late to finish fourth. Trainer Rudy Rodriguez also saddled GII Gazelle S. heroine Condo Commando (Tiz Wonderful) on the undercard.

"Very nice day," Rodriguez said. "I said to Jose [Ortiz], don't go crazy. It worked out perfect. To win this race back-to-back is amazing. This is a good horse to be around, and we've had him since he was a baby, so it's special. A day like this means a lot to all of us; you work hard, and it pays off. Hopefully, it can just keep coming."

Ortiz added, "I followed the instructions that Rudy [Rodriguez] gave me, he wanted to come from off the pace today, and it worked out great. The horse was great, I had to wait a little on the turn, but I had a lot of horse so I just wanted to wait and follow the instructions Rudy gave me. I want to thank Rudy and his staff--they do a tremendous job--and the owner Vincent Scuderi for always supporting me."

Four-time winner Seeking the Silver (Grindstone) was claimed by winning owner/breeder Vincent Scuderi for \$20,000 out of her career finale--a well-beaten-fifth--at the Big A in 2004. After producing Dads Caps in 2010, she produced last year's GII Matron S. heroine Paulsilverlining, who also carries Scuderi's black-and-red silks. The 'splashtastic' 13 1/4-length winner of the GI Spinaway S. in Tom Durkin's final call Aug. 31, the dark bay was a no-excuses fourth at odds-on in the GI Frizette S. Oct. 4, but closed her season with a coast-to-coast, 11 1/2-length tally in the GII Demoiselle S. over this course and distance Nov. 29. She picked up where she left off in the Feb. 21 Busher S., running out 4 3/4 lengths the best as the 1-5 chalk and was the odds-on selection for this return to the graded ranks.


Surprisingly beaten for speed through the opening quarter mile by 'TDN Rising Star' Puca, Condo Commando ultimately took up the running entering the backstretch. **Cont. p13**

Joel Rosario was able to slow the pace down just a bit and was always traveling well before Jacaranda (Congrats), Noble and a Beauty (Noble Cornerstone) and a four-wide Wonder Gal (Tiz Wonderful) stacked up to her outside, in that order. But Condo Commando kicked it into another gear a furlong and a half from home and pinched a winning break before holding a resurgent Puca in the run to the wire. Money'soncharlotte looked to bounce off the rail at the furlong marker, but re-rallied for some graded black-type in third.

"I was surprised to see [Puca] going with me early," the winning jockey admitted. "I didn't know how fast we were going, but it seemed like a good pace. I just sat quiet on the outside for a little bit to see what [Manuel Franco, rider aboard Puca] would do. When he took back, I went [to the front]. She's a big filly and she did it easy; she just kept her long stride going. When I turned for home, I pushed her a little bit and she was there for me."

March launched a rally on the turn, came out into the stretch and drifted out late, but found the line narrowly ahead of the luckless Lord Nelson to take Saturday's GIII Bay Shore S.

A debut second going 6 1/2 furlongs over this surface Nov. 29, the \$320,000 Keeneland November purchase successfully stretched out to break his maiden going a mile and 70 yards over the inner track Jan. 11. The

dark bay was tested for class last time and attended the pace in the GIII Withers S. Feb. 7, but weakened in the final eighth of a mile to finish fifth, five lengths adrift of the victorious [Far From Over](#) (Blame).

Turning back in distance, March was dropped immediately out the back of the pack early as longshot [Papa Upa](#) ([Kantharos](#)) set the early fractions of :23.05 for the quarter and :46.79 to the half from [Easy to Say](#) ([Eskendereya](#)), who had broken through the stalls pre-start. The 82-1 outsider turned them in and soon had [Ready for Rye](#) ([City Zip](#)) bearing down on him, but, switched March began to find his best stride from between horses on the turn and was shifted out five wide into the lane. The LaPenta runner closed stoutly down the center to overtake [Ready for Rye](#) and was just able to hold despite his wayward ways late.

[Lord Nelson](#), off slowly, was hustled up the inside by Joel Rosario, but looked to lose his action when checked sharply behind [Ready for Rye](#) leaving the 4 1/2-furlong marker. Out of camera range at the half-mile pole, the GII San Vicente S. hero was ultimately guided to the far outside to avoid the kickback, hopped back into the bridle and came home under a full head of steam to just miss in a remarkable effort. The inquiry sign went up, as March appeared to drift a few paths in deep stretch. No contact was made, however, and the result was allowed to stand.

"I had a good trip," commented winning rider Irad Ortiz Jr. "My horse was coming from longer races; we just wanted to break good and come from behind, and he did it. The trainer did a great job with him. My horse came out a little bit at the end, but I think the [stewards] made the right decision."

Of the runner-up, Rosario offered, "He was jumping a little early. I tried to put him in the race a little bit, get him up closer to the pace, but he didn't want to be there. He backed up, backed up, [and] then I had to take him way in the middle of the track so he wouldn't get hit with dirt. He just kept on running; it was a very impressive race."

A well-beaten fifth behind subsequent GI Forward Gal S. one-two finishers Birdatthewire (Summer Bird) and Lassofthemohicans (Indian Charlie) when extended to 1 1/16 miles at Churchill Nov. 29, Include Betty earned her diploma in her sophomore bow going a mile and 40 yards at Tampa Jan. 3. Successful once again at odds of 18-1 in the Suncoast S. at that track and trip Jan. 31, she came running late for fifth when switched to the turf for the

GIII Florida Oaks Mar. 7. Totally overlooked by the bettors in this return to the main track, Include Betty broke alertly from the 11-hole and was carried out a bit by her neighbor rounding the first turn. Biding her time at the back of the pack through opening splits of :23.71 and :47.91, the sophomore uncorked a furious rally while running six wide on the backstretch to put herself in contention at the top of the lane.

Mirroring Achiever's Legacy's move towards the rail in the stretch, the chestnut seemed to be herding that one in a bit, but the two never made contact. Include Betty gamely outkicked that rival and held off a late bid from Oceanwave to secure her first graded stakes win. Joe Rocco Jr., rider of Achiever's Legacy, lodged an objection, but after a long look, the stewards upheld the original order of finish. "This is an amazing little filly," winning rider Rosemary Homeister said. "I was in the 11-hole, but I wasn't all that concerned because she is a closer. I had so much horse down the backstretch, which is unusual for her because she likes to drop way out. I decide to go wide into the stretch and Joe [Rocco Jr.] and I did start going at it around the turn. I was trying to keep him in because I knew he was on one of the horses to beat. Down the lane it was just race riding. I just had so much horse. She really dug in to win the race." The winner is a half to GI Hollywood Starlet S. runner-up and 'TDN Rising Star' Blonde Fog (Divine Park) (\$124,320), and also traces her lineage back to MGISW My Trusty Cat (Tale of the Cat). Her dam Betty's Solution produced a Haynesfield filly named Solid Solution in 2013, was barren in 2014 and foaled a Proud Citizen filly this year.

CRK Stable's Kobe's Back proved that he is indeed back in winning form with a rallying triumph in the GIII Commonwealth S. Saturday afternoon at Keeneland, his second start under the care of trainer Peter Eurton. Winless in over a year, the grey overcame a slow start and launched a prolonged last-to-first here.

Making his second start off a seven-month layoff, Kobe's Back was sent postward as the third choice in a closely matched field. Never good from the stalls, the colt broke slowly from the gate and spotted the field roughly 10 lengths in the early going as Rocket Time cut out fractions of :23.19 and :45.95. Edging closer under steady encouragement from Hall of Famer Gary Stevens on the far turn, Kobe's Back

angled out at the top of the lane and began to pick off rivals down the center of the track. Engaged in battle with C. Zee to his inside, he poked a head in front in the final yards and narrowly prevailed.

"He had a lot of gears left coming into the stretch," said Stevens. "I was able to save ground until about the five-sixteenths pole, then I had to make a decision--was I going in or out? There was nowhere to go inside. And I didn't want to get him stopped. He just motored on the through the lane. I can't wait to stretch him out a little bit."

The Commonwealth was Kobe's Back's second graded stakes triumph at the seven-furlong distance, having annexed the GII San Vicente S. for sophomores while trained by John Sadler last February. Also third in Aqueduct's GIII Bay Shore S. a year ago, he closed out his spring campaign with a pair of fourth-place efforts in the GIII Laz Barrera Memorial S. and the GII Woody Stephens S. He made one more start in 2014--a punchless fifth-place run in the GI Bing Crosby S. sprinting six panels over the Polytrack at Del Mar July 27--and was sidelined following that effort.

Kobe's Back hinted at a return to top form in his first start in the Eurton barn, rallying behind a modest pace to finish second by 3/4 of a length behind Wild Dude (Wildcat Heir) in the GII San Carlos S. at Santa Anita Mar. 7. Away a bit slow from the gate in that effort, Eurton said that he was a bit surprised to see his charge in the same position in the Commonwealth.

"There didn't appear to be a lot of pace on paper, and the fact he broke bad, so where else was he going to go?" commented the trainer. "They did set some pretty good fractions. He just shows you how good he is."

A nose second in this race in 2013 and third last year, the gelding has collected several graded stakes victories at Woodbine, including the 2012 and 2013 renewals of the GII Connaught Cup and last July's GII Highlander S. A bit overlooked by the bettors in this seasonal bow, Something Extra jumped out of the gate to seize the early advantage and doled out red-hot splits of :21.38 and :44.55 from the fence. Spurting clear in the lane, the dark bay kept on finding to repel a late bid from Channel Marker and earn his first win outside of Canada. "He had a great trip," winning trainer Gail Cox commented. "[Jockey] Shaun [Bridgmohan] let him do whatever he wanted. Funny, we always thought he liked really, really hard, firm turf, but he loved this [yielding turf course]." Bridgmohan added, "He was pretty content there [on the lead]. He broke so sharply. Gail and I spoke about it, and all she said was 'just make sure he's happy.' He was happy being there."

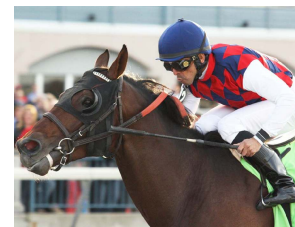

"You could see, she meant to be on the lead, and Joe did a great job," Mandella said. "I was lacking confidence, and I told Joe, 'If you're not sure she can get the last quarter, get off and run yourself.' He didn't have to." The winner's dam produced a colt by Lilbourne Lad (Ire) in 2013 and has not had another foal since. Spirit of Xian's owner Ben Keswick of Hong Kong also campaigned 2013 G1 Coronation S. winner Sky Lantern (Ire) (Red Clubs {Ire}).

DUBAI SKY SIDELINED

Three Chimneys Farm and Besilu Stable's **Dubai Sky** (Candy Ride {Arg}), winner of the Mar. 21 GIII Spiral S., suffered a condylar fracture to his left hind cannon bone during a gallop at Churchill Downs Saturday.

"The fracture was surgically repaired by Dr. Larry Bramlage at Rood and Riddle earlier this [Saturday] afternoon and Dubai Sky has recovered from surgery and is now safely back in his stall," reported Three Chimneys' Chief Operating Officer Chris Baker. "He will be out of training for several months, but with appropriate healing should make it back to the races."

Godolphin and Appleby Secure All-Weather Titles:

Godolphin was crowned leading all-weather owner, after participating in just their first All-Weather Championships Finals Day at Lingfield on Good Friday. Charlie Appleby trained three Listed winners over the Lingfield all-weather, bringing Godolphin's tally to 98 successes between Oct. 30, 2014 and Apr. 3, 2015. Appleby also gained the title of leading all-weather trainer with 76 wins. "It's a great privilege to be crowned champion on the all-weather, and it has been a big team effort from everyone concerned," the conditioner told *Gulf News*, "It's something we've never done in Godolphin before here in the UK, have a team of horses for the winter. From our perspective, it's been great. The yard has been kept active--we regrouped during the course of last year and put a team of people together and everyone has slotted in to their roles well," commented the 40-year-old, who was appointed as Godolphin trainer in July 2013 in the wake of the Al Zarooni scandal.

Appleby also praised the concept and organization of the All-Weather Championships. "There's been a great programme set out on the all-weather, the prize money has been great and sponsorships have been brilliant," he said. "There's a lovely array of races out there, black type and listed races and good handicaps to be won. It can only raise the profile of all-weather racing. You need a decent horse to turn up and win nowadays--people will say that's what we've got, but we've got to keep them fit and well during the winter. It's a two-way deal, all-weather racing has done well for it all and we've done particularly well."

Yoshidas, Inglis, Team Valor to Race in Korea:

The Korean Turf Club has reported that Team Valor's Barry Irwin, Arthur Inglis and Katsumi and Shunsuke Yoshida of Japan's Northern Farm are among the international owners that have obtained a license to race horses in Korea. Foreign owners have only been recently allowed in the country and will be required to comply with a number of conditions, including owning four Korean-bred horses for each foreign-bred horse they import to Korea. There is also a restriction on the total number of new foreign-bred horses that can join each racecourse in a single year: 160 at Seoul and 120 at Busan. Katsumi and Shunsuke Yoshida bought their first locally-bred horses at a 2-year-old sale held in Jeju last week.
