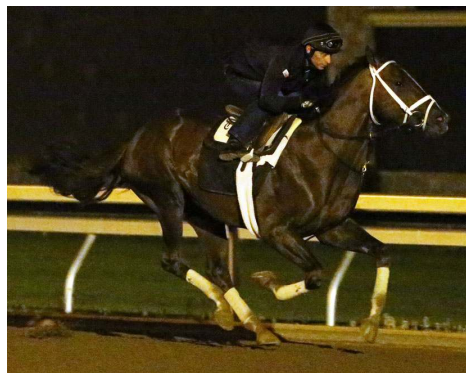

CARPE DIEM PLEASURES IN LAST DERBY BREEZE

Stonestreet Stables and WinStar Farm's **Carpe Diem** (Giant's Causeway) worked a half-mile in :48.60 at Keeneland under regular rider John Velazquez in his final move before the May 2 GI Kentucky Derby. It was the second fastest work of 63 at the distance.

The 'TDN Rising Star' was clocked in splits of :13, :25 and :48.60 with gallop out fractions of 1:01.20, 1:14.80 and 1:29.40.

"I thought he worked super," trainer Todd Pletcher said. "He seemed to get over the ground really well. We got fortunate with the weather; looks like most of the rain kind of went south of here. Perfect track. The track was in excellent condition. He seemed to handle it really well, finished up strongly, galloped out good."

Velazquez, who chose to ride Carpe Diem in the Derby over undefeated GI Florida Derby winner Materiality (Afleet Alex), was also pleased with the bay's work.

"We took it little by little in the first part of the work and then finished up really good," the Hall of Famer said.

Pletcher's other Derby contenders had their final works yesterday at Churchill, but the conditioner chose to keep Carpe Diem at Keeneland due to his affinity for the track. Winner of the GI Breeders' Futurity over this strip last fall, the hulking bay followed his GII Tampa Bay Derby victory Mar. 7 with a win in this venue's GI Toyota Blue Grass S. Apr. 4.

"He really loves the surface here," Pletcher said. "We were a little concerned with how the weather was going to play out. Today was the day we wanted to breeze him. We had a lot more confidence in the surface being good here at Keeneland. This surface has impressed us quite a bit--the way it handles moisture, rain."

Pletcher added, "He's continued to develop. He's really in a good place now. He's just very happy with himself, content, galloping well; his appetite's good. Just all the indications you'd like to see leading up to a big race. He's giving us all the right signs."

DORTMUND CRUISES IN LAST DERBY BREEZE

Kaleem Shah's undefeated **Dortmund** (Big Brown) pleased trainer Bob Baffert in his final GI Kentucky Derby work, going six furlongs in 1:13.60 (19/33) in company with Lady Bull (Zensational) at Santa Anita Saturday morning.

Baffert was looking for a more controlled breeze after last week's speedy five-furlong work in :58.80, and guided jockey Martin Garcia via walkie talkie.

"He went well," the Hall of Fame conditioner said of the 'TDN Rising Star'. "He cruised today. He's pretty fit and doesn't need much. He'll gallop into the Derby."

Dortmund has a perfect record of six-for-six, including an allowance win at Churchill Downs last fall. He most recently captured the GI Santa Anita Derby Apr. 4. The chestnut is scheduled to ship to Kentucky Sunday, along with fellow Derby contenders Bolo (Temple City) and Firing Line (Line of David), and GI Kentucky Oaks contender Stellar Wind (Curlin).

Baffert hopped on a plane to Louisville after Dortmund's breeze to oversee the final work of his other Derby contender **American Pharoah** (Pioneer of the Nile), who is scheduled to work Sunday. That work could be moved to Monday if the track is not fast due to the expected rain. **Cont. p3**

Assistant trainer Jimmy Barnes has been overseeing the GI Arkansas Derby winner's preparations so far, and galloped the Zayat Stables runner at 5:45 a.m. Saturday rather than the reserved time for Derby/Oaks contenders of 8:30 a.m. to ensure a fast track. "The track was perfect," Barnes said. "The weather was good. I'd rather just get him out on a good race track and be done with it."

Lone Star Park in Grand Prairie, Texas, cancelled their Friday night card after the first race, due to heavy rain and thunderstorms moving through the area. The \$200,000 GIII Texas Mile is rescheduled for Friday, May 1 and the remaining races will be rescheduled through the remainder of the meet.

DERBY DUO PUT IN FINAL WORKS IN FLORIDA

A pair of GI Kentucky Derby contenders, **Upstart** (Flatter) and **Frosted** (Tapit), put in their final breezes before the May 2 Run for the Roses Saturday at Palm Meadows in Florida.

Ralph Evans and WinStar Farm's GII Holy Bull S. winner and GI Florida Derby runner-up Upstart fired a five-furlong bullet in :59.95, the best of nine at the distance. With exercise rider Vicki King aboard, the handsome bay was clocked in splits of :12.67, :24.46 and :48.01, and galloped out strong.

"He felt great," King said. "He felt really good. He's done everything right. He went the right time--everything, the fractions were perfect. He's push-button. He's really a nice ride. If he messes up, it's the rider's fault, because he does anything you ask him to do!"

Trainer Rick Violette was equally pleased with Upstart's work.

"It was kind of typical [for him], very professional," the conditioner said. "He looks like he's two-minute licking, but he's going in 12 [second intervals]. He didn't want to pull up. He did it easily, and it basically was a typical Upstart work, which is what we were looking for." **Cont. p4**

Violette also noted that his charge excels racing off of fast works.

“All [Vicki King] has to do is move her hands a little bit and he accelerates,” he said. “He likes to work fast going into his races. His best races have come off fast workouts. When I toyed with that and toned it down a little bit, he didn’t run his A-race, which is kind of my program, but it was also something we’ve learned [about him] as a 2-year-old and 3-year-old. He wants to zip a little bit, and we try to keep our horses happy.”

Violette added, “He’ll leave Tuesday. He’ll gallop a little bit tomorrow and Monday. Tuesday will be his walk day, and then we’ll recharge for a big day on Saturday. He’ll just gallop [leading up to the Derby]. He’ll school in the gate and school in the paddock and that’s it--just a couple one-on-one stuff.”

Sheikh Mohammed homebred Frosted breezed five furlongs in 1:01.10 under exercise rider Rob Massey. The GI TwinSpires.com Wood Memorial winner and Holy Bull runner-up recorded splits of :12.85, :24.92 and :36.74.

“We had a great racetrack today,” McLaughlin said.

“We wanted to see a maintenance work, and we’re all systems go. He worked great--went in 1:01--and it was very similar to last week. We’re very happy with it.”

The gray trained up to the Wood Memorial at Palm Meadows, so McLaughlin decided to employ the same tactics leading up to the Derby.

“Going into the Wood, he worked every week here and flew up there and won,” he said. “Weather was a big thing. It looked rainy in Kentucky, and it has been, and in New York, too. It just looked like it was the right move. He’s trained great here.”

McLaughlin added, “On Tuesday he flies [to Churchill Downs] at noon. He’ll train [at Palm Meadows] Tuesday morning, fly up, and train Wednesday, Thursday, Friday, and maybe Saturday, too. We’ll also go through the paddock, but not in the afternoon.”

EL KABEIR READY TO RUN FOR THE ROSES

Zayat Stables's **El Kabeir** (Scat Daddy) breezed a half-mile in :46.81 at Belmont Saturday in what will be his last work prior to the GI Kentucky Derby May 2.

"Everything looked good," trainer John Terranova said of the 'TDN Rising Star's' work. "From our vantage point, everything seemed to go well. He's nice and sharp, and coming into the race well."

El Kabeir spent the winter at Aqueduct, where he won the GIII Jerome S. Jan. 3 and the GIII Gotham S. Mar. 7. He finished second in the GIII Withers S. Feb. 7 and was a late running third last time in the GI TwinSpires.com Wood Memorial S. Apr. 4. The gray already has a win at Churchill Downs in last November's GII Kentucky Jockey Club S., and his pilot from that

start, Calvin Borel, will get back aboard next Saturday.

El Kabeir, who is just the second Derby starter for Terranova who saddled 19th-place finisher Falling Sky (Lion Heart) in 2013, will ship to Louisville Sunday.

"We're looking forward to a good week," Terranova said. "He's a real smart, well-seasoned colt, and he's been battle tested already. We're just going to go in and enjoy the week--keep him happy, keep us happy--and hopefully we'll have a fun Derby."

Ken and Sarah Ramsey's GII Louisiana Derby hero **International Star** (Fusaichi Pegasus) was one of 10 GI Kentucky Derby contenders putting in a final breeze Saturday morning before the May 2 Run of the Roses. The Derby points leader worked a half-mile in :50.80 under regular jockey Miguel Mena at the Churchill Downs training center.

Working in company with 4-year-old filly Nominative (Johar), the bay was clocked in splits of :13, :25.20 and :37.60 with a five-furlong gallop-out in 1:06.20.

"We were out trying to beat the rain," Maker said of the 6:00 a.m. move. "It was a simple maintenance work and everything went well. He was well within himself. He's fit by now. We're not going to do anything in the last seven days that might put him 'over the top.' We're ready to go."

Owner Ken Ramsey was not present for the work, but was in regular contact with Maker.

"The time doesn't sound spectacular, but Mike was pleased and if he's pleased then I'm pleased," Ramsey said. "I leave the training up to him."

Following his work, International Star spent some time in a hydrotherapy spa that Ramsey had installed at Trackside for his top sophomore.

"He had it in Florida and loved it," Ramsey said. "When he first got to Trackside, after a few days Mike said he was doing fine, but he was missing his cold water spa. So I said, 'Well, good grief, we have to get one up there!' It took a week to get permission to put one in, but we got his spa and last I heard this morning he was in it and enjoying it. I'm doing all I can to win that Derby!"

International Star will van to Churchill Downs Monday or Tuesday.

TWO DERBY RUNNERS WORK AT CHURCHILL

Philip Birsh's New York-bred **Tencendur** (Warrior's Reward) and Donegal Racing's **Keen Ice** (Curlin) both put in their final works ahead of the May 2 GI Kentucky Derby at Churchill Downs Saturday.

GI TwinSpires.com Wood Memorial S. runner-up Tencendur breezed a best-of-67 five furlongs in 1:00 flat under Manny Franco, who will be aboard for the Derby. Working in company with 4-year-old allowance winner Wake Up in Malibu (Malibu Moon), the bay was clocked in fractions of :11.60, :23.40, :35.20 and :47.40 with a six-panel gallop-out in 1:14.40.

"I wanted them to go in a minute and they did," trainer George Weaver said. "He galloped out well and cooled out quick and he was dragging me around the barn wanting to play."

The conditioner added, "He will probably jog tomorrow, just some light exercise to see how he came out of the work."

Weaver also plans to school Tencendur in the paddock and gate prior to the Derby.

"He has not had any issues," Weaver said. "But with Derby Day, it can affect even the calmest horses."

Keen Ice, who moved up to number 20 on the Derby leader board Friday after the defection of Madefromlucky (Lookin at Lucky), covered five furlongs in 1:01.60 (15/67) under exercise rider Tammy Fox. The GI Louisiana Derby fourth-place finisher registered splits of :11.80, :24 and :48.60, and galloped out six furlongs in 1:15.60.

"We just wanted him to do whatever he wanted to do on his own," trainer Dale Romans said. "He's not a real fast work horse by himself, so we didn't want to put any company with him. We let him do his own thing. He had two really fast drills, got some

long miles in him here. The heavy lifting is over."

The trainer added, "He was smooth doing everything. You saw what a beautiful stride he has. He swept to his right lead turning for home perfect. I told her, just smooch to him leaving there, just let him do whatever he wants. It ended up being just right."

CLOCKERS MISS MUBTAAHIJ'S WORK

G2 U.A.E. Derby hero **Mubtaahij (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire}) worked a half-mile over the polytrack at Arlington Saturday morning, but that work was missed by the clockers because the circuit's main clocking crew was still at Hawthorne. Luckily, trainer Mike de Kock employs Fine Equinity, a GPS-based training management tracking system that records work out times, heart rates and more.

The system recorded Mubtaahij's final GI Kentucky Derby work out in :49.70, with the final three furlongs in :35.30.

"I was very happy with both pieces of work," assistant trainer Trevor Brown said, referring to both Mubtaahij and GI Woodford Reserve Turf Classic hopeful **Umigyo (Aus)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}), who went a half-mile in approximately :50. "They had a good blow out and were a bit more intense than on Tuesday. They seemed to come out of it in good order and got right into their food mangers afterward."

De Kock remained in South Africa to saddle several runners at Turffonstein Racecourse Saturday for the richest day in South African racing. He was rewarded with wins in the G1 Computaform Sprint, G1 South African Oaks and a Grade 2 event, and a second in the G1 President's Champions Challenge. The conditioner will fly to Louisville Monday.

"We had too many runners in big races today and it would have been much too rushed," de Kock said from Johannesburg. "I'm really looking forward to getting to Louisville now."

FINAL WORKS FOR OAKS PAIR AT CHURCHILL

Forum Racing's **Birdatthewire** (Summer Bird) and Brereton Jones and Timothy Thornton's **Include Betty** (Include) both breezed five furlongs at Churchill Downs in their final preparations for Friday's GI Kentucky Oaks.

Birdatthewire, winner of the GII Forward Gal S. Jan. 24 and GII Gulfstream Park Oaks Mar. 28, covered five panels in 1:01.20 under exercise rider Faustino Aguilar. The

bay was clocked in fractions of :12.40, :24.40, :36.20 and :48.40 with a six-furlong gallop-out in 1:14.40.

"She always works good," trainer Dale Romans said. "She looked like here normal self. We kept her a little off the rail to try to keep her slowed down a little bit, and it looked like she did everything right."

GIII Fantasy S. heroine **Include Betty** breezed five furlongs in 1:02.20 under regular exercise rider Leo Garcia. The track clockers caught her in splits of :25.80 and :38 with a six-furlong gallop-out in 1:18.

"It was exactly what we wanted," said Thornton, co-owner of the filly and general manager of Jones's Airdrie Stud. "She's not a real fast workhorse in the first place. It was just the final tune-up to wake her up and let her know that it's almost race time."

Include Betty came from last to upset the Apr. 4 Fantasy, and Thornton hopes her late running style will serve her well over Churchill's long stretch.

"We're excited about that long stretch at Churchill," Thornton said. "We're hoping there'll be some pace in there and it looks like there will be. She won't even be on the screen the first part of it. She's a filly you can't rush. She just wants to lope behind but then once she decides to run she really likes to go."

The chestnut's regular jockey Rosemary Homeister Jr. will remain aboard for the Oaks.

"She rode a hell of a race for us in the Fantasy and we're just hoping for her to do the same thing again in the Oaks," Thornton said.

Brereton Jones's other Oaks contender **Lovely Maria** (Majesticperfection), winner of the GI Ashland S., and stablemate **I'm a Chatterbox** (Munnings), heroine of the GII Fair Grounds Oaks, will breeze Sunday for trainer Larry Jones.

GII Woody Stephens S. June 7, Monmouth Park's GI Haskell Invitational S. July 27 and Parx's GII Pennsylvania Derby Sept. 20. The bay has not been seen since his controversial victory in the Nov. 1 Breeders' Cup Classic.

Baffert was considering both the 1 1/16-mile GII Alysheba S. in Louisville May 1 and the seven-furlong GII Churchill Downs S. May 2 for Bayern's return.

"He'll probably run in the Alysheba," the Hall of Famer announced following Saturday's work.

While this race on paper appeared to be at Jimmy Jerkens's mercy, it seemed far more likely that the conditioner would be heading to the winner's circle with heavily favored Grade I winner Wicked Strong. The chalk came up empty, however, when the real running began, but his progressive stablemate Effinex picked up the slack to give Jerkens the win anyway.

Well-held in fifth early as Wicked Strong pressed a modest pace that produced splits of :24.55, :49.23 and 1:12.70, Effinex was given his cue into the far turn and picked off Turco Bravo (Chi) (Caesarion {Ire}) with a rail bid before tipping out into the straight. He sidled up to his sputtering stablemate and challenged

pacesetting Red Rifle at the quarter pole and eventually wore down the latter in the final sixteenth.

"I had the best trip," said winning rider Angel Arroyo. "I was able to break good and relax behind the speed. I waited for the stretch, and my horse responded when I asked. He's a nice horse." **Cont. p9**

Transferred from David Smith to Jerkens midway through last summer, Effinex was second in Saratoga's restricted Albany S. in August and a distant third in a Belmont optional claimer in September. He annexed the lucrative Empire Classic H. against elder fellow New York-breds in Elmont Oct. 18, and was fourth behind Red Rifle in the GII Hawthorne Gold Cup H. Nov. 29. He filled out the superfecta again in the inner track's Alex M. Robb S. for state-breds Dec. 31, but came back running to take a muddy open optional claimer Mar. 27 with a career-best 100 Beyer Speed Figure.

"[Effinex] had a long campaign last year, going against older horses," Jerkens noted. "After he ran lackluster on New Year's Eve, we decided there was no sense in knocking him out [with a winter campaign]. We thought that if we gave him a late spring campaign, we could give him his best shot to become a better horse because he had run pretty hard last year. We don't have anything planned for him, we'll bring him back to the barn and evaluate when he comes back."

As for last year's GI TwinSpires.com Wood Memorial and GII Jim Dandy S. winner Wicked Strong, Jerkens said, "I was a little worried about running Wicked Strong 1 1/4 miles after having just one race in Florida [when fourth in the one-mile GII Gulfstream Park H. Mar. 7], even though it was a good effort. It puts a horse in a different mindset when you have to go chasing fast horses then you have to slow them back down again. You try to do what you can in the morning, but there's only so much you can do. He'll be back."

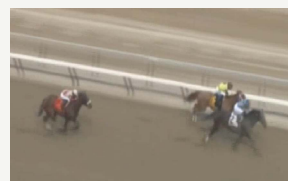
Si Sage blew up the tote at odds of 42-1 to capture his first-ever American victory in the GIII Last Tycoon S. A three-time winner in his native France, the bay was transferred to locally-based conditioner Darrell Vienna in the summer of 2013 and finished off the board in his first three starts for that trainer, all of which were black-type. A very close third in the 2013 GII Sir Beaufort S. and second in the 2014 GII San Marcos S., the 5-year-old made the trip to Kranji, where he finished sixth in the G1 Singapore Airlines International Cup last May. Returning to the States, Si Sage was a non-factor seventh to the reopposing Big John B (Hard Spun) in the GII Del Mar H. last August and failed to fire again when eighth next out in this venue's GII John Henry Turf Championship Sept. 28. Fourth in a turf sprint here Mar. 13, he was sixth last time in the one-mile Thunder Road S. over this course Apr. 4. Adding blinkers for this start, Si Sage kept a close eye on pacesetter Joes Blazing Aaron (Graeme Hall) from second through opening splits of :23.93, :48.30 and 1:13.12. Closing in on that rival as they approached the far turn, the bay took control in early stretch and skipped clear with some right-handed encouragement from Elvis Trujillo to capture his first victory on these shores. "I think the blinkers made a difference on this horse," Vienna said. "Elvis had been working him, he said maybe blinkers would help and I think he was right. I trained him once in them before but I didn't think he liked them. He worked very well in his last work with the blinkers. Frankly, I was hoping they would make a difference for him." The conditioner added, "I wasn't actually looking at the fractions, I was watching him, and frankly I was never worried. I thought he was always running pretty easily. I should say I was a little worried early when he was tugging, but after he settled on the turn, I felt pretty good, and then I could see he wasn't asking him at all, and then he did."

Felice Villa's Scuderia Effeve has a chance to finally snatch its first win in the G3 Premio Parioli (Italian 2000 Guineas) Sunday. The reigning Italian champion owner has won the Derby and the Oaks three times since 2007, and the Italian 1000 Guineas once, but the Parioli has been an elusive target. **Hero Look (Ire)** (Lope De Vega {Ire}) looked like an international prospect in his juvenile season, which was highlighted by an easy win in the G2 Gran Criterium. The colt returned three weeks ago in a conditions race over 1600 meters and was forced to a first defeat in the stewards' room. A bit coltish in the saddling enclosure and giving seven pounds to his rivals, bumped **Pelandrun (Ity)** (Gladiatorus) in the last 30 meters and crossed the line a quarter length in front, only to be disqualified.

General Sherman (Ire) (Teofilo {Ire}) is the fresh face of the race. The La Nuova Sbarra's homebred, who opened his account in his second juvenile start, outbattled **Clockwinder (Ire)** (Intikhab) in his seasonal debut over 1600 meters at Capannelle, and stepped up to score by four lengths in the Listed Premio Gardone, a solid Parioli trial, at San Siro. **Muqaawel (Daaher)**, a clever 15,000gns purchase at the Tattersalls horses in training sale last year, has changed gears since joining trainer Ana Imaz Ceca at San Sebastian in Spain. The colt, one for five in England, came back with a third in the Listed Prix De La Californie over the all-weather track at Cagnes Sur Mer, and outfinished the Group 3 scorer and G1 2000 Guineas candidate Ride Like The Wind (Ire) (Lope De Vega Ire) in a conditions race over Deauville's synthetic track.

EFFEVI PAIR HARD TO SPLIT

Fabio Branca, the retained jockey of Scuderia Effeve, faced a tough choice for Sunday's G3 Premio Regina Elena (Italian 1000 Guineas), with his boss, Felice Villa, having two talented and unbeaten fillies in the race. **Reset In Blue (Ire)** (Fastnet Rock {Aus}) opened her account strolling home in her juvenile debut over 1800 meters and has won her two starts over 1600 meters this season by a combined 11 1/2 lengths. **Sound Of Freedom (Ire)** (Duke Of Marmalade {Ire}) has had a similar path; she has won her three starts by a combined nine lengths, including last month's Listed Premio Seregno at San Siro. Branca chose Reset In Blue and Cristian Demuro gets the call on Sound Of Freedom.

Trainer Bruno Grizzetti has won the Regina Elena seven times, and this year he will saddle **Testa O Croce (Fr)** (Orpen), who needed four starts to break her maiden last year and ended the season with an unlucky third in the Listed Criterium Femminile. Testa O Croce won much easier than the neck margin suggested in a conditions race over 1600 meters at San Siro Apr. 1. "She is a very good filly and is entered also in the French 1000 Guineas," said Grizzetti. "I decided to run her just once before the Regina Elena because I want to have a fresh filly in the Classic and for the rest of the season. I will campaign her in France in the future because she is eligible for the French bonuses."

Winner of the G1 Longines Hong Kong Cup and G1 Citibank Hong Kong Gold Cup over the course and distance in his two most recent tries, he retains the full confidence of trainer John Moore.

The veteran was found to be ‘mildly lame’ in his left front foot Saturday and will be subjected to a race-day veterinary inspection before being allowed to participate.

The form of the Hong Kong Derby, won by the G1 Champions Mile-bound Luger (Aus) (Choisir {Aus}), is represented by Helene **Happy Star (Ire)** (Zamindar). A closing fourth in that course-and-distance affair Mar. 15, he is taking a fair amount of early support on the tote. Tommy Berry will shoot for a third consecutive QE II score as he jets in from Australia.

KEENELAND SPRING MEET A SUCCESS

The 15-day Keeneland Spring Meeting, which concluded Friday, Apr. 24, was a success despite heavy rainfall on seven of the 15 racing days. It was the track's fourth-highest Spring Meet in terms of on-track attendance, with a mark of 250,451, slightly below last year's attendance of 270,093. Average daily attendance was 16,697 compared to last spring's record 18,006. For the first time in Keeneland history, racing was cancelled on opening Friday, Apr. 3, due to inclement weather. The Lexington track also hosted its third- and fourth-largest single-day crowds on back-to-back Saturdays--Apr. 11, which was Coolmore Lexington Day, had the fourth-largest crowd of 37,193. The third-largest crowd of 37,737 bettered that mark Apr. 18, when the GII Dixiana Elkhorn S. was contested.

"I never cease to be impressed by the enthusiasm of our fans, the strong support of our horsemen and the hard work of the Keeneland team that combine to

produce the ultimate racing experience," said Keeneland President and CEO Bill Thomason. "The fact that we had a crowd of more than 12,000 people on track for opening Friday, when the Lexington area experienced flooding rains, speaks to their

passion for Keeneland and horse racing. We are extremely grateful to the community and to the horse industry."

Keeneland's on-track wagering totaled \$16,142,325, a drop of 14.73% from the 2014 Spring Meet's tally of \$18,931,643. Average daily on-track handle was \$1,076,155, also a drop of 14.73% compared to \$1,262,110 during the equivalent meet last year. All-source wagering for Keeneland's Spring Meet was \$117,617,108, down 14.79% from \$138,033,442 last spring. The average daily purse distribution was \$588,192, among the best in the nation.

This meet was the first Spring Meet to utilize the new dirt track, which despite the frequent heavy rainfall, performed in a consistent and safe fashion, while draining quickly in the wake of near-record rainfall.

"The dirt track was put to the ultimate test this spring, but its ability to handle the rain resulted in only one day in which it was rated 'sloppy' and that was opening day, when we received more than seven inches of rain in a 24-hour period," commented Keeneland Vice President of Racing W. B. Rogers Beasley. "The composition of our dirt surface coupled with the innovative drainage system and the diligent work of our track crew, who often worked through the night, kept it in top-notch condition for racing and training."
