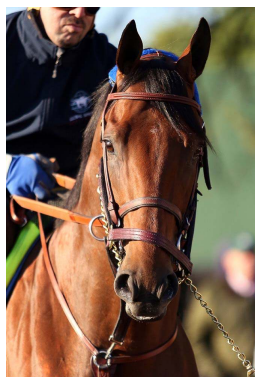

Conquest Classic

PHAROAH FAVORED FROM 18 IN DERBY 141

Zayat Stable's **American Pharoah** (Pioneerof the Nile), looking to become the first juvenile champion since Street Sense in 2007 to win the GI Kentucky Derby, will break from post 18 in Saturday's 141st Run for the Roses. Coming off a dominant victory in the Apr. 11 GI Arkansas Derby, the colt was installed the 5-2 morning-line favorite during Wednesday's post position draw at Churchill Downs. Trainer Bob Baffert will saddle both American Pharoah and second choice **Dortmund** (Big Brown), who drew post eight and is 3-1 on Mike Battaglia's morning line. The names of both Baffert runners were pulled late in the 20-horse draw, with several inside posts still open, and the trainer was visibly relieved when the pair received outside stalls. "Outside doesn't really bother me," Baffert said of American Pharoah's 18 draw. "I just didn't want to be stuck down inside. As long as he breaks well, Victor [Espinoza] is going to be aggressive with him anyway, so hopefully he'll get a good spot." As for Kaleem Shah's unbeaten Dortmund, Baffert added, "I'm happy with [eight]. "He's a good gate horse, he breaks well, he's going to be forwardly placed and we're going to have to shake it out." **Cont. p3**

Pharoah Favored from 18 (cont. from p1)

GI Santa Anita Derby winner Dortmund, a perfect six-for-six in his career, will look to become the first undefeated winner of the Kentucky Derby since his sire Big Brown accomplished the feat in 2008.

Seemingly faring less well in Wednesday's draw was GI Toyota Blue Grass S. winner **Carpe Diem** (Giant's Causeway). The most-fancied of trainer Todd Pletcher's four-horse brigade, and the Derby's 8-1 third choice, drew post two. Pletcher's GI Florida Derby winner **Materiality** (Afleet Alex), the 12-1 co-fourth choice, is right next door in post three.

"In a perfect world, I would have liked to have been more toward the middle with Carpe Diem [and Materiality]," Pletcher admitted. "But Carpe Diem is a good gate horse and he'll have to get away from there quickly. That's pretty much true whatever your draw is in this race. Materiality is a good gate horse, too, so if he gets out, he ought to be fine."

Also at 12-1 is Arnold Zetcher's **Firing Line** (Line of David), who will break from post 10.

"I'm very happy with the draw," commented trainer Simon Callaghan, who will be saddling his first Derby runner Saturday. "I believe we're last to load, which is an advantage. And with the number 10, you've got options." **Full field p4-5**

SAY WHAT?

"It is what it is. It's a tough spot but what are you going to do? My plan, to be honest with you, is still to take hold and sit in the second flight. I've got to think Carpe Diem and a couple of those others are going to go but I don't want to go with them, or sit behind. That's what I'm going to talk to Elvis [Trujillo] about."

"I think we drew great. We got speed on the inside of us. We've got speed outside of us. I actually glad about the post because we'd be in a position not to lose ground hopefully on the first turn or get pushed out. We'll sit back and see how the race unfolds from there."

"We're very happy with it. We're the first one in the auxiliary gate, so we have a little room at the break. There's plenty of speed outside us; there's plenty of speed inside us. The one hole is just the one that you feared. Other than that, we're fine and we like the post."
Trainer Kieran McLaughlin, Frosted (post 15)

"I was a little ambivalent, but my daughter texted me and said that 16 has had more success than any other post so I'm excited about that. I'm not worried about the post at all."
Trainer Tom Amoss, War Story (post 16)

"The way I look at it is: my job the next three days is to convince Jose Ortiz it's the best spot in the gate. My job the next three days is to convince Jose Ortiz that it's the exact post position we wanted."

Exercise rider Amie Williams was aboard for the work. "He got a little something out of it," trainer Jim Cassidy said. "I didn't want anything too aggressive and I thought [Williams] did a good job." Williams added, "He's got a huge stride for a little horse and feels awesome. He just floats across the ground. He wanted to keep on going and I kind of had to bring him down a little bit. His ears were pricked the whole work, he was really happy." Winner of last year's GIII Delta Downs Jackpot S., the 'TDN Rising Star' is coming off a third-place effort behind Carpe Diem (Giant's Causeway) in the Apr. 4 GI Blue Grass S.

The big two of **American Pharoah** (Pioneerof the Nile) and **Dortmund** (Big Brown) seem to look better each day, if that's even possible. No wonder why Hall of Famer Bob Baffert was in such good form during Tuesday night's Kentucky Derby Trainer's Dinner at the Hyatt Regency in downtown Louisville. Owner Kaleem Shah, wearing a Dortmund soccer shirt and jacket, was in attendance to watch his undefeated GI Santa Anita Derby winner, as well as the comebacking GI Breeders' Cup Classic hero Bayern (Offlee Wild), who is slated to return in Saturday's seven-furlong GI Churchill Downs.

After the Derby/Oaks training session wrapped, as imagined, it was a chaotic scene back by Baffert's barn when American Pharoah and Dortmund came out for their baths. Jockey Martin Garcia, returning from some trackwork on another Baffert runner, had to give a pretty loud whistle to help part the sea in order to return to the shedrow. It was a surprisingly tranquil setting by Pletcher's nearby base as his four Derby runners were getting cleaned up. Bloodstock agent Steve Young kept a close eye on the unbeaten **'TDN Rising Star' Materiality** (Afleet Alex). He signed the \$400,000 slip at EASMAY on behalf of Alto Racing last spring.

There was plenty going on back at Barn 42 as well. Philip Birsh's handsome Wood Memorial runner-up Tencendur nibbled on some grass while trainer George Weaver was interviewed by a local television station. The accommodating Christophe Soumillon was in quite high demand for interviews after piloting Mubtaahij for his morning trackwork as well. Just as training hours began to conclude, there was a nice moment back at D. Wayne Lukas's headquarters. Along with his five former assistants--Dallas Stewart, George Weaver, Kieran McLaughlin, Mike Maker and Todd Pletcher--the group was available for a quick photo-op. A large contingent of media as well as owner/breeder Ken Ramsey all looked on as the sextet--all impressively represented by Derby entrants this year--shared plenty of laughs as the bright sun beamed down on the backstretch on a delightful spring morning.

FAR RIGHT EYES KY. DERBY GLORY

Everyone wants to win the Kentucky Derby, but the people who usually get there shop at Tiffany. Not Jon Jazdzewski. He goes to the Dollar Store.

What does it take to buy a Derby contender these days? Sometimes as much as \$1.6 million, which is what was paid for Carpe Diem at the Ocala 2-year-old sale. American Pharoah cost \$300,000. Stanford fetched \$550,000. Materiality was a pricey \$400,000. Sixteen of the 20

horses expected to start in the Derby were sold at auction and they cost a combined \$4.33 million.

So how did Far Right sneak into this group? He was sold for \$2,500 as a yearling at the Keeneland January sale. You could have purchased 640 Far Rights for what was paid for one Carpe Diem.

Far Right got there through the persistence, knowledge and hard work of a horse dentist named Jon Jazdzewski, whose side business is finding inexpensive yearlings that most have no interest in. He believes he can find individuals that are completely overlooked at the sales but can actually run and, once they establish themselves on the racetrack, he looks to sell them at a hefty profit.

And he's pretty good at it. He once paid \$10,000 for a horse he sold for \$230,000, and another time he bought a horse for \$1,500 and sold it for \$150,000. He's done this despite sometimes buying no more than one horse a year.

"I try to stay at that lowest level," Jazdzewski said. "I know the really good ones are out there. We go to all the sales and wait for those types of horses to come along."

When up for sale as a yearling, Far Right was immediately cast into the bargain bin because of his then unheralded sire, Notional. He made \$733,240, won three graded stakes and finished second in the 2007 Florida Derby. But before Far Right came along Notional had never had a horse win a graded stakes race or make in excess of \$250,000.

"Usually when you see the one you like they make your heart beat," Jazdzewski said. "He was the total package. He was balanced, had a ton of definition, already looked like an athlete as a baby. He was nice, really nice. There were a lot of good horsemen at that sale. The only thing that kept them away from this horse was the fact he was by Notional."

So Jazdzewski took him home for \$2,500 and laid out his typical game plan. He would try to get the horse to show something on the racetrack right from the start, preferably in the spring 2-year-old races at Keeneland, and then sell him for a handsome profit.

As a yearling and while getting ready for his debut, Far Right was trained in Florida by Tony Costanzo, who then sent him to trainer William Helmbrecht. Far Right finished second in his first start, a 2-year-old race at Keeneland, but the offers weren't exactly pouring in. He came back and finished second again, this time at Churchill. Still, no one seemed to want him.

"Two people vetted him out to buy after his second race," Jazdzewski said. "He was totally clean. But both backed out."

The interest in Far Right didn't start to heat up until the horses that beat him in each of his maiden races went on to win stakes. That added legitimacy to his record, and convinced owner Harry Rosenblum to meet Jazdzewski's price. Jazdzewski wouldn't say how much Rosenblum paid for the horse, but it was likely in the \$150,000 to \$200,000 range. Rosenblum later sold a share to owner Robert LaPenta.

Far Right has gone on to earn \$625,766 and win the Smarty Jones and the Southwest Stakes and finish second behind Kentucky Derby favorite American Pharoah in the Arkansas Derby. But Jazdzewski doesn't regret for a minute that he sold him.

"I get asked that a lot," Jazdzewski said when asked if he wished he had held on to the horse. "The thing is, at each level, every time he had another success on the track, we would have been offered more money. It can be a never-ending thing. But we never would have gone all the way to the Derby without having sold him... We've been in this long enough to know one bad step and he's worth \$1,500, not \$200,000. *Cont. p9*



"The connections that have him now, they've done a great job. He's gotten there because of the choices they made and the things they did. They did things right, especially with the point system. They got this horse to the Derby, not me."

Having made a nice profit on Far Right, Jazdzewski said he has no intention of changing his game plan and buying more expensive horses. He still regrets the day he spent \$15,000 on a yearling, the most he's ever spent for a horse, and it turned out the filly "couldn't outrun me; she looked like an eggbeater coming down the stretch."

This year he will attend the Derby for the first time ever, going as a guest of Rosenblum. He'll root for Far Right as if he still owned him.

"Money is money," he said. "It comes and goes. It matters but it doesn't. Being right about a horse is more fun than the money part of it. You want to be able to say I picked the right horse and he did make it."

#1 OCHO OCHO OCHO (c, [Street Sense--Winner](#), by Horse Chestnut {SAf}) - T: J Cassidy. J: E Trujillo. - 50-1

BD: Looked like a legitimate Derby chance at the end of last year, but just hasn't done enough in his two tries this season to warrant serious consideration... Post really does him in. **SS:** Game Jackpot winner has done little at three to merit a look here... One of the first tosses.

#2 CARPE DIEM (c, [Giant's Causeway--Rebridled Dreams](#), by Unbridled's Song) - T: T Pletcher. J: J Velazquez. - 8-1

SS: For me, he's the complete package... With a pedigree that screams distance, last year's \$1.6-million OBS March co-topper immediately showed his class with a wire-to-wire debut win going 5 1/2f at the Spa... The most important race of the MGISW's career, experience wise, may have actually come in defeat when a well-beaten second after rallying from far back into a hot pace in the BC Juvenile... Tactical enough to sit the right trip and won his two preps with something left... Top pick. **BD:** Steve and I couldn't differ more in our opinions on this one... I don't like him at all. He hasn't run a particularly fast race, and won a decidedly sub-par renewal of the Blue Grass last time. Strikes me as a runner who will blink when he faces some adversity.

#3 MATERIALITY (c, [Afleet Alex--Wildwood Flower](#), by Langfuhr) - T: T Pletcher. J: J Castellano. - 12-1

SS: An undefeated runner with the highest Beyer Speed Figure of his crop is the co-fourth choice on the morning-line... Just shows you how deep a field this is... Plenty of ability, but lack of seasoning is impossible to ignore... **BD:** Liked him last time in the Florida Derby, and he's done absolutely nothing wrong so far in his career, but this strikes me as a case of too much, too soon. Might be your Haskell winner.

#4 TENCENDUR (c, [Warrior's Reward--Still Secret](#), by Hennessy) - T: G Weaver. J: M Franco. - 30-1

BD: Maybe it makes no sense to like Frosted and toss this horse, but his effort last time was just too sharp of an improvement for me to take at face value... Also not sure he'll relish 10 panels. **SS:** May have already run his Kentucky Derby when finishing a clear-cut second with a perfect trip after leading in the stretch at 21-1 in the Wood... Can't see him doing it again.

#5 DANZIG MOON (c, [Malibu Moon--Leaveminthedust](#), by Danzig) - T: M Casse. J: J Leparoux. - 30-1

SS: Bounced back with a solid runner-up effort in the Blue Grass after a very disappointing performance over the tricky Tampa surface... With a deep Phipps female pedigree on his page, the Classic distance may be right up his alley... Interesting longshot to consider for a small piece. **BD:** I guess there's no reason he can't clunk up for a piece, but I'm against horses coming out of the Blue Grass and other bombs interest me more.

#6 MUBTAAHIJ (IRE) (c, [Dubawi {Ire}--Pennegale {Ire}](#), by Pennekamp) - T: M de Kock. J: C Soumillon. - 20-1

BD: Anyone who has a strong opinion on this horse one way or the other is either kidding themselves or a much better handicapper than I am... This seems like a big ask, and it's hard to know who he was really beating in Dubai, but he has been extremely visually impressive while enjoying some very easy trips. Hard to toss out completely, but also hard to back with any confidence. **SS:** Certainly proved that he deserves to be here with a pair of sensational wins in Dubai and you know the distance won't be an issue... The price should be right if you decide to back him, but at the end of the day, isn't this a tall enough task without having to travel halfway around the world, too?

#7 EL KABEIR (c, [Scat Daddy--Great Venue](#), by Unbridled's Song) - T: J Terranova. J: C Borel. - 30-1

SS: Graded winner over this course should benefit from a textbook Calvin ride in this speed-laden affair, but hard to imagine that it will be enough to take him over the top... Pass. **BD:** Has accomplished a lot and earned plenty of money, but has just always struck me as being a cut below the best of this crop... Presence of Borel is sort of interesting, but may deflate his price.

#8 DORTMUND (c, [Big Brown--Our Josephina](#), by Tale of the Cat) - T: B Baffert. J: M Garcia. - 3-1

SS: Unbeaten, battle-tested and still appears to be improving... Physically imposing son of Big Brown looks like he could be the speed of the speed, but will certainly have to run hard every step of the way to get Bob Baffert his fourth Derby win... Worthy of favoritism and everyone knows it. **BD:** There really aren't many knocks on him other than the question of whether he's too quick for his own good and might get sucked up into a quick pace. The hype is warranted, but how short a price can you really take against this bunch?

#9 BOLO (c, [Temple City--Aspen Mountain](#), by Chief Seattle) - T: C Gaines. J: R Bejarano. - 30-1

SS: If you buy into the theory (like I do) that a top-flight grass runner will typically give you at least one really big effort on the dirt--see his third-place finish with a career-high 101 Beyer in the San Felipe--this son of Temple City is not for you... Already looking forward to his return to the lawn later this summer. **BD:** Endured wide trips in both of his dirt races, and was far from embarrassed in either effort... Hails from the family of Derby winner Mine That Bird and there's that whole 'turf horses like Churchill' angle to consider... Exotics candidate.

#10 FIRING LINE (c, [Line of David--Sister Girl Blues](#), by Hold for Gold) - T: S Callaghan. J: G Stevens. - 12-1

BD: Flying squarely under the radar despite some solid credentials... Wouldn't want to toss completely because of his price, but others appeal more. **SS:** Easily one of the most forgotten runners in the field... Went pound for pound with the mighty Dortmund and won with something left while setting a new track record at Sunland... Has made a very favorable physical impression since arriving from SoCal and may offer the best value in the field... Disregard at your own risk.

#11 STANFORD (c, [Malibu Moon--Rosy Humor](#), by Distorted Humor) - T: T Pletcher. J: F Geroux. - 30-1

SS: Thought he could be a star in the making after his Monmouth debut last summer and still haven't gotten over his tough Louisiana Derby defeat... Pace scenario doesn't bode well for him, but will still be playing some saver tickets. **BD:** Has set fairly average paces in his two route attempts in which he crossed the wire second... Will either be a pace casualty, or will fail to make the lead and get out-kicked by others.

#12 INTERNATIONAL STAR (c, [Fusaichi Pegasus--Parlez](#), by French Deputy) - T: M Maker. J: M Mena. - 20-1

BD: The reason you're not supposed to like him is that he's had perfect trips in each of his last three outings, but then again, what if he gets the same trip here? He's a picture of consistency and has the right running style to work out another smooth journey, and if he does, he's going to hit the board at the very least unless all the potential monsters show up with their best... Can't leave him off my tickets. **SS:** Feel exactly the same way... Phenomenal job by Miguel Mena riding this son of the 2000 Derby hero to three straight wins at Fair Grounds with nearly identical ground-saving trips... Doesn't have the same flash as the main headliners, but is awfully hard not to respect while riding a very hot hand.

#13 ITSAKNOCKOUT (c, [Lemon Drop Kid--Stormy B](#), by Cherokee Run) - T: T Pletcher. J: L Saez. - 30-1

SS: The only 'KO' to make headlines Saturday evening will be in Las Vegas during the blockbuster Mayweather/Pacquiao fight... Hard to get in his corner. **BD:** Shouldn't have been put up in the Fountain of Youth, and was a complete no-show in the Florida Derby... Hard to like.

#14 KEEN ICE (c, [Curlin--Medomak](#), by Awesome Again) - T: D Romans. J: K Desormeaux. - 50-1

SS: Has been a very frustrating horse to follow thus far--will let BD expand on that--but the king of the gallop out will finally get his desired trip here... This year's Golden Soul/Commanding Curve? **BD:** On paper, he's nowhere close to good enough--and he probably isn't to actually win--but he has that look of a horse who blows up the Derby tri or super... Or maybe I've been getting tricked by his gallop-outs. Toss Romans (Dullahan, Paddy O'Prado) runner completely at your own risk... Or do, and you'll probably look smarter than me.

#15 FROSTED (c, [Tapit--Fast Cookie](#), by Deputy Minister) - T: K McLaughlin. J: J Rosario. - 15-1

BD: He hasn't garnered the hype of the top few favorites, but his performance in the TwinSpires.com Wood Memorial was in many ways just as good as blowout wins from American Pharoah, Dortmund and Carpe Diem... He first caught the eye with a valiant runner-up effort in last year's Remsen, and put it all back together last time despite a no-cover trip behind a slow pace... Distance doesn't seem like a major issue, and the price should be right. **SS:** Did they finally figure this son of Tapit out or did he just beat up on a very weak field in his return to his favorite racetrack in the Wood? Should get a dream set-up if he's good enough; just can't seem to trust him 100% off his prior form, though.

#16 WAR STORY (g, [Northern Fleet--Belle Watling](#), by Pulpit) - T: T Amoss. J: J Talamo. - 50-1

SS: Wide trips haven't exactly helped while chasing home International Star this spring and like the way he's been moving over the Churchill surface during his morning preparations... Will still need to step up his game in a big way to factor here, though. **BD:** Always had tougher trips than International Star in his three stakes at the Fair Grounds, but also lacked the kick to make up for it... Seems like a cut-back candidate.

#17 MR. Z. (c, [Malibu Moon--Stormy Bear](#), by Storm Cat) - T: D W Lukas. J: R Vazquez. - 50-1

BD: Almost beat Dortmund and Firing Line at the end of last year, but hasn't stepped forward at all from there... Consistent and a check-getter, but would be shocked if he made an impact here. **SS:** Has shown serious heart holding up through a grueling 12-race campaign without a layoff line, including some epic throwdowns in the Jackpot, Futurity, and Southwest... But c'mon, he's still eligible for a NW1X!

#18 AMERICAN PHAROAH (c, [Pioneerof the Nile--Littleprincesemma](#), by Yankee Gentleman) - T: B Baffert. J: V Espinoza. - 5-2
BD: What can you say? Last year's champion juvenile has done nothing but continue to impress in two outings this year, and he's definitely worthy of favoritism. I've still got some questions about his dam side pedigree for 1 1/4 miles, however. I'll use him defensively in the pick four, but I'm going against him in intra-race bets. **SS:** His legend seems to be growing--if that was even possible--since his jaw-dropping bullet workout beneath the Twin Spires Sunday... Not smart enough to make him my key horse, but won't exactly be leaving him off any tickets, either...No reason to believe that he isn't the real deal.

#19 UPSTART (c, [Flatter--Party Silks](#), by Touch Gold) - T: R Violette Jr. J: J Ortiz. - 15-1
BD: Boasts several fast races, and will likely benefit from the dynamics of this one. He was probably closer than he wanted to be in his Florida efforts because the fields were a little shorter, but he should be able to take back a little bit more here and make one run... The distance shouldn't be a problem, and he seems to have bounced out of a very minor illness no worse for wear. Post isn't ideal, but hopefully solidifies an off-the-pace strategy. **SS:** NY-bred is plenty talented and ran one of the faster preps of the season in Holy Bull comebacker... Big fan of his, but not so sure that this 10-furlong trip will bring out his best... I guess you can't use them all.

#20 FAR RIGHT (c, [Notional--Zindi](#), by Vindication) - T: R Moquett. J: M Smith. - 30-1
BD: Has displayed a nice closing kick, but not sure he has the running style or the pedigree to be the type who clunks up for a piece in the Derby--seems more like a sprinter/miler type. **SS:** Hard not to pull for a \$2,500 yearling buy in a race of this magnitude... And like International Star, he has displayed the ability to rally through traffic... At the end of the day, though, other longshot stretch-runners seem a bit more appealing.

#21/AE Frammento (c, [Midshipman--Ginger Bay](#), by Golden Missile) - T: N Zito.
BD: Couldn't possibly fathom. **SS:** Bigger upset than Mine That Bird?

#22/AE Tale Of Verve (c, [Tale Of Ekati--Verve](#), by Unbridled) - T: D Stewart.
SS: I'm not even looking at this horse's past performances. **BD:** Well, he should like the distance and he's by the right trainer to spice up the exotics. Kind of hope he doesn't get in so I can save a few bucks.

PIMLICO UNSCATHED, BALTIMORE TENSE TWO WEEKS OUT FROM PREAKNESS

Rioting and violence in Baltimore gave way to relative calm and attempts at a city-wide cleanup on Wednesday. But as a police investigation into the in-custody fatal spine injury suffered by Freddie Gray works its way through the system, Maryland's largest city must brace for more civil unrest, potentially coinciding with the running of the GI Preakness S. at Pimlico Race Course May 16.

Although sporting events in and of themselves are a minor concern compared to the larger issue of overall public safety, the looting and mayhem that occurred near Baltimore's touristy inner harbor district caused the cancellation of two Orioles baseball games at Camden Yards this week, and a third game on Wednesday was played without fans being admitted to the ballpark, an unprecedented move by Major League Baseball.

Pimlico, located about 10 miles northwest of the epicenter of the downtown rioting, escaped unscathed. According to an interactive map of the violence posted online by the *Baltimore Sun*, the closest incident to the racetrack was shots that were reported fired at (but did not hit) a police officer at the intersection of Virginia Avenue and Reisterstown Road, about a mile away from the track.

"It really hasn't affected us down here other than we're all watching it," said Tim Keefe, president of the Maryland Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association.

"Pimlico's open for racing and training as normal, maybe a few more security guys and that sort of thing, but it's been far enough away for us that it hasn't been an issue."

Voicemail messages left for Sal Sinatra, vice president and general manager of the Maryland Jockey Club, and Tim Ritvo, president of chief operating officer of The Stronach Group, which owns Pimlico, were not returned before the deadline for this story.

Pimlico was not scheduled to race Monday through Wednesday, but is expected to be open for Thursday's program, according to J. Michael Hopkins, the executive director of the Maryland Racing Commission.

But if there are contingency plans percolating in the event that unrest re-ignites at the same time as more than 100,000 racegoers descend upon Pimlico for the Preakness, "I'm not aware of any," said Hopkins.

Skimming for the word "Preakness" through social media channels suggests that some people are concerned, or might even be considering targeting the second jewel of the Triple Crown for potential protesting. **Cont. p11**

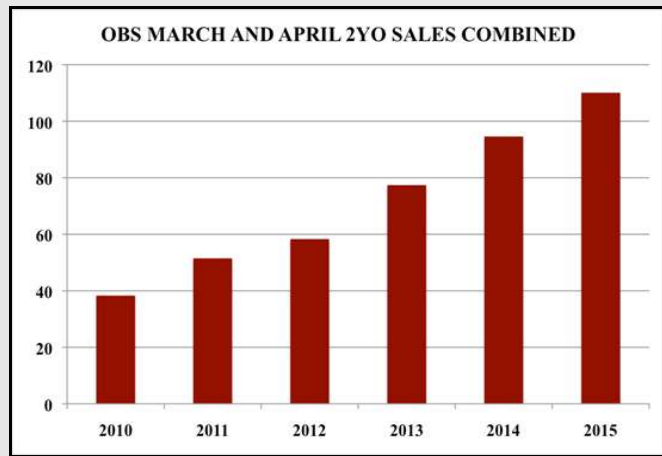

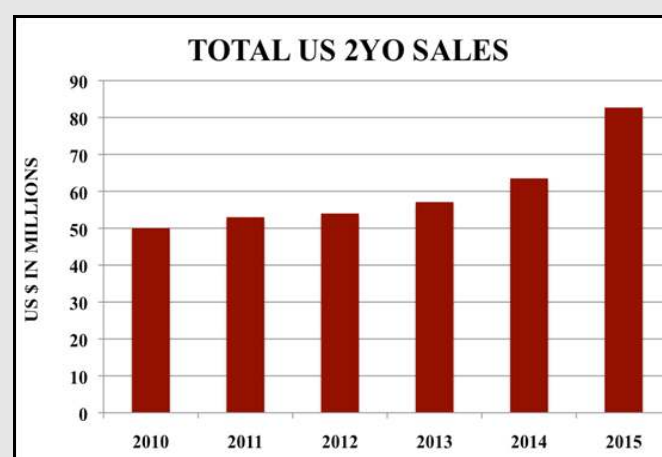
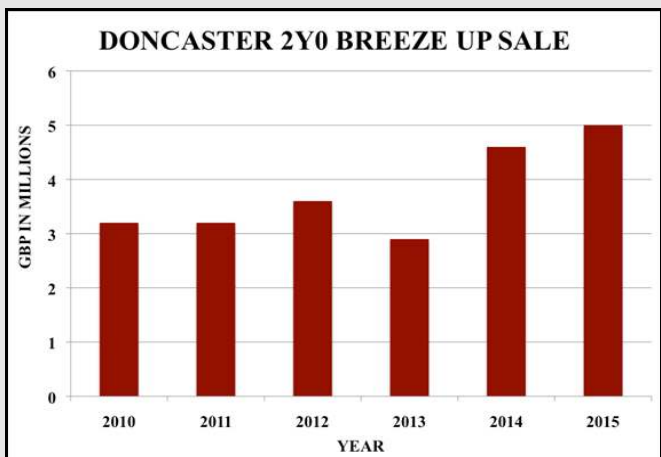

THE WOW SIGNAL OUT OF GUINEAS

Al Shaqab Racing's **The Wow Signal (Ire)** (Starspangledbanner {Aus}) has been removed from consideration for Saturday's G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket after pulling up lame Wednesday morning. "We're still investigating what the cause of it is, so no real news on that, but he won't be running on Saturday," Harry Herbert, racing advisor to Al Shaqab, told the *TDN*.

Purchased privately by Al Shaqab after breaking his maiden at first asking by nine lengths at Ayr on debut last May, The Wow Signal added Royal Ascot's G2 Coventry S. and the G1 Prix Morny--over subsequent G1

Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf winner Hootenanny (Quality Road)--for trainer John Quinn. The Wow Signal was shelved for the winter after finishing last of nine in the G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere Oct. 5, but Herbert noted the bay

had been training forwardly for the Guineas.

"The horse was working the place down and was going to carry our first silks, so it's a real blow," Herbert said. "He was such a good 2-year-old, and probably the forgotten horse of the Guineas, which is not a bad scenario going into a race. We were all getting very excited. But that's the game and we'll regroup and hope Moheet (Ire) (High Chaparral {Ire}) can run a big race for us and Osaila (Ire) (Daneshill Dancer {Ire}) on Sunday in the [G1] 1000 Guineas."

Another defection from the Guineas lineup yesterday was the Aidan O'Brien-trained **Highland Reel (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}). Last year's G2 Vintage S. winner will instead target the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains May 10, O'Brien confirmed.



A # will distinguish first-time stakes-winners, a **@** will indicate first-time graded stakes-winners, a **▲** will denote a first-time Grade/Group 1 winner, a **+** will indicate first-time starters, an **(S)** will be used for state-bred races, a **(C)** will be used for maiden-claiming races and an **(R)** will be used for other restricted races.

ECTOT TO BYPASS GANAY

Al Shaqab Racing and Gerard Augustin-Normand's G1 Criterium International winner **Ectot (GB)** (Hurricane Run {Ire}) has been removed from consideration for Sunday's G1 Prix Ganay and will instead set his sights on the G1 Prix d'Ispahan May 24.

"He had a bit of a problem on a foot and that is why he will not run at the weekend," said Sylvain Vidal, racing manager for Augustin-Normand. "Because of that upset we will wait for the d'Ispahan."

Ectot, who won last year's G3 Prix Fontainebleu and G2 Prix Niel, was last seen finishing 17th of 20 in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe in October.

"He will go to England at some stage--maybe the [G1] Champion S.--but we need to speak with Al Shaqab and [trainer Elie Lellouche]," Vidal said. "The Arc, obviously, and the [G1] Prix Jacques le Marois at Deauville are other races we will think about."

"He has changed a lot this year," Vidal added. "He has plenty more muscle and I think he could have a big year."

2014 due to the manner of his performances against smart competition in Newbury's Listed Rose Bowl S. in July and the Listed Redcar Two-Year-Old Trophy in Redcar, the bay's return was keenly awaited with the June 19 Royal Ascot contest beginning to take shape. Clearly the master of the subsequent G3

Molecomb S. hero Cotai Glory (GB) (Exceed and Excel {Aus})--who was also a surefire winner of the G2 Flying Childers S. before jinking and unseating his rider near the line--in the Rose Bowl, the gelding was taken out of planned engagements in the G2 Gimcrack S. and G2 Mill Reef S. due to a dirty scope and soft ground, respectively, but re-emerged unfazed to dismiss the eventual G2 Criterium de Maisons-Laffitte scorer Mattmu (GB) (Indesatchel {Ire}) at Redcar. Trainer Henry Candy had warned that he had become a more relaxed individual over the winter and that was in evidence through the first quarter mile, with jockey James Doyle keen to cajole him trapped wide of a trio racing up the center away from the main group. Responding by traveling kindly to the lead with 1 1/2 furlongs to race, Limato opened up when given the command soon after and hit the line firmly on top of the filly Tendu, who ran with real credit from the back of the stand's side pack. "He hasn't done a tap at home and had a tremendous blow after that, so he really did need it, which has born out what he's been doing at home," his trainer said. "So many of mine have not been winning, so I've been dreading today but what he did was very exciting. I told James [Doyle] that he had been lazy and so he pushed for the first couple of furlongs and he said that all of a sudden the horse came on the bridle almost too much. He had to take back a bit then, but he was always riding in confident fashion. He really lengthened and he has the most tremendous stride."

Candy added, "I've been very lucky with the horses I've had in this division and I think he's as good as any of them. I think he's better than this performance and I don't know if we'll go anywhere between this and the Commonwealth Cup--now that he's switched himself on, we might be better leaving him alone and bringing him here fresh."

Of the new Royal Ascot contest, Candy said, "I'm the initiative's biggest fan for obvious reasons. It's been a long time coming and it's been a nightmare training 3-year-old sprinters over the years, as there haven't been many places to go and they have to be exceptional to beat the older horses."

The plan is to go to Sandown for the [May 28] G3 Henry II S. and that should be the stepping stone to Ascot [for the June 18 Gold Cup]."

QUEENSLAND COBALT INQUIRY ADJOURNED

The first inquiry into a cobalt positive in Queensland, Australia has been postponed after it was deemed further investigation should be taken into the presence of cobalt in supplements, according to *Racing and Sports*. The inquiry in question concerned the Jamie McConachy-trained Vandalised, who was found to have cobalt in his system after a win last year. McConachy said he had never heard of cobalt prior to the inquiry, but had treated Vandalised for low red blood cell levels on the advice of a vet. McConachy's barrister wanted more information on how cobalt could be accumulated from legal supplements.

Vandalised's original swab after his victory had come back negative to the normal tests, but a frozen sample was tested after the cobalt threshold was introduced and came back positive.
