Not even in the picture for the G1 QIPCO 1000 Guineas before last Sunday, **Legatissimo (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) proved that a week can be a long time in racing as she capped a stellar weekend for Michael Tabor and Ryan Moore at Newmarket. Earning the right to be here only after winning last Sunday's Listed Victor McCalmont Memorial S. at Gowran Park,

the 13-2 shot proved up to the quick turnaround to complete an Irish domination of both Guineas and a Classic double for her main owner and jockey. Delivered from rear to overhaul the 9-2 favorite and compatriot **Lucida (Ire)** (Shamardal) in the last 100 yards,

the bay asserted for a 3/4-of-a-length success under Coolmore's new number one. There were shades of Kieren Fallon in the achievement, as that rider had also pulled off the Guineas double on Footstepsinthesand (GB) and Virginia Waters in his first year in the job in 2005. "They went a good gallop and I was always confident," Moore said. "She stayed really well in the last furlong and she'll get further. She's a very handy filly and she loved the quick ground." **Cont. p5**

MORE GANAY GLORY FOR CIRRUS

DERBY TOP THREE ON TO PIMLICO

American Pharoah (Pioneerof the Nile), **Firing Line** (Line of David) and **Dortmund** (Big Brown), the top three finishers from Saturday's G1 Kentucky Derby, are all now targeting a rematch in the May 16 G1 Preakness S. Still savoring his fourth Derby win Sunday morning, trainer Bob Baffert admitted

Saturday's win by American Pharoah was different from his previous victories. "It's fun to come here, but I think this win was different than my other ones," Baffert said. "I needed to get it done. I needed to win it. Something was building that something good was going to happen. And it did. It was a big sigh of relief. I was like 'mission accomplished.' That's the feeling I have at this time."

Of American Pharoah, Baffert added, "He was just born with that talent. He has that long stride. He's quick. He's got a really good mind. He just floats over the ground. He's different, just the way he's made. What we saw yesterday is that he's not one-dimensional, which is so nice to have. He's quick. He's handy. You can move on him at any time. I think with more racing he's getting smarter." **Cont. p3**

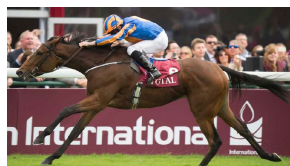

 “He wasn’t rank with Victor [Espinoza] at all,” Baffert continued of American Pharoah. “So he can sit there and pounce, run by you and go a mile and a quarter. He is competitive. He wants to win. He knows he’s special.”

Baffert’s previous Derby winners, Silver Charm, Real Quiet and War Emblem, each went on to victory in the Preakness. American Pharoah will likely have to face stablemate Dortmund in Baltimore.

“It’s one of those things where I will sit down and discuss it with [Dortmund’s owner] Kaleem Shah,” Baffert said. “I’m sure he’s going to want a little revenge. His horse ran a really good race. If ‘Pharoah’ is that good, he’s going to have to run hard. Right now I would say if all’s well [Dortmund would run]; and Dortmund looked good.”

Owner Arnold Zetcher and trainer Simon Callaghan were also looking ahead to the Preakness Sunday morning.

“You’d have to think if all is well that he’s earned that right,” Callaghan said of a Preakness start for Firing Line. “We were glad we finally got to best Dortmund after he’d beaten us twice. And we believe we can be right there with American Pharoah. We’ll walk him here for the next three or four days and monitor him. We’ll then train him with the Preakness in mind. Maybe we’ll breeze him, or maybe we’ll just gallop him. We’ll let the horse tell us. If we go, we’ll probably ship up there at some point next week.”

Of his Derby runner-up, Zetcher added, “We’re all exhausted and he’s not.”

DERBY 141 A RECORD-SETTER

A record 170,513 fans packed Churchill Downs to watch American Pharoah win Saturday’s GI Kentucky Derby, according to figures released by the track Sunday. The previous record was the 165,307 who witnessed the 2012 Derby win of I’ll Have Another. All-sources handle for the day was \$194.3 million, an increase of 4% over the 2014 total of \$186.6 million. That figure bested the previous record of \$187.0 million set in 2012. All-sources wagering on the Derby itself was \$137.9 million, up 7% from a year ago and a 4% increase over the previous record of \$133.1 set in 2012. On-track wagering on the Kentucky Derby program of \$23.0 million declined 2% from \$23.4 million in 2014. On-track wagering on the Kentucky Derby race totaled \$12.0 million, an increase of 1% over 2014’s \$11.9 million. Churchill Downs returned \$154.3 million to bettors on the Kentucky Derby Day race program.

“The Kentucky Derby is an awe-inspiring spectacle, and all of us who work here feel privileged to be a part of this experience,” said Bill Carstanjen, CEO of Churchill Downs Incorporated. “We saw continued improvement again this year, and we preliminarily expect record Adjusted EBITDA with growth over last year’s Kentucky Oaks and Derby week of \$5.0-to-\$6.5 million.”

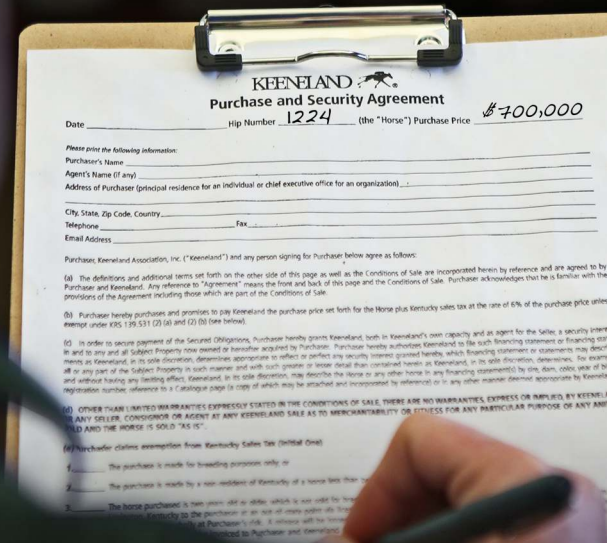

Spanish Queen, who graduated on debut versus state-bred foes going one mile over the Santa Anita turf course Mar. 5, jumped up to the graded ranks for her second start, closing late to miss by just a neck when second behind re-opposing Spirit of Xian in the course-and-trip Gill Providencia S. Apr. 4. Spanish Queen broke well and tucked in behind the early pacesetters as Spirit of Xian set fractions of :23.07 and :46.81. Forced to wait for racing room late on the final turn, the dark bay filly tipped out between foes in upper stretch and bound to the lead before easily holding off the late rally of longshot Sharla Rae. "She keeps improving," said winning rider Brice Blanc. "Richard [Baltas] has done a great job. He takes his time and he's been trying to get her to settle down and take everything in. She's getting more and more professional. She has so many gears, she has a good turn of foot and she puts me in good spots as well. She's done everything well and she even seemed like she was a step better than her last race." Of Spanish Queen's next start, Baltas said, "We'll just have to play it by ear. I wasn't even planning on this race, but I let the horse tell me what to do and she was begging me to go out there. If she comes out of the race good and she really wants to go, then maybe we go in the [May 30 GI] American Oaks because it looks like we're the horse to beat. A homebred for Jack Nakkashian, Harry Bederian and Harout Kamberian, Spanish Queen is the first foal out of Spanish Bunny.

Introduced over seven furlongs at Leopardstown in July, Legatissimo offered no clear signal that she was a Guineas winner in the making when beating only one rival in sixth on that occasion. Sent off at 12-1 for an often-informative fillies' maiden over that trip at the Galway festival at the end of the month, the bay took a significant stride in the right direction to win from the likes of the subsequent G1 Fillies' Mile heroine Together Forever (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}).

Second to the G3 Silver Flash S. winner and eventual G1 Prix Marcel Boussac third Jack Naylor (GB) (Champs Elysees {GB}) in The Curragh's Listed Flame of Tara S. over this trip at the end of August, she again had Together Forever behind in third and entered winter quarters a genuine Classic hopeful.

That tag seemed to disappear when she could manage only fourth in the G3 Leopardstown 1000 Guineas Trial over seven furlongs on testing ground Apr. 12, but Legatissimo bounced back a fortnight later to register an authoritative score over an extended nine-furlong trip in Gowran Park's Listed Victor McCalmont Memorial S. With the proven mare Euphrasia (Ire) (Windsor Knot {Ire}) and the talented 4-year-old Carla Bianca (Ire) (Dansili {GB}) well adrift there, trainer David Wachman's confidence was restored and she was sent to Newmarket to attempt to fill the void left by the absence of Ballydoyle's long-time ante-post favorite Found (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}). Not rushed early, she was shuffled towards the rear racing against the stand's rail with Lucida initially next to her as Tiggy Wiggy displayed a fair measure of her potent speed up front. As Kevin Manning took Lucida towards the middle of the track in an attempt to find a clear passage, Ryan Moore weaved Legatissimo between rivals who were starting to pay for laying closer to Tiggy Wiggy. Helped by the cutaway as the false rail ended, she pursued Lucida, who had gained the lead from the Hannon filly approaching the furlong marker, and ground her into submission as her stamina kicked in during the last 100 yards. For trainer David Wachman, who was saddling a first British Classic winner, the result was vindication for an unconventional ploy. "Gowran was like a bit of work, so although we were taking a chance coming here so soon after, it worked," he said. "I knew that if it didn't come too quick, we definitely had a shout and she's a lovely, big, scopy filly." **Cont. p6**



“She was very good last year, but a bit weak and we always held her in high regard,” Wachman continued. “We went to Leopardstown and she was beaten in very soft ground and didn’t perform, so we were left scratching our heads a bit but she won very well last week.”

Wachman added, “I was not worried about coming down in trip; we were just taking a chance running her a week after her stakes race. She’ll go further, so we’ll have plenty of options. She got home well and we’ll see how she is, as she’s had three runs in three weeks and the owners have a lot of fillies for Epsom. She’s in everything, so we’ll take it one step at a time. Her dam is a full-sister to Fame and Glory (GB), so she should get a trip.”

Ryan Moore was backing up that impression, although he appeared lukewarm on the topic of the 1 1/2-mile trip of the Oaks. “They went a proper gallop; she’s got plenty of speed, but she really got up the hill well,” he said. “I wouldn’t be sure she’d necessarily want a mile and a half, but I think she’ll go farther.” Moore also paid tribute to Legatissimo’s regular partner Wayne Lordan and added, “I was speaking to Wayne and he said she can be little bit keen in stages, but that when you get her into a rhythm she settles good and she did today.”

Lucida’s trainer Jim Bolger was taking defeat on the chin afterwards. “There are no excuses. I’d have to be very happy with Lucida,” he commented. “Her next run is more than likely to be the G1 Coronation S. [at Royal Ascot June 19], but there is a possibility of the [May 24] G1 Irish 1000 Guineas at The Curragh in the meantime. Kevin said she ran her heart out—he was very happy with her. He thought he had it put to bed at 7 1/2 furlongs, but the other one came and got by her near the line. Nine years out of 10, that run would have been good enough to win.”

Manning added, “She stumbled out of the stalls and jumped a little bit to the right, but she traveled into the race quite well and there are no real excuses.”

Tiggy Wiggy’s rider Richard Hughes told *PA Sport*, “We’ve had a go and I’m only third because she’s so good. You can argue that she stays, but she’s not as effective over a mile. We used her speed over six and it would be unfair to her to keep trying over a mile.”

As previously mentioned, Legatissimo’s dam is a full-sister to Fame and Glory, who counted the Irish Derby and Ascot Gold Cup among his five Group 1 wins.

Sauntering throughout with Al Kazeem in closest attendance, Cirrus des Aigles was still well within himself as the British raider began to be ridden in the “false straight” leading to the final turn. As the filly **We Are (Ire)** (Dansili {GB}) cracked in behind, Al Kazeem managed to fight his way to the flanks of Cirrus des Aigles, but that was all the veteran needed to spur him on. Hardly touched with Soumillon’s whip, he hit the line a comfortable winner to defy the press and his trainer to produce some original praise. “He’s just amazing and to sum up, he’s the best,” trainer Corine Barande-Barbe said. “You always worry when he is running for the first time this year, but he enjoys bowling along in front and dictating the pace. He was just having fun toying with them.”

Cirrus des Aigles used victory in this race last year as a springboard to glory in the G1 Prix d’Ispahan here and in Epsom’s G1 Coronation Cup, where he finished lame despite brushing aside Flintshire (GB) (Dansili {GB}). He could be returning to those contests now, although his conditioner has one special target in mind for him later in the summer. “We are obviously delighted and now have to see what to do with him next,” she added. “He is in all the top Group 1 races like the [May 24] G1 Prix d’Ispahan, the G1 Prince of Wales’s S. [at Royal Ascot June 17], the [June 6] G1 Coronation Cup and the G1 Eclipse S. [at Sandown July 4], but I’d love to win the [June 28] G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud with him. I will ask the horse where he wants to run and that’s where we’ll go.” **Cont. p8**

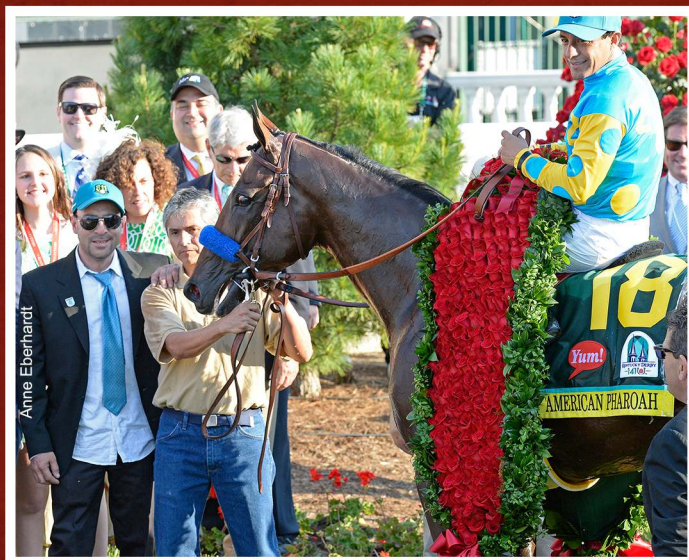

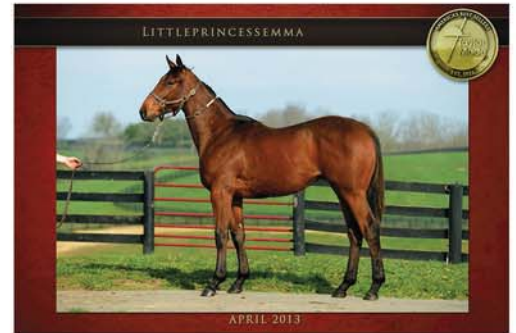
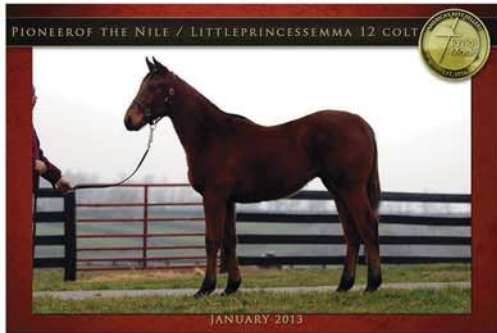

GLENEAGLES LIKELY TO IRISH GUINEAS

Saturday's G1 2000 Guineas victor **Gleneagles (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) will likely resurface in the May 23 G1 Irish 2000 Guineas at The Curragh, trainer Aidan O'Brien confirmed again Sunday on *At the Races*. Gleneagles, who has crossed the wire first in all but one of his seven starts, earned his second Group 1 when besting Godolphin's French shipper Territories (Ire) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) by 2 1/4 lengths Saturday. "He traveled well and he has the ability to quicken-- that's what he showed us last year," O'Brien said of the Michael Tabor colorbearer. O'Brien compared Gleneagles to the six-time Group 1 winner Giant's Causeway, a full-brother to Gleneagles's dam, You'resothrilling.

"He's very much like Giant's Causeway, so he could get a mile and a quarter, but he looks to be a miler, really," the conditioner noted. "What you want in a good miler is the ability to travel and then quicken, and that is what he can do. I think the Irish Guineas will be next, but we'll have to see what the ground is like and the boys will talk about that. It looks the obvious race, though."

While punters favored the come-backing 2013 G1 Japanese Derby hero Kizuna (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}) in this famed contest, in the end it was the ever-reliable Gold Ship who would pull through to record his sixth Group 1 win. Winner of the G1 Japanese 2000 Guineas, G1 St Leger and G1 Arima Kinen three years ago, Gold Ship had contested this event the last two

years but hadn't managed to finish better than fifth. Both his previous efforts have been bookended by victories in the G2 Hanshin Daishoten and G1 Takarazuka Kinen, however, and having won the former again

Mar. 22, the gutsy grey will likely aim for a monumental triple in June. Dropping back to last early despite being hustled by jockey Norihiro Yokoyama leaving the inside gate, Gold Ship angled to the outside the first time past the stands and made up a few positions, leaving Kizuna to trail the field.

Sensing a moderate pace up front, Gold Ship and Yokoyama made a sweeping move down the backstretch to sit about three lengths off the lead and three wide into the final turn. Wound up by Yokoyama at the top of the lane, the grey needed the length of the stretch to run down Curren Mirotic, and found the wire in the nick of time as Fame Game came with a late charge. "I was thinking of going to the front if he started well, which obviously was not the case," Yokoyama explained. "From there on I just concentrated on following the pace and was careful not to turn him off. In the straight, he really showed his stamina and perseverance."

The rider added, "He's often said to be unsuited to Kyoto Racecourse, but I think it's just that he's not a handy type of horse and needs a skilled rider to guide him."

Sunday's Champions Mile at Sha Tin was expected to be a battle between Able Friend, the world's joint highest-rated runner, and Luger (Aus) (Choisir {Aus}), exiting a scintillating victory in the Hong Kong Derby some six weeks ago. In the end, as so many of his races have become, it turned into a one-horse show for Able Friend, as he hit the front inside the final furlong and came home an easier-than-it-appeared winner from stablemates Rewarding Hero and Dan Excel.

It has been nothing short of a magical run for Able Friend, with five straight victories--four of them over his pet distance of a mile sprinkled with a tremendous score in the G1 Queen's Silver Jubilee Cup at seven furlongs. The chestnut, who weighed in at 1294 pounds for this bout, was exiting a tally in the Chairman's Trophy Apr. 7, an effort widely regarded as basically sub-par in spite of everything. If he was rusty or underdone that day with this target on the horizon, he was polished and sharp Sunday.

Taken back to fifth of the sextet as Dan Excel led, Able Friend drafted behind Luger from fifth and followed that one around the circle. Pulled out and around his younger rival, the big chestnut went by Luger as if he was standing still and remained under a long Joao Moreira hold as he came to Dan Excel at the 150.

Never off the bridle, Able Friend was home his final 400 meters in a mind-boggling :21.35 and whooshed by with a minimum of fuss. The clear disappointment of the race was Luger, who failed to beat one home, but was found to be suffering from an irregular heartbeat following the race. Rewarding Hero clocked the second-fastest final quarter-mile, while Dan Excel improved from his last run and is on target for a defense of his title in the G1 Singapore Airlines International Cup in two weeks' time.

Able Friend continues to enjoy the full admiration of his rider, who is now within six victories of the single-season record 114 with 20 meetings left on the calendar.

"He's just outstanding," said Moreira. "He just does everything properly. He's a dream horse. I feel like my dream came true; I found one of the best horses in the world and I'm very pleased at the opportunity I was given by the trainer and the owner. I really appreciate it."

Next on the agenda for Able Friend? A lunchtime summit between trainer John Moore, who has saddled six of the last seven winners of the Champions Mile, and owner Dr. Cornel Li, who campaigned the Moore-conditioned 2007 Champions Mile hero Able One (NZ) (Cape Cross {Ire}). At stake? A trip to Royal Ascot for the G1 Queen Anne S.

"I'm getting on a plane tonight so I'm going to get four or five days to cool down and then when I get back from that trip I'll sit down with Cornel for lunch and we'll have a chat," said Moore. "But first let's see how he pulls up and if everything is in order, we will see if he goes to Ascot."

A decision the racing world will eagerly await.

MEDAGLIA COLT TOPS INGLIS OPENER

The four-day Inglis Australian Broodmare and Weanling sale kicked off yesterday in Sydney with figures largely comparable to 12 months ago. The platinum weanling session--which offered 103 weanlings with x-rays on site--and select weanling session kicked off proceedings, and combined saw 169 youngsters change hands for A\$5,773,350, compared to 128 sold for

A\$4,388,500 last year. The average dipped fractionally, down 0.4% to A\$34,162, and the median was down 6% to A\$16,000. The buyback rate climbed 6% to 18.8%. The top price of A\$230,000 was paid for a colt by Medaglia d'Oro, sire of this year's G1 Golden Slipper winner Vancouver (Aus), while the session topper this time last year cost A\$450,000. **Cont. p14**



“Today’s results are a clear indicator to vendors that x-raying their premium weanlings and offering them in Sydney is a great way of giving buyers confidence to invest,” said Inglis’s Managing Director Mark Webster. “There is plenty of strength in the market and we are pleased to see vendors that brought their better weanlings here get rewarded in the sale ring, which sets a great base on which to build this sale.”

Medaglia d’Oro has gotten his Southern Hemisphere stud career off to a solid start at Darley’s Kelvinside Stud in Australia, but Vancouver’s Golden Slipper score in March catapulted him to new heights. It is no surprise, then, that his progeny would be highly sought-after Down Under, but yesterday’s sale-topper ([lot 110](#)) was secured by U.S.-based agent Roderick Wachman. Consigned by Middlebrook Valley Lodge, as agent for Twin Creeks Thoroughbreds, the bay colt is out of the unraced Kiss the Sun (Aus) (Anabaa), a half-sister to G1 Blue Diamond S. winner Undoubtedly (Aus) (Redoute’s Choice {Aus}); G2 Reisling S. victress Regal Kiss (Aus) (Royal Academy) and G3 Blue Diamond Preview scorer Toorak Thunder (Aus) (Real Cash).

A pair of fillies by freshman sires shared the second-highest price of A\$200,000. [Lot 46](#) was the first weanling to be offered at auction by the 2012 2-year-old Triple Crown winner Piero (Aus) (Lonhro {Aus}). Offered by Newgate Farm, the September foal is out of American stakes winner Amazing Tale (Tale of the Cat), and her second dam is the GIII Turnback the Alarm S. winner Svea Dahl (Honor Grades). The filly was purchased by the Chinese-based Yu Long Investments, which reportedly plans to pinhook her at next year’s Easter sale. Piero, who stands at Coolmore Australia in Jerry’s Plains for A\$77,000, had three go through the ring Sunday. The others sold for A\$150,000 ([lot 81](#)) and A\$80,000 ([lot 113](#)), making him the leading sire by average for the session (A\$143,333).

The second filly to reach A\$200,000 was a first-crop daughter of G1 Kentucky Derby and G1 Dubai World Cup winner Animal Kingdom, who stands Southern Hemisphere time at Arrowfield Stud in the Hunter Valley. [Lot 105](#) is a half-sister to an accomplished runner by another successful shuttler--Darley’s Bernardini--in Toydini (Aus), winner of four Group 2 or 3 races. Their dam, Johan’s Toy, is a half-sister to group winners Extra Zero (Aus) (Danzero {Aus}) and Operetta Lass (Aus) (Singspiel {Ire}), and will be offered herself during the broodmare portion of the sale. The Animal Kingdom filly was consigned by Goodwood Farm and purchased by New Zealand’s Lyndhurst Farm. Animal Kingdom had one other offering yesterday, a filly that sold to Graebar Park for A\$50,000.

Other first-season sires to record notable prices Sunday were Pierro’s archrival All Too Hard (Aus) (Casino Prince {Aus}), the four-time Group 1-winning half-brother to Black Caviar (Aus) (Bel Esprit {Aus}) who stands at Vinery Australia, and five-time Group 1 winner Ocean Park (NZ) (Thorn Park {Aus}). Each had a weanling sell for A\$80,000. All Too Hard averaged A\$72,500 (four sold for A\$290,000).

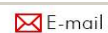
First-crop yearling sire Sepoy (Aus), whose progeny have twice broken the record for a first-season sire at this year’s yearling sales, proved again popular Sunday, with a filly out of the stakes-winning Baby Corn (Aus) (Exceed and Excel {Aus}) selling to Laurel Oak Bloodstock for A\$190,000. [Lot 52](#)’s first three dams are all stakes winners, and she is a half-sister to the dual Group 1-place Cornrow (Aus) (Duporth {Aus}).

Arrowfield’s Snitzel has been red-hot both on the racetrack and in sales rings as of late, and that trend continued Sunday when he was the second-leading sire by average behind Pierro, with three sold for an average of A\$118,333. His haul was headed by [lot 32](#), a half-brother to Group 1 winner Pear Tart (Aus) (Dehere), purchased by Sheamus Mills Bloodstock and Two Bays Farm for A\$150,000. They are out of the Sadler’s Wells mare Tangerine Dream (Fr), from the family of GI Yellow Ribbon S. scorer Aube Indienne (Aus) (Bluebird) and Group 3 winner and Group 1-placed Mare Nostrum (Aus) (Caerleon). Widden Stud’s Sebring (Aus) was the day’s third-leading sire by average, with three sold for an average of A\$91,667.

Last year’s champion first-season sire I Am Invincible (Aus) had five sell for A\$214,500 (A\$42,900 average), headed by an A\$150,000 colt from Middlebrook Valley Lodge. Consigned as [lot 86](#), the bay son of the stakes-placed Flion Fenena (Aus) (Lion Hunter {Aus}) was purchased by Musk Creek Farm.

A short general weanling session followed, with 27 of 31 catalogued selling for A\$120,100. The average of A\$4,804 was up 19% from last year, while the median dropped 33% to A\$2,000.

A TRIBUTE TO LOGAN BAILEY

My first day of employment for *Daily Racing Form* was the Monday after the 1984 GI Kentucky Derby.

I was hired by Logan Bailey, who will be laid to rest on the Monday after the 2015 Derby.

I took his passing hard, tears flowing several times the night after learning the news from another person Logan hired, Tammy Curlin.

I didn't have to think long to figure out how old Logan was. He used to always say he was from the same crop as Count Fleet.

When Logan turned 50, *DRF* colleague Woody Coyle and I placed an ad in the paper. We ran a photo of Logan and a photo of Count Fleet and underneath it said: "Happy Birthday Logan. From the same crop as Count Fleet."

Logan loved it.

Logan interviewed me while I was still a journalism student at the University of Kentucky. He did so as a courtesy to my father, who knew Logan's well-known father, Clay Wade Bailey, a Capitol beat reporter for the *Kentucky Post*.

During my first full time job in journalism, with the *Frankfort State Journal*, I received a call one day from Logan. The Kentucky Bureau chief, Ercel Ellis, was leaving *DRF* and Logan was being promoted. That opened up a spot writing the Kentucky breeding column and covering the sales, farms and bloodstock beat. Logan asked if I would be interested.

Interested?

I would have crawled the 20 miles from Frankfort to Keeneland, where the *Form* offices were at the time, to speak to Logan about the position.

Logan offered me the job a few days later and I went in to the office of *State Journal* publisher Al Dix, himself a big racing fan, to talk things over.

"Would you receive a pay increase from what I am paying you,?" Dix asked me.

"Yes sir, 50%," I replied.

"Why are you in my office," he said. "Take the job. Take the job now."

My first day on the job, Logan sat me down and said the following, "If I had two candidates for the job, and one could write and knew a little about racing and the other knew racing but could not write, I would take the writer every day. I can teach you about racing, but I don't have the time to teach you to write."

Teach he did.

Logan took me under his wing; he became my mentor.

I loved racing, but I was a handicapper. Logan taught me about the breeding industry, how horse sales "really" work, and how to become a professional reporter.

I couldn't believe one person knew so much about every facet of racing and breeding. More importantly, he was willing to share it.

Logan was passionate about racing and passionate about good journalism, and worked tirelessly to teach me how both work in concert. He taught me how to approach owners and breeders and to understand how difficult it is to raise, sell or race a good horse.

Once I got upset when a buyer wouldn't speak to me at a sale.

"He's under no obligation to speak to you," Logan said, instructing a young journalist. "Figure out how you write a good story without it."

Besides our love of the Thoroughbred industry, Logan and I had other things in common. He and I were both born in Frankfort, though he graduated from Frankfort High School and myself from Franklin County High School. It was once a true rivalry, which Logan reminded me of on many occasions.

We also shared a passion for baseball. In true Logan fashion, his obituary noted that in lieu of flowers, donations may be made to a youth baseball league which he was involved with for 40 years.

Logan's two sons played baseball and Logan was a true student of the finer points of the game. Summer vacations often included a night at a baseball stadium.

During my tenure with the *Form*, my beloved Cincinnati Reds won the 1990 World Series. Logan could see the delight that team brought me.

At least three times a week for seven years, Logan and I not only worked side-by-side but we had lunch together. We often got confused over whose turn it was to buy, and laughed about it.

He wasn't just a boss; Logan was a true friend.

When I left *DRF* for *The Racing Times*, and subsequently *The Blood-Horse* and back to the *State Journal*, Logan was my biggest cheerleader.

I nominated Logan for inclusion in the Kentucky Journalism Hall of Fame and was there when he was inducted.

One night, at a charity auction for the Journalism school at UK, there was an item I simply had to buy: the manual typewriter used by Logan's father during his newspaper days.

I bought the typewriter and gave it to Logan's son Rick with instructions to wrap it as a gift for Logan at Christmas.

I will never forget the emotion in Logan's voice when he called to thank me.

One day Logan made a small wager on a horse.

"How did he finish,?" someone asked.

"Absolutely," Logan said, of course meaning absolutely last.

In the race of those who impacted my life, who are responsible for any measure of success I have achieved, Logan Bailey finished first.

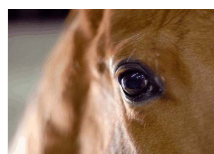

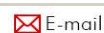

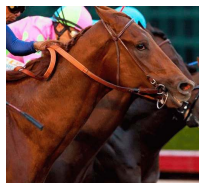
