MORE OF THE SAME

Newmarket's G1 2000 Guineas worked out as many had expected long beforehand, with **Gleneagles (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) proving a cut above, and now that the pecking order has been established, it will be a surprise if Michael Tabor's bay does not follow up in Saturday's G1 Tattersalls Irish 2000 Guineas at The Curragh. Of the last five to attempt this Classic double, three have made it, with Ballydoyle's Rock of Gibraltar (Ire) and

Henrythenavigator the most notable and the same stable's George Washington (Ire) (Daneshill) failing only due to the prevalent testing conditions in 2006. Unbeaten in Kildare, Gleneagles has all angles covered now that the ground has dried, and the only question mark would arise if any unexpected rain arrives.

"He's very like Giant's Causeway, really, but he probably would have more speed," Aidan O'Brien, who is chasing a 10th renewal, commented of the close relative to that six-time Group 1 winner. "That's the way we would rate him at the moment. He's a very well-made horse--not too big and not too small. He has a great step to him, a lovely head and a lovely mind. He travels very well in his races and quickens well. When he gets there, he doesn't do a lot, but he's very professional."

O'Brien added, "He hasn't done a lot, it's only three weeks since [Newmarket]. He had an easy week after and then he did three half-speeds and seems in good form. We'd love to keep him on good ground or better, so hopefully the ground will be good and we'll look forward to Saturday."

On the face of it, there is too much clear water between him and **Ivawood (Ire)** (Zebedee {GB}) for it to be feasible for the Richard Hannon trainee to mount a serious challenge in this rematch. Separated by three lengths in the May 2 Classic, there is little evidence that the British raider will find improvement over this mile, which stretches his stamina to the limit. Now that the impressive G2 July S. and G2 Richmond S. winner has suffered three straight defeats, it appears that some of his former luster has gone, but his conditioner remains in customarily positive mood. "The odds are stacked against us, but we think Ivawood has improved again since the Guineas and, though we are not claiming we will beat Gleneagles, who looked a proper horse at Newmarket, we have always loved our fellow and he'll be giving his all to gain revenge." **Cont. p7**

FROSTED WORKS FOR BELMONT

Godolphin's **Frosted** (Tapit), a respectable rallying fourth in the G1 Kentucky Derby, tuned up for the G1 Belmont S. with a five-furlong move in 1:01.45 (12/20) ([video](#)) in Elmont Friday. Working in company with 5-year-old **Tamarkuz** (Speightstown), winner of the G2 Godolphin Mile Mar. 28, Frosted and his workmate hit the wire together and galloped out six furlongs in 1:13 2/5. Frosted rolled to a two-length victory in

Aqueduct's G1 TwinSpires.com Wood Memorial Apr. 4. "[Frosted] worked with a really nice horse, and we didn't want him to go too fast or too slow, so it was a perfect work," trainer Kiaran McLaughlin said. "They both galloped out well and came back in good shape, and we'll do it again next week for June 6." Tamarkuz, a winner of four straight in Dubai, is probable for the G1 Metropolitan H. on the Belmont S. undercard. "Tamarkuz is a nice horse," McLaughlin added. "We're picking out a tough spot to get him started, but he's a very good horse. He's been with us about a month now and has done everything right. He's worked three times here and has been training very well. It's a tough race, but he won the Godolphin Mile in his last start, so it's not like we need to back him into an allowance race."

PIERCE TRAINEES SQUARE OFF IN NASSAU

The Malcolm Pierce-trained duo of **Deceptive Vision** (A.P. Indy) and **Overheard** (Macho Uno) square off in Woodbine's grassy GII Nassau S. Saturday. The pair was separated by just a nose, with Pin Oak Stable's Overheard coming out on top, in the nine-panel GII Dance Smartly S. here last July. Second in the GIII Violet S. at Monmouth in August, and third by a neck to subsequent GI Matriarch S. winner La Tia (City Place) in Belmont's GIII Athenia S. Oct. 12, Overheard was last seen finishing fourth in a Keeneland allowance over soft sod Apr. 9. "She likes that Keeneland course. I don't know if it was the soft turf, but it was a pretty solid race." Pierce said about the off-the-board comebacker. "I know she's a graded stakes winner, but there were other graded stakes winners in the race. She'd been off awhile and maybe needed a race." Sam-Son Farm's 'TDN Rising Star' Deceptive Vision annexed September's GII Canadian S. over the aforementioned La Tia, and was third against a solid international cast in the GI E.P. Taylor S. Oct. 19. She displayed her versatility off the bench last time when annexing the GIII Doubledogdare S. over the Keeneland main Apr. 17. "She ran very well," offered Pierce. "She trains so well and runs so well all the time. Her first couple races last season she was very headstrong. In [last year's] Nassau [where she finished third], I brought [Shaun] Bridgmohan up to ride her and she basically ran off with him. She's a lot more relaxed this year. Her best races are when she can settle, get in behind a couple horses, and make that big kick." Trevor Stewart's **Stellar Path (Fr)** (Astronomer Royal) could prove a formidable out-of-town invader. A Group 3 winner in France for conditioner Xavier Thomas-Demaulte, the grey defeated a short field in Aqueduct's Plenty of Grace S. going this distance Apr. 17 in her first try for Christophe Clement.

PLETCHER BELMONT TROOPS GEARING UP

It was a busy Friday morning for trainer Todd Pletcher at Belmont Park.

'TDN Rising Star' and GI Blue Grass S. hero **Carpe Diem** (Giant's Causeway) returned to the worktab for the first time since his 10th-place finish in the GI Kentucky Derby. Under Hall of Famer John Velazquez, the chestnut worked in company with GII Peter Pan S. winner **Madefromlucky** (Lookin At Lucky). The Belmont S.-bound duo covered five furlongs in a bullet :59.01 (1/20).

"The [main] track was probably playing a little bit on the quick side, but I thought it was a pretty good work for both of them," Pletcher said. "It was a fast work, but in hand with a strong gallop out.

Pletcher continued, "[Carpe Diem has] been galloping well. He's kind of an enthusiastic horse on a daily basis, so we decided on two breezes between the Derby and the Belmont and I thought we got a good, solid work this morning. That was the best that I've seen [Madefromlucky] breeze since we've had him. It was a very good work for him. It appears that he likes the track here, which is what we were hoping for and it seems like the Peter Pan was good going forward."

'TDN Rising Star' **Materiality** (Afleet Alex), an eventful sixth in the Derby, and GII Louisiana Derby runner-up **Stanford** (Malibu Moon) worked five furlongs together in 1:00.04 (4/20) ([video](#)). Velazquez was aboard the GI Florida Derby hero, who is also being aimed at the final leg of the Triple Crown.

"I thought both horses worked extremely well," Pletcher said. "It was a little bit slower in the first part than the Carpe Diem/Madefromlucky team, but they finished up with similar times and a strong gallop out as well. Before we went out, I told them we were looking for something between a minute and 1:01 with a strong gallop-out so the fractions seemed like they were going to land them in that time frame. I just relayed the times to them and they picked it up on their own through the lane."

Unbeaten 'TDN Rising Star' **Competitive Edge** (Super Saver), an impressive winner of the GIII Pat Day Mile at Churchill May 2, remains possible for either the GI Metropolitan H. or the GII Woody Stephens S. He breezed four furlongs in :48.59 (9/42) over the Belmont training track with impressive Churchill allowance winner **Curalina** (Curlin).

miles at 8:30 a.m. following the renovation break with regular exercise rider Jorge Alvarez aboard. American Pharoah, trained by Hall of Famer Bob Baffert, will attempt to become the sport’s 12th Triple Crown winner in the GI Belmont S. June 6. “It went nice, didn’t seem like he was tired or anything,” Alvarez said. “He came back pretty much the same [after Derby]. So far, no difference.” Alvarez was also the exercise rider for American Pharoah’s sire, 2009 GI Kentucky Derby

runner-up Pioneerof the Nile. “They are both good horses, but since day one this horse [American Pharoah] has covered so much ground,” he said. Baffert’s head assistant Jimmy Barnes was also pleased with American Pharoah’s first gallop since annexing the second leg of the Triple Crown. “It went very nice,” Barnes said. “He just had a 1 3/16-mile gallop today, but it went very nice. He’s perfect--just the way he always is--so we’ll gallop a little bit further maybe tomorrow [Saturday] and then by Sunday we’ll be back to his normal gallop at a mile-and-a-half.”

TONALIST WORKS FOR MET MILE; PICKS UP JOHNNY V

Shel Evans’s ‘**TDN Rising Star**’ **Tonalist** (Tapit) breezed five panels in a snappy :59.84 (3/20) at Belmont Park Friday under Hall of Fame rider John Velazquez, who will pilot last year’s GI Belmont S. and GI Jockey Club Gold Cup hero for the first time in the June 6 GI Metropolitan H. “He worked this morning with Johnny Velazquez,” offered conditioner Christophe Clement, “five-eighths in :59 3/5, out in 1:13 2/5. He looked well, finished well, and as of now he came back in good order. The plan is to move forward to the Met Mile, which will be a very tough race, but it’s exciting. He’s one of the few horses with graded stakes wins at Belmont from one mile to 1 1/2 miles, so he’s a very exciting horse to be around.” Tonalist most recently exploded home to take Big Sandy’s eight-panel GIII Westchester S. under Joe Bravo. He had been ridden by Joel Rosario in his previous six outings, which also included a win in Belmont’s GII Peter Pan S. last May in addition to local tallies in the “Test of the Champion” and Jockey Club Gold Cup. Velazquez is the regular rider for defending Met Mile winner Palace Malice (Curlin), who is expected to work for the race Monday.

PRIVATE ZONE TARGETS BC CLASSIC

Good Friends Stable’s MGISW **Private Zone** (Macho Uno), recent winner of the GII Churchill Downs S. May 2, has arrived at Monmouth Park and will be pointed toward a start in the GI Breeders’ Cup Classic at season’s end, according to trainer Jorge Navarro.

“The Classic is the ultimate goal,” commented Navarro. “[Co-owner] Rene Douglas told me he thinks the horse wants to go longer. Every time he hits the wire, he just keeps on going, so the plan is to stretch him out.”

Private Zone was transferred to Navarro following his win in the Nov. 29 GI Cigar Mile for trainer Alfredo Velazquez. The bay was runner-up by a half-length behind Honor Code (A.P. Indy) in the GII Gulfstream Park H. over one mile Mar. 7, prior to his victory in the seven-furlong Churchill Downs S. **Cont. p7**

After arriving to Navarro's barn at the Oceanport oval, Private Zone worked a bullet four furlongs in :47 flat May 20. The trainer noted that the gelding will make his next start at Belmont, but will likely target the series of graded stakes for older males over increasing distances at Monmouth during his summer campaign.

FIPKE JOINS WHOA

Prominent owner/breeder Charles Fipke has joined the Water Hay Oats Alliance in support of federal legislation to ban race day medication. His statement in support of the organization is as follows:

"In regards to the anti-bleeding medication Lasix, although we are at a disadvantage in racing, our stable policy is that we do not permit our trainers to administer Lasix unless scoping results demonstrate that the horses have bled in the lungs during racing. Although administering Lasix before the race usually prevents bleeding, it causes the horses to urinate excessively resulting in about a 100 pound weight loss before the race giving these horses a huge weight advantage. Therefore, in North America nearly all horses run on Lasix whether or they need it or not.

"Unfortunately, Lasix causes electrolyte imbalances and it takes most horses about four to six weeks to fully recover from a race before they are able to compete successfully in their next start. In fact, my trainers average eight to 10 weeks between races.

"In contrast, in all other parts of the world (Europe, Australia, the Middle and Far East) Lasix and race day medications are banned, so that one or two weeks between races is relatively common. In fact, I have known of horses to win a Group 1 race in Australia at a mile and a half and three days later compete and win the G1 Melbourne Cup at two miles. Such statistics are unknown in North America, except before the 1970's when Lasix became an accepted practice.

"If Lasix was banned in North America and horses could regularly race with, say even two to three weeks between races, all owners and trainers would have the potential to earn more money and have better odds of potentially not going bankrupt thereby putting many thousands of people out of work. Conversely, if more money is made, this will encourage more individuals to become owners and trainers, thereby increasing national employment statistics and growing our business.

"WHOA aims to ban all race day medications--as is the case in the rest of the world. Banning race day medications will be appealing to fans and therefore increase our fan base numbers and will give bettors confidence that the field is even and thereby increasing betting. So for all of these reasons I support WHOA 100%."

THE FORCE RETURNS

With Sole Power (GB) (Kyllachy {GB}) staying at home, Saturday's G2 Temple S. at Haydock has opened up for the likes of **G Force (Ire)** (Tamayuz {GB}) to capitalize. Although he was disappointing when last of

15 in Ascot's G2 British Champions Sprint S. in October, Middleham Park Racing's 4-year-old had looked a natural throughout the campaign and plundered the G1 Haydock Sprint Cup in decisive fashion. Saddled with a four-pound penalty as a result, he may also have to contend with the absence of regular rider Daniel Tudhope who was kicked in the stomach by a horse on Friday. "He's got a penalty, but I just thought it would

be a nice place to start him off," trainer David O'Meara told *PA Sport*. "The rain that has fallen will certainly do him no harm. After this it will be Ascot, but whether that is for the King's Stand or the Diamond Jubilee, we'll decide after this."

Godolphin rely on **Pretend (Ire)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}), who is unproven on turf, but highly talented on Polytrack, as he showed when winning Lingfield's Listed Hever Sprint S. over this trip May 14 and the six-furlong All-Weather Sprint Championships Conditions S. Apr. 3. Trainer Charlie Appleby is watching the skies ahead of his keenly anticipated return to grass. "Pretend has had a nice break since his latest start and I have been delighted with his preparation," he said. "The one thing I am concerned about is the ground. We have declared him on good-to-soft and I am hoping that it dries out a bit--if there is any more rain then it is highly unlikely that he will run. He is in good place at the moment and I want him to have a good experience ahead of the G1 King's Stand S. [at Royal Ascot June 16]. I think that running him on the wrong ground wouldn't be the best preparation for Royal Ascot."

Trainer Robert Cowell often has a leading sprinter to play with, and the May 2 G3 Palace House S. winner **Goldream (GB)** (Oasis Dream {GB}) fits the bill. "By definition this is a Group 2, not a Group 3, so he has to step up in grade essentially, but he won the Palace House quite convincingly and he arrives at Haydock in excellent condition," Cowell told *PA Sport*. "I've been really delighted with his preparation. He was working really well before the Palace House and he has probably come on a notch as well. He's a lot tighter and his work has been absolutely brilliant."

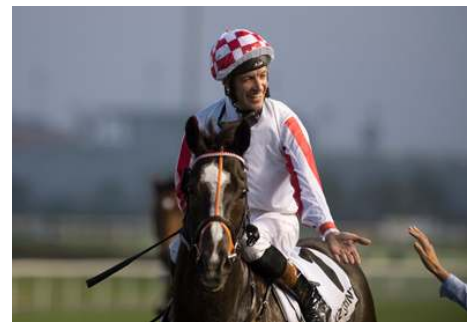

ALL POWER TO THEM

There was a time when Ireland was a bit-player at best in the major sprints, but three of the bunch to have turned that around in recent years in **Sole Power (GB)** (Kyllachy {GB}), **Gordon Lord Byron (Ire)** (Byron {GB}) and **Maarek (GB)** (Pivotal {GB}) line up proud and tall to grace the newly promoted G2 Weatherbys Ireland Greenlands S. at The Curragh Saturday. Despite the gravity of Sole Power's recent achievements, the fact remains that this six-furlong trip is further than ideal for

him and all five of his top-level wins have come over five. Nevertheless, the 8-year-old has been kept away from Haydock's G2 Temple S., which he won in 2011, in favor of this prize, whose fortunes mirror the rise in prominence of the Irish speed brigade. "One of the main reasons we decided to stay at home was that Richard Hughes was available and everyone knows how well he gets on with him," Paddy Power, son of owners Sabena and David Power, told *PA Sport*. "It will be nice for him to finally run at home--it's been a long time. It remains to be seen if he actually knows he's going for a race without having to get on a boat or a plane, though. It's six furlongs and while I'm the most optimistic man alive, I have always said there is nothing to stop him winning over six--I'm sure he stays, the races have just never been run to suit him."

With three Group 1 wins to his name, Gordon Lord Byron is worthy of respect despite being seven, and he was ahead of Sole Power when fourth in Sha Tin's G1 Hong Kong Sprint on his penultimate start in December. Trainer Tom Hogan told *PA Sport*, "We did have him entered to run over a mile a couple of weeks ago, but the ground was testing and that would just test his stamina. While he's still able to mix it with the best sprinters, there's no real need to stretch him. His run in Hong Kong in December was very good, he was just over a length behind Aerovelocity, and that form keeps getting franked."

Maarek needs to regain old glories if he is to compete here, but the 2013 G1 Prix de l'Abbaye hero shaped with promise when fourth in the May 10 G3 Prix de Saint-Georges over Longchamp's five-furlong strip, while Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's G3 Jersey S. winner **Mustajeb (GB)** (Nayef) adds further weight to the contest stepping down in trip after finishing sixth in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile.

FOUND IN DEEP

Unlike Saturday's colts' Classic, which appears cut-and-dried, Sunday's G1 Tattersalls Irish 1000 Guineas at The Curragh looks a stronger affair with little deadwood among the 18 fillies confirmed. 'TDN Rising Star' Found (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) has drawn five under Ryan Moore and is the likely favorite on the basis of her success in the G1 Prix Marcel Boussac at Longchamp in October, with Flaxman Stables' representative **Bocca Baciata (Ire)** (Big Bad Bob {Ire}) close behind. Having

impressed when winning the Apr. 18 Listed Salsabil S. over 10 furlongs at Navan, which has been advertised by the subsequent G3 Blue Wind S. and Listed Cheshire Oaks-winning exploits of **Pleascach (Ire)** (Teofilo {Ire}) and **Diamondsandrubies (Ire)** (Fastnet Rock {Aus}), respectively,

the Niarchos Family's colorbearer should have no problem with this reversion to a mile.

"Bocca Baciata has just been ticking over since the Salsabil and I think she is one of those which seems to go on any ground," trainer Jessica Harrington said, before turning her attention to Gerard Byrne's G3 Silver Flash S. winner **Jack Naylor (GB)** (Champs Elysees {GB}). "I've never actually worked them together, as they came at different times last year and Jack Naylor was out much earlier," she added. "Jack Naylor was meant to run in the Blue Wind S., but the ground was heavy so we didn't run her, which means she's going there without a run. All Jack's form is good and she's not over-big, so I don't think going there without a run will worry her. The way she is bred, she's a real mile-and-a-half filly, so she amazed me last year that she was able to win over six."

Jon and Julia Aisbitt's **Malabar (GB)** (Raven's Pass) represents the form of the G1 1000 Guineas, having finished fourth in that May 3 Newmarket Classic. She was in the same position in the Marcel Boussac behind Found, the subsequent G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches heroine Ervedya (Fr) (Siyouni {Fr}) and Jack Naylor and connections are typically game in having another go.

"She's great and has come on plenty for the Guineas," trainer's son and assistant Mick Channon Jr. commented. "It was a great reappearance, looking a little bit out-paced all the way, but she never folded on us. We know she needs stepping up in trip, but this is worth going for and a bit of softer ground will help her."

The Coolmore partners have won the last four Derbies, and remaining engaged from that camp is G1 Irish 2000 Guineas favorite **Gleneagles (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}); G3 Chester Vase scorer **Hans Holbein (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}); **Giovanni Canaletto (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) and **Kilimanjaro (Ire)** (High Chaparral {Ire}).

One French hopeful remains in Juddmonte's **Epicuris (GB)** (Rail Link {GB}), while Germany has a contender in Qatar Racing's **Rogue Runner (Ger)** (King's Best). **Storm The Stars** (Sea the Stars {Ire}) shortened slightly into 33-1 after taking Friday's Listed Cocked Hat S.

RECORDS SMASHED AT GORESBRIDGE

The 10th edition of the Goresbridge breeze-up sale exploded into action Friday, with the previous record top price smashed early in the day when [lot 16](#) exited the ring. The daughter of Candy Ride (Arg) consigned by Brendan Holland's Grove Stud was knocked down to Italian bloodstock agent Alberto Panetta for €170,000, eclipsing the previous top price of €145,000 achieved

at this sale. Bidding rose fast for the filly, who had impressed in her breeze the previous afternoon, with Tony Watkins and Gay Kelleway both making a determined effort to secure her. Panetta was not to be denied, however, and eventually won the battle. "I've

bought her for Marco Botti in Newmarket," said Panetta, before adding, "I like the sire a lot and she looks like a good early 2-year-old." It was another fine return for Brendan Holland, who bought the filly, from the extended family of sires Sky Mesa, Bernstein and Wiseman's Ferry, at Keeneland last September for \$40,000. The Cork-based consignor sold the top two lots at the Arqana breeze-up, and was continuing a fine season.

It didn't take long for the next six-figure lot to enter the ring, when [lot 30](#) from Tally-Ho Stud sold to David Redvers for €125,000. The daughter of one of Tally-Ho Stud's resident stallions Kodiak (GB) was home bred by the farm's Roger O'Callaghan, who offered the largest draft of any consignor in the sale. Tally-Ho followed up shortly after with another good piece of business when selling a Lonhro (Aus) colt, [lot 40](#), for €80,000.

O'Callaghan bought the February-born colt outside the ring in Keeneland last September, and he represented a successful first buying trip to Goresbridge for the colt's new owners Phil and David Slater. The Slaters, who also have horses in training in Ireland with Tommy Stack, have launched a new ownership venture called 'Owners First,' and the colt will go into training with veteran UK trainer Ron Thompson, who is being tempted back into the training game at the tender age of 76.

The same team struck again when parting with €82,000 for a daughter of Peintre Celebre consigned by Meadowview Stables. The filly, [lot 97](#), was bought by BBA Ireland for just €6,000 as a yearling in Tattersalls Ireland, so represented quite a profit margin for those involved.

Vibrant trade at Ireland's only breeze-up sale saw another early lot into the ring match the previous top price when selling for €145,000. [Lot 41](#), a Birdstone colt, proved American bloodlines are in strong demand when selling to Saudi Arabian based agent Ibrahim Rachid. A regular at sales grounds around the world, Rachid commented, "I loved his pedigree, his breeze and his looks. He will stay in Ireland and will go into training with David Marnane. I have been coming to Ireland for many years, but this is my first time coming to this particular sale. I am very impressed with the standard of horses."

The Birdstone colt was a \$13,000 buy by Chad Schumer at Keeneland September, and is a half-brother to stakes winner Legacy (Sightseeing) from the family of Canadian champion Benburb.

Bloodstock agent Stephen Hillen has been prolific at this season's breeze-ups, and he wasn't long making an impact on Friday. His early purchase of a smart Big Bad Bob (Ire) colt ([lot 23](#)) for €60,000, destined for

Lambourn trainer Joe Tuite, was soon eclipsed when he signed for [lot 59](#), an Acclamation (GB) colt consigned by Mayfield Stables. It took a final bid of €150,000 to secure the easy moving son of the French stakes winner Peach Pearl (GB) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) and, according to Hillen, he will be sporting

the silks of Pete Tingey and Angie Bailey, carried to top-level success by the Kevin Ryan-trained Astaire (Ire) (Intense Focus). **Cont. p13**



Kentucky-based Brendan Heeneey of Equix also got his name onto the buyers sheet early on when purchasing [lot 38](#), a Teofilo (Ire) filly from Jim McCartan's Gaybrook Lodge Stud. The filly's dam Rex Regina (Ire) (Kings Best) was a stakes winner in France and Heeneey commented, "I loved the way she breezed, she's by Teofilo who is fine stallion and she is something different to bring back to the States. She should make a really nice 3-year-old."

Heeneey was back in the ring a short time later when signing for [lot 47](#), a Dark Angel (Ire) colt for €70,000.

"Dark Angel is doing really well at the moment, he seems to sire tough racehorses that want to win and they improve with time, lets hope this lad is lucky," added Heeneey.

Six-figure sums were the order of the day, and Dubai trainer Bhupat Seemar parted with €100,000 to secure [lot 90](#), another Keeneland graduate and a son of freshman sire Drosselmeyer out of a half-sister to three stakes winners, including the Group 1-placed Stopshoppingmaria (More Than Ready). The colt was picked up privately by Roger O'Callaghan after failing to sell for \$27,000 in the ring at Keeneland September. Seemar indicated that the horse would either stay in Ireland or go to the UK in the short term, but would ultimately end up in Dubai.

Another lot to break the €100,000 barrier was [lot 48](#), a Footstepsinthesand (GB) colt bought by David Ryan of Aran Bloodstock for €105,000. Ryan, who

manages Kilfrush Stud in County Limerick, was acting for Qatari interests and commented, "We will take him back to Kilfrush for a short break before deciding on what trainer to send him to."

Italian buyers have been very active at this sale over the years, and bloodstock agent Marco

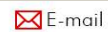
Bozzi struck for [lot 96](#), a colt by promising freshman sire Lilbourne Lad (Ire). Hailing from the famed Mocklershill academy of Willie Brown, Bozzi had to go to €55,000 to secure the half-brother to Hymn Of Love (Ire) (Barathea {Ire}), a stakes winner both in Ireland and America. "I bought him for Gianluca Bietolini, an Italian trainer based in Maison Laffitte," Bozzi said. "He trains some horses for Ken and Sarah Ramsey and I thought this was one of the nicest colts of the day."

Sean Feld, who manages the stallion career of Frankel's half-brother Bullet Train (GB), ensured he made the trip over from America worthwhile when bagging a trio of juveniles. Feld bought a colt by Derby winner Pour Moi (Ire) and a Lope De Vega (Ire) filly for a combined total of €45,000. Of future plans for the pair, Feld commented, "The filly will go to the East coast and the colt will go to California. I haven't decided on trainers yet; I need to get them syndicated first. There is still a few more horses on my list so hopefully I can pick up another."

Feld was true to his word as soon after he added [lot 179](#) to his haul when paying €55,000 for a colt by GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile winner Vale Of York (Ire).

Even before the sale had concluded and before any statistics had been calculated, Goresbridge boss Martin Donohoe expressed his delight with proceedings, saying, "I'm absolutely thrilled with how the sale has gone. Not only have we achieved the highest price ever in the sale, but the number of horses that have made over €100,000 is more than I could have hoped for. I must sincerely thank all the vendors and customers who have contributed to such a successful day."

MAGIC MILLIONS NATIONAL SALE BEGINS

Two weeks of selling on Australia's Gold Coast begins Sunday with the two-day Magic Millions National Weanling sale kicking off the sales company's National Sale Series, which continues with the National Broodmare Sale May 27 to 31; Yearling Sale June 2 to 4 and Racehorse Sale June 5. This year's sale includes dispersals from Wood Nook Farm (18 broodmares, seven race fillies and 12 weanlings) and Heinrich Bloodstock (53 broodmares and 40 weanlings).

The Magic Millions National Weanling sale has developed a firm reputation as a source of future top-class racehorses, its recent graduates including Group 1 winners **Pierro**

(Aus) (Lonhro {Aus}) (A\$115,000 in 2010), **Peggy Jean (Aus)** (Myboycharlie {Ire}) (A\$25,000 in 2012) and **Zoustar (Aus)** (Northern Meteor {Aus}) (A\$85,000 in 2011).

Pinhookers buying at last year's weanling sale enjoyed particularly strong results at this year's Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale, with the average increase in sale price for pinhooks from the National Weanling Sale coming in at 40%, with 43% of pinhooks making between A\$50,000 and A\$200,000 more than their weanling price. Champion and 2-year-old Triple Crown winner Pierro was himself a A\$230,000 pinhook at the Gold Coast sale in 2011, while Peggy Jean was turned around for A\$46,000 as a yearling at the Inglis Classic sale. Zoustar, a dual Group 1 winner as a 3-year-old, was pinhooked for A\$140,000 at the Gold Coast Yearling Sale.

This year's 411 catalogued weanlings include the siblings to seven Group 1 winners, including [lot 4](#), a colt from the first crop of Pierro who is a half-brother to the G1 VRC Oaks winner Arapaho Miss (Aus) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}); [lot 196](#), a Big Brown half-brother to dual Group 1-winning juvenile Hasna (Aus) (Snippets {Aus}), who has herself produced Hades (Aus), the dam of last year's Gold Coast Yearling sale topper; [lot 78](#), a Fastnet Rock (Aus) half-brother to Hong Kong champion Liberator (Aus) (Encosta de Lago {Aus}) who is also from the immediate family of the talented Echo Gal (Aus) (Stratum {Aus}) and Queen's Plate winner Mike Fox (Giant's Causeway); and [lot 278](#), a half-brother to this year's G1 Australian Derby winner Mongolian Khan (Aus) (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}) and G1 Wellington Cup scorer Young Centaur (Aus) (Jeune) by Magnus (Aus), himself a close relative to Black Caviar (Aus).

Pierro is the second-most represented sire in the weanling catalogue with 18 set to go under the hammer, and he heads an exciting first-season sire cast that also includes Your Song (Aus) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}) (16 catalogued); four-time Group 1 winner and half-brother to Black Caviar, All Too Hard (Aus) (Casino Prince {Aus}) (11 catalogued); Animal Kingdom (Leroidesanimaux {Brz}) (three catalogued); and Frankel's half-brother Bullet Train (GB) (Sadler's Wells) (10 catalogued).

Something Sweet in the Broodmare Catalogue...

The National Broodmare sale has drawn a stellar catalogue that includes over 100 stakes winners, headlined by this year's G1 Galaxy S. winner **Sweet Idea (Aus)** (Snitzel {Aus}) ([lot 1356](#)) and New Zealand Group 1 winner **Ruud Awakening (Aus)** (Bernardini), who are both offered as maiden mares off the track. They are late entries as part of the supplementary catalogue and join six other Group 1 winners catalogued, including the maiden mare **Diademe (NZ)** (Savabeel {Aus}) ([lot 612](#)); and the G1 Robert Sangster S. winner **Rostova (Aus)** (Testa Rossa {Aus}), offered by Newgate Farm carrying her fourth foal, by Frankel (GB) ([lot 882](#)). Also catalogued are **Hy Fuji (Aus)** (Fuji Kiskei {Jpn}),

the stakes-winning dam of recent G1 Doncaster H. winner Kermadec (Aus) (Teofilo {Ire}) ([lot 670](#)); Group 2 winner and Group 1-placed **Villa Verde (Aus)** (Not A Single Doubt {Aus}) ([lot 575](#)) as a maiden mare; **Leone Chiara (Aus)** (Lion Huner {Aus}) ([lot 726](#)), the regally bred dam of dual Group 1 winner Star Witness (Aus) (Starcraft {NZ}) and Group 3 winner Nostradamus (Aus) (Medaglia d'Oro) who was purchased for A\$800,000 here last year and is offered again in foal to Sebring; and a pair of half-sisters to this year's G1 Queen Elizabeth S. winner Criterion (NZ) (Sebring {Aus}): the G2 BTC Cup-winning **Varenna Miss (Aus)** (Redoute's Choice {Aus}) ([lot 966](#)), carrying her third foal, by Pierro; and the four-time winner **Our Pride and Joy (Aus)** (Canny Lad {Aus}) ([lot 826](#)), carrying her third foal, by Redoute's Choice (Aus).

CAN DONKI BUCK THE TREND AGAIN?

Sophomore fillies take center stage Sunday in Japan for the G1 Yushun Himba (Japanese Oaks), the second Classic of the season in their division, and **Let's Go Donki (Jpn)** (King Kamehameha {Jpn}) will be out to justify the form of her win in the G1 Oka Sho (Japanese 1000 Guineas) Apr. 12. Let's Go Donki wired the Oka Sho field over a heavy track after getting away with a slow pace, and jockey Yasunari Iwata noted that the step up to 2400 meters is a question mark. "I need

to get her to settle. If I can do that, she should last 2400 meters and let's not forget it's a race among 3-year-old fillies, in which anything can happen," Iwata said. "She has no problems running left-handed, and she should be just

as good as she was for her last race. I thought the field in this year's Oka Sho was pretty strong. I'm sure many of them will be looking to bounce back in the Oaks, but we won a tough Oka Sho, and we can go into the next race with our chins held high." **Rouge Buck (Jpn)** (Manhattan Cafe {Jpn}), a daughter of American champion Ginger Punch (Awesome Again), seeks redemption after finishing a head-scratching ninth as the firm favorite in the Oka Sho. The bay had gone unbeaten in three previous outings against males, but was 15th turning for home in the Oka Sho and failed to make up much ground.

"I imagine it's the same with some of the other horses, but the pace was so slow that she didn't have any time to recover," trainer Masahiro Otake said of Rouge Buck's Oka Sho effort. "The shine on her coat has looked considerably better and she's looking fine physically. She's been racing on a regular basis so as long as she puts in some work, she should be fine. She's untested at the distance of 2400 meters, but she's won at Tokyo over 2000 meters, which is a good sign for us. We're counting on a smoother race--and a better result--this time around."

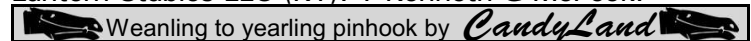
