



PLANS TO INTRODUCE FEDERAL LEGISLATION REVEALED *By T.D. Thornton*

If Congressman Paul Tonko (D-NY) has his way, a new regulatory organization called the Thoroughbred Horseracing Anti-Doping Organization (THADO) will be governing the sport's drug rules by Jan. 1, 2017.

Tonko announced his plans to file sweeping medication reform legislation within the next few weeks in a press teleconference Friday morning. Under his proposed new federal law, an 11-member committee would be created to establish uniform national drug standards whose oversight and enforcement would be the responsibility of the United States Anti-Doping Agency (USADA).

Although Tonko was vague on some points of his ambitious plan--most specifically funding, which he described as being the responsibility of the industry, and not taxpayers--he made it clear he has bipartisan support for his bill in Congress, and that a raft of industry and animal welfare groups have lined up behind the concept, including The Jockey Club, Breeders' Cup Ltd., Water Hay Oats Alliance (WHOA) and The Humane Society. *Cont. p3*

“I’m doing this because I believe it is the sound and fair and just thing to do from all perspectives,” Tonko said. “My commitment here is to move forward with the creation of national, independent anti-doping authority that I believe will protect our athletes and build integrity into our horse racing industry.”

Tonko referenced the U.S. racing industry’s current “patchwork system” of state-by-state regulation “that is not doing the job that we need here to speak forcefully for the horse and the athlete [and] that basically denigrates the perception of the sport.”

Under Tonko’s proposal, the mechanism for getting individual states and racetracks to come into compliance with the proposed federal law would be a steep penalty: Entities that do not abide by THADO’s regulations would not be allowed to participate in interstate wagering.

Tonko also underscored that the proposed law “would not create an ongoing role for the federal government in the racing industry.”

Tonko said THADO would be different from previous legislative attempts to provide federal drug oversight to the racing industry because “it’s a better balanced and more pragmatic approach that will bring what is a growing sense of necessary reform to the system.”

Sean Magers, Tonko’s communications director, confirmed via email that the proposed legislation only covers Thoroughbred racing, and that Standardbred and Quarter Horse racing would be unaffected by the new national drug rules.

“I think it’s very important to understand that we can no longer turn our backs to the health of horses that are the athletes and that are the prime focus of this industry,” Tonko said. “Many of these horses certainly have been pushed beyond their limits, and are only able to run due to medications designed to mask underlying health issues. This dangerous ‘race at all costs’ mentality has produced tragedies in many cases that I find, and I’m certain many people find, unacceptable.”

Travis Tygart commended the proposal.

“It is our hope that the model of independence, harmonization, and enforcement of robust anti-doping programs envisioned through this legislation can be realized to finally truly protect the health of the athletes and the integrity of the competition,” Tygart said.

According to a supporting document provided by Tonko’s staff, the breakdown of the 11-member THADO board would be as follows: The USADA CEO, five USADA board members, and five “at large” directors appointed by USADA from nominees presented by the Thoroughbred industry. The appointment of the Thoroughbred industry representatives would be “subject to certain conflict of interest limitations.”

“I think it offers a more comprehensive and practical outcome, all while giving authority to an independent organization,” Tonko said.

Both in- and out-of-competition testing would be mandated, but as for specifics, Tonko said “the standards developed and the rules and regs would be up to the panel.”

According to Tonko’s supporting document, initial funding for THADO would come from “loans and donations.” State racing commissions would later be tasked with paying THADO “amounts based on that state’s number of starts run during the previous month,” and “in no event will the funds come from an increase in takeout.”

On the heels of Tonko’s announcement, The Jockey Club issued a press release announcing the formation of a Coalition for Horse Racing Integrity (www.horseracingintegrity.com) comprised of The Jockey Club, the Breeders’ Cup, WHOA and The Humane Society. The home page of the coalition’s website highlights the statement that “only a national, independent group like the USADA can create and maintain a system that protects horses and the future of Thoroughbred horse racing.” *Cont. p4*

James Gagliano, president and chief operating officer of The Jockey Club, said that “the racing industry has taken thoughtful and significant steps toward medication reform in recent years and we believe that the creation of this coalition demonstrates widespread support for further changes, changes that can be made in a more timely fashion.”

With the heft of those combined organizations behind the new THADO proposal, it is unclear what the future might be for existing initiatives like the National Uniform Medication Program and the organization that developed those standards, the Racing Medication and Testing Consortium.

“I think it remains to be seen,” said Dr. Dionne Benson, DVM, executive director and chief operating officer of the RMTC. “We’re just going to continue to do the work that we do. I think there will always be a place for good research on horses, and there will always be the need to have that research. We’ve gotten very far in the last 18 months with the National Uniform Medication Program, but we’re certainly not all the way there, and it’s certainly not as easy as anyone would hope.”

Benson said the issue of states’ rights could come into play in trying to enact a law that mandates federal oversight on medication.

It is also unclear what the budget would be for such a widespread drug oversight program. According to the sports drug-testing website The Caitlin Perspective, the National Football League and Major League Baseball each spent \$10 million anti-doping contracts in 2011.

That same year, the sport of cycling spent \$4.7 million and the International Tennis Federation spent \$1.3 million.

For the sake of comparison, the California Horse Racing Board announced May 21 that its budget for drug testing for the upcoming fiscal year would be \$1.2 million. At that CHRB meeting, executive director Rick Baedeker testified that California alone tested 59,000 individual samples last year, and he made a point of noting that “to put it in context, USADA during that same time frame, testing samples from around the country, tested about 9,000 samples.”

Eric Hamelback, chief executive officer for the National Horsemen’s Benevolent and Protective Association, said his organization would like to see further clarification on how THADO would be funded, “but at this point we would not support anything that gives control of our industry’s simulcasting signal essentially to this organization,” he said.

“The funding, we think, would be passed on to the horsemen,” Hamelback said. “We spend close to \$40 million a year on testing alone. To give that to a private organization, we’re going to be looking at another—to throw a figure out there—\$20 million. I don’t see how [THADO supporters] don’t think it would be passed on to the horsemen, whether it would be some sort of starter tax or purse reduction. I don’t think this can occur without some financial strain once again put on the horsemen.” *Cont. p5*

Keeneland released a statement which read in part, "Although not currently a member of the Coalition for Horse Racing Integrity, Keeneland is committed to achieving these initiatives vital to the growth and success of our industry, and we urge other race tracks and horsemen to constructively work with the Coalition and other industry leaders with a sense of urgency. We will achieve uniformity with integrity only through constructive dialogue and coordinated action."

The Water Hay Oats Alliance also released a statement in which spokeswoman Staci Hancock said, "WHOA commends Congressman Paul Tonko (D-NY) for announcing his intent to introduce this important legislation. And we call on all of our supporters to contact their member of Congress and ask them to serve as co-sponsors."


The National HBPA expressed a different sentiment in their statement which read, "This announcement by Congressman Tonko and his proposed legislation do not have the support of the racing industry's majority voice, the horsemen."

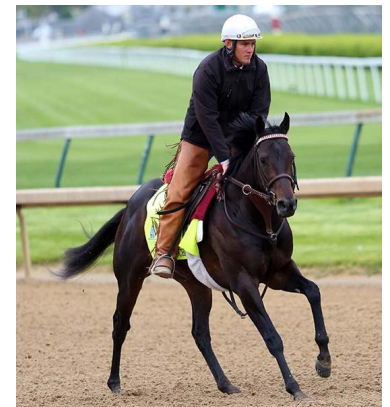

"I think he'll like the grass," offered veteran conditioner Jim Cassidy of the great grandson of Hall of Famer Personal Ensign and relative to recent turf graded stakes winners Animal Spirits (Arch), Divine Oath (Broken Vow) and Interactif (Broken Vow). "The distance he'll like. I don't have any doubts. He's pretty keen to go. I don't see any negativity." **Cont. p7**

Also shipping from California is Cellist Racing Group and Ali Nilforushan's **Papacoolpapacool** (Temple City). Transferred from Jeff Mullins to Phil D'Amato off a fifth-place run when trying dirt in Santa Anita's Jan. 10 Gill Sham S., the bay gelding has since reeled off three-straight victories on the Santa Anita sod, including the Mar. 21 Pasadena S. and Apr. 18 La Puente S. "The money is good and, more importantly, the timing is good," D'Amato said of the decision to ship across the country. "I decided if it was time to step out and race against horses from the East and see where we stand, this is the spot. He handles his foes pretty easily in his races [at Santa Anita], and he's just been training lights out. It made my decision to ship out there easy to test the waters." Ken and Sarah Ramsey won this race last year with Bobby's Kitten (Kitten's Joy), and have a solid shot to go back-to-back with **'TDN Rising Star' Granny Kitten** (Kitten's Joy). A debut winner sprinting at Belmont last July for Mike Maker, the Pennsylvania-bred scratched from the Gill American Turf S. on Derby day in favor of a nine-panel Churchill allowance May 10, which he won by daylight. Woody Weeks's **Woodwin W** (More Than Ready) is a perfect four-for-four so far in his career. The Jamie Ness pupil took a rained-off special weight in the Tampa slop Feb. 27, and added a starter/optional claimer on the Gulfstream lawn Mar. 18. He kept his hot streak going in a Pimlico allowance Apr. 24, and enters off a 3/4-length defeat of **Force the Pass** (Speightstown) in the James W. Murphy S. on the GI Preakness S. undercard May 16.

PLETCHER PLEASED WITH BELMONT TRIO

The Todd Pletcher-trained trio of **Carpe Diem** (Giant's Causeway), **Madefromlucky** (Lookin at Lucky) and **Materiality** (Afleet Alex) all appear to be officially GI Belmont S. bound following good breezes from all three contenders Friday morning in Elmont.

"I need to talk to all the connections, but I'm sure everyone is on board with all three of them [running]. We intend to run all three at this moment," the two-time Belmont winning conditioner said.

WinStar Farm and Stonestreet Stables's **'TDN Rising Star'**

Carpe Diem and Cheyenne Stables and Mac Nichol's Madefromlucky were the first to breeze early Friday. Carpe Diem's regular jockey John Velazquez piloted the GI Blue Grass S. hero and exercise rider Patti Krotenko was aboard Madefromlucky.

Carpe Diem, who worked to the outside of his stablemate and finished several lengths ahead, completed the half-mile in :47.66 (3/33) and galloped out five furlongs in 1:00.59. (Video) Under urging from Krotenko, Madefromlucky stopped the clock in :47.84 (6/33) for the half-mile work and galloped out five panels in 1:01.10.

"I thought both horses worked well enough today to continue considering the Belmont," Pletcher said. "I didn't see anything that would deter me from it. I'll see how they come out of it, and talk with everybody, but we worked with the intention of running in the Belmont, and I thought they both worked well."

The seven-time Eclipse winner added, "I don't think this work was as impressive from [Madefromlucky] as last week [when he fired a five-furlong co-bullet alongside Carpe Diem in :59.01]. I think, like a lot of horses, they will tend to work better when they are on the outside [rather] than the inside."

After the renovation break, Velazquez was back at it aboard Alto Racing's Materiality, who worked in company with possible GII Woody Stephens S. contender **Stanford** (Malibu Moon). The **'TDN Rising Star'** worked to the inside of Stanford and the pair breezed a half-mile in :47.78 (4/33) with a five-furlong gallop-out in 1:00.32 (Video).

"I thought [Materiality] worked very well," Pletcher said. "You know, he's the kind of horse who kind of does what his workmate does. It was a very good, progressive breeze, picking it up as they went along, with a very strong gallop out. [Materiality] came back and he wasn't even blowing. He just took it all very well."

Carpe Diem and Materiality were 10th and sixth, respectively, in the GI Kentucky Derby May 2, while Madefromlucky enters off a victory in this venue's GII Peter Pan S. May 10. Rider assignments for the trio have not been made official at this time, but Pletcher has retained the services of Velazquez and Javier Castellano, who piloted Materiality in the Derby and also Madefromlucky in the Peter Pan.

Rashid Al Maktoum's **Adaay (Ire)** (Kodiac {GB}) and his trainer believes he has continued forward in the interim. "He's very relaxed this year," Candy said. "I worked him a couple of times last week in behind the lead horse and he needed shaking up to get there and then he goes and does it okay. He's a pleasure to train now." This should provide another test of his true merit, with Tim Easterby saddling the May 13 G2 Duke of York S. runner-up **Mattmu (GB)** (Indesatchel {Ire}) who was also second to Limato in the Listed Redcar 2-Year-Old Trophy in October. Denied the very soft ground he thrives in as he showed when winning the G2 Criterium de Maisons-Laffitte in November, James Bowers' homebred nevertheless offers a real standard by which to re-measure Limato. Trainer Karl Burke puts two up against the hot favorite, with the impressive G2 Mill Reef S. winner **Toocoolforschool (GB)** (Showcasing {GB}) the obvious pick. Only fifth in the G3 Greenham S. on his return over seven furlongs at Newbury Apr. 18, the bay reverts to pure sprinting and his conditioner is hoping he can put up a bold showing. "We were very happy with Toocoolforschool's run in the Greenham," commented Burke. "He just got a bit tired and the ground was a bit quick for him. He should improve and we're hoping for a big run in what is a tough race." **Field p12**

If the weather forecast suggested that it was going to be a really fine week then I'd be leaning towards the Diamond Jubilee over the 1200 meters, but he's ready to run in either race."

Brazen Beau was accompanied in his gallop by the Gai Waterhouse-trained **Wandjina (Aus)** (Snitzel {Aus}), who is bound for the G1 Diamond Jubilee S. Damien Oliver guided the G1 Australian Guineas winner through his paces and Waterhouse believes the colt's proven stamina will be a key asset when he faces the European sprinters. **Cont. p13**

We wouldn't be going unless we were confident and Ollie will be the right man for the job, he's a great thinking jockey and he's riding on the Tuesday before, which I'm very pleased about."

Muthmir was beaten only a length into fifth in his last outing in the G2 Duke Of York S. at York and he will face stiff competition Sunday from fellow UK challengers **Stepper Point (GB)** (Kyllachy {GB}) and **Mirza (GB)** (Oasis Dream {GB}). Stepper Point is appearing in the dash race for the fourth consecutive year.

"We like this race," trainer William Muir said. "He's been second in it and fourth in it. He's in good shape with himself at home. When he came back from Dubai his coat went a little bit. It's not exactly gleaming, but he's come on a bundle and he's working well. It's a competitive race as you'd expect for a Group 2, but this time we've not got a penalty."

Mirza is a regular in France for trainer Rae Guest, but he feels being drawn seven of 11 is not beneficial to the chances of his good money-spinner.

Guest commented, "I think you need to be drawn near the stands rail, Christophe Soumillon rides him and he's in great form. We're hoping for a good run."

DAY THREE OF MM BRINGS GROSS ABOVE A\$62 MILLION

The third and final session of the Magic Millions Gold Coast National Broodmare Sale at Bundall Friday was a feast in three parts for buyers, with the main session humming along at a brisk pace followed by two serious supplementary offerings that saw 21 lots sell for A\$3.325 million and eight lots sell for A\$3.575 million, respectively. In total, 527 lots were sold from 624 through the ring, grossing A\$62,294,000. The average was only down by 8.9% at A\$118,205 from last year's mark of A\$129,756, which benefitted from the Teeley Assets dispersal. The number of lots to sell for A\$500,000 or above stands at 24 and the overall clearance rate is 77.2%. The two supplementary sessions ended a remarkable three days of broodmare selling with new market levels established on the back of a vibrant Australian industry that continues to attract investment from virtually every racing and breeding jurisdiction in the world.

"It was a great way to close out the sale," said Vin Cox, Magic Millions Managing Director. "It was unfortunate the circumstances that brought the second supplementary to us, but we were fortunate we were able to put the sale together for the Estate of Mr. Henry Cojuangco, where we grossed something like A\$3.5 million over eight lots.

Added Cox, "The stats are not far off last year, the Teeley Dispersal year, and we have got a gross of over A\$62 million which is just sensational. We are only about A\$7 million off last year's turnover and our average of A\$118,000 is only A\$9,000 off last year's average. It has been a great sale."

When it Rains....

The third session of the Magic Millions Gold Coast National Broodmare Sale was topped by G1 Queen of the Turf S. heroine **Amanpour (Aus)** (Northern Meteor {Aus}) ([lot 1410](#)), as part of the second supplementary session at A\$1.5 million. Amanpour and her entire family, including dam **Newscaster (Aus)** (Marscay {Aus}) ([lot 1406](#)), had only been entered for the National Broodmare Sale May 26.

They arrived at the Gold Coast sale complex at 5:00 a.m. local time Thursday morning, after being literally loaded from their paddocks of consignor Gooree Park Stud at Mudgee in New South Wales.

Out of Newscaster, she is a half-sister to the stakes winner Turf Express (Aus) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) and **Swing Dance (Aus)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) ([lot 1407](#)), the dam of Group 1-placed Street Rapper (Aus) (Street Boss) and stakes placed **Swing Vote (Aus)** (Northern Meteor {Aus}) ([lot 1409](#)).

The entire offering from Cojuangco's estate presented a unique opportunity for buyers, with Amanpour a jewel amongst a family that had been developed and held privately.

Bidding for Amanpour commenced at A\$500,000, but even that lofty starting point was not enough to deter bids of A\$100,000 to take the price to A\$1.2 million. The real jostling started after A\$1.4 million was reached, with A\$25,000 bids taking the price through A\$1.425 million, A\$1.450 million and A\$1.475 million. In the end, it was a duel between Anthony Mithen from Rosemont Stud located in the Barrabool Hills outside Geelong in Victoria, and Peter O'Brien, from Sedgenhoe Stud in the Hunter Valley, on the phone.

It was Mithen who went to A\$1.5 million on behalf of Rosemont Stud and Blue Sky Bloodstock, a price deemed sufficient by the assembled bidders, to secure the good-looking chestnut mare, who will return to the care of trainer Gai Waterhouse for a spell before reappearing at the racecourse.

"I thought it was enough to pay for her," said Mithen. "We were pretty close to the knockout blow, but it was nice that we were the last one standing. She will spell now and stay with Gai and hopefully have a good spring racing in the red and white gatecrasher colours of Rosemont."

Amanpour will likely visit Rosemond Stud resident stallion Starspangledbanner (Aus) (Choisir {Aus}) upon her retirement from racing.

Newscaster, in foal to Smart Missile (Aus), was purchased by China Horse Club for A\$525,000. Bloodstock agent Michael Wallace signed for Swing Dance for A\$360,000. She is carrying a foal by American shuttler Congrats. Earlier on the day, Rosemont and Blue Sky Bloodstock warmed up for the main event, acquiring racing prospect **Swing Sensation (Aus)** (Northern Meteor {Aus}) ([lot 1408](#)), for A\$330,000. Neil Jenkinson Bloodstock, from Queensland, signed for Swing Vote, who was presented in foal to Smart Missile as well, for A\$360,000.



'Quality' Rises to the Top...

The main session of the day was topped by the Almavale Bloodstock-consigned **Elusive Leone (Aus)** (Elusive Quality) ([lot 1152](#)), out of the Lion Hunter (Aus) mare Leone Chiara (Aus), the dam of Australian champion Star Witness (Aus) (Starcraft {NZ}) and MGSW Nostradamus (Aus) (Medaglia d'Oro). Back in foal to that Darley sire, Elusive Leone was purchased by James Harron Bloodstock for A\$550,000.

First Round of Supplements in Demand...

The first supplementary catalogue was almost as vibrant as the latter, with strong bidding for ([lot 1384](#)), **She's Got Gears (Aus)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}), and [lot 1385](#), **Sweet Sanette (SA)** (Jallad).

She's Got Gears, out of the Encosta de Lago (Aus) mare Last Minute (Aus), is a stakes winner and twice Group 3-placed. She has already left her mark as a broodmare with the stakes-placed filly Outlaw Kate (Aus) (Exceed And Excel {Aus}). Offered by Coolmore Stud in foal to stud resident Fastnet Rock (Aus), she was secured by

bloodstock agent Dermot Farrington for A\$700,000.

The South African-bred Sweet Sanette, by Jallad out of the National Assembly mare Scented Samantha (SAf), landed the G3 Sycamore Sprint S. in her native country and was third in Royal Ascot's G1 King's Stand S., as well as winning a stakes in Hong Kong during her racing days. She was also presented in foal to Fastnet Rock (Aus) by Coolmore Stud. Sweet Sanette attracted the attention of Damien Gabbedy, who signed for her through his Belmont Bloodstock Agency for A\$875,000, after bidding commenced at A\$150,000.

INGLIS CHANGES LOCATIONS

The location was selected after an intense review period that determined that the new placement of Inglis' facilities will benefit from the close proximity to Warwick Farm, the Sydney International Airport and the forthcoming second Sydney Airport at Badgery's Creek, which will also be capable of handling international traffic. The WestConnex project to improve the ring road network around Sydney, was also a factor in the selection process.

"Inglis secured DA approval in 2012 from Liverpool Council to develop a state of the art sales facility at Warwick Farm with up to 1,000 stables and a fully enclosed selling auditorium," said Inglis Managing Director Mark Webster. "Our recent introduction of ringside dining at Newmarket was a great success; we will be able to expand this level of service to many more clients at Warwick Farm. There will be plenty of open green space for vendors to entertain buyers and significantly more parade areas than any existing sales complex."

Continued Webster, "It will also be possible to service the complex with a ring road for vehicles, including resort style electric club cars for the convenience of major clients. Visitors will have access to 2000 car parking spots, significantly more than the 400 currently available at Newmarket. We are also working towards incorporating a hotel on our site to accommodate guests, with a range of hospitality facilities including a bar, micro-brewery, day spa, cafe and restaurants. This will supplement the recently established Holiday Inn Hotel opposite the racecourse on the Hume Highway."

"Our goal is to create the best Thoroughbred horse sales facility in the world that honours our heritage and services the Australasian Thoroughbred industry for the next 100 years, full stop," concluded Webster.

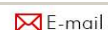

First or second in all five racetrack appearances to date--including the Saintpaulia Sho at Tokyo Feb. 1 and a runner-up effort to the reopposing Satsuki Sho second-place finisher **Real Steel (Jpn)** (Deep Impact {Jpn}) in the G3 Tokinominoru Kinen Feb. 15--the bay has talent to spare. The recent G2 Kyoto Shimbun Hai one-two of **Satono Rasen (Jpn)** (Deep Impact), and Cyclomen Sho winner **Porte d'Auteuil (Jpn)** (Deep Impact {Jpn}) will both be making their initial forays at the highest level when stretched out an additional 200 meters Sunday. Positioned in stall seven, **Reve Mistral (Jpn)** (King Kamehameha {Jpn}) lifted the course and distance G2 TV Tokyo Hai Aoba Sho May 2 and could also have a say in the outcome. **Field p17**

FIRST BARRETTS MAY SALE AT DEL MAR RULED A SUCCESS *by Brian DiDonato*

Thursday evening's Barretts May 2-Year-Olds in Training Sale, the first since the sales company announced a permanent move from Fairplex in Pomona, CA, to the Del Mar Fairgrounds, featured solid trade and a strong turnout as 92 juveniles changed hands for \$4,199,000 in gross receipts. The sales average was \$45,641, up 5.4% from last year's figure of \$43,307. The \$30,000 median was unchanged from 12 months ago, while the 24.6% RNA rate was slightly higher than the 23.1% buy-back rate recorded in 2014. A pair of older horses of racing age sold Thursday for a

combined \$17,000, but were not included in the statistics above.

"We were very pleased with the turnout," offered Barretts general manager Kim Lloyd. "Before the sale, there were concerns about how it would go over here with the attendance and people driving down, but we were overwhelmed with

the participation by our buyers. It was the biggest crowd we've had in years, including anything we've done in Pomona. So, we're very thrilled with the turnout and the buying base was strong, too--the results speak for themselves."

In addition to a venue change, the 2015 May sale was pushed back two weeks from last year, when it occurred during GI Preakness S. week.

"We were very happy with the timing of the sale--it worked out just fine," Lloyd said. "In a new venue, we're working with the 22nd Agricultural District as the landlord of the Fairgrounds here, and they have a lot of events that have been here for a long, long time. So, we're kind of having to settle our schedule in between some events, but it turned out well. Going forward, we'll see how the dates shake out in the future."

Topping the one-day event was a colt by freshman sire J P's Gusto (Successful Appeal) who breezed Tuesday in [:21 1/5](#) and was offered by Ciaran Dunne's Wavertree Stables, Inc., Agent III as [hip 65](#). Bloodstock agent Dennis O'Neill scooped up the \$35,000 OBSAUG yearling and \$72,000 OBSAPR juvenile for \$230,000.

"When we bought him, we thought he was a very special horse," said Dunne, who was selling on behalf of a group of partners operating as Avalanche Racing. "We gave good money for him [at OBS April]... One of the reasons that we keyed in on him was that he breezed later in the day at one of the late sessions at OBS and into a headwind. He worked really well--[:21 4/5](#)--but he didn't have what you'd call the most ideal of conditions. So, we thought he was a horse who didn't have to improve--all we had to do was get him under better circumstances and we thought he could move forward. Also, J P's Gusto ran out here, so we thought that might have a little bit of bearing."

J P's Gusto, who now stands at Journeyman Stud in Ocala, won four stakes races as a juvenile in Southern California in 2010, including the GI Del Mar Futurity.

Dunne's operation also sold the sale's second-priciest lot, a Kitten's Joy colt who was secured by Daniel Kramer for \$225,000 ([hip 138](#)). A \$125,000 OBS August yearling, the chestnut was a \$185,000 purchase by trainer Peter Miller on behalf of Rockingham Ranch earlier this year at OBS March. He covered a furlong in [:21 2/5](#) at the under-tack preview.

"We might have been a hair disappointed in him," Dunne admitted. "He's a really, really nice horse. He worked fabulously well and galloped out like a monster. He's a big, strong horse by as hot a stallion as you can get. I thought that horse could have possibly brought more because you have to think that sprinting on the dirt is probably not what he's made to do. I was a little disappointed that people didn't land on him more... I think the people who bought him got themselves a real bargain."


Asked to comment on the overall market, Dunne said, "It's the same as always. They queued up on what they perceived to be the good horses, but it was very difficult to move anything else... It's all or nothing, and that can be a little frustrating at times."

Of the new setting, he said, "Overall, I was very happy with the sale and the setting. We showed probably more than we have at any Barretts sale in quite a while. I was a little nervous coming down here that they'd be able to get the people out, but they did. They had a great turnout at the breeze show.

Wednesday we were very, very busy at the barn and there was enough vetting to support a little bit of confidence that the sale was going to go well. And then, the people showed up on sale day. All the way around, I think it was a success."
