'PHAROAH' OFFICIALLY HASKELL BOUND

Triple Crown winner **American Pharoah** (Pioneerof the Nile) will make his next start in Monmouth Park's GI William Hill Haskell Invitational S. Aug. 2, owner Ahmed Zayat told ESPN.com Thursday.

"I've decided to do the logical step and run American Pharoah at Monmouth," Zayat said. "I'm trying to create one of the best days racing has ever seen for its fans and one that will also fit the prestige that surrounds American Pharoah. I want it to be a great day for everyone that will celebrate

racing."

Hall of Famer Bob Baffert, who boasts a record seven Haskell wins, added, "We were all waiting to see how American Pharoah worked and for me to give the OK. I liked the way he's training, the way he worked and how he came out of it very well. He looked a little light after the Belmont but he's gotten the weight back, so with no hiccups between now and then, the Haskell is the obvious spot for him."

Monmouth Park officials are making the Haskell part of a three-day celebration to be called "The Pharoah Phan Phestival." Baffert will also be inducted into Monmouth's Hall of Fame during the weekend.

"We are ecstatic to know American Pharoah will be running in the Haskell," Monmouth president Bob Kulina said. "This will be the biggest day ever in the history of racing in New Jersey. We've been racing for 70 years and this is the first time we will have a Triple Crown champion here. I didn't think I would ever say this, but this will be even bigger than 2007 when we hosted the Breeders' Cup."

Zayat, a New Jersey resident, plans to reach out to fellow New Jerseyans Bruce Springsteen, Jon Bon Jovi and Kobe Bryant in hopes that they will come and make Haskell day an even more memorable experience.

Many tracks have been trying to lure American Pharoah, including Saratoga which Zayat says is not out of the question.

"The horse comes first and we intend to run him as many times this year as he tells us he can," Zayat said. "The hope is that he does in the Haskell what he loves to do, and that is winning. We'll see how he comes out of it. We have not ruled out running at Saratoga [in the GI Travers S. Aug. 29]. It's something I'm happy and willing to do, as does Bob. I don't want to commit and put too much pressure on Bob or the horse. We want the horse to tell us. But if he's ready, he'll go there. These are not easy decisions but I want to do right by the horse and the fans."

MAIN SEQUENCE RETURNS IN U.N.

Dual Eclipse winner **Main Sequence** (Aldebaran) makes his first start since returning from Dubai in Sunday's GI United Nations S. at Monmouth Park, a "Win and You're In" event for the GI Breeders' Cup Turf. The Flaxman Holdings homebred burst onto the American turf scene with a scintillating victory in this race last year in his Stateside debut for trainer Graham Motion, and followed that with three more Grade I wins, including the Breeders' Cup Turf. Kicking off this term with a win in Gulfstream's GI Mac Diarmida S. Feb. 21, the chestnut was seventh last time against much tougher in the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic Mar. 28. The morning-line favorite will exit post six with regular rider Rajiv Maragh aboard. "He is a very professional horse and is always straight forward," said Motion. "He's had no problems since coming back from Dubai." The champion's arch rival **Twilight Eclipse** (Purim), second in last year's U.N., reopposes here for trainer Tom Albertrani. Drawn on the rail with Paco Lopez in the irons, the West Point Thoroughbreds runner captured Belmont's GI Man o'War May 9 and was seventh last time behind **Slumber (GB)** (Cacique {Ire}) in the GI Knob Creek Manhattan S. June 6. Michael Dubb, Sheep Pond Partners and Bethlehem Stables's Slumber will break from post five for trainer Chad Brown with Irad Ortiz, Jr. at the controls. **Full field p3**

NEW ERA DAWNS IN VIRGINIA

The horse racing landscape in Virginia shifted significantly July 1 when new state racing statutes went into effect to turn over simulcasting privileges and profits from closed Colonial Downs, which has not held a Thoroughbred meet since 2013, to a newly recognized a non-profit alliance between the state's Thoroughbred, Standardbred and steeplechase racing interests.

But even though Wednesday marked the official date of the changes in the state's racing laws, the Virginia Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association (VHBPA) and the relatively new Virginia Equine Alliance (VEA) have been working for months on both short and long-range plans to establish a self-sufficient series of Thoroughbred meets in the state that could be folded into a larger regional circuit.

According to Frank Petramalo Jr., executive director of the VHBPA, near-term goals over the next 90 days include finding a suitable turf course to run a brief flat race meet, opening the first of what could eventually be 10 off-track-betting locations in existing sports bars around the state, and the one-year shifting of Virginia's six state-bred stakes races and four signature graded stakes races to Laurel Park in Maryland.

Wednesday, the Virginia Racing Commission (VRC) granted of permission to move four graded stakes--the GII Virginia Derby, GII Virginia Gold Cup (for steeplechasers), the GIII Virginia Oaks and GIII Edward P. Evans All Along S.--out of state for one year. **Cont. p5**

In a story the [TDN reported in April](#), one bone of contention between Colonial and the VHBPA had been Colonial's desire to run a single blockbuster stakes weekend in 2015 built around those graded races. The VHBPA, at the time, strongly disagreed with that plan, claiming that budgeting so much money for graded stakes (that would likely be won by non-Virginia horsemen) was at odds with the VHBPA's goal of supporting "bread-and-butter" racing at the lower end of the purse structure.

Petramalo said Thursday that the package of four graded stakes would likely have an aggregate purse of \$900,000. Part of the VEA's negotiations with the Maryland Jockey Club (MJC), which owns Laurel, is to have the MJC split the cost. But that still means \$450,000 would be leaving Virginia to potentially benefit outside horsemen.

Both Petramalo, and Bernard Hettel, the executive secretary of the VRC, said the outflow of purse money was preferable to losing the graded status of those races and leaving Virginia without marquee events if and when racing returns to the state in 2016.

Hettel said the VRC backs this move. "There is some desire to maintain the grading," Hettel said. "This would have been the second consecutive year of non-performance, which would have been an absolute losing of the grade."

MJC vice president and general manager Sal Sinatra confirmed funding for the graded stakes package would be a 50/50 split, pending the approval of Maryland horsemen. He said this is an expense the MJC is willing to pay for because it contributes to the MJC's eventual goal of having higher-class year-round racing in the region.

"They're still trying to preserve Virginia racing, so I try to help them as best I can," Sinatra said. "The way it's planned right now, we first have to make some sort of arrangement with Delaware, because they're a bigger party, if you will, to what could be a 'DEL-MAR-VA' circuit. Virginia is going to be a smaller slice, but we're trying to work all of us three together."

Petramalo said Colonial Downs owns the trademark to the name "Virginia Derby," so a rebranding would be necessary for the proposed \$400,000 race, which would be rescheduled from its former July date to September or October.

"So what we'll likely do is rename those races with 'Old Dominion,'" Petramalo said. "So it will be the 'Old Dominion Derby,' the 'Old Dominion Turf Cup,' etcetera, presented by the Virginia Equine Alliance. Something like that."

The rules are not crystal clear on whether the renamed and relocated race would retain its grade. According to the Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association guidelines for the American Graded Stakes Committee, "if a graded or eligible race is altered materially in age, sex, eligibility, racetrack location, or purse, or is substantially changed on the calendar (60 or more days), this will prompt a review and may result in a change in grade."

"Our first priority is finding a site for some flat racing," said Petramalo. "We're close there. I would not be surprised if in the next month or two we turned our energies to opening up the system of OTBs."

The scouting for new race meet locations and the preparation for eventually taking control of the state's OTB network have been in the works ever since the VHBPA and Colonial failed to reach a lease agreement earlier this spring. And in 2014, six Virginia-bred stakes races were run at Laurel, so that aspect of the plan is not new.

The VEA now has statutory authority to run race meets and up to 10 OTBs in the state. Colonial previously had a simulcasting exclusivity, but the track surrendered its live racing license, then shuttered its OTBs, last autumn. This prompted the passage of new legislation to grant those rights to a non-profit horsemen's entity, which the state now recognizes as the VEA.

Petramalo said based on a projected \$50 to \$70 million simulcast handle in 2015, the VHBPA will add another \$2.5 to \$3 million to its coffers this year, derived from a state-mandated 5% share of the handle. The VEA, he said, separately garners 4% of the simulcast handle; this is money that formerly went to Colonial for operating its OTB network.

"Remember, while I don't want to necessarily give out specific numbers, we didn't race in 2014," Petramalo said. "So sitting in our bank accounts is all of the purse money that we would have spent last year. We're not in bad financial shape."

"We're not looking to open up the same ones that Colonial had," Petramalo said. "What we're looking at is a new business model. The old model was building stick-and-brick stand-alones. We think it's more economically feasible and profitable to set up an OTB in an existing sports bar, and then we wouldn't have to start from day one building a facility."

For a new track he added, "Our goal is probably to come up with something like Kentucky Downs, where you have all turf racing in a large, rolling course in the countryside."

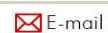
Colonial, Petramalo said, is totally shut down right now and it won't resurface as a possible location for a race meet.

The Godolphin runner suffered a training setback in the spring, but Appleby is already lining up potential late season targets. "Charming Thought is back cantering and the plan is to aim him at the G2 Park S. at Doncaster in September," he revealed. "He looks a totally different horse to look at compared to how he was in the spring. Hopefully it will be the springboard to an autumn campaign, where we will look forward to getting him ready for Champions Day. This race should also tell us if we run him over six furlongs or step him up to a mile on Champions Day." Charming Thought had subsequent G1 Commonwealth Cup winner Muhaarar (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}) back in third place when winning at Newmarket last October and that victory also capped a memorable month for his breeder Craig Bennett, whose Merry Fox Stud had also bred and owned another Group 1 winner four weeks previously in the shape of Cursory Glance (Distorted Humor).

DURBAN JULY LOOKS WIDE OPEN

The countdown has begun to South Africa's premier race, the R3.5 million, G1 Vodacom Durban July. Saturday will see a full field 18 runners tackling the exacting 2200 meters of the Greyville Racecourse. The Durban July is a conditions race with a set top weight of 60kgs and with a capped weight of 57kgs for

3-year-old old colts and geldings and 56kgs for their female counterparts. Hence in recent years the 3-year-olds have dominated, winning five of the last six races. This year's field includes three 3-year-old colts and three fillies, with

the Sean Tarry-trained **Legal Eagle (SAf)** (Greys Inn) the short-priced favorite at 28-10. Legal Eagle won the G1 SA Derby over 2450m at Turffontein by a commanding three lengths and his jockey on that day, Anton Marcus, is back in the saddle. His trainer has an unassailable lead in the SA Trainers' Championship and he has won the Durban July twice in the last three years. Legal Eagle is also extremely well in at the weights, carrying only 54kgs.

The Durban July, however, is a race in which favorites seem to find more trouble than luck, with only five favorites saluting the judge in the last twenty years. *Cont. p7*

Tarry however has another 3-year-old ready to accept the crown should Legal Eagle fluff his lines. Stable companion **French Navy (SAf)** (Count Dubois {GB}) is a dual G1 winner with victories in the G1 SA Classic and the G1 Daily News 2000 behind his name. He has 54.5kgs on his back and the services of his regular pilot Raymond Danielson.

Of the fillies, Mike de Kock's **Majmu (Aus)** (Redoute's Choice {Aus}) is the one they all have to beat. An easy winner of the Cape Fillies Guineas over 1600 meters, she produced another runaway victory against her own sex in the G1 Empress Club Stakes. Stepping out in open company for the first time in the G1 President's Champions Challenge, however, she ran into the extremely talented **Wylie Hall (Aus)** (Redoute's Choice {Aus}), who beat her comfortably to the line. Majmu has the services of De Kock's stable jockey Anthony Delpech, but she meets the 5-year-old Wylie Hall again and it is unlikely that she can reverse the finishing order in her favor.

Last year's winner, Wylie Hall, who subsequently lost the race in the boardroom, has to be one of the favorites for this year's edition and his trackwork this week confirmed that he is in top condition. His trainer Weiho Marwing is out to exact revenge and he has engaged the services of previous July winning jockey, Bernard Fayd'Herbe. With 58kgs, Wylie Hall will carry only half a kilo more than in 2014 and at 5-1 in the betting, he is very good value for money.

Lastly, one has to consider dual G1 Queen's Plate and G1 J & B Met winner **Futura (SAf)** (Dynasty {SAf}), partnered by Sean Cormack. With a merit rating of 120 to Wylie Hall's 116, he is by far the superior horse on paper. Yet races are not run on paper and Futura has several obstacles to overcome. As the highest rated horse in the race he carries the top weight of 60kgs and he has recently changed stables. Is he good enough to have his name added to the scroll of honor? We will know come Saturday.

MULTIPLE CHARGES IN COBALT CASE

The cobalt doping controversy in Australia continues to gather pace and it was announced on Thursday that Racing NSW stewards have issued a total of 52 charges against six individuals in relation to positive cobalt samples taken from Midsummer Sun (GB) (Monsun {Ger}) after his win in the Listed Gosford Gold Cup in January. As the trainer of Midsummer Sun, Sam Kavanagh faces 24 of those charges along with the veterinarian at the center of the case Dr. Tom Brennan, who faces eleven charges. Dr. Brennan is alleged to have connived or was a party to Kavanagh committing rule breaches and that his conduct or negligence also contributed to Kavanagh's misdemeanors. Kavanagh also faces charges in relation to race day injections and drenches administered to Midsummer Sun and a number of stable mates in the period between September 2014 and January 2015. Other individuals who have been charged with various offences connected to the case include John Camilleri, Mitchell Butterfield, Michael O'Loughlin and Aaron Corby, practice manager of Flemington Equine Clinic. The trio of Sam Kavanagh, Dr. Brennan and Aaron Corby have been advised that the hearing of charges pertaining to the cobalt finding has been set down for July 20 and 21 at the Racing NSW head office in Sydney.
