NISH STICKING TO PLAN AT FASIG JULY

When Kevin and Kimberly Nish send a pair of stakes-winning fillies through the sales ring during Thursday's Fasig-Tipton Summer Selected Horses of Racing Age Sale in Lexington, the couple, who race as KMN Racing, will be following through on a business plan developed four years ago.

"We've been advised by Alex [Solis] and Jason [Litt] since we got in the racing business," explained Kevin Nish. "And we've had a plan that we would buy yearling fillies and then sell some that had become successful to fund the next year or two years of purchasing fillies."

Putting that plan into action two years ago, Solis and Litt purchased **Lutine Belle** (Bellamy Road) ([hip 411](#)) on behalf of the Nishes for \$40,000 at the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky October sale. The bloodstock agents also acquired **Lindisfarne** (City Zip) ([hip 410](#)) for \$57,000 at the Keeneland September sale.

Lindisfarne ([Thorostride video](#)) has now raced seven times and her three victories include a 1 1/2-length tally in the Marshua S. at Laurel in January. She currently has earnings of \$108,545. Lutine Belle ([Thorostride video](#)), who has earned nearly \$115,000, counts the Blue Norther S. at Santa Anita among her three victories to date. **Cont. p3**

KEENELAND ADJUSTS OPENING WEEK OF SEPTEMBER SALE

Keeneland has adjusted the opening week schedule of its 2015 September Yearling Sale, which will be held Sept. 14-26. The sale will open with a three-day Book 1, spanning Monday-Wednesday, Sept. 14-16, one day less than previously. The sale's traditional "dark day," will move from Friday of opening week to Thursday, Sept. 17. The Book 2 sale will be conducted Friday-Saturday, Sept. 18-19, followed by Books 3-6 beginning Sunday, Sept. 20, according to a release from the sales company. **Cont. p9**

GOSDEN TALKS PLANS FOR CLASSIC WINNERS

While G1 Epsom Derby winner **Golden Horn (GB)** (Cape Cross {Ire}) stole the spotlight last weekend when running away with the G1 Coral-Eclipse, trainer John Gosden was busy Monday revealing plans for his 'other' 2015 Classic winners: G1 Irish Derby victor **Jack Hobbs (GB)** (Halling) and G1 Prix de Diane scorer **Star of Seville (GB)** (Duke of Marmalade {Ire}).

Jack Hobbs, who emerged from the shadows of Golden Horn to take the Irish Derby June 27, has the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe as his long-term goal, and Gosden said the Godolphin colorbearer could prep in France.

"He is having a short holiday now and is just trotting," Gosden noted. "A race like the [G2] Prix Niel [Sept. 13] could be for him before the Arc. He is a Halling so if the ground is soft it should help him."

Gosden said Star of Seville is set to be back in action at Glorious Goodwood Aug. 1.

"Star Of Seville will head for the Nassau," he said. "She is in super form and is currently having a freshen up. They don't always handle the track at Goodwood as it can make them off-balance, but if she handles it she certainly has a chance."

NISH STICKING TO PLAN AT FASIG JULY

The two fillies will sell Thursday through the Darby Dan Farm consignment, but Nish admitted it would be a bittersweet parting.

“We made that plan and now it is very hard to stick to it because they have both done so well for us,” he said. “They are trying to lash me to the mast so I don’t break off from the plan, but right now we are sticking with the plan and we’re agreeing that we’ll put that money into next year or this coming fall’s yearling sales.”

The plan got a little harder to stick to when Lutine Belle ran a career-best third in the June 27 GIII Seniorita S.

“Yes. It made it harder for me,” Nish chuckled about Lucine Belle’s finish in the Seniorita. “But as Jason and Alex say, ‘You can always sell them when you don’t want to sell them. If you want to sell them, it might be harder to sell them.’”

Nish said he expects to purchase between four and six yearlings this year with a clear-cut game plan.

“We have always purchased the horses in a certain price range,” he explained. “Jason and Alex--because we live in Northern California--are looking for horses they believe can win a maiden special weight up here. Sometimes they go on to do bigger things. Sometimes they don’t. But Jason and Alex have done very well by us and we are happy to continue to follow their advice.”

The next generation of yearling purchases has already started to pay dividends.

“This past Saturday, we had a first-time starter named Stays in Vegas (City Zip) and she won the Juan Gonzalez S. by six lengths,” Nish said. “We were quite excited about that and that is a reinforcing mechanism towards the plan that Jason and Alex have for us. So she is a crop beyond from the two that are going to sell who has already come up and looks like she’ll be ok.”

Stays in Vegas was a \$40,000 Keeneland September yearling purchase last fall.

In addition to the yearlings they purchase at auction, the couple have a California-based broodmare band of 16. cont. p4

“The farm where our mares are is only 20 miles away, so the whole family can come over and we like to see our foals when they are born,” Nish said of the appeal of breeding. “But we have clearly had more success with the ones that Alex and Jason have selected for us at the sales.”

The Nishes, who only became involved in racehorse ownership some four

years ago, have already enjoyed a lifetime of success in the game. They were co-owners of two-time GI Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint winner Mizdirection (Mizzen Mast) and are also part of the ownership group of champion Shared Belief (Candy Ride {Arg}).

So this is an easy game?

“The facts would lead me to believe that,” Nish laughed. “But I've had enough of the other experiences. You hear about the ones that are good, but we have had several others that weren't. We have pictures from maiden claimers at Golden Gate. Not everybody wins. But we've been doing a better than average job thanks to the advice we've been getting.”

Nish, who is the CEO of GeoVera Insurance Holdings, gets regular updates on the status of Shared Belief, who has been sidelined since a hip injury in April. The champion is currently recuperating at Pegasus Training Center in Washington.

“[Trainer] Jerry [Hollendorfer] is up with Shared even as we speak,” Nish said Monday. “He has been on stall rest and has been getting ultrasounds every two weeks to check on the progress of the healing of his fracture and that has now healed enough, as of a week ago, that he got to leave his stall and resume some hand walking. He will continue to get ultrasounded every two weeks and we'll continue to lengthen his time out of the stall. The best-case time line for us would be to get him back into rehabilitation where he could start using all of their wonderful facilities--the underwater treadmill, swimming--that might begin sometime in the middle part of August.”

Nish added the time line will be completely up to Shared Belief. cont. p5

“This guy has won so much and done so much for us and the Romes and the whole ownership operation,” Nish said. “He doesn’t owe us a nickel and he is going to get whatever he needs to come back and be the best he can be. If he is ready to go sooner, we’ll go sooner. If it takes longer, it will take longer. We are following the advice from the farm and they are good judges in that and we have high confidence in Pegasus.”

The Fasig-Tipton July Yearling sale gets underway Thursday at 10 a.m. and will be followed immediately by the Horses of Racing Age sale.

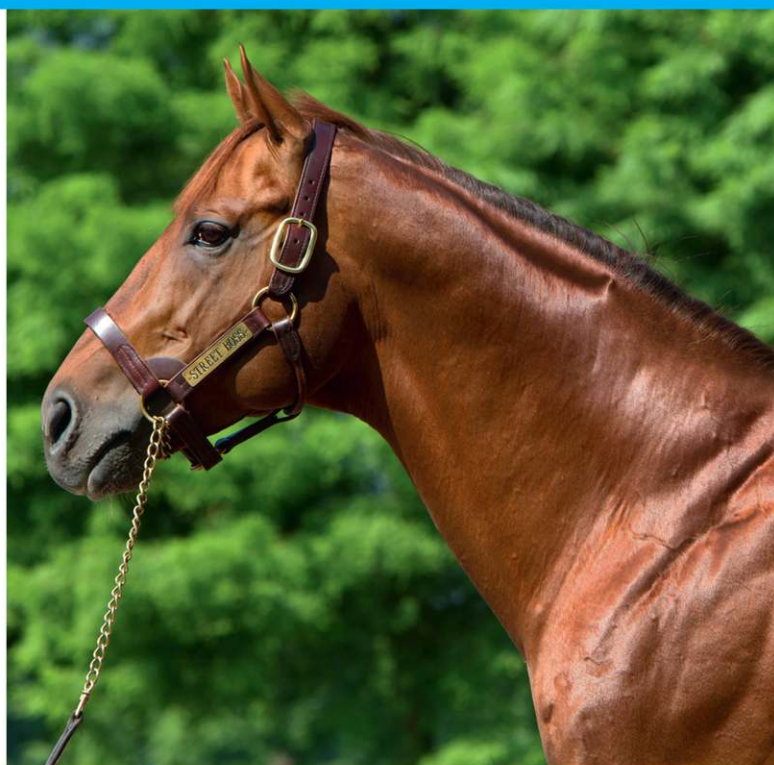

But over in England, it was the day that a batch of 3-year-old fillies was offered by the Aga Khan at Tattersalls' December Sales. It is worth pointing out that the average price in 1971 for a house in the UK was apparently £5,632, so the 4,100gns paid for the unraced Khazaeen wasn't as insignificant as it sounds to modern ears. Her price, though, fell well short of the 38,000gns--a new record--paid for another 3-year-old filly, Prudent Girl.

Although Prudent Girl went on to produce Providential (Washington D.C. International) and Play It Safe (Prix Marcel Boussac), Khazaeen's legacy has arguably been even more opulent. She produced three notable broodmare daughters in The Dancer, her sister Kazadancoa and Beaming Bride, who collectively have provided Khazaeen with seven Grade I-winning descendants. There is also the Japanese Derby winner King Kamehameha, a former champion Japanese sire who is giving Deep Impact a very good battle for the 2015 title.

Of course one of those seven Grade I winners is that excellent young turf filly Lady Eli, who retained her unbeaten record in style in Saturday's Belmont Oaks Invitational. The seven also include four others which scored at the top level in North America. Two of them--Beaming Bride's sons Alwuhush and Husband--were also turf performers, while Spring In The Air won the Alcibiades S. on all-weather and The Deputy took the Santa Anita Derby on dirt.

The question which needs answering is whether Khazaeen's potential was obvious at the time of her sale. The fact that she never made it to the racecourse will surely have deterred some buyers, fearful that she had either had physical problems or had failed to display any talent. **cont. p8**

Her bloodlines, on the other hand, were very attractive. Her sire, Charlottesville, had earned a Timeform rating of 135 with a sequence of victories which featured the Prix Lupin, Prix du Jockey-Club and Grand Prix de Paris. Charlottesville was to die at 15, but not before he had sired the Derby winner Charlottown. One of Charlottesville's broodmare daughters was to become the dam of Top Ville, a leading racehorse and sire.

It was Khazaeen's female line, though, which was enough to get the pedigree purists purring. Her fourth dam, Black Ray, was foaled nearly 100 years ago, but her name lives on thanks to the continued success of her descendants. Black Ray's first notable feat was to produce Jacopo and Foray, two colts which headed Britain's Free Handicap for 2-year-olds, and her daughter Eclair was also well above average. If Eclair's name seems familiar, it is because she produced Khaled, a Middle Park S. winner who was to find fame in the U.S. as the sire of Horse of the Year Swaps.

Eclair is the third dam of Khazaeen, who had an older half-sister called Runaway Bride. The Aga Khan made a rare venture to the sales ring to buy Runaway Bride's 1974 Red colt for 16,500gns as a weanling, and never had cause to regret the decision. The colt was Blushing Groom, the outstanding French 2-year-old of 1976. It was Blushing Groom's sale to Gainesway which helped fund the Aga's purchase of the Boussac stock in 1978.

Blushing Groom is by no means the only exceptional performer tracing to Black Ray. A return visit to Eclair's sire Ethnarch resulted in another notable filly called Infra Red. This mare became the fourth dam of the truly brilliant Mill Reef, who had won the Derby, Eclipse, King George and Arc in the months prior to Khazaeen's appearance at Tattersalls. Infra Red was also the third dam of Wollow, a champion 2-year-old who progressed to win the 2,000 Guineas and several other top events in 1976.

Lady Eli therefore has a highly distinguished female line for a filly who was sired at a fee of only \$10,000. Her dam Sacre Coeur was bred by Runnymede Farm and Catesby W. Clay, who also bred Lady Eli. Sacre Coeur managed only three starts, all as a juvenile, but she won on turf and was well worth retaining by her breeders. She was foaled when her dam Kazadancoa was 22 and was the last of her 13 named foals. No fewer than three of Kazadancoa's earlier foals--Jacodra, Jacodra's Devil and Changing Ways--had become graded winners.

Sacre Coeur is keeping up the good work, Lady Eli being her second graded winner following Bizzy Caroline, a dual Grade III winner at up to nine furlongs on turf. Both are by Mr. Prospector line stallions--Bizzy Caroline by a great-grandson in Afleet Alex and Lady Eli by a grandson in Divine Park.

Together with Include and Majesticperfection, Divine Park is one of three members of the Airdrie stallion team which has exerted a powerful influence on this year's top prizes for America's 3-year-old fillies.

It is well worth adding that Include Betty's sire was priced at \$7,500 in 2011, whereas the sires of Lovely Maria and Lady Eli were both available for \$10,000. Divine Park's fee this year was only \$7,500, which is a reflection of the difficulty he has had in attracting mares. None of his first four crops has numbered as many as 50 foals and he covered only 25 mares last year. Hopefully Lady Eli's exploits as a juvenile will have changed all that.

As a \$20,000 yearling whose first two dams are daughters of Ascot Knight and Czaravich, Divine Park's pedigree could be said to lack a bit of glamour. However, there is no fault to be found with his sire Chester House. This son of Mr. Prospector was undoubtedly a serious loss to Kentucky breeders, as his death at the age of eight in 2003 meant that he left just 223 foals. As many as 28 of these 223--13%--became black-type winners and Chester House's Average Earnings Index of 2.14 was considerably higher than his mares' Comparable Index.

Divine Park was one of the best of the black-type winners, together with that very fast mare Ventura and the high-class middle-distance horse Phoenix Tower. A winner of six of his nine starts, Divine Park enjoyed his finest moment in winning the GI Metropolitan H.

It is worth mentioning that Chester House was a half-brother to Empire Maker, grandsire of American Pharoah, and to that very smart filly Honest Lady.

Although Honest Lady's Grade I-winning son First Defence is responsible for that top filly Close Hatches, he is another who hasn't always found it easy to win widespread support from breeders. First Defence has fewer than 30 3-year-olds this year, but three of them have enjoyed stakes success, one being that fast filly Irish Jasper, a \$12,000 yearling who is now a dual Grade III winner with earnings in excess of \$300,000.

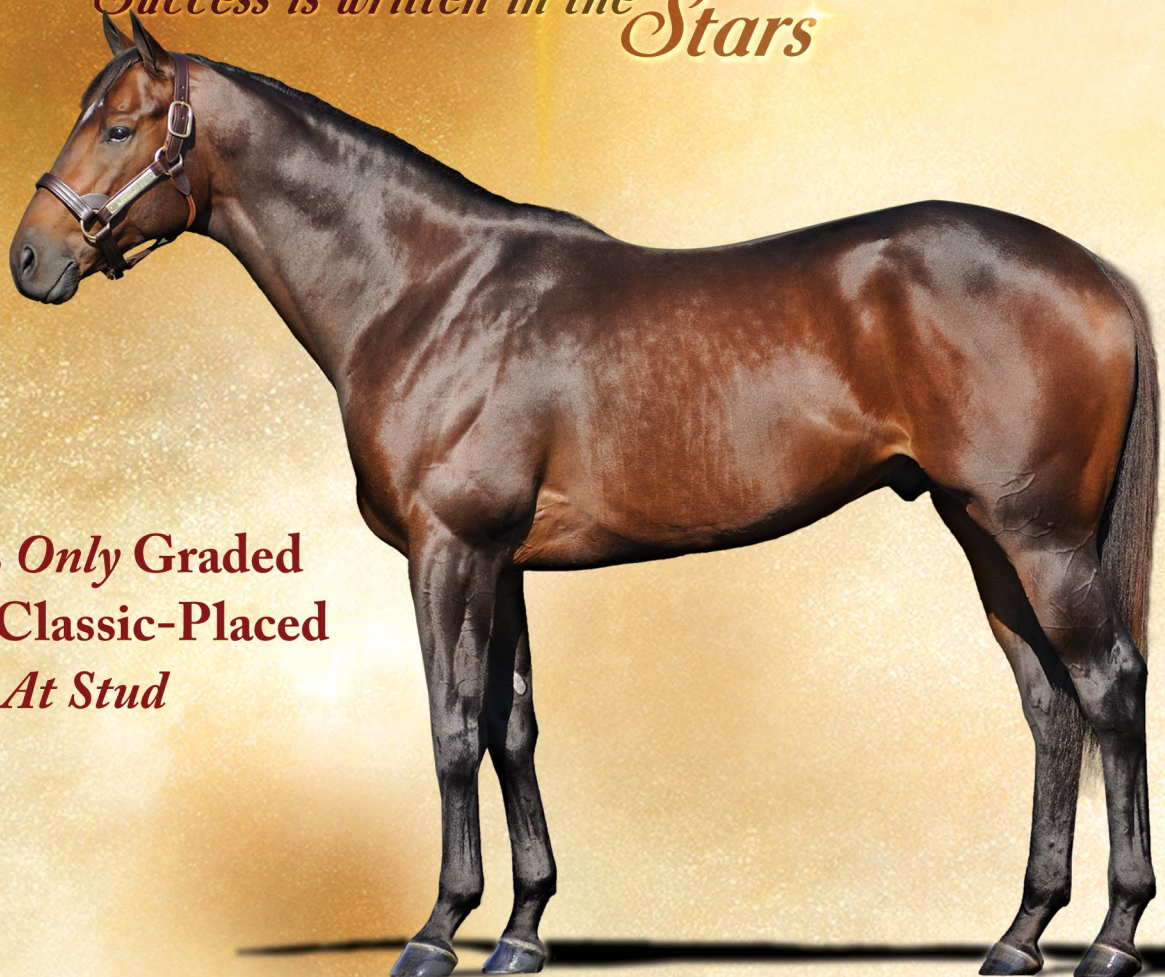

NEW BAY LIKELY FOR DEAUVILLE DATE

G1 Prix du Jockey Club victor **New Bay (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}) is likely to bypass a clash with G1 Epsom Derby and G1 Coral-Eclipse scorer Golden Horn (GB) (Cape Cross {Ire}) in the G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth S. later this month and instead target Deauville's G2 Prix Guillaume Aug. 15, according to trainer Andre Fabre.

"He is in the King George and we will discuss it with the Prince [owner-breeder Khalid Abdullah], but I think he is more likely to run in the Prix Guillaume d'Ornano," said Fabre. "That is a Group 2 over a mile and a quarter, which will be good for him."

Khalid Abdullah and Fabre are still set to be represented in the King George, however, by last year's G1 Hong Kong Vase winner **Flintshire (GB)** (Dansili {GB}), who was also second in last year's G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, G1 Breeders' Cup Turf, and two Group 1s this year, including the G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud June 28 behind Treve (Fr) (Motivator {GB}).

"The King George is the plan for him," said Fabre. "He ran his usual good race at Saint-Cloud and I am sure he will at Ascot, providing he gets fast ground."



GOODWOOD TARGETS FOR LEGATISSIMO, 'PARIS'

G1 1000 Guineas winner **Legatissimo (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}), touched off by a short head in her last two outings in the G1 Epsom Oaks and G1 Pretty Polly S., will attempt to get back to the winner's circle in the G1 Nassau S. at Glorious Goodwood Aug. 1. Trainer David Wachman noted the Magnier, Tabor and Smith charge would skip the G1 Irish Oaks July 18.

"She came out of the [Pretty Polly] fine so we will try again," said Wachman. "I'd say the Pretty Polly was a good race, the winner won well and the third was coming home well. The Nassau will be the same and it will be interesting."

Another recent Group 1 winner likely for the Goodwood meeting is last month's G1 Gold Cup winner **Trip To Paris (Ire)** (Champs Elysees {GB}), who could bid to extend his reputation over long distances in the G2 Goodwood Cup July 30. Trip To Paris was making a hefty class jump when he caused a mild upset in the Royal Ascot feature, having previously finished second in the G3 Henry II S. off the back of three handicap victories.

"Trip To Paris is very fresh and you would not think he's just won a Gold Cup," said trainer Ed Dunlop of the 4-year-old. "I think we will go to Goodwood now for the Goodwood Cup. He does have a penalty to carry, but there is good money there and it's now under consideration."



MOODY INVESTIGATION NEARING END

Australian champion trainer Peter Moody could learn this week whether he will be charged for a positive cobalt sample returned by a horse in his care. Fellow Victorian trainers Mark Kavanagh, Danny O'Brien and Lee and Shannon Hope have all been recently charged in cobalt cases, with dates for hearings still to be set,

and Racing Victoria's Chief Steward Terry Bailey told *RSN Radio* Monday that trial results on Moody's case were complete.

SUPER MAJESTY (f, 3, [Super Saver](#)--Gins Majesty {GSW, \$210,431}, by [Go for Gin](#)) earned 'TDN Rising Star' status after a dominant 6 1/4-length score as the 3-5 choice in her six-panel debut at Santa Anita May 24, and showed more of the same Sunday evening at Los Alamitos. Bet down to 2-5 favoritism, the bay was away from the gate a step slowly but quickly advanced to track the pace from the three path through a quarter-mile in :21.56. Super Majesty swept to the lead turning for home and effortlessly widened down the venue's long stretch to post a 15 1/4-length score. Ultimate Holiday (Harlan's Holiday) was second best. The final time of 1:08.26 was just short of the track record of 1:08.18.

"A few little things popped up, and she needed a little extra time [before her debut]," said Alex Solis, II, of Solis/Litt Bloodstock, who purchased the filly for \$400,000 at the Fasig-Tipton Florida Sale from consignor Eddie Woods on behalf of Larry, Nancy and Jaime Roth's LNJ Foxwoods. "WinStar rehabbed her for us, we got her back to the track and it's all been smooth sailing since then. She's always been a really nice filly."

The winner, who also sold for \$100,000 as a Keeneland September yearling, is a daughter of 2006 GIII Ballerina Breeders' Cup S. winner Gins Majesty. Solis believes that Super Majesty's pedigree indicates that her early success will translate to continued improvement at longer distances.

"Physically, she's a big scopey filly--she's 16.1, almost 16.2 hands--and she's out of a Go For Gin mare, so we always thought she was a route filly," he continued. "We never thought she was a sprinting filly at all, so I think she's just that talented that she can do it."

While the ease at which Super Majesty pulled clear from the field on Sunday would likely have been noticed by casual observers, the bloodstock agent noted that his father and jockey, Alex Solis, believes there is still significant room for improvement.

"My dad said he never really got to asking her," Solis recalled. "He said he let her stretch her legs a little bit because they've never been able to do that in the mornings. She does everything so easily."





Solis added that no future plans have been made for the bay, and the connections are keeping an open mind when considering a prospective next start--including a cross-country trip to Saratoga.

Gins Majesty, who RNA'd for \$240,000 while in foal to First Samurai at the 2007 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky November sale, has also produced the unraced juvenile filly Flynn Bug (Sidney's Candy), a yearling colt by Bluegrass Cat and a weanling colt by Overanalyze.

LNJ Foxwoods, through Solis/Litt Bloodstock, have purchased a number of other high-dollar prospects earlier this year. Inheritance (Tapit), a juvenile filly purchased for \$1.9 million at the OBS April Sale is now under the care of Steve Asmussen and recently posted a pair of initial three-furlong workouts June 30 at Keeneland and Monday morning at Churchill Downs. NYRA Endorses NYSGC Changes:

The New York Racing Association has sanctioned an amendment made by the New York State Gaming Commission to enhance wagering opportunities at NYRA tracks. The Gaming Commission adopted two new rule changes on Monday: decoupling entries in stakes races of \$50,000 or more and adding superfecta wagering to the betting menu of races with coupled entries.

"The New York Racing Association is very pleased with the Gaming Commission's decision to decouple entries in stakes races, as it could increase field size, wagering opportunities and wagering revenue," said Christopher Kay, NYRA Chief Executive Officer and President. "Given additional betting interests and corresponding added handle, significant economic benefits may flow to horsemen, the New York Thoroughbred Breeders and Development Fund, the State of New York through taxes and regulatory fees, and to NYRA."

Espinoza, McDonald atop Longines Jockey Standings:

Triple Crown-winning jockey Victor Espinoza and leading Australian rider James McDonald lead the standings for the Longines World's Best Jockey standings at the midpoint of 2015, with several others within reach of the title.

The Longines World's Best Jockey award, handed out for the first time last year to Ryan Moore, recognizes the jockey with the best performances in the world's highest-rated races. Espinoza and McDonald are tied with 66 points while French rider Maxime Guyon sits third with 58 points. Frankie Dettori has accrued 52 points, and Ryan Moore 44.

Nomination Discount for Breeders' Cup HORA:

Owners of horses of racing age not currently nominated to the Breeders' Cup program can nominate their runners at discounted rates on or before Wednesday, July 15 for competition in this year's Breeders' Cup World Championships, October 30-31 at Keeneland Race Course. All horses must be nominated in order to compete in any of the 13 Grade I Breeders' Cup World Championship races. The nomination discounts are as follows: 2-year-olds by a nominated Breeders' Cup stallion can join the program for US\$12,000; 3-year-olds and up that were foaled in the Northern Hemisphere and sired by a nominated stallion will receive a 50% discount off normal racehorse nomination fees and 3-year-olds and older born in the Southern Hemisphere can nominate for 25% of their regular nomination fee. All nominated racehorses are eligible for the Breeders' Cup World Championships and any other racing program of the Breeders' Cup for as long as they race. Owners may nominate their horses of racing age online at members.breederscup.com or by calling the Breeders' Cup Racing department at 859-514-9422.
