Gainesway Stable's **Danzatrice** (Dunkirk) enters this test off a fourth-place effort last time in Belmont's GI Acorn S. June 6. Starting this term with an allowance win at Laurel Mar. 26, the chestnut beat out GI Frizette S. winner and Acorn runner-up By the Moon (Malibu Moon) in the Parx Oaks May 2 prior to her run in the Acorn.

Also exiting the Acorn is Mary and Chester Broman homebred **Bar of Gold** (Medaglia d'Oro), who won a trio of state-bred tests at Saratoga and Aqueduct before finishing sixth in the Acorn. Another runner who could make some noise at a price is Heider Family Stables's undefeated **Hip Hop N Jazz** (Speightstown). main track for trainer Christophe Clement, the gray earned his diploma at Gulfstream in his turf debut for the Casse barn Mar. 14.

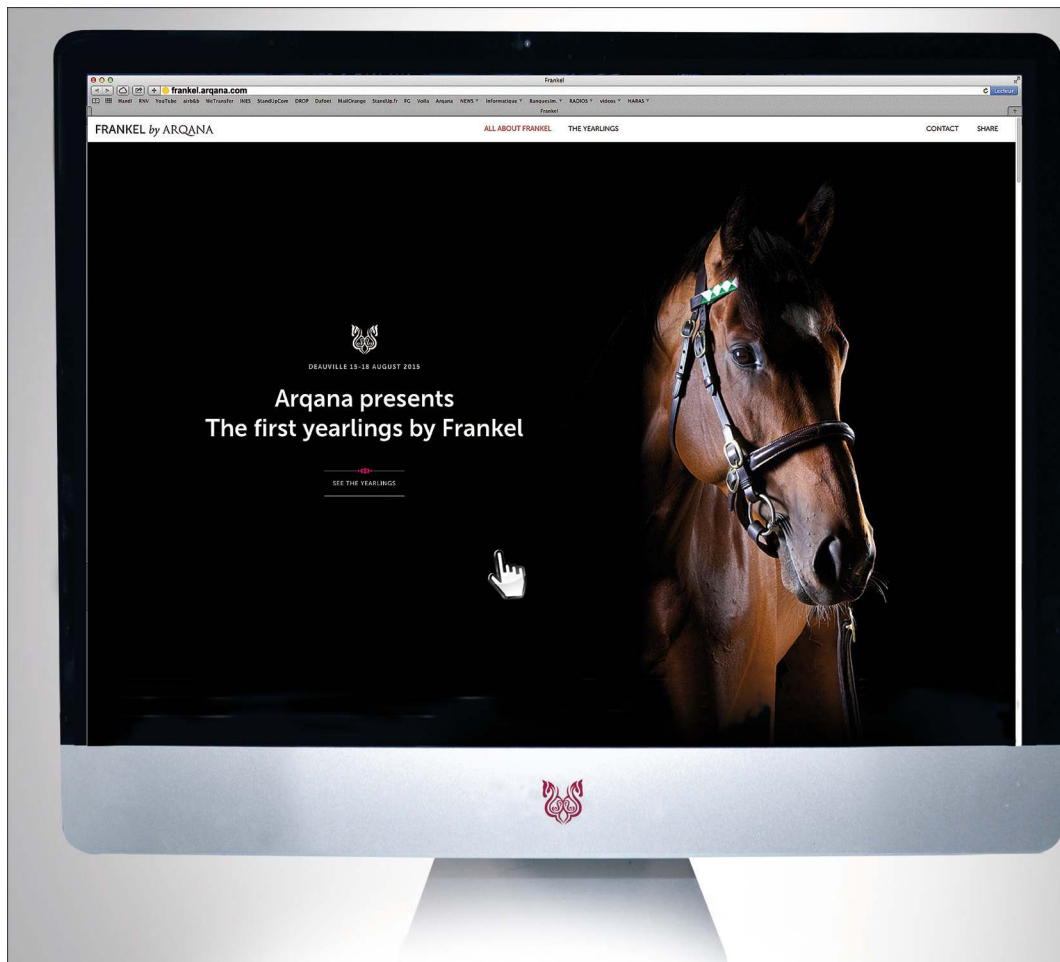

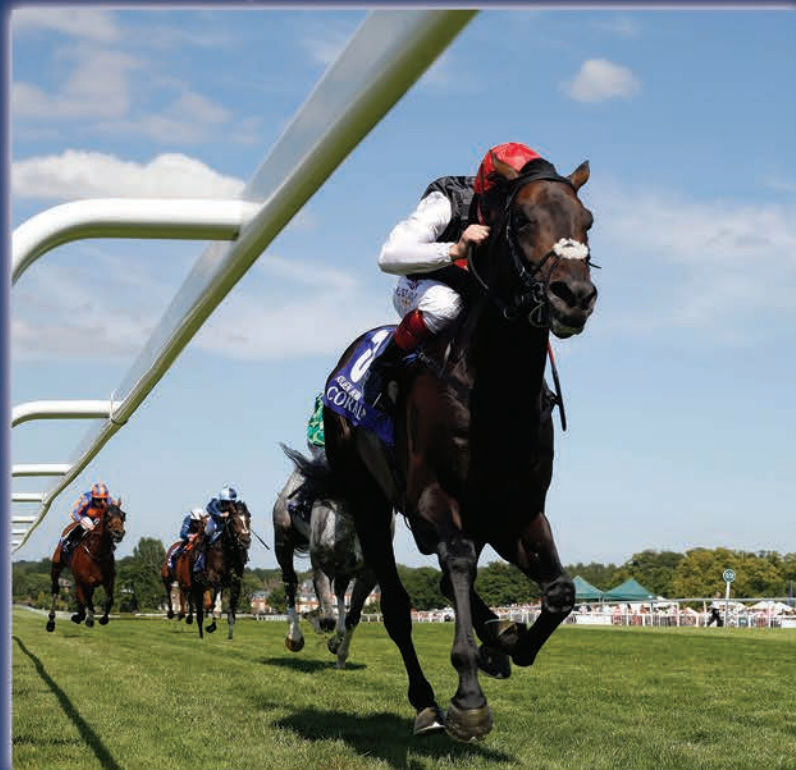

When he went for her she found plenty. It's very special and it hasn't quite sunk in yet. I suppose the [Aug. 2 G1] Prix Rothschild [at Deauville] would be the obvious race for her."

Euro Charline, whose late withdrawal from Royal Ascot's G2 Duke of Cambridge S. stung connections, delighted Marco Botti this time around. "We were caught by surprise at Ascot and it was just frustrating what happened, but that is in the past," the trainer remarked. "We were looking forward to this race and she didn't disgrace herself. The race did not pan out how we wanted it to as she's definitely happier getting cover and challenging late on. [Jockey] Andrea [Atzeni] said as there was no pace and he preferred to get her relaxed where she was. They all came in a bunch at her, but she kept finding and fighting all the way to the line." Regarding future plans, Botti added, "Team Valor is keen to have another shot at the [G1] Beverly D. S., so we'll see how she comes out of this. The other race for her could be the Prix Rothschild."

One of the main reasons why Hugo Palmer's fledgling training career has hit a higher profile, the admirable New Providence proved that her latest rare disappointment at Royal Ascot was an aberration with

a typically determined effort here. Rewarded for her game attitude with a win in Salisbury's G3 Dick Poole Fillies' S. over this trip and a third in Newmarket's G2 Rockfel S. over a furlong further at two, the chestnut returned in the same heart to run a short-head second to Osaila

(Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) in the Apr. 15 G3 Nell Gwyn S. back over the latter track and trip prior to filling the same spot in Lingfield's G3 Chartwell Fillies' S. also at seven panels May 9. Reverting to this distance to be third in the G2 Sandy Lane S. at Haydock three weeks later, it was a surprise that she was never a factor when 13th in an admittedly hot G1 Commonwealth Cup at the Royal meeting June 19. Enjoying a perfect tow into this race, New Providence was traveling notably best approaching the last furlong and when committed at that marker opened up enough of a gap to secure the win from the strong closer Lucky Kristale. "She deserved that so much," Palmer commented. "The Group One at Royal Ascot was the only time she's been out of the first three in her life. She's as honest as the day's long and loves a battle. She probably idled a tiny bit in front and when Lucky Kristale came to her girths she found a bit more. She doesn't lie down. I don't know why she ran so badly at Ascot. That was not her true running. When they've always run brilliantly and they run badly and you go to well again quickly you wonder, but everything was fine and there was no reason not to. We'll go from here, all being well, for the [July 31] G3 Oak Tree S. at Goodwood and then we might think of trying a mile in America. There's a race at the end of August over a mile in Saratoga [the Aug. 29 GII Ballston Spa]. With fillies like her, I think we've an advantage over theirs."

Kept apart from the remainder for most of that June 20 highlight by Craig Williams, the Mar. 14 G1 Newmarket H. winner was unable to resist the late thrust of Undrafted (Purim).

Emerging with reputation intact, the ride he received was the subject of a large amount of criticism and James Doyle will likely be keen to carry out more conventional tactics here. "I've been privileged to train a few nice horses over the years, but he is right up there with the best of them. Winning the July Cup would not just be a career highlight, but a life highlight," trainer Chris Waller commented. "He is up there with the best sprinters in Australia and as you have seen on the world stage, they perform well every year. I would not be swapping him for any other horse. That last run would have brought him on and there is a little bit more left in the tank." **Cont. p10**

If there is an Oasis Dream lurking here, it is most certainly in the form of Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's **Muhaarar (GB)**, a son of that luminary who tore apart a seemingly deep first edition of Royal Ascot's G1 Commonwealth Cup June 19. Previously, last year's G2 Gimcrack S. scorer had taken Newbury's G3 Greenham S. over seven furlongs Apr. 18 so stamina will not be an issue tackling this stiff six-furlong test. "I'm delighted with the horse. He's done well since Ascot and his weight is good and he's showing all the right signs," trainer Charlie Hills commented. "The only slight reservation I have is the 'Ascot bounce'. A lot of horses who ran at Ascot haven't run up to form since. It does take a lot out of them. He seems in good form, but you never really know until they go to war again, so that is a bit of a concern. We know he's a horse going in the right direction and he's still improving. I don't think we've seen the best of him yet."

Ignoring that the betting market suggests it is a two-horse war, the form book says that the veteran five-furlong specialist **Sole Power (GB)** (Kyllachy {GB}) and last year's G1 Haydock Sprint Cup winner **G Force (Ire)** (Tamayuz {GB}) should not be left out of calculations. The former is part of a two-pronged attack from the Eddie Lynam stable alongside the 3-year-old filly **Anthem Alexander (Ire)** (Starspangledbanner {Aus}), who was third in the Commonwealth and has to find some improvement. Success for the 8-year-old Sole Power would be a remarkable feat, as he is yet to win over this trip and has been notably below-par on four of his seven attempts at it in pattern company. "I have not done much with either of them since Ascot and have just tried to freshen them up, but they both seem very well," Lynam said. "Sole Power ran well in a very good July Cup two years ago, finishing fifth, beaten in a photo for third, and though he has never won over six furlongs, he's finished in the frame in a Haydock Sprint Cup and been second in a Group One in Hong Kong over this trip. They just didn't go the end-to-end gallop that he needs [when fifth in the June 16 G1 King's Stand S.] at Ascot. He owes us nothing and we are not afraid to lose. Anthem Alexander is trying to become the first three-year-old filly to win this race since Habibtu [in 1983], so it's a big ask for her and it looks hard for her to reverse Ascot form with Muhaarar."

Shadwell's second string is the William Haggas-trained **Muthmir (Ire)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}), who was third in the King's Stand. "Muthmir has been very well since Royal Ascot and is not the kind of horse that needs a lot of work," his conditioner said. "I am not sure that he would have won the King's Stand Stakes with a clear run, but he was not beaten far and was staying on well at the end, so my first impression after the race was that maybe he needed a step back up in trip. I do have some reservations about the undulations of the July Course, as all his best form has come on flat tracks."

Newmarket's G2 Superlative S. has played host to some lofty talent in recent times and Saturday's edition, with so many unexposed types in the line-up, could possibly unearth another in the mold of Dubawi (Ire), Horatio Nelson (Ire) and Olympic Glory (Ire) (Choisir {Aus}). If the betting is the guide, then if it comes it will most likely be in the form of the almost obligatory Ballydoyle representative **Air Vice Marshal** (War Front), who was impressive when scoring over this trip at

Gowran Park June 21. That is a track which the stable has used to launch the likes of Spartacus (Ire) and Antonius Pius and there was much to like about the way the half-brother to the high-class Contested (Ghostzapper) went through his race. Michael Tabor's

challenger will be tested by Hambleton Racing Ltd's unbeaten **Taking Libertys (GB)** (Makfi {GB}), who comes here on the back of five- and six-furlong wins at Beverley Apr. 15 and Pontefract May 22. Cosmo Charlton, who manages the syndicate, is hoping he can hold his own in this elite company. "He's been a really exciting horse for us this year. He's done everything well. He looks to be crying out for the step up to seven furlongs and I think he's the type of horse that will continue to improve through the year."

Mark Johnston has proven the foremost trainer of juveniles in Britain so far this year and his duo here includes the June 16 G2 Coventry S. fourth **Beaverbrook (GB)** (Cape Cross {Ire}) and the June 26 Doncaster conditions scorer **Champagne City (GB)** (Tobougg {Ire}). "I hope we have made the right decision taking Beaverbrook up to seven furlongs in what looks a very hot Superlative Stakes," he commented. "The horse has earned his spot in the race and I think he is a progressive horse with more to come. It is a big jump up in grade for Champagne City, but like Beaverbrook, he has earned a shot at a race like this."

**QATARI SUMMER**

With the two favorites for Saturday's G2 Fred Cowley MBE Memorial Summer Mile at Ascot, Qatar Racing could well be celebrating a favorable outcome with either **Arod (Ire)** (Teofilo {Ire}) or **Lightning Spear (GB)** (Pivotal {GB}). Like chalk and cheese in what they have so far accomplished in the public realm, the former comes here on the back of a third in the G1 Lockinge S. at Newbury May 16 and a win in

Epsom's G3 Diomed S. June 5 while the unbeaten Lightning Spear steps out of handicap company for the first time. Since being dropped in trip from middle distances, last year's G2 Dante S. runner-up and G1 Epsom Derby fourth Arod has thrived and the manner in which he dealt

with the multiple group winner Custom Cut (Ire) (Notnowcato {GB}) in the Diomed over an extended mile left a lasting impression. "We've been very happy with him since Epsom and decided to skip the Queen Anne at the Royal meeting to come here instead," trainer Peter Chapple-Hyam explained. "I'm sure there's more improvement in him. He seems to be getting stronger all the time. We know he likes fast ground--the faster the better."

Lightning Spear has doubled his tally this term with wins at Lingfield Apr. 29 and at Salisbury June 24 that may have masked his true ability and trainer Ollly Stevens is keen to try him in this kind of company. "He's unbeaten over a mile and Ascot's stiff course wouldn't worry me at all," he commented. "A smaller field was less risky. Had he run in a handicap on Saturday, it would have been his last handicap anyway before going on to Group races. We just decided to grasp the nettle a little bit early."

Godolphin's 2014 G2 Celebration and Boomerang Mile winner **Bow Creek (Ire)** (Shamardal) would offer stern opposition if able to rebound from a comeback sixth in the Apr. 24 G2 Sandown Mile, while the Lockinge fifth and subsequent May 30 G3 John of Gaunt S. scorer **Cable Bay (Ire)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) is another who holds valid claims now that connections appear to have found the key to him. "The ground might be slightly on the quick side for him, but he's a horse who is still improving and I don't think we've seen the best of him yet," trainer Charlie Hills said.

**TOP LOT DAN DESTINED FOR QATAR**

Back-to-back victories since the publication of the catalogue were enough to elevate **Go Dan Go (Ire)** (Dandy Man {Ire}) (lot 673) to the position of session-topper at 180,000gns on the final day of the Tattersalls July Sale. Qatar's champion trainer Jassim Al Ghazali, who is aided in his selection process by Will Douglass of Charles Gordon-Watson Bloodstock, added the 97-rated 3-year-old to his list of 12 purchases for a total of 501,000gns throughout the three-day sale.

Commenting on his most expensive purchase of the week, Douglass said, "He is a lovely gelding, with some great current form that is working out well."

Yet another solid clearance rate of 93% brought the summer sale to a close on Friday ahead of the final day of the July meeting and the G1 Darley July Cup. The third day's trade accrued 2,426,400gns (+7%) for 144 horses sold at an average price of 16,850gns (+2%) and median of 10,000gns, which dropped by 9%. Final figures for the sale as a whole saw turnover stand at 8,949,800gns, an increase of 7% for 14 fewer lots sold than in 2014, while the average and median both climbed by 10% to 18,415gns and 11,000gns respectively. The clearance rate fell marginally but held at a respectable 90% for 486 horses sold from 543 brought to the market. **Cont. p12**

Commenting on a vibrant few days of trade at a sundrenched Park Paddocks, Tattersalls Chairman Edmond Mahony said, "Widely regarded as Europe's premier midsummer sale, this year's Tattersalls July Sale has attracted buyers from every continent in the world, all of whom have contributed to improved

figures across the board for the fourth consecutive year. Turnover a fraction short of 9 million guineas is the third highest ever for this fixture, while the median equalled the record and the average was second only to the record breaking year of 2006."

He added, "Year after year we reflect on the extraordinary level of international participation at the July Sale and other similar sales here at Tattersalls, and this week's renewal has been no exception. We felt that the catalogue had all the necessary ingredients to attract a diverse crowd of buyers and this has been reflected not only in the improved figures, but also, crucially for a sale of this nature, in the spectacular clearance rate of around 90%. The global appetite for British and Irish horses in training is as strong as ever, and equally encouraging has been the demand for well bred fillies and broodmares."

There were fewer British and Irish National Hunt trainers in action this week at Tattersalls but Simon West selected the Aga Khan-bred colt **Vilman (Ire)** (Mastercraftsman [Ire]) (lot [749](#)), a winner over 1m5f since the catalogue was printed, to join his string of jumpers. The Yorkshire trainer went to 95,000gns to secure the

relation to Group 1 winners Valanour (Ire) (Lomond) and Vereva (Ire) (Kahyasi {GB}).

He said, "He is a nice sort and I had some good advice about him. He has been bought to go jumping and is for the owners of [triple winner] Maximiser."

Another 3-year-old, **Skate (GB)**, (Verglas {Ire}), lot [620](#), will be leaving Roger Charlton's Beckhampton stable and is also headed for Qatar after trainer Marco Botti outbid Al Ghazali at 85,000gns.

"I was bidding on behalf of Jamie Lloyd and the horse is going to a client of his in Qatar," said Botti, whose Team Valor-owned Beverley D S. winner Euro Charline (GB) (Myboycharlie {Ire}) finished runner-up in the G1 Falmouth S. at Newmarket on Friday afternoon. "He's got good form, is still unexposed and likes fast ground so will be ideal for Qatar," he added. The half-brother to European champion 3-year-old sprinter Mince (GB) (Medicean {GB}) has won his last two starts over sprint trips at Haydock and Bath for breeder Lady Rothschild and is rated 85.

Lot [644](#), the Juddmonte filly **Isostatic (GB)** (Champs Elysees {GB}) may yet take to the track after being bought by breeder Dwayne Woods of Brook Stud near Newmarket. The juvenile half-sister to Group 2 winner Deportivo (GB) (Night Shift) is unraced to date.

"We don't have any of this family, but there is black-type all down the page," said Woods. "She's a sweet filly. We will take her home and assess her - she might go back into training."

With yearlings now in the early stages of preparation for forthcoming fixtures at Arqana and Doncaster next month, Tattersalls' headquarters in Newmarket will remain quiet until the premier European auction, the three-book October Sale, begins its two-week run on Oct. 6.

Born in 1932 in Alexandria, Egypt, Sharif started his career working in the precious wood business alongside his father. Later, he left for London to study acting. His name is forever

linked to Lawrence of Arabia, where he played the role of desert prince Ali Ibn Kharish. He earned a Golden Globe for Best Actor in a Supporting Role in 1963, and a nomination for the Oscar for Best Supporting Actor in the same year.

He found a new international success with *Doctor Zhivago*. He had a great passion for racing.

His line in a commercial for *Tierce Magazine*, "Racing, you know, it's my greatest passion," became a cult sensation. He lived that passion every day.

His friend, trainer David Smaga was very emotional about his passing.

"He was a great man, a worldwide star, but above all, he was my friend," he explained. "He knew me as a child in Egypt and we always stayed in touch. He had horses with me, but our relationship was about more than that."

Recently, the pink and black colors of this lover of Deauville flew aboard Don Bosco (Fr) (*Barathea {Ire}*), winner of the G3 Prix Gontaut-Biron and *Lixirova (Fr)* (*Linamix {Fr}*), winner of the G3 Prix Miesque.

**ABLE FRIEND NAMED HOY IN HONG KONG**

The battle for 2014/2015 Hong Kong Horse of the Year came down to a photo finish between **Able Friend (Aus)** (*Shamardal*), who dominated the local mile division with victories in the G1 Longines Hong Kong Mile and G1 Champions Mile; and

**Aerovelocity (NZ)** (*Pins {Aus}*), who not only returned the G1 Longines Hong Kong Sprint to the host jurisdiction, but also added Group 1s on international soil in the Takamatsunomiya Kinen in Japan in late March and the KrisFlyer International Sprint in Singapore in May. At the end of the day, it was Able Friend, Hong Kong's version of 'Big Red' who took down the top honors, with both horses set to fly the flag for Hong Kong in the 2015/2016 season, which kicks off in early September. ***Cont. p14***

**Able Friend Named HOY in Hong Kong cont.**

Trained by John Moore, who has locked up a seventh premiership, and ridden in seven of his eight starts by champion and most popular jockey Joao Moreira, Able Friend, an A\$550,000 Inglis Easter yearling, dropped his return to the races in a rare meeting with Aerovelocity, but would not taste defeat again in Hong Kong, posting six straight tallies and additional top-level successes in the Stewards' Cup and the 1400-meter Queen's Silver Jubilee Cup. Able Friend failed to reproduce his best form in the G1 Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot last month, prompting owner Dr. Cornel Li to remark that he didn't expect to win any awards, but voters and fans alike were able to see past that disappointment. In addition to Horse of the Year, Able Friend was also named champion miler and most popular horse.

It was a more ambitious campaign for Aerovelocity, who became the first Hong Kong runner to win Group 1 races in three countries to take down champion sprinter honors. With the lack of a suitable race in Dubai, the 6-year-old was shipped across to Chukyo for the Takamatsunomiya Kinen and overcame ground easier than he likes for a half-length success. In his final start of the season, the Paul O'Sullivan trainee ventured to Singapore for the KrisFlyer and provided Hong Kong with a third straight running of that race, defeating two-time defending champion Lucky Nine (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}) into third as the 3-5 favorite.

**Designs on Rome (Ire)** (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}) gave the John Moore stable a second winner on the evening, as the 5-year-old was named champion middle-distance horse. Partnered in all but one of his starts this season by Moreira, the bay put it all together on international races day, defeating one-time barnmate Military Attack (Ire) (Oratorio {Ire}) by a short head in the G1 Longines Hong Kong Cup before besting Helene Super Star (War Front) in the G1 Hong Kong Gold Cup two starts later. The latter, raced in Europe as Lines of Battle, was crowned champion stayer on the strength of his victory in the G1 Champions and Chater Cup May 31.

In other categories, **Thewizardofoz (Aus)** (Redoute's Choice {Aus}) was named champion griffin (new horse) with a trio of facile victories from as many starts and **Contentment (Aus)** (Hussonet) won five of eight starts to go from a rating of 52 to a current 95 and was named most improved horse.

Two legends of the Hong Kong turf who were recently retired, **Ambitious Dragon (NZ)** (Pins {Aus}) and **California Memory** (Highest Honor {Fr}), were recognized with lifetime achievement awards. --by Alan Carasso

**MOODY TO FACE COBALT CHARGES**

Peter Moody is the latest trainer who will face charges in the on-going cobalt doping scandal in Australia. Moody's **Lidari (Fr)** (Acclamation {GB}), who finished second in the G1 Turnbull S. at Flemington last October, subsequently tested positive for nearly twice the legal threshold of cobalt allowable in a horse's urine sample.

Under Australian rules of racing, the permitted level of cobalt is 200 micrograms per liter of urine, however Lidari's sample was found to contain 380 micrograms per liter (with a 38 microgram per liter measurement of uncertainty), while

the Hong Kong Jockey Club's racing laboratory confirmed a level of 410 micrograms per liter. Moody will face charges of administering cobalt to Lidari with the intention of improving the horse's performance. He will be the fourth trainer following Sam Kavanagh, Danny O'Brien and Lee & Shannon Hope to have charges brought against them and according to Dayle Brown, Racing Victoria's general manager for integrity services, "Mr. Moody, like the trainers from the other three stables, will have the opportunity to defend the charges brought against him before the independent RAD (Racing Appeals and Disciplinary) Board and we hope that this can occur at the earliest possible opportunity."

## California

### Fewer Medication Violations in California:

California horse racing experienced only four Class 1, 2, or 3 medication violations during the 2014-15 fiscal year--the lowest number in at least 40 years.

The Maddy Laboratory at the University of California, Davis, confirmed four positives for Class 1, 2, or 3 drug substances from 11,900 samples tested during the fiscal year that concluded June 30. This was the lowest number of major medication violations that could be determined by a search of California Horse Racing Board (CHRB) records going back to 1974. This compares to 28 Class 1, 2, or 3 confirmations in 2013-14.

The huge drop is largely attributable to CHRB and industry enforcement efforts, particularly for clenbuterol, which accounted for 16 of the 28 previous year's positives. There were no clenbuterol positives in 2014-15.
