CHROME SUSTAINS CANNON BRUISE

Horse of the Year and dual Classic winner **California Chrome** (Lucky Pulpit) will likely be out for the remainder of the 2015 season after x-rays showed a cannon bone bruise. The chestnut was second in the GII San Antonio Invitational S. Feb. 7 and runner-up in the G1 Dubai World Cup Mar. 28. California Chrome was originally scheduled to make an appearance in Ascot's G1 Prince of Wales S., but was withdrawn with a foot abscess. He arrived at Arlington Park last week in preparation for a start in the GI Arlington Million, but will miss that start--and likely the remainder of the season--after x-rays showed a cannon bruise. The DAP Racing facebook page released the following statement Sunday: "California Chrome won't run in the Arlington Million due to cannon bone inflammation. Owner Perry Martin said the condition was found by x-ray late yesterday afternoon."

Champagne glasses were lifted in exuberant toasts as buyers and consignors gathered at the Northern Horse Park on the evening of July 12 to share good luck wishes for the Japan Racing Horse Association's two-day select sale of yearlings and foals set to begin the following morning.

"Thank you for coming from all over the world to Japan. We hope you spend big money and go home with no money left in your pockets," JRHA Vice Chairman Teruya Yoshida told the crowd of about 100,

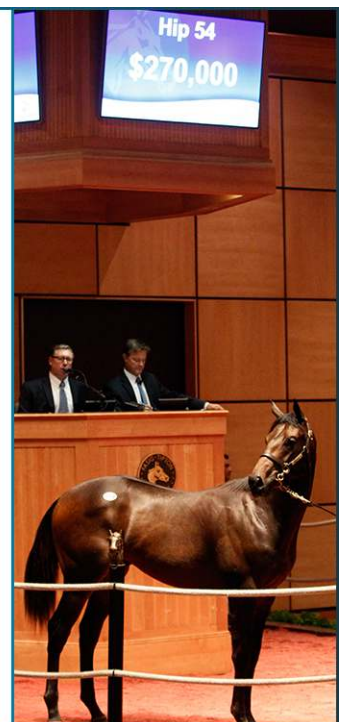

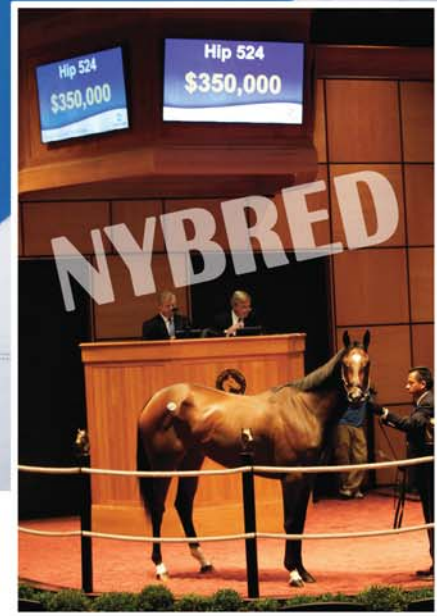

"After his good race in the Guineas, I could not run him in the St James's Palace because of a foot infection, but he is now back to his best," commented trainer Andre Fabre after drawing level with the race's previous record-holders Francois Mathet and Francois Boutin with five editions. "Provided all is well, he will run in the [Aug. 16] G1 Prix Jacques le Marois at Deauville as long as it doesn't come up heavy."

Territories was arguably emerging as France's leading 3-year-old miler here, having steadily built towards that accolade by finishing third in the seven-furlong G3 Prix la Rochette at Longchamp in September and again, before being promoted to second, in the G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere over the same track and trip on Arc day. Returning with a smooth win in that venue's G3 Prix de Fontainebleau over a mile Apr. 12, the homebred had finished 2 1/4 lengths behind Gleneagles (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) in the Newmarket Classic before his injury-enforced break.

"This was a very accomplished performance by Territories, who showed his class," said Godolphin's Lisa-Jane Graffard. "Mickael rode a cool race and did not panic. Territories was a bit further back than we wanted but the leaders went very fast. He will remain at a mile and might go for the Deauville race [Prix Jacques le Marois Aug. 16]."

With the previously unbeaten G2 German 1000 Guineas winner Full Rose (GB) (Aqlaam {GB}) failing to make the grade and finishing last, this race was left to the mercy of the older brigade, and Wild Chief proved clear best to register a first black-type success. Campaigned over further last summer, the chestnut was fourth in the 10 1/2-furlong G1 Prix du Jockey Club at Chantilly in June before finishing fifth in another Derby--of the German variety--over a mile and a half at Hamburg the following month.

Fifth staying at that trip for both the G1 Preis von Europa at Cologne in September and Munich's G1 Grosser Preis von Bayern in November, he was second on his 4-year-old bow in the Listed Fruhjars-Meile at this trip at Cologne May 10 before filling fourth in the G3 Prix Bertrand du Breuil also over this distance at Chantilly June 14. Stalking the early pace, Wild Chief took command with a quarter mile remaining and surged into the clear before being geared down late on.

"Now the Japan sale is the place to find the fastest horse in the world," said JRHA international consultant Naohiro Goda in opening remarks.

"It can be said the JRHA sale has become one of the world's best sales," added JRHA Chairman Taro Kono, a longtime member of Japan's House of Representatives. "Japan's economy has been improving, so hopefully the sale results tomorrow and the next day will be strong."

Several leading Japanese owners and staunch JRHA buyers in the past attended the party, including Makoto Kaneko, who raced Triple Crown winner and now leading sire Deep Impact (Jpn) (Sunday Silence); Masahiro and Mizuki Noda; and Hajime Satomi. They were joined by a contingent of foreign-based agents, owners and trainers in what has been described as likely the largest number of non-Japanese professionals to ever visit the JRHA sale. Some plan just to observe and learn about the Japanese market and bloodstock, but others said they will attempt to make purchases.

Australian trainer Gai Waterhouse, who is among those on their first JRHA sale foray, chatted and mingled with other partygoers while looking ahead to bidding.

"I'm just so happy to be here," Waterhouse said. "I hope to buy as long as we can make the numbers work."

Prices at the JRHA sale are boosted by the high purses Japanese horses compete for on the Japan Racing Association circuit. The JRHA sale is coming off two consecutive record years for gross, and last year's average price for 404 horses sold was ¥31,126,361 (about \$305,160 based on the exchange rate at the time). **cont. p5**

European-based bloodstock agent Mick Flanagan, who worked in Japan while participating in the Darley Flying Start program, said he had found several horses during his inspections of JRHA sale entries that would suit some of his American and European clients.

"It just depends on how much they bring," Flanagan said. "I hope to get to buy something, but if I don't, I'll definitely be back next year."

On the other side of the sale ring, Runnymede Farm of Paris, Kentucky, will offer a yearling in the opening session. There are not many foreign-based entities that have sold horses at the JRHA sale, but Runnymede has participated for years.

Runnymede General Manager Romain Malhouitre said he felt hopeful about the sale, primarily because the farm's colt, [hip 20](#), is "a nice horse" with a strong pedigree. The big bay son of Dubai World Cup winner Victoire Pisa (Jpn) (Neo Universe {Jpn}) is out of a half-

sister to prominent Japanese sire King Kamehameha (Jpn) (Kingmambo) and to American Grade I winner The Deputy (Ire) (Petardia {GB}), and is being offered through the Shadai Farm consignment.

Among sale visitors who have traveled to Japan primarily to

observe and learn is Airdrie Stud's Bret Jones, who said he was encouraged to make the journey by bloodstock agent John McCormack. Jones spent much of July 12 visiting the Yoshida family's Shadai and Northern Farms and inspecting a number of foals that will be offered during the second day of the JRHA sale.

"I wanted to learn about the Japanese marketplace," Jones said. "So far, it has exceeded my expectations. Everybody's been very kind and I couldn't be more impressed. We've sold horses to some buyers here in the past. So I wanted to come over and put a face to those names, and I want to offer them the same kind of hospitality they have given me when they come to Kentucky."

"And now I can't wait for my second trip to Japan," he added.

The yearling session begins at 9 p.m. Eastern Sunday night, and the foal session at the same time Monday.

I'll Have Another Producing 'Strong' Stock...

One of the many intriguing sidelights of this year's Japan Racing Horse Association select sale will be the offering of two members of the first yearling crop by GI Kentucky Derby and GI Preakness S. winner **I'll Have Another** (Flower Alley), who stands at Big Red Farm in the Shizunai area of Hokkaido.

If the looks of the first yearling set to enter the ring are any indication of how I'll Have Another is stamping his offspring, then the forecast will be good for the now 6-year-old stallion.

[Hip 42](#) is a chestnut colt out of multiple Japanese stakes winner Maltese Heat (Old Trieste), who is from the family of American champion sprinter Eillo (Mr. Prospector). The colt was bred by Nagako Fujita and is consigned by Amaba Reiji Farm.

"He is a special type," said Hirokazu Okada of Big Red Farm of the yearling. "But generally, I'll Have Another's offspring are strong physically."

I'll Have Another has been well supported in Japan. This year, in his third season at stud, he covered 128 mares, following books of 126 and 152 in 2014 and 2013, respectively.

"I'm very happy with his offspring," Okada said. "It seems they will be well suited to dirt racing, but he also is a good match for mares with Sunday Silence blood, so hopefully they can run on both turf and dirt."

I'll Have Another's other yearling in the JRHA sale is [hip 173](#),

a dark bay or brown colt out of Special Woman (Jpn) (Special Week {Jpn}), a half-sister to Group 3 winner Tokai Mystery (Jpn) (King Kamehameha {Jpn}) and two other stakes performers.

In addition to the two yearlings, I'll Have Another is represented by a pair of foals in the JRHA sale: [hip 410](#), a filly out of Hishi Alcor (Jpn) (Daiwa Major {Jpn}) who is from the prolific family of Japanese champions Hishi Amazon (Theatrical {Ire}) and Admire Moon (Jpn) (End Sweep); and [hip 523](#), a colt out of Hiraboku Girl (Jpn) (Tanino Gimlet {Jpn}), a half-sister to the dam of Group 1 winner Whale Capture (Jpn) (Kurofune).

Okada noted that buyers interested in the offspring of I'll Have Another will have more chances to acquire one at the Hokkaido Selection Sale on July 21, as 11 yearlings by the stallion have been catalogued for that auction. The offerings include a filly who is out of American Grade 3 winner Bully Bones (Hesabull) and another filly out of a daughter of multiple Argentine Group 1 winner Guernika (Arg) (Luhuk).

RECORD TURNOVER AS HK SEASON WRAPS

by Alan Carasso

Before an on-track crowd of 42,000 who were showered with confetti and streamers and who received stuffed animals tossed into the crowd from jockeys using the starting gate as makeshift transportation ([video](#)), the 2014/2015 Hong Kong racing season concluded with record turnover of HK\$107.9 billion (*US\$13.92 billion*), up by 5.8% over last season. It is the third consecutive year that a new mark has been established and is the second time the HK\$100 billion threshold has been eclipsed.

"The record turnover this year is the result of a lot of hard work," commented Winfried Engelbrecht-Bresges, chief executive officer of the Hong Kong Jockey Club. "Since the 2005/2006 season, turnover has increased 79.7%, which is testament to the successful strategies the Club has undertaken in that time to revitalise Hong Kong horseracing. The season's record turnover has in turn provided a record tax contribution from racing of HK\$12.3 billion (*US\$1.59 billion*), which means that horseracing has again been able to make a significant positive contribution to the Hong Kong community."

Over 2.07 million fans passed through the turnstiles at Sha Tin Racecourse and Happy Valley Racecourse for the year's 83 meetings, the highest number in 12 years.

"It is rewarding to see us exceed the two million total attendance figure for the third consecutive season," Engelbrecht-Bresges explained. "This is a result of the right strategy, the right investment in facilities and technology; I think it has to do with people--we have a fantastic team who are able to understand what our customers want and provide those services."

John Moore won his seventh training championship with a final tally of 70 winners and record earnings of nearly HK\$140 million (*US\$18.1 million*). In addition to campaigning Hong Kong Horse of the Year Able Friend (Aus) (Shamardal), Moore also saddled Designs on Rome (Ire) (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}) and Dan Excel (Ire) (Shamardal) to major successes on the international stage.

The bulk of the Moore winners were ridden by champion jockey Joao Moreira, who won a historic 145 races and outdistanced 2013/2014 winner Zac Purton by 50 winners.

"The season has gone fantastically," the 'Magic Man' offered. "It couldn't have gone any better. But I'm already looking forward to next season and I know I can make improvements."

The 2015/2016 racing season begins Sept. 6 at Sha Tin.

Emirates Singapore Derby cont.

The punters bet Sunday's Emirates Singapore Derby as if it was a two-horse race, and so it proved, as Argentinian import Quechua completed a rare double, tacking this 4-year-old feature onto his victory in the valuable Singapore Gold Cup last November.

A Group 2 winner and Group 1 placed in his native Argentina, Quechua has been a model of consistency in Singapore and recorded a breakthrough success with a defeat of his stablemate Emperor's Banquet (Aus) (Holy

Roman Emperor {Ire}) in the 2200-meter Gold Cup, the richest event on the local racing calendar, Nov. 16. More recently, he turned in a big performance to just miss in the Queen Elizabeth II Cup over the course and

distance Apr. 26 and was first of the locals home in the G1 Singapore Airlines International Cup May 17, finishing 3 1/4 lengths behind the Hong Kong duo of Dan Excel (Ire) (Shamardal) and Military Attack (Ire) (Oratorio {Ire}). He prepped for the Derby with a runner-up effort to War Affair in the Patron's Bowl over an insufficient 1600-meter trip June 21 and was primed for this test over a more level playing field.

Drawn gate 11 in the field of 14, Quechua hit the ground running and was a bit wide from fourth early on, but Corey Brown gave his mount a little rein and the duo was up into a stalking second as VRC St Leger hero Order of the Sun (Aus) (Encosta de Lago {Aus}) set the pace. Fastnet Dragon got the perfect spot in the box seat, while War Affair could not get in from the 13 and traveled three and four wide in the middle stages.

Order of the Sun still led narrowly from Quechua, but Brown was still riding full of confidence, pushed the button and hit the front 400 meters from home. War Affair traveled deep on the second turn, but looped rivals to draw alongside Quechua and the stage was set for the final furlong. The Horse of the Year may have poked his head in front with a sixteenth of a mile to run, but Quechua--who covered 11 meters fewer than War Affair--used that to his best advantage and stuck his head across the wire first. Fastnet Dragon saved all the ground to be in the photo finish.

"He's been such a good horse to us. He's won the Gold Cup and now the Derby, what more can you ask of him," said trainer Patick Shaw, who orchestrated the career of the legendary Rocket Man (Aus) (Viscount {Aus}) and who was winning his second Derby after [Our] Falstaff (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) in 2006. "The plan was to go forward today from the wide draw, but I left it to Corey to decide where he wanted him to be. I was pretty confident he would be right in it coming to the top of the straight as he's such a fighter. He dug down real deep when War Affair got to him, and was just too good today. Corey also gave him a great ride."
