**DQ GIVES CURALINA CCA OAKS WIN**

For the second time in two days, a Todd Pletcher trainee earned a graded stakes victory through the intervention of the Saratoga stewards, as **Curalina** (Curlin) was promoted to the win after coming up a nose short of tiring pacesetter **I'm a Chatterbox** (Munnings) at the wire in Sunday's G1 Coaching Club American Oaks. I'm a Chatterbox was judged to have bumped the eventual winner in the shadow of the wire. On Saturday, it was the Pletcher-trained Uncle Vinny (Uncle Mo) who was put up to first in the GIII Sanford S.

"It takes some of the enjoyment out of it," Pletcher admitted. "Ideally you'd like to cross the wire first and have no doubts about it. After seeing that she came back one jump after the wire and put her nose in front, I feel a little less apologetic about this one. Yesterday [in the Sanford], we weren't bothered. We were the beneficiary of someone else being bothered. In this particular case, our filly was knocked off stride at a critical point in the race and got beat a couple inches. In my eyes, it probably made the difference. I'm sure there are other people that feel differently, but based on what Johnny [Velazquez] said, just watching it there, I would have to agree."

The victory continued a red-hot weekend for Lane's End stallion Curlin, whose three winners on Saratoga's opening-day card Friday included GIII Schuylerville S. winner Off the Tracks (Curlin). **Cont. p4**

**WILD DUDE UPSETS BING CROSBY**

**Wild Dude** (Wildcat Heir), a disregarded 11-1 outsider, closed powerfully to win Sunday's G1 Bing Crosby H. and earn an automatic berth to the G1 Breeders' Cup Sprint. The 5-year-old settled off the pace in fourth as **Distinctiv Passion** (With Distinction) took the field through fractions of :22.01 and :44.73. Favored **Masochistic** (Sought After) launched his rally turning for home and hit the front at the top of the lane, but Wild Dude was winding up for his run in the center of the track and the bay surged past the favorite in deep stretch to win going away. **Kobe's Back** (Flatter), who was left at the gate and trailed the field throughout much of the six-furlong contest, was flying late to get up for third. **Cont. p3**

**COVENTRY HERO ON COURSE FOR PHOENIX**

Mark Johnston's G2 Coventry S. winner **Buratino (Ire)** (Exceed and Excel {Aus}) is on target for Europe's first juvenile Group 1 event, the G1 Keeneland Phoenix S. scheduled for the The Curragh Aug. 9. The progressive 2-year-old is likely to face stern competition, including fellow Royal Ascot-winning juvenile **Washington DC (Ire)** (Zoffany {Ire}), trained by Aidan O'Brien to win the Listed Windsor Castle S. June 16. Johnston was the last British-based trainer to win the race when successful back in 1997 with Princely Heir (Ire) (Fairy King). "Buratino is spot on, just ticking over," said Johnston. "His next run will be in the Phoenix S., all being well. Everything's gone absolutely according to plan."

O'Brien has already won the race an amazing 13 times and, in addition to Washington DC, the Ballydoyle trainer could also be represented by **Air Force Blue** (War Front), who finished runner-up to Buratino at Royal Ascot, and **Painted Cliffs (Ire)** (Canford Cliffs {Ire}), an impressive winner of the G2 Railway S. at The Curragh June 27. "At the moment they are the three being aimed at the race and we'll take another look closer to the time," said O'Brien. **Cont. p10**

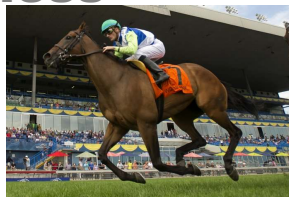

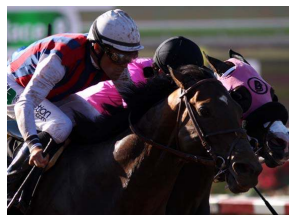

**DQ Gives Curalina CCA Oaks Win (cont. from p1)**

I'm a Chatterbox, making her first start since finishing third in the GI Kentucky Oaks, was fractious in the paddock and appeared washed out in the post parade. She jumped sharply from her outside post and bound to the lead, setting fractions of :23.54 and :46.99 as 4-5 favorite Curalina overcame a trouble start to track the pacesetter from the rail. I'm a Chatterbox skipped clear

leaving the backstretch, completing three-quarters in 1:11.27, and still had a clear advantage with a furlong to run, but Curalina began grinding down the pacesetter. I'm a Chatterbox was grimly holding on to a slim

advantage in the final strides, but drifted out into her rival's path just enough to draw the disqualification in a tight finish.

"I was coming to get [Florent Geroux, aboard I'm a Chatterbox]," jockey John Velazquez said. "He took her out and she bumped me, and my horse switched to the left lead. Now I'm unbalanced and then I had to get after her to get her back in, and I just missed the wire. I knew two jumps before the wire, I was going to get him. When she got bumped and went to her left lead, she lost her balance, I lost my balance. I had to get back on her and just missed it. No doubt in my mind, I was going to get her."

Trainer Larry Jones was proud of the effort of the returning I'm a Chatterbox, winner of the Gill Rachel Alexandra S. and Gill Fair Grounds Oaks earlier in the year.

"I thought she ran very well, coming off a long layoff like that," Jones said. "She took a little time off and was good to go. We set very legitimate fractions and, still to hold on, I'm thrilled with the horse. The jock rode a great race, he didn't do anything to cause it. He stuck with the right hand the whole way. She kind of jumped the tracks where the gate comes across, but you need to get the horse back over somehow. That's just the way it goes."

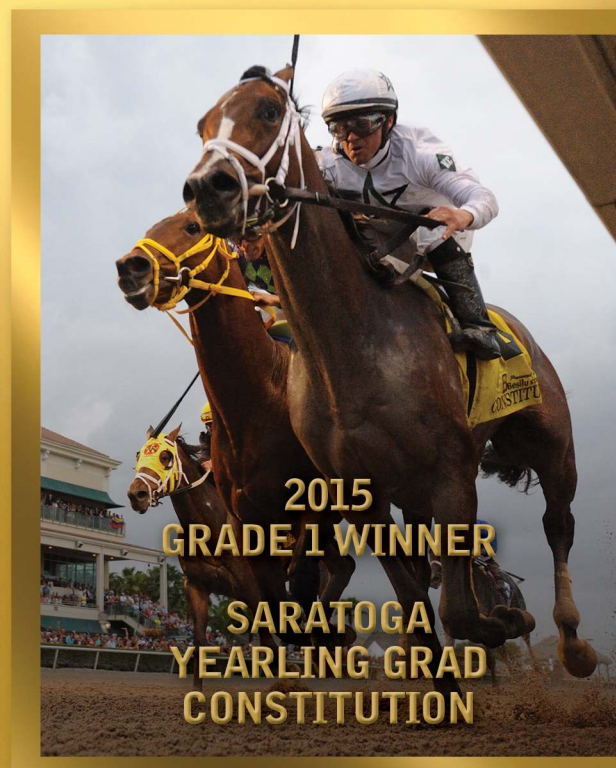

Ageless won the Giant's Causeway S. at Keeneland and The Very One S. at Pimlico last spring before adding this race a year ago. She ended 2014 with a close-up fourth-place effort in the Nov. 1 GI Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint. Second in this year's Giant's Causeway, she repeated in The Very One and closed late to be third against the boys in the June 6 GIII Jaipur S. last time out. Taken in hand soon after the start, Ageless raced near the back of a compact field early as Leigh Court battled Richies Party Girl (Any Given Saturday) on the front end through fractions of :22.22 and :44.22. Niggled at turning for home, Ageless swept up four wide into the stretch and reeled in Leigh Court.

That foe battled back bravely along the rail, but Ageless had her measure in the final strides. Ageless's final time of 1:07.17

bettered the course record of 1:07.18 set by Go Blue of Go Home when winning the July 5 GII Highlander S.

"She's getting better all the time," reported winning jockey Julian Leparoux. "Today, she won very impressively.

Today, the way she

came after those horses was great." Winning trainer Arnaud Delacour added, "She's very versatile. She can usually run well on softer turf, but today the turf was firm and she didn't seem to mind. She always comes with a good run at the end and that's what she did today."

Breeder Hinkle Farms purchased Special One, with Ageless in utero, for \$37,000 at the 2009 Keeneland January sale.

Leigh Court just missed giving Peter Fluor and K.C. Weiner's fledgling Speedway Stable its second graded victory of the weekend. The operation was represented by Hard Not to Like (Hard Spun), winner of Saturday's GI Diana S. at Saratoga.

The field for the Haskell is also likely to include:

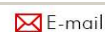

Suzanne Stables' **Barbados** (Speightstown) looks set to become the first New York starter for veteran trainer Mike Tomlinson when he goes postward in the Aug. 1 GII Amsterdam S. at Saratoga. 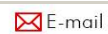

## SPRING CARNIVAL LOOMS FOR SUPER ONE

**Super One (Aus)** (I Am Invincible {Aus}) cemented his status as Singapore's leading juvenile, remaining undefeated with a dominating front-running victory in Sunday's 1200-meter Juvenile Championship at Kranji Racecourse, and could now set his sights on the Melbourne Cup Carnival in the Australian springtime.

Consigned to the 2014 Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale by Broadwater Thoroughbreds, Super One was an A\$190,000 purchase by Michael Wallace and trainer Michael Freedman on behalf of Super Team

Stable after the team were the immediate underbidder on future G1 Golden Slipper S. hero Vancouver (Aus) (Medaglia d'Oro). The son of Tails Wins (Aus) (Tale of the Cat) had never been off at odds longer than 2-5 in his three previous races and was entering the Juvenile Championship off a five-length

demolition of the Aushorse Golden Horseshoe May 15.

Jockey Craig Newitt, who had partnered with the colt in his first three starts, recently left Singapore to return to Australia and Melbourne Cup-winning hoop Corey Brown was at the controls for the first time Sunday. He bounced the prohibitive 1-5 chalk away from his high draw and found his way to the front going very easily prior to the turn. Never really out of second gear, he put a few lengths on his battling rivals in upper stretch

beneath a motionless Brown and galloped home a five-length winner, with plenty more in the tank ([video](#)). The rider was quick to praise the colt.

"I've ridden a lot of champion horses, and Exceed And Excel (Aus) was right up there with the best," said Brown, who won the 2009 Cup aboard Shocking (Aus) (Street Cry {Ire}). "I've ridden this fellow [Super One] only in a barrier trial and a couple of gallops before today, but he sure gives me the same feeling. I barely gave him a squeeze and he won by panels. I'm not saying he would be better if he had a target in front of him, but I would like to see him take a sit one day."

While Freedman stopped short of confirming Super One for the trip across to Australia for the 1200-meter G1 Coolmore Stud S. up the Flemington straight Oct. 31, it's clear he's done his homework.

"I'll have to see how he pulls up first and then look at the programme and the quarantine procedures. If we go down, he has to leave by the 26th of September," said the Australian trainer, who has just returned from his Greek holidays. "The first thing I asked Corey after he jumped off was what he reckoned about his chances in Australia, and he told me he would be the right horse to take there. If we go, my gut feel is he will not run here before he flies out. He may get a barrier trial or a lead-up run there, I'll see. It would be exciting for the owner and myself to have a horse to represent Singapore at the Spring Carnival."

## FRENCH-BRED COLT TOPS PADDOCK SALE

**Mr. Notorious (Fr)** (Myboycharlie {Ire}) topped Saturday night's Barretts Paddock Sale at Del Mar when he fetched \$200,000 from Deron Pearson's D.P. Racing. The sale, which has been held since 2011, was

moved to post-race Saturday for the first time this year. A total of 19 horses sold for a gross of \$728,500, good for an average of \$38,342. The median was \$33,000, down from \$42,000 last year. A total of 10 horses did not sell. Gross, average and median were down

from last year, which saw 19 horses sell for a total of \$2,147,000 for an average of \$113,000 and a median of \$42,000 in 2014.

Mr. Notorious, who sold as [hip 14](#), was originally purchased by Teresa Marnane for \$30,518 at the Arqana Deauville October Yearling Sale and RNA'd for \$5,601 at the Saint-Cloud May 2-Year-Old Breeze Up Sale. The sophomore was successful in his unveiling at Marseille-Borely June 19 ([video](#)) and was runner-up in an allowance there June 30 for trainer Matthieu Palussiere. McCarthy Bloodstock consigned Mr. Notorious on behalf of Con and Teresa Marnane. Mr. Notorious is the second foal out of the unraced Isola Tiberina (Hennessy), who is out of Trampoli (Trempolino), a graded stakes winner in France and Grade I stakes placed in the U.S. Mr. Notorious will go to trainer Jim Cassidy.

"He's very well made," Cassidy explained. "There's nothing to really not like about him. It's just a matter of how much we wanted to pay for him. I probably didn't want to go that high, but we did and so be it."

The conditioner said he would likely point Mr. Notorious towards the Del Mar Juvenile Turf S. Sept. 5.

D.P. Racing has been active at the Del Mar Paddock Sale in recent years. In 2012, Pearson went to \$510,000 to acquire then 3-year-old filly Oscar Party (Dixie Union), who subsequently finished second in the GII Indiana Oaks. Cassidy currently trains Prize Exhibit (GB) (Showcasing {GB}), winner of the GIII Seniorita S. and GII San Clemente H., for D.P. Racing.

D.P. Racing also purchased [hip 9](#), a 2-year-old colt by Stormin Fever for \$9,000 to become the sale's top buyer. McCarthy Bloodstock sold four other lots for a combined \$324,000 for top consignment honors. The GSP My Monet (Decarchy) ([hip 36](#)), RNA'd for \$275,000.

serves as Chief Counsel to the Governor of Kansas.

Laue had always been interested in Thoroughbred racing, dabbling in partnerships before purchasing his first broodmare in 1999.

"Breeding cattle and breeding Thoroughbred horses does have some similarities," Laue explained. "We had always followed and been interested in Thoroughbred breeding. About 15 years ago, I decided to expand our interests into that area. Initially, we did some partnerships with the wonderful folks at Centennial Farms and then went out on my own."

That initial broodmare purchase was Hail Roberta (Roberto), who would produce GI Secretariat S. winner Gun Salute (Military). Laue said he was encouraged to buy another horse to join Gun Salute in training. He purchased Cayuga's Waters as a \$45,000 yearling at the 2003 Fasig-Tipton New York-bred Sale.

"The very first broodmare I bought was an Allen Paulson mare named Hail Roberta," Laue explained. "The first foal I mated out of her became a horse named Gun Salute, who became a Grade I winner for me. He was the only horse I was going to have in training and I thought 'That's silly. I should have at least two.'" **Cont. p3**

Laue continued, "So I came up to Saratoga and bought this mare, Cayuga's Waters, as a yearling filly--the first yearling I ever bought. She and Gun Salute both went to Mott. Cayuga's Waters won the Pebbles S. at Belmont, placed in several other stakes, had a great 3-year-old year and won a race here at Saratoga by 10 1/2 lengths. She became my next broodmare, along with the dam of Gun Salute, and she's done a tremendous job for us."

Cayuga's Waters' first two foals were stakes winner Cascadilla Falls (E Dubai) and GII Vagrancy H. victress Glorious View (Pleasant Tap), who were both campaigned by Laue. She also produced Lemon Drop Kid colt Highball who fetched \$250,000 from Gary and Mary West at the 2012 Keeneland September Sale. He went on to become multiple graded stakes placed.

Laue currently has five broodmares in his band, including Cayuga's Waters, and three horses in training with Mott and Tom Albertrani.

"We've become largely a breed-to-race operation and occasionally sell yearlings," Laue offered.

One of those yearlings going to market will be Sage Hall's yearling half-sister. The Quality Road filly will enter the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Sale's ring as [hip 50](#) Aug. 10. She will be consigned by Hurstland Farm.

Laue attributes the success of his small, but accomplished operation to the trainers and horsemen he works alongside.

"We work very hard at the matings and working with good people," he said. "Alfred Nuckols at Hurstland Farm handles all the mares and the young horses for us and Tony Everard at New Episodes Training Center breaks all the 2-year-olds. I know everyone in this business works very hard at it and I chalk a lot of it to being lucky and being at the right place at the right time."

Laue noted that a lifetime breeding and raising cattle, as well as stock horses, has given him an advantage when it comes to Thoroughbred breeding.

"We're very serious about trying to do it right," Laue commented. "Some of my friends joke that they shouldn't let cattle guys into the horse business because we come with a little advantage from having studied genetics and animal husbandry. I grew up on the ranch and, of course, that was part of our daily life, so I think some of that has carried over and has been helpful in making the right decisions on matings and how to bring horses along."

Laue's interest in pedigrees led him to freshman sire Cape Blanco (Ire), who stood at Ashford.

"I'm always looking for some value and something a little different," Laue said of his pairing decisions. "I typically haven't used a lot of first-crop stallions. I found the opportunity to get to a Galileo horse interesting--that's probably what helped me make the decision. He was, I believe, the first accomplished Galileo son to stand over here. You look at what Galileo and his sons have done in Europe, they've done very well over those Danzig lines, particularly Danehill mares."

He continued, "My mare is a Langfuhr by Danzig and I thought that might be something worth trying. I enjoy racing on the grass and there are a lot of opportunities on the grass. We've also got another shot of Rough Shod and the Moccasin-Special family in my mare and that also comes through in Sadler's Wells and Galileo."

Between purchasing Cayuga's Waters in Saratoga, seeing her allowance romp at the Spa and now watching her filly Sunday, Laue has had a good deal of success in New York. Which is fitting since all of her offspring have been named after his alma matter.

"When I bought Cayuga's Waters, she needed a name," Laue stated. "She's a New York-bred and I had no previous connections to the state of New York except I went to law school here. So Cayuga's Waters is from the Cornell Law School song and the foals have all somehow been related to Cornell. Cascadilla Falls is the waterfall outside of my dorm room, Glorious View is from the second line of the song, and this filly, Sage Hall, is named after an incredibly elaborate Victorian building on the campus which was the first women's dormitory at Cornell."

As for Sage Hall, Laue noted, "We'll get a feel for what happened today and see how she comes out of it and see where we go next."

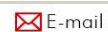
For now though, the connections will "probably stop at the Reading Room and have a cocktail"--a celebratory cocktail a decade in the making.
