DANDY RUNNERS AVOID PHAROAH SHOW

While the most talked about race for 3-year-olds this weekend will certainly be Sunday's GI Haskell Invitational S. featuring the return of Triple Crown winner American Pharoah (Pioneerof the Nile), Saratoga's GII Jim Dandy S. Saturday still offers a

\$600,000 purse and the opportunity to prep locally for the Aug. 29 GI Travers S. Favored on Eric Donovan's morning line is Sheikh Mohammed homebred **Frosted** (Tapit). Second in the GII Remsen S. at the end of last season, the grey

filled the same slot in Gulfstream's Holy Bull S. Jan. 4. He was a disappointing fourth after striking the front too early in that venue's GII Fountain of Youth S. Feb. 21, but his connections figured him out before Aqueduct's GI Wood Memorial S. Apr. 4 and were rewarded with a convincing tally.

"We changed everything for the Wood. It was a great achievement for our whole team," recalled trainer Kieran McLaughlin. "It was very satisfying because of how many times we watched the replay of the Fountain of Youth and tried to figure out what went wrong. I'd put it in the top five [wins] of my career."

It was then on to Louisville for Frosted, and he did very well to make up ground and be fourth in a GI Kentucky Derby dominated on the front end. He waited for the GI Belmont S. after that, and briefly looked like he might give American Pharoah a challenge before settling for second, 5 1/2 lengths back. **Cont. p7**

'PHAROAH PHANS' OUT IN FULL FORCE

It was a bit of an unusual scene on the Monmouth Park backside just before 7:00 a.m. as a crowd began to form outside of trainer Kelly Breen's Barn 12. Onlookers leaned around each other and ducked under rails to try and get a glimpse of the great **American Pharoah** (Pioneerof the Nile) being saddled for his morning gallop as he readies for Sunday's GI Haskell Invitational S..

At 7:20 a.m., with 10 minutes to go until the Triple Crown

winner was expected to arrive on the track, the rail and trackside viewing stands were already lined with media and horsemen with their cameras and cell phones at the ready.

The champion stepped onto the freshly harrowed track promptly at 7:30 a.m. and galloped 1 3/8 miles under regular exercise rider Jorge Alvarez. His presence was announced over the loudspeakers to a crowd of 5,000 excited fans, who swarmed the grandstand area to get a sneak peak at the 12th Triple Crown winner ([video](#)). **Cont. p3**

He was followed by GI Belmont S. third-place finisher **Keen Ice** (Curlin), who was on the muscle and looking like a million bucks as he galloped strongly past. Also on track during the special Haskell time slot were Gill Pegasus S. hero and 'TDN Rising Star' **Mr. Jordan** (Kantharos) and recent Monmouth allowance winner **Top Clearance** (Majestic Warrior).

Seeming perfectly at home over the Oceanport oval, American Pharoah was pulled up on the backside, turned around and jogged quietly off the gap. He returned to Barn 12, where a large group had already gathered around the barriers surrounding the bath area.

The popular colt was happy to oblige his paparazzi, posing several times to give photographers plenty of opportunities for the perfect photo. Assistant trainer Jimmy Barnes was on the shank as Alvarez draped the Triple Crown scrim over the Classic winner. He was then passed off to groom Eduardo Luna who walked the sophomore several times around the shedrow.

At 12:30 p.m., another crowd of adoring fans had gathered to see American Pharoah, but this time they lined the tunnel and Monmouth Park paddock waiting to see the big colt school before the first race. Inside the paddock, racetrack officials and the media anxiously awaited their next chance to capture an image of Bob Baffert's most famous trainee.

People swarmed the fence, cameras at the ready as a bay horse emerged from the tunnel, but it turned out to be Bobby V. (Pleasantly Perfect), the one horse in the first race. The rest of the runners filed in behind him leaving the crowd restless as they squinted in the direction of the tunnel.

A few minutes later, American Pharoah could be seen in the shadows of the tunnel with Alvarez on a shank to his right, Luna on a shank to his left and Barnes close beside them. Only a handful of media noticed as the colt spooked and crow-hopped at what turned out to be a group of over eager fans running towards the rail yelling his name. Alvarez lost his balance after lunging forward in an attempt to restrain the colt and fell, but quickly jumped to his feet and the group entered the paddock without further incident.

Fans cheered and chanted "Pharoah, Pharoah" as the gleaming bay made his way around the walkway and into the saddling area. He stood and walked calmly around the saddling area until the first race was over to avoid further incident. The sophomore was then lead around the circle and back out of the tunnel to a roar of applause.

"It was wonderful, wasn't it?" Barnes said after the schooling session.

Dennis Drazin, advisor to Monmouth Park's operators Darby Dan Development, expressed similar sentiments.

"Today was really amazing," Drazin said. "I came out this morning and the traffic was unbelievable to get here. There were 5,000 people in the stands just trying to take a look at [American Pharoah] and now we had a pretty crowd to watch the horse schooling in the paddock. The important part is that New Jersey benefits from all of this. It is a big economic boost to the state. After there wasn't a Triple Crown winner for 37 years, we were fortunate enough to get American Pharoah to come to Monmouth Park."

Drazin added, "What this means for racing here in New Jersey, is that they know we need help. They are committed to try and get us some revenue funding through casino expansion, which won't be on the ballot this year, but will be next year. Monmouth Park probably won't get a casino, but we will get a share in the revenues generated from casinos in North Jersey."

American Pharoah is scheduled to gallop again Saturday during the special Haskell time slot at 7:30 a.m.

CAN FALL'S STOCK KEEP RISING IN VANDY?

Stonestreet Stables's 'TDN Rising Star' Rock Fall (Speightstown) leads seven solid sprinters in Saturday's GI Alfred G. Vanderbilt H. at the Spa. Off the board on debut last April, the Todd Pletcher trainee has been perfect ever since, reeling off five consecutive open-length victories. He crushed a strong group of Keeneland

optional claimers by nine lengths two back Apr. 18, good for a 109 Beyer Speed Figure, and went one point better when besting GISW Dads Caps (Discreet Cat),

and **Clearly Now** (Horse Greeley) in Belmont's GII True North S. June 5. "He's coming off a powerful win in the True North and has been training well," Pletcher said. "We're looking forward to seeing him step up to a Grade I and seeing if he can handle it. I don't know that he can run much better than he did in the True North. It was a pretty impressive performance and all the figures suggest that it was really a top-caliber race. We're hoping for more of the same."

Salutos Amigos (Salute the Sarge) reeled off four Aqueduct wins--including three at the Grade III level--over the late fall and winter before checking in eighth behind fellow U.S. invader Secret Circle (Eddington) in Meydan's G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen Mar. 28. The dreaded "Dubai bounce" did not apply to this David Jacobson pupil, who picked up right where he left off with a powerful 3 1/4-length tally in Monmouth's sloppy Mr. Prospector S. June 28.

The Big Beast (Yes It's True), another 'Rising Star,' returns to what appears so far to be his favorite track. The hulking bay blitzed an allowance field here last July before taking the GI King's Bishop S. in August. He took an Oaklawn allowance on seasonal debut Mar. 1, but settled for fourth behind Dads Caps as the favorite in Aqueduct's Apr. 4 GI Carter H. "We've seen him mature," trainer Tony Dutrow said of the 4-year-old, who missed the second half of last season with an ankle chip that required surgery. "He's still having fun, he still enjoys himself, he still has his ways, but he's a more mature horse as you would expect from three to four. There's lots of good stuff about him going into this race. He's doing fantastic in every way, and he loves Saratoga. He's going to face horses that he's never faced before."

The aforementioned Favorite Tale--the field's third 'Rising Star'--shipped down to Gulfstream after the True North to steal the GII Smile Sprint S. He'll likely employ similar tactics this time. **Field p5**

We've given Brian DiDonato and Steve Sherack mythical \$2,000 bankrolls and told them they must bet at least 1% and no more than 10% of their stake in each flat Grade I run at Saratoga. The player with the highest bankroll at the end of the meet wins.

GI Coaching Club American Oaks - Nice to see the stewards get it right by putting up the late-running **Curalina (+95)**, who was bumped hard right at the wire. Was pretty shocked to see her go off at 4-5, but I'll certainly take it. **Bankroll: \$2055.**

GI Alfred G. Vanderbilt H. - Granted it came over a very speed-friendly Gulfstream surface, but **Favorite Tale** made the defending sprint champion look rather ordinary in a dominant performance in the GII Smile Sprint H. last time July 5. Favorite Tale lost all chance after stumbling at the start in Rock Fall's GII True North in his prior attempt and he kicked off his 4-year-old campaign with a useful second at Monmouth in May. The son of Tale of the Cat seems to have bounced out of his Smile win better than ever, posting a five-furlong bullet in :58 2/5 (1/23) at Parx July 22. Only concern? All three of his career triple-digit Beyers have come when drawing the rail. With his early speed, though, it shouldn't be too difficult to clear this group with an aggressive ride from Irad from his outside draw. **Wager: \$50 Win on #7 Favorite Tale (5-1).**

GI Coaching Club American Oaks - Conquest Eclipse (-\$50) ran just too poorly to be true, and was eased after pressing the early pace. A post-race scope revealed her to have an airway issue that will hopefully be resolved soon. **Bankroll: \$1900.**

GI Alfred G. Vanderbilt H. - I will not pick Clearly Now. I will not pick Clearly Now. . . . Ok--I think that worked. It feels like I've been saying this a lot lately, but there's really not much pace signed on here for a Grade I sprint. **Favorite Tale** has been pretty unreliable throughout his career, but there's one thing you can bank on--he'll be hard sent early. The 'TDN Rising Star' seems to do his best running when he's given his head and allowed to go as fast as he wants, and he showed that last time when setting a very fast pace and forgetting to stop in the GII Smile Sprint H. down at Gulfstream. Last year's sprinting champ and Smile runner-up Work All Week has likely lost a step this year (he runs at Mountaineer an hour earlier), but it was still a strong effort from Favorite Tale, who has run big races in enough locales to think he can duplicate that effort here. **Wager: \$50 Win on #7 Favorite Tale (5-1).**

The Adoration's second and third-place finishers **Warren's Veneda** and **My Monet**, will try to get the best of Beholder this time around. Warren's Veneda, who opened the year with consecutive tallies in the Paseana S. Jan. 11, GI Santa Maria S. Feb. 14 and GI Santa Margarita Mar. 14, was a flat fourth in the GII Great Lady M. S. at Los Al July 11. She carries co-top weight of 123 lbs. along with Vanity winner **My Sweet Addiction**.

"I have a very difficult time comprehending it," Warren's Veneda's trainer Craig Lewis said of having to give weight to the likely heavy favorite. "But the reason we're getting penalized is we won a Grade I earlier this year. Beholder has won multiple Grade Is (five), but none this year." Lewis added, "She's going to have to bring her 'A' game and Beholder is going to have to stub her toe, because Beholder is the best mare in the country. Chasing Beholder is like when we had Clubhouse Ride (Candy Ride {Arg}) and we had to chase Game On Dude (Awesome Again) all over the country. We made a lot of money doing it. As demanding as it is, it's still good to have nice horses to do it."

My Monet was second in the off-the-turf Osunitas S. last time out July 18 before going through the Barrett's Paddock Sale at Del Mar, where she RNA'd for \$575,000.

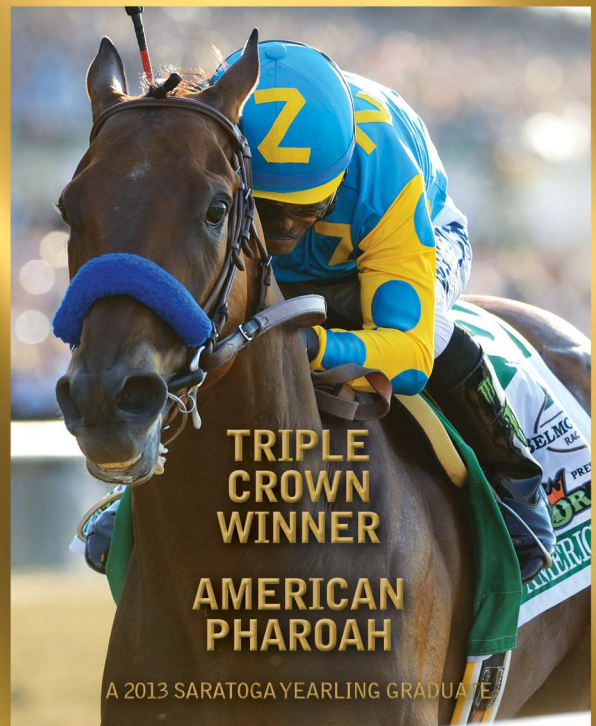

WEST VIRGINIA DERBY FULL OF VERVE

GI Preakness S. runner-up **Tale of Verve** (Tale of Ekati) is among a well-matched group of 3-year-olds signed on for Mountaineer's GII West Virginia Derby Saturday. The Dallas Stewart trainee, who graduated at Keeneland Apr. 23, registered that Preakness second in the Pimlico slop May 16 before finishing a well-beaten seventh in the GI Belmont S. June 6.

Bourbon Lane Stable's **Bent on Bourbon** (Arch) rolls into Mountaineer off three consecutive victories: a seven-furlong maiden special weight under the Twin Spires May 2; an optional claimer there May 29; and the GIII Iowa Derby June 27.

Trainer Todd Pletcher sends out GII Peter Pan S. winner **Madefromlucky** (Lookin At Lucky) and GIII Dwyer S. third Tommy Macho (Macho Uno). The former was most recently sixth in the Belmont, but the rest and cut back in distance should help. Tommy Macho broke his maiden at Belmont May 2, and annexed an allowance on Belmont day over next-out GII Indiana Derby hero Tiz Shea D (Tiznow).

Live Oak Plantation's **Souper Colossal** (War Front) was second last time in Monmouth's Long Branch S. The Eddie Plesa trainee kicked off his 3-year-old season with a victory in the Texas Glitter S. sprinting on the grass at Gulfstream Feb. 7 and was second in Monmouth's five-furlong Select S. June 14. Routing and getting back to dirt last out, he set the pace in the Long Branch and gamely kept on to finish second behind Stanford (Malibu Moon), who stayed in Saratoga for Friday's Curlin S. "He's coming to West Virginia in 100% condition," Plesa stated. "We're ready to roll."

Regis Racing's \$1.55-million Keeneland September purchase **Iron Fist** (Tapit), one of only four horses who can claim to have beaten Triple Crown winner American Pharoah, got off the mark at Santa Anita May 25 and went on to annex a one-mile optional claimer there June 28. This will be his first attempt at the nine-furlong distance.

Upstart and **Competitive Edge** are expected to instead run in Sunday's Haskell.

He was second to **'TDN Rising Star'** Speightster (Speightstown) in the GIII Dwyer S. over a flat mile at Belmont July 4, and could be poised for a return to his best with the added ground and conditioning.

'BOSS' THE ONE TO BEAT IN AMSTERDAM

Jerry Durant's **Holy Boss** (Street Boss) seeks his fourth-consecutive win but must navigate an additional sixteenth of a mile and deal with speed to his inside in Saturday's GII Amsterdam S. at Saratoga. Named a **'TDN Rising Star'** off a 10 1/4-length debut drubbing at Churchill in September, the Steve Asmussen pupil finished off the board in the following month's GI Champagne S. and again back under the Twin Spires in optional claiming company in November. Second on seasonal debut at Oaklawn in January, he returned to his best after a short freshening, reeling off back-to-back wins in Hot Springs--including the Apr. 10 Bachelor S.--before beating **Victory Is Sweet** (Congrats) by two lengths with a 100 Beyer Speed Figure in Pimlico's Chick Lang S. It's a little bit of a cutback to 6 1/2 [furlongs], but I think he can handle it. I'd rather run him at seven, but this is the race that's available and hopefully the sixteenth less won't affect him too much. WHITNEY CONTENDERS OUT IN FORCE FRIDAY

Several GI Whitney H. contenders put in their final breezes in preparation for the \$1.25-million 1 1/8-mile contest, to be held at Saratoga Race Course next Saturday, Aug. 8.

Leading the potential Whitney starters was MGISW **Tonalist** (Tapit), for Robert Evans. The Christophe Clement trainee breezed five panels over the Oklahoma training track in 1:02.55 (2/2) Friday morning. John Velazquez has the call in the Whitney, after piloting the 'TDN Rising Star' to a runner-up finish in the July 4 GII Suburban H. in his latest. "It was a nice work, usual story," said Clement. "His previous two works were in company, but today he worked on his own. I thought he worked well; he galloped out in 1:15 flat. I really think from a mile on he can run with the best." Added Clement, "I think there's enough pace for him to be comfortable, just to be comfortable the first part and Johnny will work it out. It's exciting, it's going to be a very good race. For once, he might not be the only top weight. It's the usual steps: get him there, get him to feel as good as possible and try our best."

Last year's GI Travers S. victor **V.E. Day** (English Channel) worked six furlongs Friday in 1:14.03 (1/1) and galloped out seven furlongs in 1:27 even for trainer Jimmy Jerkens and Magalen Bryant. The Magalen Bryant-owned 4-year-old ran second most recently in the GII Brooklyn Invitational S. June 6. "He looked good," said Jerkens. "He certainly isn't over-raced. It's only going to be his third start of the year. We weren't really planning on that, but it just worked out that way. We're hoping he can finish out the year strong."

Jerkens will also saddle GI Wood Memorial S. hero **Wicked Strong** (Hard Spun), who blitzed five furlongs in 1:00.10 (4/18) at Saratoga Thursday. A nose-second to stablemate V.E. Day in the 2014 Travers, the Centennial Farms colorbearer completed the trifecta in the Forbidden Apple S. at Big Sandy July 11. "He's doing good," said Jerkens. "He went good' just what we wanted. He's right on track. I think he's starting to rise back up again."

John Oxley's GI Stephen Foster H. scorer **Noble Bird** (Birdstone) rounded out the quartet of Whitney hopefuls with a half-mile move in :48.88 (22/40) under regular pilot Shaun Bridgmohan in company with GSP Coastline (Speightstown) at the Spa Friday. He was last seen finishing second in the GII Alysheba S. beneath the Twin Spires May 1. "I don't think he could have worked any better," said trainer Mark Casse. "He broke off a couple lengths behind and he wanted to run him down at any point. He came home the last quarter in 24 [seconds] and we shut him down right after the wire. Shaun's been on him forever. He works him pretty well, and last week his comment was the horse has never felt better [five furlongs in :59.90 {2/48} at the Spa July 25]. He was on him again today and he was just raving about how we'll he's training. That makes you feel good."

GENERAL AGREEMENT ON 'PRESCRIPTION FOR RACING REFORM'

United States regulators and the National Horsemen's Benevolent & Protective Association largely reacted with nods of approval late this week after taking time to digest the 10-point "Prescription for Racing Reform" released Wednesday by the American Association of Equine Practitioners.

The Lexington-based AAEP is a non-profit organization with over 9,000 veterinary members worldwide. It is also one of 23 racing industry stakeholder groups that occupy a board of directors seat on the Racing Medication and Testing Consortium, the group that develops uniform rules, policies and testing standards.

Three of the planks of the [AAEP's 10-point plan](#) specifically mention recommendations that pertain to the RMTC.

"As a board member, the AAEP is a group that's very influential in the RMTC," said Dr. Dionne Benson, DVM, executive director and chief operating officer of the RMTC. "They've really taken the side of the horse in the 10 points that they've made. Any recommendations or requests that they bring to us we will certainly review very thoroughly." **Cont. p10**

The key point outlined first and foremost in the AAEP press release (although it is covered by planks numbered nine and 10 within the actual plan) involves the pursuit of research to reduce exercise-induced pulmonary hemorrhaging (EIPH) in racehorses by means other than the prevailing practice of administering furosemide (branded Lasix or Salix).

“Few other medications have been studied and virtually no medication strategies outside race-day treatments have been researched,” AAEP plank No. 9 states in part.

“Upon finding efficacious methods to manage EIPH, the AAEP will propose that the RMTC amend its uniform medication policy in order to eliminate race-day medication,” plank No. 10 continues. “If an alternative of equal or greater efficacy to furosemide can be found that will not require race-day administration, the AAEP will support the cessation” of race-day furosemide.

“If there is any medication that is shown to control EIPH in addition to or in lieu of Lasix, we would seriously consider it,” said Benson. “Until there is, we have to continue with what we have. But if something is found, if something is developed, or if it’s found that Lasix can be used in a different way, that’s something that our board would seriously review and determine whether the change would be in the best interest of the horse.”

NHBPA chief executive officer Eric Hamelback told the *TDN* that his group “wholeheartedly supports any efforts that can be done from a scientific research standpoint to look at any alternatives, whether it’s management strategies or different medications, that can make Lasix more socially acceptable, or possibly find an alternative that can help eliminate [EIPH] as effectively as the current medications that we have.”

Hamelback continued, underscoring the NHBPA’s overall stance on medication, “The HBPA is pro-therapeutic medication, and pro-therapeutic medication only. We are advocates of a true and fair national uniform policy for all of our trainers and owners.”

Benson said she interpreted the 10-point plan as “very supportive of the National Uniform Medication Program,” which the RMTC considers one of its own top priorities.

MOSES, BESHEAR FEATURED SPEAKERS AT ROUND TABLE

Moses has also served on the International Olympic Committee as a member of the Athletes Commission, Medical Commission, and Ethics Commission, as well as on the Athletes Advisory and Executive Committees of the United States Olympic Committee.

First elected in 2007 and re-elected in 2011, Gov. Beshear shepherded Kentucky through the global economic recession, earning the Commonwealth national recognition for job creation and business investment.

Recognizing that Kentucky's long-term success would require building a stronger workforce, Gov. Beshear also has worked aggressively to improve the core areas of education and health.

Rick Bailey, registrar of The Jockey Club, will provide an update of the use of microchips for the identification of Thoroughbreds domestically and internationally.

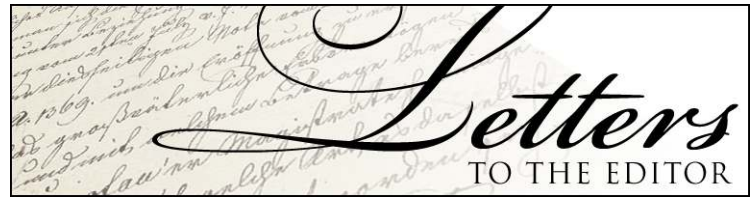

Having beaten the similarly progressive Goldream (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}) in a valuable six-furlong handicap at York last July and broken Doncaster's track record in the Portland H. over an extended five furlongs in September, Muthmir returned this term with pattern races on his agenda and started off with a fifth in the May 13 G2 Duke of York S. back on the Knavesmire. Sent to Chantilly to annexe the G2 Prix du Gros-Chene over this trip May 31, the bay ran third to old rival Goldream in the G1 King's Stand S. at Royal Ascot June 16 before finishing ninth when over-racing in the G1 July Cup returning to six at Newmarket last time July 11.

Granted the furious pace he so badly needs, Muthmir settled into his own comfortable high tempo initially several lengths off the speed. Coaxed to the far rail by Paul Hanagan approaching the furlong pole, he joined the gallant Take Cover 100 yards later and gradually asserted to defy a penalty.

"He's very good--everyone knows how strong he is now," his rider commented. "Sometimes he can hit the stalls too well, so I've got to be brave with that blind. Luckily he just missed the beat a bit and was able to relax. When he won the Group 2 in France, he pricked his ears a little bit, but there he really knuckled down and was trying that hard his head was nearly on the floor."

Trainer William Haggas added, "He's fast, and when they go that fast he doesn't pull and has a turn of foot. We are getting there now and he had a penalty today, so he was the best horse. I would say the G1 Nunthorpe S. [at York Aug. 21] is where we'll go." Take Cover just failed to follow up his win 12 months ago and trainer David Griffiths said, "It's a mixture of delight that he's got his form back and a tinge of disappointment that he got done. He's got such a big heart."

Showing instant benefit from that decision, Malabar was buzzy from the break, which helped her achieve a prominent pitch, and was then provided with a vital lead by the habitual front-runner Kool Kompany. "It was a nice, even gallop and she quickened up nicely," jockey Silvestre de Sousa commented. "She is a good filly and this trip with the visor on could be ideal for her. the initial exchanges, she was stoked up to challenge passing the quarter-mile marker and kept on strongly once taking over at the eighth pole to hold fellow AI Shaqab colorbearer Osaila with something to spare. "She was due to run at Hannover in Germany, but she had a little problem with her foot so we decided not to go and prepared for this race instead," explained trainer Francois Rohaut. "She has been in great form and did a tremendous piece of work last week so we felt very confident. She loves a long straight and the ground was perfect for her. Seven furlongs is ideal and she won a listed race at Maisons Laffitte last year over the trip. We must try for a Group 1 and she could go for the [G1] Prix Foret on Arc day [Oct. 4], but we won't know whether she is good enough unless we try."



SETTLING SCORES

Separated by just a short head in The Curragh's G1 Pretty Polly S., the Irish fillies **Diamondsandrubies (Ire)** (Fastnet Rock {Aus}) and **Legatissimo (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) square up again in Saturday's G1 Qatar Nassau S. at Goodwood. The latter, who was suffering a second consecutive reversal by that narrow margin after being caught late on by Qualify (Ire) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}) in the June 5 G1 Epsom Oaks, suffered a troubled trip in that June 28 feature and it may be that it made the difference. Legatissimo still holds the strongest form as a result of her success in Newmarket's G1 1000 Guineas May 3, and she is favored to gain her revenge on the Ballydoyle raider Diamondsandrubies, whose dam, Quarter Moon (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), was third here in 2002. The latter's breeder and part-owner Richard Henry said, "Aidan tells me Diamondsandrubies has been in great form since her Pretty Polly S. success. It looks a particularly strong renewal with a pair of Classic winners in the mix. Goodwood is a pretty unique track, but we're hopeful she'll handle it."

Also from Aidan O'Brien's establishment is Michael Tabor's **Wedding Vow (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), who is on the up after breaking her maiden in the G2 Kilboy Estate S. over nine furlongs at The Curragh July 19, while John Gosden has a trio as he seeks a fourth successive success in this race headed by Lady Bamford's G1 Prix de Diane heroine **Star of Seville (GB)** (Duke of Marmalade {Ire}). Only ninth after meeting late interference in the Oaks with Sheikh Mohammed Obaid Al Maktoum's re-opposing **Lady Of Dubai (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}) and stable companion **Jazzi Top (GB)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) ahead in third and fifth, respectively, the homebred rebounded in what looks a weak renewal of the June 14 Chantilly Classic over a more suitable 10 1/2-furlong trip and has to improve again to win this. "Star of Seville obviously ran a great race in the Prix de Diane," Gosden commented. "We are aware this a high-quality race against some proper fillies though. This is Jazzi Top's trip, as it is for Star of Seville, and Jazzi will be a better filly than she was in the Oaks. She's really strengthened up and could be in the shake up."

VANCOUVER WINS RANDWICK TRIAL

'TDN Rising Star' and unbeaten G1 Golden Slipper victor **Vancouver (Aus)** (Medaglia d'Oro) made his first major move towards an Australian spring campaign when winning a Randwick trial Friday ([click here](#) for a video feature). The Gai Waterhouse charge showed speed throughout the 850-meter trial and held off the dual Group 3 winner **Hi World (Aus)** (High Chaparral {Ire}) to win by a short head in :50.60 over the soft going under regular race rider Tommy Berry. The star-studded field was rounded out by Vancouver's dual Group 1-winning stablemate **Cosmic Endeavour (Aus)** (Northern Meteor {Aus}); G1 Flight S. winner **First Seal (Aus)** (Fastnet Rock {Aus}); G1 Crown Oaks victress **Kirramosa (NZ)** (Alamosa {NZ}); last season's G1

Doncaster Mile victor **Kermadec (NZ)** (Teofilo {Ire}); and Godolphin's Group 2-winning juvenile **Exosphere (Aus)** (Lonhro {Aus}).

"He gives you goosebumps," Berry told *Racenet*. "That's the best he's trialed without the blinkers on. He's just so relaxed and laid back;

what I really liked about him today was the way he pulled away from them inside the final 50 [meters]."

Vancouver officially turns three Saturday, and Waterhouse noted the first major target of his sophomore campaign will be the G1 Golden Rose S. Sept. 12. Lead-up races could include the G3 San Domenico S. Aug. 15 and the G2 Run to the Rose two weeks later.

"He's such a professional colt," Waterhouse told *Racenet*. "I'm happy, happy, happy. I haven't made a decision yet; I will just see how he comes through that trial and make a decision sometime within the next 10 days."

Prior to Friday's trials, in which Waterhouse sent out 25 horses, the Hall of Fame trainer discussed Vancouver's future prospects further with *RSN's* Shane Anderson.

"He's the most exciting colt I've come across in a long time; nothing's a problem," Waterhouse said. "Everything he takes in his stride, and he never goes out of second gear. The Slipper was probably the first time we saw him in top gear."

Waterhouse said Vancouver outruns everything she throws at him in the mornings.

"He toys with the Group 1 horses; he's too good for the 2-year-olds I have in the stables--and I have a lovely group around him--so I work him with a horse like Cosmic Endeavour, and she's an older mare, and a Group 1 mare."

While little has been decided about Vancouver's future beyond the Golden Rose, late-season targets are likely to be the G1 Cox Plate late October or the G1 Coolmore Stud S. against 3-year-olds at the Melbourne Cup Carnival.

"After the Golden Rose, a decision will probably be made by Coolmore and the group on whether he will go on to the Cox Plate or be freshened up for the Coolmo

re. I

must say, whatever he runs in, I don't think they'll beat him--that's how good he is."

Coolmore purchased a controlling interest in Vancouver after the Slipper in March in a deal that set his value at a rumored A\$40 million.

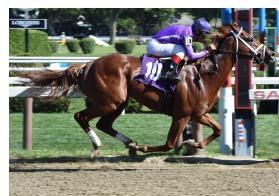

Guy Brook's half-brother to the 2008 G1 Caulfield Cup hero All the Good (Ire) (Diesis {GB}) may need a lot more time, and faces an experienced Godolphin opponent in **Folkswood (GB) ([Exceed and Excel {Aus}](#))**, a Charlie Appleby-trained grandson of the 1999 G1 Coronation S. winner Balisada (GB) (Kris {GB}), who was third in a decent Newmarket maiden last month.

BREEDERS' EDITION EUROPE

FIGURES UP AT NZB MIXED SALE

During a session that saw international buyers purchased the top three lots, New Zealand Bloodstock's Winter Mixed Sale saw gains across the board. With fewer catalogued and offered compared to last year, the buyback rate dropped by just over seven points to 20.8%, while the average climbed 50.1% to NZ\$12,776. The median was unchanged at NZ\$1,750, and a total of 57 horses changed hands for NZ\$728,050, compared to 82 sold for NZ\$522,650 last year.

The top-price offering, the Group 1 producer **Amathea (NZ)** (O'Reilly {NZ}) ([lot 27](#)), was knocked down to agent Dean Hawthorne on behalf of partnership of Australian clients.

"I purchased her for a partnership between GSA Bloodstock in Melbourne and Arrowfield Stud," said Hawthorne. "Based on the market, as the dam of a Group 1 winner, she's good value. The second foal looks promising also, so she's a mare that can leave things with a bit of ability."

Amathea's first foal is the G1 New Zealand Oaks winner Savaria (NZ) (Savabeel {Aus}), and the 10-year-old mare was sold in foal to Niagara (Aus). She will later be served by the Group 3 winner and Group 1-placed Scissor Kick (Aus) (Redoute's Choice {Aus}).

Michael Wallace purchased the sale's second-most expensive lot--and the only other to realize six figures--when picking up [lot 17](#), the stakes-placed maiden mare **Percentage (Aus)** (Onemorenomore {Aus}) on behalf of the China Horse Club for NZ\$180,000.
