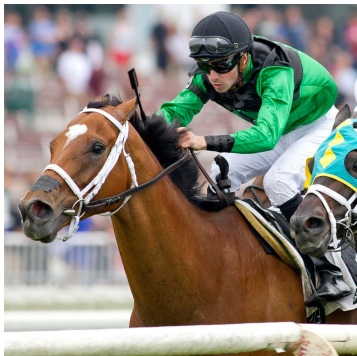

HOME COURT ADVANTAGE FOR MILLION 33?

After Teleprompter (GB) won the GI Arlington Million --the so-called 'Miracle Million' following the fire that destroyed the grandstand in 1985--American-trained horses were successful in 10 of the next 12 runnings, a streak capped by Chester House (Mr. Prospector) in 2000. There was a dramatic shift in the course of the next 11 years, as horses trained outside of the United States prevailed on eight occasions, a number that could have been even higher were it not for the disqualification of Powerscourt (GB) (Sadler's Wells) in 2004. But since Cape Blanco (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) proved a popular winner in 2011, the Million has been the property of the domestically based runners, including Hardest Core (Hard Spun), who surprised GI Breeders' Cup Turf hero Magician (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}). With last year's American St. Leger winner **The Pizza Man** (English Channel) likely to swing for the fences, a field of 13 middle-distance turfers are set to face the starter for the race that inaugurated in the era of seven-figure purses back in 1981. *Cont. p5*

SALES ACTION SHIFTS TO DEAUVILLE

The European yearling sale season kicks off Saturday evening with the Arqana August Yearling Sale in Deauville, France. A international group of shoppers has descended on the seaside town for the three-day sale, which has 374 catalogued between evening sessions Saturday and Sunday and an afternoon session Monday. Selling begins at 5 p.m. after racing across the street at Hippodrome de Deauville over the weekend, with 94 catalogued each evening, and the remainder will sell starting at 1 p.m. Monday. Arqana's v.2 yearling sale takes place Tuesday with a separate catalogue.

Shoppers were up with the sun Friday and out inspecting yearlings, and Arqana President Eric Hoyeau said he was pleasantly surprised with the global feel on the sales grounds.

"It is very international," Hoyeau said of the assembled cast of buyers. "It's very interesting and impressive to see so many people. All the usual people are here and there are definitely some newcomers, and it's interesting to see some new people from the Southern Hemisphere--Australia and New Zealand. That's something very new for us." *Cont. p16*

Godolphin Stable racing manager Jimmy Bell was equally pleased. "Very nice, with a small field today, obviously Joel [Rosario] had a very good ride," Bell said. "He was patient, stayed behind and bided his time and she has a very good kick to her. She's got all the credentials, versatility, very good mind and a lovely body." Seventh behind Strict Compliance on debut in a Gulfstream turf sprint Mar. 11, Sentiero Italia showed marked improvement with a front-running score to earn her diploma when stretched out to 1 1/8 miles on the sod at Aqueduct Apr. 19. A decisive allowance winner over the Belmont lawn May 28, she dead-heated for fourth behind undefeated Lady Eli (Divine Park) last time in the GI Belmont Oaks Invitational S. July 4. The sophomore is a half to Ashkal Way, winner of the GI Citation H., GII Kelso Breeders' Cup H. and GII Bernard Baruch H.

On numbers alone, Team USA stands a good shot to hang on to the trophy, but there is quality there to back it up. Trainer Chad Brown, who saddled the promoted Real Solution (Kitten's Joy) to win this two years ago, has three in the race, two of whom go out for Real

Solution's owners Ken and Sarah Ramsey. A one-time claimer, **Big Blue Kitten** (Kitten's Joy) has slightly better form going a bit further than Saturday's 10-furlong distance and was a running-on second to stablemate **Slumber (GB)** (Dansili {GB}) when last seen at the trip in the

GI Manhattan S. at Belmont June 6. The 7-year-old, winner of the GI Sword Dancer Invitational in 2013 going a mile and a half, atoned for his Manhattan defeat with a sound success over Slumber for a second win in the GI United Nations S. at 11 panels July 5. **Shining Copper** (Aragorn {Ire}), who was in the U.N. to set things up for Big Blue Kitten, took them into the final furlong before settling for third, and is back for pacesetter duties here.

Slumber, purchased as a racing prospect for \$200,000 out of last year's Keeneland November sale, added blinkers and snapped a 10-race losing streak when upsetting the Manhattan at 14-1, but was outfinished in the U.N., going down by 1 1/2 lengths. He would prefer some pace to run into and his low draw could lead to an impeded journey, but he figures to be on the wire if at his best.

Triple Threat (Fr) (Monsun {Ger}) looks tailor made for this spot as he goes out for Bill Mott, who saddled Paradise Creek (Irish River {Fr}) to win the 1994 Million. Fourth as the favorite in the G1 Criterium International de Saint-Cloud in 2012, he was a dual Group 3 winner in France at three and was third to Smoking Sun (Smart Strike) in the G2 Prix d'Harcourt last term. He made his U.S. debut in the GII Monmouth S. when first-up for nine months and found traffic on the turn before switching out and streaking home in :34.56 per DRF Formulator to score by a nose. An intended runner in the GIII Arlington H., won by **Quiet Force** (Dynaformer), July 11, he missed that engagement, but shows up here and has the feel of a mid-range price chance.

A four-time winner over British all-weather surfaces, the chestnut has two wins from six tries on the grass, including a half-length success in the G3 Huxley S. at Chester May 7. He'll add Lasix here, should stay the trip and his trainer/jockey team of William Buick and John Gosden upset the 2010 Million with Princess Haya's Debussy (Ire) (Diesis {GB}).

While the foreign challenge looks less than formidable in the day's main event, at least four of the overseas raiders for Saturday's GI Beverly D. S. appear classy enough to have a say in the outcome.

The 'd'iscussion must begin with Team Valor International's **Euro Charline (GB)** (Myboycharlie {Ire}), who made history last August when becoming the first

3-year-old to defeat her elders in this event, accounting for favored **Stephanie's Kitten** (Kitten's Joy) by 3/4 of a length. The bay was to remain stateside thereafter, with an eye on the GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup and the GI Breeders' Cup

Filly/Mare Turf, but was forced to miss those engagements and returned to Europe. Far from embarrassed when fourth to Solow (Ire) (Singspiel {Ire}) in the G1 Dubai Turf Mar. 28, she was no better than 11-1 for the G1 Falmouth S. at Newmarket July 10, but stuck on gamely to finish just a length adrift of Amazing Maria (Ire) (Mastercraftsman {Ire}). *Cont. p6*

The latter did her part to validate the form of that race with a defeat of G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches and G1 Coronation S. winner Ervedya (Fr) (Siyouni {Fr}) in the G1 Prix Rothschild at Deauville Aug. 2.

"They said we couldn't do it last year because she was a 3-year-old and she did it and beat a good field," trainer Marco Botti said. "This time they say we can't do it because no one has won twice. I hope we prove them wrong again."

The betting public, especially at Arlington, knows that Dermot Weld is always to be taken seriously when he ships in, and Moyglare Stud's **Carla Bianca (Ire)** (Dansili {GB}) looks to give her sire a second win in the race in the last three years (Dank {GB}, 2013). Runner-up to Australia (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) in her career debut two summers ago, the homebred defeated older fillies and mares in the G3 Dance Design S. last August, but was a disappointing fourth of five behind Legatissimo (Ire) (Daneshill Dancer {Ire}) and **Wedding Vow (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) as the 4-5 chalk in the Listed Victor McCalmont Memorial S. at Gowran Park in late April. Second in the G3 Munster Oaks over 12 furlongs June 14, the gray bounced back for an all-the-way defeat of Million hopeful Ellevel (Ire) (Kodiac {GB}) in the G3 Meld S. at Leopardstown July 16. She has a combination of speed and stamina that could stand her in good stead in this race.

Wedding Vow will try to follow Euro Charline as the second sophomore to take down the Beverly D. She has already acquitted herself well against her elders, posting a 6-1 upset in the G3 Kilboy Estate S. at The Curragh July 19 ahead of a runner-up effort to Legatissimo in the G1 Nassau S. Aug. 1. This will be her third run in 27 days.

"I'm not at all worried about the two weeks break," T.J. Comerford, assistant to trainer Aidan O'Brien, commented. "We brought Together (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) here and ran second in [the G1 First Lady S.] then ran a week later in [the G1 QE II Challenge Cup] and won the race. People practically ignored her because of it. They're racehorses and that's what they do. They run and ours seem to thrive on it."

Stephanie's Kitten was the recipient of a suspect ride from John Velazquez when fourth in the G1 New York S. The 5-year-old finished fourth, but was promoted to third through disqualification in his seasonal bow in Churchill's GI Turf Classic Invitational S. May 2, and was third last time in Arcadia's GI Shoemaker Mile June 13. Stuart Janney homebred **Ironicus** (Distorted Humor) looks to keep his hot streak alive here. An allowance winner on the turf at Gulfstream Jan. 31, the gray was a close second in a turfy Keeneland test Apr. 15. A decisive winner of Pimlico's GII Dixie S. May 16, the Shug McGaughey pupil secured a good-looking victory in a grassy Belmont optional claimer at this distance last time July 8, and appears primed to make it three in a row here. "I think he's a very, very good horse, so we'll have just have to wait and see if he keeps climbing up the ladder where it all pans out," McGaughey said. "He would be suited to the [GI] Breeders' Cup Mile because of his running style. He'd be back because there would be a lot going on up front, so that's what I have in mind." was a late scratch from that test after she threw Javier Castellano during the post parade and took a lengthy tour of the track. Adding blinkers for her official career bow July 2 in Elmont, the bay was a total professional, taking the field from gate-to-wire to graduate by an impressive 5 1/2 lengths.

"She's pretty straight forward," said Pletcher. "I think she's fast, very speed-oriented. We'll let her do what she likes to do." Tonasah's stablemate **Delicate Lady** (Thunder Gulch) makes her first start for the Pletcher barn in this test. Eclipse Thoroughbred Partners purchased the bay privately from her breeders William and Diana Shaffer after she scored a decisive 6 1/2-length victory in her career bow at Arlington July 2 for previous trainer Carlos Silva. "She seems to handle the dirt really well," he said. "Plus, being a Thunder Gulch, she should appreciate the added distance. We hope that she can handle the step up in class." Big Chief Thoroughbreds and Gene Voss's **Decked Out** (Street Boss) was also a debut winner at Santa Anita May 7 and finished second as the favorite in the Astoria. The Keith Desormeaux pupil was third last time out in this venue's GIII Schuylerville S. July 24. "Her numbers have regressed a little bit, which we weren't really happy with," said Desormeaux's assistant Julie Clark. "We like her. She's an aggressive filly in the mornings and I thought she was a little more fit for the last one than she was. She got a little tired, so we've tried to correct that for this one. We're really hoping to see a turnaround this time." Ron Winchell homebred **Just Wicked** (Tapit) was a close second in her turf unveiling downstate June 14 and earned her diploma for trainer Steve Asmussen when switched to the dirt her next out July 24. Chadds Ford Stable's **Lookout Sister** (Giant's Causeway) is another looking to take her record to two-for-two here after a good-looking graduation at Delaware July 18 for trainer Graham Motion. Bell Racing's **Kandoo** (Kantharos) receives Lasix for the first time here following a front-running victory in her Gulfstream unveiling July 18. Rounding out the field is **Heartbreaker Girl** (Drosselmeyer), who takes a step up in class after thrashing a field of \$50,000 maiden claimers in Hallandale July 23.

Third in the G1 Grosser Preis von Berlin, he was sidelined off a ninth in the G1 Grosser Preis von Baden in September and returned to action with a solid fourth in the GII Nijinsky S. at Woodbine July 19. That event was over a nine-furlong trip that is well short of his best and he can move forward with the added real estate here.

Ken and Sarah Ramsey's **Hyper** (Victory Gallop), an 8-year-old entire and not by Kitten's Joy, also exits a trip to the Great White North, where he closed willingly to be third in the 12-furlong GIII Singpiel S. In his lone effort beyond that distance, the homebred--who sports a similar lifetime trajectory to Big Blue Kitten--proved an easy winner of the John's Call S. going a mile and five-eighths at Saratoga during the summer of 2013. The in-form Irad Ortiz Jr. takes over at the controls.

BROWN LOADED FOR ARLINGTON PROGRAM

If the six horses trainer Chad Brown has entered in the Arlington Million program Saturday perform as well as his Saratoga runners have recently, he might be flying home with a couple more Grade I victories on his resume.

Between Wednesday, Aug. 5 and Friday Aug. 14, Brown won with 12 of 35 starters, a torrid 34.2 win percentage at the extremely competitive Spa meet. Twenty-two of those 35 starters finished in the top three, an in-the-money rate of 62.9%.

Brown, 36, has three runners in the GI Arlington Million, which he won in 2013 with Real Solution (Kitten's Joy): **Big Blue Kitten** (Kitten's Joy), **Slumber (GB)** (Cacique {Ire}) and **Shining Copper** (Aragorn {Ire}); two in the GI Beverly D. S., a race he won in 2011 with

Stacelita (Fr) (Monsun {Ger}): **Stephanie's Kitten** (Kitten's Joy) and **Watsdachances (Ire)** (Diamond Green {Fr}); and **Hyper** (Victory Gallop) in the GIII American St. Leger.

With two of his seven entries winning on the opening-day card, including the GI Lake George S.

With Mrs. McDougal (Medaglia d'Oro), Brown was off to a fine start. He was cool by his standards during the next 10 days before moving into the torrid stretch that started with nine wins in six days.

"The horses have been running really well, but they have been running really well for us all year, though," he said Friday in his Saratoga office. "We try to focus on this meet some, but we had an outstanding Keeneland meet and finished second in the standings. Then we finished second in the standings at Belmont with 33 wins. And now."

Added Brown, "Really, my staff has been really busting it and staying on top of everything. Of course, I have the horses from the clients, a nice, diverse group of horses. There has been a lot of patience from the clients and I am running these horses when they're ready and where they fit. It all comes together, meet to meet now for us. It's been a solid year and we're having another good Saratoga meet, which is good."

The surge at the Spa lifted Brown into a familiar position in the Saratoga standings, second to Todd Pletcher, 20-17, through Friday's program. For the past four summers, Pletcher and Brown have finished first and second, respectively, in wins at the meet.

Brown grew up in nearby Mechanicville, New York and he and his wife and two daughters are Saratoga Springs residents, so a victory at his home track would be a big deal. *Cont. p14*

After fielding questions about it for years from the local media, it's a subject he would rather not hear about.

"I honestly think about it less and less, virtually not at all now," he said. "We have so much going on in this business. We're trying to focus on these horses individually and get the best out of them, running them when they're ready in the right spots. We don't manage or spot the horses or change anything we're doing in regards to where we are in any standings in any meet."

He continued, "It would be nice, don't get me wrong. if we had the most wins at the end of the meet. It would be very rewarding for me, my clients and my staff, but it's not and never has been the centerpiece of our business."

Brown said his unbeaten star grass filly **Lady Eli** (Divine Park) is getting better after a bout with laminitis this summer. He expects the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf winner and GI Belmont Oaks Invitational S. heroine to be able to return to competition in 2016.

"She's doing terrific," he said. "She's getting better and better every week. She's doing as well as she possibly could be. We're just extremely pleased right now. She's definitely in the recovery phase where she has excellent hoof growth. We're increasing her exercise every day. We don't have any firm dates or plans when she could be put back in training. We're taking it week to week."

In 2013, Brown stayed in Saratoga and watched Big Blue Kitten win the GI Sword Dancer Invitational S. A

little later that afternoon Real Solution took the Million via disqualification. He will be at Arlington International Race Course Saturday to saddle his gang, led by the veteran Big Blue Kitten, who has won 13 times and earned just over

\$2 million for Ken and Sarah Ramsey. Brown doesn't know what to expect this year.

"I'm relieved that he's in career form as a 7-year-old," Brown said. "I have a lot of respect for the horse. I can't tell you I'm surprised. He has a lot of heart and has been a model of consistency since the first day we ran him as a 3-year-old. We've had him his whole career and have a ton of respect for him. We just love him. For him to be in career form at seven is so rewarding."

BEHOLDER TO TAKE ON THE BOYS

Dual Eclipse winner **Beholder** (Henny Hughes) will face males for the first time in her career in Del Mar's GI TVG Pacific Classic Aug. 22. A champion at both two and three, the Spendthrift Farm colorbearer has dominated the female division with 13 wins, seven of which were Grade 1s, and over \$3.6 million in earnings.

"I think when you come to a point when you're winning in your own class so much, you probably ought to try something different," trainer Richard Mandella said. "That's what I'm doing. I don't often do it, but I don't often get one as good as Beholder. I think she deserves a chance to step up.

It has been pretty easy for her for a year and she's not over-raced, so I think there's nothing wrong in trying and I'm pretty confident in her. She's pretty good."

Beholder comes into the Pacific Classic off a seven-length romp in this venue's GI Clement L. Hirsch S. Aug. 1.

Gary Stevens, Beholder's regular pilot, has plenty of experience racing fillies against colts, with the most famous being his 1988 GI Kentucky Derby winner Winning Colors. The Hall of Famer shares Mandella's confidence in the 5-year-old's ability to compete with males.

"I think it's more their temperament and mental attitude going into it," Stevens said. "I don't think, obviously, Richard [Mandella] would have tried this as a 3-year-old. But we've talked about it in the past and she's continued to mature and she's to the point right now where she's a total professional, a big, strong mare, and she can handle it."

Stevens continued, "She's got speed, as everybody knows. But she's got that style now where I can do whatever I want to with her. She is capable of doing things that a lot of good colts I've ridden in my career weren't capable of doing."

The long-range goal for Beholder this term is the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff at Keeneland Oct. 30. Stevens feels the spacing between the Pacific Classic and the Distaff makes this the ideal time to try the bay against males.

"A lot of them that I've ridden against colts they've performed well, but it has knocked them out for a while, too," Stevens said. "I think that's a consideration, where she is right now and where she's going to be. She has plenty of time to recover."

"He usually works a little bit quicker, but he's fit and ready to go," trainer Kieran McLaughlin remarked. "Rob thought he was going a little faster than that, but the track might have been a little dull at 5:40 [a.m.], or maybe Frosted was a little sleepy."

"Everything is set," McLaughlin added. "We'll work back next Thursday, Friday, Saturday or Sunday, depending on weather. He'll go a little quicker, but it's not a big deal. He's fit."

There is a chance that Frosted could face Triple Crown winner American Pharoah (Pioneerof the Nile), who he finished fourth to in the GI Kentucky Derby May 2 and second to in the GI Belmont S. June 6, for the third time in the Travers.

If the Triple Crown winner does not show, McLaughlin feels confident in his colt's chances to improve on his Jim Dandy performance.

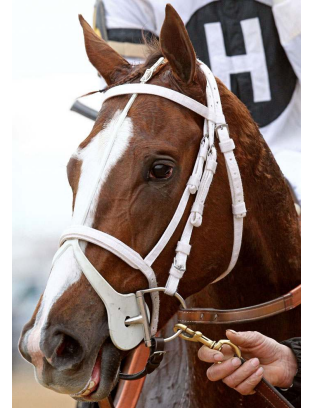

The conditioner added, "I really felt like she was tighter, but she was dog-tired when she finished. She blew out of there and ran as far as I conditioned her."

Lukas said his upset winner of last year's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies came out of the seven-furlong Test in good condition and is expected to breeze this weekend. The **'TDN Rising Star'** will regroup and point towards the \$1-million GI Cotillion S. Sept. 19 at Parx.

"I wish had pushed her a little bit more and had her more ready," Lukas said. "But the good news is that it's fixable."

Sales Action Shifts to Deauville cont. from p1

That group includes representatives from Arrowfield Stud and Eliza Park International; agents Peter Vela, Damon Gabbedy and Paul Moloney; and Sir Owen Glenn, the owner of Australian Group 1 winner Criterion (NZ) (Sebring {Aus}). Meanwhile, those visiting from the U.S. include Alex Solis and Jason Litt, Justin Casse, Gatewood Bell, Tom Ryan, Michael Hernon, Bobby Flay and Deuce Greathouse.

"The vendors are happy, and it's very busy," Hoyeau added.

The August sale has been the epitome of a success story since the turn of the decade, with figures improving year-over-year and mirroring the direction French racing and breeding are moving. The sale's average has risen each year since 2010, reaching €147,864 last year, and the median has also risen the last four renewals, hitting €90,000 12 months ago. Last year's clearance rate of 80.5% was the highest in the sale's 15-year history, and the aggregate of €38,592,500 was the third-highest, and highest since the number catalogued was cut by about 100 in 2013.

Despite these encouraging figures, Hoyeau remained modest about the potential of this year's catalogue. He pointed to the strong results of last year's sale, as well as last week's Saratoga sale, as indicators of what may come.

"Saratoga was fantastic," he noted. "And last year we had a very strong sale. Every year we look to consolidate our results. The most important thing for our vendors is to have a very solid and consistent sale. Breaking records is difficult to predict, but our target is to consolidate."

Michel Zerolo of Haras des Capucines, which sends 30 through the ring over the next three days, said the action at his barn has been "non-stop" since Wednesday.

"It hasn't stopped, even with the rain [Thursday]," he said.

Zerolo said the increase in shoppers in Deauville and the improvement of the French breed have gone hand-in-hand.

"The selection has become more drastic so the quality of horse has improved," he pointed out. "The pedigrees have improved and the French breeders have made efforts with better stallions. You see a lot [of buyers] from Australia and New Zealand, and more Americans; way more Americans. There was a time when there were no Americans."

Newsells Park Stud is a regular vendor at Arqana August, shipping yearlings across the English Channel to sell, and Newsells' General Manager Julian Dollar echoed Zerolo's sentiments.

"Everyone has been full flow; it's felt busy in here," he said. "We're starting to get second looks, and it feels positive."

While Newsells has plenty of opportunities to offer stock domestically, Dollar noted the operation has been lucky with horses sold at Arqana, its graduates including Group 1 winners Masked Marvel (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}) and Gitano Hernando (GB) (Hernando {Fr}).

"We've always kept a presence here, even though it's harder for our horses who aren't qualified for the French premiums," Dollar explained. "It's been a good sale for us; the horses out of this sale have always run well."

Dollar suggested buyers at Arqana may be more open-minded, and therefore it can be a good spot for an international pedigree in addition to well-bred fillies.

"I think it's always a good sale for fillies, so we might pick a nice filly or two for this sale," he said. "Also I think you tend to get more Australians and Americans here that come with an open mind, so for instance we have a nice Hard Spun filly ([lot 43](#)) who is doing really well so we brought her to France, and also a Harlan's Holiday colt ([lot 65](#)). Harlan's Holiday has a nice 3-year-old in France this year [Juddmonte's Group 3-placed Inordinate] with Pascal Bary, who's done well, so we thought we should bring him here as well."

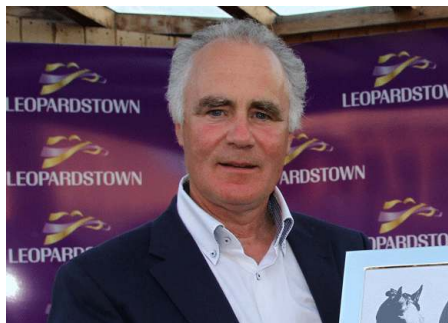

SAME STORY FOR BALLYLINCH

Ireland's historic Ballylinch Stud made headlines for numerous reasons last year, not least being the first-season sire title clinched by its resident Lope De Vega (Ire) (Shamardal) and the G1 Dewhurst S. score by Lope De Vega's Ballylinch-bred and Arqana-sold Belardo (Ire). The famed farm was also in the press, however, following its purchase by U.S. businessman John Malone last December.

Ballylinch Stud, which came into existence in 1914 and bred and stood legendary 2-year-old The Tetrarch, later the sire of Mumtaz Muhal, one of the most influential broodmares in the stud book, has changed hands just twice in its 100-year existence, so its purchase no doubt caused a stir. John O'Connor, managing

director since 1988 explained, however, that things have remained the same at Ballylinch.

"The mechanism of the purchase meant that [Malone] bought the company, so basically everything stayed the same--all the staff stayed, he bought the horses and everything," O'Connor explained. "It made for a very seamless transition. He's a very good and understanding man about the business, and he's anxious to build on what's already there at Ballylinch, and we're keen to do that for him."

Just weeks after sealing the deal on Ballylinch, Malone added Co. Kildare's Castlemartin Stud to his rapidly growing arsenal of farms, which also includes Bridlewood Farm in Florida. O'Connor explained that Malone plans to fuse the two operations and grow his broodmare band.

"We have about 35 mares and that will increase gradually," he said. "We're probably heading towards about 50 mares."

The first order of business for Ballylinch, however, is this weekend's Arqana August sale, where the nursery will offer six youngsters. O'Connor described the consignment as "very even," but pointed out a few highlights: [lot 4](#), a filly by Ballylinch resident stallion Lawman (Fr) out of G1 Prix de l'Abbaye winner Wizz Kid (Ire) (Whipper); [lot 89](#), a Shamardal colt out of a half-sister to Lope De Vega; [lot 106](#), another Lawman colt, this one out of the multiple stakes winner Modeeroch (Ire) (Mozart {Ire}); and [lot 132](#), a colt out of stakes winner Promesse De L'Aube (Fr) (Galileo {Ire}).

"We've been busy," O'Connor said of the action at the barn this week. "At a certain level of the market it's more important who looks than how many look, and we're very happy with the viewing."

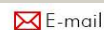
Ballylinch stands in a good position to continue stopping the press in 2015. Its youngest stallion, the Group 1-winning sprinter Dream Ahead (Diktat {GB}), has made a promising start at stud with his first-crop 2-year-olds. He currently sits third on the European first-crop sire list behind the Coolmore duo of Zoffany (Ire) and Canford Cliffs (Ire), and his 10 winners include the 'TDN Rising Star' and G2 Anglesey S. winner Final Frontier (Ire).

TREVE SISTER A JEWEL AT ARQANA

Arqana August has developed a reputation as a source of well-pedigreed fillies, and one who certainly fits that description this year is [lot 176](#), Haras du Quesnay's full-sister to dual G1 Prix de l'Arc winner Treve (Fr) (Motivator {GB}). The daughter of Trevisse (Fr) (Anabaa) will go through the ring near the end of Sunday's evening session, and she is sure to keep the crowd around until the very end.

Criquette Head-Maarek, trainer of Treve and daughter of Quesnay patriarch Alec Head, was on-hand to visit the flashy bay filly Friday morning, and she was quick to share her admiration of Treve's little sister with a growing group of onlookers.

"She's a lovely filly with a lot of class," said Head-Maarek. "She's bigger than her sister was at the same stage. Treve was lighter--lighter of bone. This filly has

more scope; she has a bigger shoulder; she's deep."

While Treve is no doubt the leading light of the family, she is far from the only standout. Trevisse has also produced the stakes-winning and Group 2-placed Trois Rois (Fr) (Hernando {Fr}), and G1 Prix Saint-Alary winner Treble (Riverman), also trained by Head-Maarek, falls under the third dam. The fourth dam is G1 Prix Ganay winner Trillion (Hail To Reason), the dam of five-time Group 1 winner Triptych (Riverman).

Treve herself went through the Arqana sales ring, going out unsold at €22,000 at the 2011 Arqana October yearling sale. The now 5-year-old was sold to Al Shaqab Racing partway through her unbeaten 3-year-old campaign, which also included wins in the G1 Prix de Diane and G1 Prix Vermeille. Head-Maarek said the decision of potentially parting with another family member wasn't an easy one.

"It's difficult; we won't let her go for nothing," she said. "For me, she's a lovely filly."

Head-Maarek explained that Trevisse lost another full-sister to Treve last year and wasn't bred this year.

First coming to the fore when winning the Listed Prix Michel Houyvet over 15 furlongs at this meeting 12 months ago, Baino Hope was a close-up third in the G2 Prix Chaudenay over that trip on Longchamp's Arc weekend card and returned to the winner's spot on her seasonal bow in a 10 1/2-furlong conditions event on Saint-Cloud's Mayday fixture. Second in the interim in the 12-furlong Listed Grand Prix de Lyon at Lyon-Parilly June 13, the bay arrived here for this competitive renewal still unexposed and open to progression and lived up to expectations with an ultimately authoritative score under Christophe Soumillon. Tracking the leading trio early in the slipstream of the habitual front-runner Cocktail Queen, she was swung out to overhaul that rival with a furlong remaining and surged clear as the line neared and her stamina came into full effect. "We need to keep her fresh and not run too often, firstly as she had some bleeding problems and also to only run when the ground is soft as that's what she prefers, so it was perfect today," trainer Jean-Claude Rouget commented. "We know she has a good turn of foot and she had a good trip and stays well. She deserved that and, knowing her problems, I wouldn't want to bring her back for the G2 Grand Prix de Deauville as that will come too quickly, so we will probably take our time and head to the G2 Prix Royallieu [at Longchamp Oct. 3] provided the ground is soft enough."

WEATHER CHECK

Saturday's rain-beleaguered G2 Betfred Hungerford S. at Newbury offers an ideal contrast of established diehards and social climbers tackling the in-between "specialist" trip of seven furlongs, with Godolphin supplying one in each category in **Safety Check (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire}) and **Richard Pankhurst (GB)** (Raven's Pass). The former has proven this season that he belongs in this league with wins over this trip and a

mile, respectively, in the Jan. 22 G2 Al Fahidi Fort and Feb. 26 G2 Zabeel Mile on Meydan's turf track and transmitted that form back to Europe when third under a four-pound penalty in Goodwood's G2 Qatar Lennox S., also at this distance July 28. However, with the soft ground that has already seen to

the withdrawal of two fascinating contenders in Limato (Ire) (Tagula {Ire}) and Home of the Brave (Ire) (Starspangledbanner {Aus}), he could be another defector according to trainer Charlie Appleby. "I think his participation would have to be in doubt," he said. "He's in good form, but he ran in soft ground at Newbury last year and couldn't raise a gallop. If we do take him out, we'll probably look towards the [Sept. 12] G2 Park S. at Doncaster."

Richard Pankhurst has not been seen since displaying Classic potential when winning the Listed Chesham S. over this trip at Royal Ascot last June, but is another who will not find these conditions ideal. "He has been off the track for a long time, but he has been doing well at home," jockey Robert Havlin said. "He probably wouldn't want too much rain, but he is up for a big run. He will obviously come on for it, though." One who will appreciate the dig in the ground is last year's G2 Challenge S. scorer **Here Comes When (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}), last seen finishing fourth in the G1 Sussex S. at Goodwood July 29. Trainer Andrew Balding commented, "Here Comes When came out of Goodwood in good form. It was a good run in the Sussex S. last time over the mile. I think he is just as effective over a mile or seven furlongs, but he is a Group 2 winner over seven and hopefully he will have every chance."

Ballydoyle could be represented by a pair of fillies with Aidan O'Brien mentioning **Outstanding (Ire)**, a full-sister to GI Breeders' Cup Turf winner **Magician (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) and third in the GI Belmont Oaks as 'a probable' for the Yorkshire Oaks, while recent stakes winner **Easter (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) could also be in the mix.

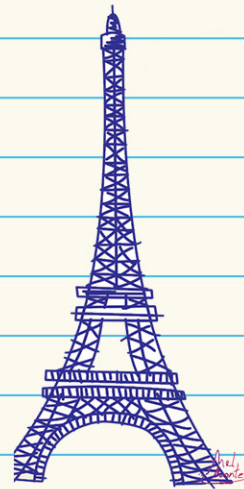

F-T NEW YORK SALE OPENS SATURDAY

by *Jessica Martini*

Fasig-Tipton will look to follow up on a power-packed renewal of its Saratoga Selected Yearlings Sale when the company's two-day New York-Bred Yearlings Sale begins Saturday evening at 7 p.m. in the Humphrey S. Finney Pavilion. A total of 283 yearlings have been catalogued for the auction, which comes on the heels of a select sale which produced across-the-board gains and a gross up 40% from a year ago.

During a busy day of showing horses Friday, consignors were upbeat ahead of the New York sale.

"If it's anything like the sale we just had, hopefully it will be really, really good," said Select Sales' Carrie Brogden. "Obviously, it's a completely different set of buyers. We are seeing so many more trainers and end-users. The select sale is a very big end-user sale, too, but these are people trying to buy racehorses to try to break even and have a little fun, go through their conditions. It's a very different feel to the sale than the big sale, where everyone wants to win the Derby. Here, people would be thrilled to win a nice maiden special weight and maybe a New York Stallion stakes race."

With the advent of slots-infused purses, the New York sale has been growing in popularity each year. Last year's auction saw a total of 176 yearlings sell for \$14,099,000. The average of \$80,108 was up 10.5% from 2013, while the median--\$65,000--was up 18.2% from the previous year.

"It's hard not to be optimistic if you have the right horses," said Denali Stud's Craig Bandoroff. "There is not going to be somebody for every horse--there never is, but [New York] purses are so good, the good horses are going to do really well."

He continued, "Purses are the engine that pulls the train. The purses here are good and the breeders awards are good, so that makes people more aggressive on the reserves and that helps the horses sell better, too."

Brogden agreed.

"People know if you buy a \$100,000 horse, if you go through two conditions, you've paid for him basically," she said.

Both the New York purse levels and the activity in the barn area Friday had Kitty Taylor of Warrendale Sales optimistic ahead of Saturday's first session of the auction.

"New York-breds are running for a lot of money and I think there is a high level of interest and it should be a good sale," Taylor said. "It is a new group of buyers, but I believe the energy from the last sale will carry over. People have money to spend and, for the right horses, they'll spend it."

Eight yearlings topped the \$200,000 mark at last year's New York sale, led by a filly by Lookin at Lucky who sold to Mandy Pope's Whisper Hill Farm for \$270,000. Recent graduates of the sale include this year's Gill Holy Bull S. winner Upstart (Flatter); in fact, the very first horse through the ring, hip 301, is closely related to that runner; as well as graded stakes winner Startup Nation (Temple City) and Eclipse champion Dayatthespa (City Zip).

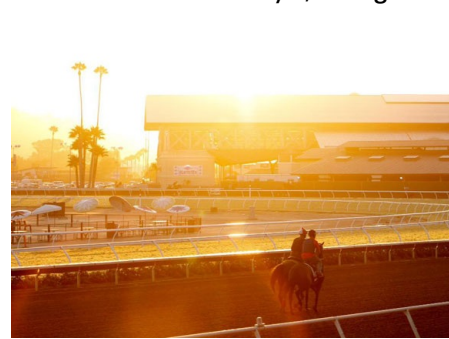
After its opening session Saturday, the sale continues Sunday with a final session beginning at 7 p.m.

BARRETTS ROLLS DICE WITH AUGUST SALE

It's August in Southern California. The weather is good, the racing is better, and officials at Barretts are looking forward to their inaugural August Select Yearling Sale set for Saturday evening following the live racing program at Del Mar.

"We have a beautiful venue here at Del Mar, it's covered and cool, and we see this as a tremendous opportunity to have a select sale during the race meet," commented Kim Lloyd, the general manager of Barretts.

"Our real thrust is to try and get new people involved. We had lots of people show up [Friday] to have a look at the horses, it's been very strong and we expect a lot of participation."

The vast majority of the 76 youngsters catalogued were bred in California, and

given the current structure in the state, Lloyd sees this as a real selling point.

"The Cal-bred program is very strong right now," he said. "There is a lot of money out there for California-breds, with the Golden State series, for both colts and fillies, and all the Cal-breds in this sale remain eligible for that series, as well as the Barretts Juvenile S. and Barretts Debutante S."

But these are not your everyday Cal-breds. In additions to established local sires such as Unusual Heat, Tribal Rule, Lucky Pulpit--sire of California Chrome--and a handful of offerings from the first crop of six-time Grade I winner and 2011 Eclipse Award-winning older horse Acclamation (Unusual Heat), there are several Kentucky-sired Cal-breds by stallions such as Harlan's Holiday Midnight Lute, Warrior's Reward, First Samurai, Creative Cause, Kitten's Joy, Shackelford and Majesticperfection. The latter is the sire of hip [24](#), an H & E Ranch-consigned son of Princess Deelites (Afternoon Deelites), who counts the outstanding Avenue of Flags full-siblings California Flag and Cambiocorsa amongst his female family members. There are additionally horses bred in other states by sires like Bernardini, Colonel John, Hansen, Into Mischief, Lookin at Lucky, Munnings, Quality Road and Tapizar.

"Those Kentucky sired Cal-breds have been very popular at our sales," Lloyd reported. "A lot of people are buying mares and bringing them to this state, foaling them out and breeding them back in California. It is definitely an attempt to upgrade the stock in California and we're certainly hoping for the best."
