PIZZA MAN TOPS HOME TEAM SWEEP

Facing some higher-profile North American-based runners and a five-strong European contingent, local hope **The Pizza Man** (English Channel) rewarded his connections' confidence to become the first-ever Illinois-bred to win the GI Arlington Million while stamping his ticket to the GI Breeders' Cup Turf later in the year. Cross-entered in the GIII American St. Leger earlier on the card, the last-out GIII Stars and Stripes S. winner was backed down to 5-1 from a 10-1 morning line and split the field in the early going as **Shining Copper** (Aragorn {Ire}), a rabbit for co-favored **Big Blue Kitten** (Kitten's Joy), did his job up front. Guided out

into the clear along the home turn, the fan favorite was met with an audible roar from the crowd when track announcer John Dooley said his name. He seemed to find another gear at that point, and started to chip away at the pacesetter's advantage. **Up With**

the Birds (Stormy Atlantic) snuck up the rail inside of that rival, and Big Blue Kitten came flying outside of The Pizza Man, but The Pizza Man gobbled up ground under left-handed encouragement from Florent Geroux to deliver the popular victory by a neck over Big Blue Kitten. Shining Copper managed to hold third over Up With the Birds.

"I always have confidence when I ride him," said Florent Geroux, who also pilots last year's champion sprinter Work All Week (City Zip) for Richard and Karen Papiese's Midwest Thoroughbreds and trainer Roger Brueggemann. "He knows where the wire is and he knows how to win. But I had no horse the whole way. It looked like he was struggling a little bit over the very soft track, but when I took him outside, he's all heart... he grabbed the bit again and I was like, 'Oh boy, he's going for a big one here.'" Of his popularity, Geroux added, "He's a local horse. Even going to the track, we had a lot of people cheering for us... He's just a very special horse who loves to win. There aren't many like this, but we have two in the stable with this guy and Work All Week. I'd like to give credit to trainer Roger Brueggemann, because these are two very different horses. We have The Pizza Man who's going very long on the turf, and we have the fastest sprinter in the country too." **Cont. p3**

SON OF SHAMARDAL LEADS ARQANA OPENER

Lot 89 boasted all the credentials of a sale-topper and the strapping bay--by Shamardal out of a half-sister to last year's champion first-season sire Lope De Vega (Ire) (Shamardal)--made it worth the wait until late in the opening session of the Arqana August Yearling Sale for vendor Ballylinch Stud when fetching a session-topping €720,000 from Sheikh Mohammed's bloodstock advisor John Ferguson.

The Arqana sales ring was lined with spectators standing six deep just ahead of the 5 p.m. curtain-up of the company's flagship yearling sale Saturday, and while expectations were high, figures fell short of last year's red-hot trade on the corresponding day. Sixty-two of the 81 lots offered exchanged hands for an aggregate of €11,792,000--a dip of 27%--and clearance rate of 77%, which was down five points on 2014. The average price of €190,194 dropped by 25%, while the median was also down, to €155,000 from €170,000 (-8.8%). A notable buyback and would-be session topper was **lot 39**, a Sea the Stars (Ire)--Dance Secretary (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) filly from the Haras de la Rebourriere et de Montaignu consignment who was led out unsold at €750,000. **Cont. p16**

S. at Arlington, but drifted to her right approaching the wire, impeding the on-rushing Stephanie's Kitten (Kitten's Joy). The latter's stablemate, Watsdachances (Ire) (Diamond Green {Fr}), was able to drop her head on the wire just ahead of Stephanie's Kitten and was awarded the victory when stewards ruled that Secret Gesture's actions in deep stretch cost the Ramsey runner a position. With the win, Watsdachances earns a trip to the BC Filly/Mare Turf.

Galileo Colt Leaves 'Em Reeling

Sent off the 12-5 second favorite in Saturday's GI Secretariat S., Highland Reel (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) was given a positive ride by Seamie Heffernan, pinched a winning margin on the turn and cruised home the 5 1/4-length winner to give his perennial leading sire his third winner of the race in five years and second in succession (Treasure Beach {Ire}, 2011; Adelaide {Ire}, 2014). Closing Bell (Tapit) came from the back of the back to give WinStar Farm and trainer Bill Mott a second straight runner-up effort in the event, while favored Force the Pass (Speightstown) went in the air at the break and ran on to finish a creditable third.

The Niarchos homebred was meant to have his first run of the year in the G1 Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot, but was forced to miss that event and kicks off the season here. Richard Hannon will saddle the half-brothers Toormore (Ire) (Arakan) and Estidkhaar (Ire) (Dark Angel {Ire}), while Godolphin's Territories (Ire) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) also rates a look.

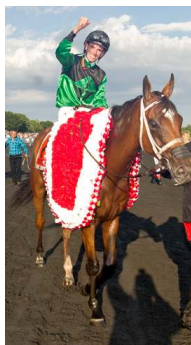

The Pizza Man sported a 12-9-1-1 record over the Arlington Park turf course, and reeled off three-straight wins here to kick off his 5-year-old campaign, including scores in last year's running of the Stars and Stripes and in the then-ungraded American St. Leger 12 months ago. He was fifth and sixth, respectively, when trying deeper waters in Woodbine's GI Northern Dancer S. in September and GI Canadian International in October, but was a close third behind 2015 GISW Finnegan's Wake (Powerscourt {GB}) in the GII Hollywood Turf Cup at Del Mar Nov. 27. He resurfaced to take Churchill's Opening Verse S., and successfully defended his Stars and Stripes title July 11 by a neck over St. Leger fourth Roman Approval (Roman Ruler).

“It’s very emotional,” admitted the soft-spoken Roger Brueggemann. “He deserved to be here.”

Of whether or not he might be seen at Keeneland for the BC Turf Oct. 31, Richard Papiese quipped, “It’s possible. First we have to read the paper and see if we belong there.”

Richard Papiese owns and operates Midwest Store Fixtures, a major provider of custom-made retail merchandising displays. Midwest Thoroughbreds has led all owners by wins in every year since 2010, and currently stands atop the leaderboard for this year. Papiese claimed The Pizza Man’s dam for \$18,000 at Arlington in 2005. Winless in two more starts for him, The Pizza Man is her third and final foal to race.

When Jamie Spencer announced that he was unretiring last August, preferencing race riding to a 'desk job,' it was moments like these he had in mind. Carrying the colors of Sheikh Fahad al Thani's Qatar Racing, the 35-year-old shoved Secret Gesture--a close fifth behind the Chad Brown-trained Dayatthespa (City Zip) in last year's GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf--past defending champion Euro Charline (GB) (Myboycharlie {Ire}) and looked home free. **Cont. p5**

Stephanie's Kitten emerged from the backfield and was gaining inches, but was steadied sharply behind Secret Gesture, so much so that Watsdachances was able to dive home second. Following a lengthy deliberation, stewards decided to take down Spencer's number, the jockey's second Festival DQ after guiding Powerscourt (GB) (Sadler's Wells) to an apparent victory in the 2004 Million. It was the second time in the history of the race that a winner was involved in a disqualification (Let's Elope {NZ} demoted from first to third in 1993).

A maiden winner in a pair of Irish starts for Ger Lyons, Watsdachances won the GIII Miss Grillo S. and was runner-up to Flotilla (Fr) (Mizzen Mast) in the 2012 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf, and capped a sometimes-frustrating 3-year-old campaign with a stakes success at Aqueduct. Runner-up in the 2014 GIII Gallorette H. and third in the GIII Matchmaker S., the bay was fourth in the 11-furlong GIII Glens Falls S. in August and filled the same spot behind Stephanie's Kitten in the GI Flower Bowl Invitational S. in late September before calling it a year. She had just two runs under her belt this term, a one-length score in the Gallorette May 16 and a near-miss second last time in the GII Dance Smartly S. at Woodbine July 5.

Euro Charline caught a flyer out of the gate and led clear under the wire for the first time as Secret Gesture showed speed from her high draw to do the chasing. Carla Bianca (Ire) (Dansili {GB}), front-running winner of the G3 Meld S. last time out, landed in third, while stablemates Stephanie's Kitten and Watsdachances settled in the second half of the field. Euro Charline remained the boss as they raced into the final 5 1/2 furlongs and there was little change in the plot

entering the final turn. Asked to come after the pacesetter following three-quarters of a mile in 1:13.04 over the increasingly rain-affected ground, Secret Gesture finally claimed that one with a little less than a furlong to run, but soon had Stephanie's Kitten to deal with. With his mount lugging in once in front, Spencer went to a left-handed stick and Secret Gesture began edging to her right. Well aware, Spencer switched his whip to his right hand, but the damage had been done. Watsdachances, ground-saving throughout, gained at the fence in upper stretch and, while never winning, got her head down ahead of Stephanie's Kitten, an ultimately decisive move. **Cont. p6**

GI Breeders’ Cup Filly & Mare Turf winner and Eclipse Award winner Dayatthespa (City Zip). “She was giving it her all there in the late stages and I’m just thrilled.”

With a ticket in hand for the Filly & Mare Turf--to be run at the Beverly D. distance at Keeneland Oct. 30--Bradley said the decision of just how to get there will be left up to his trainer.

“Chad [Brown] will make that decision,” he said. “Do you go to Keeneland for a race like the [\$400,000 GI] First Lady S. [Oct. 3] to get a race

over the track? She likes Belmont, so we could go there as well.”

Like Dayatthespa, who was sold to Stonestreet Thoroughbred Holdings for \$2.1 million at Fasig-Tipton last November, Bradley indicated that Watsdachances would in all likelihood be offered at public auction this fall.

Aidan O'Brien already boasted a record three wins in this event, and added to that tally with the super-impressive and aggressively ridden Highland Reel, the third winner since 2011 in this race for these connections sired by Coolmore Ireland resident Galileo (Ire) (Sadler's Wells).

A winner of Goodwood's G2 Vintage S. in his final juvenile appearance last July, the bay returned off the bench to finish sixth in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains at Longchamp May 10, and improved to second three weeks

later in the G1 Prix du Jockey Club at Chantilly. He could only manage fifth in the G1 Irish Derby June 27, but ended his winless drought last time in the 1 1/2-mile G3 Gordon S. back at Goodwood July 29.

Having never shown much speed across the Atlantic, Highland Reel was sent straight out to the front, and found himself all alone after race favorite and expected pace player Force the Pass broke in the air and was relegated to last. **Cont. p6**

Seemingly washed out from the humid Chicago weather, the invader posted splits of :24.53, :50.09 and 1:14.72. Given his cue to quicken at the head of the lane, he shut the door on his competition in a matter of strides to win as he pleased. Closing Bell and Force the Pass, fourth and first, respectively, in the GI Belmont Derby Invitational S. last time, both closed well to fill out the major placings.

"I didn't see much pace and he won easy," offered winning pilot Seamie Heffernan. T. J. Comerford, assistant to O'Brien, added, "Nobody seemed to want to make [the pace], and if they don't want to make it, Aidan has no problem making it. There's no point in turning it into a crawl either." As for what might be next for the 3-year-old, Comerford said, "That's Aidan's call. Aidan likes the horse and there are plenty of races for him."

The winner's second dam was Australian Group 1 winner Circles of Gold, who produced Elvstroem (Aus) (Danehill), winner of the G1 Dubai Duty Free and four Australian Group 1s; and Australian and English champion Haradasun (Aus) (Fusaichi Pegasus), who took the 2008 G1 Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot for O'Brien.

Sharla Rae, splitting the field when seventh at 33-1 behind the brilliant Lady Eli (Dvine Park) in the GI Belmont Oaks Invitational July 4, returned to California to post a career high here. Sitting a perfect trip while saving ground in third through a half mile in :46.63, Sharla Rae was angled out for her run at the top of the lane and fought past a very game Her Emynency for a narrow score.

"I just loved it [the way the race developed]," trainer Doug O'Neill said. "It was like we had a walkie-talkie to [jockey] James [Graham]. He was in a perfect spot and this filly has been training great. Last time she ran in New York, Joel Rosario called me after the race and said, 'If I knew this filly, she would have won.' He was afraid to use her early because he was afraid she'd run off. James put her in the race and she still shut it off and conserved herself."

He continued, "What a ride by James Graham. It was a matter of me getting it right. I had her on turf, dirt, synthetic and all over the place, but this is obviously where she wants to be. She's a quality turf filly."

A debut winner sprinting at Los Alamitos last July, she added the Barretts Debutante S. at third asking in September and Golden Gate's Pike Place Dancer S. a month later. Sharla Rae was given a freshening after finishing a distant ninth in the GIII Delta Downs Princess S. in late November. She got the money in Golden Gate's California Oaks in her second attempt this term Feb. 7, then was a respectable third in the GIII Bourbonette Oaks at Turfway Mar. 21. She outran her 48-1 odds with a good second at the Del Mar Oaks distance in the grassy GII Honeymoon S. at Santa Anita May 3, her final start for W C Racing. With O'Neill continuing to train for this new partnership group, she was fifth in the GI American Oaks May 30 before her aforementioned unplaced effort in New York.

Sharla Rae's dam [Jinny's Gold \(Gold Fever\)](#), second in the 2004 GIII Valley View S. at Keeneland, was bred to Uncle Mo after producing a [Majestic Warrior](#) colt in 2013.

After missing by just a neck in last year's renewal, Grand Arch held off a desperate late surge from Ironicus to win this year's GII Fourstardave H. by an equally narrow margin. Away alertly, the bay settled in a tracking third on the rail as King Kreesa (King Cugat) clocked early splits of :24.20 and :48.30 on the front end. Looming dangerously in second turning for home, the 6-year-old entered into a brief battle with King Kreesa in the stretch, took control in the final furlong and held off the fast-closing Ironicus for a narrow decision. "He's a horse that we've sort of campaigned toward this time of year," winning trainer Brian Lynch said. "He usually gets good and we were hoping he was going to bring his 'A' game today. We felt like he needed his last race there at Belmont but he certainly ran big in this race last year and he got the job done today." Winner of last term's GII King Edward S. at Woodbine prior to his runner-up effort in this event, Grand Arch finished fifth in the GI Woodbine Mile last September and was second to two-time Horse of the Year Wise Dan (Wiseman's Ferry) in the GI Shadwell Turf Mile Oct. 4. Closing out the season with a non-factor 11th in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile Nov. 1, the bay made his seasonal bow a winning one in a grassy Keeneland allowance Apr. 15. Sixth in the GI Turf Classic at Churchill Downs May 2, the gelding was fifth to the reopposing King Kreesa after a wide trip last time in Belmont's Forbidden Apple S. July 11.

“She had a great post today, Jose [Ortiz] gave her a great ride, and I think she beat a very good filly,” said Asmussen, who won this race in 2011 with eventual champion My Miss Aurelia (Smart Strike). “It’s extremely satisfying--the Winchells, what they mean to my family and their breeding program. We trained this filly’s mother for the Winchells, as well... This is a very good filly and another graded stakes winner for the incredible sire Tapit.”

Winchell Thoroughbreds purchased the winner’s dam for \$280,000 at the 2009 Fasig-Tipton July sale, and she went three-for-five for Asmussen, capping her career with a 5 1/4-length victory in the Tiffany Lass S. at Fair Grounds in February of 2011. Her first foal was the winning colt Tapit Wicked (Tapit), and Just Wicked was her second foal. She has a yearling colt by Tapizar (Tapit), produced a filly by Tapit earlier this year and was bred back to Gainesway’s super sire once again.

Under an always-confident ride from Andrasch Starke, Lucky Speed powered home authoritatively to run down fellow European invader Panama Hat in this marathon affair. A winner of the G1 Deutsches Derby in 2013, Lucky Speed failed to win in four tries last season, including a third in the G1 Grosser Preis von Berlin in August and a ninth against a salty field in the G1 Grosser Preis von Baden in September. On the sidelines thereafter, he ran on for fourth in Woodbine’s GII Nijinsky S. July 19 over a nine-panel trip that always figured to be sharper than the stoutly bred bay’s best

distance. With just a slow four-panel leg-stretcher on the Etobicoke Polytrack Aug. 9 on display in the interim, Lucky Speed saved all the ground from midpack here behind an honest pace for the distance. Still appearing loaded for bear as the field bunched up on the home bend, the 5-year-old was deftly maneuvered off the inside before returning to draft behind the leaders for a bit longer. Panama Hat got first run, but Starke finally let Lucky Speed loose and he responded with a winning move. “We knew he needed more distance and that’s what he got today in the American St. Leger, he can handle the American track very well,” Starke said. “I am so happy this is my first win in the United States and to win the St. Leger is amazing. It was the right conditions to bring him over here and I’m very happy.”

Academic, an upset winner of the Woodbine Oaks in June, added another feather to her cap by beating the boys in the 86th renewal of the GIII Canadian Derby. The filly showed steady improvement in three starts as a juvenile and broke her maiden in her sophomore debut over the all-weather surface at Woodbine May 15. But it was her wire-to-wire 66-1 upset of the June 14 Oaks that put her on the radar of the racing community. She faced males for the first time in the 10-furlong Queen's Plate at Woodbine July 5, flashing brief speed before retreating to finish last of 13 in the distant wake of Shaman Ghost (Ghostzapper). Trained by Reade Baker for Bear Stables up to that point, a share of the 3-year-old's ownership was sold to Riversridge Racing and training duties were transferred to Tim Rycroft for this trip to Edmonton. Flashing her characteristic speed from the inside post, the bay took back to cede the early advantage to Blue Dancer (Bluegrass Cat) as that rival doled out fractions of :47.66 and 1:12.66. The pair spurted clear from the rest of the field passing the grandstand with a lap to go and Academic was asked to pick up the chase on the backstretch. Poking her head in front on the far turn, she powered clear to a decisive triumph.

Dismissed in this first start for locally based Patti Miller, Mizz Money conceded the early lead to hard-to-settle Unbridled Courage (Leroidesanimaux {Brz}), and took over when that rival backed out of it midway on the home bend. She gamely fended off Prado's Sweet Ride in midstretch, and found the line with room to spare over fast-charging Return to Grace.

Twin Creeks Racing Stables’s **Saratoga Mischief** (Into Mischief) looks to provide Todd Pletcher, who owns 11 Saratoga training titles, with just his second victory in the GII Saratoga Special S. Sunday. The \$360,000 FTSAUG purchase graduated by a neck going just one-panel shorter in his unveiling here July 25, and gets the morning-line nod in this

step up. "We thought he had trained well," Pletcher said. "We weren't sure that he would go over there and win first time out. He was somewhat inconsistent in the mornings, but we had had some inconsistencies on the track surface the first part of the meet. He seems pretty focused out

of the race. It was a pretty straightforward race. To his credit he put himself in a good position." Live Oak Plantation homebred **Holding Gold** (Lonhro {Aus}) enters off a debut victory on the synthetic at Woodbine July 19. The Mark Casse pupil breezed a best-of-30 half-mile in :47 1/5 over this strip Aug. 7. Following an impressive victory with Texas Red (Afleet Alex) in the GII Jim Dandy S. here Aug. 1, trainer Keith Desormeaux sends out Big Chief Racing’s **Exaggerator** (Curlin) in this test. A non-factor fifth on debut at Santa Anita June 5, the dark bay got up just in time for a nose victory at Del Mar July 25. "In his first start, he ran a little green, got dirt in his face at Santa Anita and didn't like it, and sort of veered around but made a really nice move at the end and closed really well," said Desormeaux's assistant Julie Clark. "Then he won his next out there. They're really happy with him. They really like him." Also making his third start here is Holy Cow Stable's **John Q. Public** (Proud Citizen), trained by Hall of Famer D. Wayne Lukas. A first-out winner at Ellis Park July 5, the dark bay finished 10th after hitting the gate and being bumped in the GIII Sanford S. July 25, and receives Lasix for the first time here. AWC Stables and Harold Lerner's **Mid Life Crisis** (Congrats) wired the field in his Delaware unveiling July 20, and looks to go two-for-two for trainer Graham Motion. Terry Hamilton's **Hammers Vision** (Court Vision) tries dirt for the first time here for trainer Brian Lynch after capturing his career bow on the grass at Belmont July 19.

A second-out graduate on the synthetic here Apr. 18, the chestnut missed by just a head to **Field of Courage** (Marchfield) when trying two turns for the first time here May 10. Seventh when attempting similar conditions over the main track here June 6, he was fifth in the Queen's Plate S. July 5 prior to his win in the Prince of Wales at Fort Erie July 28, and tries turf for the first time here. John Oxley's Field of Courage is one of two entrants from the Mark Casse barn. Graduating at second asking on the main track here Sept. 21, the dark bay followed suit with a pair of wins on the synthetic here Apr. 25 and May 10, respectively. Fifth in the Plate Trial S. over this strip June 14, he was third last time in the Prince of Wales. Winner of last term's Swynford S., stablemate **Conquest Boogaloo** (Scat Daddy) was third in the Plate Trial and the Queen's Plate, and was fifth last time in the Prince of Wales. Charles Fipke homebred **Danish Dynaformer** (Dynaformer) finished third in the GIII Marine S. here May 16 and won the Plate Trial next out. The Roger Attfield trainee was second in the Queen's Plate and a non-factor sixth last time in the Prince of Wales. Another contender who could make some noise here is Augustin Stable's **Lucky Lindy** (Harlan's Holiday), trained by Mark Frostad. The bay earned his diploma in his second start in an off-the-turfer here June 5 and missed by just a nose in a grassy allowance at this venue July 5. The bay finished second when last seen in the Toronto Cup over this turf course July 26.

TRAVERS CONTENDERS POST WORKS

A trio of runners pointing to Aug. 29 GI Travers S. continued their preparations for that centerpiece of the Saratoga meet with workouts Saturday morning at the Spa. **Texas Red** (Afleet Alex), 2014 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile hero and recent winner of the GII Jim Dandy S. Aug. 1, breezed five furlongs in 1:01.66 in his second-to-last workout prior to the race.

"We were happy with that," said Julie Clark, assistant trainer to Keith Desormeaux. "Corey said he gallops out strong. He's not tough to pull up but he's ready to keep going a little bit further. It was nice."

Meanwhile, Ralph M. Evans

and WinStar Farm's MGSW **Upstart** (Flatter) covered six furlongs over the main track in 1:14.84. It was the dark bay's first move since a third-place effort behind Triple Crown winner American Pharoah (Pioneerof the Nile) in the GI William Hill Haskell Invitational at Monmouth Aug. 2. Upstart's trainer, Rick Violette Jr., was pleased with the workout, but said he will hold off on a decision about the Travers until the field takes shape.

"We'll point for the Travers," explained Violette. "I doubt that [we'd want to] hook American Pharoah, and if he doesn't come then we'll be ready to roll. He went terrific. It was a little bit of a combination of maintenance and to get some air in his lungs. He went the last quarter in 23 [seconds] and change. It was a great breeze, and he cooled out well."

The trainer added that the Haskell was likely a useful stepping stone for an improved performance in Upstart's next outing.

"He's really had kind of an easy couple weeks to let him recharge, especially the first week," Violette noted. "The second week he got back to regular gallops. The Haskell was a good race and he bounced [out] of that, and now we get back into serious mode. He'll have a fast breeze maybe Saturday or Sunday, depending on the weather. He likes to run off his fast breezes."

Donegal Racing's **Keen Ice** (Curlin), recently second in the Haskell, returned to the worktab for the first time since that race with a five-furlong move in 1:01.25 in company with stablemate Lulu Le Mon (Lemon Drop Kid). Javier Castellano was aboard Keen Ice for the first time.

"[Javier] said he felt like a classic distance horse. He went smooth and did everything right," said trainer Dale Romans. "He worked super. If you don't know the horse, he's never going to blow you away watching him breeze because he's a big freight train, but that's as good as he works. The big thing is he comes back off the racetrack prancing and happy and wanting more."

Romans also said he has not made a final decision on the Travers, but added that it will not be dictated by American Pharoah's plans.

STRONG START TO F-T NYB SALE

The Fasig-Tipton New York-bred Preferred Yearlings Sale, following just days after an impressive renewal of the company's Select sale, got off to a strong start at the Humphrey S. Finney Pavilion in Saratoga Saturday night. A total of 88 yearlings grossed \$7,126,500 during the session, compared to 92 yearlings selling for \$6,934,000 during last year's opening session. The average of \$80,983 was up 7.4% from 2014, while the median dipped 15% to \$51,000. With 128 yearlings offered, 40 were reported not sold for a buy-back rate of 31%. It was 36.1% last year.


"It was another good horse sale this evening," said Fasig-Tipton President Boyd Browning. "It's always nice to see the average up, the gross up and the buy-back rate down. There was a little slippage in the median, but it's hard to compare the median from one night to another."

The top price at last year's auction--\$270,000--was bettered three times during Saturday's session, with Vivien Malloy and Lady Sheila Stable teaming up to buy a filly by Tiznow ([hip 416](#)) for top price of \$350,000. In all, eight yearlings sold for \$200,000 or more during the session, equaling the two-day total of a year ago.

"There was a very solid marketplace," Browning continued. "There was very, very competitive bidding, especially for those offerings who were perceived to have good conformation and pedigree and vetted well. The horses that didn't tick the boxes--there is still selectivity in the marketplace. There is not a buyer for every horse unless every horse is of sufficient quality. But all in all, it was a very solid sale, a very good start to the New York-bred sale. It's remarkable when you consider the growth and the progress that has been achieved in this marketplace over the last five years. It was a great start and we hope to follow it up with a strong finish tomorrow.'

Sunday's final session of the two-day auction gets underway at 7 p.m.

Malloy Teams Up on Tiznow Filly...

New York stalwart Vivien Malloy teamed up with Sheila Rosenblum's Lady Sheila Stable to take home the top lot at Saturday's opening session of the Fasig-Tipton New York-bred Preferred Yearlings sale, going to \$350,000 for a daughter of Tiznow. Out of Grade I winner Acey Deucey (Abaginone), [hip 416](#) is a half-sister to multiple stakes winner Preachintothedevil (Pulpit). Consigned by Summerfield, the yearling was bred by Stone Bridge Farm.

"She was a beautiful filly from a wonderful family," said Malloy, who bid alongside bloodstock agent Mike McMahon. "She is probably a two-turn filly. And she's a New York-bred. So everything was good."

Linda Rice will train the yearling. "Lady Sheila is going to be a 50% owner of the horse," McMahon explained. "Linda Rice and I bought her together. We picked her out and worked on the whole thing together. And the two ladies let us buy the sale topper."

Malloy, who owns Edition Farm in Hyde Park, NY, admitted she was already looking ahead to the yearling joining her broodmare band down the line.

"We were pricing empty, not even bred, and she would be worth a lot," Malloy said.

Malloy acknowledged competition for New York-breds has gotten fierce, but she hopes to take advantage of that during Sunday's second session of the auction.

"I remember a trainer of mine said, 'You better step up, Vivien, because they are really getting good,'" Malloy recalled. "I am selling Sunday, so I hope I am as lucky as somebody else was tonight."

Seidman Steps Up...

Maggie Seidman, sitting alongside bloodstock agent Mike McMahon, went to \$300,000 to secure a filly from the first crop of multiple Grade I winner To Honor and Serve (Bernardini) during Saturday's opening session of the Fasig-Tipton New York-bred sale.

"She was our top pick for a filly in that price range," McMahon explained. "So we are very excited about it. Mrs. Seidman has made a real big commitment. She has been in the business for a very long time, but she has decided to play with the big boys now and she is definitely capable of doing that."

[Hip 380](#), consigned by David Reid's Preferred Equine, is out of stakes winner Tale of a Dream (Tale of the Cat) and is a half to stakes-placed Dynamic Barbie (Roman Ruler). She was purchased for \$47,000 at this year's Keeneland January sale.

McMahon admitted the bay filly's young sire was a major attraction.

"We've really liked what we've seen of the To Honor and Serves," he said. "We did a couple of seasons with him with Gainesway and we were very happy with the foals. He was a sire prospect that we really thought was a top three in his crop. We wanted to buy one, so we picked out one that we really liked."

Asked what he liked about the yearling, McMahon smiled, "Everything. You don't buy a horse like that and not like everything. I really wish Mark Casse hadn't been so interested in her too because he cost us a lot of money. But good horses bring competition out."

Seidman, who has horses with trainer Carlos Martin, campaigned stakes-placed J J Julep.

Highwater Mark for Reid...

The sale of the To Honor and Serve filly marked the biggest Thoroughbred success for David Reid's Preferred Equine. Reid, a leading standardbred consignor for the better part of three decades, was making his third appearance at the Fasig-Tipton New York-bred sale Saturday.

"We are very happy with the price, but I'm also very happy with the connections who got her," Reid commented. "I was really happy with the activity since she came to the sale. As the saying goes, she ticked all the right boxes. She is just a lovely filly from the time she got to the grounds--actually she's been a lovely filly since birth. Her attitude was just terrific through the whole process. Coming into the ring, I was really confident. I thought she stood out. She didn't have one bad show the whole time here."

Reid, who is a partner in Ice Wine Stable which campaigned Group 1 winner No Nay Never, sold two yearlings at the 2013 New York sale and brought four yearlings to the 2014 sale.

"This is our biggest sale result in Thoroughbreds," he confirmed. "We are growing slowly, but I have to give a shout-out to Fasig-Tipton and their team. They do a great job and, being in the sales business for 30 years myself, I really appreciate the job they do--it's first class all the way.

Reid restricts his Thoroughbred consignments to the New York-bred sale, explaining, "It's a timing thing, really. I'll sell 500 yearlings this fall for Standardbred sales. But I am really a deep believer that there is an opportunity for people to do both breeds. I don't want to say that I am proof of that, but I think it is doable. It is definitely a different game from the breed, but as far as operation and racing, it's all the same lingo, it's all the same connections with auctioneers and bid spotters. Operationally it's the same, but it's just a different breed and a different clientele."

Flatter Colt Causes Early Fireworks...

A colt by Flatter kicked off early fireworks during Saturday's Fasig-Tipton New York sale when bringing a final bid of \$290,000. Seth Klarman of Klaravich Stables signed the ticket on the dark bay yearling as LRK Stable, but declined to comment on the purchase.

[Hip 333](#), consigned by Winter Quarter Farm on behalf of breeder Oak Bluff Stables, is out of stakes winner River Nore (Archers Bay).

"We knew he was quite nice obviously," Winter Quarter's Ferran Robinson said. "He was one of those that you don't quite know what you have until you're here on the grounds and realize that you have a man among boys. We felt pretty good that we would get around \$200,000 and we are thrilled with \$290,000. He's just a fantastic colt. He's a particularly good specimen for this sale in particular. I was really impressed with his mind the whole time. I thought he handled himself well. He showed well every time. He never got tired and by the end you felt really good with what you have. And we felt really confident going in the ring."

Winter Quarter had success with another son of Flatter Saturday night when LRK Stable purchased [hip 345](#) for \$150,000. Bred by Waterville Lake Stables, the dark bay is out of stakes-placed Santa Croce (Saint Ballado).

Ryan Strikes for New Owner...

Bloodstock agent Mike Ryan purchased [hip 351](#), a daughter of Lookin at Lucky, for \$255,000 Saturday at Fasig-Tipton. Ryan was bidding on behalf of a new client, who asked not to be identified.

"He's a young guy who has never owned a horse before," Ryan explained of the Florida owner. "I took him around and showed him some of the better ones and this filly was in our top three tonight. There are a couple of really nice ones coming up later and I told him we have to swing hard for this one." **Cont. p15**

Of his new client, Ryan added, "He's brand new and would rather keep it confidential. He's a young guy and he wants to get in the game. I told him, it's a five-year program. If you want to do it right, you can't just come in one year--you have to give it a chance to grow. His wife grew up in Saratoga and they've been coming to the races for years and he said he wanted a nice New York-bred. He wanted some action."

Bred by Dennis and Deborah Petrisak, the yearling is out of multiple stakes winner Shesastonecoldfox (Foxhound) and is a half to multiple stakes winner Fox Rules (Roman Ruler) and to stakes winner Fox Rox (Officer). She was consigned by Thomas J. Gallo III Sales Agency.

"She was a well-grown, very, very solid filly," said Ryan. "She's a beautiful-looking filly. But her frame of mind was unbelievable. The good ones have class factor and she had that."

Another Hard Spun for Centennial...

Centennial Farms, which campaigns Grade I winner Wicked Strong (Hard Spun), acquired another son of the same stallion when going to \$200,000 for [hip 338](#). Consigned by Bluewater Sales, the yearling is out of Ruly (A.P. Indy), a half-sister to multiple Grade I winner Questing (GB) (Hard Spun).

"Of course we liked him being by Hard Spun," Centennial President Don Little smiled when asked about the yearling's appeal. "He is sort of unique in this sale--he has more of a Kentucky-type pedigree. And you know the cross works because of Questing under the second dam. He fits the mold of what we're trying to do. He has a Classic-type pedigree. He's a big, strong individual. He looks like he can get a Classic distance."

Little, who said he got shut out of the Saratoga Select sale earlier in the week, was making his first shopping foray at the New York sale.

"We're here in Saratoga, so it doesn't hurt to look," Little explained. "The select sale was very, very strong--we bid on three that we didn't get. We weren't really expecting to find anything at this sale, but we were lucky to find him and get him for the price that we paid for him. I think the type of horse that we're looking for, in [Keeneland] September--if we're looking to buy five horses--it's going to be a little bit difficult to get five because I think that price point will have to come up 10% or 15% to get that type of horse."

'Ben' Colt Part of Busy Night for McMahon...

Mike McMahon had a busy night during Saturday's session of the Fasig-Tipton New York-bred sale, facilitating in the purchase of the evening's top two lots. A little more under the radar, McMahon enjoyed an impressive pinhooking score when [hip 362](#), a son of Here Comes Ben, sold for \$175,000 to Midwest Thoroughbreds. McMahon had purchased the youngster for \$20,000 at last fall's Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Mixed Sale.

"He was always a great mover," McMahon said of the dark bay, who was consigned Saturday by Hunter Valley Farm. "He was scopey enough, but he had nice, balanced muscle and there wasn't much I didn't like about him."

Of the colt's bargain price tag, McMahon added, "The October market hasn't really been discovered by the mainstream pinhooking group yet. So it was a fortunate thing that I was able to get him."

A few hips before the Here Comes Ben colt, McMahon sold a homebred son of Artie Schiller ([hip 348](#)) for \$170,000 to Niall Brennan under his McMahon of Saratoga Thoroughbreds banner.

"It's a very strong market," McMahon, who grew up in the New York Thoroughbred breeding industry, acknowledged. "Where this market came from when I was a child to now, is just an unbelievable turn. The pavilion and the sales grounds have been redone and this is just a great thing that Fasig-Tipton has done for New York. The way the purses are and with more people making money, there are more people coming to buy New York-breds."

Sheikh Mohammed stands Shamardal at his Kildangan Stud in Ireland and Ferguson said that leading sire, combined with the colt's pedigree page and good looks, made him a leading light of the session.

"Shamardal is an extraordinary sire in so many ways because they're all so honest and he's getting Group 1 winners at so many different levels," he commented. "Not only do we like the sire, but he's a really good individual, and the mare's a sister to Lope De Vega, who had a Dewhurst winner in his first crop, so he's making it too. In terms of pedigree, the ideal of a nice young mare that's a sister to a successful sire with a highly exciting sire himself--it all fits. We're delighted to have him."

Ferguson noted his team saw the colt on the farm in Germany where he was raised earlier this year.

"He's a horse that's just continued to thrive since," he added.

Lot 89 is the second foal from the 7-year-old Lavande Violet (Ger) (Hurricane Run {Ire}), whose Intense Focus yearling last year sold for just €4,000 at Baden-Baden. She is a daughter of Lady Vettori (GB) (Vettori {Ire}), winner of the G3 Prix Calvados and the dam of G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains and G1 Prix du Jockey Club victor Lope De Vega as well as Group 3 winner Bal de la Rose (Ire) (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}).

Lot 89 was the last of three of the session purchased by Ferguson, who struck immediately when picking up [lot 1](#), the lone offering by Kitten's Joy in the sale, for €150,000. The Ken and Sarah Ramsey-bred, consigned by Voute Sales, is the first foal from the stakes-placed Wave Of Applause (GB) (Royal Applause {GB}), who was purchased by the Ramseys for \$65,000 at Fasig-Tipton's February Sale in 2012.


"He was a very athletic horse, again out of a young mare, and Kitten's Joy is doing really well all around the world," Ferguson noted.

Ferguson also purchased [lot 35](#), the most expensive yearling of the session for Redoute's Choice (Aus) (Danehill) (see story below).

Demurely Rewards Monceaux Investment...

In December 2013, Ecurie des Monceaux stretched to 600,000gns to secure the multiple stakes-placed Galileo (Ire) mare Demurely (Ire) when she went through the ring at Tattersalls carrying her first foal, by Invincible Spirit. Consigned as [lot 44](#) on the opening day of the Arqana August Sale, the resultant offspring didn't take long to prove to her breeder that it was money well spent when she was knocked down for €610,000 to Hubie de Burgh. Unable to name his

client, who is likely to race the January-born filly in either France or England, de Burgh had the final say when Charlie Gordon-Watson walked out of the ring after reaching his limit at €600,000.

De Burgh said, "She's a beautiful filly with a fantastic pedigree and is by a stallion who is consistently good year after year. She's not just going to be a sprinter--she should get further than that, so there are a lot of opportunities for her. If she wins a group race, what's she worth? Millions. She's been bought for a breeder who collects

top-class international pedigrees and that's what she has."

Demurely's half-sisters include the G1 Irish Oaks winner Moonstone (Ire) (Dalakhani {Ire}), G1 Prix Saint-Alary winner Cerulean Sky (Ire) (Darshaan) and G1 Irish Oaks runner-up L'Anresse (Ire) (Darshaan {GB}).

The agent added, "We've always bought really sound horses here and the quality gets better and better. It's attractive to come here with the exchange rate being so good against sterling."

De Burgh later went to €410,000 in pursuit of [lot 59](#), a daughter of reigning champion sire Galileo (Ire) and the treble Group 3-winning sprinter Fire Lily (Ire) (Dansili {GB}).

He said of the descendant of the Kilfrush Stud matriarch Mill Princess (Ire), "Her mother was a very good race filly and she's from a very good family. She's from the famous Galileo-Danehill cross, with speed. She'll race in Europe; she's not French-bred, so maybe not in France, but we haven't decided yet."

An Invincible Force...

Invincible Spirit has sired the high-class fillies Moonlight Cloud (GB), Rosdhu Queen (Ire) and Fleeting Spirit (Ire), and is already represented by several good sons at stud, including Lawman (Fr), Mayson (GB) and Vale Of York (Ire). His current runners are headed by Europe's top-rated juvenile Shalaa (Ire). Ecurie des Monceaux, which is managed for Lucien Urano by Henri Bozo, has already enjoyed plenty of success with Invincible Spirit as the breeder of another of his young stallion sons, Charm Spirit (Ire), and that luck continued through to another of the draft, [lot 50](#), a filly by the Irish National Stud's flagship stallion out of Guy Heald's listed winner Dubai Rose (GB) (Dubai Destination).

South African Derek Brugman of Mayfair Speculators, who bought the filly on behalf of Markus Jooste in partnership with Coolmore for €550,000, said of his new signing, "We thought she was a very high-quality filly. Dubai Destination is starting to make it as a broodmare sire and we bought the half-sister by Monsun last year [for €650,000]. She's in training with Nicolas Clement and we think she's a very decent filly, so we wanted to get back into the family via Invincible Spirit, who is firing at the moment."

He continued, "We haven't decided on a trainer yet but we'll speak to the Coolmore guys and see where she's going."

With four yearlings sold through the first session, Invincible Spirit headed Galileo on the sires' list with the leading average price of €427,500.

At the end of trade on the first day, Ecurie des Monceaux was once again at the top of the vendors' table, with seven lots sold for €2,190,000. They included [lot 85](#), the Myboycharlie (Ire) half-brother to treble Group 1-winning miler Charm Spirit (Ire) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}), who sold to that horse's trainer, Freddy Head, for €220,000.

Roman Invasion of Hong Kong Continues...

The talents of Holy Roman Emperor (Ire) have been well advertised in Hong Kong by multiple Group 1 winner Designs On Rome (Ire) and GISW Rich Tapestry (Ire), which helped to convince the Hong Kong Jockey Club's representative Mark Richards to part with €320,000 for an easy-moving colt by the Coolmore stallion consigned by Haras des Capucines as [lot 78](#).

The bay March-foaled colt is out of the young Montjeu (Ire) mare Jeu De Plume (Ire), a half-sister to four stakes winners in Hearthstead Maison (Ire), Rave Reviews (Ire), Fermion (Ire) and Sail (Ire). Richards said, "He looks like a pocket rocket and he sold himself, really. He has such presence."

"The offspring of Holy Roman Emperor seem to adapt well to Hong Kong and he reminded me an awful lot of Designs On Rome," Richards continued. "We gave a little bit more than I thought we'd have to, but there was plenty of interest in him, so let's hope we've got it right."

First Frankel To Al Shaqab...

The first yearling by the unbeaten champion Frankel (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) to see a sale ring understandably caused a stir midway through the session, and [lot 41](#) will eventually wear Sheikh Joaan's Al Shaqab Racing silks after being hammered down to Peter and Ross Doyle Bloodstock for €300,000.

Doyle did his bidding alongside trainer Richard Hannon, but said a conditioner for the April-foaled bay had not yet been decided. Doyle said he considered his purchase among the more precocious of the Frankels.

"Frankel is a big plus, but we thought he was a very good-looking individual," Doyle noted. "We thought he was quite a sharp-looking Frankel and he has a very good pedigree to back it up. We could see him running as a 2-year-old, and Richard Hannon was very fond of him as well."

Lot 41, the first of four Frankel youngsters to go through the ring for Monceaux and six overall--the rest are slated to sell Sunday--is out of G2 Sun Chariot S. winner Danceabout (GB) (Shareef Dancer), who with 10 foals has produced the listed-winning Rainbow Dancing (GB) (Rainbow Quest) and the stakes-placed Handsome Man (GB) (Nayef). He is the most expensive sales yearling to date for Danceabout, who has a 2-year-old and a foal by Makfi (GB).

Fast Start For Redoute's...

Another sire classified as "first-season" at Arqana is Redoute's Choice (Aus) (Danehill), who is represented by his first yearlings sired during a stint at the Aga Khan's Haras de Bonneval in France. Unlike his younger counterparts, however, the 18-year-old is proven as a three-time champion sire in Australia, and Sheikh Mohammed's bloodstock advisor John Ferguson swooped for his first colt through the ring Saturday night, settling at €450,000 for [lot 35](#), a January-

foaled son of the unraced Copernica (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), a full-sister to G2 Beresford S. winner David Livingston (Ire). The colt's third dam, Kasora (Ire) (Darshaan {GB}), produced the six-time Group 1 winner High Chaparral (Ire) (Sadler's Wells).

"Redoute's Choice has been a superb stallion in Australia, and there's no reason why he won't repeat his success in the Northern Hemisphere," said Ferguson. "This is a Redoute's Choice out of a Galileo mare going back to a great family, including High Chaparral, and he was a very athletic horse and we're delighted to have him."

Ferguson said he thinks Redoute's Choice's Northern Hemisphere foals have mirrored the looks of his Australian progeny.

"I've been looking at them in Australia for many years, so I'd say they're fairly similar to those in Australia," he commented. "There's not a huge difference. Some horses with different mares can produce different types, but he's such a preeminent and dominant stallion; Redoute's Choices look like Redoute's Choices."

Lot 35 was purchased as a foal by Joe Foley of Ireland's Ballyhane Stud for 175,000gns at Tattersalls December last year, and Foley was rewarded for his boldness after Saturday's transaction. The Irish-foaled colt is eligible for French premiums, which convinced Foley to consign the colt in Deauville through Richard Powell's Haras du Lieu des Champs.

He said, "I sent him straight back to France to Richard and he and his team did a great job raising and prepping him. He was an outstanding foal with a stallion's pedigree and I'm a great believer in Redoute's Choice, as I stand his son Elzaam (Aus), whose first foals head to the sales later this year. Everybody had looked at him and Richard filled me with confidence that he would sell well. Best of luck to Godolphin."

Redoute's Choice had four go through the ring Saturday, with three selling for an average of €323,333.

Other first-crop sires to post significant results included Darley's reverse-shuttler Sepoy (Aus) (Elusive Quality), whose lone offering brought €200,000 from Peter and Ross Doyle Bloodstock; Nathaniel (Ire), who had three sell for an average of €108,333; Helmet (Aus) (Exceed and Excel {Aus}), another Darley reverse shuttler who had one sell for €120,000; Excelebration (Ire), whose three offerings were headed by an €160,000 colt; and Born to Sea (Ire) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}), whose lone offering of the evening fetched €260,000 from Nicolas de Watrigant of Mandore International Agency, who signed the ticket alongside Born to Sea's former trainer, John Oxx. **Cont. p19**

Oxx, who also trained Born to Sea's half-brother Sea the Stars (Ire) (Cape Cross {Ire}), said of Born to Sea, "he's getting very good-looking stock; quite precocious looking, they're very well-made. His foals made a big impression last year and I'd say we'll see a lot of nice yearlings by him. Of course his pedigree has a lot of attraction to it, being a half-brother to Galileo and Sea the Stars, and he's standing at a different level of fee so breeders are supporting him well." Oxx revealed the colt ([lot 87](#)) was purchased for Sunderland Holdings, who bred and raced Sea the Stars.

The Kendargent Party Continues...

The first two Kendargent (Fr) yearlings through the ring at Arqana, the only two of the sire's to be offered Saturday, will both be headed to the UK, according to Haras de Colleville's farm manager, Guillaume Vitse. Colleville, owned by Guy Pariente, stands the 12-year-old stallion.

"We were very happy with the sale," said Vitse, who saw [lot 21](#), a full-sister to G3 Prix de la Grotte winner Kenhope (Fr), bring €250,000 from Agence FIPS for an undisclosed English outfit who is new to the business.

"The filly is going to England for some new clients that Mr. Pariente met in the UK who want to invest into the whole business. They're very new, and the trainer hasn't even been chosen."

The second Kendargent of the night, [lot 38](#), brought €100,000 from Tony Nerses. Vitse said the purchase was on behalf of Saleh al Homaizi and Imad al Sagar, who campaigned 2007 Epsom Derby winner Authorized (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}), also a Nerses purchase. The filly is a half-sister to Kendam (Fr), the G3 Prix Eclipse winner who was third in the G1 Prix de la Foret.

"Our target is to send as many Kendargents as possible to the UK," said Vitse.

Connections of Coulsty are looking at the upcoming **Turkish invitational races**, while **David Simcock** said of **Breton Rock**, "He could have done with a bit more rain, but that run sets him up for an autumn campaign. He is the **G2 Park S.** [at **Doncaster Sept. 12**] and the **G2 Celebration Mile** [at **Goodwood Aug. 29**] and we will look at races in **France** later on for him."

With no star miler in attendance at Deauville on Sunday, opportunity knocks for Godolphin's **Toormore (Ire)** (Arakan) in the G1 Prix du Haras de Fresnay-le-Buffard Jacques le Marois. Back to winning ways in the seven-furlong G2 Lennox S. when last seen at Goodwood July 28, the 2013 G1 National S. hero was

gaining his just deserts after a game second in the G1 Lockinge S. at Newbury May 16 and fourth in the G1 Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot June 16. “He could have gone for the Hungerford, but he won his Group 2 last month and we also think the

mile will suit him better than seven,” trainer Richard Hannon commented. The stable also run Toormore's half-brother **Estidhkaar (Ire)** (Dark Angel {Ire}), who has been absent since disappointing when 14th in the G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket May 2. He had previously chased home the subsequent triple Group 1 winner Muhaarar (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}) in Newbury's G3 Greenham S. over seven furlongs Apr. 18 and showed how much he appreciates this kind of testing surface when streaking to success in the G2 Superlative S. at Newmarket last July. “Estidhkaar has had a break since the Guineas, when nothing went right for him,” Hannon commented. “He'll be more suited to Deauville and the easy ground is also a plus for both of them.” Godolphin's **Territories (Ire)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) would be another 3-year-old with major chances were it not for the rain and the July 12 G1 Prix Jean Prat winner who was also runner-up in the 2000 Guineas may be forced to sit out the encounter if trainer Andre Fabre judges the going to be too soft. “The going is a concern and on top of that, they are running handicap races on the track before the race, which could ruin the ground,” he said. “I am happy with the horse, but I might make a last-minute decision. He is really a good-ground horse.”

Fabre also saddles last week's G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest bridesmaid **Esoterique (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}), who scored over this course and distance in the 2014 G1 Prix Rothschild, as well as Haras de Saint Pair's July 26 Listed Prix Frederic de Lagrange scorer **Vadamos (Fr)** (Monsun {Ger}). “She [Esoterique] is fine and has spent the week in Deauville enjoying herself,” their conditioner said. “She has nothing to lose. She has already won at Deauville and has won there over the mile. I would prefer good ground for her, also. Vadamos' work in the morning would suggest he can be competitive in this category. Work in the morning and races are different, of course, but I am impatient to run him in this kind of race.” Arguably the race's most intriguing and important runner is The Niarchos Family's G1 Breeders' Cup Mile winner **Karakontie (Jpn)** (Bernstein), but trainer Jonathan Pease faces a tall order readying him to win this on his seasonal bow off a subsequent lay-off.

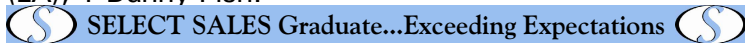

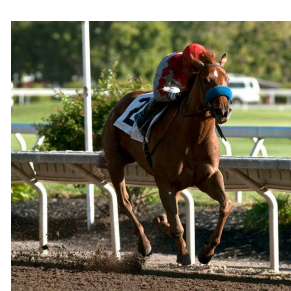
