SHALAA SCORCHES MORNY RIVALS

After the disappointment of Golden Horn (GB) (Cape Cross {Ire}) suffering defeat in unsuitable conditions in midweek, it was a bold call of John Gosden to let Al Shaqab Racing's **Shalaa (Ire)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) take his chance in a rain-affected G1 Darley Prix Morny at Deauville on Sunday, but the prolific G2 July S. and G2 Richmond S. winner rewarded the bravery with another merciless display of speed to enhance his already stellar reputation.

Rain in the morning at Deauville led to an anxious wait for his fans, but after a course walk Gosden opted to let him loose and a sense of caution pervaded for the first half of the race, with Frankie Dettori holding on to a narrow lead from the

same operation's second-string, **Gutaifan (Ire)** (Dark Angle {Ire}). Still enthusiastic enough to pull that rival out of his comfort zone by the furlong pole, Shalaa—who was sent off a generous 7-10—gradually pulled clear under hand riding to score by a comfortable 1 3/4-length margin, with **Tourny (Fr)** (Country Reel) best of the French duo well adrift five lengths behind in third. “We had some reservations about the ground, and if he was not handling it Frankie was asked to take care of him, but he did tolerate it even though it was far from being his favorite,” his conditioner said. “He’s a very good horse and his class won it for him. He’s probably the fastest 2-year-old I’ve handled since Oasis Dream, and I think he could be in that class next year.”

AVANZARE VICTORIOUS

John Youngblood and Donato Lanni's **Avanzare** (Grand Reward), off since winning the GII Arcadia S. at Santa Anita in January, returned to the races in style, holding off **Talco (Fr)** (Pivotal {GB}) for a neck victory in Sunday's GII Del Mar Mile. Taken in hand shortly after breaking from his outside post, Avanzare was angled to the inside and found the rail while racing near the back of the field into the first turn. He tugged his way closer down the backstretch under a snug hold by Gary Stevens. Swept out some six wide at the top of the stretch, Avanzare had clear running room down the center of the course as favored **Bal a Bali (Brz)** (Put It Back) was buried along the rail and crying out for racing room. Avanzare bound to the lead and determinedly held off the late-flying Talco. “It was a good run for him,” said Stevens. “I had to give up some ground to keep him in a good spot, but he's a big, strong horse and he got it done today.” **Cont. p4**

'PHAROAH' CONFIRMED FOR TRAVERS

Triple Crown winner **American Pharoah** (Pioneerof the Nile) was confirmed for the Aug. 29 GI Travers S. after impressive connections with a seven-furlong work at Del Mar Sunday. The Zayat Stables' runner worked in 1:23.20 under Martin Garcia, registering splits of :23.00, :47.20, :58.80 and 1:10.60 and galloping out a mile in 1:36.40. It was the fastest of two at the distance at Del Mar Sunday and his six-furlong time bettered the day's bullet move of 1:12.20 at that distance.

“He was more aggressive today,” trainer Bob Baffert said after the work. “He didn't work all that fast last week and he wanted to get into it today. We wanted to see where his energy level is—to be sure he still has it. It's incredible that he does after all this. Then again, he's an incredible horse.”

Shortly after the work, Zayat Stables tweeted “American Pharoah is Saratoga bound!”

American Pharoah, who completed his Triple Crown sweep with the June 6 GI Belmont S., returned to action with a facile victory in the Aug. 2 GI William Hill Haskell Invitational at Monmouth Park.

Sunday's work was American Pharoah's second since the Haskell. He went four furlongs last Sunday in :47.60.

"Today was very positive," Baffert said. "We'll see how he comes out of this, how he cools out. His bags are packed; he's ready to go. We'll see. Maybe we'll wait until tomorrow to see how he is. We'll see."

American Pharoah's participation would increase the purse for the Travers from \$1.25 million to \$1.6 million, with attendance already capped at a sold-out 50,000.

SMART TRANSITION WORKS FOR TRAVERS

Arnold Zetcher's **Smart Transition** (Smart Strike) worked five furlongs at Saratoga Sunday in a bullet :58.55 in preparation for the Aug. 29 GI Travers S.

"He worked really well," trainer John Shirreffs said. "We were hoping he'd work a little bit between a minute and 1:01, somewhere around there. He went a little faster than expected, but that's all right. He's been training well right along."

Unraced at two, Smart Transition was fourth in the July 4 GIII Dwyer S. and is coming off a 4 3/4-length victory in the July 31 Curlin S.

"You never know exactly where a horse is going to go, but he's been a horse that's been very impressive since his 2-year-old year," Shirreffs said. "He stood out among the 2-year-olds that we had. In some of his races he was very unfortunate; he didn't get the ride or the trip he needed. In the Curlin, he got the perfect trip. It couldn't have gone any better for him and he showed what he was capable of. If we get another good trip, I think he should run very well."

Shirreffs admitted the presence of Triple Crown winner American Pharoah would make Smart Transition's task in the Travers even more difficult.

"If American Pharoah [runs], we're going to have to step up quite a bit," Shirreffs said. "I think it's good. It's good for racing. We're feeling good about being in the Travers."

BEHOLDER FINE AFTER CLASSIC ROMP

Beholder (Henny Hughes) was tired, but otherwise fine Sunday, a day after her jawdropping victory in the GI TVG Pacific Classic at Del Mar.

“She is tired this morning and she came out of it better than I did,” trainer Richard Mandella said. “Last night you could have run her again and she might have gone just as fast, she was feeling that strong. But this morning it hit her and she’s tired.”

Mandella was non-committal on a next start for Beholder, who has now won “Win and You’re In” events for the GI Breeders’ Cup Classic and Distaff.

“Obviously a lot of windows are open, we have a lot of options,” Mandella said. “We’ll take it a step at a time. She’ll run one more race before [the Breeders’ Cup] if it looks to me like it’s needed. Fillies take a little more time to recuperate and we’ve got time now. The [Sept. 26 GI] Zenyatta is a good possibility, probably likely, but we’ll have to wait and see.”

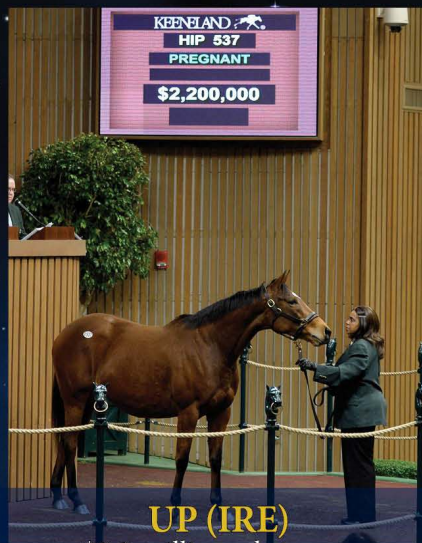

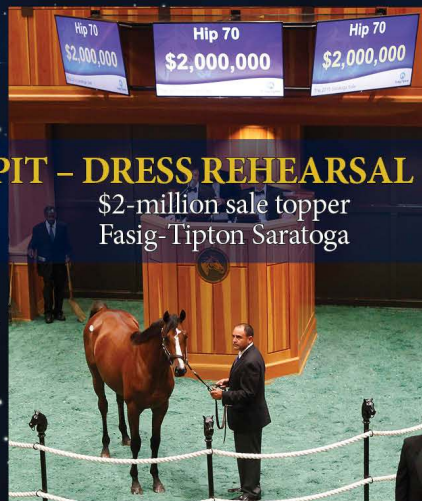

First or second in his first seven trips to the post, Avanzare suffered his only off-the-board finish to date when a close-up fourth behind Finnegan's Wake (Powerscourt {GB}) in last year's GIII Arlington H. He rebounded to take the GIII Washington Park H. over the synthetics and, shipped west, he ended 2014 with third-place efforts in the Oct. 4 GII City of Hope Mile and Nov. 29 GIII Native Diver S.

Reporting Star, second in last year's GII Sky Classic S., earned the first graded victory of his career with a dramatic photo finish. The dark bay gelding opened 2015 with a runner-up finish in the Jan. 17 Sunshine Millions Turf S. at Gulfstream Park. He resurfaced to run third in a blanket finish over Woodbine's main track in a July 12 optional claimer. Favored Bobby's Kitten (Kitten's Joy), making his first start since a late-running victory in last year's GI Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint, sprinted out of the gate and found himself battling Stacked Deck (First Samurai) on the front end as Reporting Star rated

off the dueling leaders through fractions of :22.32 and :45.01. Still with plenty to do to catch the pacesetters turning for home, Reporting Star was tipped to the rail for running room inside of the tiring Stacked Deck, while Tower of Texas was angling outside of Bobby's Kitten. Those two foes inhaled the pacesetters and bound clear with Reporting Star just getting a nose in front on the line. "He's a great horse and he gives you everything he's got every time he runs," said winning trainer Pat Parente. "It was a perfect stalking trip. He had them in his sights, and when he has a horse in his sights, he'll run them down."

The Firestone homebred began his 2015 campaign with an optional-claiming victory over the Gulfstream lawn Mar. 29. "I talked to [trainer] Christophe [Clement] this morning and he said, win or lose, to ride a patient race and sit the pocket, and that's exactly what I did," explained winning jockey Joe Bravo. 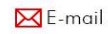

Only fourth behind Amazing Maria (Ire) in the G1 Prix Rothschild over a mile at Deauville three weeks ago, Barbara Keller's Odeliz found some improvement when returning to the Normandy venue on Sunday to register a 35-1 upset in a farcical renewal of the G1 Darley Prix Jean Romanet. Instantly on the lead from her widest draw, the chestnut was left alone to enjoy a hack-canter under Adrie de Vries and, after warming up in her own time, was able to see off a stern challenge from the Rothschild third Bawina from the quarter pole. Digging in to score by a neck, she had won the tactical war in a race to shame some of the country's riding talent, with Avenir Certain unable to make up sizeable ground from an impossible position and finishing 3/4 of a length away in third. Odeliz, whose first black-type encounter had been a successful one in Longchamp's Listed Prix de Liancourt in September 2013, found an admirable level of consistency last season when placing five times in group company in Europe prior to her half-length second to Just the Judge (Ire) (Lawman {Fr}) in Woodbine's GI E. P. Taylor S. in October. In contrast, her first outing this term proved an uncharacteristic disappointment, as she was seventh in heavy ground in the G3 Park Express S. over a mile Mar. 29, but she was back on track with a fourth in the G2 Middleton S. over an extended 10-furlong trip at York May 14.

No match for Arabian Queen (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}) when third to that future headline-maker in Epsom's G3 Princess Elizabeth S. over 8 1/2 furlongs June 5, Odeliz was fitted with cheekpieces for a confidence-boosting foray into Hamburg for the June 27 G3 Franz-Gunther von Gaertner Gedachtnisrennen, and looked a sharper tool when steered to a first pattern-race success by Adrie de Vries. Just a neck behind Bawina in the Rothschild and beaten under three lengths in total there with her German jockey retaining the partnership, she was able to eke out more here due to the combination of a soft lead and a return to a more suitable trip. For trainer Karl Burke, it was a triumph of persistence and consistency being its own reward. "It wasn't exactly the plan to go from the front, but I left it up to Adrie and she relaxed so well there," he said. "She is so lazy I knew she was not doing much and so was quite confident--when she quickened, I knew she could last out. She's been a progressive filly and has come a long way for us. She did not run as a 2-year-old, as she was big and needed time, but she has been good since and I always thought she would do well over a mile and a quarter." Burke added his charge had likely booked a return ticket to Canada. "She was second in the E. P. Taylor last year and it has always been the plan to return, so I see no reason to change that and she will also be entered in the [Oct. 4] G1 Prix de l'Opera de Longchamp." Last year's winner Ribbons (GB) (Manduro {Ger}), who was sent off the 27-10 favorite, was one of those who did not sit too far off the tepid pace but was ultimately disappointing in sixth.

Returning from a lengthy break, having last been seen winning the G3 Prix de Barbeville over a half-furlong further at Longchamp May 3, Alex My Boy provided favorite-backers with the usual nervous wait before he finally delivered the ultimately inevitable end result as his class told. Typically slow to warm up in his races for former trainer Mark Johnston, the bay still managed to garner successes in 14-furlong handicaps at Haydock and Musselburgh and finish second in Goodwood's Listed March S. at that distance last summer before finishing eighth in the G1 St Leger at Doncaster in September. Suited by the much more gradual cranking-up process of French staying races, his new conditioner Andreas Wohler saddled him to be runner-up in the Listed Prix Right Royal at Saint-Cloud Apr. 5 prior to his career-best success in the Barbeville. Again tardy from the gates and needing cajoling along by Olivier Peslier, Alex My Boy was not asked to do anything strenuous in last for much of the contest but, when straightened for home, was sent in pursuit of former stable companion Oriental Fox and duly wore him down with his irresistible finish in the last 75 meters. "He received a good ride and did what we expected," Wohler said. "He is lazy, but he picked up well and the G1 Prix du Cadran [at Longchamp Oct. 4] is where he will go if the ground is soft."

Alex My Boy's dam is the triple Oaks (Epsom, Irish and Yorkshire) winner Alexandrova, herself a half-sister to G1 Cheveley Park S. winner Magical Romance (Ire) (Barathea {Ire}). It is also the extended family of G1 Irish Oaks winner Chicquita (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}). Alexandrova has an as-yet unraced 2-year-old by Fastnet Rock (Aus) named Somehow (Ire), and she was bred to War Front this year.

It was after The Curragh's G2 Futurity S. that Jim Bolger boldly proclaimed New Approach (Ire) to be "a European version of Secretariat," and eight years on a son of that luminary, Herald the Dawn (Ire), stepped up for Coolcullen in a rain-drenched renewal to emulate his sire in game fashion. Sent off at 7-1 on debut, the full-brother to Dawn Approach (Ire) outran those odds when going under by 1 3/4 lengths to Reckless Endeavour (Ire) (Kodiac {GB}) in second and finishing clear of the subsequent G3 Tyros S. third Lieutenant General (Ire) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}), and built on that

experience when going one better over this trip in another maiden at that track last time Aug. 3. With the rain coming to Kildare, the betting became tight at the head of the market and the bay was eventually made the 6-4 second choice, with the emphasis on Shogun as Ballydoyle's sole representative

after the withdrawal of his stable companion Air Vice Marshal (War Front). As the only three of the quartet left that held any chance set off, it was the filly Now Or Never who led Shogun by a length with Kevin Manning waiting patiently with Herald the Dawn a further two lengths behind that 11-8 chalk.

Joseph O'Brien was the first to send out the distress signals and Shogun was in trouble a long way out, but Herald the Dawn was able to bridge the gap to the talented filly from the quarter pole to the furlong marker and gradually wore down her resistance in the run to the line. "Kevin said the wheels were spinning, but he got there," Bolger commented. "He's basically a good-ground horse, but he overcame the adversity. He can do six furlongs, seven or a mile. He's a late-May foal and he didn't come to hand as quickly as Dawn Approach, but he's making up for it now. We'll see where he fits in and we have choices in Group 1 races in Ireland, England and France. The reason we ran today was to see if he could get through the ground and that will leave him a little bit versatile with regards to the back-end. He's definitely a Guineas horse and I don't see him staying much beyond a mile." Aidan O'Brien was putting the flat effort of Shogun down to the ground and said, "I was afraid he was vulnerable on that ground and there was every chance he would do what he did. He wears blinkers because mentally he's still very immature and we felt that we couldn't pitch him into the [Sept. 13] G1 National S. unless he had another run, so he had to even though the chances were that he would disappoint. He's a Fastnet Rock out of a Galileo mare and Joseph knew after two furlongs that he was in trouble on the ground. I felt that, mentally, the run would do him good and, with that under his belt, he could make the step up to run in a Group 1 on nice ground. I think you'll see a nice horse next time."

Herald the Dawn's dam, Hymn of the Dawn, has a yearling full-sister to the colt.

Runner-up in the G1 Irish 1000 Guineas here May 24 and the G1 Coronation S. at Royal Ascot June 19, 'TDN Rising Star' Found enjoyed a saunter around The Curragh in an already weak renewal--made even less significant by the scratching of her barnmate and fellow 'TDN Rising Star' Ol' Man River (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire})--to return to the winner's circle for the first time since the G1 Prix Marcel Boussac at Longchamp on Arc day. Given the manner of that success in October, it is surprising that the bay had been without a win in 2015, but two strong efforts at the top level suggested she retained much of her ability, and it is significant that she had for a short while been under consideration for a crack at the G1 Epsom Derby. Rested since the Marcel Boussac runner-up Ervedya (Fr) (Siyouni {Fr}) had gained her revenge at the Royal meeting, she was settled in second early by Seamie Heffernan tracking Answered, and was in second gear throughout. Only requiring a shake of the reins to brush aside that rival 100 yards out, she recorded the kind of facile score that her ego demanded as she is built towards a high-profile autumn campaign. "That is the first time Found has run beyond a mile and we always felt she was crying out for it," Aidan O'Brien commented. "The plan was always to keep her to a mile until Ascot and then give her a break. We could have a look at the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe [at Longchamp Oct. 4] with her. You would have to be delighted with that for her first run back. She has plenty of pace and over a mile she was probably getting there too early. Seamie gave her a lovely ride."

AUTUMN RETURN FOR SUCCESS DAYS

Robert Ng's **Success Days (Ire)** (Jeremy), winner of the G3 Ballysax S. and G3 Derrinstown Stud Derby Trial earlier this year, is working towards a return to the races and likely to resurface in October, according to trainer Ken Condon. Success Days was supplemented to the G1 Epsom Derby after his pair of stakes scores but finished last of 12 in that Classic after sustaining an injury and hasn't raced since.

"Success Days is doing well and is in his third week back cantering," said Condon. "He also swam for a few weeks before that. He didn't put on much weight and

Meanwhile another Irish-trained former Derby fancy, Sheikh Hamdan's **Zawraq (Ire)** (Shamardal), will be out for the remainder of the year but will likely point to a 2016 campaign, according to racing manager Angus Gold. Zawraq is unbeaten in two starts and won the Listed Leopardstown 2000 Guineas Trial S. in April but was ruled out of the Derby after suffering a crack in his off-fore cannon bone.

"He's still at Derrinstown Stud recuperating," said Gold. "I saw him three weeks ago and he was just walking. He's fine, but after they found the crack in a joint it's going to be three months before he goes into training, so he will have missed this season. He's too good a horse to rush back for not very much, so we'll give him plenty of time and hopefully get him ready for next season."

TATTS, DBS ADD STEROIDS RULE

British sale companies Tattersalls and DBS have updated their conditions of sale to allow buyers the option to return a horse that tests positive for steroids, according to *Racing Post*. The move is in response to the British Horseracing Authority's enhanced zero-tolerance steroid policy, and the buyer will be given the option upon signing the ticket to have the horse tested at a BHA-approved lab.

Directors at both DBS and Tattersalls noted that testing has already been in place for a number of years, and a positive has yet to be returned.

"When buyers sign for a lot they will be asked if they want to test the horse for steroids. However, we've been testing for steroids for more than 10 years and never had a positive," DBS Managing Director

Henry Beeby told the publication. He added, "We've been in close consultation with the BHA to come into line with the regulations. Our testing policy has been upgraded so we can be sure whatever standards are imposed on racehorses at British racecourses are imposed on the yearlings being bought at Doncaster."

Tattersalls Marketing Director Jimmy George told *Racing Post*, "We introduced testing for anabolic steroids a number of years ago and have never had a positive. I don't expect that to change, and I don't expect buyers' behavior to change. We've just had to revisit the issue [of steroids] and come up with comprehensive conditions of sale to reflect the BHA stance."

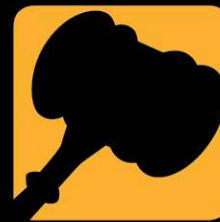

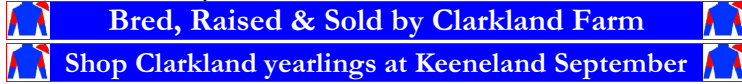
