AMERICAN PHAROAH ARRIVES IN SARATOGA

With a police escort of New York State Troopers leading the way from Albany International Airport, **American Pharoah** (Pioneerof the Nile)'s road show arrived at Saratoga Race Course Wednesday afternoon.

Assistant trainer Jimmy Barnes said the approximately 2,850-mile cross-country trip to run in the GI Travers S. on Saturday could not have gone more smoothly. The 12th Triple Crown winner left his stall at Del Mar a 1:30 a.m. PST and walked off the truck at Barn 25 just after 3 p.m. EST, a span of 10 1/2 hours.

American Pharoah vanned to Ontario International Airport for a flight to Lexington, Ky. Some horses got off and 2003 Kentucky Derby and Preakness winner Funny Cide was led on for the second leg of the flight to upstate New York. The final portion of the journey was a 29-mile van ride on Interstate 87, the Adirondack Northway, to the track. Funny Cide will be paraded in the paddock before Thursday's program.

"Traveling with Pharoah, they make it very convenient for us," Barnes said. "We're like the last one to show up at the plane and the first one off. Everybody has been very cooperative with that."

It was the 13th plane ride to compete this year for the Zayat Stables' homebred, who has accumulated lots of frequent flyer miles in his climb to the top of the racing world.

"He handles shipping very well. Absolutely," Barnes said. "He's shipped so many times now that he's a pro."

Barnes said the colt, who wears ear plugs while racing, has them in when he's traveling or whenever he leaves the barn. The veteran horseman, and longtime assistant to trainer Bob Baffert, said he's never seen a more resilient horse who can handle training, competing and traveling. **Cont. p3**

TRAVERS UNDERCARD TAKES SHAPE

While Triple Crown winner **American Pharoah** (Pioneerof the Nile) will certainly hog much of the spotlight Saturday with his appearance in the \$1.6-million GI Travers S., Saratoga will run five other Grade I events leading up to that centerpiece, and another Grade II for good measure after the "Midsummer Derby." The \$1-million GI Sword Dancer S., one of several races added to the Travers undercard and one of four Breeders' Cup "Win and You're In" qualifiers to be held Saturday, features globe-trotting \$5-million earner **Flintshire (GB)** (Dansili {GB}). The Andre Fabre trainee was second in last year's GI Breeders' Cup Turf. Champion **Untapable** (Tapit), upended by **Stopchargingmaria** (Tale of the Cat) in the GIII Shuvee H. here Aug. 2, looks to bounce back in the GI Personal Ensign S. With 12 horses signed on, the GI Forego S. for older sprinters is among the day's most intriguing events. Speedy MGISW **Private Zone** (Macho Uno) will take on the likes of 'TDN Rising Star' **The Big Beast** (Yes It's True), winner of the GI King's Bishop S. 12 months ago and most recently a neck second in the GI Alfred G. Vanderbilt H. Aug. 1. A field of 11 sophomore sprinters comprise the King's Bishop, led by **Competitive Edge** (Super Saver), who cuts back to the trip over which he won last year's GI Hopeful S., and GI Amsterdam S. winner **Holy Boss** (Street Boss). **La Verdad** (Yes It's True) seeks her first Grade I in the Ballerina S., but meets GI Humana Distaff S. heroine **Dame Dorothy** (Bernardini). **Fields p5-7**

"I think he's an exceptional case as far as being able to handle all of the shipping, keeping his weight well, keep eating," Barnes said. "When you need to go back and forth from the East Coast to the West Coast they could back off their feed and lighten up on you. He pretty much gained weight. It hasn't been an issue at all. It's been nice."

Top-level racing has been part of culture in the Capital Region of New York since the Civil War, but the news that the first Triple Crown winner in 37 years would compete in the Travers has ratcheted up the interest in Saratoga's signature race. The Time Warner newschannel provided live coverage of the arrival of American Pharoah's flight to Albany--much as it would if the President was coming to town--and a few dozen members of the media were at trainer John Terranova's barn to report on the end of the journey.

"At the airport there was a large reception," Barnes said. "Along the freeway people were pulled over. It was the same at Churchill [Downs] when we came back from the Belmont."

Barnes had handled lots of Baffert standouts through the years, but has never seen as horse receive rock star-type treatment.

“You just really have to enjoy it because he’s only going to be around so long, and when this is all over I’m sure we’re going to miss him,” Barnes said. “At times it gets a little hectic, but you’ve just got to sit back and just enjoy it. You’re blessed to be here.”

Barnes said the colt will go to track Thursday morning for some light training. His morning workout between 8:45 and 9:00 a.m. Friday is open to the public. It’s a pretty safe bet that it will draw a large crowd.

Travers, scheduled for 5:46 p.m. and part of NBC’s live coverage from 4:00 to 6 p.m.

After he got off the van from the airport, American Pharoah was walked around the ring under the ancient trees outside Terranova’s barn, and given a bath. Forty-five minutes after Barnes led him down the ramp, showing no signs of being worn out by the trip, he was in his stall. All in a day’s work for the American Pharoah road show.

“He adjusts,” Barnes said. “He’s probably adjusted right now. You could lead him over and run him. I really think he adjusts very easily.

“We’d like to get him over the track. He likes a deeper-style track so this track should be fine. He likes the eastern tracks. All his racing has been on basically eastern tracks, other than a synthetic track (Del Mar) and Santa Anita. It’s hard to believe. You think back to all his races, he has really only had two at home. The rest of the time he had to ship everywhere to run.”

BULLET GONE ASTRAY TO HOPEFUL

Four Horsemen Racing Stable and Lady Lindsay Racing Stables' undefeated **Bullet Gone Astray** (Gone Astray) will ship up from Gulfstream Park for the Sept. 7 GI Hopeful S. on

Saratoga's closing day card. A debut winner in Hallandale June 28, the Henry Collazo trainee annexed the Mountaineer Juvenile S. by nine lengths Aug. 1. "I gave him plenty of time to recuperate," Collazo said.

"He was anxious to get back to the track. After I gave him a week off, he went back to the track and really hasn't missed a beat. He's doing great. I breezed him last Saturday and the decision was made to go to the Hopeful Sunday. He came out of the breeze so good." As for stretching out an additional furlong to the seven-panel distance of the Hopeful, Collazo offered, "I don't think seven furlongs is going to be a problem. I don't think two turns will be a problem, because he's push-button. When you have a horse that's push-button, all you have to do is ride along until you push the button. That's him."

DBS VINTAGE RENEWAL DRAWS TO A CLOSE

Even when a yearling is a good-looking individual, significant pedigree updates make a world of difference to a sales price, and everything fell into place for a Pantile Stud-bred daughter of Paco Boy (Ire) ([lot 286](#)), who topped a vibrant edition of the DBS Premier Sale at a record-equaling 280,000gns.

Her full-brother Galileo Gold (GB) won the G2 Vintage S. at Glorious Goodwood for Al Shaqab Racing in July, and she will eventually race in the Classic-winning colors of Saleh Al Homaizi and Imad Al Sagar, whose homebred Ajaya (GB) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) won Saturday's G2 Gimcrack S.

“For us as breeders we need such fillies, first to race, then to retire as broodmares to Blue Diamond Stud. She has quality and strength and she looks like she will be a lovely mare in time,” explained Saleh Al Homaizi.

“It has been great to

see the results from the stud, with Ajaya and Raucous (GB) first and third in the Gimcrack, and Special Season (GB) winning so well on debut. You could say it has been a special season.”

A total of 31 yearlings sold for £100,000 or more though the two days of the Premier Sale, compared to 21 in 2014 when the top price was £230,000. This year's top price equals that set in 2011 by Gale Force Ten (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}), who went on to win the G3 Jersey S. at Royal Ascot and has just completed his first covering season at the Irish National Stud.

Heightened competition at the top end--most notably from a variety of Arab owners, who accounted for all bar one of the 15 most expensive horses sold--saw increases in every sector in what Managing Director Henry Beeby described as “a superb renewal” of DBS's flagship yearling auction.

Turnover of £17,776,000 was accrued from 416 horses sold across the two days (three fewer than last year) and was up by 14%, while the average of £42,731 represented an improvement of 15% and the £30,000 median was up 11%. Another solid clearance rate of 87% was achieved, just one point short of last year.

The lively second session added £9,475,000 (+23%) to the coffers. The day two average was £46,675 (+27%), and the median was £31,000 (+17%) for the 204 horses sold on Wednesday.

Beeby commented, “this has not happened by accident. We can do nothing without the yearlings and I want to thank every vendor for putting their faith in the DBS team and working with us to produce a catalogue that was as good as ever.”

He continued, “Of course the other part of the equation is the buyers and we have so enjoyed seeing DBS graduates excel again on the track this year. That has driven major players to Doncaster this week and we have seen some monumental bidding battles.”

Galicuix a Gem for Pantile Stud...

When the Galileo (Ire) mare Galicuix (GB) went through the ring at Tattersalls in December 2013, Colin Murfitt was pinching himself for being able to pick her up for just 8,000gns. Then just a 5-year-old, she was carrying to Paco Boy (Ire) and already had a colt foal by the same stallion on the ground.

“We brought the mare home and kept looking at her thinking that there must be something wrong with her as we couldn't believe we were able to buy her so cheaply,” said Bo Hicks-Little, the manager of Pantile Stud in Soham for Murfitt, who runs his own construction company.

As it transpires, early indications are that Galicuix was very much a diamond in the rough. Her first foal, Galileo Gold, is now a Group 2 winner, while her second foal is this year's DBS Premier Sale-topper. To add further luster to a rapidly improving page, Galicuix's half-brother Goldream (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}) has won this season's G1 King's Stand S. and G3 Palace House S. **Cont. p8**

With his background in building it was a natural step for owner-breeder Murfitt to create his own stud on fenland to the north of Newmarket. Pantile Stud was developed from scratch with the help of Hicks-Little 11 years ago and on the racecourse its most famous graduate to date is the Listed Chesham S. winner Richard Pankhurst (GB) (Raven's Pass), who was bred by John Gosden's wife, Rachel Hood, a client of the stud.

As Gosden said at the time of the colt's Royal Ascot success, "It's beyond exciting to have a horse that Rachel bred at Pantile Stud in the Fens. It's unusual to breed a horse in the Fens but they can grow a good horse there--they grow a lot of good vegetables, so why not a horse?"

This view will now be shared by those who saw the well-grown Paco Boy filly, who was offered for sale through Robin Sharp and Malcolm Bryson's Houghton Bloodstock. Hicks-Little recalled, "She was the sweetest foal and has always been very straightforward. As she was in the parade ring I was flicking through my phone looking at selfies I have taken with her. She's an absolute dream of a filly--she was a super foal and she just blossomed. This is the biggest sales result we've had at Pantile Stud. Robin and Malcolm have done a terrific job with her."

Houghton Bloodstock enjoyed a good day at Doncaster on Wednesday, their draft including a colt by Poet's Voice (GB) ([lot 321](#)) out of three-time U.S. winner Hunter's Fortune (Charismatic) who sold to John Ferguson for £140,000.


Darley Digs Deep for Dark Angel...

John Ferguson was not at Doncaster for the opening day of the sale, but he made his presence felt on

Wednesday when buying five yearlings for just shy of £1 million. His two most expensive purchases of the day were both sons of Dark Angel (Ire) out of Exceed And Excel (Aus) mares, with the highest-priced colt of the sale being the full-brother to G2 Superlative S. winner Birchwood (Ire), who was consigned as [lot 372](#) by his breeder, Guy O'Callaghan of Grangemore Stud. Birchwood was bought by David Armstrong as a yearling for 77,000gns last October, and Godolphin swooped to buy him in training after he'd won his first two starts for Richard Fahey. Ferguson ensured that, should lightning strike twice, his brother will start his racing career in the royal blue silks when parting with £270,000 and seeing off challenges for the colt from Ross Doyle and Amanda Skiffington.

"One has to start taking Dark Angel very seriously--he's a stallion who is doing very well. He's come through the ranks and he's rapidly made it to the top table," said Ferguson, who also bought Yeomanstown Stud's Dark Angel colt ([lot 297](#)) out of juvenile winner Golden Rosie (Ire) (Exceed And Excel {Aus}) for £240,000.

For Guy O'Callaghan, the sale of Birchwood's brother sealed a successful two days in Doncaster after he sold a pinhooked Dark Angel filly for £180,000 on Tuesday and another daughter of the same stallion ([lot 347](#)) for a client for £125,000. He said, "I bred the colt from a mare I claimed for £10,000. Birchwood was her first foal and then there was this one. She has another Dark Angel colt at foot and is in foal to Slade Power (Ire)."

The dam of the top colt, Layla Jamil (Ire) (Exceed And Excel {Aus}), won twice over seven furlongs for Mick Channon and made her final racecourse appearance when finishing eighth in the claimer in which she caught O'Callaghan's attention. **Cont. p9**

“She puts plenty of strength into her offspring,” he continued. “I felt coming here I had a good bunch of horses but it’s wonderful when it all comes together and it happens. It means everything to me to have a result like this when I’m doing it under my own banner now.”

“If you bring a good-looking horse here it will sell,” he added. “All the big buyers are here--Shadwell, Darley, the Al Thanis.”

Powerplay From Leading Buyers...

The leaderboard was indeed dominated by big-name buyers, including David Redvers acting for Qatar Racing, who bought a colt by Pivotal (GB) ([lot 378](#)) from Croom House Stud for £250,000.

A first foal, he is out of the winning Holy Roman Emperor (Ire) mare Loreto (Ire), whose half-siblings Drumfire (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) and Cabaret (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) are both group winners. The family has already worked well with Pivotal, who is the sire of another of Loreto’s siblings, Ho Choi (GB), winner of the Listed Queen’s Silver Cup in Hong Kong and runner-up in the G2 Gimcrack S. when trained in Scotland by Linda Perratt.

Shadwell added another 10 yearlings to the ten bought of the first day for a total outlay of £2,204,000. Those purchases included the top-priced yearling in the sale by Born To Sea (Ire) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}), the freshman half-brother to Galileo (Ire) and Sea The Stars (Ire). Consigned as [lot 281](#) by Rathbarry Stud--who bought him as a foal for 65,000gns--the colt out of the King’s Best mare Frances Stuart rocketed to £230,000.

“He was very athletic, and although the sire is unproven, he’s by Invincible Spirit and out of Urban Sea, so you have to give him a chance,” said Gold. “John Gosden saw the horse and loved him. At this particular sale I’ve been looking at horses this week with the trainers and trying to buy horses they like.”


Born To Sea, who started his stud career standing for €10,000 at Rathasker Stud, moved to the Aga Khan’s Giltown Stud to stand alongside Sea The Stars this season. His yearling average for five sold at the DBS Premier Sale was £89,400.

Gold also signed for [lot 393](#), the Grove Stud-consigned son of Dutch Art (GB), at £205,000gns. The half-brother to listed winner Master Of War (GB) (Compton Place {GB}) had cost Brendan Holland 150,000gns at Tattersalls in December, making him the most expensive pinhook of the sale.

The final day of yearling action this month at Doncaster takes place Thursday with the DBS Silver Sale, which starts at 10 a.m. local time.

"They attract every year a large bunch of overseas buyers in search of the right profile for the U.S., Australia, Hong Kong, the Dubai carnival, Qatar or Saudi Arabia. The deal is not yet guaranteed to go through, but if it proceeds the new company would be named Paddy Power Betfair, with Paddy Power shareholders owning 52% and Betfair 48%. In a statement issued to the stock exchange today, the companies said, "the possible merger would create one of the world's largest public online betting and gaming companies by revenue with enlarged scale, capability and distinctive and complementary brands. The combination has compelling strategic logic and represents an attractive opportunity for both companies to enhance their position in online betting and gaming and to deliver synergies, customer benefits and shareholder value."

The announcement of the potential merger follows the news last month that Ladbrokes and Gala Coral will merge to become the biggest bookmaker in Britain. Paddy Power Betfair is expected to maintain a significant presence in Britain and Ireland while pursuing international growth opportunities, including in the U.S. and Australia.

"If the ground stays good and fast, we will look forward to seeing him run," said trainer Aidan O'Brien.

Gleneagles has not been seen since taking the G1 St James's Palace S. at Royal Ascot June 16, and will race beyond a mile for the first time at Leopardstown while seeking his fifth Group 1 win.

Should things go his way, Gleneagles is set to meet a star-studded field in the Irish Champion that could also include G1 Epsom Derby winner **Golden Horn (GB)** (Cape Cross {Ire}); his recent Juddmonte International conqueror **Arabian Queen (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire}); and G1 Prince of Wales's S. victor **Free Eagle (Ire)** (High Chaparral {Ire}).

There is also the [G1] Champion S. to fall back on, so the horse still has plenty of options."

Currently favored for the historic Classic is Tabor, Smith and Magnier's **Order Of St George (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), who is 3-1 after winning The Curragh's G3 Irish St Leger Trial S. over 14 furlongs last weekend.

"Treve is the one, obviously, and then Golden Horn and Jack Hobbs may go there as well," he said. "They are all good horses, but we like our horse."

Cumani also provided an update on Jon Kelly's exciting 2-year-old filly **Beautiful Morning (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}), who broke her maiden at second asking in a competitive York event last week. The 650,000gns Tattersalls purchase is the first foal out of Date With Destiny (Ire) (George Washington {Ire}), herself the lone produce of her four-time Group 1-winning ill-fated sire.

"She did very well," the conditioner said. "We haven't quite decided on her next target yet but she came out of the race well. She'll run one more time this year; she's got plenty of options."

Those options include the G2 Rockfel S. Sept. 25 and the G1 Fillies Mile Oct. 9, for which Beautiful Morning holds entries. **Cont. p12**

HUNTER VALLEY MINE APPROVED

Coal miners in Australia's Hunter Valley have received preliminary approval to expand their mining pits in what could be a devastating turn of events for local Thoroughbred operations, including Darley and Coolmore's Australian satellites.

The expansion proposal by the mining company, Anglo American, was rejected last year by the Planning and Assessment Commission for concerns of its affects on local studs and wineries. The New South Wales planning and development department, however, reportedly gave preliminary approval for a scaled back version of the plans this week.

"They have basically relied on the mining proponents' revised environmental impact statement, which states that they are going to mine now on a much smaller footprint and that they have come back behind a buffer line," Darley Australia's Managing Director Henry Plumtre told *Racing.com*. "What they have actually done is instead of being 500 meters from the front gates at [Darley] Woodlands and Coolmore, they are now going to be 900 meters. They have moved the mining footprint 400 meters, which is completely irrelevant to the main problem. The bigger issue, which this government is ignoring--and it is something that we have asked them to think about--is the question of what happens to that region in the next 25 years."

Those against the mines cite that the industry has a short lifespan; once the land is mined, it is no longer usable, and thus mining has long-term negative implications. *Mining.com* reports that under the revised proposal, "the open pit will have to remain behind a natural ridge line and leave a buffer zone...resulting in about 100 million tonnes of coal resource being left untapped."

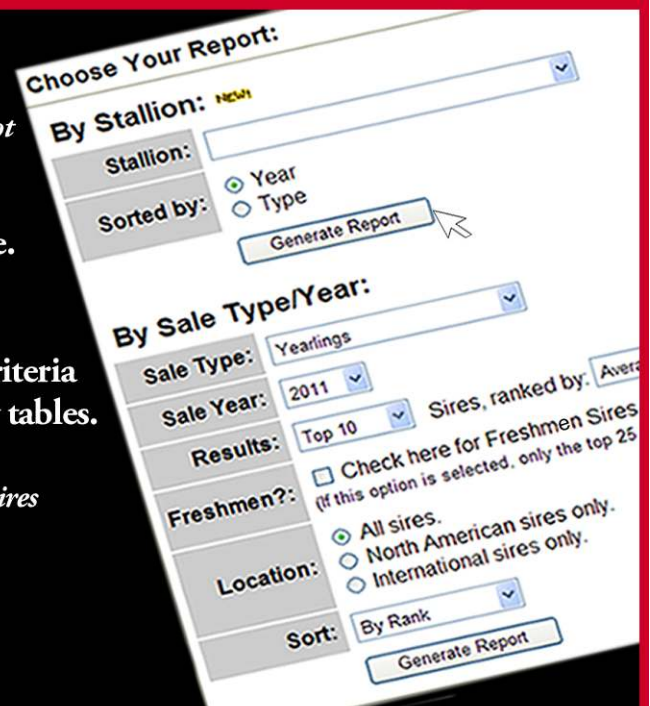

NOTABLE GAINS AT OBS AUGUST

The first of open two sessions of the Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's August Yearling Sale saw notable gains in both average and median as well as a drop in RNAs. A total of 206 yearlings sold for a gross of \$3,109,700 during Wednesday's session, which was good for an average of \$15,096, up 14.6% from last year. There were 54 RNAs, which was a dip from 94 last year, for an RNA rate of 20.8%. The median of \$10,250 was up 13.9% from 2014. The sale was topped by [hip 463](#), a filly by Broken Vow. The filly was consigned by Southern Cypress Stables LLC, Agent II and went to H & E Ranch for \$70,000. The bay is out of Morning Sky (Mt. Livermore), who is a daughter of graded stakes winner Radiant Megan.

Summerfield was the top consignor for the session, selling 28 horses for a total of \$503,000. De Meric Stables was the session's top buyer, purchasing four hips for a combined \$155,500. The open yearling sale's final session begins Thursday at 11 a.m. and will be streamed live on the OBS website.

While a minor stone bruise forced **Sylven Park** (Wildcat Heir) to scratch from an intended start at Saratoga in late July, the promising turf sprinter proved well worth the wait with a second straight impressive tally at Gulfstream Park Sunday afternoon.

A debut dead-heat second in Hallandale Mar. 26, Sylven Park tipped his hand as one to watch after covering his final eighth in :10.98 in a visually impressive come-from-behind maiden win over the Churchill lawn June 25 ([video](#)). The bay overcame a

wide journey to record his second straight decision in an optional claimer this weekend, good for a career high 84 Beyer Speed Figure.

Since claiming Sylven Park's dam for a mere \$5,000 out of her career finale at Mountaineer in the summer of 2010 with the purpose of breeding, co-owner and breeder Nathan McCauley has always had high hopes for Birdie Birdie (El Prado {Ire})'s first foal. Birdie Birdie, an earner of a shade over \$100,000 in 15-career starts, won four times, including a maiden special weight and a first-level allowance at Del Mar. Sylven Park's second dam Dominique's Show (Theatrical {Ire}) is an unraced half-sister to European champion One Cool Cat (Storm Cat). The 10-year-old Birdie Birdie's 2-year-old colt Free Rose (Munnings) is currently in training with Cal Lynch and is nearing a debut at Parx. Birdie Birdie produced a filly by Maclean's Music in 2014 and a filly by Curlin in 2015. She was bred to Temple City this spring.

"I've always been high on him," McCauley said of Sylven Park. "I claimed his mom for \$5,000 and bred her to my favorite stallion, [the late] Wildcat Heir. There is a lot of sentimental value just to begin with. He was a really nice foal and a great yearling. I never planned to sell him; we always planned to race him. Since day one as a 2-year-old, he always flashed a lot of ability. He has a great way of going and has a great mind. He had some baby issues last year and we just gave him time."

He continued, "It's been incredible just watching him. He's my first homebred. I've been around horses the last decade or so. It's been very satisfying. And I still don't think we've seen the best of him yet."

While growing up in Lexington, Kentucky, the 32-year-old became interested in racing by attending the GI Kentucky Derby with his family, including his slightly younger brother and Sylven Park's co-owner and trainer Tevis. Their father Ron owns the family's McCauley Farm, which is run by their youngest brother, Alex, and is located 20 minutes away from Keeneland. The McCauleys partnered with Barry Abrams to own their first racehorse, 2008 GI Las Virgenes S. heroine Golden Doc A (Unusual Heat). *cont. p2*

Looking for a change, Nathan McCauley moved to Nashville, Tennessee, five years ago and launched the car dealership Providence Auto Group. Introduced to the car business by his father, he has worked in the industry since graduating high school.

“We started going to the Derby and I just got the horseracing bug,” McCauley explained. “For me, I went from a casual fan to a diehard follower of the sport when Afleet Alex won the [GI] Preakness [S. in 2005]. I was just a huge fan of his and that was kind of a game changer for me. We bought our first racehorse Golden Doc A in 2007. We just had incredible luck with her and she was an amazing filly. Tevis took out his training license a couple years after that and I got into the bloodstock side of it then, too.”

There are plenty of options for McCauley’s current star--named after a neighborhood in the Volunteer State--going forward. They include: an allowance race at Kentucky Downs next month; the GII Jefferson Cup going a mile at Churchill Downs Sept. 26; or awaiting the prestigious Keeneland fall meet. The GII Nearctic S. at Woodbine Oct. 18 is also on the radar for Sylvan Park moving forward as well.

But for now, McCauley and the team are just enjoying the ride.

“I gave a share away to a number of my friends from Tennessee and also my brothers so we could enjoy him together,” McCauley concluded. “We’re going to take our time with him. We’ve had some nice horses over the years and there’s a feeling around everybody that he could be up there with the best of them. We’re just going to take it one step at a time and hope that he is.” --*Steve Sherack*

THREE STAKES ADDED TO DEL MAR FALL

A trio of stakes races have been added for Del Mar’s second fall meet, the track announced Wednesday. The GII Goldikova S., Golden State Juvenile and Golden State Juvenile Fillies--all \$200,000 races effectively “borrowed” from Santa Anita this year--bring the purse value of Del Mar’s 17 fall stakes to \$2.7 million. Highlights among the Del Mar fall schedule are the grassy GI Hollywood Derby for sophomores Nov. 28 and GI Matriarch S. for female turf milers Nov. 29. “We’ll be emphasizing turf racing and offering a half dozen stakes for 2-year-olds,” Del Mar Thoroughbreds Club’s executive vice president for racing Tom Robbins said in a release. “Our Thanksgiving weekend finish will find us on the grass for six stakes at every level, which will be lucrative for our horsemen and exciting for our fans.” Del Mar will race on a Thursday through Sunday schedule, with post time at 12:30 p.m. every day except Thanksgiving, when racing will begin at 11 a.m. and end at 2:30 p.m. Visit dmtc.com for the complete stakes schedule.

Da Big Hoss ran second in a 1 1/16-mile turf optional claimer at Fair Grounds Mar. 28 and scored in a \$50,000 tagger beneath the Twin Spires for Gary and Mary West and Wayne Catalano June 21. Claimed out of that race by these connections, the chestnut was promoted to first after a wide journey, when the reopposing Global Strike (Smart Strike) was taken down for interference with another rival in a 1 3/8-mile Spa turf contest July 31. One of the more fancied runners for this marathon turf affair--

restricted to horses who had not won a graded stakes on the grass in 2015--the 4-year-old dropped anchor second last in the early stages, as Global Strike showed the way through an unhurried three quarters in 1:18.68. He began to inch closer as the field entered the final turn. Da Big Hoss took command abruptly at the half-mile marker as Global Strike gave way and was given an enthusiastic hands-and-heels ride by Irad Ortiz, Jr to outlast the late charge of Holiday Star and earn his first black-type badge. “He’s a route turf horse,” said winning trainer Mike Maker. “Always consistent, lightly raced, very attractive horse and everybody liked him.
