## NYRA CONCLUDES RECORD-SETTING 2015 SARATOGA MEET

The 147th Saratoga racing meet came to a close Monday with a record handle of \$648,272,805, which is a 13.5% increase from last year's all-source wagering. This marked a significant jump from the previous record of \$590,187,876 set in 2012.

On-track handle also set a new record of \$157,547,599, compared to the 2012 record of \$150,637,998. The 2015 meet also saw record purses, a double-digit increase in dining and concessions revenue and a rise

in paid attendance, which totaled 1,065,625 for the 40-day session.

"The 2015 season at Saratoga Race Course was truly fabulous and is one which we won't soon forget," said NYRA CEO and President Chris Kay. "Our fans enjoyed 40 days of world-class Thoroughbred racing, spectacular weather and a series of guest enhancements to this venerable sporting venue. All of us at the New York Racing Association are deeply appreciative of the support we have received from the owners, trainers, jockeys, stakeholders, fans and the community as a whole during this historic season at Saratoga. Their dedication to the industry and love for the sport continue to cement Saratoga as the premier race meet in North America." *Cont. p3*

## NUMBERS UP AT CLOSE OF DEL MAR MEET

Del Mar closed its 76th summer meet Monday on a positive note with total handle up, fields sizes holding steady despite an increase in racing and a good response to their new dirt track. The track extended its summer session to eight weeks for the first time, which added four more racing days compared to 2014.

The 40-day meet, which ran from July 16 to Sept. 7, saw a 9.8% increase in handle from \$442,626,307 in 2014 to \$486,060,724 this season. While average daily on-track handle was down 14.6%, the average daily off-track wagering increased 5.5%.

On-track attendance was down 12%, with an average of 14,558 this term compared to 16,535 last year. The total attendance for the 2015 meet was 582,324. *Cont. p4*

## ANTONOE CONTINUES HER 'RISE'

Bolstered by the subsequent wins of the vanquished in a debut performance which oozed class and attracted a 'TDN Rising Star' tag going 7 1/2 panels at Deauville in her only prior start Aug. 7, **Antonoe** (First Defence) was just as impressive in winning her black-type bow in Tuesday's G3 Prix D'Aumale as she was in that 6 1/2-length debut romp. Seizing command after the initial strides, she maintained control until set alight approaching the final quarter-mile and powered clear under minimal urging in the closing stages to easily outclass her rivals for a career high.

"She really is a lovely filly and won very well in her debut at Deauville," commented trainer Pascal Bary. "You are always a little worried going into the second race because you hope they'll confirm that initial promise, but you can never be certain they will. She did that in some style today and, if everything is well, she will return in the [Oct. 4 G1] Prix Marcel Boussac at Longchamp."

Antonoe's unraced dam Ixora was sold to Klawervlei Stud for \$100,000 while in foal to Successful Appeal at the 2013 Keeneland November sale. The resulting foal is now a yearling colt named Decision Reversed.

The meet was highlighted by a sold out crowd of 50,000 who gathered to see Triple Crown winner American Pharoah (Pioneerof the Nile) run in the GI Travers S. Aug. 29, just one day after 15,000 people packed the grandstand to watch the champion's morning gallop. The Zayat Stables homebred finished a valiant second to Keen Ice (Curlin), who came running late to record the fastest winning Travers time in 14 years.

The Travers day card, which featured a total of six prestigious Grade I events, reached an all-source wagering record of \$49,668,754, which was a 24.5% increase over Travers day 2014.

"On behalf of the men and women of the New York Racing Association and the fans of our great sport, I again would like to express my deep and abiding appreciation to owner Ahmed Zayat, his son and racing manager, Justin, and Hall of Fame Trainer Bob Baffert, for bringing 'The People's Horse' to Saratoga," said Kay.

Kay continued, "We wish the Zayats, Bob and their champion colt the best of luck as they train toward the Breeders' Cup, culminating a historic and unforgettable campaign."

“Both tracks performed very well,” said Del Mar Thoroughbred Club President and CEO Joe Harper. “We had a strong racing product and generated momentum going into the fall season. There is a new normal, not just at Del Mar, but with California racing in general. More racing here means more opportunities, but also less immediacy for our fans. We will continue to adapt as Del Mar plays a larger role in the industry.”

Field size held steady for the third straight year at 8.8 horses per race despite the addition of 28 races to the 2015 meet. This was also the first meet run on the new dirt track, which was changed over from synthetic during the winter.

“It’s a good track, a safe track,” Hall of Fame jockey Mike Smith said. “I’ve heard they’re going to add a bit more sand to it after the meet is done and I think that will be a good thing. They’ll make a good thing even better.”

Del Mar will host its second fall meet, which will run for five weeks instead of four this year, from Oct. 29 to Nov. 29.

the time. He won his first start in good style, but showed a lot of immaturity that day and we hope that he will be a little more focused on this occasion.

The most important thing is that he has another nice experience." Among his rivals is another Deauville debut winner in His Highness The Aga Khan's **Vedevani (Fr)** (Dubawi {Ire}), a son of the G1 Prix Saint-Alary winner Vadawina (Ire) (Unfuwain). Successful over 7 1/2 furlongs Aug. 7, the bay may have more potential than Sheikh Hamdan bin Mohammed Al Maktoum's July 25 Listed Winkfield S. score **Sixth Sense (Ire)** (Shamardal) but the latter represents the Mark Johnston stable and warrants respect on that basis alone.

**BIG GUNS STAND THEIR GROUND**

All the leading contenders appear on the list at the latest forfeit stage for the G1 Irish Champion S. at Leopardstown this Saturday. A dry forecast for the week up until Saturday morning has been welcomed by the track officials and by connections of most of the intended runners. This means the mouth watering clash between star 3-year-olds **Golden Horn (GB)** (Cape Cross {Ire}) and **Gleneagles (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) looks increasingly likely to happen. However this race is not all about the Classic generation. G1 Prince Of Wales's S. winner **Free Eagle (Ire)** (High Chaparral {Ire}), his immediate victim that day and defending champion **The Grey Gatsby (Ire)** (Mastercraftsman {Ire}) and veteran MG1SW **Cirrus Des Aigles (Fr)** (Even Top {Ire}) are all intended runners. We are all set to stage one of the best day's racing ever seen in Ireland. We would encourage people to come early on Saturday and become part of this historic occasion."

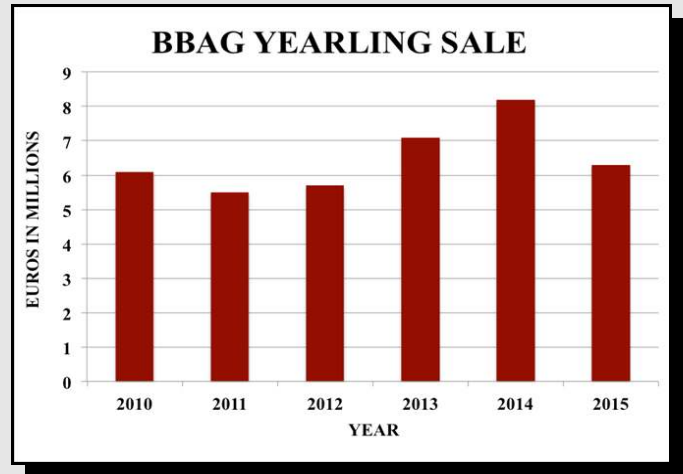

### OCTOBER YEARLING CATALOGUE RELEASED

Arqana have catalogued 597 yearlings for their October Sale which is scheduled to take place over four days Oct. 20-23. The catalogue, which is available [online](#), is divided into two sections: Part I, which includes the first day with 192 yearlings and Part II, which comprises the balance over the other three days. For the first time this year, the October Yearling Sale will begin on a Tuesday rather than a Monday. Also, selling will commence at 11am each day, except for the Wednesday session which will begin at 3:30 p.m. Explaining these changes Arqana President Eric Hoyer said, "We felt that the Monday start didn't allow enough time for inspections as many French-based professionals are racing at Longchamp or elsewhere the day before, while our British and Irish customers also have a busy weekend with British Champions Day. With the Tuesday start, there will be two full days dedicated to inspections as all the horses catalogued on the first two days will be available for showing from Sunday morning."

This sale is of course synonymous with Treve (Fr) (Motivator {GB}) being bought back by connections for €22,000. However recent G1 Prix Jean Romanet winner Odeliz (Fr) (Falco) was also bought for the same sum. Other Group 1 winners to have been unearthed at this sale include Charm Spirit (Ire) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}), Avenir Certain (Fr) (Le Havre {Ire}), and The Grey Gatsby (Ire) (Mastercraftsman {Ire}). This year all the major French farms have yearlings on offer.

Numerically, La Motteraye Consignment offer the largest bunch with 32 yearlings, including the only offering by Sea The Stars (Ire) (Cape Cross {Ire}), a colt, catalogued as lot [136](#). Haras des Capucines have 31 in the catalogue including lot [62](#), a Dansili (GB) (Danehill) half brother to Group 2 winner Laugh Out Loud (GB) (Clodovil {Ire}).

**September 11, 1976...Jockey John Oldham** and his wife, jockey **Suzanne Picou**, became the first husband and wife to compete in the same parimutuel race. Oldham finished second and Picou was 11th in the third race at Latonia.

**September 12, 1970...Nijinsky II** won the St. Leger S. and became the 15th winner of England's Triple Crown. No three-year-old has completed the Triple since.

**September 13, 1974...Trainer D. Wayne Lukas** notched his first Thoroughbred stakes victory, saddling his own three-year-old colt **Harbor Hauler** to take the second division of the Foothill S. at Pomona. The winner's share of the purse was \$6,312.

**September 13, 1989...Jockey Pat Day** won eight of the nine races on the card at Arlington International Racecourse.

**September 14, 1853...West Australian** won the St. Leger S. by three lengths and became England's first Triple Crown winner.
