POPE HOLDS STRONG HAND AT KEENELAND

Over the past three years, Mandy Pope's Whisper Hill Farm has gone on a much-publicized broodmare buying spree, most notably with the high-profile purchases of Havre de Grace and Plum Pretty just hours apart in November 2012, and sprint champion Groupie Doll in 2013. Pope's stellar broodmare band will undergo its first commercial

test with seven Book 1 offerings during next week's Keeneland September Yearling Sale.

"Obviously, having watched them grow through our sales-prep program--which my crew is very good at--it's been very exciting to watch them grow up and mature," Pope said. "And they've all done really well. It's very exciting. At the same time, to watch them sell, it's going to be tearful also."

"I think the highest I've ever sold anything for is probably around \$550,000," Pope continued. "So this is a big year for me--to see what these kind of horses are going to bring." Cont. p3

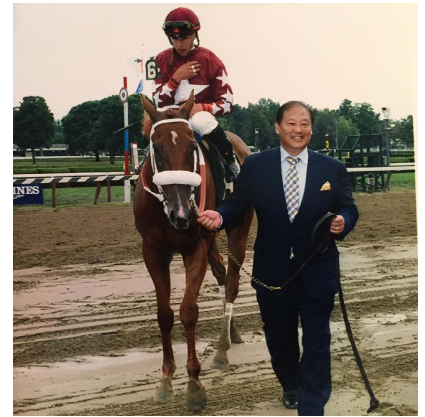
GLENEAGLES-GOLDEN HORN ON BUT IN THE BALANCE

Leopardstown officials were on Thursday intent on ensuring that the keenly anticipated stand-off between **Gleneagles (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) and **Golden Horn (GB)** (Cape Cross {Ire}) goes ahead, with the G1 QIPCO Irish Champion S. moved to 65 minutes earlier on the card due to concerns about the effects of forecast heavy rain. Following the shift of the race, it will now be the first to be staged on fresh ground on the outside track with the preceding contests on the inside course. The rain is due on Friday, with Saturday predicted to be dry and Nessa Joyce, Leopardstown's racing and operations manager, outlined the management's initiative on Thursday. "We're trying to do as much as we can for our Group 1 races to give them the best ground," she explained. "We'd already planned in advance by making two tracks, the first four on the inside and the last four on the outside. We are going to have the Qipco Irish Champion S. as the first race run on the outside track. It hasn't been raced on at all this year." Cont. p14

SETTING 'SAIL' FOR THE CUP

After lowering Saratoga's Mellon turf course record to 1:00.46 for 5 1/2 furlongs in the \$100,000 Smart N Fancy S. Aug. 30 (video), streaking sophomore filly **Lady Shipman** (Midshipman) will set her sights on the upcoming GI Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint. Tabbed as a 'TDN Rising Star' following her sensational grass debut at Gulfstream Park West last November (video), the Randall E. Lowe homebred has won eight of 10 career starts for trainer Kathleen O'Connell--all against females--including six stakes races. She has recorded triple digit Beyer Speed Figures in each of her last three wins.

Pope Holds Strong Hand at Keeneland cont.

Pope's September offerings, which will be consigned by Wayne and Cathy Sweezey's Timber Town, include the first foal out of GI Kentucky Oaks winner Plum Pretty (Medaglia d'Oro). The 7-year-old mare was purchased for \$4.2 million at the 2012 Keeneland November sale. Her Distorted Humor colt sells as [hip 514](#).

"He's awesome," Wayne Sweezey, who also boards Pope's mares at his Timber Town Farm, commented of the chestnut. "This particular horse is exceptional--he's probably one of the best horses we've raised. He's just beautifully balanced and a lovely, lovely individual. We're really excited about bringing him over there."

[Hip 116](#) is a daughter of War Front out of group-placed Betterbetterbetter (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}). Pope purchased the mare, with this foal in utero, for \$5.2 million at the 2013 Fasig-Tipton November sale.

"She's very well made," Sweezey said of the bay filly. "She is out of a Galileo mare--there are seven highweighted horses in the first three dams. And she has a great attitude. She a very balanced, great walker. As they say, she ticks all the right boxes. She has all the attributes that you'd want if you are trying to buy a high-priced filly to race. She's going to be a very exciting horse for us to sell."

Also at the 2013 Fasig November sale, Pope purchased Speed Succeeds (Gone West), in foal to Street Cry (Ire), for \$1 million. The resulting colt is a half-brother to Grade I winner Brilliant Speed (Dynaformer) and to graded stakes-placed Souper Speedy (Indian Charlie).

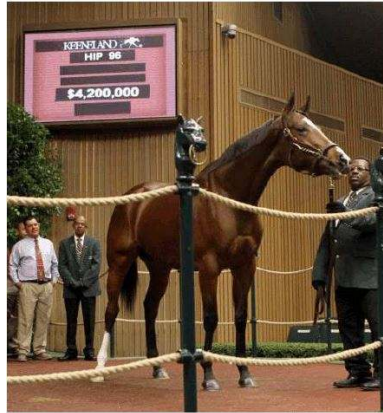
"He is a tremendous Street Cry colt," Sweezey said of [hip 643](#). "He is a big, pretty chestnut colt with a great big walk. He's very handsome, has good conformation and is just a lovely horse."

One noticeable absence from the Keeneland catalogue is the first foal out of Havre de Grace (Saint Liam). Pope purchased the 2011 Horse of the Year for \$10 million at the 2012 Fasig-Tipton November sale. The 8-year-old mare produced a filly by Tapit last year.

Pope explained the sex of the foals is a major factor in the decision to race or sell.

"A big part of the decision is colts and fillies," she confirmed. "We'll sell more colts and keep the fillies. So you won't see Havre de Grace's filly sell. She is extremely lovely and, being a filly, I'm definitely going to keep her. Whereas Plum Pretty's was a colt, so he is going to the sale. If he was a filly, he might be being kept also."

A longtime commercial breeder, Pope has become more involved in racing in recent years. **Cont. p4**

Her colors were recently carried to a second-place finish in the GI Spinaway S. by 'TDN Rising Star' Tap to It (Tapit).

"I'm having a good time with the racing," Pope said. "And these horses that are going through the sale will have reasonable reserves on them. Obviously they have value to me as well as to other people as far as being racehorses. But when we do take them, our intent is to sell them."

Sweezy is looking forward to a big September sale. In addition to the Whisper Hill horses, his consignment also includes [hip 155](#), a colt by Tapit out of Cat Myth (Hennessy), a full-sister to champion Johannesburg. Timber Town is consigning on behalf of Woodslane Farm, breeders of GI Belmont S. winner Tonalist (Tapit).

"He is magnificent," Sweezy said of the yearling. "He is lovely and he is going to be really popular."

As excited as he is about this year's crop, Sweezy thinks 2016 might be even bigger.

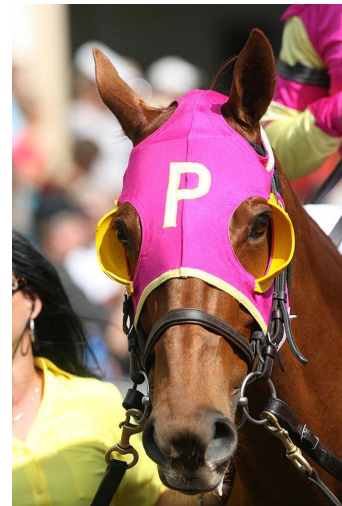
"What is in the pipeline for next year is as exciting, if not more," he commented.

Whisper Hill's next group of yearlings will include the first foal out of two-time champion female sprinter Groupie Doll. Pope purchased the now 7-year-old mare for \$3.1 million at the 2013 Keeneland November sale. Her Tapit colt was born premature, but is now doing well, according to Sweezy.

"Groupie Doll's baby--Mandy really made a commitment to save that foal early on and he's grown into a tremendous foal," Sweezy said. "He's doing great. He's cool. So he's there for next year."

"And we have a War Front out of Havre de Grace we'll sell," Sweezy continued. "And Plum Pretty has a War Front that we'll sell. And there are a couple of Tapits floating around. It's really super watching them come up and then to have the opportunity to represent them at the sales."

Lowe, a 58-year-old retired insurance executive, also raced Lady Shipman's dam Sumthingtotalkabt (Mutakddim), a five-time winner of \$172,123. Lady Shipman is the second foal from the 12-year-old, who brought \$28,000 as a BAROCT yearling. Just Talkin (Midshipman), a 2-year-old full-sister to Lady Shipman, was recently sold privately to leading New York owner Michael Dubb. She also has a yearling colt by Leroidesanimaux (Brz) and a weanling colt by Treasure Beach (GB). Sumthingtotalkabt was bred to Poseidon's Warrior this spring.

"Sumthingtotalkabt is a very interesting horse," said Lowe, who splits his time between Los Angeles and Honolulu. "She was trained by Wally Dollase. I've owned racehorses for over 30 years now, and the reason why I kept her for breeding was that one day at Keeneland she ran 6 1/2 furlongs in 1:14 1/5 and got beaten a neck for the whole thing [in an allowance race]. The horse that beat her Lady Belsara went on to win a graded stakes [GIII Chicago H.] after that, so I thought that maybe she could pass along her speed to her offspring, which is Lady Shipman. All of my horses are raised/broken/trained by Ryan Barbazon in Florida and I've been pretty lucky with Sumthingtotalkabt because she has thrown five good, correct babies."

Consigned by Pleasant Acres Farm, Lady Shipman (click [here](#) for catalogue page) RNA'd for \$35,000 at last year's OBSAPR 2-year-old sale after breezing an eighth in a bullet :9 4/5.

"Ryan Barbazon said that she was the fastest horse that he'd ever trained," Lowe recalled. "So, going into the sale when she worked an eighth in :9 4/5 and galloped out three furlongs in :33, I said, 'Wow, this is really something.' But it was very disappointing--she was scoped 14 times--and nobody wanted to buy her. The announcer even stopped the auction to remind everyone that she was the fastest filly in the sale, but nobody seemed to acknowledge that. A couple of bloodstock agents tried to buy her privately afterwards. They were \$25,000 away from my asking price, so I decided to keep her."

Growing up in Los Angeles, Lowe began attending the races with his father at the age of seven. Fast forward to 1985. After cashing a six-figure Pick 6 score at Santa Anita and teaming up with a legendary owner/breeder, Lowe was quickly on his way.

"[Golden Eagle Farm founder] John C. Mabee had just started Golden Eagle Insurance and I was already in the business at the time," Lowe explained. "Believe it or not, I had bet a \$96 Pick 6 ticket at Santa Anita and I was the only winning ticket. After taxes, I took about \$30,000 in cash and \$100,000 in a check. I went to John Mabee and asked if I could invest in his company. He took me to Del Mar and interviewed me and made me his first broker in Los Angeles. It was just amazing that he had that much confidence and faith in me."

Inspired by the tremendous success of his late friend and former colleague--who raced and bred standouts such as Best Pal, Excellent Meeting, General Challenge, et al--Lowe decided to give breeding a chance.

"When John passed away [in 2002], I was down to one racehorse at the time and she got hurt," Lowe explained. "I thought, 'Why can't I emulate him and try this whole thing over again? That's why I started breeding racehorses.'"

Lady Shipman has quickly become the centerpiece of Lowe's five-horse operation.

A debut third on dirt in Miami last October, the chestnut has won eight of her nine subsequent starts, including the OBS Sprint S. Jan. 27, Pimlico's Stormy Blues S. Apr. 18, Monmouth's Crank It Up S. June 6 and Saratoga's Coronation Cup S. Aug. 3. Her lone defeat on grass came when stretched to seven furlongs and third in Belmont's Wait a While S. May 16.

"I couldn't be any more proud leading her into the winner's circle," Lowe concluded. "To come from humble beginnings--I wasn't born into this sport--and to see it finally maturing after 30 years, it's almost like watching your kid go out there in little league, and all of sudden, he hits a grand slam homerun and all of the college and pro scouts are looking at him. I have that kind of feeling with Lady Shipman."

"He's doing great and came out of the Million in awesome shape," Midwest principal Richard Papiese said. "We had a few options of places to take him for a final Breeders' Cup prep, but we decided on the Shadwell Mile because we believe it is what is best for the horse." Papiese continued, "There are a few reasons to go to Keeneland. First, I think he will benefit from a race over the course. I also like the idea of shortening him up beforehand, as he may have to be laying closer in order to win on the big day." Papiese added, "We thought about going to Laurel for the [GI] Commonwealth Cup [Sept. 19], but we believe he will get a lot more out of the Shadwell than going anywhere else. We always love supporting Laurel and we hope to race there with him in the future." **Cont. p7**

He continued, "It's more about the set-up and running against the best horses. He's also not the greatest shipper and this was best for him in that regard. We feel like it will prepare him perfectly for two consecutive mile and a half races afterward, especially with shipping to Japan and doing so early. Everything will hopefully go well between now and then." Midwest and trainer Richard Brueggemann will also run defending GI Breeders' Cup Sprint winner Work All Week (City Zip) in the GIII Phoenix S. at Keeneland Oct. 2.

With no Godolphin runner in the small line-up, Buick is free to ride for Aidan O'Brien, with Rosegreen stalwart Colm O'Donoghue on the impressive G3 Irish St Leger Trial S. winner **Order of St George (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) and Silvestre de Sousa set to partner the Aug. 6 G3 Ballyroan S. scorer **Fields of Athenry (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}). Rain is forecast on Town Moor, which would benefit Order of St George after he was so impressive when beating the former high-class performer Sea Moon (GB) (Beat Hollow {GB}) by 7 1/2 lengths on soft ground in the Leger Trial at The Curragh Aug. 23. He was a short-head second to Bondi Beach on a livelier surface in the June 28 G3 Curragh Cup, and his stable companion needs the ground to stay on the faster side of good.

Aidan O'Brien, who is focused on the clouds above Leopardstown, is also wary of the weather in the North of England. "There's also lots of rain forecast for Doncaster, so we'll have to wait and see which horse goes where, but the one that won in the Curragh [Order of St George] won on soft so will run in Doncaster," he said.

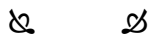

Tiggy Wiggy made a name for herself as last year's standout juvenile sprinting filly, winning six times and finishing second in her other two outings that campaign. After winning the Listed National S. at Sandown in May, she was touched off by Anthem Alexander (Ire) (Starspangledbanner {Aus}) when second in the G2 Queen Mary S. at Royal Ascot.

Tiggy Wiggy bounced back to take the Weatherbys Super Sprint and G2 Lowther S. over the highly regarded Cursory Glance (Distorted Humor), then turned the tables on Anthem Alexander in the Cheveley Park. The bay failed to win in four attempts this year, but did finish third in the G1 1000 Guineas.

"Tiggy Wiggy owed us nothing--we said through the winter that if she never won again it would not matter a jot as she had done us proud--and now she can look forward to a new career," Hannon added. He indicated that Tiggy Wiggy would be sold at auction later this year.

"She'll be let down and will come under the hammer at the end of the year, but she will make a fantastic broodmare for someone. We'll all miss her as she was so popular--she wasn't always the easiest, but she got better with age," he said.

The dark bay, trained for the majority of his career by Chad Brown, won four graded stakes races in 2013 at the age of four, including the GI Hawthorne Gold Cup H. Last seen finishing third behind recent GI Woodward S. winner Liam's Map (Unbridled's Song) in a Belmont optional claimer in June after being transferred to Todd Pletcher, the 6-year-old retires with a record of 20-9-3-2 and earnings of \$1,210,205. "It's with mixed emotions that we have decided to bring Last Gunfighter home," said Glennwood Farm's General Manager Tanya Gunther. "But at age six, it's time to consider the next stage of his career in the breeding shed. His versatility was incredible; he won stakes at five different tracks and at five different distances. In one stretch he won nine of 12 of his starts from three to five, including seven stakes. His Hawthorne Gold Cup win was especially memorable, considering it was just four weeks after his gutsy effort in the [GI] Breeders' Cup Classic. We consider ourselves very fortunate to have had the pleasure of racing homebred Last Gunfighter."

Selway: Lasix Study Proceeding Nicely

Renowned equine veterinarian Dr. Stephen Selway issued a press release late Thursday to update equine professional on progress being made on his study on the use of Lasix in 2-year-old maiden special weight and stakes races at Gulfstream Park.

Selway Lasix Study cont.

"Gulfstream decided to write some non-Lasix races for 2-year-olds and I thought this would be an opp to

be able to evaluate the horses, not only the 2-year-old maidens running without Lasix, but also the ones on Lasix," Selway explained. "This is my last chance to give back to the industry. My wife and staff aren't especially happy about it, but we're getting it done,"

he deadpanned.

While Selway 'commissioned' the study, he felt it was best to allow others to assess the data.

"I contacted some of my clients and we were able to obtain two video endoscopes," he explained. "I didn't feel it was right if I did any scoring of the images, so I asked three industry vets that have had lots of experience to do so. We tried to make it as bulletproof as we can, they don't know if horses are on Lasix or off Lasix, all they have is a number. We'll see where the figures lie and we expect to make it available to the racing community to see what percentage of the horses are bleeding with or without Lasix and to what extent."

To date, Selway reports that 277 endoscopic exams have taken place and that the first 228 sets of images have been forwarded to his colleagues Drs. J. Prendergast, F. Northrup and N. Neittinis. Selway explained that laboratory costs have been absorbed by owner Ahmed Zayat, while Caroline Wilson, Antony Beck, Roy Jackson and John Sikura were instrumental in the acquisition of the endoscopes. Selway anticipates that as many as 500 horses will have been inspected by year's end.

"We need to decide as an industry whether we want these horses to stop getting Lasix and what percentage of horses is at risk of permanent lung damage," he commented. "It'll be interesting, I honestly don't know what we're going to find." *Twitter: @EquinealTDN*

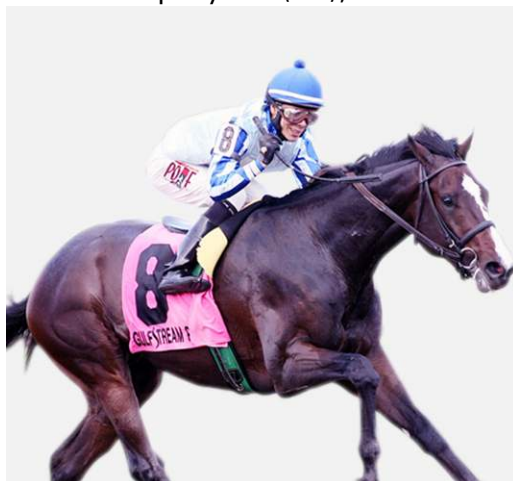
