**KEENELAND SEPTEMBER STARTS MONDAY**

Keeneland's marathon 12-day September Yearling Sale begins Monday morning at 11 a.m. with the first of three Book 1 sessions. Activity was high at the barns over the weekend and sales officials are looking for a strong auction.

"Everybody is here," commented Keeneland's Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell. "There is no change in the enthusiasm for horses, if anything it's increased since last September. The magic of American Pharoah has definitely helped. It has helped elevate the visibility of our sport, which will hopefully bring more people into it. And we look forward to a good sale."

During last year's September sale, 2,819 yearlings sold for a gross of \$279,960,500. The average was \$99,312 and the median was \$50,000. Those figures held largely steady with the sale's break-out 2013 results and Eaton Sales' Reiley McDonald looks for the status quo to continue in 2015.

"I suspect it will pretty much be like last year," McDonald said. "I haven't seen anything here in two days of showing that makes me think otherwise. I haven't seen many new faces, I haven't seen a lack of the old faces. I think the number of shows has been the same. I'd say pretty much what we saw last year is what we'll see this year."

Select Sales will be participating in its sixth yearling sale of the season and the company's Andrew Cary has seen strong demand and enthusiasm coming into the September market.

"The results of the horses coming out of this sale and U.S.-breds winning all over the world further backs up the quality of horse that we raise here," Cary said. "We've got tons of domestic people here, tons of international people here. This is definitely one of the best places in the world to find the best horses. I hope that they stay all the way to the end because we have some good horses selling the last day of the sale, too."

**Keeneland September Preview cont.**

In 2014, Book 1 lasted four sessions and featured 13 seven-figure yearlings, including matching \$2.2-million sales toppers by leading sires Tapit and War Front. There were 762 yearlings catalogued for the four sessions.

This year, Keeneland has shortened Book 1 to three sessions with 724 catalogued and a dark day Thursday before Book 2 starts Friday.

“We are trying to keep buyers mobile,” Russell explained of the change. “What we found out last year

was that by Thursday, we didn't have enough horses for Book 2 in [to the sales barns]. So buyers and consignors said if we put fewer horses in in days one, two and three and then get the Book 2 horses in in time, people can keep moving. Come Wednesday, they've

already looked at all the horses to look at something.”

Gainesway's Michael Herson thinks the change will be a positive for the sale.

“The new structure of Book 1 is very appropriate,” Herson commented. “It will raise the market, there will be more synergy, we will sell more horses each day. The sessions will start a little earlier and there will be more continuity of sessions now that it is three not four days. The last few years, session four in Book 1 has become more difficult to sell out of because people have mentally moved on to Book 2. By moving up the dark day, it will allow for better screening of Book 2 horses by people who have to leave town because of time commitments. So those horses will get additional exposure and consequently will sell better because they will have a bigger following.”

The three Book 1 sessions of the September sale begin at 11 a.m. The remaining sessions of the auction begin at 10 a.m.

**Hip 25, f, Bernardini--West Coast Swing, by Gone West**

*Consigned by Select Sales, agent I*

Out of the stakes-winning and graded stakes placed ‘TDN Rising Star’ West Coast Swing, this yearling is a half-sister to a Tapit juvenile who brought \$900,000 at this year's Fasig-Tipton Florida sale. The mare is a half to graded stakes winner and fellow ‘TDN Rising Star’ Speightster (Speightstown) and stakes winner Paiota Falls (Kris S.) Her dam Dance Swiftly is a full-sister to Canadian champion Dance Smartly. “Bernardini had a huge Saratoga meet, with two Grade I-winning fillies,” commented Select Sales' Andrew Cary. “This filly is an outstanding physical. This bay colt is out of Wild Poppy, a daughter of champion Flanders (Seeking the Gold) and a half to champion Surfside (Seattle Slew). "He was foaled and raised with us," said Denali's Craig Bandoroff. "He's a typical War Front. He looks like a Danzig, but War Front puts so much quality in his horses. He's a really good mover. A pretty straightforward horse, by a sire everybody likes." The March foal is from the family of Sunday's G1 National S. winner and 2014 KEESEP graduate Air Force Blue, also a son of War Front.

**Hip 99, f, War Front--Azzedine, by Mr. Greeley**

This yearling's second dam is multiple graded stakes winner Atelier (Deputy Minister) and she is from the family of Grade I winner Aldiza and champion Althea. "She's got some length and scope and little bit of leg underneath her," said Lane's End's Allaire Ryan. "She has a great presence about her. She carries herself well. And she just has that kind of classy look to her."

**Hip 101, c, More Than Ready--Baffled, by Distorted Humor**

Out of group-placed Baffled, this yearling is a half-brother to multiple Grade I winner and 'TDN Rising Star' Constitution (Tapit) and to graded stakes winner Jacaranda (Congrats). Baffled is a half-sister to Grade I winner Emcee (Unbridled's Song). "This is just a beautiful More Than Ready," said Taylor Made's Mark Taylor. "He's very scopey for the sire, with great balance, a great demeanor and good walk. He's out of a female family that has really taken off. He has a tremendous physical. WIN AND YOU'RE IN®

Ridden by Flavien Prat to a third-place effort as a maiden in the 2013 G1 Prix Jean Prat when under the care of Freddy Head, Mondialiste annexed a Saint-Cloud conditions event in May 2014 and sold for €190,000 at the Arqana July sale. Given the rest of the year off, the bay was a neck second in Doncaster's Lincoln H. Mar. 28 and third in the G3 Earl of Sefton S. at Newmarket 19 days later. Fourteenth--of the 30 runners--in the June 17 Royal Hunt Cup H. at Royal Ascot, he trounced his rivals by 10 lengths in the Listed Pomfret S. at Pontefract July 26 and was exiting a neck success as the 4-1 favorite in the Strensall Aug. 22.

Drawn the rail, but last to load, Obviously mustered through to take up the running without really being asked by Joe Talamo and the duo soon had several lengths on GII Play the King S. upsetter Reporting Star (Circular Quay) and favored Lea while racing well away from the inside over the rain-affected turf course. Kaigun (Northern Afleet), runner-up to Trade Storm last year, settled in midfield while Mondialiste and fellow foreign raider Mr. Owen (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) took up positions at the rear.

Still well out into the middle of the course after a half-mile in a demanding :46.63, Obviously began to feel the pinch, if just a bit, as Reporting Star started to draw in, though the balance had plenty of work to do. As the pace and, probably, the ground began to take its toll on Obviously, Lea was bridging the gap from third and Reporting Star proved a fly in the ointment. Lea finally grabbed his chief market rival inside the final 100 yards, but Mondialiste, one of the last to make the stretch, began picking off horses and Feargal Lynch was lucky enough to poke through three off the fence between Reporting Star and Lea close home en route to the victory. A claim of foul by the connections of Reporting Star against the winner was disallowed.

“He is very tough. You can ride him whatever way you want really,” commented trainer David O’Meara, who has orchestrated the multiple Group 1-winning season of Amazing Maria (Ire) (Mastercraftsman {Ire}). “He’s always sort of there for you when you go for it. He always finishes well. Everything sort of looked good with him, but it is always a concern when you fly him that far from home, like eight hours or whatever we’ve come. But fantastic, a great run.”

Trainer Phil D’Amato was hardly downtrodden with the effort from Obviously, who was making his first start since a fifth in last year’s GI Breeders’ Cup Mile.

“He tried. He had everything going against him here with the soft turf course,” the conditioner offered. “He gutted it out and gave it his all. I think this sets him up really nice for the Breeders’ Cup Mile.”

Occupandiste, a multiple French champion in 1997, is a half-sister to GSW & MG1SP Impressionante (GB) (Danehill), the dam of French highweight and G1 Prix du Jockey Club hero Intello (Ger) (Galileo {Ire}). Mondialiste’s granddam is a half-sister to Irish champion and G1 Irish 1000 Guineas winner Mehthaaf (Nureyev) and champion sprinter Elnadim (Danzig). His fourth dam is blue-hen Fall Aspen.

Runner-up as a maiden to Ami's Holiday (Harlan's Holiday) in last year's Breeders' S. over this course and trip, Interpol was a trip-and-track maiden winner Sept. 20 before kicking off 2015 with an allowance tally going a mile at Gulfstream Mar. 28. An allowance

fourth over this course May 22, he bounced back with a second-level score June 21, but could do no better than a midpack fifth in the GII Nijinsky S. July 19. Friendless in the market for the Aug. 16 GII Sky Classic S. over a more comfortable 10 furlongs, the bay raced relatively handy to the pace

and outslugged his rivals late for a neck victory, earning a career-best 94 Beyer Speed Figure.

There appeared to be a dearth of early speed in the Northern Dancer, and Emma-Jayne Wilson took full advantage. She put Interpol right into the race to sit just off the flank of this year's Breeders' winner Danish Dynaformer (Dynaformer) and the two of them backed the pace down to a crawl, covering the opening half-mile in a methodical :52.28 and had half the journey covered in 1:17.90. Triple Threat enjoyed the best trip, albeit over ground easier than he likes, while Habibi--who had beaten the boys four times at home, including the 2013 G1 New Zealand Derby--lingered at the back

of the back after opting for this spot over the GII Canadian S. Danish Dynaformer and Interpol still had things very much their own way and they turned the field into the daunting Woodbine stretch, but the sophomore began to struggle and Interpol was in front at the quarter pole. Staying on doggedly, the bay kept finding inside the final furlong and lasted over Habibi, who weaved her way from the back of the pack to miss narrowly. Triple Threat just held off GIII American St. Leger hero Lucky Speed (Ire) (Silvano {Ger}) for third.

"I was [comfortable with my position throughout the race]," said Wilson. "[Trainer] Sid [Attard] said earlier this morning with us going a mile and a half we would probably be sitting a little closer. I wasn't sure about the pace make-up. I was happy if I was going to lead him along. I knew as we turned for home if I could get a head in front like last time he'd be real tough. Very few horses can keep their head in front for the entire length of the stretch, but he seems to enjoy it and wants to be there so I just let him run his race."

Interpol's sire won the GI Breeders' Cup Turf over similarly wet ground at Monmouth in 2007. His dam, winner of the 1998 Edgewood S. and runner-up in that year's GI Del Mar Oaks, is a half-sister to fellow Paulson-bred Del Mar Show (Theatrical {Ire}), who won the GIII Connaught Cup at Woodbine, one of his five graded successes. Winner of the 2014 GIII Maple Leaf S. over the local synthetic track, **Strut the Course** failed to transfer that form over to a conventional dirt track and was a well-beaten seventh behind **Frivolous (Empire Maker)** in the GII Falls City H. at Churchill Downs to close out an otherwise-productive campaign. In tough for her seasonal debut in this track's grassy GII Nassau S. over a mile May 23, the homebred defeated subsequent adjudicated GI Beverly D. S. winner **Watsdachances (Ire)** (**Diamond Green {Fr}**) in the GII Dance Smartly S. over this track and distance July 5 and was exiting a near-miss second to **Uchenna (Ire)** (**Fastnet Rock {Aus}**) in the GIII Ontario Matron S. back on the Polytrack July 25.

A market drifter as **Hoop of Colour** was more heavily bet than expected, **Strut the Course** was taken a nice hold of by **Luis Contreras** and settled in between horses in the third of three flights of three horses through an opening half-mile in a decent :49.37 given the squishy underfoot conditions. **Contreras** held that position into the final quarter-mile and traveled strongly in a pocket as three or four of them lined up across the track. **Hoop of Colour**, a bit rank early, hit the front at the eighth pole and had company to her outside from **Uchenna** and **Overheard (Macho Uno)**, but **Strut the Course** dove down to

the inside of **Hoop of Colour** and finished best of all. **Button Down** closed well up the fence for second.

Though she's got her spot in the field for the GI Breeders' Cup Filly/Mare Turf, **Strut the Course** is not guaranteed to make the trip.

"I have to talk to the owner [about the Breeders' Cup]. I am not sure," admitted trainer **Barb Minshall**, who also sent out **Stacked Deck (First Samurai)** to win the GIII Bold Conquest S. earlier on the card. "The [GI] E.P. Taylor S. [10f, Oct. 18] looks pretty tempting here, but we'll talk about it. It has just been awesome. This filly has been so good from the get-go and **John** has been so great, letting me put her where we want to run her and give her the time we need. It's just been great. She was coming into this race in awesome shape."

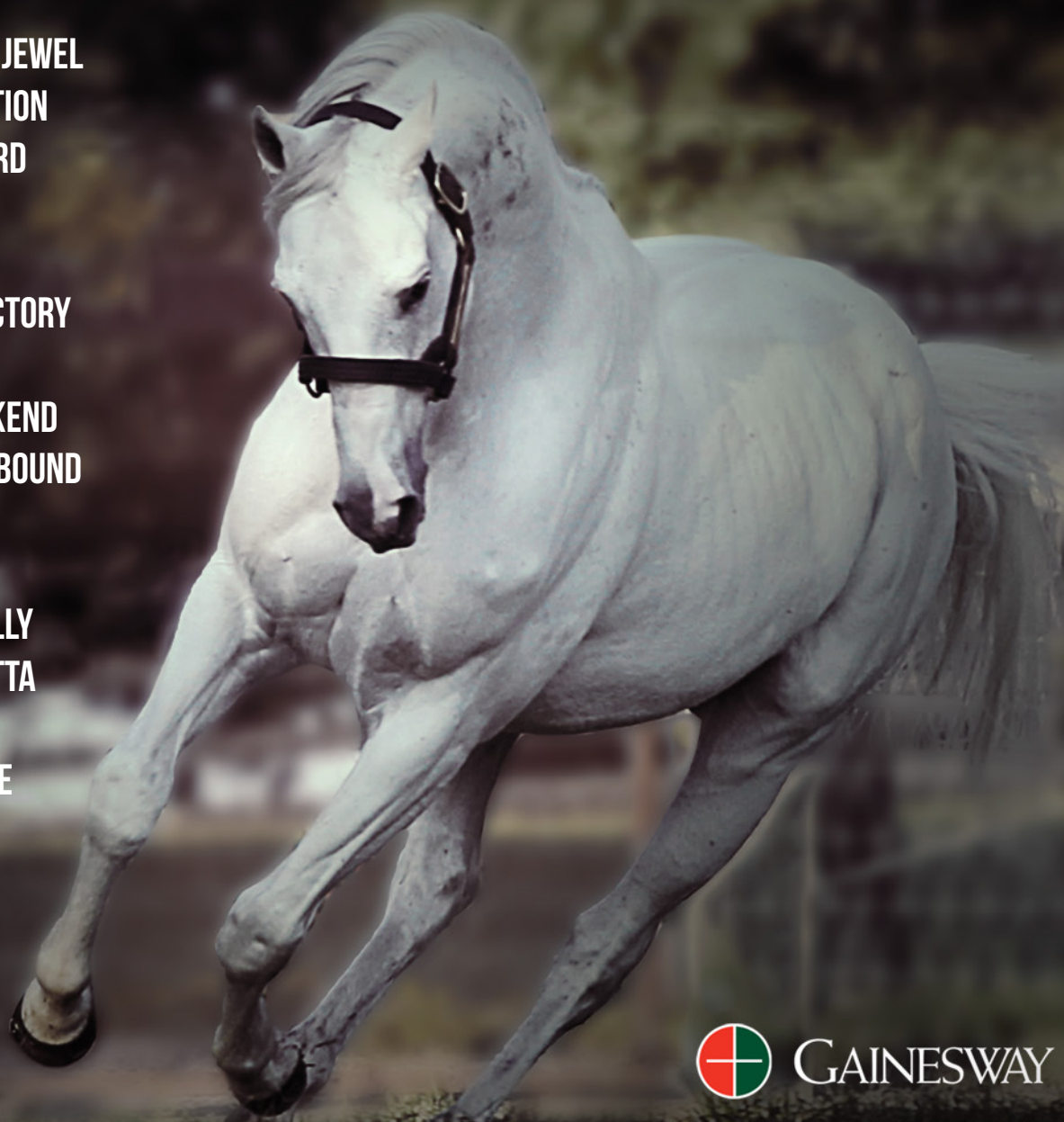

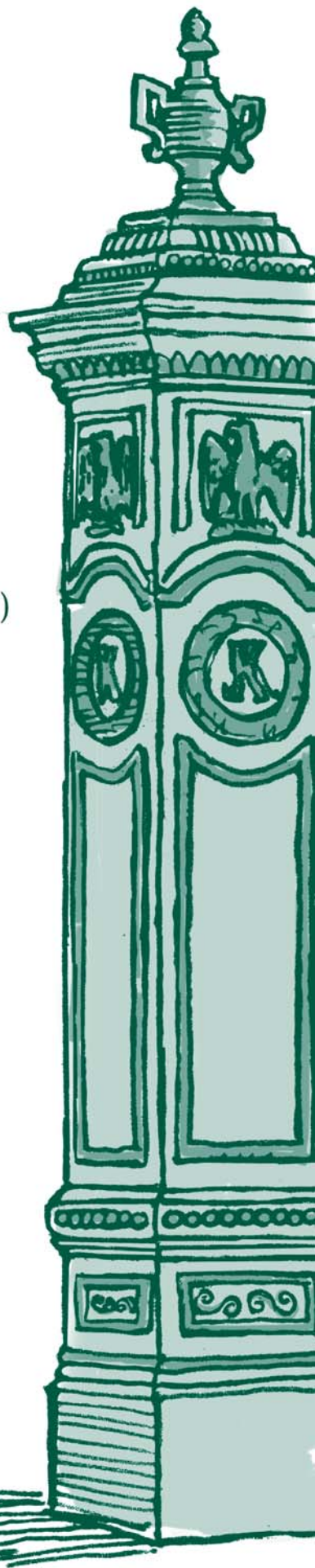

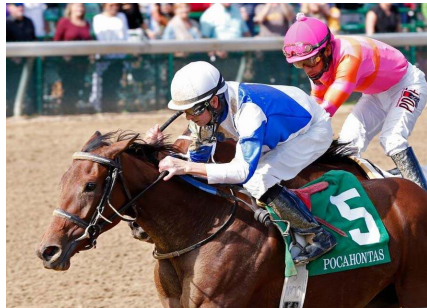

For fans, televised sightings of celebrities at major racing events were also different. A knowledgeable producer or director might instruct camera operators to pan the box seats with the hope of giving viewers a glimpse of famous faces enjoying the races, because their presence served as an implicit A-list endorsement for the sport.

That's all changed. Through continual fine-tuning, the intertwined concepts of luxury hospitality and the poised placement of "celebrity ambassadors" who attend racing's marquee events have evolved more in the past five years than in the previous five decades.

On Monday, the Breeders' Cup will announce the culinary and musical lineups for its fifth annual Taste of the World, a "star-studded evening with world-class entertainment and dining" that the organization bills as "one of the most highly anticipated social events for the Thoroughbred world."

Hosted this year in lavish, tented fashion on the grounds of WinStar Farm not far from Keeneland Race Course, the invite-only extravaganza for participating jockeys, trainers, owners, and breeders on Thursday, Oct. 29, will serve as the gala kickoff for the sport's two-day championships. The 2015 Breeders' Cup is expected to be highlighted by Triple Crown champion American Pharoah (Pioneerof the Nile)'s pursuit of the first-ever "Grand Slam" title, which the colt would accomplish with a win in the GI Classic.

Celebrity chef and horse owner Bobby Flay will oversee the event, which features renowned culinary dignitaries representing 15 nations who will prepare dishes inspired by their country's cuisine ([click here](#) for the roster of participating chefs).

And while the culinary diversity of Taste of the World is designed to mirror the international flavor of the Breeders' Cup itself, there is no mistaking that the event's headline musician-three-time Grammy Award-winning superstar Tim McGraw-represents host state Kentucky's distinctively country vibe.

"The key lifestyle and entertainment elements of the Breeders' Cup World Championships continue to evolve as we focus more acutely on providing our key participants with not only the best in horse racing, but the best in overall hospitality and entertainment," said Craig Fravel, president and chief executive officer of the Breeders' Cup.

"To be able to showcase our farm to over a thousand VIPs is a privilege," said WinStar president and chief executive officer Elliott Walden. "We look forward to entertaining at our newly renovated foaling barn, and it is going to be an unforgettable evening and a monumental moment in WinStar's legacy."

Peter Rotondo, the vice president of media and entertainment for the Breeders' Cup, said Taste of the World is unique among food-focused events at major sporting events because it gives participants a chance to "break bread together before we go to war" on the racetrack. **Cont. p16**

"The idea is, let's get everybody together in a really special environment," Rotondo said. "Not a loud party, so to speak. You can actually hear yourself and have conversations, and really experience the international flavor of the Breeders' Cup."

Rotondo traced the genesis for Taste of the World to Flay's winning the 2010 GII Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf at Churchill Downs.

He said Flay had celebrated More Than Real's victory with friends and family in his box seats. Reflecting on the experience long after the race was over, Flay suggested to Breeders' Cup officials that it would have been a nice perk to have a private, exclusive area to go to after the winner's circle ceremony.

That idea led to the formation of the Enhanced Experience Committee (EEC), and after brainstorming ways to infuse luxe elements into the Breeders' Cup, Rotondo said "we literally started a whole new program of events."

One of them was the Champions Terrace, which Rotondo said debuted in 2011.

"As soon as you win your race, you're whisked away to this private area where you can watch the replay with your family as many times as you want and have a champagne toast," Rotondo said. "Basically, the way we look at it is it's the happiest place on Earth. It's a revolving 30-minute party, and then the next [winning owners] move in. We're thinking of putting a camera in there, because everyone is so happy when they win."

Taste of the World also evolved out of the EEC that same year.

"Our parties were more for the fans-the kickoff, the press party. The audiences were not exactly hitting the target [demographic]," Rotondo said. Flay's involvement led to the natural decision of putting food at the forefront of the annual evening-before-the-races gala.

In 2014, Fortune magazine reported that "what has changed increasingly over the last few years are the rebranding efforts to make the Breeders' Cup a more fan- and owner-friendly affair, including serving better food, adding on more races over a longer span of time, and providing perks for horse owners to keep making the trek each year."

Along the way, the EEC also came up with the idea of pairing morning training with high-end hospitality.

"We said, 'What about breakfast?' Rotondo explained. "The morning workouts are a huge part of racing. In the past, there wasn't much there. You would congregate, have your coffee from the track kitchen or whatever, and that would be it. So we started the Trackside Breakfast Marquee. You can avoid the elements if necessary, mix and mingle with other owners, trainers, and breeders, and the breakfast is great."

Rotondo continued: "Champions Terrace, Taste of the World, and Trackside Breakfast Marquee were the three big enhancements that came out of the EEC. There were countless others, but that really changed the dynamic of Breeders' Cup, that committee and what came out of there."

Another EEC initiative was the Purple Carpet concept, which Rotondo said dovetails with the Celebrity Ambassador Program that puts entertainment and sports luminaries front and center at Cup events.

"There's no doubt, being in California five out of the last seven years, in the backyard of Hollywood, it was just natural" to ramp up the celebrity presence, Rotondo said.

Rotondo explained that the BC works with an entertainment agency to recruit influencers, offering tickets and transportation in exchange for exposure and promotion. **Cont. p18**

But he said it is important for the stars to have a genuinely "organic" interest in racing, so that their inclusion does not seem forced or--worse--"like just another photo op" for the ambassadors.

"We went and found these celebrities who love horse racing, and were fans, like [actresses] Elizabeth Banks or Bo Derek, or they own horses, like [basketball coaches] Avery Johnson or Rick Pitino. We've worked with them to help promote the Breeders' Cup in the month leading up to it, and if they're in town, they come to the races.

"You look at a Rob Drydek," Rotondo continued. "He's a skateboarder; two, three shows on MTV; millions of followers on Instagram and Twitter. And he's at every Breeders' Cup, betting with both hands, and promoting it while he's there.

"It's part of the plan now, no doubt. It's not just enough for them to come. What we ask them to do is really promote that they're coming. If you're a big sporting event, a major event, you want those types of folks to be interested. And with the BC, it's more authentic, because a lot of them who come actually love the game."

Rotondo contrasted the Celebrity Ambassadors program to the way entertainers often appear courtside at high-profile basketball games, where the protocol seems to be to leave once they've been assured of some face time on camera.

"With our guys, they might show up fashionably late, but of course they all stay through the Classic," Rotondo said. "And sometimes, we can't get them out of there. The races are long over, and they still want to hang out."

Sent off the 3-5 favorite coming off a break after winning the June 28 G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud on livelier summer ground, Al Shaqab Racing's sensation Treve clearly enjoyed the return to a rain-softened surface and proved more tractable than in the past for Thierry Jarnet as she raced in mid-division initially. Spurred on by a rush of adrenaline as she entered the "false straight" and sensing that her moment was near, the imposing bay tanked to the leaders and, after assuming control with a quarter mile left, sprinted clear for a win of ridiculous ease. Jarnet's only concern late on was to make sure she stayed straight, as she was inclined to hang down into the rail, but at the line, her exhibition of matchless class was not fully expressed by the margin of just 4 1/2 lengths back to the Aga Khan's progressive G3 Prix Minerve-winning 3-year-old

**Candarliya (Fr)** (Dalakhani {Ire}), and further half-length to the G1 Yorkshire Oaks third **Sea Calisi (Fr)** (Youmzain {Ire}). To put her performance into context, the G1 Juddmonte International winner, **Arabian Queen (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire}), was fully 11 lengths behind her in sixth.

Two years ago, just before her first Arc triumph, Treve dispatched the classy Wild Coco (Ger) (Shirocco {Ger}) with ease in this contest and showed her earlier G1 Prix de Diane success to be no flash in the pan. When she arrived here last year, she already had two unexpected defeats behind her after losing out in the G1 Prix Ganay and G1 Prince of Wales's S. for varying reasons, and she looked a pale imitation of the filly that had so emphatically conquered the world's best on the first Sunday in October. Since that effort behind a rival in Baltic Baroness (Ger) (Shamardal) that would not normally be in the same league, she managed to wow once more as only she can with a second Arc at odds of 11-1 that reflected the general opinion of her prospects of reversing a season's slump.

This term, Treve has managed to come through the first two parts of the masterplan--the 10 1/2-furlong G2 Prix Corrida at Saint-Cloud May 29 and the Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud--with wins and reputation firmly intact, but it was only in this race that she was able to show what she remains capable of. With the 3-year-old colts Golden Horn (GB) (Cape Cross {Ire}), Jack Hobbs (GB) (Halling) and New Bay (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}) on the horizon, she needed to be the Treve of old to ensure favoritism for the Arc, but it is arguable that she may even be better than ever after this stellar display. **Cont.**

she is too strong on the bit and has done too much, but she always has plenty left and the way she moves on at the end of a race is unbelievable. It's amazing how well she looks and how much bigger she is this year."

Treve descends from a high-class European family, her third dam being a half-sister to the French champion 2-year-old and G1 Irish 2000 Guineas winner Triptych (Riverman), as well

as the dam of G1 Prix Saint-Alary winner Treble (Riverman). Treve's dam, Trevisse, has a yearling full-sister to Treve that was sent through the Arqana August ring by the Head family's Haras du Quesnay, but was bought back for €1.2 million.

**THEY ONLY HAVE EYES FOR HER**

For Sunday's Arc Trial day at Longchamp, the *Paris-Turf* racing paper, referring to **Treve (Fr)** (Motivator {GB}), winner of the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe in 2013 and 2014, noted that the "public will only have eyes for her".

On a cloudy afternoon in which five different races had Group 1 winners in their fields, all eyes were indeed on Treve. Could she win the Arc for an unprecedented third time three weeks later?

The day began with a "hymn" on the big screen, dedicated to Treve:

It was an ambiance of coronation.

But the 5-year-old Treve still had to prove herself in the Group I Prix Vermeille for fillies and mares, facing, among others, **Arabian Queen (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire}), the only filly to have defeated the otherwise unbeaten John Gosden colt Golden Horn (GB) (Cape Cross {Ire}). Golden Horn then came back to to win Saturday's G1 Irish Champion S. against a high-quality field, flattering Arabian Queen.

The Prix Vermeille, for fillies and mares, had never been won by a 5-year-old. The Christiane Head-Maarek stable made no secret that they were treating the Vermeille as an "objective" and not just an Arc trial. Treve not only won the Vermeille, she did so unleashing her fierce turn of foot and demolishing the field. Before the race I asked Bernard, a professional handicapper, if he'd be willing to take the low odds on Treve in the Arc.

"I'll wait for the post-position draw," he said. But following her impressive victory, he changed his tune.

"I'm beginning to think I'd take her at even money."

My plan was to survey the "betting public", asking if they would accept the low odds on Treve, currently between even money and 4-5 with the British bookies. Following the Vermeille, I could not find a single person who would reject the low odds.

"I'll take her at 1-5," said one camera-toting Treve fan. True rapture had set in.

I decided to ask the professional players if they were equally possessed. What about those Gosden horses, and what about Mr. Arc himself Andre Fabre, with his Flintshire (GB) (Dansili {GB})--second to Treve last year--and his current 3-year-old star New Bay (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}), the dominating winner of the G2 Prix Niel prep, 30 minutes before Treve's show of force, and previously the winner of this year's French Derby?

"I wouldn't be mesmerized by this year's winners over 3-year-olds," said John, a seasoned race observer. "This year's threes are not at the same level as last year's crop. Not only will Treve now face a lower level of competition, but she's even stronger than when she went into the Arc last year. The only thing that would change my mind is an injury."

Normally the Prix Vermeille is run faster than the other two Arc trials, the Prix Niel for 3-year-olds and the Prix Foy, another Group 2 for 4-year-olds and up, all at the same 2400-meter Arc distance.

But this year, Prix Foy winner Postponed (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}) ran a second faster than Treve, and two seconds faster than Fabre's New Bay in the Prix Niel. New Bay will get a 3 1/2-kilo weight advantage over Treve in the Arc.

I eventually found one public handicapper who called for reason rather than rapture.

"Fabre has had Arc winners coming from the Prix Niel and he cannot be discounted so swiftly. New Bay looked impressive!"

The day began with the first 1,000 fans entering Longchamp receiving a free €2 bet. It reached a peak when Treve's elated rider Thierry Jarnet took a tour around the winner's circle ring, shaking the hands of each and every fan within reach while signing autographs. For the moment, racing fans can't take their eyes off of Treve. The fear is that Treve-mania may cause defections from the Arc field the first Sunday in October?

Hit by four significant withdrawals due to the very soft ground, this renewal was partly salvaged as the class act prevailed in the shape of Ervedya, who further enhanced the reputation of the current crop of sophomore fillies. Less than 24 hours after her arch-rival Found (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) had beaten all bar Golden Horn (GB) (Cape Cross {Ire}) in the Irish Champion, Ervedya--who had eclipsed that filly in the G1 Coronation S. at Royal Ascot June 19--started as the even-money favorite with potentially serious

opponents Esoterique (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}), Territories (Ire) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}), Arod (Ire) (Teofilo {Ire}) and Dutch Connection (GB) (Dutch Art {GB}) all ruled out. Anchored in

second early by Christophe Soumillon following Karakontie, the free-running bay needed a gap in the straight, but when it came she was able to wear down the long-time leader passing the furlong marker en route to a length success from the strong-closing outsider Akatea, another 3-year-old filly, who edged out Karakontie by a length. "What a nice filly she is--she never disappoints or runs a bad race," the owner-breeder's racing manager Georges Rimaud said. "She had run well on soft before, but never on such a heavy surface so we had slight doubts beforehand. She ran great again and is just a sweet little filly. We think she is through for the season and will have a long break, as we intend to keep her in training next season." Ervedya had already shone over this course and distance when winning the May 10 G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches before her Royal Ascot exploits, but had hit a wall last time in the form of Amazing Maria (Ire) (Mastercraftsman {Ire}) when runner-up in the G1 Prix Rothschild at Deauville Aug. 2. With such a depleted field to face here, the only anxious moment for her owner-breeder came when the German raider Wild Chief (Ger) (Doyen {Ire}) tried to pin her in behind Karakontie in the home straight. "It looked for a few seconds as if she would get shut in, but it's a mark of her quality that she found her way out and like so many in her family, displayed the quality that we have come to expect from them," His Highness The Aga Khan commented.

rehearsal for what is shaping up to be a vintage renewal of the Oct. 4 showpiece. For a first try at this mile-and-a-half trip, things could hardly have gone more smoothly and aside from the fact that the G1 Grand Prix de Paris winner Erupt (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}) was patently below-par, it looked a valid trial for the keenly awaited course-and-distance feature. Settled perfectly in

second early following his pacemaker Countermeasure (GB) (American Post {GB}), the homebred was traveling strongly as the ultimately disappointing Erupt took over at the head of affairs turning for home. Kept in a pocket for a few strides by Ol' Man River (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) on his outer, he was able to brush that rival aside without any real effort and join the previously unbeaten Niarchos homebred with Vincent Cheminaud still motionless at the quarter pole. As Erupt folded tamely, New Bay was shaken up to take total command and drew away impressively under hand riding to keep a resurgent Silverwave comfortably at safe distance.

"That was the ideal prep and exactly what we wanted for the horse," Khalid Abdullah's racing manager Teddy Grimthorpe commented. "It went how we had planned it beforehand and he is still learning. He broke well and settled well and the slight doubt we had about his stamina has been erased now. All being well, it is the Arc for him now." Despite Erupt's flop, connections are keen to turn up in three weeks' time. "You are always disappointed to be beaten, especially when they are undefeated beforehand, but I think he had excuses, as he needed the run and the jockey said he was not quickening the same on that ground," the operation's racing manager Alan Cooper commented.

New Bay hails from one of his owner/breeder's most prolific sire-producing families. His third dam, Bahamian (Ire) (Mill Reef), produced the G1 Irish Oaks victress Wemyss Bight (GB) (Dancing Brave), herself the dam of four time Grade/Group 1 winner and sire Beat Hollow (GB) (Sadler's Wells). Bahamian also produced Hope (Ire) (Dancing Brave), the dam of Oasis Dream (GB) (Green Desert) and G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches winner Zenda (GB) (Zamindar), who in turn produced G1 Irish 2000 Guineas winner and Cartier Horse of the Year Kingman (GB) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}), who covered his first book at Juddmonte's Banstead Manor Stud this year. Cinnamon Bay has an unraced 2-year-old filly named Spice Trail (GB) (Champs Elysees {GB}); a yearling colt by Dansili (GB) and a colt foal by Champs Elysees.

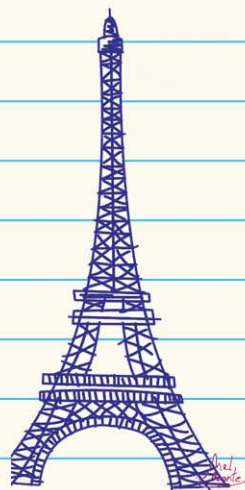

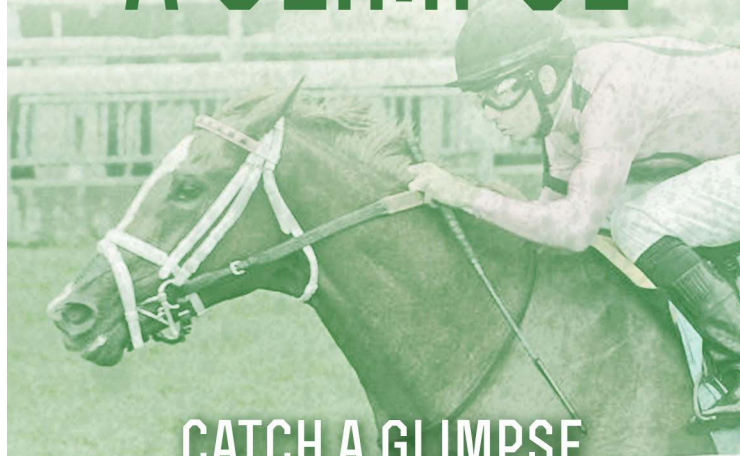

Successful in the G2 Prix Vicomtesse Vigier over this track and trip last May, Fly With Me was fifth in the 14-furlong G2 Prix Maurice de Nieuil back at this venue in July before chasing home the future Melbourne Cup hero Protectionist (Ger) (Monsun {Ger}) when second in Deauville’s G2 Prix Kergorlay in August.

**NEW ORDER**

Bringing up a Ballydoyle clean sweep of the trio of Group 1 races on The Curragh's star-studded Sunday card, Michael Tabor's **Order of St George (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) demolished some distinguished older opposition in the G1 Palmerstown House Estate Irish St Leger to add to the Doncaster St Leger acquired 24 hours earlier by

stable companion Bondi Beach (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}). Held up in rear early by Joseph O'Brien, the 5-4 favorite--who had been so impressive when winning the G3 Irish St Leger Trial S. over this track and trip Aug. 23--crept into contention without any stress and sliced his way between rivals just

before the three-furlong pole. In front soon after, the bay--who would arguably have been a clear-cut winner of the Doncaster Classic--hung down towards the fence but kept extending his lead and hit the line with 11 lengths to spare over **Agent Murphy (GB)** (Cape Cross {Ire}). In a sad postscript, last year's winner **Brown Panther (GB)** (Shirocco {Ger}) was pulled up injured in the backstretch and had to be euthanized.

"He's been getting more impressive with every run this year and it's unusual to have a stayer that can quicken the way he does," trainer Aidan O'Brien said of the winner, who could be the new leading force in the staying category to follow the likes of the stable's Yeats (Ire), Fame and Glory (GB) and Leading Light (Ire). "He's a very exciting horse who travels strongly and has a lot of options."

Engaged in the English Leger and apparently set to run until Aidan O'Brien made a late switch on Friday, Order of St George was the subject of a major gamble on Sunday and gave his supporters little concern throughout. Looking back through his form, the manner of his win on his third maiden start when upwards of 8 1/2 lengths too strong for some moderate rivals on soft ground over a mile at Leopardstown last August suggested he could be a stayer with class, but he was only fifth in the G3 Autumn S. at that trip at Newmarket in October. Second over nine furlongs in the Listed Eyrefield S. back at Leopardstown later that month, he reappeared in the G3 Curragh Cup over this track and trip and lost out only by a short head to Bondi Beach before taking a 13-furlong Down Royal conditions event July 24 and storming to an emphatic Irish St Leger Trial win back on his favored testing surface.

Looking every bit as if he was up against minor-league opposition as Joseph O'Brien picked and chose his passage through on the home turn, Order of St George powered away from some of the season's more accomplished middle-distance and staying performers to place himself towards the top of his stable's pecking order of 3-year-olds. **Cont. p29**

“They went hard up front and [Joseph] put him asleep and sneaked through lovely,” his conditioner said. “We may have a look at the two-mile race at Ascot [the Oct. 17 G2 QIPCO British Champions Long Distance Cup] with him.”

Order Of St George’s second dam is the Eclipse champion 2-year-old filly Storm Song (Summer Squall). His dam, Another Storm, has an unraced 2-year-old named Kellstorm (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), a yearling filly by Holy Roman Emperor (Ire) and a Declaration of War colt foal.

The demise of the 7-year-old Brown Panther, who it was revealed had suffered a fractured hind leg, cast a long shadow over proceedings and Paul Hensey, general manager at The Curragh, explained the situation. “Brown Panther sustained a hind leg injury. He was quickly attended by the vets on site and the decision was made to euthanize him.”

**Owen Issues Panther Tribute...**

Michael Owen, the former English football star who bred Brown Panther and campaigned him in partnership with Andrew Black, released the following statement after the horse was euthanized Saturday: "It's the saddest day of my life. The toughest, most honest, brilliant horse I will ever set eyes on passed away today

doing the thing he loved the most. A shattered hind leg that was irreparable according to the first-class team at The Curragh ended his life.

"I was with him when he was born, shared an experience for seven years that will never be repeated and gave him his last

kiss goodbye," Owen added. "What an honor to own and breed him. I love you Panther, life will not be the same without you."

In addition to last year’s Irish Leger romp, Brown Panther’s other career highlights included a win in the 2011 King George V S. at Royal Ascot, a performance that brought Owen to tears; and a 3 1/2 length romp in this year’s G2 Dubai Gold Cup. He was 11 of 28 starts and earned more than \$1.7 million.

On a rain-compromised Irish Champions weekend that featured a couple of high-profile withdrawals from Ballydoyle, Aidan O’Brien’s decision to let **Air Force Blue** (War Front) take his chance in The Curragh’s G1 Goffs Vincent O’Brien National S. paid handsome dividends, as the imposing bay delivered another masterclass under Joseph O’Brien. There were shades of Hawk

Wing in his success in the G1 Phoenix S. over six furlongs here Aug. 9, and he looked in that exalted class again despite enjoying no cover throughout. Always traveling with potency two lengths off his pace-setting stable companion **Painted Cliffs (Ire)** (Canford Cliffs {Ire}),

the 10-11 pick drew alongside **Herald the Dawn (Ire)** (New Approach {Ire}) passing the quarter pole with barely any encouragement from his rider. Sent on with a shake of the reins soon after, he imposed his authority on affairs without recourse to the whip to best that rival by three lengths.

“I don’t want to say too much, but Joseph was very impressed with him and he’s a very exciting horse,” said Aidan O’Brien. “He’s very unusual, but I have to be careful as you can say too much when you get excited.”

Of the previous nine Aidan O'Brien-trained winners of this prize, Air Force Blue would at this stage stand comparison with several, and by completing the Phoenix-National double, was joining the stable's One Cool Cat, George Washington (Ire) and Mastercraftsman (Ire)--the latter being by another who managed the feat in the Neville Callaghan-trained Danehill Dancer (Ire).

Giving instant justification for his trainer's decision to crack on early when winning a competitive six-furlong maiden from more precociously bred rivals on debut at this track May 24, he did little wrong in the G2 Coventry S. other than encounter a faster finisher on the day in Buratino (Ire) (Exceed and Excel {Aus}), but beat everything else convincingly in that June 16 Royal Ascot contest. After a short break, he handled the rain-eased ground better than Buratino when impressive in the Phoenix, but it may be that he had improved at a faster rate than his British rival, who ended up third with Air Force Blue's stable companion Washington DC (Ire) (Zoffany {Ire}) splitting the pair.

Forced to race alone here with Joseph O'Brien not keen on an over-restraint, he went through the race without being in a race situation and it was a case of natural ability carrying him to the post.

"He has a huge engine, traveled very good throughout the race and down to the furlong-and-a-half mark I was still cantering," his rider explained. "I haven't ridden many as good as him. He's very straightforward, travels, relaxes, has a lot of speed and he showed today that he gets seven furlongs well."

O'Brien senior was trying hard to keep his feelings under wraps and added, "We took a chance running him on ground that he would have hated, as he wants real fast ground. With a War Front, you'd be afraid of that bad ground, but in February he was powering up through all the 2-year-olds at home and that's the reason we ran him. We had to know what we would do with him if the ground came up awful next year. Joseph said he was running away the whole way and he couldn't even get him back in behind horses. He has real pace, too. Gleneagles has that pace--natural pace."

O'Brien said a crack at a third Group 1 could be on the cards this year.

"He'll have one more run if he's going to go again and I'd imagine that would be in the G1 Dewhurst S. [at Newmarket Oct. 10], as now he's gone up to seven you don't want to go back to six. It wouldn't be essential if he doesn't run again this year."

Air Force Blue's second dam is a full-sister to Eclipse champion 2-year-old filly Flanders (Seeking The Gold), herself the dam of Eclipse champion 3-year-old filly Surfside (Seattle Slew). His dam, Chatham, has a yearling colt by Lemon Drop Kid set to sell as [hip 162](#) at Keeneland September Monday.

The filly that won won't mind stepping up to a mile and could be there for the G1 Fillies' Mile [at Newmarket Oct. 9], and Joseph's has done plenty this year, while Alice Springs could drop back if she needs to in something like the G1 Cheveley Park S. just depend on their availability for a hearing--either this Thursday or next Thursday most likely, but to be confirmed."

The St Leger is the second Grade/Group 1 taken from Qatar Racing and trainer Ralph Beckett in the space of a month--their Secret Gesture (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) was disqualified after winning the G1 Beverly D. S. Aug. 15. That demotion was also appealed, with no outcome yet revealed. Simple Verse was taken down Saturday after allegedly interfering twice with Bondi Beach (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) in the closing stages before crossing the line a head in front of that colt.

"With normal improvement from three to four he could be something to look forward to next year," Raymond added. "At the moment, that's it for the season."

### GOLDEN HORN IRISH CHAMPION S. ANALYSIS

Controversy over the stewards' inquiry that followed the G1 Irish Champion S. took full attention away from future implications of the performance of winner **Golden Horn (GB)** (Cape Cross {Ire}). By the colt's previous high standards, this was arguably a disappointment.

Okay, so winning at the highest level is hardly a bad result at any time, but we shouldn't just be analyzing racehorses in binary. Back in June, this colt looked like he could rise to the standard reached by the likes of Treve (Fr) (Motivator {GB}) and New Bay (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}) in their Arc trials at Longchamp on Sunday. But the truth is that he hasn't got there, and it is no surprise that bookmakers like Ladbrokes favor not only the French-trained pair, but also Golden Horn's stablemate Jack Hobbs.

Golden Horn increasingly seems to lack an instant punch; it must be doubtful he can match the finishing speed of the French-trained pair above. In Treve's G1 Prix Vermeille, the last two fractions on soft ground were :11.26 and :12.25, while in New Bay's G1 Prix Niel the equivalent numbers were :11.51 and :12.21.

Neither horse was fully extended, and these are world-class numbers considering the conditions.

The previous day at Leopardstown, Golden Horn lacked the same sparkle. He would probably still have held off Free Eagle (Ire) (High Chaparral {Ire}) had he not badly hampered that rival

when swerving left inside the final furlong--the move that triggered a stewards' inquiry after which the winner was allowed to keep the race (though strictly against the ethic of fair play, it was the right decision under rules that currently favour the perpetrator of interference rather than the victim).

However, the compacted field behind him generally had less favorable trips throughout the 10-furlong contest, and when international handicappers rate this performance at the end of the season, it won't rate either among the best in Europe, or indeed that of Golden Horn himself.

It is another question why Golden Horn hung so violently. His trainer John Gosden was quick to blame the shadow of the grandstand, but why did this affect only the winner? It speaks of a colt whose mind was wandering as much as his body.

Golden Horn's prospects in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe seem to rest on ground and pace; he may improve on a faster surface and for being ridden patiently. The subject of riding tactics is a particularly interesting one here, given Gosden's post-race quotes. "We got our tactics very wrong at York [when

Golden Horn won the G1 International S.] and we laid too far back, so I left it to the jockey and he's left it to the other extreme," the trainer said.

That seems unfair on Frankie Dettori. What was he supposed to do? The 44-year-old arguably won the race with his proactivity early from the rail draw, for another aspect of Golden Horn's performance worthy of particular emphasis is that he was a stride slowly away, and required his rider to hustle him in the early stages to avoid a potentially poor tactical position.

To my mind, Dettori ought to be given extra credit; Gosden's 'I left it to the jockey' is a surprising insight. There was no guaranteed pace in the field of seven and, given that the trainer felt so strongly that tactics brought about Golden Horn's defeat at York, you would have thought it natural for a plan to have been determined. Left to his own devices, Dettori was quick, bold--and, most of all, right to make the running.

This early aggression that was forced on Dettori was bound to take its toll on Golden Horn, but typical of the all-time great in the saddle that he is (Dettori was singled out by legend Lester Piggott in this recent interview), the Italian found a perfect tempo through the middle part of the race on Golden Horn, carving out something like even furlongs of around :12.5 seconds on the yielding ground. And, when set down for the drive, Golden Horn got down to near :12 for the penultimate furlong before finishing off in :13.5. (These fractions, of course, are hard-timed and thus approximate, in contrast to those provided at Longchamp.)

As a result of Golden Horn's mistakes at the start and end of the race, it seemed like he had a hard race. But inferring the long-term effect this might have is not something that appeals as scientific. Suffice to say, it will be a great training performance from Gosden to get him to peak on Oct. 4 at Longchamp, when it appears as if the form of other key contenders is trending in the positive direction.

In contrast to his stablemate, Jack Hobbs (GB) (Halling) seems likely to produce a personal best at Longchamp. His return in the G3 September S. at Kempton at the beginning of this month was mighty impressive, considering a layoff since winning the G1 Irish Derby in June.

**EXOSPHERE A CREDIT TO SIR IVOR LINE**

The win of Exosphere (Aus) in the G1 Golden Rose in Sydney on Saturday is a great result for the colt's owner/breeder Sheikh Mohammed, for his sire Lonhro (Aus) and for the Sir Ivor sire line.

Winner of the G1 2000 Guineas, Derby, Champion S. and Washington DC International in 1968, Sir Ivor retired to Claiborne in 1969. He sired plenty of good racehorses and broodmares, but as a sire of sires, he was a non-achiever--with one glorious exception.

Sir Tristram (Ire) was far from the best racehorse sired by Sir Ivor, recording merely two minor wins in France from 19 starts. Of no interest to breeders in the

States and Europe, he was bought by Patrick Hogan, a young studmaster in New Zealand who was, presumably, influenced by the fact that Sir Tristram came from the same family as the influential stallions Hyperion, Sickie, Pharamond, Hunter's Moon and

Mossborough. From his base at Cambridge Stud, Sir Tristram proved easily the best stallion sired by Sir Ivor, ultimately setting a new world record for individual Group/Grade 1 winners (45).

Patrick (now Sir Patrick) Hogan always said that he would wait until he was confident that he had found Sir Tristram's successor before adding a son of the patriarch to the roster at Cambridge Stud. Eventually he decided that he had found him: Zabeel (NZ), winner in 1990 of the G1 VRC Australian Guineas in the colors of Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid al Maktoum. Zabeel duly turned out to be easily the most successful of the 14 sons of Sir Tristram who sired at least one Group 1 winner. Zabeel's sons included two horses who were voted Horse of the Year in Australia: the outstanding gelding Might And Power (NZ) and 10-time Group 1 winner Octagonal (NZ).

Bred by Cambridge Stud from its outstanding matron Eight Carat (GB), Octagonal was raced by Jack and Bob

Ingham, whose Woodlands Stud was the largest and most successful owner/breeder operation in Australia. Octagonal got off to a flying start at Woodlands with his first winner Lonhro (Aus), who eventually won one more Group 1 race than his father had done as well as becoming (in 2003/04) Australia's only Horse of the Year sired by a previous Horse of the Year.

Sheikh Mohammed bought Woodlands Stud and its stock from the Ingham family in May 2008. Lonhro was unproven as a stallion at the time, but he has subsequently established himself as world-class, not least by being champion sire in 2010/11. That achievement prompted a period of reverse-shuttling to Jonabell Farm in Kentucky beginning in 2012, in which year he was represented in Australia by the G1 Golden Slipper winner Pierro (Aus).

Among the races that have helped to cement Lonhro's reputation as a stallion has been the Golden Rose, run at Rosehill each spring. This race, formerly known as the Peter Pan S., was given its current title in 2003 in an effort to boost its status, the implication being that it had become for spring 3-year-olds what the Golden Slipper is for autumn 2-year-olds. It had previously carried Group 2 status and been a lead-up race for more important events later in the spring, but since 2003 it has been promoted as a championship race in its own right (and has carried Group 1 status since 2009).

The first G1 Golden Rose was won by a Woodlands-bred, Darley-raced son of Lonhro: Denman (Aus). Now, the 2015 version has seen another Darley homebred colt by Lonhro, Exosphere (Aus), take the race. Winner to date of four of his six starts, Exosphere was an impressive winner of the Golden Rose, skipping past the leader at the top of the straight en route to a 2 1/4-length victory. He had won the G2 Run To The Rose S. two weeks previously, while the highlight of his juvenile campaign had been an impressive victory in the G2 Skyline S.

Exosphere's dam, Altitude (Aus), was a multiple winner in Melbourne. As she is by Danzero (Aus) from a mare by Marscay (Aus), her merit can be attributed in part to two of Australia's most notable stallions of recent decades--Danzero, a member of the first Australian crop of Danehill and the Star Kingdom-line sire Marscay. Each won the Golden Slipper and each sired a Golden Slipper winner: Bint Marscay (Aus) and Dance Hero (Aus), respectively.

A colt of immense potential, Exosphere is raced by the most international racing and breeding operation in the world. After the Golden Rose, his trainer John O'Shea (who is the private trainer to Sheikh Mohammed in Australia) remarked, "A horse like Exosphere has international appeal and you never know where he will end up."

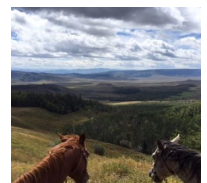

from the trail ride will go towards the new Horses and Hope Mobile Cancer Screening Van that will expand screenings to both men and women for seven types of cancer, including breast cancer.

In addition to the satisfaction of raising money for such a worthy cause, the group of horsewomen, "Latigos and Lace," had a truly unique and life-changing experience that was both exciting and challenging. There was an atmosphere of support, cooperation and bonding that left an indelible impression in everyone's mind that won't be forgotten. The ladies are currently planning riding adventures for next year and hope to include more horsewomen who are interested in supporting Horses and Hope.
